New Syndrome obtains and markets tunes through the facilities of Vancouver Publishing in Canada and Jack & Jill Music and Sherman-Devorzon Music in the U.S. Valiant Records of Hollywood, California will handle U.S. distribution.

METCALFE'S CASTLE HOME OF MOD BEAT

The Castle in St. Catherines, Ontario has been tabbed the most beautiful teen club in North America, and where the "in" crowd originated. The Castle is now the official home of Canada's Mod Beat and where the "Carnaby Street Canada Look" originated. The Castle is owned and operated by Ron Metcalfe who, a few short years ago, topped the American Hit Parade with his instrumental recording of "Twisting At The Woodchoppers' Ball". The Ron Metcalfe orchestra, 17 musicians, 2 vocalists and a vocal group, was billed as "The Most Exciting Dance Band in the Land" and toured throughout the United States and Canada. It was this knowledge of the business that has set Metcalfe apart from most promoters and club owners. He knows what his audience wants and knows how to go about giving it to them. Groups who have appeared at his posh Castle have come away with a new slant on stage presentation. Exclamations of "Wow, man you've got to see it to believe it" or "We've never sounded so good". Teenagers from all over Ontario and the surrounding U.S. states of New York, Ohio and Pennslyvania make The Castle a weekly habit.

It was The Castle where the British Modbeats were discovered by Ron Metcalfe, It was the enthusiastic response of the patrons of The Castle who convinced Metcalfe that he had a group with the greatest potential in Canada. The next step was to put the boys on wax and he picked Canada's most successful record producer, Stan Klees, who as president of Tamarac Record Productions, had been instrumental in boosting the image of many of the well known groups in Canada. Klees is now the only contributing producer for the well known Red Leaf label, and Tamarac productions have been hits on Columbia, Capitol, Quality, Rca Victor and Apex in Canada as well as several U.S. labels, so came well recommended for the job of obtaining the best in sound from the British Modbeats and putting it where it counts, on a marketable disc. The Modbeats first release on Red Leaf "Whatcha Gonna Do About It" had an advance order of 1000 from the area where they were best











known. At present the boys are on a promotion tour of England where they have an active fan club, which came about through a picture story on them in a British magazine. The Modbeats are Canadian and make their home in St. Catharines. Booking is handled by Image Artists Representatives, 3 King St. St. Catharines. Fan Club president is Lynda Johnson. 11 Phelps St. St. Catharines, Ontario.

Calgary: Johnny Harlow, who has just released "Remember Baby" on Sparton, has been getting the best in support from radio stations throughout the west. Harlow has just joined the popular Western Canadian recording group, The S'Quires, as featured singer and organist. Television shows have been set up in many of the Western cities. The group will debut on Calgary's CHCT's "Guys and Dolls" and will give the public a chance to catch their new Carnaby Street Mod look.

Chuck Benson sends more news on the Associated Commercial Travellers and the CFRN Edmonton "Search For Talent". The program is aired each Saturday night beginning at 8:00 PM. The show discontinues for the summer and picks up again in Sept. Saturdays 7:30 to 8 PM John Barron, Assistant Production Manager, of CFRN, hosts "This Is Canada". The entire program ranges in subjects from Canadian writers to singers and instrumentalists. Monday evenings CFRN broadcasts live from the Caravan Motel (The Penthouse) featuring The Gordon Schmidt Quartet.

Charles Picot joins the full time announce staff at CKBC in Bathurst, New Brunswick and takes over the 8 PM to 12:30 AM time slot. Denis Menard moves into the 4 to 8 PM shift with four hours of the popular music on "Sound Spectacular" Parts 1,2 and 3. Denis sends news that the greatest thing to happen in the area is a song called

"Were We Wrong", which is based on the Truscott Affair and recorded by a local group. The song is not available on record as yet. Denis produced this hot little master and from the response it received on "Canadian Showcase", it could be a hit. Record companies interested should contact Denis Menard at CKBC. June 14 was the scene of a packed arena when Canada's Wilf Carter headlined a giant Country show which also starred Kitty Wells, Johnny Wright, Ruby Wright, BIII Phillips and The Tennessee Mountain Boys. CKBC's country spinner, AI Hebert, taped telephone interviews with the stars prior to their appearance which resulted in good listener reaction.

With CKLY Lindsay going 24 hours, their personalities move to new air times. Tex Bagshaw 6-9 AM, Bob Carter 9 AM-1 PM, Dick Alberts 4-9 PM, Fred Darke 9-12 MN and Roy Pett and Carl Hanshaw MN to 6 AM. To keep their holiday listeners abreast of traffic news, CKLY maintains a Marine cruiser on the waterways weekends and Wednesday afternoons, with their mobile traffic cruiser on the road seven days a week.

"The Night Show" with CKBI's John Wessel goes remote every Wednesday between 9 and 10 PM from one of Prince Alberts more progressive Drive-Ins. John took along Larry Christle for the first show which packed them in and pleased the sponsor so much that the show will now be a weekly feature. A similar broadcast was performed for the opening of a new sport centre and again CKBI was instrumental in bringing out an enthusiastic audience. Larry Christle, in addition to programming and air chores on radio, now moves into an hour daily presentation at noon on CKBI-TV. He joins hosts Jim Scarrow and Mery Samborsky to form a threesome for "Junction", a news entertainment package.

Bob Bacon moves from VOCM to CFCB Corner Brook Nfld. and would like to be placed on the mailing list of those record companies wishing exposure on the No. 1 station in Western Nfld.

Glenn A. Cooper moves from CHIC Brampton to CKMP in Midland, Ont. and finds himself in the midst of celebrations in honour of a boost in power from 250 to 1000 watts, the seventh year anniversary of broadcasting for CKMP and the (unofficial) beginning of the tourist season. Beginning June 30 at 1 PM, CKMP's "67 Hour Radio Marathon" will begin with Glenn and Brian Henderson Staying mike-side until Sunday morning at 8 (July 3). Theme for the show is "If we can take it, you surely can". Format for this important holiday outlet is adult programming daytime with evening and all-nite for the younger set.

Dave Charles will be boosting more of the Canadian Sound in the Quinte area through the summer months because of the great influx of American visitors to the holiday country throughout the

plete show (May 30) to Chad Allen and The Guess Who. ///Paul Revere and The Raiders move into the Winnipeg Arena July 8 and will get a giant assist from local favourites, The Fifth and The Deverons.///The Rolling Stones make their appearance in town July 14 at the Arena. On the same bill will be the McCovs. Standells, and Winnipeg's Huntsmen.///The Byrds made it to the Auditorium June 23 and had their show beefed up by locals. The Fifth and The Shondells.///Hunter and Wong have left The Shondels. Al Johnson and Bill Wallace are the replacement crew. ///Orest Andrews, formally of The Syndicate replaces Bruce Decker with The Deverons.///The Tom Northcott single of "Going Down" has been getting good exposure in the Peg. ///The Secret's release of "Crying Over Her" has been getting good action in Winnipeg. This Toronto based group will be the main attraction at Teen A Go Go (Teen Fair) at the Red River Ex. June 24 through July 2. There will be local groups playing throughout this area which has been set aside for the teens. Frank Wiener is the man behind this venture and is one of the big men pushing Canadian talent in the city through his Teen Night Club, The Hungry "I". Frank also manages the Columbia recording group, The Shondels.//Winnipeg is girding itself for an explosion of local talent. Some of the better known groups have been coming up with some real "tuff" sounding demos and a credit to them is their choice of original material over the borrowed kind. 


