While many stations across the nation are creating more exposure time for the best in Canadian talent, Winnipeg, already known internationally because of the success of The Guess Who, will have to sit back and wait to have their talent discovered by other more Canadian minded centres.

Grandstand show for not promoting home grown talent. Nobleman had his chance with television viewers last Monday night, when he appeared on CBC-TV "Viewpoint" and roundly criticized the CNE, Expo '67, the CBC and CTV television networks for not putting more emphasis on the use of Canadian talent. Nobleman also suggested a more sound form of monitoring the broadcast media to make sure television outlets maintain their 55% content ruling. This ruling applies only to television stations.

ity' - see this, don't miss that, gear, fab, Carnaby Street, etc. - so much so, that they can no longer see the truth. They flock after the 'fad agents like pigeons looking like prosaic crumbs and invariably wind up disillusioned!' He continues "some, the ones with depth, see what is going on but even they don't seem to understand. The whole scene is just a void or a blank space. The agents are using these suggestable kids for financial gains for their own pockets. The kids - they turn to drugs, goof, joints, and so on. It seems such a pointless and endless existence. After midnight in the streets of London's Soho or Kensington districts, kids just walk around aimlessly, looking, I suppose, for something tangible to know and understand, something that makes any kind of sense. I guess the kids here have a lot in common with their cousins in other parts of the world."

I asked BARRY for his thoughts on the British group scene.... "Over here, I've seen the best groups in the world, and in general the bands are more ambitious, so much so that a lot of throat cutting and back stabbing goes on, more than would be expected. Most of the groups I have met were friendly and openly expressed what seems to be the common objective - to go to America and 'clean up'!"

A note to those people who like advance information on the big names of the future. Remember the name THE MOVE. We caught their act the other night in a Soho club and WOW. Five members in this group consisting of three guitars a drummer who can sing a low "E" and a vocalist with a fantastic voice, put on a stage performance such as I have never seen. Their closing number, "Watch Your Step" lasts 18 minutes and features a five minute drum solo and guitars being "cross played" and then chorded with a violin bow. It has to be seen to be believed.
