

# An important year for Canada at MIDEM

Canada at MIDEM is now becoming one of the most popular social as well as business events outside the country. The importance of MIDEM for Canadians has been largely due the participation of the Federal Government and their generosity in sponsoring a group of companies to the Cannes song market.

Government participation has obviously paid off, Julie Radwanski, of the International Public Relations Office of Infor mation and Public Relations for the Depart ment of Industry, Trade and Commerce, reports that the Canadian government has hard facts and numbers showing the popularity of Canadian music abroad. She points out that during the 1970 to 1976 period, exports from Canada rose from \$0.5 million to \$1.9 million, a gain of 280 percent Royalties received from foreign societies increased 574 percent from \$123,000 in 1967 to \$706,000 in 1976. Imports for the 1970 through 1976 period increased 223 percent from \$4.4 million to \$14.2 million while the ratio of imports to exports changed dramatically from 35.1

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in 1965 to 5.1 which again indicated a significant increase in the acceptance of Canadian music abroad.

It's also interesting to note the number of platinum and gold albums certified over the past year. In all, there were 216 records certified with the Canadian Recording Industry Association. This included the first quadruple platinum album to be certified by CRIA, which was Boston which went over the 400,000 mark. The first triple platinum was A Star Is Born by Barbra Streisand and Kris Kristofferson, which registered sales of more than 300,000 units Electric Light Orchestra's A New World Record took honours of being the first double platinum album to be certified by CRIA.

To qualify for gold status in the album category, sales in Canada must exceed 50,000 units. For gold status in the singles category, sales must exceed 75,000 Platinum certification is for album sales in excess of 100,000 units and for singles, sales must exceed 150,000

Ms. Radwanski also pointed out that other indications of growth in the Canadian industry included a 32% increase in the number of recording studios over the past two years. The technical advances rnade by Canadian studios attracted many internationally-known groups to record in Canada, These included Elton John, Isaac Hayes, Nazareth, Cat Stevens, Alice Cooper, Olivia Newton-John, Ringo Starr and many others Although Montreal and Toronto would appear to be garnering most of the business. Vancouver is perhaps one of the most underrated recording centres in Canada. They now boast some of the most modern recording facilities in the world and are fast developing an international clientele. Recording activity however, is not restricted to these three centres. Edmonton, Hamilton, Regina, Calgary, Halifax, Whitby, Winnipeg and others are contributing to the growth of this important industry in Canada In the Canadian market alone, sound recordings have grown in value from \$69.7 million in 1970 to \$172.5 million in 1976. Total net shipments expanded from 44.1 million units in 1970 to 75.4 million units in 1976, a gain of 71 percent The value of sales at distributor's net selling price totalled \$160.1 million in 4976, an increase of 147 percent over the corresponding figure for 1970. Record sales ex

panded by 129 percent with tapes up by 203 percent. Growth per year varied from a low of 9 percent to a high of 25 percent.

Government figures also reveal that the consumer price index for sound recordings moved from 100,00 in 1971 to 159.6 in 1976, an increase of 60 percent which compares with a gain of 50 percent for all consumer items.

Another area in which Canada has progressed is in the development of direct to disc lacquering and digital sound recordings. These limited edition recordings are now in dernand around the world.

The importance of MIDEM to Canadian record companies and publishers can best be illustrated by the number of Canadian music people who return each year to what has become the world's greatest meeting place for selling and bartering song material, completed masters etc.

Perhaps one of the greatest success stories has been that of Gary Salter and Johnny Williams who, today, head up their own Direction label. On their first trip to MIDEM they scooped the rest of North America by negotiating for the release of product by Silver Convention. Direction

now celebrating its first anniversary (Jan. 25), is a consistent winner in the discomarket. One of their big winners in this field is Kebekeletrik, now being distributed in the U.S. by Salsoul. They have also had much success in the pop field with Billy Workman and with Barde, a traditional folk group. Williams has arranged licensing agreements for their catalogue in disparate territories such as Australia, New Zealand, The Philippines, Brazil, France, The Benelux, Italy, Spain, Central America as well as individual record arrangements with the U.S., U.K., Germany, Austria and other countries.

Carole Risch, who heads up Montreal's Sterling/Disques Fleur Inc. is also a firm believer in MIDEM. "I have always made good contacts with lasting business arrangements" she told RPM, and her success in the domestic and international market backs up this claim. She is currently hustling Diane Juster, Claude Michel, Alain Delorme and Midnite Stud. The latter is a discogroup making excellent gains with their

single, Gloria. Ms. Risch began her own company in 1974 after several years in the business, most notably working for MUCH Productions, a recording label owned by CHUM Radio. One of her most important releases from the international market has been Santa Esmeralda, an album which features Leroy Gomex. The album is now

gold in Canada and Ms. Risch will be presenting Larry with a gold record at MIDEM this year.

RCA's Ed Preston and Andy Nagy return once again to MIDEM. They too have become well entrenched in the disco mar-

ket. Two Canadian recording units, The Black Light Orchestra and THP Orchestra have scored on the international front as well. RCA's publishing arm, Sunbury/Dunbar has been active over the past year

through its president Jack Feeney, providing Messrs Preston and Nagy with an excellent representation of Canadian writers. Mr. Nagy told RPM: "Once you leave MIDEM, the contacts you have made, carry on indefinitely." Needless to say, Mr. Nagy will be on the lookout for another Roger Whittaker, Joe Dassin or Vickie Leandros.

The location seems to be ideal for the record and music industry to gather from every corner of the world. The season seems to add to the success of MIDEM. 



# What seven days of MIDEM is really like

You can't believe that it can continue at its killing pace for seven days. On the sixth day you notice that it is beginning to die down.

One thousand firms are represented and 5000 participants attend one of the largest events in the music and record industry each year.

This is MIDEM and it is a marketplace for selling music publishing catalogues and recorded masters to various countries of the world.

Each day thousands of appointments are made, millions of words of negotiation are spoken and songs and masters are listened to and hundreds of deals are made. All this occurs in a pandemonium of subdued sound and confusion that takes a few days to understand.

Tapes are played, VTRs are shown and photos and products are displayed and hyped in every language and if you don't speak the language, there is one universal tongue and that is business.

If you view it as an outsider it looks like a big party, but as you get involved, you see that it is a very well organized mass confusion that creates results and can only be part of a business as exciting as the record and music business.

The magnitude of the event requires a great deal of organization and the efforts of Bernard Chevry have not been in vain because the whole thing comes together regardless of the fact that it is big and complicated. This is a genuine tribute to the founder and organizer.

MIDEM isn't all business, and for a few it is no business at all. Each night a gala is staged that presents the finest talent from around the world.

You may find that you want to spend your night at the gaming tables of the Casino on the Croisette. Around midnight the bars at the Martinez, Majestic, Carlton and the many other main hotels are crowded with representatives of many countries

who talk over the deals and near-deals of the day.

Silver Convention came to Canada from MIDEM. Abba was discovered at MIDEM and other million dollar deals have been made, and will be made at MIDEM.

In its size, splendour and confusion there is a purpose and for those who are willing to work, there is a reward. Few could travel the world to peddle their wares in the same way that they can be sold and bought at MIDEM under one roof during one hectic week.

It grows each year, and this year's events from January 20th to the 26th will be the biggest in MIDEM's twelve years. Facilities in the Palais des Festival have been expanded again this year to make room for more participants.

Many companies pick this week for their annual international sales convention. There are press receptions and presentations that are going on throughout the week at many locations throughout Cannes.

Hotel rooms are at a premium and the known eating places are packed each night. In the bars of Cannes there is standing room only from 11 pm until the last customer leaves at some early hour of the morning.

MIDEM is an eyeopener to the music industry universally. It presents an opportunity for the industry to get together and make contacts, contracts and bring the thoughts, feelings and music of one nation to another who might often be worlds apart. It isn't a new concept because many industries have international conventions and festivals, but MIDEM is unique in many aspects.

The event flatters the industry and in the years to come as more and more artists attend, MIDEM may become as glamorous as the Cannes Film Festival because the record and music industry is now much bigger than the film industry.

Canada's participation is an asset to our industry. It can be the best spent seven days of the year.

# Canada UIS AT MIDEM

MIDEM is the creation of Bernard Chevry, who has organized every MIDEM since the first one in 1967. All of the meetings have taken place in Cannes, France, a location Chevry had thought ideal for its atmosphere, accommodation and size.

Chevry's background includes the setting up of a wholesale record operation (COGEDEP) and a television programming firm (MIP-TV) among other activities in the early 1960s.

At the first MIDEM in 1967 there were 349 companies and 900 people in attendance, by 1976 the numbers had swelled to 500 companies from 40 countries and over 5,500 people.

Chevry has said, in interviews, that he feels that while if he hadn't founded MIDEM someone else would have, the fact that it has been done by someone outside of the rnusic industry has given MIDEM a greater scope than it might have had.

Chevry has said that it gives MIDEM credibility that the U.S. takes part instead of organizing their own music publishing market as might be expected. (It wasn't until two years ago when the first Musexpo Festival was held in the U.S.)

The largest contingents to MIDEM come from the U.S., France, Germany, and the U.K.

MIDEM is set up on four floors of a building, and each floor has a number of booths of various sizes assigned to representatives of various countries. Canada shares one large booth, and each company has staff in charge of appointments. The booth also has listening rooms, as the rules state that music cannot be played audibly. The idea is to go from booth to booth in a circle, making appointments. The booths are open from 9:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. and business, naturally, continues back at the hotel during the evening.

# Global network, Mel Shaw firm 5 rock specials

Toronto-based Mel Shaw Productions and Ontario's Global Television Network have firmed an agreement for the production of a series of five contemporary music specials for the Ontario network, Canadian syndication and international distribution.

The specials, under the umbrella title The World Of Rock, will be introduced with a one-hour package titled Rock Times Three. The program will feature top Canadian acts Rush (Anthem Records), the Stampeders (MWC) and the lan Thomas Band (GRT) in a concert setting. Air date is being projected for early February in Canada.

The specials will be produced by Shaw and Milad Bessada. On the first program, the Stampeders and Thomas segments were directed by Jack Sampson, with the Rush segment directed by Bruce Gowers. Associate producers were Candi Cazau and Beverley Bowen. Global executive producer Jerry Appleton has expressed his enthusiasm for the project, and the network's desire to develop a close working relationship with the recording industry. Appleton feels the Global specials and subsequent series will offer a major showcase for recording artists to perform their new releases in a natural concert setting.

Future programs will continue to use top Canadian recording artists along with emerging new attractions.

On the international front, Shaw will be in Los Angeles to meet with U.S. managers and agents in an attempt to involve U.S. artists in the series. He will also be approaching distribution firms in an effort to gain U.S. syndication. The first program will also be shown to interested parties at MIDEM in Cannes, France, where Shaw will attempt to develop a liaison for use of videotaped pieces from international recording artists.

# CTV wins gold, silver at Int'l film, TV festival

The CTV Television Network has taken a number of top honours at the 20th International Film and Television Festival, held recently in New York. The Canadian network received two gold and one silver medal in the television documentary cate-

# ACTRA, CAMPP agree on consultation mechanism

The Association of Canadian Television and Radio Artists-(ACTRA) and the Canadian Association of Motion Picture Producers (CAMPP) have come to agreement on a mechanism for consultation on the issuance of ACTRA work permits to non-Canadian performers used in Canadian-produced feature films.

Under the agreement, producers seeking work permits on behalf of non-Canadian talent will, as in the past, contact ACTRA, which will, in turn, issue the permits in accordance with its guidelines as announced last fall. These guidelines include two work permits without qualification for films produced with the intention of seeking a 100-percent cost allowance and in films subsidized by the Canadian Film Development Corporation. In certain international co-productions, permits will be issued in accordance with the relevant treaty. ACTRA is to be consulted in any other case.

Should a problem arise in the event of producers requesting more than two permits for non-Canadians, ACTRA will contact CAMPP to implement the consultative mechanism. The mechanism was set in motion December 13 at the first meeting of the Joint Committee representing ACTRA, CAMPP and the Association des Producteurs de Films du Quebec (APFQ).

ACTRA emphasizes the guidelines are not hard and fast rules. They were established to discourage disproportionate use of non-Canadian performing talent in films designed as Canadian under the State Department's point system.

At the December 13 meeting, CAMPP representatives suggested producers seeking information or advice could contact Chalmers Adams in Toronto at (416) 964-8044.







Now in its tenth year of operations, GRT of Canada is coming off a banner year in 1977. The company's international product has been highly successful, with hits from a variety of established and breakthrough artists, including Steely Dan, McCoo & Davis, Jimmy Buffett, Al Stewart, Alan Parsons and Stephen Bishop.

But it has been in its domestic product that GRT has shone in 1977. Dan Hill, following two successful albums that are gold in Canada, saw his third album skyrocket to platinum-plus, and his new single go gold Klaatu, a Canadian group whose members remain unknown, broke internationally in 1977, with combined sales on their two albums now hovering at the million mark Prism, a new group from Vancouver, are nearing gold on their debut album, and with two active singles, have made impressive inroads into the U.S. market. Canadian successes were also had by Ian Thomas, Moe Koffman, John Ellison and new group The Hunt.

GRT of Canada is a division of GRT Corporation, a U.S. firm which began as a

tape manufacturing concern, handling the production of eight track and cassette tapes for other record companies. The U.S. firm became involved in album distribution shortly thereafter, primarily with licensing agreements for labels such as Chess and joint venture deals such as Janus Records, which was founded jointly by GRT and Pye Records of the U.K. GRT later bought out the label and now owns it outright. The U.S. firm also produces product on its own label, based from Nashville. Recent hits on the GRT label include singles by Ronnie McDowell and Meri Wilson.

GRT of Canada was originally established in 1968 as a Canadian division of the parent company, strictly for tapes, including manufacturing. Around the turn of the decade, with Ross Reynolds as president, the firm began to get involved in album distribution. Reynolds recalls, "We made the decision that in order to grow, we had to be a full music distributor."

The company's first label was Chess Records, GRT also took over a number of artists from Spartan Records. The company's first domestic product included singles by the Magic Cycle and the first album was by Canadian champion fiddler Ward Allen. Reynolds notes GRT has been involved with the release of Canadian product almost from the very beginning.

The growth of GRT of Canada has been long, hard and steady. A significant gain was made with the acquisition and subsequent international success of Lighthouse. At the time of their signing in November 1970, GRT had such artists on its label as Ronnie Hawkins Dr. Music, Beverley Glenn-Copeland, Everyday People, Tommy Banks, jingle writer Terry Bush and Lighthouse

From that point, the company has never looked back. Moe Koffman was signed, and has since produced six successful albums. Gains were also made on product by such diverse artists as James Leroy, Mainline, Joe Mendelson, Greaseball Boogie Band (now Shooter), as well as country artists including Mike Graham, Jack Bailey, R. Harlan Smith, Cathy Young, Chad Allen, and even an album with Xaviera Hollander.

In 1973, Ian Thomas was signed to the label, and almost immediately tallied an international hit with Painted Ladies. In 1975, GRT picked up the Daffodil label, including Klaatu. Hill was signed shortly after.

In the past year, GRT has consolidated its roster, letting a number of acts go and entering into a policy of giving more solid support to the seven acts it has retained. Reynolds notes, "We've found the concentration is working a lot better. We have international deals with Dan Hill, Klaatu, Prism and Ian Thomas, with other international releases pending on Moe Koffman."

GRT of Canada now distributes the two GRT-owned labels, GRT and Janus, and through GRT (U.S.) the Barnaby and Chess labels. In addition, the Canadian

Sunnyvale, California-based GRT Corporation has announced the appointment of Vinton D. Carver as president and chief executive officer of GRT Corporation. Carver has been a member of the board since 1968, and has been Chairman of the Board since 1974, a capacity in which he continues to serve.

GRT, in addition to its tape and album manufacturing and marketing concerns, operates direct mail and television promotions, and owns Los Angeles County ski area Mountain High. Its last fiscal year showed total sales of almost 50 million dollars with net income over 1.5 million.

company has separate licensing agreements with the ABC group, including Dot, Anchor, Audio Treasury, Blue Thumb, Dunhill, Hickory, Impulse, Westminster Gold, and Shelter; Sire & Passport, 20th Century; Cream; and new New York-hased label Tomato Records.

GRT has offices in Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, Calgary and a new branch in Vancouver. The marketing structure calls for three regional managers. Ken Dion for the East, operating from Montreal, Ontario manager Joe Toews (Toronto), and western manager Alex Petchkin (Calgary).

# ROSS REYNOLDS - President GRT Of Canada

Ross Reynolds has been in charge of GRT of Canada almost since the company's inception. In fact, he has no other music industry experience, Reynolds, an American, joined GRT's eastern U.S. operations in New Jersey early in 1969 and moved to Canada to head up the Canadian operation several months later.

As president, Reynolds oversees the entire system in Canada, including manufacture and distribution of the company's domestic product and that of its licensees, and all the different aspects of marketing that product Reynolds notes, "We've been fortunate in that, by and large, we've been able to operate fairly autonomously We're not heavily dependent upon our parent company in terms of our day-to-day operations."

Reynolds takes a strong personal interest in the artist development functions of the company. He is pleased with GRT's efforts in this regard, and with those of A&R director Jeff Burns

growth to date in 1977. Reynolds is looking for another strong year in 1978. "I don't think there are any startling revolutionary steps that we're going to be taking. We have, over the past year, gotten involved with the broadcast marketing of records. That has been a plus, and I see that growing. We have been involved in publishing, and we will be getting increasingly involved. That's an area of growth for the coming year.

"Additionally, we are actively seeking and looking to sign new agreements with international companies to distribute their product in Canada, Conversely, we're really not planning to sign a lot of new Canadian acts; perhaps one or two over the next year. The criterion that we're trying to use is that we would like to sign international caliber artists

"I'm optimistic about 1978. We've had several artists break substantially, and I don't see any reason why they can't continue to grow substantially. I'm optimistic about some of the others that are just on their way. In addition, I think ABC has made some major steps to get itself together.

20th Century seems in the process of turning itself around, and they have some new albums that I'm very optimistic about"

### GORD EDWARDS

### - Executive Vice-President

Executive Vice-President Gord Edwards is a new addition to the staff at GRT, joining the company last May. He is a veteran of the music industry, beginning 22 years ago as a promotion man with RCA. After a position in sales, he has held executive positions at

Capitol, as National Promotion Manager, at WEA Music, as Branch Manager, National Sales Manager and Vice-President market ing. More recently, he had served as Vice President and General Manager of rack jobber Handleman's Canadian operations

Edwards is generally responsible for much of the administration of GRT of Canada. He oversees all areas of marketing, and is also involved in warehousing, manufacturing, shipping and promotion, primarily in an administrative sense. He also oversees budgeting and marketing of product.

Edwards notes: "We've had an exceptional year. The interesting thing is that it's come from all areas. Our Canadian product has been tremendous. I think the major reason for it is that we've concentrated our efforts on a few key acts rather than releasing a whole bunch and hoping something will happen. We still have a relatively large roster of Canadian artists. We ve been successful in breaking three and one more is going to be released very shortly in the U.S.

"In addition, ABC is starting to really turn around, and they're becoming very successful again in the U.S. 20th Century had Star Wars. The soundtrack is almost double platinum in Canada. Our other licensees have also contributed. There's been general overall good product, plus we've greatly changed around our market ing team in the field, upgrading our field force."

GRT now has three regional managers, for eastern, western and central Canada. They have also opened a sales office in Vancouver. Sales in the West have been particularly strong. The company has recently instituted a new computer system to

speed up the ordering process. The warehousing system has also been improved "

Edwards is looking forward to the tuture "We expect the licensees to continue with a lot of good product, which is indicated by their early release schedules. We should have good follow-up albums on all our major acts

"We feel that things are going to continue on We don't see any problem areas in the next little while. It looks great for 1978 for us."

### FRANK DAVIES

- Director, International and Publishing Divisions

One of the biggest Canadian music industry stories of 1977 was the international breakthrough of Klaatu, the Toronto-based four piece mystery group. The man behind Klatu from the beginning, who now stands behind the international hopes of the entire GRT roster, is International and Publishing Division Director Frank Davies.

Davies settled in Canada in 1970, pro-

duced an album for Ronnie Hawkins' band, Crowbar, and the two formed Dalfodil Records. He made a deal with Capitol Records for himself and the label, and bought Hawkins out He met with major successes with Crowbar, King Biscuit Boy and others, and moved the label to A&M in 1974. The following year, he came to GRT.

Davies' responsibilities in the International Division include the making of international arrangements for GRT's artists and product. It is in this capacity that GRT has shown its greatest strength this year. Three of the company's domestic roster, Klaatu, Dan Hill and Prism, have all achieved major U.S. trade chart action simultaneously.

Interestingly, all three are signed to different, unrelated U.S. labels. Klaatu are released by Capitol and handled worldwide by EMI, Prism are signed worldwide to Ariola America, and Hill is with 20th Century. In addition, GRT artist lan Thomas has been sign. I to a worldwide deal with

In A&R, Burns notes, GRT has been following a policy of carrying a smaller roster of artists on whom they are most enthusiastic, and devoting a major effort towards the breaking of these artists.

### MIKE REED

- Merchandising & Product Manager

Mike Reed, GRT's Merchandising and Product Manager, is a recent addition to staff, having joined the firm five months ago. Reed is a veteran of 14 years in the music business, beginning in high school when he ran school dances. He became involved in retail with Sayvette in Toronto and London,

Ontario. Since then, he has bought singles for Handleman and served a tenure at Apex Records, a division of Decca, handling first eastern Ontario sales and then Ontario promotion. In 1967, one of the Apex-distributed labels, Warner Bros., became independent in Canada. Reed joined them in Ontario promotion, and spent eight years with WEA as the original Alberta branch manager, Atlantic label manager, national promotion director, artist relations director, and in merchandising. Following a stint with Motown Records, Reed took time off from the industry before joining GRT.

Reed handles a variety of general responsibilities within the marketing scope, handling anything related to product in a

Jeff Burns is a veteran of ten years in the record business. He began with Columbia when they started their retail operations, and later moved to Montreal to open the firm's retail division. Burns then broke into

promotion with a position at MCA Records as Ontario promotion manager. Five years ago, he came to GRT as national promomanager, and has added A&R duties since that time.

In A&R, Burns is responsible for signing acts to the label, and, with Reynolds, for determining the release of product. In promotion, he oversees the company's entire promotion and publicity operations, and supervises the promo staff, which includes Perry Goldberg in Ontario, John Kearny in Ottawa, Quebec and the Maritimes, Don Grant in Manitoba and Saskatchewan, Alex Petchkin in Alberta, and Calvin Lew in B.C. Promo staff spend much of their time reporting on singles, which GRT uses largely as a tool to self-albums, and working with radio stations on promotion.

Burns also works with Mike Reed and Gord Edwards to map out marketing plans and organize promotions. Burns is responsible for time buys and receptions, and he occasionally works on artist tours.



general capacity. He works closely with Gord Edwards and Jeff Burns, and is responsible for much of the display and point-of-purchase material, ideas and approaches. He also co-ordinates promotion and releases with the U.S. affiliates, and deals with the



various record components, such as label copy and the determining of initial shipments.

On the horizon for Reed is the introdution of an oldies line. He is also initiating release in Canada of a prestigious German classical line, Seon, through ABC Records in the U.S. Projects for 1978 include the emphasis on the company's country music product, particularly on ABC.

# NORMA McLELLAN - Production Manager

One of the most vital, yet thankless, areas in any record distributor is the ensuring that orders are made, product is received, and markets are stocked as quickly and efficiently as possible. Production Manager

Norma McLellan has been handling these areas for GRT for the past seven years.

Her basic responsibilities involve the obtaining of initial shipment orders from the marketing department, receiving the jacket negatives and tapes, and sending them to the manufacturers with orders for the proper quantities. The gist of the endeavour is the meeting and, wherever possible, beating of deadlines. This involves a continuous struggle to get priority time at the plants. She is also in charge of customer service.

Mrs. McLellan works closely with the marketing staff in an attempt to best meet their needs. She also works closely with the pressing plants - GRT is using Quality, Precision and RCA - and keeps an eye on quality control. She notes both quality and quantity have improved dramatically for GRT over the past year or two.


One of the reasons for the improvements is her own department. GRT inventories and orders are now fully computerized.

Mrs. McLellan receives product and inventory status reports on a daily, weekly and monthly basis, complete with minimum and suggested figures for stock and orders. The accounts are supplied on a percentage basis, to ensure all wholesalers will receive some stock, even when an order is not 100 percent filled from the plants. This is a rare situation at GRT - turnover normally occurs within two to three days of order



Gill's basic responsibilities involve the putting together, releasing and marketing of television packages. These consist both of artist collections and various artist compilations, including both GRT and other acts. Releasing them on a market by market basis, the Mom & Dads package will be platinum in Canada within two weeks. with the Vaughan package also gold nearing platinum. Gill's system is unique for Canada. in that GRT is handling total marketing of

Another major project for Gill was a special package promotion in conjunction with Elk's Men's Stores. The promotion involved a compilation of material from various artists distributed in Canada by GRT. The clothing stores took the stock, for which they handled the artwork and promotion, and gave away free albums with clothing purchases. The promotion was highly successful, with the chain report. ing major sales increases over the period

Gill is planning more projects for 1978 He hopes to expand his operations to encompass four or five packages annually. In the works are a new Mom & Dads set. featuring waltzes, country and MOR compilations, a summer package of oldies, and a possible gospel collection. Each package is a major project, on which Gill oversees media buying, jacket design, budgets, distribution and sales of the product, Gill is also label manager for 20th Century

# GRT's Roster Of Stars


### IAN THOMAS

GRT feels Ian Thomas is on the verge of a major international breakthrough. Thomas has been signed, through GRT, to a worldwide release deal with Atlantic Records, which will include the U.S. release of his forthcoming sixth GRT album, Still Here.

Thomas' career came about as the result of classical piano study at conservatory. While still in his teens, he arranged for the Hamilton Philharmonic and Toronto Symphony Orchestras. Becoming more interested in folk and rock, he formed a trio which evolved into the highly successful Toronto

group Tranquility Base. After the group dissolved, Thomas went out on his own, eventually forming his own band.

Thomas has had numerous Canadian singles through the years, including Come





The Sun, Long Long Way, Painted Ladies and more recently Right Before Your Eyes. His most recent album Calabash also received U.S. release, on Chrysalis Records.

### AL STEWART

1977 was an international breakthrough year for Janus recording artist Al Stewart. Stewart achieved North American stardom with a hit single, Year Of The Cat - - the title cut from his third Janus album, seventh overall - - and a major seven-month British and North American tour.

Stewart, a Briton, left school at 17 to play in a succession of British rock bands.



Influenced by Bob Dylan, he traded in his electric guitar for an acoustic and has been writing highly lyrical ballads ever since.

His career turned around when Stewart moved to the Janus label. His first album, Past Present And Future, was a series of historical ballads for which Stewart prepared by reading over 50 books of history.

The next effort, Modern Times, blended more modern pop sounds with the ballads.

### DAN HILL

With his third GRT album Longer Fuse nearing double platinum status in Canada, and his recent single, Sometimes When We Touch, gold in Canada and top 20 on the U.S. trade charts, Dan Hill is now breaking through into the international market.

Hill began writing songs at 14 years of age in his hometown of Don Mills, Ontario. He gained local acclaim, and four years

later, a short-lived recording deal with RCA Records. The following year, Hill recorded his first album with the assistance of private financing and producers Matt McCauley and Fred Mollin. The album was sold and Hill was signed to GRT. This was followed by a management deal with Toronto's Finkelstein-Fiedler Co, and a U.S. deal with 20th Century Records.

Hill has now recorded three albums, and is beginning work on a fourth. The first

two are gold approaching platinum. He has been on major cross-Canada concert tours since 1975, first as opening act for Murray McLauchlan, and for the past year and a half as a sellout headline artist.

### **PRISM**

Prism are a brand new Vancouver-based high energy rock group who are getting an early head start in cracking the international market. The nucleus of the group was formed in July of 1976 by producer-musician Bruce Fairbairn, then featuring lead vocalist Ron Tabak, drummer-songwriter Rodney Higgs and guitarist Lindsay Mitchell. A demo tape at Vancouver's Can-Base Studios led to a deal with GRT.

Completing the group were the additions of bassist Tom Lavin, keyboard player John Hall and Tom Keenlyside, who fills in a horn section with Fairbairn.

Prism's career received a major boost when they signed a management agreement with Bruce Allen. The group subsequently received an international release deal with Ariola America. Their debut album, titled after their name, is nearing Canadian gold after a September release. A first single, Spaceship Superstar, did very well. In the U.S., the album has made impressive gains on the major trade papers. A second single, Take Me To The Kaptin, has just been released.

### KLAATU

One of the most mysterious groups to grace the horizon in recent years, Klaatu have also become one of the most successful groups to break internationally out of Canada. The group declines to identify its members, except to say that Klaatu consists of four musicians who want to be identified only by their music. They have been recording on Daffodil Records, a GRT-distributed label, for several years.

Early in 1977, a publicity event was begun, quite quietly and without the knowledge of GRT, at a Rhode Island newspaper. A reporter compared the group to the Beatles and concluded that they were one and the same. From that article rumours spread at a speedy pace around the world, resulting in huge sales from people who wanted to make their own comparison. The album, 3:47 E.S.T., which is released worldwide by Capitol-EMI, has sold in excess of 600,000 copies to date and is gold in Canada and Australia.

Later in the year, the group's second album, Hope, was released. An extravagant effort involving performance from the London Symphony Orchestra, Hope has proven Klaatu's worth on the world market with sales around 400,000 in its first few months. It is also gold in Canada.

### STEELY DAN

Over the past five years and six albums, ABC recording group Steely Dan have proven themselves among the top groups to come out of North America, sales wise and critically. The nucleus of the group consists of founders Walter Becker and Donald Fagen, who met in the late 60's in college, wrote songs together, and formed Steely Dan in 1972.

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In 1974, Becker and Fagen dismantled the group, retaining only guitarist Dennis Dias. Steely Dan now exists as the framework for the recording of the duo's material which is becoming more jazz-oriented with each album.

Steeley Dan's recently released new album, Aja, quickly became a major international hit, rising near the top of all North American trade charts within several weeks.

### JIMMY BUFFETT

ABC recording artist Jimmy Buffett has been gaining notices for several years as a songwriter in a relatively small country-folk-rock circle. 1977 marked him for stardom with a major album success, Changes

In Latitudes, Changes In Attitudes, and hit singles with the title cut and Margaritaville.

A native of Mobile, Alabama, Buffett spent time in New Orleans before coming to Nashville and his first record deal. The deal was unproductive, with one poor production and one lost set of master tapes. Somewhat disillusioned, he moved to Key West, Florida. After a period of time, he signed there with ABC and recorded his first album with the label, A White Sports Coat And A Pink Crustacean.

Buffett tours regularly and heavily throughout North America with his group, the Coral Reefer Band.

### STAR WARS

Science fiction-fantasy film Star Wars has become the largest grossing motion picture in history. The soundtrack for the movie, on 20th Century, has been a major North American sales success. In Canada, the album is well beyond platinum. The soundtrack was written by John Williams, who has composed scores and acted as musical director for roughly 40 films, including Jaws, Goodbye Mr. Chips, The Poseidon Adventure. Towering Inferno and Earthquake. Williams has also composed symphonic works, which have been performed throughout North America, and has received two Emmy Awards from the American Television Academy, and Academy Awards for Fiddler On The Roof and Jaws.

The soundtrack was performed by the London Symphony Orchestra.

# History Of Rock scores as film production

CHUM Radio (Toronto) has just completed production of an educational film based on its highly successful award-winning radio documentary, The History Of Rock, With the assistance of the CHUM Group of stations, the film is being made available at no charge to high schools across Canada.

The filmed version of The History Of Rock, "traces the roots, rise and resurgence of rock 'n roll and parallels the tremendous social and cultural upheavals which accompanied it, beginning in the early 50s and continuing through to the present."

A production team, numbering a dozen, spent almost a year writing, producing and editing more than 15 hours of rare film footage obtained from international sources.

Included on the film are rare shots of Elvis Presley and the Beatles as well as events leading up to and including the assassination of U.S. President John F. Kennedy.

Educators who have seen the film have apparently been unanimous in their praise and enthusiasm. Many believe the film can be of special value to students of music, sociology and the theatre, with career guidance included for students considering vocations in entertainment and broadcasting.

It's interesting to note that The History Of Rock has been specifically tailored to fit into one school period, beginning with a live introduction and followed by a question and answer period.



The RPM 100 is a national chart compiled weekly from national sales and radio station airplay and chart action. The top 50 records are computed from sales

The computation of the records from 51 to 100 is based on early airplay, chart action and regional sales and breakouts. The chart is based on samplings from markets across Canada and indicates trends that may not be prevalent in all areas of Canada. Shaded numbers inidcate a strong upward trend and gains in airplay or sales. This chart is offered as a guide to new product and an indication of trends in Canadian markets.

The RPM 100 singles and album chart (or any part therof) may be reproduced with a proper credit.




