CBS and Attic terminate distribution deal

Toronto: CBS Records Canada and Attic have terminated their three year distribution agreement (effective Apr 30). The announcement was made in a joint statement by Stan Kulin, Senior Vice President, CBS and Attic's President Al Mair. Said Kulin: "We

at CBS have enjoyed both a business and personal relationship with Attic over the past years and sincerly wish Al, Tom, the staff, and of course, their artist roster, the best of success in the upcoming years."

Mair noted: "We have had a great three years with everyone at CBS, and will miss them. Together we had great success, including 10 gold LP's, 4 platinum LP's, 2 gold singles, 1 platinum single and 1 double platinum LP. We wish them continued success, particularly with Canadian artists."

It was later announced that Attic and Quality Records had signed a distribution agreement, effective May 1, which was revealed jointly by Mair and Quality's President George Struth. Included in the agreement is the formation of a joint venture to develop new Canadian artists for the domestic and international markets through Attic's worldwide network of licensees.

Mair, who founded Attic eight years ago with Tom Williams, noted: "This new move is going to make us even stronger in our commitment to sign and develop Canadian artists for the world market."

Hefty Quality launch for Stars On III

Toronto: Quality Records are about to launch an extensive national radio and print campaign to support the latest Stars On release, Stars On III.

Stephen Tennant, National Marketing Manager for Quality Records, said the campaign, which begins the first week of May, will run six weeks using the theme More Star Power From The Stars On.

The campaign is to include special posters and mobiles at the retail level, in addition to the national radio and print advertising.

Quality recently released the single Tribute To Stevie Wonder by Stars On, which has already gained significant airplay in both Canada and the U.S. The single is a medley covering 12 of Wonder's greatest hits from Fingertips to Master Blaster.

"It's the best produced, most accurate medley we've heard yet," said Tennant. "It's unbelievable that someone could so perfectly immitate such a unique voice as Stevie Wonder's. We released the seven-inch to radio and retail and a limited edition of the 12-inch extended version for club-play and higher retail visibility."

The flipside of the Stars On III album is a 27-tune medley of hits of the Rolling Stones.

While Tennant doesn't expect the sales of Stars On III to equal that of the quintuple platinum level of the Beatles medley of last year, he believes the 200,000-unit mark is within reach.

"Although there has been a bandwagon of medleys over the past years, the Stars On people are masters of imitation and production," said Tennant. "They've put together a fantastic package with which to kick off the summer. It's not just for purists but just perfect for people who want the hits. Perfect for parties or summer cruisin'."

Triumph in pre-production for next studio LP

Toronto: Attic recording group and Toronto heavy metal trio Triumph, recently off a successful U.S. tour, have gone into preproduction for their next studio LP.

The new album will be the follow-up to their highly successful Allied Forces which included the hit single Magic Power.

Attic reports the band is back home after playing to over half a million following their 85 sold-out U.S. dates, and preparing their next assault.

Included in Triumph's plan are live broadcasts for the RKO Radio Network and the BBC World Service, as well as an audio/video concert for the U.S. All-Rock MTV channel.

The trio has been chosen as a headliner for the ABC Summer Superstar Series, and was recently profiled in concert on a CBC halfhour special profile of the group in concert. studio, and home situations as well as an appearance on CTV's Thrill Of A Lifetime show where a young Toronto guitarist fulfilled his wish to play onstage with the band.

The Attic recording unit recently learned that it's gaining a following behind the Iron Curtain.

While in England on tour, band member Rik Emmett was approached for an interview by the London correspondent of a Yugoslavian radio station.

"His command of English was limited," said Emmett. "And my command of Yugoslavian is non-existent, so we settled on sign language.

"When the interview was over, he asked me if I had any messages for the Yugoslavian rock fans. I was tempted to ask him for their names. After all, why not send a personal message to both of them."

\$21 million sales increase Stats figures for '81

Toronto: Although record shipments were reported to be down for 1981, the latest Stats Canada figures show there was a \$21 million increase from the sales of records and pre-recorded tapes for last year over 1980.

The net value from the sales of records and pre-recorded tapes combined amounted to \$270.1 million in 1980 which increased to \$291.1 million for 1981.

Stats figures show that the sale of all records increased from \$209.8 million in 1980 to \$219.7 million for 1981, while the sales from pre-recorded tapes rose from \$60.3 million in 1980 to \$71.4 million in 1981.

The report shows that the shipments of 7-inch records fell from 16.8 million units for 1980 to 14.1 million units in 1981. However, it shows that 12-inch records increased from 52.4 million in 1980 to 54.4 million units for 1981.

It is very important to note that Stats Canada only divides records into the 7 and 12-inch categories when showing shipments. They do not differentiate between regular 12-inch albums and the recently popular 12-inch singles for shipments. This may account for the decrease in 7-inch disc shipments for 1981 and the increase in 12-inch records for the same year.

Altogether, the shipments from both 12 and 7-inch records accounted for 69.2 million units in 1980 and 68.5 million units for 1981.

The shipments of pre-recorded tapes rose from 15.4 million units in 1980 to 17.4 million units in 1981. Cassettes rose from 10.2 million units in 1980 to 14.8 for 1981. However, 8-tracks fell from 5.2 million units in 1980 to 2.6 million units in 1981.

Spitfire Band Flight II released by RCA/CTL

Toronto: As a result of the highly successful debut from the Spitfire Band, RCA has released The Spitfire Band - Flight II from the Canadian Talent Library (CTL).

In addition to the new LP, RCA has released a special single, complete with a four-colour sleeve which includes the tracks New York, New York and The New Shanty Town. The picture sleeve is the same photo as that on the album.

The album, produced by producer Jackie Rae, contains 12 tracks and was recorded at Eastern Sound in Toronto.

Arrangements on the album were by Micky Erbe with vocal arrangements by Laurie Bower.

Veteran Toronto broadcaster Wally Crouter of CFRB stated that for 35 years he has been using every trick in the book at CFRB to wake up his early morning audience and keep them that way. He said the Spitfire Band gave him "a lot of help last year and that he was thrilled to see them flying again with a great new album."

Crouter's comment was included in the album liner notes. Among the other songs on the LP are Let's Dance, I've Heard That Song Before, Opus One, Leap Frog, and more, all of which are done in the big band fashion. Also included is a medley containing Green Eyes, Amapola, and Tangerine.



The CRTC should be listening

The recent presentation to the CRTC by the CHUM Group is one of the most positive ever presented. The CRTC should look beyond the control of radio and bring itself up to date on what is really happening at the programmer level. Broadcasters, like every other type of business, is feeling the pinch of the economic squeeze and the CRTC is going to have to listen to what the broadcasters are saying before there are casulaties. Remember back when RPM first suggested shirt-sleeve meetings between the programmers and the CRTC? In fact, we did have a couple with the late Doug McGowan and Germain Cadieux. They didn't go too well then because the top priority was Cancon regulations. Well, it's 9 years later, the programmers are admitting that the Cancon regulations did help and were necessary, so now a meeting of minds would be timely. Getting rid of some of the housekeeping problems would help both the broadcasters and the CRTC.

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They're not answering their phones

The big squeeze has finally hit Los Angeles. Record execs, producers, talent buyers and even the small label owner, have made it pretty obvious they're not looking to sign new talent. Recording groups from every state in the nation, from the U.K., Australia and Canada have been caught in the squeeze and there are a lot of destitute souls hanging around. One observer told me, "The record industry is in trouble. By the time I get an act recorded, packaged and shipped, my costs are up close to half a million dollars. If I have a couple of them and blow it, I'm dead." Even the majors are being very cost conscious, so you will see fewer signings this coming year.

A housecleaning on the way?

There could be a housecleaning, well, maybe a dusting, on the way for a large concern. Business has been good but costs just keep on going up and up.

Partners for how long?

If you're of opposite personalities, getting into partnership together could be an ongoing adventure in survival. One such pair have been talking about parting with one buying the other out. Both are pretty strong personalities, which has made their partnership very successful. When the parting comes, bets will be taken on the survival of the remaining partner - in business that is.

Changes at the CRTC

It's obvious that some CRTC Commissioners aren't really into their work. A couple of them have been caught nodding off at recent hearings. There's one name that's been suggested as a possible replacement and apparently federal and provincial brass approve, but he has yet to be asked. If he is, and if he accepts, the next few years will be interesting, to say the least.

The singing cowboy returns?

Watch for the return of the singing cowboy. If you remember Gene Autry, Roy Rogers and Bob Wills, you must be a real oldtimer. Anyway, watch for the return of the real roots cowboy music. You're witnessing some of it now with Lefty Frizzell, Spade Cooley and Rex Allen Jr., but there's more on the way - something about trying to fight moral degragration that has obviously become so much a part of the music industry. They said it, not me. Don't put it down just yet. If you check some of the companies who have success with television packages you'll find their top priority is traditional country music, and they're selling a hell of a lot of it. There's also a huge market for ethnic music. So, it's not Toronto, Calgary, Edmonton and Vancouver where all the sales are being generated. There are a lot of people in-between and their music tastes are quite different.

The union takes its toll

British Columbia is probably next to Quebec when it comes to unrest among the business people and for entirely different reasons. We all know the touchy unilingual situation in Quebec has driven out some very important money makers, but in B.C. it's the unions. Who can afford to operate a full service record company, warehouse etc., and be at the mercy of some pretty way out union

demands. Consequently, another racker has quit B.C. and moved east to Calgary to set up his warehouse.

Big Peach launch Bechamp release

Toronto: Debbie Bechamp makes a bid for the pop/country charts with her initial Big Peach single release. The plug side, I Wanna Hear The Angels Singing, has already attracted attention from country programmers, while the flip side, Your Love, is being given close scrutiny by adult contemporary programmers. Both sides were penned by guitarist and producer of the single, Peter Komisar.

Bechamp, now based in Toronto, is a native of Chapeau, Quebec, where she began her career in the music industry in various country/rock groups including Whynot and Ruby. She met Komisar when he was working

with the Kingpins. They later moved as a team to Ottawa where Bechamp joined the Tamarack Showband, touring the Maritimes, Ouebec and Ontario.

They moved to Toronto in 1979 where Bechamp played Cowboys as a solo for nine months. Komisar concentrated on his writing, founded his own publishing house and generally looked after the day to day affairs of Big Peach. He joined Debbie and together as a duo they began playing dates at Holiday Inns and other clubs across Ontario and Quebec. They recently completed the taping of an Opry North Show.

Bechamp's current single was produced by Komisar at Phase One Studios in Toronto and features some of Canada's top session men including guitarist Brian Russell, pianist Ray Parker, steel man Ron Dan, Brian Barron on fiddle, drummer Kevin McKenzie and bassman Tom Szczesniak. Komisar is currently gathering material for an album. Big Peach is distributed through their Toronto offices.

Junos lack lustre, spirit and magic ingredient

The 1982 version of the Juno Awards was the best television version of the event ever, but what ever the magic ingredient is that will make the Junos shine, it still isn't there.

The press may have a field day criticizing the sales aspect of the awards and the repeat winners. They may work overtime to criticize the record industry image, but the Junos is still thought of as the best award show of the year whether they like the record industry or not. The Genies are still the favoured awards and the ACTRA come second with the print media, but then the record industry has not had a very good image with the dailies. Invite the press to a "press reception". See how many show up.

Starting at the 5 pm cocktail reception (which was spread out over three rooms on two floors. It just didn't happen. It was slow, the guests were cautious and the evening started off with a thud.

Things only got slightly better when the pre-awards show started with no one listening and a din that drowned out Brian Robertson's introductions.

Something has to be done to make the preshow awards more of a show and less of a throw away.

So the first two events of the evening fizzled. It is now hard to follow all that, but shrimp and domestic white wine is quickly thrown on each table and CBC starts the Juno Awards at 7 pm. Many people are still headed home from work.

It is interesting to note that most people I spoke to missed the first hour and tell me they turned on their TV at 8 o'clock. CBC explained a few years ago that they wanted the Junos on early so that more young people could watch. How young do you have to be to watch the Junos and is this really what the average record buyer is depicted as? Is that really who the Junos are for?

As a CBC super special, the Junos rank as one of the best shows the CBC puts together all year. Why not? They are handed twenty to thirty stars and the show has the names. The three production numbers were excellent and again prove that given some camera exposure there are some very talented young people in Canada crying for this kind of exposure. We have the singers and dancers and all we really need are the ideas and the people to put them together.

CBC really tried too hard to make the show a record awards show.

The gold records, used to announce the winners, were really too gimmicky. The traditional envelope is still the best.

It was nice to see some of the freakier people in tuxedos even if they weren't proper and it was nice to see a few of the ladies dressed a little better this year.

The Junos lack lustre, glitter, sensation. The Junos are too complicated. There is too much being squeezed into the show. It all plods on and ends and it's like a movie that ends and you leave the theatre confused as to

whether it was entertaining or not and you wonder if you should ask for your money back.

This year's Junos were the best television variety show yet, but as an award show to promote the industry and sell the industry the Junos mean less each year. Possibly the whole thing should be simplified a great deal and done on a smaller scale.

When the day comes and a ticket to the Junos is worth its weight in gold and you have to know someone to get a ticket, the Junos will have made it, but with tickets too readily available it is felt by many in the industry that the Junos are a non-event.

Too early, too long, too many awards, too many other awards, too many non-industry people, too big, too spread out and too commercial, the Junos lack lustre, spirit and a magic ingredient.

Peter Pringle - the best of French/English markets

A&M recording artist Peter Pringle is out to conquer both the English and French markets in Canada with the release of two new LPs in both languages, boosted by a major tour of Quebec.

Pringle, who was also nominated for a Juno in the Most Promising Male Vocalist category, has released the English album Fifth Avenue Blue and the French, Pour Une Femme.

The Halifax-born singer-composer is one of the few Canadian artists to experience phenomenal success in Canada's two markets.

His last French and English projects were the albums Magicien and Rain Upon The Sea. Magicien was Pringle's debut French album, selling near platinum and garnering him three consecutive -1 hit singles with the songs Je Viens De Decouvrir, Si J'Etais Magicien, and Madame. Meanwhile the singles I Could Have Been a Sailor and It Just Occurred To Me figured in his Juno nomination.

While his previous French and English albums were basically the same songs, except in different languages, the new A&M releases differ in that four out of 10 new tunes are original French compositions. The new French and English singles are Pour Une Femme and Outta My Sight.

For the latest albums, Pringle was backed by some of the recording industry's top musicians and technicians. Backing vocalists lending a hand included three of the Four Seasons, Gerry Polci, Larry Lingle, and Mike Lingle.

The albums, produced by Harry Hinde, were engineered by Tony D'Amico, Don Gooch and Patrick Von Weigandt, then mixed by David Holman who also mixed Olivia Newton-John's Physical.

Musicians on the albums include such veterans as drummer Carlos Vega, bassist Lee



Sklar, guitarists Mike Landau, Paul Sabu and David Lindley, keyboardist Greg Mathieson, and percussionist Paulino DaCosta.

Both albums contain 10 cuts each of which Pringle co-wrote with such names as Larry Brown, Lee Shapiro, George Weiss, Luke Gibson and Bob Crewe.

Although born in Halifax, Pringle was raised and spent most of his time in Toronto where he makes his homebase. At the University of Toronto he learned to speak several languages.

Pringle later got hooked on Indian music and studied this music form with Ravi Shankar, who had also taught the Beatles.

"I heard a record of Indian music and loved it," said Pringle. "I studied for a year with him (Shankar). He's a wonderful man and an extraordinary musician. I became a sitar teacher for a while. When I went to India I also took up an instrument called the surbahar. Indian music is a little esoteric. It's melody not harmony."

A demo tape made by Pringle fell into the hands of producer Brian Ahearn. As a result, Anne Murray recorded several of his songs. Afterwards other artists started covering his material including Mary Travers.

Pringle began his career as a songwriter and travelled to such areas as the Far East, the South Pacific, and both Central and South America. He spent time living in India, France and Italy. Pringle's travels also landed him into a few minor problems such as being arrested in Egypt.

"You're not allowed to bring foreign currency into some other countries," he explained. "I didn't know it was against the law. I was carrying a few foreign bills and the officials looked in horror at me. They asked if I was an Israeli spy and I said no. I could have been smart and humoured him by saying, sure I'm a spy and he would have written self-confessed Israeli spy. It wasn't funny. You have to be very careful with those people. They take things very seriously. It gives them a sense of importance."

Pringle said that basically, the brand of music he's doing now is what he was doing before.

"I'm much more adult-contemporary," he said. "It's something that doesn't change greatly and is here to stay. It can take on different flavours. Look at Presley, MOR stations play him now and he was once synonymous with the devil."

Pringle has appeared on such shows as Merv Griffin, Dinah, Al Hamel and Allan Thicke. In 1979 he headlined his own CTV network special. He also starred with Robert Goulet and Juliette in Return Engagement, a CBC-TV special. In addition he composed the music for the Academy Award nominated films of Milos Forman and Tadeus Jaworski.


"The Gold Collection offers a simply spectacular new design and will of course contain only the original hit recordings," he said.

Tennant added that the Motown Yesteryear 45 series will remain the same with a possible change in the sleeve.





ALBUMS

JOHNNY CASH, JERRY LEE LEWIS
CARL PERKINS - Gospel/rock
The Survivors - Columbia - FC-37961-H

If you're a student of rock, you'll find that these three giants from the rockabilly, rock on days were probably the three most influencing personalities that contributed to its growth, along with Elvis Presley, of course, They were tagged "The million dollar quartet". Cash, Lewis and Perkins are survivors in the truest meaning of the word, although Lewis came close. They could, in fact, be front and centre, when it all happens again. This package of hot and live stage spontaneity is a story in itself and was almost an accident. Cash asked Lewis and Perkins, who were in Europe but who had a night off, to join him for the second half of his show in Stuttgart. The record is totally spontaneous and unrehearsed and producers Lou Robin and Rodney Crowell just let the tapes roll. What you have is a misty-eyed look into the past: Whole Lot-ta Shakin' Goin' On, Blue Suede Shoes, There Will Be Peace In The Valley For Me, Can The Circle Be Unbroken, Rockin' My Life Away and I Forgot To Remember To Forget (a No. 1 record for



Presley in 1955). There's solos and duets and the three of them together. A classic release that will become a collector's item.

SPLIT ENZ Time And Tide - A&M SP-1891-W

A&M have had much luck with groups from down under and from across the pond. Luck might be a factor, but marketing strategy is probably closer to the real reason that A&M Canada always have an edge over their U.S. parent. This Hugh Padgham/Split Enz production is another example and is breaking nicely across Canada. The album has been given an extra boost with the

timely release of a single, Six Months In A Leaky Boat, already making gains on the RPM singles chart. Tim Finn takes writing credits for this choice cut as well as Small World. Brother Neil is also an impressive songwriter with Hello Sandy Allen and Take A Walk as notable tracks. Tim and Neil, keyboards and guitar respectively, are up front on vocals with that sharp delivery and projection that has become almost a trademark for this innovative group of New Zealanders, now making their home in Australia. They're also ready for a major tour of Canada taking them from Victoria (May 12) through to Quebec City (June 1). Lyrics enclosed.

ALLAN J. RYAN
But What Does He Do?

Allan J. Ryan's talent is described as "soft rock, with a touch of folk", which puts him in the mainstream of what today's contemporary adult and soft rock programmers are looking for. Ryan is a veteran in the business, having found an open door to the record industry several years ago, and one that served to expand his talents as a songwriter/performer. This experience has also built a sound vocal framework that oozes confidence and an obvious respect for his tender, emotionally charge lyrics:


DON WILLIAMS - Country Listen To The Radio - MCA 5306-J

One of the most powerful and successful of country traditionalists, Don Williams obviously takes pride in his country roots. The pop world should get a handle on this "perfect entertainer" with the dynamic vocal touch that makes every track a personal message to the listener. Williams is all country but his interpretation of the Mark True/Charles Cochran/Sam Hogin penning of Don't Stop Loving Me Now, and I Can't Get To You From Here, co-written by Stephen Chandler and Fred Knipe, should influence a spread into the other markets. Of course, country is what he does best and he couldn't do better than with the title track, which is his current single, Bob McDill's If Hollywood Don't Need You, and an exceptional track, Only Love, which was co-written by Roger Cook, Sandy Mason and John Prine. Produced by Williams and Garth Fundis at Nashville's Sound Emporium, Lyrics in-

JETHRO TULL
The Broadsword And The Beast
Chrysalis - CHR-1380-F

There are some revealing factors about this album release from the legendary Jethro Tull, most importantly being the fact that lan Anderson has allowed a producer, Paul Samwell-Smith, to enter the hallowed studio world of Jethro Tull. Obviously the power-packed and successful JT did alright

with Anderson as a producer, going back to 1970, but with old-age rock and roll habits and the AOR market beckoning, perhaps Anderson detected a need for change. What real control the producer had over the session is not too noticeable here. Sure, new member Peter-John Vettese on piano, synthesisers and vocals, has added a new dimension to the overall Jethro Tuli sound, but Anderson's vocals and his extraordinary flute, is still the obvious trademark. There's also a new drummer, Gerry Conway, who joins guitarist Martin Barre and bassman David Pegg to make the Jethro Tull picture complete. The later, by the way, supplies that mandolin insert and adds to the vocals. It's difficult to pick favourite tracks but Fallen On Hard Times, Słow Marching Band, Broadsword, and Watching Me, Watching You are exceptional tracks.

DOLLY PARTON - Pop/country Heartbreak Express - RCA AHL1-4289-N

Although the pop world would appear to have adopted Dolly Parton, and vice versa, Parton will always be country, no matter how far up town she travels. She's writing. producing and arranging in the pop vein, but she still performs with that magic communication that could only belong to a lady with strong country roots. Only one criticism, Parton is so vocally well put together, using projection more as an emotional vehicle, that her lyrics can be destructive, particularly with sad songs. This album's a downer, but a winner, particularly punched home by the title track, Single Women, her current single, penned by Michael O'Donoghue and the real killer, Release Me, although, with the latter, she has arranged for an instrumentalupper. That's Buddy Spicher on fiddle and Joe McGuffee on steel, and a very impressive horn section.



PETER NOONE - Rock
One Of The Glory Boys
Johnston/CBS FZ-37369-H

Another of the survivors of the British invasion of the '60s, vocally-mature and with a definite handle on the rock needs of today, Peter Noone could make his comeback with this Spencer Proffer production. It hasn't been for the lack of trying. He claims however, that he has been waiting for that old image to fade. The cute, bucktoothed leader of the pack known as Herman's Hermits actually does little here to reflect that era. He has mastered old-age rock with class that should move him past the barriers of relativity and into his own time and space. Noone is probably closer to American than to British rock and is particularly powerful on Give Me Just A Little More Time, If You Gotta Make A Fool Of Somebody, and Nothing Left To Lose - all priority cuts, but give a hard listen to I'm Gonna Rock Tonight,

WAVES OF PEACE FOR POLANDI

World peace can only be achieved through individual peace, and it seems as though people are so caught up in the rush to grab a piece for themselves that they are kept from experiencing inner peace.

Does it get better or does it become worse? Surely everyone would want it to be better, not only for the world at large, but for themselves as individuals.

For the people of Poland, the situation at this moment has reached tragic proportions. Along with many others throughout the world, we would like to encourage a common expression of concern for the plight of the Polish people, which is but a reflection of the plight of all mankind.

We in the music industry are involved in a unique network which has unlimited potential for world communication, the medium of communcaiton being music itself. Music can affirm the timeless nature of human life. When inspired by the spirit of the love of life, it can also transcend direct confrontation with the forces of misunderstanding, thereby helping to lay the groundwork for the eventual dissipation of misunderstanding itself.

"Waves Of Peace", as a song form conveying thoughts of peace, harmony and goodwill, is a vehicle of world communication. It is ours to use to focus a different form of attention in support of the people of Poland, and through the Polish people a concern for all mankind.

On February 1st, following the call to "mobilize the moral force of freedom... Let Poland Be Poland", we dedicated "Waves of Peace" to the people of Poland on the Paul Reid Show, broadcast over CFQR in Montreal. These thought-waves are now expanding. They have been translated into Polish ("Fali Spokoju") and French ("Ondes de Paix"). Soon they will be heard throughout the world in many languages, each of which is dedicated to the people of Poland.

Aside from the spiritual effect that this demonstration will create throughout the world, a portion of the generated income will be set apart to assist in supplying the material needs of the Polish people. As this unfolds, the people of Poland will be heartened to sense this worldwide demonstration of encouragement in their time of trial.

Offering an alternative is Record Peddler success

Toronto: In a period when many record retailers are experiencing less sales, and in extreme cases being forced to close shop, a Toronto record outlet specializing in imports has been experiencing enormous success.

The Record Peddler is located in downtown Toronto and is owned by Ben Hoffman, President and Managing Director of the shop. The store first opened in 1977, and business was up significantly in 1981 according to Hoffman.

Not only has the outlet been successful despite the recession, the shop has done will with imported product even before the artists have Canadian deals in most cases and in that sense is one step ahead of the majors.

"I invested a very modest amount into the store when I opened," said Hoffman. "Initially the store was set up to sell and buy deletes and odds and ends. I was a big record buyer and was running out of records to buy. There wasn't enough product available to support a business on just that and that's how the import idea came about.

"At first we started buying through local suppliers but then some of them dried up and we had to start supplying ourselves. The main thrust of our business now is our wholesale division which is growing quickly. We're about twice our original size but the store hasn't changed that much."

Hoffman said he was sure his store would be successful on a certain level, but that it became more successful than he imagined.

"You have to maintain an awareness of what the person on the street is looking for."

Hoffman said that he supplies about 100 accounts across the country and that he has about 40 regular suppliers. He stated that 80 per cent of his stock consists of imports while the remaining is about 20.

But what does Hoffman attribute his success to?

"My amazing intelligence," he said. "But really you have to maintain an awareness of what the person on the street is looking for so that he can get it fast. You have to be aware of what's happening because it changes so quickly. We're also unlike the major chain store. We're small but our stock is so much more varied. We've maintained a small store image but are stocked to appeal to a wide range.


"Fifty per cent of our records can't be found in any other store. And 90 per cent can't be found in the city at comparable prices or in stock and supply. Even if you appeal to a limited number of people such as five per cent, and have the stock, you can have one corner or chunk and they're your customers as opposed to the customer who may not be loyal to one store."

Hoffman said his wholesale operation is restricted to imports and some independently recorded Canadian material. When ordering imports he noted they deal with independent exporters while with the small labels, they deal direct.

"When choosing records to import, initially we try anything that looks like it's oriented towards us," he explained. "We're always looking at three or four trade papers each

week and I'm in contact with companies, wholesalers, and retailers all over the world.

"The reason that some other retail stores aren't doing well is not so much as there's too many as they're all selling the same product," he pointed out. "When they're all selling the same records, it results in price cutting and then they don't make money. So they have to

cut inventory which makes them more and more the same. Then it just becomes a circle."

Hoffman noted that in Toronto, within a small radius, stores are selling the regular product. He said Peddler stocks everything from rock to rockabilly, to jazz and blues. The store also buys and sells used albums.

"I pick up all of the state's imports at Record Peddler," said Ivar Hamilton, Import Music Director of CFNY-FM. "We've worked very closely and always have. What we play usually sells well there. Other retailers all carry the same product. I've watched the place grow and now the major record companies are watching the place. It's prompting them to act much faster. We buy

about 50 per cent of our product there."

Hamiton felt that Record Peddler was probably the best record store in the country. He said the other stores carrying imports are few and far between, in addition to charging much more. He added as well that they sometimes consult with the store as to new product.

Hamilton has his own feature on the station titled The Import Show which airs every Sunday from 5 pm to 7 pm.

Hoffman also told RPM they have their own record label called Fringe Product set up mainly to license foreign porudet from independent labels. In addition, the store sells tickets to small concert events.

"People look at Reocrd Peddler as a place where the people are in touch with their interests as opposed to a store where they have no interest as long as the records sell," said Hoffman. "This is a place where you can buy something even if you have no idea what you're looking for."

Hoffman stated they did well with such acts as the Clash, Buzzcocks, and the Human League before they had deals in Canada.

"We've made people aware of some artists by introducing them so that when the major does release the debut here, it's a band and not a who."

Hoffman said they appeal to the same people who listen to CFNY-FM. He noted that the station realizes the only way to survive, is to be different.

"One thing interesting is that a lot of people knock radio for being restrictive or for their playlist," he said. "A lot of it has to do with the fact that they don't have the product. They depend on the majors and in effect are pawns of them. The majors are servicing them with an eye for personal product, not new material. In some cases, those at the stations are not knowledgeable and are more interested in what the listeners want instead of establishing an identity."

Hoffman maintianed that the major companies are not guilty of releasing garbage but felt they're missing out on a lot of things because they're attitudes are still turned towards the big-sellers.

"They can't afford to take chances and want instant success. If they don't get it, they give up."

As for defective discs, Hoffman believes that imports have just as many pops, ticks, warps, etc. as the domestic releases. However, he felt that the mastering of the imports was superior so that the actual music sounds better as comapred to the domestics.


Bob Cousins on the road
