

RCA APPOINTS MURPHY PROD MGR FOR ABC

John Murphy has been appointed to the post of National Product Manager for ABC Records labels in Canada. Murphy will be responsible for release planning and development of promotion programs for the ABC labels.

In making the above announcement. Robert F. Cook, Vice-President and General Manager of the Record Division of RCA Limited, noted: "John has always displayed outstanding creative ability in his position as Regional Promotion Manager. This, complete with his previous sales experience, will be an asset in providing turther growth of the ABC Records pro-duct in Canada". Cook went on to explain: "Our relationship with ABC/Dunhill dates back to 1968. BLACK CREEK TAPES MOVIE SOUNDTRACK

The Toronto-based Black Creek have completed the taping of the soundtrack for the Canadian movie, "Search". The session was produced by Cliff Edwards at Toronto Sound Studios. The movie script was written by Martin Lager and produced by Burg Productions of Toronto and was shot throughout Ontario.

Black Creek members, Nick Whitehead, Mark Haines and Steve Goldberger co-wrote the musical score for the movie which is published through Static Free Music (CAPAC). Other members of Black Creek are: Jayce Ford and Dave Pearce.

Release dates for the movie and the soundtrack album have not been confirmed at time of writing however, the movie will open in several cities throughout Canada and the U.S. An album session for Black Creek is also in the offing with Edwards producing. Steve Propas and Neill Dixon are now negotiating for a label contract.

The Blue Grass group have just completed two successful club dates in Toronto where they played to capacity houses at the El Mocambo and Chimney. They now head north for several dates including Laurentian University, Sudbury (Jan.30 to Feb.1) followed by Fiddler's Green, North Bay (3-8), the Harbour Room, Owen Sound (10-15) and back up to Sudbury to the Brockday from Feb. 17 through Mar. 1.

GAIETY'S CARROLL BAKER MAKING NATIONAL GAINS

Gaiety's sweetheart, Carroll Baker, is beginning to register national gains on her newest single release, "I've Never Been This Far Before". Baker is going it alone this time – without the Canadian content crutch. Her new single was written by Conway Twitty and it was during her appearance at the Country Music Association International Show in Nashville, when she first introduced her version of the song.

Joe Walker, Executive Director of the CMA, in a letter to the young Gaiety star, noted: "What a superb performance you gave at CMA's 1974 International Show. Your performance was electrifying and added a great deal of spice and vigor to the show".

Baker also performed the song at RPM's Big Country where she received assurances from Canadian country radio personalities that she needn't apologize for the single not being Canadian in content — they were ready to play the single on release. Reaction has been similar where she has performed the song at jamborees and at club dates, and was the door opener for her to appear in the U.S. as part of the Faron Young and David Houston package.

CANADIAN BRASS TO TOUR THE MARITIMES

The Canadian Brass, the first to release under the Boot Concert Master Series label, have been scheduled for a ten day tour of the Maritimes commencing Jan 25. at St. John's Memorial University. This date is preceded by an afternoon workshop for students. Also on the itinerary are dates at the Dalhousie Arts Centre in Halifax and the completion of their tour (Feb. 3) at Mount Allison University in Sackville, New Brunswick. The popular quintet will then return to the Hamilton Philharmonic where they are artists-in-residence.

The Canadian Brass recently released their second album, "Canadian Brass In Paris", produced by Eleanor Sniderman in one of France's national monuments – St. Chapelle. The group had been invited to France as representatives of Canada at the

lan Tyson and his crew -- Sylvia and the Great Speckled Bird -- move out on their annual Canadian concert tour Feb. 5 with a date at Kirkland Lake. They work their way through Northern Ontario with dates in Timmins (6), Haileybury (7) and North Bay (8).

The Tyson show's first leg west sees them in Brandon for two shows (15), followed by Vermilion, Alberta (17), Edmonton (18), Victoria (19) and Port Alberni, B:C. (20).

Back into Alberta to Ponoka (21) and up to Golden, B.C. (22) before heading east once again. They move into Saskatoon (24), and down to Regina (25) before their Winnipeg date (25) and finally back into Ontario with dates in Thunder Bay (27) and their tour capper in Sault Ste. Marie (28).

Tyson has been making his yearly tour during a break in his CTV taping. The show, produced and directed by Michael Steele in the studios of CFTO-TV is seen Mondays at 7PM EST on the complete CTV Network.

Tyson's single, "She's My Greatest Blessing", is currently enjoying action on the RPM Country Playlist. The single was culled from his A&M album.

European Festival 1974. The Canadian Brass' initial album release, "Canadian Brass", set a record for sales of Canadian classical recordings, the first two months of release.

Commencing in May of this year, the Canadian Brass will tour western Canada and, beginning in July, will take up a six week residency at the Banff School of Fine Arts.

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COVER STORY COLUMBIA SCORES FIRST WITH DISCOS

Discotheques would appear to be the next big happening for the record industry according to trade talk over the past few months. Much of the talk has been on the growth and importance of discos in the U.S. with the Canadian trade, generally, overlooking their own market. Discos in Quebec, of course, have been part of that scene for many years, but just recently gained a great deal of importance because of their power in selling records that wouldn't normally receive important "radio" exposure. Columbia's Montreal branch office suddenly found themselves breaking hits and selling in excess of thirty thousand singles in Montreal alone. One single, in particular, was "Marmalade Lady" by La Belle.

Not so, replied Columbia's national promotion director, Charlie Camilleri, who got together with Ontario Branch Manager Eddie Colero and his two promotion reps, Mike Watson and Terry McGee. They were of the opinion that there was a growth pattern emerging

insofar as discos in Ontario were concerned, particularly in the Toronto area. The big obstacle, Ontario's liquor laws, which demanded that licenced clubs close at 1AM, had actually spawned an aggressive type of disco owner who counted on his sound system and the type of music he programmed rather than supplying an in-store "buzz". Columbia became tuned into this pattern and, as they were grooming Canada's first all black disco type group, Crack of Dawn, for a record release, decided to introduce their eight piece band at a first time ever, crack of dawn breakfast reception.

Camilleri, McGee and Watson, set up a posh suite on the 30th floor of Toronto's Hyatt Regency with a south easterly view and invited Toronto and area disco club owners and their operators — and crossed their fingers. The suite began to fill up at 5AM and by 7AM it was packed and, the crowd, high on sunbreak (champagne and orange juice) enjoyed a well laid on breakfast. Columbia had scored a first and they credited much of the success of the reception to Al Peabody, who heads up his own production company.

Columbia are now launching a heavy concentration on the disco market, not only in Ontario but on the west coast and Winnipeg. What Toronto's disco people were witness to with the Columbia reception was an expensive and well planned event. Terry McGee

DAFFODÍL PRODUCT ON ALBUM SAMPLER

Bob Dunne of Island/Daffodil reports the initiation of a giant campaign revolving around Daffodil's slogan. The push, which will include the use of radio spots, ads, buttons, streamers and posters, is intended to help publicize an album sampler of Daffodil product. The sampler will be called "Naturally" and suggested retail price is \$3.98.

According to Joe Owens, A Foot in Coldwater's "Para-dice" (DIL-1058) has been making gains in Quebec with programmers in English Canada tending to go on the flip side "Make Me Do Ánything You Want". It appears that the former hit is still a big phone-in request. Several well-known managers in the industry, among them Shep Gordon, have lately expressed an interest in the band. was asked if this type of promotion was really necessary, to which he answered:

Perhaps with people who have come into the promotion end of the industry in the last couple of years, they may have found that there was really a basic lack of flash in

Canada — where, in the States, this kind of thing exists all the time. It just comes down to a very basic point — if you're going to do something, then you might as well do it right and there's only one way to do it and that's first class.

But why 5AM?

We wanted to create a tremendous impression with the discotheque owners, operators — and with the press people. So we held it in a very plush hotel with champagne and breakfast — just to establish the fact that a record company had realized the re-emergence of discotheques and disco music in this city. It was successful perhaps, because typical receptions go on until 8 o'clock at night. But for discotheques, 7PM receptions don't work because discotheques close down at 1AM, if they serve liquor, and after hours clubs are open until SAM. They were actually surprised when they came into our reception and found so many people.

What kind of people go to discotheques?

Most of them are between the ages of eighteen and twenty-five. But remember, this age group is now more relaxed than they were five years ago.

Would a new dance craze spark greater interest in record sales?

If there was another dance craze, that ' might happen, but I don't think that would provide the initiative for people to go out to record stores. There's enough initiative going on right now with discotheques that they're going out and buying a lot of product.

There always has been a disco scene in Toronto hasn't there?

* * *

Yes, but since the sixties, it died, because the music was no longer publicly popular. Radio stations weren't playing that type of music but now the whole trend is turning around, so that major radio stations in Toronto, Montreal and Vancouver are getting into disco product.

Canadian record companies haven't become overly excited about producing disco type records although the new Bond single on Columbia, "Dancing On A Saturday Night" falls into this category – as do all danceable records. With giant clubs like the Colonial going disco (with live groups), speculation is there will be more disco music for an obviously growing market.

ACTION FOR QUALITY SINGLES AND ALBUMS

Quality releases are running well in Quebec with "Love is the Answer" by Van McCoy now just a few thousand sales below the million seller mark and the Harmonium album at gold status based on sales in Quebec alone. "O.K. Chicago" by Resonance is beginning to look like a major hit in Montreal. The single, through disco play has sold over 5,000 copies without the aid of a chart number to date.

On the international scene for Quality Jason's "Let's Put The Fun Back In Rock And Roll" is beginning to show chart action and negotiations are underway for a world-wide release through Playboy Records who also like the flip side "Johnny B. Goode.

CHUM and Quality have released the CHUM Graffiti album and are following up with a heavy promotion on the air and with in-store displays. Half of the proceeds from sales will go toward the CHUM Charitable Foundation. Plans are pending to expand the album outside Ontario.

U.A. ACTIVE WITH FULL RELEASE SKED

Alan Matthews reports an active schedule for single releases in early February. A new country single by Canadian Zephyr will be pulled from their album "In the Zephyr Style" and is slated for release mid-February. Jerry Warren, who has had much success with "Big Red Jimmy" will follow up with Happy Song". The single is off his album "From the Falls to the Coast".

AXE ALBUMS SHOWING GAINS

Axe's Thundermug. s reached the 2,000 national sales mark with their album "Ta-daaa!" and Greg Hambleton is in the process of negotiating its release in the U.S. The Gary and Dave "All in the Past" album is reportedly selling well and a single will be pulled for release in the near future. Another single for Axe by Jay Telfer titled " I Write Your Name (On The Wall Above My Bed)" is scheduled for February release.

Axe's international scene is active with Gary and Dave's "Could You Ever Love Me Again" listed at number six on Australia's chart and negotiations for more Axe product underway in Holland, South Africa, England, Ecuador and the Philippines.

CANADIAN MUSIC SALES TO DISTRIBUTE DELMARK

Delmark Records, an independent jazz and blues label in the U.S., has reached an agreement for Canadian distribution with Canadian Music Sales.

According to a representative of CMS, this move is in keeping with their policy of "expansion in specialist labels", which already includes Canadian representation of Arhoolie, Yazoo and Blue Goose records. Delmark is currently enjoying good reaction to Junior Wells' latest album "Junior Wells on Tap".

CAPITOL ASSUMES **RIGHTS TO ARISTA**

Dave Evans, director of marketing Capitol Records EMI Canada, has announced that as of January 1st, 1975, the Canadian firm assumed sole manufacturing, sale and distribution rights for the Arista label (previously Bell) and all associated labels.


Making for a smoother than usual transition, Capitol will continue to exchange Arista and

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Ray Materick - out of his shell

Ray Materick has been around the music scene for several years but, up to now and in spite of the admiration he excited in some circles for work he's done in the past, he hasn't received much recognition. Now, with his single, "Linda Put The Coffee On", currently riding the RPM Singles Chart at No. 21, he's attracting attention in all circles with airplay on country, pop and MOR charts. "Linda" was pulled off "Neon Rain", his first album for WEA which is scheduled for release Jan 23rd. WEA executives are enthusiastic about Materick's talent and are promoting the album to the tune of \$30,000.

"Neon Rain" is not Materick's debut on the recording scene. His first and only other album was called "Sidestreets" and was released on the Kanata label two years ago. It didn't sell very well but did receive critical acclaim that can best be personified in one comment from the Toronto Star: "Sidestreets was an interesting experience one of the most remarkable folk albums of the year. Materick is highly personal, not so uncommon now, but he's also intelligent and sensitive, not so uncommon anytime' Materick's reaction to this praise is true to form: "Who me? I'm just a country boy". He may well be "just a country boy", but he is also the first Canadian to be signed in Canada to the prestigious Asylum label, distributed by WEA, a label that includes on its roster such top artists as Joni Mitchell and Jackson Browne.

Materick was born and raised in Brantford (Ontario), moved to Preston (Ontario) when he was 16, and at 17 began six years of travelling that saw him working at everything from nightshift in a tire mould factory to singing "Winchester Cathedral" through a paper megaphone in a "long-since forgotten rock band". At 23, he decided to go back to university where he majored in philosophy, "grew my hair even longer, lived in a trailer, lost 50 pounds, wrote scads of 'heavy' things, developed an unnatural appetite for cheap wine, and promptly dropped out". Materick dropped out to devote himself to a full time pursuit of songwriting and securing a recording contract, which, as he says, brought him to "the times of Kraft dinners and weifare cheques". 


May of 1974, "three guys at one record company finally listened", which brings us to the present and the resulting contract with WEA.

Materick was asked about his feeling regarding the activity surrounding his promotion, his new album and his future. His answers follow.

What is your personal reaction to the fullscale promotion WEA has launched for your album?

I just want it to be tasteful and I want to be seen in the right light. I have turned down things before that would have helped my career but only because they wouldn't have helped it in the right direction. I'm the type of guy that would sit around and starve for two months rather than play some bar for a thousand dollars - which is something I have been offered. I'm flattered by the whole thing.

* A division of Boot Records Limited Distributed nationally by London Records I'm excited and happy that they've got the faith in me to do this, but I've been in this business for five or six years and I've had a lot of managers and gone through a lot of problems, so I don't expect so much. I just sort of sit back and do what I do.

Are you finding that the heavy interview and promotion schedules are bothering you - Is it infringing on your privacy?

I've done it before and I resented it more then, because a couple of years ago I was much more the cynical angry young man. But there are a few things that I think I owe the record company in return.

Do you feel you had enough freedom in the production of your album?

Yes. I've got the best people to work with. They let me do anything I want. Gene (Martynec) produced the album and we got along fine and therefore I could make suggestions, because to me it's a piece of art. It's not another album of songs. It's such a personal thing, like an artist draw-ing a sketch. All they wanted was for me to paint it and somebody to frame it and that's what it turned out to be. I'm perhaps straighter than your average musician and can get along with the guys in the sense that I do have ideas in the way things should be produced, and how things should be handled as far as promotion goes, so when I convinced them that I could talk and think, then I convinced them that they could trust me for creative control. It's easier for them too.

Did you approach many record companies in the beginning?

A long time ago I did, for the first album. I've been turned down by everybody. There's always depression when you're turned down. I was told I had no talent, I had no potential. That guy probably still believes it, probably always will. But I'm the sort of person that it just added more fuel to my fire. I felt that what I was doing had to be. I felt that I was a fairly intelligent person, therefore what I was doing must be fairly good too. A person like me can't understand why it's not happening if it seems logical.

Would you ever move to the U.S.?

I don't know. I'm not a nationalist. I'm concerned with the Canadian scene because I'm Canadian, but what I write doesn't deal with any particular physical surrounding, and I'm not nationalistic to the point that I'll stay in Canada just to add to the Canadian music scene. What I have done in a small way is open some doors. To get the Asylum thing isn't easy. They've got some heavy artists down there. But maybe I've opened the door a little bit, though I didn't do it for that reason. I did it because it was best for me. I'll always have a home in Canada but I may have to live in the States if things start to happen, because that's where it's happening for my business.

You have a very lyrical writing style. Did it evolve, or has it always come easily to you a current that you could always tap?


I think you begin like anybody else begins. I think anybody can write if they don't try to think like a genius from the start. The things I first wrote are embarrassing. I started out in the moon, June, spoon thing, of course, and eventually I evolved around to a sort of colloquial style which I write in now. Everything I write isn't very hard to understand. It's like anything else. To be a good doctor, or to be a good painter, you've got to spend time at it, practice it. It's a

McLauchlan is heard on this Thunder Sound session on piano, harmonica and guitar.

TOWER OF POWER Urban Renewal Warner Bros BS 2834-P

There's some disco power in this set as well and that's where Tower of Power have a bit of an edge. Their uptempo numbers are exceptional with a horn section that completes a near perfect picture of music art. Lenny Williams, lead vocalist, should also take a bow. He's front and centre and whatever else backs him - vocals, strings, horns and it's all tied neatly together with respect.

BADGER RELEASES NEW GRIFFITH SINGLE

Bobby Griffith has a new single with Badger Records titled "No Money Blues" f/s "I'm Really in Love". Griffith initially came to the attention of programmers and public with his recording of "The Sound of Peace". This was followed by "The Badger's Song" and was then followed by an album, "Bobby G. Griffith", recorded by CTL.

COCHRANE Hang On To Your Resistance Daffodil DAF 10043-W

If 1975 is going to be the year of the contemporary folk singer, Tom Cochrane should be one of those counted. FM progressives and aggressive AMers will find



Cochrane a listener shaker, particularly with "Revelations: Visons in A Dream" and "When I'm With You". The set isn't perfect, by any means, but it should establish Cochrane as a healthy new talent with much to offer in the folk idiom. Full house of professional musicians adds to production: Ian Guenther, strings; Allan Booth, piano; Peter Rochon, additional keyboards; and the Cochrane trio, Rick Nickerson, bass; Deane Cameron, percussion; and Tom Cochrane on acoustic and electric guitars.

G.C. CAMERON Love Songs & Other Tragedies Motown M819V1-Y

Made for discos - Cameron is a new voice with an extra sensitive interpretation of Stevie Wonder, Willie Hutch and Van McCoy material. He's also into the writing thing with his own "Tippin", a bit of an off-pacer, but it reveals the other side of Cameron. It's Black music that's programmable and saleable, but it's a work album.

STRAY DOG While You're Down There Manticore MA6-501S1-Y

Recently baptized as a member of the Motown group, this Manticore unit was better known outside Canada as a trio but are now five members strong and could pick up disco play with "Bits & Pieces" and "Very Well". A couple of instrumentals that could sit well with the FM progressives are "Worldwinds" and "Dreams & Junk" and a very interesting "Pieces". There's a lot of competition around by better known groups, so Stray Dog will have to have a promo fire set under their tail.

LEO SAYER Just A Boy Chrysalis BS-2836-P

There'll be much emphasis placed on this Britisher and what better way to kick it off than an album that gets right to the point – the boy has talent. Actually, Sayer is already a giant but only a few are tuned into nis capabilities. There's a little bit of drama in each cut with perhaps a little more in "Telepath", which might turn some off, but display a little guts and listen on, you're probably tuned into one of the voices that will cause change in the business. If you get to "In My Life", you've got it made and you've got a full second side to convince yourself that Sayer has it.

LIGHTFOOT HONOURED AT NEW YORK CONCERTS

Gordon Lightfoot's recent weekend concerts at New York's Lincoln Centre's Avery Fisher Hall were highlighted when he was awarded the Lincoln Centre Bonze Medallion. The presentation was made in recognition of the artist's participation in the centre's 10 year old Great Performers series of concerts. The only other pop performer to receive the award was Ella Fitzgerald.

William Lockwood, producer of the Great Performers series for the Centre, made the presentations. Lightfoot also received two special plaques from ASCAP, commemmorating the success of his two Reprise hits "Sundown" and "Carefree Highway".

Gentle Giant, who release on the Capitol-EMI label and have been scoring well with their new album, "The Power and The Glory", appeared at Convocation Hall at the University of Toronto (24). The British group moved over to Kitchener's Wilfred Laurier University Theatre the following evening.

Macon, Georgia's Lynyrd Skynyrd are set for a Convocation Hall date Feb. 2. This is the first Canadian visit by the MCA recording group. They had much success with their album, "Second Helping", from which was culled their hit single, "Sweet Home Alabama".

Another British group, Strawbs, have been scheduled for a six city Ontario tour commencing with the National Arts Centre in Ottawa, Jan. 31st. Kingston's Queen's Arena is next Feb. 1st, followed by Wilfred Laurier U. in Kitchener (2), Hamilton Place (4), London's Western University (5) and Toronto's Massey Hall (6). A&M have released Strawbs' new album, "Ghosts" to coincide with the tour. On tour with Strawbs will be Man who have just released their U.A. album, "Slow Motion".

APRIL WINE SET FOR ALBUM RELEASE & TOUR


In November of 1974, Aquarius Records announced the signing of April Wine to a new multi-year contract. By the terms of the new agreement Aquarius replaces Much Productions as executive producers of all April Wine product. The group will also be entitled to a series of cash advance payments that will exceed \$50,000. According to Terry Flood, manager of the band and president of Aquarius, they will receive the highest royalty rate in the country.

During the time the Aquarius deal was being finalized, Flood acquired the services of American management and the services of PR consultant Jerry Kellert, who will perform U.S. management functions on behalf of April Wine from his New York office.

Two decisions were made concerning April Wine and the U.S. First, the group signed a new label deal with Big Tree Records, a subsidiary of Atlantic Records. Big Tree executive Doug Morris has given the April Wine project special priority in this regard.

The second decision involving the group and the U.S. was the signing of April Wine with the William Morris Agency. The agency has announced that April Wine will begin its first tour of the U.S. beginning February (6) in Chicago. Prior to that, the group will do a short tour of Eastern Canada for concert promoter Donald K. Donald.

An album entitled "Stand Back", produced by the members of the group, is being readied for release in Canada and the U.S. the first week in February. The album was produced at Tempo Studios (Montreal) over a seven week period. "Stand Back" features songs which are all Goodwyn-Clench compositions and all aspects of production from album artwork to tracking, to mixing and mastering, were done in Canada under the personal supervision of members of April Wine.



FRENCH IN B.C.????

There appears to be a very real possibility of an English Canadian release for the Ginette Reno/Jean Pierre Ferland version of "T'es Mon Amour". While spending time at the University of Montreal during the summer, this tune had to be the musical high-point of my stay. More than any thing else, it pointed out why chanteuse Reno hasn't met with success in the English market. She can interpret French lyrics with far more authority! Whereas in English she comes off as only a competent middle of the road singer, in French she gets herself into some very progressive sounds – at least progressive enough for CHOM. "T'es Mon Amour" is an example.

The purpose of this note is to beseech programmers outside of Quebec to rivet attention on the tune. It is a natural crossover for the English market — much like "Eres Tu" was for Mocedades. I'm firmly convinced that "T'es Mon Amour" is capable of being the hottest selling Canadian release since "Seasons In The Sun". What's more, if it can cross over in the rest of Canada the way it finally did on CKGM, then there's bound to be a lot more musical solidity between us and the Quebecoise. I think it's a learning process for anyone to hear the emotion and mood, all so prevalent in "les disques francaises".

Geoffrey Tobiasson has been appointed a Director of Axis Entertainment, A Vancouver-based booking complex. The above announcement was made by Barry Samuels, president of the firm.

Tobiasson is well-known in the Vancouver music scene, having headed up his own company, Buffalo Booking Agency, which was absorbed by Axis.

Axis was first established in 1970 and now has twenty-five bands under exclusive agreements and books into more than two dozen Vancouver cabarets as well as the majority of high schools and colleges. An indication of their growth is their gross billings for 1974 which were in excess of \$750,000, an increase of more than 40% over the previous year.

HARRIS PACTS WITH LYRICHORD

Kenny Harris, who heads up Pyramid Records, and Peter Fritsch of Lyrichord Disc Inc., have firmed an agreement whereby Lyrichord will manufacture and distribute "Four Centuries of Music For Bassoon", by Christopher Weait, in the U.S. The New York-based Lyrichord is exclusively an ethnic and classical music label. The Weait album is being scheduled for release in the spring.

Weait is co-principal bassoonist with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra and is instructor of bassoon at Queen's University, Kingston and at the faculty of music, University of Toronto. He has been pencilled in for an appearance on CBC-TV's "Music To See", sometime in February.

craft! I think everybody's got an inborn talent - if you can think, you can write. It's a matter of developing a style. I think Gord Lightfoot said that the first fifty songs you write are shit, then once you get them out of your system, you can start - though I don't necessarily agree on fifty as the number. I've got some friends who say "if anybody had told me you'd be writing songs this good, four or five years ago, I would have laughed at them". Now I'm basically where I want to be, but I've got got some developing to do.

Did your philosophy studies help your writing ability?

Greatly. I finished two years of honours philosophy and then stopped because I didn't see any use in going on at that particular time and I wanted to write for a year. If you're going to be a songwriter, there's no way you can do two things. If you're going to develop your craft you've got to sit at home and develop it. So that's what I did for a year. I gave myself nine months to write songs and three months to see if I could find a recording contract. If I couldn't get it, I'd go back to school. I got the contract two months before I was supposed to go back to school. What philosophy is, and what school is, is a mental exercise. It's like doing push-ups in your head, and your mind expands because of that. I think it certainly helped my writing because not only can I say things differently, I can think of things in different perspectives. Also my mind was in shape for thinking of metaphors and doing my writing exercises. I write parodies of songs, or I'll write some songs really fast as exercises to sharpen up my mind.

Are you a room writer or a road writer? I don't usually write too many songs while I'm on the road. If I'm driving back and forth to Toronto I might write a few words in my head. In fact, I came up with a line this morning for a song I'm writing. These days it's very hard to write a song because there's so many things going on, with the promotion of the album and the single, and I'm also managing myself right now. I don't say "I'm going to write a song", I just pick up my guitar and hope that I'm going to write a song. Usually the tune comes first, because that decides what the lyrics will be. If it's a slow tune, the lyrics will be a little heavier than if it's a bouncy tune. These days I find myself getting really critical about what I write. Did you ever consciously style your vocals after anyone else?

I've always been into country music and Dylan was an influence on me in the early days, though I used to be told I sounded like Harry Chapin, Cat Stevens, Van Morrison, Murray McLauchlan. But I've been singing like this for ten years, before I'd even heard of anybody else. Certainly, lyrically, I don't sound like anybody, so I'm safe there. It all depends on what you listen to. At one point I listened to "Freewheelin" (Bob Dylan) and of course I was writing songs like that. Three years back I was listening to "Tea for the Tillerman" (Cat Stevens) and I had to stop listening to it. I thought it was a great album but I was starting to put "yes yes" in my songs. As a matter of fact I was listening to Elton John of late, the old Elton John, and I put in a little "Ooh Ooh" at the end of "Linda" which comes straight off an Elton John song. And I just did that to be funny, of course nobody else will get it.

How do you feel towards your audiences? Do you ever feel a breakdown in communication?

It all depends where you play. These days, no, there's no breakdown because I come on and it's a different story. They know who I am. My whole show is based on communication with the audience. I've even stopped playing and talked to the audience. I have a very easygoing thing. I read some poetry on stage sometimes, though I'm getting a little away from that now. Of course, the energy from the audience is what makes the energy come from you and, nowadays they're putting out the initial energy. But if you're pushing out energy and nobody responds, well, I've been known to get quite upset. I played one of my lowest points in these last two years at a club in Toronto and every other night I just walked off the stage because there was no energy coming back. In my head I was saying, "What am I doing here. I don't deserve this - with the cash register clanging in the background and people banging beer bottles". I'm not into that.

Things are usually quiet when I play. What's the "Dream" you refer to in your biography and on your album?

It's not a dream so much - that was just the word to use. The whole "Mystic Highway Suite" (from the album) was written like a dream. That's why the strings were a little more up front and the voices were a little further back. What I'm talking about there is a self-awareness through the mystical experience - the supernatural: I know the dream exists. I know it could be a reality, but I'm not really there yet. The fast part with the electrical guitar is my first attempt at finding it, then it slows down to the interlude where it says "that's not the way to look at it, it's not going to take years, and there's a lot to find out. Nothing else is going to help you find it, it's all inside yourself". And l came to that awareness which is a step in the right direction. The epilogue is merely as I envision the string section, as being supernatural, with the guitars being natural, and sort of fighting each other with the stringsever present. There's two guitars if you listen closely, playing opposite things. Bruce (Cockburn) is playing one part, I'm playing another. At the same time, the strings are just floating over top. What it represents is life and superlife. That's what I tried to convey and some guy said to me, "well, I don't know, it seemed like you were trying to commercialize and put in strings". He missed the point completely.

Did you find yourself losing spontaneity, recording a track over and over?

I just get tired. I don't ever lose the spontaneity. This album was rehearsed and rehearsed and thought about for a long time. Every note you hear, except for the odd one, was thought about. For example, "Neon Rain" has a Bob Dylan harp in it and that's supposed to be Bob Dylan. Murray (McLauchian) played that. That's in there for a reason because the song is Dylanesque, about a young guy trying to be an important songwriter, but going slightly insane.

You're getting all kinds of airplay - did you expect it?

Almost everything I write seems to be an incorporation of my country influences my MOR influences - in the sense of Johnny Mathis and Frank Sinatra, because I always liked those types of songs - and the folk influences. So all three are integrated and almost everything I write can be played on any kind of station. Like "Linda" - I never thought of it as a country song, but it's in the top 10 at some country stations, and it's number six across Canada on middle of the road charts and it's on the pop charts.

Do you want to be a musician indefinitely or do you have other interests?

If I had a goal in life, it would be to write a novel. Not THE novel, but a novel. Just to be able to write 365 pages of coherent sentences, all intertwined, seems to be a big challenge to me. There's that, but I'd also like to produce records some day. Music's in my blood. Maybe I'll attain this goal of success but success to me is in being an accepted songwriter.

Materick leaves us with the thought: "Neon Rain is somewhat further along the mystic highway, between the dream and the realization. We all make the journey - I've been taking some notes along the way". KE



Lepp credits the staff of CFGO's public affairs office with the successful putting together of the documentary and for management for allowing an inside look at a multi-million dollar industry.

CRYSTAL ROCKUMENTARIES OFF WITH ZEPPELIN SPECIAL

The first in depth broadcast documentary on Britain's top group, Led Zeppelin, is now in the process of syndication through Crystal Rockumentaries. The two hour special, "The Led Zeppelin Radio Rockumentary" features commentary by Ritchie Yorke, author of the forthcoming "Led Zeppelin Biography". The special was hosted and produced by Wayne Dion, and also features comments on Zeppelin by prominent musicians such as Eric Clapton, Keith Richard of the Rolling Stones, and the Who's Pete Townshend.

"The Led Zeppelin Radio Rockumentary" is being syndicated to AM and FM stations throughout North America and the rest of the world to coincide with the group's current North American tour which kicked off in Minneapolis on Jan 18 and continues until the end of March. It is Led Zeppelin's first major tour since the record-breaking 1973 American tour. Zeppelin's first five albums for Atlantic Records (beginning with "Led Zeppelin" released in January 1969) have all been certified as platinum sellers and the sixth album, "Physical Graffiti", a double set, was expected to

He will also be involved in production and creative services as well as audio visual productions and general magazine writing. ship gold. The package, which can be run in full or in two one-hour segments, is being syndicated on a first come-first served basis in each market.

Ritchie Yorke, author and rock journalist, is credited with having been the first member of the media to publicly predict Led Zeppelin's massive success. During the course of the past five years he has written more words about the band than any writer anywhere. He was also a key contributor to the BBC's highly-acclaimed Story of the Beatles radio series.


Sudy Shen, chief engineer, is supervising the installation of the Sansui CSE-5B4 Channel Quad Encoder. Several FM stations in the U.S. have also installed the Encoder. The new dimension has a "surround" 4 channel effect which treats equally, signals originating in a 360 degree field.

The new quad signal will not affect listeners not having quadrophonic receivers. A built-in synthesiser will enhance the quality and separation of the stereo signal.

The response to the single when aired on Waddell's "Top of the Morning Show" (CKOS-TV Yorkton) has been "fantastic" says Waddell. The single appeals to western Canadians of Ukrainian and Polish descent — and anyone else looking for a little morning pickup.

Gary Shannon takes the giant move west from Kingston to do a weekly "oldie" show ("Good Old Rock 'n' Roll") for The Tall Totem people. He is based in Prince Rupert, B.C. but the show is heard in the System's three markets and is sponsored by Kelly's Stereo Mart. The System's PD/MD, Ted Hockaday, also reports that another former CKLC Kingston type, John Murray, ex "Duke", has joined "our little Air-Force". Peter Forman, who threw in the towel in Oakville to settle in the "beautiful land", opens the System's day from Terrace (6-9AM) followed by Peter Jones with an "open line" (9-10) with Norm Andreassen (10-2PM). John Murray takes the afternoon shift (2-6) followed by Stan Twist (6-MN). Dalena Trigo does swing.

Dave Charles, now settled into his new position as program manager at CHQT Edmonton, reports the November rating placed the station a "solid number two and number one in some morning drive and afternoon drive quarter hour segments". Present lineup at CHQT follows: Bob Bradburn (5:30-9) Don Andrews (9-Noon) Glen Corness (noon-3) Lorne King (3-6) with "Reflections" (6-8) and Bob Concie's "Adventures in Music" (8-10) and Jim French going all night.



Greg Stewart, music director at CKGM Montreal, reports a novel approach to their year end chart. The list of "Super 98 hits of 1974" and Montreal's Top 20 albums were distributed on a Book Mark and made available at the city's leading record stores — which made for a lot of talk about CKGM at the local high school level.

Andy Kay joins CJFM Montreal. He will host the 7PM to Midnight show. Kay has five years of radio under his belt, picking it up in Montreal, Hamilton and Halifax. Prior to the Montreal gig he was music director at CJCH Halifax — so he knows from rock music.

I wonder if this is Andy Kay, a popular Montreal rock musician from the early sixties — a member of J.B. and The Playboys? Anyway, with Kay now at CJFM, the station is now "live" 24 hours a day. Jim Pogue takes over after Kay from Midnight to 6AM, followed by Chuck Azzarello (6-10) with Bert Gordon doing it to 3PM and Dave Tollington (former RPMer) up to 7PM.

Mark Papousek, a local boy makes good. He has become an on-air member of CKOB Renfrew (4-6). Opening the day for the station is Scott Richards followed by Papousek and Gail Griffiths. Paul Robinson is CKOB's fulltime newsman assisted by Martin Burns and Maureen LeGris, Richards also handles country in the afternoons with Jay Silver taking care of the rock crowd in the evening. Jim Donohue, Terry Sammon and Maureen LeGris share the light evening music show.

Weyburn's CFSL experiences the same old problem - "announcers come and go" but the Saskatchewan station is happy with their arrangement of utilizing the services of students and graduates of the Columbia School of Broadcasting. In fact, their entire on-air staff, with the exception of Gary Thom, are from the school. Don Daniels, a graduate of Columbia, began his career at CFSL then moved to CKOV Kelowna, He's now back, on the air at 'SL (Noon-4) and is also program director. Gary Thom does the wakeup chores (6-9) with Penny Eastman following (9-Noon), Dave Jackson, music director, takes the 4-8 shift with Ed Bain taking the day out (8-MN).






