
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

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Nobel's Rene Simard to sing Olympic theme

Rene Simard, still fourteen years of age and a Quebec "superstar", has apparently been picked to sing the theme for the Olympics. The young Nobel singer who has enjoyed international acclaim, is currently experiencing strong sales with his new single, "Love Will Keep Us Together", the Captain & Tennille single in French. Simard teamed with another Quebec music notable, Pierre Lalonde, for the "Together" single.

Columbia, distributors of the Nobel label, have acquired a fourteen minute film clip from the CBC-TV's "5th Estate" which featured Simard on the English network. Simard is currently sprucing up his English and is expected to release an English language single before the year is out.

Charlie Camilleri, national promotion director for Columbia, reports the "To-

gether" single which was released Sept 15, has already sold in excess of 40,000 copies in Quebec province alone. A mailing has also been actioned across the rest of Canada.

The Gallagher "Blooze"

Rory Gallagher, the critic's-choice "blooze" guitarist was born in Ballyshannon, Eire, sometime after the second big War bang. At the age of nine, after his parents had bottled themselves in the town of Cork, Gallagher taught himself to finger guitar from a \$10 jobbic he copped through a Woolworth's catalogue.

While at school, he received prominent grades from gigging at the main dance-events, eventually landing his first pro-time with the "Fontana Showband." "I wasn't fond of showbands", he said, "but promoters thought you had to have fifteen members before you were a proper group ... we played Ireland, toured Spain and did a couple of English gigs ... it turned out to be great fun." Fun and of course the learned experience. After two and a half years of lounge-acting around, Rory, his drummer and bassman, headed for reclusive Hamburg Germany, where acts like Pink Floyd and Nektar were kicking out sounds for music-exploration.

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"Taste" was put together when the boys came back to Ireland, and the critics tagged them as a "progressive blues" unit. Three albums later, Taste broke up... but Gallagher wasn't crying. Since the band's 1970 split, Rory Gallagher has been his own frontman, hammering and cajoling the blooze on six refined album-releases.

"Sinner and Saint" (Polydor 2383 315-Q) is his latest, and Gallagher sings, plays all guitars, blasts alto, harmonica and violin.

The man has no pretensions for the druginduced dwell and demoes clear distinct guitar lines that rolls for crisp/clean rock.

Pounding a Strat similar to Hendrix, the man relies on harmonics instead of a scramble-brained feedback.

As his critics acclaim, Gallagher can pluck licks out of his instrument "in a flow that never ceases to be unique."

In these rocking ages, when walled-sound determines success, Gallagher and his expressions are a welcoming rock commodity. His LP-intentions are a total self-writ and the effort is all-Gallagher as he's commanded the production.

As Polydor's Allan Katz says, "Gallagher is one of the hardest working and most down-to-earth artists. His two-hour sets and laid-back attitude have built an incredibly loyal audience in the blues rock field because he NEVER gives a mediocre concert."

Ray Danniels, young business-brain of SRO Productions and the Polydor Records group are hot over the Gallagher '75 Canadian Tour. Sept. 30th will see the man at Toronto's Massey Hall,

Oct. 3rd in London, Oct. 4th in Kitchener, Oct. 8th Winnipeg, 11th Edmonton, 12th Lethbridge, 13th Calgary, 16th Victoria and the 18th in Vancouver's Pacific Colliseum.

GLENDA ROY

Glenda Roy's early years were lesson-preoccupied with flute, violin and piano, and as she approached her eleventh year in highschool, she had nurtured somewhat of a recognition as a professional in danceexpression. In her estimation she used to be an "average Canadian mother who couldn't get a day job", which motivated her to form her own company in 1970.

"Glenroy Promotional Services" was involved in all aspects of sales promotion from the selling of real estate to fur coats."

In 1972, with an experience of sales and advertising behind her, Glenda landed at RCA Canada, where the most immediate opening available was the position of secretary to National Promotions man Ed Preston.

A very fortunate opportunity.

Her duties began to branch out considerably, including the supervision of the RCA regional set up, and eventually she was promoted to her present position of National Promotion Co-ordinator, which includes all of RCA's Canadian record advertising, artist relations, designing point of purchase material, the writing of bios and all specialized promotional projects.

Last year Glenda created the CITY-TV-Toronto dance-feature "Boogie." It was on her suggestion, that "Boogie" should concentrate on a disco-soul format as opposed to a greaser nostalgic-sockhop;

"Boogie's" format has proven to be a success as Glenda has been retained as associate producer for its second season.

"I think there's too little public promotion", she says.

"There is more promotion occurring within the trade, than there is on the consumer level. "Boogie" is just one example of a design for the consumer-outlet."

Capitol's Harvest group, Maniege, have completed their album sessions at Toronto's Manta Sound Studios. The Montreal group



BRUCE MILLER Rude Awakening A&M SP 9018-W

A patented-proficient Tom Scott sax-wail can lend the best to an artist's sound-inten-

Miller's "Rude Awakening" is an effort that supports the claim of music being built upon the support of nature-wonder lyrics . . .

"Roly Poly" (1:50) is a quickie but toetapped efficient, and gives Tom Scott a chance to Woody Herman his clarinet.

A great deal of effort has gone into Bruce's disc, and when you try to do something good it obviously shows in the final product.

RUSH Caress Of Steel SRM 1046-Q

Their last album was glittered by pockmarked road-trips, that a band on the run is guaranteed to groupie-encounter . . . now with audience-acceptance more than adequately assured, Rush have given themselves enough room to play out their fantasies,

Third album insight: Geddy, Alex and Neil sound-out the accustomed reliance of heavymetal chord-crank, but as this entire effort is "dedicated to the memory of Mr. Rod Serling", it has become apparent to the

Rush, that it is not the be-all necessity to scream and thunder-crash in order to impart images within a people-populated twilight zone.

"Bastille Day" (4:36) serves up a portion of hot sliced meat, due in sections to the cold metal cuts of a sweeping-blade guillotine . . . a first-class Rush, backing into the sex meatgrinder, obviously getting a little behind in their work.



"I Think I'm Going Bald" (3:35), lyricizes and Geddy bass-pounds, the gig that ages fast, but as far as this troupe is concerned, they're a Wild Bunch that wouldn't have it any other way.

"The Necromancer", is a 121/2 minute shortstory sojourn centering on a divining spirit, communicating open-line with the dead . . . a parallel here, with a medley of musical interludes including "Return Of The Prince"


(3:51), readied by Polydor as a Rush-release single.

"The Fountain" (3:48) precludes the grind of gushing Alex axe-ioms with an ending built upon a soft-touch . . . a sweet denouement putting on a feeling of ten-times heavier anticipation than a bash-reliance on me tallurgy.

With every new LP-exercise, Rush expose their mild progression. A very commendable effort and one that Rod Serling might just roll over for. MD




WEA Ontario promotion racks up heavy October







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It's tough to be number two with a bullet

There used to be one firm selling millions of re-grooved goldies on racks in supermarkets and dimestores to the hype of recurring hard-sell radio and television ads. It was "Only on K-Tel."

Now, Winnipeg-based K-Tel, who had dominated the plastic power market in North America, is rack to rack and platter to platter with the Toronto-based Tee Vee Records for the biggest piece of the Canadian mass merchandising pie.

Last summer Tee Vee ran its "Funny, Funky Hits" dead against K-Tel's "Goofy Greats" and this fall they've got "Machine Rock" toe to toe with K-Tel's "Pinball Rock." "Funny, Funky" hit gold, boosted by a T-shirt-album deal through radio stations in 50 Canadian cities.

Tee Vee scores Gold and Platinum Awards

Tee Vee albums have won 4 Platinum Awards (100,000 sales in Canada) and 5 Gold Leaf (50,000 sales) Awards.

K-Tel boosted its media image sponsoring C.F.L. Football on C.T.V. Tee Vee did them one better. With such companies as Imperial Oil, Ford Motor Co. and Molson's Breweries, this year Tee Vee is part of Hockey Night in Canada - the top turf of Canadian television marketing.

"Last spring we were number one", reports Tee Vee operations manager Danny La Roach, "But this fall they're out with tons of stuff."


Tee Vee, which is now putting over one million advertising dollars a year into Canadian media, isn't turning the other cheek. They're moving 14 albums this fall, 6 of them Canadian, promoted by 18 Toronto produced television ads.

Tee Vee's fall headliners groomed to "sell" fast

Tee Vee's fall headliners include: Their second Elvis package, "Elvis Forever"; 20 original C&W hits on "Super Country"; and a collection of Christmas classics, "Santa Sends His Best", which they promise will be carried by a whole new concept of seasonal packaging when it hits the stores in November.

Tee Vee has budgeted almost \$200,000 to push 6 regionally marketed Canadian content specials this fall. On the East Coast it's the Carlton Showband's "First Choice" and in Quebec Tee Vee is making its first mark in the French language market with a Quebecois country music sampler and a collection of hits sung by the Famille Soucy. Out west it's Al Cherney's "Fiddle Country", Maurice Bolyer's "Piano And Banjo Favourites" and "The Hank Snow Collection."

At a company banquet last week Tee Vee celebrated its third anniversary and received two platinum awards for their Elvis albums.

"We're an independent company that came from nowhere...."

"We're an independent company that came from nowhere", Tee Vee President Ed LaBuick stated proudly. "Now we're in a position of respectability because we've paid our bills and sold the product."

Bob Cook, vice-president RCA, whoe Elvis material was marketed by Tee Vee, told the banquet: "It's coming back to the public through television merchandising that there is material for the market of people over 35."

Ed LaBuick began in sales of food and related products in western Canada, moved east marketing electronic equipment, and joined Ampex just as the 8-track and cassette boom was born. He saw the potential of combining his cross-Canada marketing know-how with his appreciation of the demand for re-recorded and otherwise hard-to-get popular music standards.

LaBuick's first success was with GRT (when it was started as General Recorded Tapes in 1971) with a smash selling tape and record collection of cover hits by Canadian artists.

LaBuick founded Cachet Records with his wife - and right hand - Faye.

From there it was to Cachet Records which he founded with Faye LaBuick. They scored on a 4-album rock 'n' roll goodies set, "Party Rock", in 1973 followed by an RPM gold record for Canadian Maurice Bolyer's "40 Golden Banjo Hits."

"Party Rock" was a breakthrough. More than half of its 200,000 sales were made through an exclusive rack and catalogue deal with Simpson-Sears which had never sold records like this before.

Cachet Records moved into current sounds with "Soul Train Hall of Fame" and in spring 1974 made what they call "our first major push into mass merchandising" with "Can't Stop Dancing" and "Boston Pops", both Gold records.

In May 1974 LaBuick formed Tee Vee records and has never looked back.


That summer Tee Vee released a Harry Belafonte double album, which almost hit platinum, and two Canadian packages: Al



Cherney's "Golden Ukranian Memories" and "The Hank Snow Collection" which was marketed through Home Hardware, an East Coast and Ontario chain of independently operated stores which had never sold so many records before. They also scored their first "exclusive" with the Towers chain - "Country Sunshine", a platinum record.

Last fall Tee Vee hit "here-to-stay" status when they paid ½ million for the rights to market "ELVIS" in Canada. The big plus was not only the more than 350,000 sales that followed but the prestige of handling the "king of gold."

Millions of customers brought into stores by Tee Vee ads

Tee Vee has opened up the retail disc market in Canada far beyond the "traditional" record store counters. K-Mart, Simpson-Sears, Woolco, Towers, Home Hardware and Link Hardware out west among others now all prominently display selected big sellers to millions of customers - many brought into the store by Tee Vee's ads.

RCA president Cook argues that the traditional record business should welcome these advances: "Record people screamed when radio was introduced but look what it did for records."

Tee Vee's marketing system seems to be optimal - it maximizes success and minimizes failure, especially with Canadian material.

For example, the current East Coast action to sell the Carlton Showband will be national when the kinks are worked out. If, by chance, sales fall short in the East the project could be scrapped without the loss involved in pressing the copies needed for an all-Canada campaign. Home Hardware's success in selling 20,000 of "The Hank Snow Collection" in one market has Tee Vee certain that it will hit gold when sold out west as well.

Canadian artists have been showcased by Tee Vee

Cook points to the fact that Tee Vee sold 28,000 copies of Al Cherney's "Golden Ukranian Memories" through a campaign confined to the prairie provinces to show what Tee Vee can do for the Canadian artist.

LaBuick doesn't feel they repackage old music. "We properly package it."

"They're a damn good sales force", testifies Brian Buckingham, vice president of Spitzer, Mills and Bates which handles the Tee Vee account. "We've helped them with media spots, campaigns, package and instore promotion design but we've learned a lot from them as well."

That's not to say it's all roses. LaBuick is resigned to the fact that the current trends in mass record merchandising, has peaked.



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

Everyone who does business with Tee Vee agrees on one thing - mass merchandising is the future and Tee Vee does it well.

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"LaBuick - a modest man who gets the job done"

MARKHAM, Ontario.

When you get right down to it, the Canadian music industry is somewhat sparse in the field of personality success stories. One might even make the observation that the Maple Music business is notable for its lack of such success trips, probably because it's early days and the real heroes are still out in the back streets paying dues, and paving their respective paths. Of course we're not talking here about recording artists, session musicians or composers: the breed in question is the people behind the scenes who put the upfront scenes together, those who make the impossible possible, those who take a shot on the wheel of chance and come out winners.

It is difficult to deny that a certain element of mediocrity still runs rampant in this industry, to the dismay of many. A few people have basked in the glory of hot periods but consider just how many have maintained any sort of consistent track record. A handful have gotten lucky but luck - like love, hate and the summertime - comes and goes. Hype is such a prevalent and pervasive factor in music industry endeavor that it is


sometimes hard to evaluate just who is really making it. Talk is cheap and hype even cheaper. The Truth has far too often become a distant stranger in affairs of the music business.

All of which serves to emphasize the actual significance of the outstanding success of a gentleman named Ed LaBuick who runs Tee Vee Records Inc., the number two packager/merchandizer of TV-marketed record product in this country. In a mere three years, LaBuick and his keen and energetic team have built Tee Vee Records into a multi-million dollar operation. I've been wanting to put down some words on this subject for many months but LaBuick had steadfastly maintained a conspicuously low profile, preferring to get the job done ahead of telling the world about it. Whenever I've contacted Tee Vee Records for the purpose of writing a piece on its activities, LaBuick. has always asked me to hold off until he was ready to spread the word on what the company has been doing. It's a damn good story but LaBuick simply wanted to consolidate the company's position before tooting the old self-promotion trumpet,

And so finally last week, on the occasion of a celebration dinner at which a total of five platinum albums and four gold albums were duly anointed as a demonstration of the company's success, LaBuick explained: "I have always found the music industry to be so full of hype. It's always been hype and hope first . . . and then achievement later. I wanted to wait until we had substantiated our position before we did any blowing of our own horn." I must say I find that to be a fresh viewpoint and a highly commendable outlook.

To relate this tale in the right perspective, one needs to backtrack for a few pars, to enlarge upon LaBuick's background, to explain where he's coming from. Initially based in Edmonton, LaBuick worked in the merchandizing area for a large supermarket chain concentrating on all aspects of display and in-store motivation material. The food business, as LaBuick readily concedes, is every bit as competitive as the music industry and likely more so.

After several years, LaBuick accepted a local sales rep position with Philips Appliances with merchandizing again his specialty. Recognizing his unique talents and his ardent interest in the tape playback hardware aspect of their activities, Philips moved LaBuick to Toronto. Later he switched to



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Ampex and then Stereodyne, and was closely involved in the launching of the prerecorded cassettes and cartridges in this

country. He was a genuine pioneer in this field.

When GRT of Canada was launched, LaBuick joined forces with Ross Reynolds to set the company on its feet. He and Reynolds worked together for 31/2 years and the company prospered, especially in the area of developing domestic product - an aspect of the record industry which has been sadly neglected by some major labels. Ross Reynolds acquired the artists and product and LaBuick merchandized the results with an uncommon flair, "Essentially I am a merchandizer", LaBuick admits. "I know how to sell. But all that time, I just didn't like the way that records had to hyped to radio stations. That was one aspect which I could have well done without. Actually I began to realize that I wanted to get into

the mass retailing business."

Accordingly, LaBuick had the balls to take the big plunge and go it alone with personal financing. In June '72, he and his wife Faye launched Cachet Records and LaBuick Sound Inc. (the corporate name was changed to Tee Vee Records Inc. in June last year). Early projects included cover hit packages and some original productions involving Maurice Bolyer and a Pub Party compilation. Bolyer's 40 Banjo Hits album went gold in both Canada and Australia, and the Pub Party package went over the 100,000 units in Australia, which is a phenomenal figure for that market.

For a while, Cachet dabbled in the Cancon rat-race, concentrating on the country field but finding it less than lucrative. At this juncture, LaBuick realized that he needed to move into compiling original artists packages. His first foray in this highly-competitive scene brought Party Rock, an exceptional LP which exceeded the 200,000 units mark in Canada. Since then the company has released some 31 packages, most of which have earned gold or platinum awards for Canadian sales.

Tee Vee Records has not neglected Canadian artists either. Out of 14 new packages to be premiered this Fall, four are totally domestic productions (representing a significantly higher percentage than most of the major labels). "I just figured out the other

day", comments LaBuick, "that we've spent around half a million dollars on the production and promotion of our Canadian product. And most projects have been financially successful. We may not be out there hammering on radio stations doors to get exposure but we've been doing our bit for the Canadian industry in other ways. Plus our company is totally Canadian and we have no outside controls."

Tee Vee Records now employs 40 people at the beautifully-located Markham head office and they constitute a unique team of keenly-motivated individuals such as Advertising Co-ordinator Ann Davis; Dave Harding, General Manager; Operations Manager Danny LaRoche; Wally Hill, Sales Manager; and Fay LaBuick as Vice President. "The secret of Tee Vee Records success" LaBuick quickly assured me, "is people. It's not just Ed LaBuick, We have maintained a policy of paying our people really good money in return for effort. I wanted to make sure that all the dissatisfaction I'd personally experienced in the past working for large corporations would not happen here.

"The other people who've been of immense assistance to us are the major mass merchandizers and retail hardware and record stores. We've had especially good support from record stores, which of course are not the mainstay of our type of business. We've

had strong support from retailers and we've done our best to accommodate their particular needs.

"I believe that we have brought to the record business in Canada a whole new class of consumer - the sort of people not buying current or catalog product from the majors. We've opened the door to another kind of music consumer.

"I think there's a great future for selective packages. Unfortunately a lot of crap broadcast packages have been shoved into the marketplace. There's been so many op-

portunists - companies which were undercapitalized and operated like amateurs which is obviously the reason that more have gone broke than have survived. For the future, I think the strong will be stronger while the weak will fall by the wayside. A year from now, there will be less companies in this busines than there is today.

"Even though we do have a music background, we still go to experts for advice in putting together our packages. We put our money where our mouth is. We pick the product and we gamble but we always try to run with the right product. That's the most important thing.

"We're not number one in our field, but we're a hot number two (as point of fact, Tee Vee Records did equal the sales of its biggest competitor in record sales during last Spring). We don't necessarily want to be number one. We want the right product and the right merchandizing. We're not particularly interested in the 22 Explosive Hits type of package. We're more into traditional packages, items with staying power . . . rather than the immediate hit compilation thing. We've even put out a number of French Canadian albums which have done extremely well. Our whole strength is effective advertising, and much retail merchandizing support co-ordinated by our coast-to-coast reps.

"The company was launched with my own capital and in the early days, we had to have tight controls of budgets and financing which is something my wife Faye looks after. We've built the company up from there by making a minimum of mistakes and by putting total support behind what we believe in."

Most recently Tee Vee Records has moved into the print field with an excellent cookbook The New Complete Book of Cookery being marketed this Fall and early Winter. LaBuick's other recent coup was the securing of commercial spot time in the CBC's Hockey Night in Canada telecasts. Getting in there was a long and arduous task but LaBuick pulled it off, after obtaining acceptance from such diverse hockey broadcast ownership interests as the Canadian Sports Network Association, Ford, Molsons and Imperial Oil. "Our TV commercials for Hockey Night in Canada will not be as hard sell as our competitors", LaBuick insists. "We don't want to annoy Canadian consumers and I suspect that some of the commercial approaches used in this field are intensely aggravating. We do not want to go that route."

And so Ed LaBuick, a shrewd and perceptive winner in the Canadian music industry, continues to build up a huge domesticallyowned operation which seems bound to expand and endure. It would appear that Tee Vee Records can only keep on getting bigger and better and for that Ed LaBuick deserves widespread recognition and admiration for pulling it off. His is one of the real success stories of this business, and never mind his modesty and desire to maintain a low profile. This man is making it and big and everyone could take a few lessons from his approach. Too many stale winds blow in the vacuum of Canadian music, when it's obviously time for fresh insight and new methods. Change is not necessarily a bad thing but insecurity about taking a new direction reflects nothing but mediocrity, parent company domination or feeble hearts. @ Ritchie York 1975


CEC to showcase top of line talent


