

"Ballet High" treads on sacred ground

When the Royal Winnipeg Ballet and RCA recording group, Lighthouse, move front and centre on the stage of Toronto's St. Lawrence Arts Centre Aug 1st., they will begin a week of experimentation which treads on sacred ground. never before toyed with. "Ballet High" as the show is billed, would appear to be an affront to those who regard the art of ballet as an untouchable and the only surviving link with the high brow musical past. One might however, look at the age bracket enjoying, or pretending to enjoy, ballet and perhaps agree with this diversionary tactic in ballet production. It is obvious that ballet is a victim of the generation gap and what the Royal 'Peg's Brian Macdonald has done, is to attempt to mount a ballet that could, with the help of Lighthouse, bridge the dreaded generation gap with a hoped for interest by the young sophisticates - in one of the finer arts.

The Ballet Company is made up of 25 dancers and they like to stress, "no principals". The first half of the show has seven acts with the complete Company and Lighthouse on stage warming up, as the first act. This is fol-lowed by "Taking A Walk", a dance by Sandy Nadal; Christine Hennessy executing Ravel's "Bolero" (Miss Hennessy received rave reviews in Europe and the U.S. on the Company's recent tour); the fourth act has a large portion of the Company taking part in "Eight Loves of Bread"; with a dance improvisation making up the fifth act.

Act 6 has been tagged "A surprise", which will probably be "Ballet High", the first rock ballet; and the complete Company with Lighthouse on stage, take part in a repeat of "Eight Loves of Bread".

"The Shining People of Leonard Cohen" kicks off the second half. Two dancers will perform over the reading of several Cohen poems. It is hoped that Cohen will be on stage to do honours to the reading.

For the final act, Lighthouse goes into the orchestra pit for another of Macdonald's ballets, "Five Over Thirteen".

All in all "A Ballet High" sounds extremely interesting. The only terror that could possibly strike the hearts of balletomains is the inclusion of the group, Lighthouse.

Lighthouse however, is somewhat of a phenomenon themselves. By all that's real and believable in



BRIAN MacDONALD this industry, Lighthouse shouldn't even exist. At first glimpse they look like a giant jigsaw puzzle and soundwise, you either dig immediately or are just too embarrassed to admit you don't understand. You pretend anyway, because Lighthouse has proven, in the almost unbelievable span of one year, that they do communicate, and they do sell records, in Canada. They're on their third album "Piecing It All Together" and it would appear to be their strongest, to date. This is an indication their sound is catching nationally. Scott Richards, promotion manager for RCA (Ontario

Tenth Mariposa may be last

The tenth annual Mariposa Festival, held on the Toronto Islands this past weekend (24, 25, 26), created, in many of us, mixed emotions. It was billed as the "gentle festival", and it was. It was also, musically, one of the most complete and satisfying any of the audience had seen. To try to talk about the acts and their merits is futile. They were all great and they were all together. Suffice it to say that some of the biggest names in folk/country/blues were represented. In most cases, the performers had as much fun, if not more than the audience.

Toronto Islands, overlooking smogchoked Toronto, are, comparitively, a paradise in a desert, a daisy in a municipal dump. They are a beautiful setting for a festival and the trees, grass and water lent a friendly, homely atmosphere. Given this setting, the organizers of Mariposa came up with unbelievable sound, great staging and lighting, and superb organization. The audience could have asked for no more and the Mariposa people could have given no more. Superlatives become stale and meaningless when trying to describe what actually went on. There is only one way to know, and that is to have been there. Anyone who missed that opportunity passed by what may prove to be their last chance to be a part of the spirit that is Mariposa.

The Mariposa festival is a non-profit effort, devoted to the furtherance of folk music in North America. It has become one of the most respected and well-known events of its kind in the world and is acclaimed for its top level performances as well as its "good vibes". This year, for the first time, it was the victim of the ignorant and mis-directed disturbances of the vocal minority who demand to hear "their" music free of charge. There is nothing wrong with the protesting of some of the inflated admission charges at various musical events in this country, but the Mariposa festival is provided, without a profit to the promoters, with only nominal fees to major performers, with a sound system unequalled at the most expensive concerts, in a setting unlike any other and with all remaining monies going to the support of folk music. Mariposa is, in fact, devoted to the fostering of "the peoples' music" and as such deserves the whole-hearted support of everyone, from the pocket book.

The damn fools who disrupted this year's festival may well be the cause of its cancellation in future years. Be it on their stupid and ill informed heads. Be it on their heads that one of the most peaceful and complete festivals in the world may cease to exist through their greed.



Mullan Upped to National Promotion-A&M

Liam Mullan, who joined A&M less than six months ago, has been appointed National Promotion Director for A&M Records (Canada)

Prior to joining A&M, Mullan had become highly successful in pro-



motion with record companies, and in the broadcasting profession. The latter with Montreal's CKGM.

His first appointment with A&M was to oversee promotional activities with the label's Ontario west to British Columbia distributor, Capitol Records. He has been instrumental in breaking several singles and creating a highly lucrative market for new A&M album product.

One of Mullan's greatest triumphs was the success of "A Song Of Joy" by Miguel Rios. His collaboration with the powerful pop writer Ritchie Yorke and Canada's top rated radio station, CFRB (first introduced to Toronto listeners by their George Wilson) was instrumental in bringing top attention to the disc. A subsequent promotion push broke the record nationally and forced a U.S. release. The record has since become one of the top sellers in the U.S.

In making the announcement of Mullan's new appointment, Gerry Lacoursiere, Managing Director of A&M's Canadian operation, noted: "Mullan is one of those rare finds and the type of person we so desperately need in our industry."

Sounds Canadian Goes Int'l

Capitol of Canada has now had two artists appear in the American trade charts since the inception of the Sounds Canadian promotion in early spring. First to break was the Edward Bear discing of 'You Me and Mexico', a number one record in Canada. Now the Anne Murray single, 'Snowbird', is beginning to climb the charts of the three major charts below the border. 'Snowbird' was written by Gene McLellan and produced by Brian Ahern, both Canadians.

Capitol confirmed this week that 'Snowbird' is set for rush release by EMI, the Capitol parent firm in England. Paul White, director of A&R, reports Anne's latest album release, 'Honey, Wheat and Laugh-

Feinberg has a Message in Disc

The Vanguard press release notes, "Abraham Feinberg has been doing unpredictable things throughout his long and distinguished career." David Street of the Toronto Telegram headlines his After Four story with "An aged rebel and the voice of youth". The Toronto Star's Jim Beebe came up with "Rabbi Feinberg takes up singing again" and RPM's Album Pick, not to be confused with review, brings to light the fact that the royalties go to orphaned children in North and South Viet Nam, suggesting "push it for that reason, if no other".

The warm intros by the dailies and the cold facts revealed by RPM are somewhat akin to the life of this seventy

year-old Rabbi Emeritus of Holy Blossom Temple in Toronto. He has been warmly received around the world and he has gotten the cold shoulder almost as often. He is "peace" personified and bears the peace sign as proudly as he does the Star of David. One of his warm receptions was from a University of Toronto student when he stated: "War is the ultimate degradation. It gives profit priority over people: power over personality, machinery over man and violence over love, joy and freedom."

Feinberg's recent visit to Hanoi caused quite a stir on Ambassador Row in Ottawa resulting in the loss of his U.S. passport, which has since been returned. If there was any just cause for fighting the establishment, you could be sure Feinberg would be front and centre, perhaps one of the prime reasons for his being able to overcome the generation gap...even more so than Marshall McLuhan, who, ironically, wrote a portion of the liner notes for the album. Notes McLuhan: "With un-



diminished zest and empathy for this mass vehicle, he celebrates the marriage of rock and religion in the cause of the world's children."

Rather than going on and on about Feinberg the lion-hearted, which may or may not take away from the value of his Vanguard recording, "I Was So Much Younger Then", let's look at this attempt to bridge the hawk/dove gap. This is an amazing voice with an extremely well put together "live" message. It's antiestablishment but with a twist. The Rabbi's sincerity is obvious and at times he even appears to be fighting the lush backing, which suggests he was opposed to its gimmickry in the first place. Nevertheless, the backing is superbly done and does add that ingredient which would probably be missing with a simpler background. It should be noted that the album was cut at Bay Studios in Toronto and produced by Brian Ahern and Athan Katsos. Ahern and Tommy Graham are also heard on lead and bass guitars. Other notable Toronto musicians included on the session are Pat Riccio Jr., Brian Browne, Bill Speer, Miles Wilkinson and producer Katsos. Canadian copyrights are strongly represented on the album. These include Art Gee's "Warm Traitor's Breath", "Good Things" by James Bennett, Michael Stanbury's "Bells of Saint Pierre", "Story of Isaac" by Leonard Cohen and others.

It's not likely that Rabbi Abraham L. Feinberg will become an overnight recording giant, but it is almost certain he'll create a new and highly sensitive market. Others have attempted to generate a "peace crusade" on disc, but none have been as qualified. Whether you're a Dogan, suffer from Orangeitis, or have no religion whatsoever, Tony Frome, "Poet Prince of the Airwaves" (1935) communicates, beautifully, now, in 1970.

The MLS Report, submitted by Chairman Roy Hennessy (CKLG) noted that the Chariman refused to accept 2 records on the basis they were B sides of recent submissions. In view of the volume of discs being submitted (15 to 20 per call), the submission of B sides or resubmission of singles will not be accepted unless they are accompanied with proof of their potential through charts and sales and other pertinent information.





This call also saw discussions with regards to biographies and the necessity of having these with the discs submitted. The MLS are looking for a word other than "biography". They are looking for the recording history and background of the group and the record. They would also like to know when they play, with whom, where and past recording experiences. Information on who produced the disc is also desirable and what success he has had in studios before. What portion of the record meets the Canadian content is also requested. Notes Hennessy: "This type of information is invaluable to us in making our judgment on new product."

Ampex proudly announces the release of Jesse Winchester's first single from his first LP

Montreal - Jesse Winchester arrived in Montreal early in the summer of 1967. He moved because of the Draft . . Now Winchester has an album out (on Ampex), produced by the Band's Robbie Robertson. It is a firm, beautifully performed and composed record, one that will surely mark Winchester as one of the important singer-songwriters. The fact that Robertson plays lead guitar on the album and that Levon Helm chips in on drums and mandolin here and there is bound to be of interest. But it is Winchester's album through and through, conveying a unique personal sensibility.

Winchester's music is rich in its depth and heritage, as it is a consummation of everything he grew up with. Hissound is clean, like the Band's, Southern, with measures of rock and roll, gospel, even jazz – whatever comes naturally.

He sings as he writes, in a

gentle but strong voice. He's a relaxed, perfectly paced singer, possessing beautiful ballad phrasing and plenty of funk on uptempo numbers. Winchester, like the best singer-songwriters, does not separate words, music and performance – it's all one thing.

"It used to be that a song could get across all the feeling you wanted from very, very simple words. Now the word has become more important. But, to me, I still like a sound song. I don't like a lotta words. The fewer the better, the simpler the

better . . . in everything."

Winchester simply sings away, with nothing forced or put-on. The back-ups are fluid and mellow, rocking and rolling and, at times, just being quiet about it. The album, recorded in Toronto, is also a fine production achievement for Robertson, simply because he has remained faithful to the singer.





Lightfoot Receives Canada Medal

For a country of doves we sure have a lot of medal awarding going on. Gordon Lightfoot has been awarded the Medal of Service by the Order of Canada. Nice to see Miss Streisand's friend allowing token recognition of the Canadian recording industry, if indeed he



is. Now might be a good time to suggest that the government declare one of our prime time months as Canadian Talent Month. Perhaps the next time that New York visitor comes in for a visit maybe someone could arrange for her to be entertained with a bit of Canadiana in the green room of the PM's official residence. Anyway, perhaps we should be thankful for small favours. We finally have a Canadian recording artist with a government award.///Have you ever seen so many Canadian records making the scene? I hope you're listening to them, and carefully, because you are sitting front and centre for one of the biggest shows of strength this country has ever witnessed. The **Canadian Recording Industry** is flexing its muscles, and there's a lot of bread being laid out for record sessions. Surprisingly enough the discs are beginning to show a return. Paul Misener, one of the really progressive record retailers (we know this is true, by the mere fact that he returns his RPM Report Sheet, faithfully), is finding an almost unbelievable increase in sales for Canadian product. Apparently radio listeners throughout the Alliston area, where his record bar is located, and Barrie are switching their listening habits from the Toronto Top 40 giant to several other stations. Even CFRB is attracting many young listeners. Top seller at Misener's is the Guess Who single "Hand Me Down World", followed closely by "As The Years Go By" by Mashmakhan with Anne Murray's "Snowbird" making disc sales look good for native talent. R. Dean Taylor's "Indiana Wants Me" has shown indications of being a giant.///Brian H. Master, rock music director and jock at C-HOW Welland has Leigh Ashford's "Country Place" as "One of the biggest Canadian happenings at this station." The group has played the Peninsula several

times since the release of their RCA deck which probably accounts for their popularity.///Terry David Mulligan, of CKVN Vancouver, into Toronto setting down a series of commercials for Molson's. He reports top listener reaction to the station's album content. Mother Tucker's Yellow Duck is getting the 'VN red carpet treatment, along with Northcott. Howie Vickers ("Rum Ditty") and Anne Murray ./ '/Gerry Thom, of CJDV Drumheller, lists Mashmakhan as the top selling Canadian group with Tom Northcott, a close second. Gerry has a couple of solid breakout items in Cat's "Marian" and "Ten Pound Note" by Steel River.


Leeds Pushing Norman Flip

'Love is All', but the flip has come in for a round of good promotion by Leeds Music that could bring it out on top. Actually, both sides have been receiving top exposure throughout the province of Quebec. but the Leeds' copyright, 'That's Part of Being Your Man', was written by Ross Allen, a Canadian, and someone whose name 'you're going to hear a lot of in the future" says Leeds' Al Allbutt. Norman, who has been playing the popular Claude St. Jean Steak House in Montreal for the past three years. is one of the rare new breeds of French-Canadian. He is capable of transferring sincerity in song in either French or English. The single is a one hundred per cent Canadian production.



and Manitoba) will attest to their disc power in both provinces and their growing potential as a Today's Sound group. He finds them an easy group to sell because of their unpredictable enthusiasm. Both Paul Hoffert and Skip Prokop, who head up Lighthouse, consistantly come up with ingenius methods of promoting the group. They have already integrated their sound, successfully, with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, and after this ballet experiment will no doubt come up with another invasion of righteous listening - all of which makes for good reading and promotional gold.

The 20 member group have just returned from an Ontario Government sponsored trip to Expo '70 where they performed in the Province's Pavilion, which will no doubt add to their importance in the international market. They, at first, had some difficulty with bookings but appear to have overcome this problem. They now have bookings a full year in advance.

Brian Macdonald, a Montrealer by birth, is one of Canada's most distinguished gentlemen of international ballet. After formal and university training in the bi-bi town (McGill), he became a music critic for the Montreal Herald (1949). He became increasingly interested in the ballet scene and received extensive ballet training under several noted teachers. He was one of the first members of the National Ballet of Canada which was cut short by an accident, causing severe arm injuries.

Turning to teaching and choreographing for local television he produced several ballets for the CBC-TV's "Concert Hour". He became known nationally for his choreography and direction as well as playing the lead in "My Fur Lady", which toured Canada for 18 months.

In 1958 he became associated with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet. <u>He was appointed official choreo-</u> grapher to the Company, five years later. By this time he had proven himself with "The Darkling", "Les Whoops-De-Doo", "Pas D'Action", and "While The Spider Slept".

Receiving a senior fellowship from the Canada Council he was able to study in Leningrad, New York, Copenhagen and London. The year he became Artistic Director of the Royal Swedish Ballet, his "Aimez-Vous Bach?" was awarded the gold medal in Paris at the second International Festival of the Dance.

Macdonald works have been danc-

ed by world famous Combanies including: The Deutsche Opera Ballet of Berlin, The London Festival, Dutch National and Ballet Contemporains of France.

Canada honoured Macdonald in July of 1967 when he was presented with the Service Medal of the Order of Canada.

Three new ballets were mounted by Macdonald in 1970, which were to be unveiled during the Ottawa and Toronto engagements.

"A Ballet High" under which these engagements are billed, is the first rock ballet — which should prove interesting from that standpoint alone.

CKGM Making Changes well that the station must now decide

Geoff Sterling's CKGM FM in Montreal, underground voice to that city's youth, has come to the point where it must make changes in order to survive. CKGM shifted to underground format with little or no emphasis on making money, but that policy seems to have succeeded so well that the station must now decide whether it should continue to depend on its AM sister for financing or pay its own way, mainly by a drastic reduction in overhead. Among the plans being discussed is one involving the wholesale importation of taped underground shows, thus dispensing with costly on-air staff. Another solution

would be a subscription set up, in which the station would be supported by voluntary donations from the listening community. According to station manager, Jim Sward, the right course lies somewhere between the two. Financial troubles have reached the point where a benefit concert was held for the station featuring Mashmakhan. Jesse Winchester, Albert Failey. Coven, Chris Kearney, Bruce Murdoch, and others. Dave Bist, writing in the Montreal Gazette, pointed out that solid community support behind the station could bring the attention of national advertisers to the station and make it a self-sustaining operation.

Hunter on Promo Tour

Tommy Hunter, Columbia recording artist and host of the 'Tommy Hunter Show' on the CBC, is currently touring the country with the cast of the weekly show. The show is drawing capacity crowds everywhere. During the group's stopover in Saskatchewan, they dropped in at CJGX, Yorkton.
