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#### Eight charged in major bust involving counterfeits

Toronto: Following a six-month investigation by Metro Police and the Anti-Piracy office of CRIA, eight persons have been charged involving the manufacturing and distribution of counterfeit albums. The information on the investigation and charges was released by CRIA's Director of Anti-Piracy Operations, John Langley.

Counterfeit albums were apparently being manufactured in Toronto and distributed in the U.S., Europe and Canada.

Seized were masters, moulds, stamps, record jackets, and finished product. Recovery value is estimated to be in excess of \$1 million. The investigation revealed that operations had been carried out since 1979.

Charged were, William Hoover, owner of Modern Album; Lee Farley, President of Banner Records; Jack Vermeer, President of Paramount Records; Edward Gresik, Toronto lawyer; Paul Falerio, Operations Manager, Precision Records, a division of Ahed; James Cassina, of Discount Records; Domenic 'Mickey' Cinicola; and Rudy Hinter. A warrant has been reportedly issued for the arrest of Gary Salter of Banner Records.

Counterfeit albums seized included the Rod Stewart Collection, The Music of Willie Nelson, Best of Town and Country and Mellow Moods by Anne Murray.

#### Canadian Record Catalogue previewed by CIRPA

Toronto: The preview edition of the Canadian Record Catalogue was featured in a special presentation (Oct 16) at Harbour Castle.

The catalogue is a compilation of current Canadian recordings, indexed by song and album title, performer and composer. Future plans call for the inclusion of documentation on recordings that are no longer active.

The catalogue was developed and researched through funding by the CRTC and the Department of Communication, with research being carried out by CIRPA and ADISQ of Quebec.

The database of the catalogue is to be merged through a special program with

## Rush's Exit Stage Left features concert dates

Toronto: Anthem have released the new, double live project from Rush. Titled Exit Stage Left, the album was produced by Terry Brown.

The recording comprises live dates in Canada and Europe with mixing at Le Studio in Morin Heights, Quebec. In addition, the album was digitally mastered in New York. The suggested list is \$14.98.

Anthem's Managing Director, Tom Berry, reports the track, Closer To The Heart, has been pulled as a single. A studio version of the song was released a few years ago. Berry explained that the live version was picked as the new single because of the audience response. Audiences had become so familiar with the song they were joining in on the chorus everytime Rush performed it.

"It's much better than the last live album," said Berry, who is launching a major marketing campaign, in conjunction with Capitol, for Rush weekends in Montreal, Toronto and Vancouver. Colourful posters are being shipped to major retail stores along with a three-song edited version for in-store play. Major buys on radio are also being finalized.

Another plus is a one-hour feature length film of the band, live, which is to be shown on pay TV in the U.S. and on national TV in Canada.

Bill Misener, well-known writer and performer will be on release with his new album the first part of November, and Rae is now in the studio cutting a session for a recent signing to the Library, Cecile Frenette.

Popular soprano Maureen Forrester has signed with the Library for a unique Jackie Rae production. She will record a classical album plus an album of popular music. The first will be titled Maureen Forrester In Recital while the second will surprise her many fans carrying the title Maureen Forrester - Her Other Side.

Rae's production of the recent Peter Appleyard self-titled album release, has become one of Appleyard's most successful albums, from the airplay standpoint. Country programmers have picked up on Appleyard's instrumental version of Breaking & Entering which was a hit for both Carroll Baker and Shelley-Lou Marie and the Terri Gibbs' initital release of Somebody's Knockin'. Contemporary adult programmers have been giving good exposure to Appleyard's version of the Bee Gees' Words as well as to Appleyard originals, Peter's Blues and Bermuda Blue.

## Veteran record marketer to Van's A&B Sound

Vancouver: 20 year veteran record marketar, Adrian Bilodeau, has been appointed Manager of the record department of A&B Sound. Mr. Bilodeau's appointment took effect Oct 20.

A native of Vancouver, Mr. Bilodeau first became associated with the record industry in the early sixties, joining a company as sales rep, that distributed what is now MCA product. He later moved to London Records and shortly after took over as label manager for the Liberty label at London's Montreal headquarters. He then moved on to become National Sales Manager for London.

Bilodeau was always anxious to return to the west and in 1971 took advantage of an opening as Branch Manager of the Calgary operation for London, which was later followed by his appointment as Marketing Manager for London's western region with base in his hometown of Vancouver. He enjoyed an association of 17 years with London, until it folded in 1980. Bilodeau then joined WEA as Branch Manager of the Vancouver operation, until his appointment to A&B Sound.

## Triumph's Allied Forces scores gold in Canada

Toronto: Triumph's latest album release, Allied Forces, has reached gold status after only four weeks of release in Canada.

The Triumph album is already in the top 50 in the U.S. and is regarded by Attic as the group's strongest album on all levels including retail, radio and the media. This is their fifth album for Canada and fourth for the U.S.. As well, their single, Magic Power, taken from the album, is showing including the following Hold On into the top end of trade charts in Canada and the U.S.

Triumph are currently on a major North American tour that will bring them back into Canada later in the fall.

## Audio Market Sales to distribute Sheffield Lab

Milton, Ont. Audio Market Sales have been appointed Canadian distributor for Sheffield Lab direct-to-disc product.

The change in Canadian distribution has resulted in Sheffield Lab direct-to-disc releases being reduced in price to a suggesed list of \$24.95. As well, distribution will be consolidated with other audiophile labels, Crystal Clear direct-to-disc and American Gramaphone Fresh Aire plus DBX encoded discs, all of which are distributed in Canada by AMS.

AMS reports that in view of the limited number of discs that can be pressed when the direct-to-disc method is employed, a number of Sheffield releases are out of print and considered collector's items. These include Lincoln Mayorga and Distinguished Colleagues Volume I, Sheffield's first direct-to-disc recording produced in 1968 and the 1975 recording, I've Got The Music In Me by Thelma Houston and Pressure Cooker.

#### Wm. Harold Moon award to jazzman Moe Koffman

Toronto: One of Canada's most successful jazzmen, Moe Koffman, received P.R.O. Canada's greatest tribute (Oct 7), the Wm. Harold Moon Award. Named after the first managing director of P.R.O. Canada, the award is given in recognition of "outstanding contribution on the international music scene". The award was presented by Francis Preston of the CMA and Harold Moon.

Besides being successful in the comcommercial/jingle field, Koffman has been a major thrust in Cancon jazz for more than 35 years. His biggest hit, Swingin' Shepherd Blues, has become a world-recognized standard and has been covered by more than 150 versions. As well, he has 15 albums to his credit. He recently signed to Elektra where his initial album release, If You Don't Know By Now, produced by Domenic Trojano, is to be released shortly.

The award to Koffman as well as 20 other awards plaques were presented to writers and publishers at P.R.O. Canada's Annual Awards Dinner. It should be noted that P.R.O. Canada, which administers royalties for 10,800 authors and composers and more than 2,000 music publishers, is the only rights organization in Canada that honours their members in such a way. The awards are based on songs most performed on radio in Canada.

Emcee for this year's awards presentation was well-known television personality Alan Thicke, whose subtle humour and knowledge of the business kept the event light

Burton Cummings took honours as cowriter of his recording, Fine State Of Affairs, and Trooper's Ra McGuire and Brian Smith received two awards for Janine and 3 Dressed Up As A 9. Tom Lavin, founder of Powder Blues Band and writer of Doin' It Right, received a plaque as did Lindsay Mitchell for his writing of the Prism single, Night To Remember. Charlotte Wieve was honoured as writer of Jenson Interceptor's single, Tiny Thing.

Terry Carisse and Bruce Rawlins, Ottawaarea writers, who were recently honoured as Composers of The Year at this year's Big Country Awards, were on hand to receive their P.R.O. Canada plaques as writers of Sparkle In Her Eyes, which was recorded by Carisse. Laura Vinson won recognition for her writing of Sweet Mountain Music and James Ross for his penning of We've Got The Magic, recorded by R. Harlan Smith.

French-language writers were also honoured with Claude Blouin and Marie-Thérèse Paillé receiving an award for their song Alabane. As well, Roger Magnan, who co-wrote Flash, and Montreal's Jean Robitaille, who co-wrote Val de nuit, were recipients of plaques.

P.R.O. Canada's film award was presented to Paul Zaza. His scores for films include Three Card Monte (1977), Murder By Decree (1978), and Stone Cold Dead (1979).

In the concert music field, Violet Archer was recognized as this year's leading contributor in that field. A Montrealer, now living in Edmonton, her career has included commissions for the Edmonton and Saskatoon Symphony Orchestras and internationally-known tenor David Astor.

Winnipeg native Fraser MacPherson, now living in Vancouver was the winner in the Jazz Music category. He has toured Russia twice on concert tours and is one of the few Canadians picked as a headliner at Bourbon Street. Live At The Planetarium, his album released in 1976, received international recognition.

Roger Bowling, co-writer of Coward Of The Country, a large sized hit for Kenny Rogers, won the award for International contribution.

#### Lee Sandford in control as she launches new single

Toronto: Lee Sanford, Topaz recording artist, has recently completed a month-long promotional tour of radio stations to promote her new single, Reflections.

Sandford, who is the label owner and also owner of a publishing company, is set for an armed forces overseas tour (Dec 13), as part of a package show which will take her to Germany, Cyprus and other mideast and European countries.

The busy young talent has been running a hectic schedule the last few months which included recording the theme song from the forthcoming motion picture Speak Of The Devil and maintaining a steady and indefinite contract at the Crystal Dining Lounge of the Fisherman's Warf on Pier One in Toronto.

"I had a wonderful time on my promotional tour," she said. "The reaction was excellent and the people were more than helpful. There were a lot of surprised people. Artists don't see reps in those areas very often because of the money and time factor, so it's a big pat on the back for us.

"I feel your records have a better chance when you're doing things yourself. If you work the record it gives you identification, and you don't have to wait for someone else to decide when to release your product."

Influenced by singers like Bette Midler and Liza Minnelli, Sandford recorded her first single, Perpetual Dreamer, in 1976 but didn't get into the business of recording and performing full-time until much later, feeling that her parents might not have liked the idea of her being in showbusiness at that time.

Reflections was produced by Art Snider, who is also scoring the music for the movie

Speak Of The Devil. An album from Sandford is expected early next year.

A big plus for Sandford with her new release was the amount of miles she covered, and the communication she set up with programmers in small, medium and major markets. #### RCA to distribute Dimension

RCA has made arrangements with Dimension Records of Nashville to distribute their product in Canada. The label recently released a Top 5 record by Ray Price, titled It Don't Hurt Me Half As Bad. The next single is to be Diamonds In The Stars. Price's new album, Town And Country, is to be released shortly.

#### It's Miller time - after three years

Capitol is releasing the first Steve Miller album in almost three years. The new album is titled Circle Of Love and Heart Like A Wheel has been pulled as a single.

#### Chilliwackers produce Baldry

Long John Baldry will be off with a new album the first of the new year. As yet untitled, the album is being produced by Chilliwack members Bill Henderson and Brian Macleod at Hamilton's Grant Avenue studios.

#### Klaatu to open for Prism

A coupling of two of Capitol's top Cancon groups should make for an interesting showing. Prism, who begin their national tour in the west on Nov 10, have asked Klaatu to open for them. The tour will also be good for album sales. Prism are off with their Small Change album which contains their single Don't Let Him Know. Klaatu are touting their new album, Magentalane, which includes their single, The Love Of A Woman.

#### Squier opens for Foreigner

Billy Squier has been firmed to open for Foreigner for their Toronto date (Nov 13). The date will give a further boost to Squier's album Don't Say No, which has had a run of 20 weeks on the RPM 50.

#### Dr. Hook & Ripperton top releases

Capitol is readying a Dr. Hook Live album, along with Minnie Ripperton's Greatest Hits and High Times from Dottie West. Also ready is the new J. Geils Band with their album, Freeze Frame. A single, Centrefold, has been taken from the album.

#### France Joli to Sefel

One of Quebec's top female singers, France Joli, who was also a Juno-award winner, has signed a recording deal with Sefel. Her single, Gonna Get Over You, has already been released in Quebec and will be shipped nationally the first week in November. Lionel Richie of the Commodores has apparently written a song for Joli, as yet untitled, which will appear on her album. Joli opened five dates for the Commodores.

#### Vale, Nelson et al on Sefel

Sefel is releasing a television package titled All I Want For Christmas, which is a compiliation of Christmas songs by various artists including Jerry Vale, Willie Nelson, Patti Page and Others. There will be U.S. TV support ads running for five weeks. The album will also be available at retail stores.

#### Bilitis Soundtrack heads releases

Top of the list of releases from Sefel is the Soundtrack from the movie Bilitis. Also scheduled are a Greatest Hits from Jerry Vale and a French version of The Rose. titled Si L'Amour by Johanne Deforges.

#### Wrabit brings MCA into Cancon

MCA are launching a major campaign on the release of the self-titled album from Wrabit, which is a worldwide release. A single, Back Home, has been taken from the album. Mike McKelvie, Director of Marketing for MCA reports they have a guaranteed sale for their accounts on the album, plus display contests across the country, radic buys on major FM stations, buys on AM stations who chart the single, 2X3 posters for the retailers as well as Wrabit shirts for retailers who support the project.

The latter is from their Mike Chapman production of Parallel Lines and was remixed and given the added plus of French lyrics. Blondie is Clem Burke, drums, Jimmy Destri, keyboards, Nigel Harrison, bass; Frank Infante and Chris Stein om guitars; and, of course, the unmistakeable vocals of Debbie Harry, now doing her solo trip.

BILLY BURNETTE Rock
Gimme You - Columbia FC-37460-H

The son of the late rockabilly great Dorsey, Billy made quite a splash a few months ago but disappeared from the scene. This Barry Seidel and Barry Beckett production could bring the young rocker back into prominence. Very good at interpreting the sounds of the past, Burnette also proves that he's just as good at writing, particularly with I Don't Know Why. He also co-wrote a couple

of songs that should attract pop and country programmer attention including Whatcha Gonna Do When The Sun Goes Down and Gettin' Back (To You And Me).

HARRY BELAFONTE Contemporary adult Loving You Is Where I Belong Columbia FC-37489-H

There's only one way a recording/concert star can find out how much their image has been tarnished through ignoring their fans for a long period of time and that's to put out an album. Belafonte was one of the big names in the late fifties and early sixties and now, through producers John Cartwright and Bob Freeman, Belafonte could find himself back in the mainstream. He must have a million fans who have been waiting and what we have here is well worth the wait. The smooth and deliberate sassiness of delivery is vintage Balafonte, particularly on Streets Of London, Forever Young as a Medley with Jabulani, The Rose and Mary Makes Magic.

BRIAN PLUMMER Rock I'm As Guilty As You - Sefel SEF-1002

A variety of studios were used by Stacy Heydon for this particular production, although there is no indication of which is which. Studio West, Saskatoon, Kensington Sound, Toronto, and Hamilton's Grant Avenue were used. Lisa, co-written by Plummer, Al Higbee and Robin Benger, has been released as a single. Plummer penned all the other cuts except The Fire-Eater, which he co-wrote with Benger. Back-up instrumentation was supplied by Tax, who are drummer Glenn Ens, Dave Cooper on lead guitar and bassman Texas Dave Bowes. Other session men were Grant Slater, keyboards, Walter Zwol, organ and vocals and producer Heydon on guitar and vocals.

KARLA DEVITO Is This A Cool World Or What? Epic FE-37014-H

A vocal projection that served her well on stage with the Pirates of Penzance and Godspell, makes Devito's acceptance on disc that much greater. This is the voice that made Meat Loaf so appealing on Paradise By The Dashboard. Most of the album was produced by Bill House except Midnight Confession, penned by Lou Josie, to be released as a single; the Jim Steinman penning of Heaven Can Wait; and Randy Newman's Just One Smile, all produced by John Jansen, and all choice. Also favourites are Almost Saturday Night and her own original, Just Like You.



#### Muffins remain strong despite member changes

Toronto: Guitarist for Martha and The Muffins, Mark Gane, reports the band has never been stronger despite the number of member changes that have taken place since the band broke internationally.

The group has just released their third album. This Is The Ice Age, on the Dindisc label, distributed by PolyGram, produced by the band and Daniel Lanois. A single, Women Around The World At Work, has been taken from the album.

Comprising the band are Martha Johnson, Mark Gane, Andy Haas, Jocelyne Lanois and Nick Kent. The latter replaced Tim Gane although Gane did perform on the Ice Age album.

"Part of the reason for the member splits was the tremendous amount of pressure on the group," said Gane. "We had no idea of the amount of imact that the song Echo Beach would have internationally. We were so naive at the time, and then it all dropped on us. All that mattered than was getting out that next hit single."

Echo Beach, written by Gane, taken from the gold album Metro Music, won a Juno Award for Single of The Year, in addition to reaching gold as well.

"Following up a big hit single is a concept of the industry," continued Gane. "To me, Echo Beach died a long time ago. We still play it and it was very nice what id did for us. Some people make it out to be more important than the other material. I can't even remember why I wrote it. People ask to hear things a year out of date and we feel the pressure. It gets tiring playing the same songs over and over again.'

Gane explained that the title of their new album embodies several messages.

"The cover and title have to do with the way the world is today," he said. "It's very cold emotionally and ethically. The world seems to be getting closer and closer to war. The music scene seems to be tied in with economics. There's this trend back towards conservatism. One record company in the U.S. told us the lyrics in our single are too heavy.'

Gane has found that one of the odd things about playing in the band is having to tell somebody that you play in a band called Martha and The Muffins.

"One of the hardest things was coming up with a name for the group." he said. "We didn't want one of those pseudo punk names and somebody suggested that the Muffins would be a pretty whimpy name. I think our original intention was to change the name but it stuck. I don't even like it. Everytime somebody asks me what I do I think, 'oh no, I'll have to tell them I play in a group called Martha and The Muffins'."

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

D'Arcy went big on this session, using a variety of background talent including producers Jack Feeney and Ted Gerow, arranger/keyboardist John Arpin, the Laurie Bower Singers, Marc Productions in Ottawa and McLear Place in Toronto.

LARRY GATLIN/GATLIN BROS BAND Not Guilty - Columbia FC-3737464-H One of the most powerful family teams in

country music, Larry. Steve and Rudy are almost inseparable. Larry is the power behind the writing and this album is no exception. What Are We Doin' Lonesome is an example, and which has been released as a single to keep the Gatlin name on the charts.
