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Major labels offer plenty of big names for the fall

After what some have described as an unusually dry summer of major releases, the five major record companies are preparing a heavy list of hitters for the fall schedule. While there may be a lack of prominent domestic releases heading into the busy Christmas buying period, there should be more than enough high-priority international releases to keep sales and promotion reps busy into December.

Sony's main domestic priority will be a new

release from Prozzak, tentatively slated for mid-November. There is also talk of a new Celine Dion compilation album, tentatively titled a Collector's Series, which will primarily feature b-sides and rarities sought out by the many diehard Celine fans. Again, no specific dates are mentioned, although mid-to-late October is a possibility.

From an international standpoint, Sony's priorities would appear to be new releases from both Ricky Martin and Jennifer Lopez, along with the Latin Grammys 2000 compilation. Sony will also feature live releases from both Barbra Streisand and Pearl Jam. The Streisand album (tentatively titled Timeless) is a record of her recent New Year's Eve

concerts in Las Vegas, while the Pearl Jam will actually be a series of 28 different releases throughout the world, including two in Canada, recorded in Katowice, Poland. Both albums are expected sometime in September or October.

Sony will also offer a number of soundtracks in October and November, including Dawson's Creek Vol. 2, Charlie's Angels, Dracula 2000, What Women Want, and a pair of Ally McBeal soundtracks (one soul, the other Christmas).

In the country vein, October will see Sony debuts from veterans Travis Tritt and Billy Ray Cyrus, as well as a Billy Gilman Christmas release. In a more rootsy vein, Sony will also release new material from the Allman Brothers, and an Indigo Girls compilation. October will also see new releases from A3 (who were featured on The Sopranos

Loggerhead Records signs New Brunswick's Even

Loggerhead Records have announced the signing of Fredericton-based band Even to their artist roster. The five-piece band were the recent winners of beer.com's North American Battle of the Bands.

Even's song, Can You Feel The Rain, was voted the top overall song from the 500-plus entries received at beer.com. The voting was conducted by the website's browsers. By winning the contest, Even were awarded three showcase appearances in North America – the Dock's in Toronto, the Viper Room in Los Angeles, and the Mercury Lounge in New York – all of them taking place in August.

"We are positive Even has a bright future," notes Loggerhead president Andrew McCain. "We are determined to make Even the next Canadian success story."

Adds Even's Derek McLaughlin, "We have been talking to Andrew for a couple of years. He has always made time for us and gave us advice when he didn't really have to. Andrew has a real passion for artists and music. We have the highest respect for him and his staff at Loggerhead Records and are thrilled to be working with them."

Even's CD will be out in the spring of 2001.



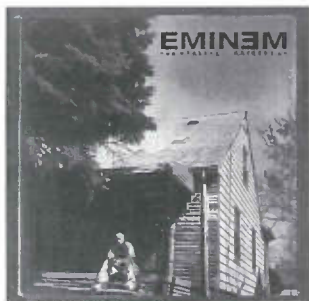

Rage Against The Machine (live), The Offspring, comedian Chris Rock, and a long-awaited new release from Sade. December will see new product from Cypress Hill (live), Bone Thugs 'N Harmony (compilation), and an ELO boxed set.

For their part, BMG is pinning their Christmas wishes to a pair of new releases from Christina Aguilera, one being a Latin release, the other a Christmas record. Also slated for the fall from BMG are new releases from Dave Matthews, Everlast, Love Inc., Run DMC (a compilation), Alan Jackson,

SR71 (a new David Bendeth signing), a Lonestar Christmas album, and the newest Planet Pop compilation.

TNN and CMT Canada to simulcast 2000 CCMA's

After months of speculation concerning the future of the show on television, the Canadian Country Music Association announced late last week (August 17) that the CCMA Awards will be simulcast live on September 11 at 9 pm ET on both The Nashville Network and Country Music Television Canada.

CCMA president Tom Tompkins made the announcement, alongside Brian Hughes (vice-president, programming, TNN) and Vicki Dalziel (general manager, CMT Canada). Ironically, it was just two weeks earlier, at the CCMA's media conference to announce this year's nominees, that Tompkins had stated that the awards would not be televised this year.

"We're delighted that TNN and CMT Canada have joined together to bring this event live to audiences in both Canada and the United States," noted Tompkins. "We are grateful to TNN for its financial support in making this year's production possible, and to both TNN and CMT Canada for their efforts in making a live simulcast possible."

The Canadian Country Music Awards were first televised live by CTV back in 1987, and the network remained the host of the live broadcast for a dozen years. The 1999 awards in Ottawa were telecast live by the CBC. TNN has re-telecast the CCMA's on a tape-delay basis since 1993.

The 2000 CCMA Awards will take place September 11 in Edmonton's SkyReach Centre, hosted by Terri Clark and Paul Brandt, before an expected live audience of more than 8,000 fans. Shania Twain, Julian Austin, Paul Brandt, Terri Clark, Tara Lyn Hart, and The Wilkinsons are among the nominees, with Twain and Hart leading the way with six nominations a piece. The final voting will be conducted by the 1,700 members of the Canadian Country Music Association.

Hughes says that discussions between the CCMA and TNN were initiated back in June, but it was only after talks failed with local national broadcasters that TNN stepped up with a firm offer.

From the Zomba side, look for a new Aaron Carter release September 12th, a Matthew Sweet greatest hits package and a new album from Mystikal on September 26th, a new R. Kelly November 7th, and a new Backstreet Boys album in mid-November. As well, Zomba has just released the self-titled debut from Alberta-based trio Jake, and the new Head Planet Earth.

Warner Music Canada is kicking off their fall schedule with a new release from the Barenaked Ladies on September 12, along with the debut release from newly-signed artist Vast. The week after that (September 19) is Madonna's new album, Music. September 26th will see new releases from east coast favourites Great Big Sea, as well as international heavies Paul Simon and Bette Midler.

The first week in October will see new product from Green Day, to be followed a week later by new albums from Collective Soul, Tamia and Orgy. Also coming in October are new releases from Dwight Yoakam and Lynda Lemay.

Finally, November sees new Warner releases from Rod Stewart, Sugar Ray, Enya, and Colin James, as well as the latest versions of Big Shiny Tunes and Women & Song.

Universal has a slew of major releases primed for the fall schedule, led by a trio of domestic releases on August 29 – Jason McCoy, Zuckerbaby and Wild Strawberries. September 5th sees the release of a Who Wants To Be A Millionaire compilation, featuring a collection of classics inspired by the hit show.

September 12th sees the highly anticipated new release from Boyz II Men (titled Nathan Michael Shawn Wanya), as well as new releases from Joan Osborne, LL Cool J, Los Lobos, Sarah Harmer, and a Jimi Hendrix 4-CD boxed set. The following week

sees new material from Erykah Badu, Fastball, George Strait, Terri Clark, Willie Nelson, and a soundtrack for the hit television show Survivor.

Also coming in September (26) is the new 98 Degrees (Revelation) and Mark Knopfler (Sailing To Philadelphia).

In October, Universal will offer new Ja Rule, Sammy Kershaw and SheDaisy (all Oct. 3), followed a week later by The Wallflowers, and the lead single (titled Beautiful Day) from U2's new release, All That You Can't Leave Behind. That full album comes out October 31.

October 17th will see new material from Limp Bizkit (Chocolate Starfish & The Hot Dog Flavored Water) and Mark Chesnutt (Lost In The Feeling), followed one week later by albums from Marilyn Manson, Nelly Furtado, PJ Harvey and Snoop Dogg (Snoop Dogg Presents Doggy's Angels).

Coming in November from Universal are new releases from Blink 182 (live), Foxy Brown, Dru Hill, Elton John, Powerman 5000, and Eve. The tentative December schedule offers new material from K-Ci & Jo-Jo, Redman, Method Man and DJ Clue.

Finally, EMI Music Canada's fall release schedule includes All Stars 2001, Blur, more Everclear, Radiohead, Robbie Williams, Sarah Brightman, a new Beatles greatest hits package, and The Mollatts. On the Virgin side, upcoming fourth quarter releases include a Lenny Kravitz greatest hits package, Snow, the Spice Girls and Yanni.

Duets soundtrack features Paltrow's singing debut

Academy Award-winning actress Gwyneth Paltrow makes her on-screen singing debut in the upcoming Hollywood Pictures feature Duets. The soundtrack for the film, on Hollywood Records, features Paltrow and various other actors singing numerous pop classics. The film, directed by Paltrow's father Bruce Paltrow, opens in Toronto on September 15, preceded by the soundtrack, which will be released via Universal on September 12.

The film also stars Scott Speedman (Felicity), Andre Braugher (Homicide), singer Huey Lewis, Maria Bello (Payback, Coyote Ugly), award-winning producer/artist Babyface, and Paul Giamatti (Saving Private Ryan). Distributed by Buena Vista, Duets tells the story of six amateur singers who meet while competing for the \$5,000 grand prize in a karaoke contest in Omaha, Nebraska.

The soundtrack's eleven songs feature a mix of pop, rock and R&B classics, all reinterpreted by the film's stars. Tracks on the soundtrack include Feeling Alright by Lewis, Bette Davis Eyes by Paltrow, Cruisin' (the lead single) by Paltrow and Lewis, Just My Imagination by Paltrow and Babyface, Try A Little Tenderness by Giamatti and Arnold McCuller, I Can't Make You Love Me and Sweet Dreams (Are Made Of This) performed by Bello, and Lonely Teardrops by Lewis.

"Tom Tompkins and Sheila Hamilton were here in Nashville for Fan Fair and for our awards show. They mentioned the difficulties they were having with the broadcast television group. We kicked around a number of ideas, and they went back from the meetings we had to talk to the broadcasters once again, with which they didn't have any luck.

"In the meantime, we were investigating all options possible on our end, because this was an important property for us. We felt there was a history there, certainly we felt we owed it to our Canadian viewership with TNN, and we didn't want to see the thing go away. So we were able to rob Peter to pay Paul, so to speak, in a number of areas. And while it took a lot of time, we were able to come up with the resources to help make this a reality."

One change that may be brought about by the addition of TNN is the inclusion of American artists in the CCMA show.

As Hughes points out, the CCMA has included American artists in the past, and with TNN simulcasting the show throughout the US, the addition of American talent could only help in boosting the ratings. He adds though, that the primary reason TNN is broadcasting the show is to throw the spotlight on Canadian talent.

"I've always taken the approach that, yeah it's great to have American acts, but the reason we're doing this is to display the Canadian country talent there is. And certainly there's an enormous amount of Canadian talent that has made its way into the US, and done very well. So I think in all those aspects, we satisfy our needs. But the wheels are in motion now with the labels in Canada, who have called in familial relationships with labels in Nashville, and they're both working to get some American artists, as well as Canadian, on the show."

The CCMA Awards will be produced by Toronto's JST Productions, with Aidan Cogrove of JST acting as co-producer of the show with Michael Watt, who will serve as the show's director.

EMI's download plan a win-win solution for everyone

With the recent announcement of EMI Music Canada entering the world of digital music downloads, the face of the Internet is about to change. Currently, music files are everywhere on the web. Sites like MP3 and Napster have not only been in the press lately, but also in the courts. The concern with much of Internet music downloading today is that files are downloaded free and the artists do not get paid.

EMI is the first major label to offer their music commercially in 'secure' digital file format. The difference now, is that the artists will be compensated for their art and there will be a legal framework to help fight pirating.

At this point, most consumers still prefer the physical world with all the packaging. Downloading files is not something that the majority are into yet, but the public has definitely demonstrated an interest in receiving their music in digital files and EMI felt it important to fulfill this public demand. However, the existing formats were insecure and did not compensate the artists, the labels, the retailers or the publishers. With these new digital music downloads, the consumer need has been addressed, but with a secure legal file format that still allows them to obtain music digitally, while fairly compensating everyone.

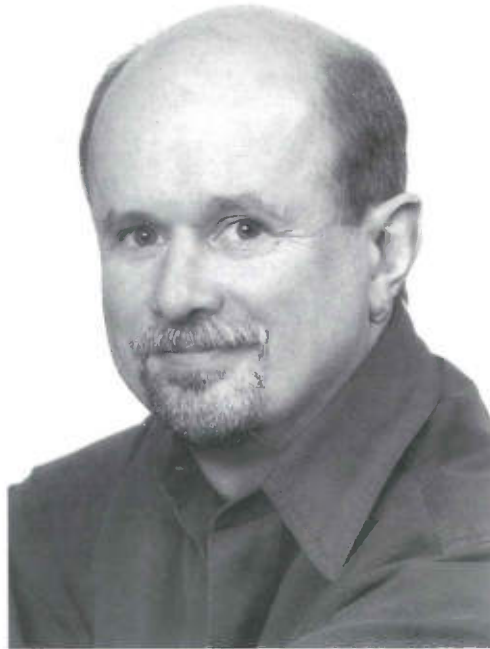
This method helps to combat piracy because it proves that downloading can be done in a secure and legal way. This also gives the courts ammunition to say to those sites distributing illegal files, that there is now a way for them to change their file formats to the legal ones. The US courts have already ruled to shut these sites down, but Napster has appealed. The courts are now making it extremely risky for venture capitalists to get involved in any site that does not offer secure legal files.

EMI has an equity stake in Portland, Oregon company SuperTracks – a digital service provider (DSP). Representatives of that company came to Toronto in May and gave a demonstration of how the system works from EMI's boardroom for six of Canada's major retailers, HMV, Sams, CDPlus, Chapters, Music World and Sunrise. The presentations were then repeated in Vancouver for Future Shop and A&B Sound.

The way this all works begins with EMI in Toronto sending a master tape of a song to SuperTracks. The song is then turned into a digital file, watermarked, securely encrypted and 'stored' in SuperTracks' digital warehouse. A link to this file is then established with the Canadian retailers' web site. The consumer logs on to the retail web site, goes to the area marked 'downloads' and reads about the titles offered.

When the consumer makes a selection, the

payment is arranged. The digital files can be added to the same 'shopping cart' that physical goods are currently purchased through. After the retailer has

confirmed payment, a digital 'note' is sent to SuperTracks clearing the file to be sent to the consumer. Once the file has been delivered, the consumer can burn the song to a CD (up to 2 burns), make up to 3 copies, transfer to portable devices, both 'trusted' – secure and insecure – MP3 players, and can re-install on their computer up to twice in a one-year period. This is enforced through the 'Digital Rights Management' which is right in the file. This 'DRM' is able to know how many times it has been burned, re-installed or ported to a secure device. Territory restrictions are respected by SuperTracks – for example, a US consumer cannot download from a Canadian site.

At this point in time, HMV are the only Canadian retailer fully integrated with SuperTracks to begin the commercial digital downloading, although

Adds Yeager, "We are pleased to have an ally in SpinRecords. While we credit Napster with raising awareness in the music industry and helping increase music sales, our view is that playing music without compensating artists is wrong. The SpinRecords and Soundom solution is a better way. It goes several steps beyond what Napster has tried to accomplish. It is a great move forward for the recording industry."

Yeager also noted, "We hope this will cause other sites to join in our belief that recording artists should be paid when people listen to their music."

Robert Shapiro, COO of SpinRecords, commented, "It's great to partner with Soundom. Soundom and SpinRecords both believe the same, simple principle that artists need to be compensated for their work. With Soundom.com sharing our music catalogue, both listeners and artists are open to much more exposure, which is great for everyone."

a number of the others are close to being ready. Other DSP's like Liquid Audio, and Amplified, will also be provided with EMI's files.

EMI's download initiative is currently set up in North America only for now, with the rest of the world to follow later this year. EMI in Canada's first download offer is a selection of previously unavailable songs from superstars The Tea Party, made available on July 4. The Tea Party were not only the first Canadian band, but also the first EMI band in the world to do a live internet broadcast back in March of 1994, so it is definitely fitting that they now hold the distinction of being the first Canadian band to do this.

EMI has cleared titles from other domestic artists including: Anne Murray, Moist, Sky, Renee Rosnes, Econoline Crush, Damhnait Doyle, Susan Aglukark, St. Lawrence String Quartet, David Wilcox, Bruce Guthro, and Kim Stockwood. While the US has cleared titles from international artists such as David Bowie, Tina Turner, Frank Sinatra, Everclear, Janet, Pink Floyd and Spice Girls. Where territory rights apply both catalogues will be combined.

This catalogue makes available music from all genres and all age demographics. The assumption currently is that the consumers downloading music are within a narrow age group and are interested in specific music. After the catalogue is available for a period of time, there will be real statistics of what consumers interests are and who is doing the purchasing. Prices for the downloads at present will be the same as in the physical world, at present \$3.99 list. Certain 'songs' are available as a single track, but the consumer is unable to 'cherry pick' from the album. The full album is a 'one file' download.

This new involvement in downloads from a major label and retailers should be the key solution to the recent problems with pirating. Fans will still have outlets to get the music they want and artists will be properly compensated for their talents and efforts. This opens up new marketing concepts as artists will now have the opportunity to record tracks specifically for download only. Consumers may then be able to obtain even more music from their favourite artists making this a win-win situation for everyone.

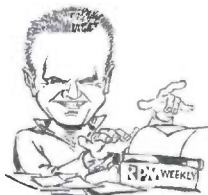
performance photos of the band, many of which have never been widely available before. By perusing the site, fans can personalize images with band graphics and logos or their own words, and design their own original works of art.

According to Cathy Cleghorn of Anthill Trading, the band's official merchandise agent, "This is a great method for fans to order tour posters and custom album artwork. Fans have always asked for merchandise items that were manufactured two or three years ago but are no longer in stock – now they can go to the gallery and re-create items they were looking for."

The new gallery has been implemented by Memories On Demand, a web-based digital imaging company. The images used are extremely high-resolution, with an average file size of 200 megabytes. The entire process is done online, including picking the images, customizing the order, and choosing the print material and size. All orders are conducted within a secure environment, and orders are ready to ship within ten days.

Memories On Demand's Mike Adams adds, "Any fan of The Tragically Hip will surely find this online gallery a vast treasure-trove of 'one-of-a-kind' images. It just isn't feasible for traditional printing technologies to reproduce such images."

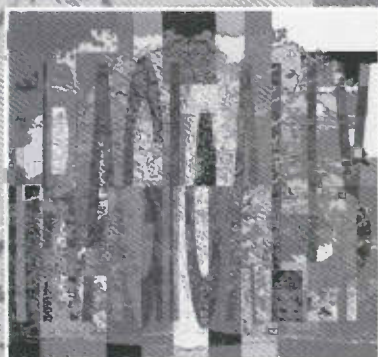

CHERELLE JARDINE - Pop

Pop is a catch-all category here. Add street-smart and alternative and that's what makes this CD an all encompassing piece of entertainment shrewdness. It's not too difficult to accept that the Toronto-born Jardine, who now lives in Richmond, BC, has been recording since 1993 and that this is her third album. With that experience comes a vocal confidence and caressing lyric interpretation of that of a veteran. Of course, her experience fronting a band from 1992 also goes in keeping with her nonchalant walk through this song material, all of which she wrote with well-known west coast tunesmith John Peacock. Jardine also has an impressive lineup of session people: Blue Rodeo's Basil Donovan (bass), Chilliwack's Gerry Adolphe (drums), Sarah McLachlan's David Sinclair (guitars), Megan Metcalf's Robbie Steininger (guitars) and Farmer's Daughters' Steve Hall (keyboards). Jardine produced the set with Sidney Perez. All tracks are 100% Cancon and the use of the MAPL logo assures that. That soft-sell vocal presence should gain Jardine an open door at both campus and A/C radio. All tracks are radio friendly and key here are We Are Love, Joel, So Beautiful and Inside The Silence. PAPICHULO CREW - Dance/Latin/Hip Hop

We got a little sidetracked and critiqued the EP of this dynamic duo (RPM New Releases - Aug 14/00). The single, now at radio, is titled Trippin' and Toronto's Energy 108 is all over it, which should also break out at CHR and A/C. There's an English and a Spanish mix of the single here as well. As previously mentioned, the vocal magic here belongs to Shantall and Shadow and the former is exquisite on the Been Told/Me Han Dieho, a Spanish/English

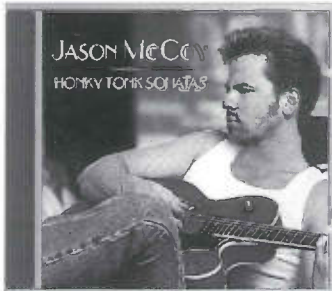


mix, a key track that should be a single. The mention of hip hop might cause some to reject this release, but the melding of hip hop with Latin and dance has been tastefully programmed by producer Alex Greggs, who has worked with Britney Spears, Christina Aguilera, 'N Sync, Love Inc., Blaque and Pink, which is pretty impressive, with obvious input from Shadow and Dennis 'Dow Jones' Shaw,

the manager of the band, who are credited as executive producers. If you were wondering what Papichulo Crew is all about, patch into El Monumento, their previous single which got the MuchMusic nomination nod as best dance video, and follow that up with Para Las Latinas. The album is perhaps somewhat restricted for radio with the exception of Been Told, but the entertainment value goes without question. There shouldn't be a dance club or rave event without this package. Some recording was done in Greggs' Orlando, Florida studio and at Red Light Audio in Toronto. No MAPL logos, but it's assumed some tracks are Cancon. No label would chance getting a radio station in trouble with the CRTC by suggesting something is that isn't. And, when it comes to clubs, Cancon or the lack of it, doesn't cut it with DJs. -WG

JASON McCoy - Country
Honky Tonk Sonatas

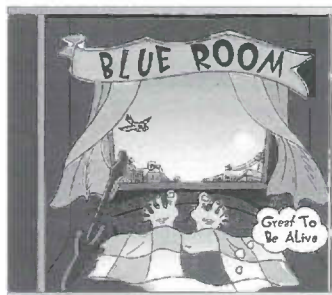
The unshaven McCoy fits the picture of his song material, a real door-opener into the wonderful and very popular world of honky tonk. He won his first Big Country Award as outstanding new artist in 1996 and has since cemented a solid relationship with Nashville



writers. Kind Of Like It's Love, the first single from the album, written by noted Music Row tunesmiths Jim Lauderdale and John Leventhal, has already scored a Top 10 (#9) hit for McCoy, who likes to think of the song as having a Roger Miller feel to it, "a cheesy sound by some standards ... and I never cut a shuffle before." And that's only the tip of the iceberg. With McCoy's penetrating vocal property, he masterfully wraps himself around the song message, perhaps more pronounced on Ten Million Teardrops, a song he wrote with fellow Canadian Tim Taylor, Fix Anything, which he wrote with Denny Carr, and Broke Down written with Odie Blackmon. McCoy hasn't rushed onto the contemporary or new country battlefield. These tracks are about as traditional as it gets, which should warm the hearts of those country programmers who have expressed concern for the way country music has been going. Although there is a pop feel to a couple of these tracks, which isn't a bad thing, McCoy plays it straight and he should come up a winner, particularly with the Jim Lauderdale and Frank Dycus penning of Doin' My Time In Bakersfield, a duet with Gary Allan, no slouch when it comes to hit records (he did it with Smoke Rings In The Dark and is currently charting with Lovin' You Against My Will). Lauderdale's penchant for writing and getting right to the heart of the message is also displayed on Whisper, another key track. Tunesmiths aside, it's that unmistakable McCoy vocal signature that turns on the ear. The youngster from Minesing, Ontario, one of the youngest to get his pilot's licence at age 16, is now a player in the big time of Nashville's country music. Produced by Odie Blackmon and Mike Poole, the album was recorded in Toronto and Nashville. -WG

BLUE ROOM - Good Times Music
Great To Be Alive

Rhythm and Blues is firmly established as a descriptive but we prefer to say Good Times Music, the kind enjoyed at a friendly tavern or with friends in a rec room or on a patio. That's what's offered here. Blue Room is comprised of Paul Sanderson (guitar), Fraser Lawrason (bass), Pat Quinn and Frank Watt (drums), Norm Ryan (saxophones) and Brian Neller (lead vocalist). The songs are all original and, as the late Lawrence Welk might have said, real toe tappers from Red Beans and Rice right through to Southbound Road. We've noticed



that on a first hearing, people's toes start to tap and by the second they're on their feet dancing. That's Good Times Music. 100% MAPL. -BW



BÉLA FLECK & THE FLECKTONES - Jazz

We're grateful for the bio notes confirming our thought that Béla Fleck and his Flecktones defy and indeed, defeat categorization. Let it suffice that the leader does things with a banjo that Eddie Condon might have envied. Add a backing of pure and electronic instruments playing orchestrations that favour the flavour of countries around the globe and you'll have the distinctively styled but wholly melodic jazz messages delivered here. It's a given that negative criticisms of performing arts must be reinforced by specifics but positive ones are excused. We're taking refuge in the latter and simply stating that this is an album to be enjoyed by everyone. It might be arcane but it's decidedly not esoteric. -BW

One wonders about an album of music that

Still, Yiddish will survive so long as there are champions of it such as Theresa Tova. An accomplished singer and actor whom we've enjoyed muchly in Ragtime and at the Stratford Festival, she here sings



Yiddish popular songs in a hugely evident and loving labour of love. What ever its source(s?) Yiddish is a language/dialect/patois what ever that can imbue otherwise mundane words with a richness of emotion unsurpassed even in Italian. Miss Tova expertly and-again-lovingly mines its rich ore to deliver a purity of musical emotionalism that stuns even the most otherwise dispassionate listeners. As proof, we offer the final song which is the only one previously familiar to us. The Great Depression song Brother, Can You Spare A Dime? sung in Yiddish brings tears to the eyes. JAKE - Pop

Hopefully, for these three young lads from Three Hills, Alberta, the current teen pop craze hasn't run its course just yet. With the proliferation of pop artists, one might think that Jake may have missed the bus. But given the fact that they're Canadian, and that they wrote and performed all their own material, perhaps they have a leg up on the many other artists in the genre. Brothers Toby, Marty and Josh Penner can not only sing and write, but they also supply most of the instrumental tracks on this record, strong testimony to the obvious talent in the family. The irony is that the trio was actually signed by Nashville-based Reunion Records, who saw the talent ahead of all the actual Canadian labels. Make no mistake, Jake is pure pop, with reasonably modest melodies and hooks couched in fairly standard 4/4 rhythms. And melodically, there's probably nothing here that hasn't been heard before. But the lads can sing, and they clearly have an instrumental punch that's a step ahead of most pop outfits. And there's clearly an abundance of radio potential here, with future singles left and right. Let Me Know has been tabbed as the lead single,



and has already made some impressive moves up the hit charts (#41 - Aug. 21/00). After that, Reunion/Zomba could choose from any number of possibilities - up-tempo options such as Waiting, The Right Time, Don't Want To Lose and Take My Heart Away - or more laid back, AC-type tracks like Melt Me or Believer. Of course, getting substantial airplay is one thing - actually selling some records is gonna have to involve the band getting out there and performing some live gigs. If there's one quibble, it's the fact that this record is coming out at the end of the summer, traditionally when teen pop music goes into hibernation. And again, there is still plenty of competition out there, among the Britney's and Backstreet's of the world. But the fact that they are more hands-on than most pop artists is a definite plus. Jake could very well put Three Hills, Alberta on the map, wherever that is. -RR

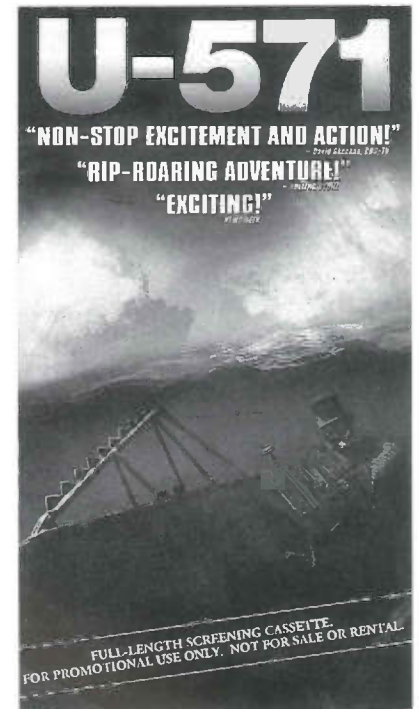

U-571 - Action/Drama

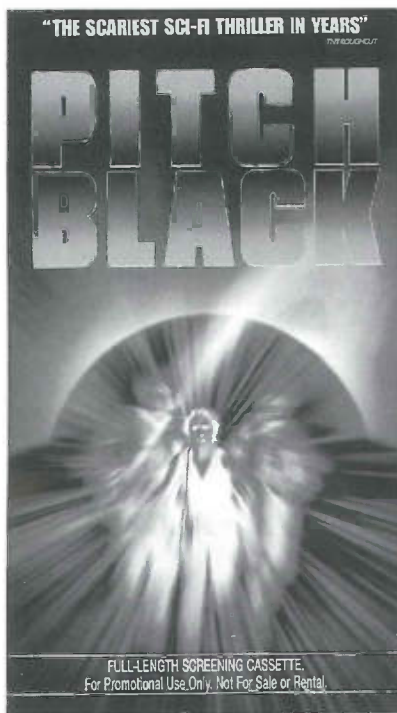

In the tradition of The Hunt For Red October and Das Boot comes this new submarine-based action/thriller, which generated over \$70 million at the box office. Like the classic Das Boot, U-571 takes place in World War II, and like the Wolfgang Petersen epic, it involves a lot of quiet, tense moments, and a lot of sweat. The story actually begins aboard a German U-boat, a sub that's been ravaged by depth charges and is losing power. When the German sub commander sends out a distress call, the call is intercepted by American intelligence operatives, who decide to send out an American sub to raid the U-boat and steal the highly-prize Enigma coding machine. The Enigma machine allows the German U-boats to conduct secret communication with the German high command, and the Allies can't crack the codes. Because of this, the Allied supply lines are taking a beating, and the Americans see this an opportunity to turn the tides of the war. The American boat sent out on the mission is captained by Bill Paxton (Twister, Apollo 13), with a crew that includes the disgruntled Matthew McConaughey (A Time To Kill, Contact), and Harvey Keitel (Reservoir Dogs, The Piano). The American sub races out to raid the German U-boat, but just when the situation seems in hand, a torpedo from an unseen German ship blasts the American boat from the water, and the surviving American sailors are forced to take refuge in the German U-boat. From there, the tension mounts, as the diminished American crew tries to stay alive, and keep the mission alive. The real star of the film is McConaughey, who struggles to keep his crew alive while the sub is being constantly threatened by German forces. While the film may be a tad bit rah-rah American, director Steve Mostow does a nice job in portraying the German crew as real people, not just a group of shadowy evil characters. This is one of those action-filled special effects films that likely works best on the big screen, but the potent human drama manages to make the film work on the small screen as well. - RR

PITCH BLACK - Sci-Fi/Thriller

Hide the kids and keep the lights on - Pitch Black was made to scare you, and it does the job quite nicely. Directed by David Twohy and starring a cast of relative unknowns, Pitch Black takes place in the



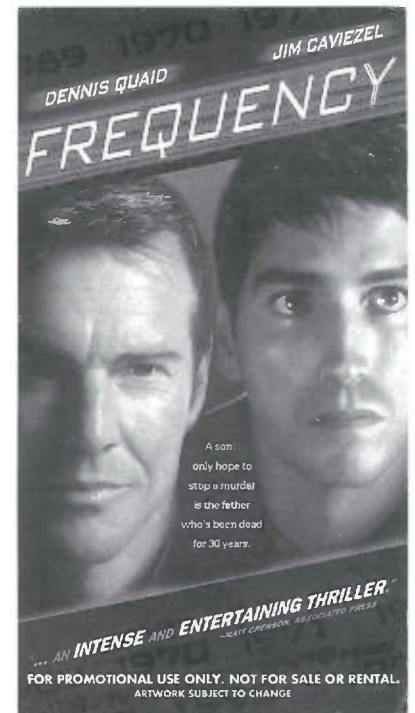
future, aboard a deep space craft carrying a crew of passengers traveling to an unnamed destination. Of course, the names of the actors or characters are somewhat superfluous in a film like this – the more characters there are, the more fodder there is for the monsters. The ship is suddenly bombarded by a meteor shower, and after a harrowing descent (during which the captain tries to jettison the passengers to ease the rate of descent), the ship crash lands on a barren, desert planet that appears lifeless. It appears lifeless, but we know better. The surviving crew and

passengers make a brief survey of the planet, and eventually find a 20-year-old human settlement that now appears deserted. When one of the passengers attempts to explore a small cave, he's quickly and violently ripped to pieces by some unseen force. Before long, the group discovers that the apparently sole inhabitants of the planet are a species of bird-like reptilian creatures, who's sole purpose appears to be flying and eating (of course, it makes you wonder what the creatures were eating before the humans arrived, but anyway). Like most monster movies, the question becomes which of the group will survive, and how many different and disgusting ways the director can show someone's death. Director Twohy films the planet scenes in a rather drab, sepia tone, adding a measure of desolation to the travelers' plight. The group eventually discovers that the creatures are wary of the light, which is great, until the planet is blanketed under a total eclipse, and the crew is forced to scramble for safety, searching for any source of light they can find. The entire second half of the film takes place in the dark, with the creatures flashing in out of the darkness to claim more victims. Eventually, the crew's fate is placed in the hands of their tough female captain, and a slightly deranged killer who was imprisoned aboard the ship prior to the crash. Pitch Black definitely isn't for the younger set, with plenty of violence and tension – but older viewers will get a solid two hours of entertainment. -RR
