

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No confirmation on Lightfoot single

Contrary to a story that appeared in RPM last week (July 10/76) regarding the release of Gordon Lightfoot's title cut of Summertime Dream as his next single, this information was incorrect. "We're waiting to find out the best cut and the best response in Canada and the U.S.", WEA's Larry Green told RPM, continuing with, "We thought we had the right cut, then the information was put on hold for a variety of reasons".

Price has been set at \$50 per thousand and orders should be directed to Pierre Fyfe, Polydor Records in Montreal.

Barbara Onrot new post: Capitol Artist Relations

Bill Bannon director of promotion for Capitol Records-EMI of Canada, has announced the appointment of Barbara Onrot to artist relations/artist development manager for the label.

Onrot's duties will include the coordination of artist tours and their relations with sales, marketing, promotion and A&R divisions of the company.

Onrot's appointment became effective July 5, 1976.

CPI gets go ahead for dates at CNE

Toronto's facelifted CNE Stadium will go through its rock baptism this summer with firmed dates for top rock names. CPI and the CNE people have agreed on two dates - so far. The first concert, set for July 24, will headline Aerosmith, Rick Derringer, Mahogany Rush and Henry Gross. Tickets have been pegged at \$8.50 for the first 10,000 and \$15 for the next 15,000 (no reserve).

Seating for the newly refurbished stadium is a whopping big 55,000 with another 20 000 for the field area the largest in Canada.

Peter Frampton will headline the next show, firmed for July 31st, with a rain date for Aug 2.

It's expected there will be complaints against the concerts, lodged by the Forum people of Ontario Place because of the turned up" sound system which, when mixed with the audience reaction, could effect even the Toronto Symphony Orchestra - if they were appearing at the Forum at the same time as the rock concert.

Tour new Lp and Gold for A&M's Gino Vannelli

A&M's Doug Chappell reports that Gino Vannelli's new LP, Gist of Gemini, will be released before the Montreal rock star hits the road on the first leg of his Canadian tour this month. Vannelli kicks off the tour July 13 in Brandon, Manitoba, and finishes with five dates July 26-31 as part of the Olympic Cojazz program, including two nights at Montreal's Alle Wilfrid-Pelletier (30, 31) and one night at the Olympic Village (28).

When in Montreal, A&M Records will present Vannelli with gold for his albums, Powerful People and Storm At Sunup.

Mair cuts ties with Early Morning Prods

Alexander Mair has resigned as General Manager of Early Morning Productions and their associated companies. He will concern himself only with that business concerning Attic Records, a music complex he formed with Tom Williams in 1974.

Apparently it was initially agreed that Mair would assume dual responsibilities with both Attic and Early Morning but because of "the spectacular growth" of Attic there just wasn't enough time to do justice to both operations.

Attic will be expanding their operation and will take over the entire building at 350 Davenport Road in Toronto. Early Morning will vacate the premises shortly.

Columbia Canada crew to invade CBS convention

The CBS worldwide convention, to be held at the Los Angeles Century Plaza (July 21-24), will be attended by one of the largest Canadian contingents since the annual meetings began.

Heading up the group will be Columbia Canada's president, Terry Lynd. Besides top management from sales, A&R, publishing and promotion, field reps will also register for the meet.

Management from A&A, All Records and Shorewood Packaging will be attending the convention as well.

Last year's convention, held in Toronto, reportedly left behind more than \$1 million for the week long festivities. One Royal York Hotel spokesman remembered: "The CBS Convention was the largest and best put together convention we have ever experienced at the hotel".

Karr and Godfrey exit O'Keefe Centre

Toronto's theatre community was shocked over the sudden departure of Walter Godfrey as house manager from the O'Keefe and the retirement of Jack Karr as publicity director. The latter will leave his position at the end of July. No replacements have been named at press time.

Jack Karr, one of the most knowledgeable PR people in the business, told RPM that he was stepping down because of medical reasons but, after a short rest, hopes to become involved in the business once again. He was associated with the O'Keefe for eleven years and prior to that enjoyed much popularity as a showbiz writer for the Toronto Star. Godfrey was with the big house for ten years.

Also taking leave of the O'Keefe is Pat Canning, who was secretary to former general manager, Hugh Walker.

New to the roster of management is Carolyn Baxter who will serve as administrative assistant to the new general manager, Tom Burrows. Baxter comes to the O'Keefe from Canadian Arctic Gas.

150 reps at A&M L.A. annual meet

Los Angeles was the scene for the annual A&M conference (June 22-28), when 150 A&M reps from Canada, the U.S., and England gathered for "a call to arms," reports A&M Canada's Jim Monaco.

Monaco, promo manager Doug Chappell, J.P. Guilbert, from the Montreal branch, Ontario promo man David Bryan, western reps Ron Sinclair and Neil McGonigall, were the A&M Canadians in attendance. While there, they sat in on seminars on sales, marketing and merchandising, FM radio, and artist tours. There were presentations by the British Dark Horse and the jazzoriented Horizon labels, as well as a talk by A&M president Jerry Moss and the unveiling of new summer product.

A highlight of the affair were the show-casings, where Valdy, according to Monaco, "blew everyone away," and landed a "definite commitment" on international promotion and marketing of his product. His new album will be released in the U.S. this month. (Reassuring news to Valdy, who re-recorded in Los Angeles the best songs from his first three LPs that were only released in the U.S. but didn't take off.)

Another name raised was Gino Vannelli, who is reported to have quite a following in the U.S. His new LP, a concept piece, was scheduled for release this week.

Jim Monaco told RPM that A&M's

Canadian operation received "a lot of respect" from the international people. He felt that this may be because "we lack a lot of the problems the U.S. operation has to cope with." He pointed out that the parent company doesn't distribute itself, but has several independents contracted to it. (A&M Canada used to be in the same position, but last year began its own system.) A&M U.S., is expanding, as here, but because of its size, is finding the expansion not as smooth going as the changes happening this side of the border.

A&M, over the past few years, has charted more Cancon singles and LPs on its label than any other company. The U.S. parent may also have been impressed by the three awards A&M came away with at the RPM awards banquet.

Woodhouse appointed to Tee Vee Promo

Joe Woodhouse has been appointed promotion representative for TeeVee Records and will work closely with Dan LaRoche.

Mr. Woodhouse became one of the top salesmen in the business while at Capitol

which earned him a position in the promotion department. He gained an international image as a unique Canadian promotion representative with his handling of visiting artists which included floral tributes and his own design of cakes - the latter usually turned over to Toronto's Children's Hospital along with a Woodhouse arranged bedside party for the youngsters.

Initial TeeVee promotion for Mr. Woodhouse was the label's O'Keefe reception for Tom Jones during which TeeVee president, Ed LaBuick, presented Jones with Platinum for his 10th Anniversary Set, a television package that was one of the success stories for LaBuick and his company (see photo coverage RPM July 10/76).

Woodyard emerging as hot new talent

There's a very talented 21 year old singer, musician from North Vancouver who goes by the name of James David Woodyard. I first met him about a year and a half ago when he, Doug Robertson and Bob Dalrymple had a record out on London called Another Day and Satisfied Mind. The three of them appeared at the television station asking if they could get on a show or something to plug their record. They impressed me with their sincerity and desire to do well

in the business. The group broke up to go their own separate ways shortly after the record and I didn't hear of them again until the other day when Doug Robertson appeared in my office with "another record." This time it was by Jim Woodyard called Pennsylvania Flower and In Her Arms To Stay. Jim Woodyard has spent several years working with some of Vancouver's best recording acts and is finally emerging as one of the most talented young musicians in Vancouver. Broadcaster Red Robinson likens Jim's singing to that of John Denver. His talents have been heard on several radio and TV commercials played both in Canada and the U.S., and he has been a studio musician for several singles and albums recorded by other artists. He plays guitar, banjo, mandolin and piano. He is also a talented songwriter, having written material already recorded by other acts in the past. His singing style can best be described as "earthy" a low key, smooth easy voice with a distinctive sound of professional originality. James David Woodyard's first solo effort is getting airplay across the country from some radio stations and is being played by stations from Victoria to Courtenay on the Island, Pennsylvania Flower is a country flavored, folkrock tune and the flip side, In Her Arms To Stay is a beautiful lyrical ballad which you will be sure to enjoy.

Woodyard is handled by Dave Palmer of Productions West in Vancouver, who told me they are planning a tour of Canada for Woodyard to help promote the new record, on their own Hiway label. An album is presently in the works.

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Shooter staking out Calgary's Refinery Club

Calgary's Refinery nightclub has been taken over by Toronto's notorious Shooter Gang. This GRT recording group stormed the club with bursts from their Thompson sub machine guns and are intent on holing up for at least the next two weeks.

Formerly the Greaseball Boogie Band, Shooter switched to their present gangster image two years ago after taking their '50's greaser act as far as it could go.

"As Greaseball we were probably the most authentic '50's band in Canada," said keyboardist Ray 'Rabbit' Harrison.

"We explored every possible avenue with that image, we took it to the limit. It reached a stage where we had to do something different to prevent the band from becoming stale."

As a result, Greaseball traded in their Harley Davidsons and leather jackets in

favour of pinstripe suits, fedoras and sub machine guns.

Also changed was the group's musical presentation. Their 50's revue was exchanged for songs like Murder In The First Degree and Money. Interspaced between songs are bursts of gunfire, imaginary pitched battles with police and a constant comedy chatter of gangland dialogue.

It's an image that Shooter members: vocalist Ramone Riviera (alias Duncan Whyte), keyboardist Harrison, Wayne 'Lefty' Mills (saxaphone), drummer Sonnie 'Pasquale' Bernardi and bassist Jimmy 'Thumper' Jones have had great success in selling to Canadian audiences during their present six-week tour.

"Our prime goal has always been to entertain the people. The music is secondary," said percussionist Bernardi. "We'll go to any

extreme to give the audience a good visual show as well as a good audio performance."

Shooter's type-cast imagery has not prevented this good-times rock n' roll band from enjoying a liberal amount of success on the charts. Their cover versions of Leo Sayer's Long Tall Glasses and Train hit the charts as did their cover of Neil Sedaka's Standing On The Outside.

Their new single, Hard Times, is receiving extensive air play and Shooter's second album is projected for a fall release.

"We're also trying to get something going in the states," deadpanned Bernardi. "GRT is trying to work a situation where they're going to buy up all the record companies in the States and we'll be the first release on the new label. It's called King Kong Grooves". -Keith Sharp.

Di Maria started working on the music for the concept LP when he was contacted by a friend, Tom Shannon, who has just returned to CKLW in Windsor Shannon had interviewed a number of plant-music proponents on his show and found that despite all of the disagreements among the "experts", they agreed that soothing music, preferably baroque, aided plant growth.

De Maria scored the music and produced the record in Atlanta with several Atlanta Symphony musicians and "tastey rock musicians: I didn't need guys who say 'I'm recording a plant music LP, hee hee' and take scale and run."

Di Maria remembers that at first none of them took the project seriously enough, but then got into it and it became a labour of love. The intent gave them the structure to compose and record within, and they came up with a very smooth presentation done in a living cycle: side one is a wake up and exercise routine, and side two works

into a final-cut lullaby.

Whether or not the program works on plants (and it can't do any harm) the producers tried to keep the music true to the music plant growth factors most accepted by plant music freaks, and came up with an LP suitable for human enjoyment as well.

"I'm not looking to be made a fool of," says Di Maria, "It's a well-performed and lovingly put-together album, and I like me better because of it."

He reports unsolicited correspondence from people who say the music has done wonders for their green friends and the LP is selling primarily through plant shops and nurseries. Many green-house growers have been playing continuous classical music for their seedlings for years, and find Plant Music to be as good as anything they've used before. Some, Amherst reports, are even promoting the LP.

Several MOR and light classical stations in the U.S. have aired the LP and Di Maria wants to keep the promo light; he's afraid it would look too much like fad mongering. Amherst plans to run a TV marketing campaign for the LP in the fall.

Foot-in-mouth disease could spread

It took a brash, uninformed series of statements by a Canadian National Exhibition official (who, foot in mouth, used only ignorance to defend unfounded attacks on Canadian talent), a subsequent public out-



cry, threats of lawsuits, and a public apology to possibly change the emphasis of future CNE Grandstand Shows from showcasing U.S. talent to presenting Canadians.

Now, one wonders if the waves of change will reach some of the major Western summer grandstand shows.

The Calgary Stampede, which this year stages the largest officially-sanctioned U.S. Bicentennial celebration outside the U.S., is headlining Bob Hope and Helen Reddy along with the Mormon Tabernacle Choir.

Edmonton's Klondike Days will stage Gordon Lightfoot, (July 24) before he goes on his canoe trip, with Chicago, Loretta Lynn and Conway Twitty, The Carpenters and The Beach Boys.

The Pacific National Exhibition (Vancouver) in late August features Canadian acts Bachman-Turner Overdrive and Neil Young, with Frank Sinatra, Tom Jones, Bob McGrath, Phyllis Dillar, Lawrence Welk, Neil Sedaka, Johnny Cash, Glen Campbell, Jose Feliciano, Stephen Stills, Rick Nelson, Charley Pride, Ray Charles, and Vikki Carr.

That's enough to make a West Coast promo man really work.

Events such as the recent CNE controversy (RPM, July 10) tend to send ripples and set precendents for similar circumstances elsewhere. We hope that the officials responsible for the Western grandstand shows are boning up on the personalities and availability of Canadian acts so, when the pressure is on, they, at least, can defend going after the Yankee tourist dollar with U.S. acts in an informed manner.

Maybe they'll also find some suitable acts from closer to home, and not as costly.

A lesson can be learned from the Olympics Arts and Culture program. Despite all of the problems facing the Olympic organizing committee (COJO), they have been able to sponsor a program of high culture, pop, and jazz to the hundreds of thousands of tourists visiting Montreal this summer with a very heavy Canadian line up.

The National and Royal Winnipeg Ballet and dozens of Canadian dance, drama and musical groups will play hundreds of performances in the Montreal area in July.

The pop lineup, Cojazz, an all-Canadian jazz festival, is presenting five concerts by Gino Vannelli, four each by Moe Koffman and Nimmons 'N' Nine Plus Six, and David Clayton Thomas' Blood Sweat & Tears and the Dudes, three by The Paul Horn Quintet, four by Quebec-born Maynard Ferguson and a day of showcasing four local Quebec jazz groups.

That doesn't seem like a lineup to scare tourists away, and a lot of Canadians will see some of their own great ones for the first time.

K-Kountry, LaFleche & Gill score for B.C.'s Rada label

The Vancouver-based Rada Records reports a heavy summer schedule for the label's top hopefuls. Elmer Gill is now in Las Vegas sharing the billing with Phil Ford in The Roar Of The Grease Paint - The Smell of The Crowd. The musical was written by Anthony Newley and Leslie Bricusse and ran to packed houses when it

Castlegar-based Zodiac release on Minto label

Castlegar, B.C. has established itself as spawning what could be a leading contemporary MOR group from that province. Named Zodiac, the group comprises musicians in age from 15 to 17 - James Warner,

Ron Plotnikoff, Brian Verigin and John Keraiff, and they release on the Minto label.

Initial single release, Moon Of Summer, was penned by Serge Plotnikoff, one of the pioneers of songwriting from B.C. The flip, Sing For Pleasure, was written by group member Warner and both are published through Kin-gar Publications (BMIC). There is no information as to who produced the session or where.

Shipping was extensive across Canada and early reports indicate that the single has been charted or playlisted in five markets.

K-Kountry, Rada's newest country group, have been included in the festivities for Stampede Week which is part of their western tour and includes Kamloops and Revelstoke. They'll be heading into eastern Canada in the fall.

George LaFleche, brother of the famous Giselle McKenzie, will be appearing at B.C.'s Fort Steel summer festival. He capped a heavy spring television schedule on a national bit with his sister. His new Rada single, Kootenay Serenade is being scheduled for a summer release.

Canadian and U.S. dates set for Mahogany Rush

With their new Columbia distributed album, under title of their own name, beginning to show national acceptance, Mahogany Rush, moved into the U.S. on a major tour that sees them sharing the billing with several name groups. They have already swung through the U.S. midwest with Ritchie Blackmore, Lynyrd Skynyrd, Journey, B.O. Cult, Mott The Hoople, Wet Willie, Foghat and Derringer and headline their own show in Kenton, Ohio, July 7 before moving into Toronto's CNE Stadium with Aerosmith and Jeff Beck for the 24th.

The Montreal-based group will team up with Ted Nugent for dates in San Antonio (25), Corpus Christie (26), Houston (28), and Dallas (29).

Returning home they headline their own show at Place des Nations August 4.

Polydor set to release best of Bachman-Turner

Coinciding with their new 20-city tour beginning July 16, Bachman-Turner Overdrive and Polydor have set that date for the release of a Greatest Hits package. The album is titled, The Best Of BTO.

Included on the set will be Let It Ride, You Ain't Seen Nothin' Yet, Roll On Down The Highway, Hey You, Lookin' Out For No. 1, Blue Collar, plus live versions of Takin' Care Of Business (8 minutes long) and Gimme Your Money Please. The latter is the first cut from their first album.

Runkhe's Summer Love now on his Hot Spell LP

U.A.'s Craig Runkhe, whose new single, Summer Love, recently broke into the RPM top 100, gets a boost from his new LP, Hot Spell. He taped the all-original set in Nashville with Larry Butler producing. His current single is included on the LP.

Runkhe will be playing the Prairies: July 15, 16, 17 at the Winnipeg Inn; two weeks starting July 19 at Saskatoon's Sheraton-Cavalier Hotel.

Rada & Haggstrom to build Cancon

The pacting of two B.C. music firms will add yet another plus for local talent from that province. Rada Records of Vancouver and Whiterock's Haggstrom Music, a recently established production company formed to develop domestic talent, have firmed a long term agreement.

First to benefit from the signing will be Jud Paynter. Initial single release will be a Paynter penning, Do It, to be followed by

an album.

Nigrini on verge of stardom

Ron Nigrini's recording career started when Attic Records did. He was their first release, in '74, with an LP just titled Ron Nigrini.

The LP met with good criticism as he played bars and coffeehouses, but not until recently has he found any real commercial success. Charted at 123 stations across Canada at last count, his version of the Oscar-winning Keith Carradine song I'm Easy has opened up the market for him a little more.

Even so, Nigrini admits that it was Carradine's Oscar (the song is from the movie Nashville) that charted the song. I'm Easy was released around the same time as the movie, but Attic's reservicing of the record after the awards (several months later) made programmers take notice.

Nigrini's version is doing well on the RPM chart despite the fact that Carradine's original has now been released on both sides of the border. Nigrini is managing to make a good name for himself with programmers as well as critics, several of whom agree that Nigrini's interpretation is the superior version.

When it comes time to pick a second single from the new LP, Rich Things, hopefully one of his own compositions, such as You're The Reason, will be taken out.

As his musical style is not narrowly defined, Nigrini isn't against doing other people's songs, as long as he can identify with them. He told RPM that he's turned down several suggestions from the Attic crew for this reason. I'm Easy was an exception.

The new LP has an impressive list of musicians helping out: Larry Good, Tom Szcesniak, Michael Hasek, Ben Mink, David Essig, Shirley Eikhard, Ralph Cole, with

production by Bruce Pennycook. Nigrini explained that production was as deeply or as sparingly textured as required for each song; the result is an LP containing a blend of moods and styles.

Nigrini is featured as a solo artist at present, but he works off and on with Paul Fortier and Don Heard, who also helped out on the LP. This summer he'll be on his own again, performing solo at several folk festivals between occasional bookings at coffeehouses and bars: the Atlantic Folk Festival near Halifax July 31, the London Home County Folk Festival August 7, and the Hamilton Festival of Friends, sometime during the weekend of August 14.

Nigrini is looking forward to taking part in a play this fall. He'll be on stage with guitar in hand, providing a live "soundtrack" for a modern production by Toronto's Open Circle Theatre. -BT

A disco version of Over The Rainbow has been cut by Darren St. Claire and Blossom, with production by Richard Harrow and Doug Wong. Kentucky Moonshine will be released from the LP by Appleshine featuring Manni Fink, production by Richard Harrow and Bruce Innes. Sunshine Song is a release by Ron Mahonin on his new Heart label. A commercial advertising campaign recorded at Soundwest called Snowmotion recently won a national award from the Travel Industry Association of Canada.

MacLaine outgrosses Humperdink & Jones

Following on the heels of Humperdinck (May) and Jones in June, Shirley MacLaine arrived in town with her one woman show and smiles for everyone. From the moment she bounds on stage till the moment she leaves it, MacLaine does what she was paid for, entertain.

With a collection of songs from her past movie hits, she brings smiles and fond memories of moments enjoyed in the past.

MacLaine, who set a box office record for a single performer in a one week run, at the O'Keefe Centre (topping both Humperdinck and Jones) grossed \$209,256, playing to 26,000 people (SRO at all performances).

Miss MacLaine who started her career in the chorus line, showed what has taken her from the obscurity of the chorus line to one of the world's leading ladies in films and one of the most professional performers on stage. Not only did she prove that she can sing and dance but also that she can entertain.

That Raisin' Prods set Morse session

Kenny Harris' newly bowed That Raisin' Productions has firmed a record deal with local Vancouver artist, Kathy Morse. A unique song and dance talent, the young Morse has been involved in the music business since the age of seven and for the past two years has included flying instructress to her occupations.

Studio and date for the recording session will be announced at a later date.

Television and music

Watch the hits on your TV

What is behind the new explosion of hit singles from television show themes?

Themes from S.W.A.T. and Welcome Back Cotter were chart toppers in the U.S. and Canada, and themes from Baretta, Happy Days, and Laverene and Shirley are now also on the charts.

There have been several hit TV show singles in the past - Peter Gunn, Mission Impossible, 77 Sunset Strip, Route 66, Dr. Kildare, Rawhide - but never so many from TV shows premiering in the same season, and never so many on the chart at once.

Steve Barri, who produced four hits from TV shows this year (S.W.A.T., Happy Days, Welcome Back Cotter, Baretta) says, in an Associated Press wire story, that it's no accident all of the themes come from ABC network shows.

The network has apparently an aggressive push made to win the 8:00-9:00 pm viewing hour which has been regulated by the U.S. FCC to be programmed by the networks with shows fit for family viewing. One of the keys has been to create musical themes more attractive to the hit-struck minds of younger viewers, and, the network expects, their tastes will direct their parents viewing habits at that time as well.

In Canada, there was talk at one time of releasing Ben McPeek's theme for CBC's Frankie Howerd Show as a single.

Barri stresses that hits are generated by the success fo the TV show. But he also predicts that TV music scorers will now compose with the theme's ability to be stretched into a record-length song in mind.

It's not surprising that TV, the most lucrative part of the entertainment business (the U.S. networks billed \$2.2 billion in advertising revenue last year - total U.S. ad billing is estimated at more than \$6 billion for 1976), would pay for and generate hit music material.

When Broadway was king and when Hollywood was on top they were (and still are) major cogs in the music hit machine.

With a growth of Canadian TV production and experience of many of Canada's top composers in TV theme scoring (Hagood Hardy's Homecoming was a TV tea commercial) many are hopeful the electron screen and discbiz will click for some of the same up here.

Amherst growing after 6 months

Amherst Records of Canada and Canada-Wide distributors broke into the record promotion game with a Rolls Royce-driven promo for the Tremeloes new Shiner LP in June.

Amherst, a record company in Canada and in the U.S., and Canada Wide, an independent record distributor here, are both divisions of U.S. rackjobbing firm Trans-Continental Record Sales. Canada Wide began 18 months ago, basically as a distributor of deleted records; Amherst's Canadian office opened last January.

Canada Wide now distributes records on the Dick James Music, Gold Plate and newly-signed Soul International labels, as well as the Amherst label.

Amherst is looking to sign Canadian acts, and recently announced a deal with Bananas, a popular bar band for the past few years who once recorded for CHUM's now defunct MUCH label. They plan an LP release for the group in September, and say they are planning to launch one of the biggest Canadian promotions ever for a breaking new group.

Canada Wide's Ed (Swiatek) was driven on his Tremeloes promotion rounds to stores and radio stations in a classic Rolls Royce, and put up "be driven around in a Rolls Royce for a day" contests at Hamilton's CKOC and A&A's. They plan to use the car again to promote the newly released Chicago Gangster LP (Gold Plate label).

This week, Amherst-Canada Wide is mailing a new single by Ozo, an international group including a Canadian with German, Dutch and Israeli fellow members. Their single, Listen To The Buddah, is described as a bit of religious reggae.

Rush came home this time with a superstar tag. Three sold-out nights, making the show the biggest grossing in Massey Hall's history. The band played selections from Rush, Fly By Night, and Caress of Steel, as well as the highlight of the evening, side one from 2112, their current opus. Three encores capped their performance each night.

Max Webster, out with debut LP on SRO's Taurus label, appeased an excitable crowd with their slightly eccentric rock, to the tune of an encore each of the three nights, a rare achievement for an opening act. A single off the LP has been released, entitled Blowing The Blues Away.

Franklyn booked in big around TV production

Vic Franklyn will be playing two weeks with a big band in the Zodiac Room of Toronto's Ramada Inn which began June 26, when he and William F. Cooke Productions began shooting Franklyn's upcoming syndicated TV variety series. This stint was a major departure from the room's normal disco-sound acts.

Franklyn will also be one of the few Canadians playing Toronto's Royal York Imperial Room next season, sandwiched between season-opener Lawrence Welk and Tony Bennett.

CHCH Hamilton has set the Franklyn show for Thursdays at 8:30. It was erroneously reported in RPM (July 3) that CHCH shot the original pilot at Toronto's Casa Loma, then scrapped the idea. Only the Casa Loma part was scrapped, and no finished pilot was ever shot. CHCH, William Cooke told RPM, has been a strong support-

er of the show since its inception.

Brook Benton and Kelly Garrett have been lined up to appear on the show in addition to numerous stars reported earlier in RPM. The show will be syndicated to independent TV stations across Canada.

VALDY Valdy And The Hometown Band A&M SP 4592-W



From the time this LP was previewed with the hit single, Yes I Can, last winter, a lot of people, including fans Valdy won on his cross-Canada tour last spring, have been expecting big things to come out of B.C.'s Little Mountain Studio.

It's the West Coast folksinger's fourth Canadian LP. He cut another last year, a compilation of songs from his first three, for the U.S. market; it didn't work for him and A&M there, and some critics and Valdy fans thought the Isick Rothchild's production of that deck went poorly with Valdy's simpler style.

He's now back to Claire Lawrence production, but this time with a fuller, and in many ways slicker, product than his first three LPs.

There's a lot of guitar strings in cuts Valdy would have played solo before, and only a few cuts without the full sound of the band. But it's not overly produced. There is only one cut (Old Home Place) which sounds like a move to a more country sound that some poeple expected from the hit single.

Lawrence's reed playing and Shari Ulrich's violin playing bring more of a pop-jazz flavour to most songs, all good for airplay, but there isn't the jamming and soloing (including by Valdy himself) that the group showed in concert.

Except for the new sound, the material is similar to Valdy repertoire we are familiar with: the country, the sea, working people all have a big place. A&M has picked Peter And Lou to be Valdy's next single, to be released next week.



RPM Album Reviews

CÓRDON BLEU Solution Rocket PIG 2189-J

New Rocket family addition is a German four-man band featuring sax instead of guitar, creating strains of accessable jazz and light rock. Clear sounds are the work of Elton's producer Gus Dudgeon. Progressive FMers should love Chappaqua and Third Line Part II. LP should appeal to pop, rock, and jazz markets.





IAN LLOYD Ian Lloyd Polydor PD 1 6066-Q

Co-produced by Gregg Diamond, this outing by Stories front man should appeal to fans of that group. Lloyd's voice has been set in a similar pop-rock format, and several cuts have AM and FM airplay potential. Try Sensations, Silver Chains, Oh What I'd Do, and single, Never Been A Man.

MICHAEL FRANKS The Art Of Tea Reprise MS 2230-P

Franks has a soft voice which is best suited to those of his songs with a light jazz feel, and, with the help of a few familiar LA sessionmen, producer Tommy Lipuma makes those songs sound even better. Eggplant, Jive, and Mr. Blue, should appeal to FMers and MOR programmers, as well as lovers of soft rock & light jazz.





ANDREA TRUE CONNECTION More More More Buddah BDS 5670-M

Pop producer Greg Diamond has turned this former porno movie star into a singer with a top-ten hit. A five-song package aimed at the disco LP-buying market, Diamond has also written and arranged all cuts, including subtle disco ballads like Keep It Up Longer.

VARIOUS ARTISTS Peter And The Wolf RSO 2394 162-Q

A rock interpretation of the classic children's tale, produced and written by Jack Lancaster and Robin Lumley, with a few themes borrowed from Prokofiev. The story flows smoothly with narration by Viv Stanshall and slick performances by Manfred Mann, Alvin Lee, Gary Brooker, Garry Moore, Eno, Phil Collins, Stephane Grappelli & others.





RUBETTES Rubettes Polydor 2490 138-Q

Already a success in Britain and Europe, the Rubettes, with this LP will, try to further their hold of the North American market that bought Sugar Baby Love two years ago. That hit is included in this set, as are selections from two LPs previously released here. Deeply rooted in the vocal sounds of the fifties the band should find new fans

Royalty's newest signing, Glory-Anne Carriere, took the promotion plunge and, along with the label's national sales manager, Ian Douglas, set out on a tour of Canada. 

"....the very best studios in the world"

Looking back in time to 1964 when RPM began publishing to the Canadian music industry, there really wasn't that much happening in domestic production.

Canada boasted three "major" multi-track recording studios. All three were 3-track facilities and the producers of that day, who found their Canadian productions climbing the U.S. charts, were very surprised that the productions, out of Canada, were being accepted internationally.

Those early pioneering efforts were done with very little that could be called professional production facilities. The early Canadian recording studios were used chiefly to overdub imported commercial and jingle tracks. Record production in Canada was centred around Montreal where a great deal of French-Canadian recording was done to a unique market and the productions were of very poor quality but very successful in this unique market.

In March of 1966, Hallmark Studios in Toronto announced the first 4-track studio in Canada. The equipment was a second hand unit purchased in the U.S. and installed in the existing control room.

Within a few months RCA's studios in Toronto and Montreal followed suit and shortly after, Bay Music and Sound Canada, in Toronto, were all equipped with 4-track facilities.

The producers who began it all had brought the business to a point where 4-track was feasible for Canada. It was the beginning of an era where more and more Canadian productions surfaced on the international charts and set the Canadian music explosion of the late sixties.

It wasn't until mid-1970 when the studio boom occurred. The announcement of the CRTC Canadian content regulations brought about a number of studio proposals and many of them were very ambitious. It then became standard for most studios to offer 8-track and a number were equipped with 16-track and 24-track facilities.

The announcement of the 30% Canadian content ruling was considered "a licence to print money" according to one of the drumbeaters who was attempting to finance a new facility.

As a result of the newly announced regulations, there were many who saw the door open and suddenly Canada not only had studios, but many of them were as up-to-date as any in the world.

The facilities were not only modern but, in many cases, the decor was sumptuous compared with the factory atmosphere of the early Canadian studios.

Now, six years later, we can attempt to put together a directory of Canadian studios. In this edition, we have outlined the facilities that are available to Canadians, and the world, for recording.

Even this is not a complete list because many other studios exist which are used exclusively for jingles and commercials and still others that specialize in motion picture sound track recording.

Canada can boast today some of the best studios in the world and many artists of international reputation come to Canada to record.

It was summed up by the manager of one of the hottest acts in the world who, when asked why they picked Canada for recording, answered: "We record in the very best studios in the world". That says it all.

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



The Programmers

Turn on your TV and watch the hits

Led by Toronto's CHUM-FM, there has been a resurgence in live concert-type broadcasting on FM radio. A local performance by a Canadian group broadcast direct to the station's listeners makes airfare which will satisfy the CRTC's new demands for up front FM programming.

So far this year, CHUM-FM has featured performances by Bim, Ray Materick, Moe Koffman, Dominic Troiano, Shirley Eikhard and others, averaging about two a month. Before August, there will have been a dozen broadcast concerts.

Other stations across Canada have featured similar programs, such as CHFM Calgary, CJCM or FM96 Montreal, and CHIQ-FM Winnipeg, but none to the extent that CHUM-FM has.

Program director Duff Roman explained to RPM how it began: "All this activity got started when CHUM-FM made statements to the industry that we would be doing live broadcasts. We had included it in our Promise of Performance to the CRTC, so it came to be known that we'd be doing them when the regulations came into effect in September and that we were receptive to doing them now. With that, discussions began

with promotional people, record companies, personal managers, and even artists themselves, and it just developed from there."

In each case once the broadcast has been agreed to by CHUM-FM and the record company and the group's management, and the date and place set, the technical equipment has to be set up. This was the responsibility of the record company and management, but, since the station knew the most about such things, CHUM-FM engineer Dave Heydu was hired independently to take care of the mixing and carrying of the sound (via special Bell telephone wire hookups) to the station for broadcast. The average cost for a broadcast was about \$600, which was paid for by the group's management and/or their record company. Roman stressed that in every case, the broadcast was done as a promotional vehicle for everyone involved, and that the technical setup was the only part that involved costs.

GRT was the first to do a broadcast with the station, and they're also the label doing the most broadcasts. National promotion rep Jeff Burns told RPM that besides Dan Hill's broadcast in December, a redo will be done shortly. Moe Koffman was done in March. In addition, GRT has arranged similar broadcasts with Hill for CHFM Calgary and CJFM Montreal, as well as Downchild at CHIQ-FM Winnipeg. As Burns explained, "We're trying to be the first in every market," and he added that a live broadcast, "if promoted properly is certainly worthwhile."

Tapes have been made of all the broadcasts, but so far only Dominic Troiano's management has tried hustling them to stations to any real degree. Several American stations have expressed interest. This is not due so much to anyone's promotional abilities as it is to Troiano's established following south of the border. None of the other broadcast performers are well-known outside of Canada.

While it is much more convenient for several stations to use one tape of a broadcast performance instead of setting up a broadcast in each market as GRT had done, there are not enough stations in Canada to make extensive promotional tape use practical for a Canadian group. It would seem that much of the promotional value is in the fact that listeners are hearing the performance live as it happened.

Four other record companies have tried live broadcasting besides GRT. Polydor's Garfield did one, with heavier-thanusual costs being picked up by the band, but the tape didn't turn out, according to Lopi Bruner. No definite plans have been made for another broadcast by any other Polydor act. RCA held a broadcast for the Good Brothers, and while again, no plans are being made for tapes or broadcast, Neil Dixon of Dixon-Propas Management told RPM that some of the results are being considered for a live LP.

There is enough interest to give CHUM-FM a busy schedule right up to the time the regs officially come into effect in September but Roman admits that there are limits as to the potential of live broadcasts. "It's very difficult to do. There are so many technical problems. It will be a limited format. In terms of whether we can expand it we'll have to wait and see, but in terms of the energy and manpower needed to present an hour of live programming, it just isn't economically feasable for it to be a broadbase thing. It's just too complicated for the end results."

For FM radio though, it remains good foreground fare, and record companies don't seem against the idea in the case of a group or artist in need of different exposure.

CJRT sets concerts of live classical music

Toronto non-profit FM station CJRT will present six evening classical music concerts at Toronto's 1,400 seat Ryerson Hall. The concerts, featuring the CJRT Orchestra and 11 guest artists, will be partially broadcast by the station.

Last season CJRT staged a four-concert series, selling out two and almost selling out the others. They sold 600 season subscriptions.

The concerts, which will be staged October 3, November 14, December 19, January 30, March 27 and May 15 (all Sundays) will each feature the works of one composer or country, and will each consist of an inroductory prelude presenting chamber music, and a full-orchestra concert, followed by coffee reception with the musicians.

CJRT music director Paul Robinson, who will also conduct the CJRT Orchestra, told RPM that the prelude portions of the concert, and possibly more, will be broadcast over CJRT as they were last year. The additional cost of broadcasting the full orchestra, \$20 per musician, would come to more than \$1,000 per concert. The series

presents only half-concerts from the full orchestra to economize on musicians live performance fees.

The concerts are financially independent of the station, but Robinson plans to devote a full day of programming to the subject of each concert the day of the performance.

The CJRT Orchestra is made up of prominent Toronto musicians, many of whom play in the Toronto Symphony. Soloists for the series are: Clarinetist James Campbell, Soprano Alexandra Browning, tenor Mark Dubois, cellist Peter Schenkman, soprano Barbara Ianni, pianists Anton Kubalek, William Aide, Jane Coop, and Patricia Parr and mezzo-soprano Lois Marshall.

Series subscriptions cost \$30.00 for adults. Deficits will be met by grants from the Ontario Arts Council and private business.

CBC radio is running two classical music shows with a twist to the usual classical music formats this summer.

Sundays on AM, Mondays on FM, the networks will broadcast The Art Of The Collector, an eight-week series featuring interviews and selections from some of Canada's private record collectors, many with collections of more than 20,000 discs.

Cellist Peter Schenkman will host the show with guests including Toronto Star's William Littler, Performing Arts In Canada's Michael Schulman, record producer Paul Hoeffler, author James Creighton (recording archivist at the U. of T.), opera archivist John Codner and Cregor Benko, VP of New York's International Piano Archives.

The series begins July 11 (12 on FM). 4:03 EDT, 7:03 ADT, 7:33 NDT, 9:03 PDT, 11:03 CDT, and aired nationally at 1:03 pm on the FM network.

Starting July 10, CBC-AM offers Music From The Proms, a Saturday Night onehour light classical show geared to summer night listening produced by John Holm's in St. John's Newfoundland. (8:30 pm EDT, 9:30 ADT, 10 NDT).

As well, the AM network is airing a Saturday half-hour show (10:30), Sounds Like Summer, hosted by Larry Palef, who introduces a request program of popular music on CBC broadcast and other recordings replacing Family Favourites for the

Entrants are asked to mail their log sheets, showing how often the song is aired, into GBI Recording Company in the Bahamas every week during the month of July. A log sheet from each station will be placed in a raffle barrel, and a draw will take place at a broadcasting affair at the Waldorf Astoria in Toronto the first week of August.
