

Loverboy presented with Harold Moon Award

Toronto: P.R.O. Canada's 15th annual awards banquet, a gala affair that attracted the largest audience in the history of the event, 276 writers and publishers, press and record industry representatives, was held at the Four Seasons Hotel (Sept 20). The performing rights organization, a non-profit group, administers performance royalties for more than 12,700 composers and authors and 2,500 music publishers in Canada. The awards dinner, emceed by Burton Cummings, pays tribute to the organization's songwriters, composers and music publishers. Cummings himself has received a P.R.O. Canada award every year since they began in 1969.

One of the highlight's of the evening was the presentation of the Wm. Harold Moon Award to Loverboy, the five-man West Coast rock group that has scored million selling albums and singles, over their short career. Loverboy's manager Lou Blair accepted the

award for the group who are currently on a six-month North American tour.

It was a West Coast sweep in the pop-music category with seven of ten awards going to writers in the Vancouver area. These were Bill Henderson for the Chilliwack hit I Believe and Henderson and Brian MacLeod for Chilliwack's My Girl; Bob Buckley and David Sinclair for the 1982 Straight Lines' hit Letting Go; Ray Roper and David Wills for the Stonebolt single, Goin' Through The Motions Of Love; Claire Lawrence and Shari Ulrich for Ulrich's release She Remembers; Bryan Adams and Jim Vallance for Adams' release Coming Home; and Paul Hyde and Bob Rock of the Payolas for Eyes Of A Stranger. Toronto writers receiving awards were David Roberts for Boys Of Autumn and Eddie Schwartz and Dave Tyson for All Our Tomorrows. Montreal's Dwayne Ford was honoured for Stranger In Paradise.

Publishing companies honoured with multiple awards were ATV Music (Canada) with three awards; and Dunbar Music and Irving Music, two awards each.

P.R.O. Canada also honours writers and publishers of the foreign song that receives the most broadcast performances in Canada and which is licensed by P.R.O. Canada. The award this year went to California composers John Farrar and Tom Snow for the Olivia Newton-John hit of Make A Move On Me.

CJVB Vancouver's first to broadcast in AM stereo

Vancouver: Multilingual station CJVB has beaten the local major AM stations to the punch by becoming the first Vancouver station to turn to AM stereo.

After months of work by engineering firm S.W. Davis Broadcast Technical Services and Chief Engineer Mike Fawcett, CJVB made its stereo debut on September 10, at 5 pm using the Motorola System with 50,000 watts of power. Other major Vancouver AM stations are reported to be in the final preparation stages of their AM stereo transmission systems.

Organizational changes for CBS departments

Toronto: Jack Robertson, Senior Vice President, Operations, CBS Canada has announced several organizational changes within the Special Products and Direct Marketing departments.

Len Freidman assumes managerial responsibilities as Director for both Special Products and Direct Marketing and will report directly to Jack Robertson. Lesley Sephton assumes the post of Product Coordinator for both departments, taking responsibility for administering to Direct Marketing activities in addition to her Special Products duties.

Platel, Southam and Sephton will all report directly to Len Friedman.

Zounds experiences unusual R&B sales

Toronto: Lloyd Nishimura, store manager of the Scarborough-based record retail outlet Zounds, has voiced surprise at the growing sales for R&B artists, not just because they're selling, but because they're selling with little support from radio.

"If I owned CJCL, I'd make it an R&B station," he said. "This music is not serviced by any other station. Other stations probably haven't even considered it. A station would capture a large market including the ethnic groups. This music is doing well, with little support."

Nishimura believes the majority of the sales for R&B artists are based on club play and fans tuning into American stations airing R&B.

"One of the interesting things is that the buyers of R&B product extends into the very young as well, to those from 10 to 15. A lot of kids are into black music, and the cross-over R&B like George Benson and Al Jarreau also does well."

Nishimura noted that his big-sellers this year came from Michael Jackson, The Police, David Bowie, Def Leppard and the Flashdance Soundtrack, pointing out that the best-

sellers are boosted by a Top 40 single.

"To me, if there's a strong single on radio, it will translate into record sales. Def Leppard was the exception. It was the surprise of the summer.

"The age of the people who come to this store range from 20 to 30. They are the young people with the jobs. They're the ones who have the money. The students have it rough. Part-time jobs are scarce."

Nishimura estimated that about 70 percent of his customers are male. He believes however, that more women still go to malls when buying records, but are probably buying other products such as clothes. He also noted that the majority of people who come to the store drive cars.

"We have a lot of country people coming in. I'd say just under 10 percent are country buyers, but we don't get as many easy-listening customers as I'd like. However, there hasn't been a heck of a lot of easy-listening hits during the last several months."

Nishimura has found that the sale of pre-recorded cassettes are about 30 percent over last year, noting that 25 percent of his given sales are in tapes. Compared to the sale of

LPs, he said that albums still outsell tapes by slightly over two to one.

"As a sales percentage, singles remained about the same as last year, but their importance has gone up in terms of selling an album. Twelve-inch singles have also become an important sales tool."

CJCL goes to adult music format

Toronto: CJCL, formerly CKFH, has switched to an adult music format which they refer to as the "Music of your Life". According to General Manager Doug Ackhurst, the station will feature "all good music by the people who made it good."

He explained the station is making the switch because the demand exists. Said Ackhurst, "It will offer an alternative advertising medium with an adult sound that will feature the smooth sound of singers such as Frank Sinatra, Nat King Cole, Tony Bennett, Perry Como, the Mills Brothers and Englebert Humperdinck. There is also growing interest in good music all across the country among younger people who are just discovering these wonderful sounds for the first time and making it their kind of music too."

BOYS BRIGADE

Tony's East - Toronto - Sept 17/83

One of the few truly innovative bands to appear in recent months, Boys Brigade has in fact existed for quite a while, albeit in a rather limited fashion. A result of the so-called "alternate" circuit of locations, they are only now coming to the attention of the mass audience as a result of their debut record.

Vocalist/keyboardist Malcolm Burn is the focal point of the band, and is very earnest in his attempts to familiarize the audience with the material. The poly-rhythmic sound makes for a compelling backdrop to the lyrical content of the tunes. The intense nature of some of the subject matter adds to the singular and distinctive approach which this outfit seems very comfortable with; one doesn't get the impression of a bunch of musicians just jamming away either, which would be a certain temptation given the lineup. My host between sets was drummer Billy (Bucko) Brock, a very cheerful fellow who filled me in on the group's successful gigs, notably a radio broadcast in the U.S., which brought their music to a very wide audience, and more than likely opened more doors to getting the current single, *Passion Of Love*, onto heavy rotation on many major-market FM stations.

Overall, the feel is really good and I can only speculate on how far these guys can go. Frankly, I think they're great and go a long way to carrying the torch for quality Cancon on the airwaves.

TORONTO & STREETHEART

Kitchener Memorial Auditorium Sept 18/83
When Mr. Shields of that veteran group of roustabouts a.k.a. Streetheart hit the boards with buddies in tow, a selection of familiar tunes set our collective toes tapping. It has always been something of a mystery to me that this band has never really broken nationally, even with the assistance of people such as Nazareth's Manny Charlton.

I can only put it down to the fact that these guys are probably the most stable and unpretentious bunch currently working the circuit. As the tunes were rolled out, you got the feeling that you had been invited over to a friend's place to have a drink or two, and catch up on what's been going on. Such is the ambience of a Streetheart gig. No pretense, just a lot of fun and cheerful banter from his nibs. Maybe with the big push nationally, these guys can finally break out of the mid-sized halls and bring back some common-sense to the industry which has yet to bring them the attention they really deserve.

After the requisite break, it was on to the headliners and obvious (T-shirt sales anyway) local favourites, Toronto. I got my fill of Ms. Woods and Ms. Alton, however it's hard to escape the corporate image which this band seems to purvey. The tunes are all there, properly showcased with a good emphasis on the new record, but something seems to be missing. There are no rough edges here, apart from the standard repertoire of shrieks and howls which accompany every song. I desperately want to like this band but something keeps getting in the way. Perhaps the next release will reveal a less studied approach to the material, and a more natural stage demeanor. The day may also come when bands don't leave the stage immediately after their last song, obviously assuming that they'll be called back for an encore.

One might ponder the intricacies of staging a rock and roll event in a medium-sized hall while maintaining relatively clear sound. There was considerable "bounce-back" from the end wall which detracted somewhat from the otherwise good mix.

ROBERT PLANT

Maple Leaf Gardens - Toronto. Sept 10/83

It has been said that rock metes out a curious justice to its heroes. Such is the case with Robert Plant. Saddled with the pedigree and attendant adulation of a certain other band, he is left with the task of convincing us to accept the man, not the myth.

His attempt to maintain artistic validity is enough. The intent was to produce two albums worth of material in advance of any public offering. The rampant fanaticism surrounding anything to do with Led Zeppelin is the only consideration to undercut this theory. As it was, they were out in droves Saturday night, cheering every wave of his hand and shake of his golden locks. He takes it well though, obviously realizing that his own body of work will ultimately speak for itself. The songs are good and the choice of sidemen is surprisingly astute. One in particular is the talented Phil Collins, perhaps rock's most notorious workaholic. His fluid yet forceful touch was a primary component in the presentation. Ex-Frampton cohort Bob Mayo is another, adequately filling out the keyboard sound, as well as doubling on guitar. Plant's alter ego through all this however, has been chickenshock alumnus Robbie Blunt. Though occasionally self-indulgent, he was responsible for elevating the material from good to frequently interesting.

It's good to have the man back. The only hope is that the faithful will come to a better understanding of the '80s Plant and what he's trying to accomplish.

Z Z TOP

Kingswood Music Theatre - Toronto
Sept 11/83

There are currently any number of trios playing blues-based rock 'n roll, and then there's Z Z Top; supposedly three of the rauchiest, funkiest and downright dirtiest hombres to climb on a stage.

But wait a minute! Instead of the much-anticipated Texas blowout, we are served up just over an hour of tepidly rendered hits and near-hits. With over a decade of music to draw on, why was so much material left out? Why would such a hot band deliberately play it so cool? Surely it wasn't the capacity crowd. These guys get cheers for waving their arms. What we have here is corporate rock at its worst; a few lasers, a few lights and enough sanitized boogie to starch your shirts. The punters deserve better.

It's the Tom Rivers show!!!

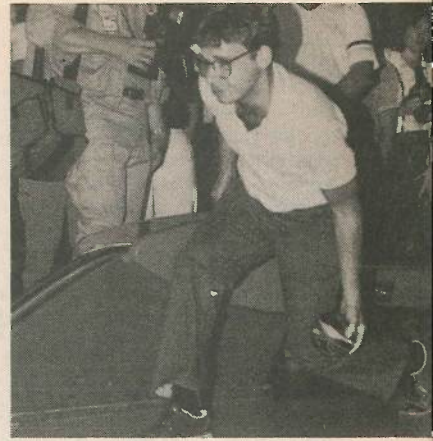

**The Saga Of
BABY DEVINE**
By Bette Midler

The Devine Miss M is as outrageously funny writing fables as she can be on stage. Her first book, *A View From A Broad*, gave her fans somewhat of an insight into her writing talents but *Baby Devine* takes this talent a bit further. Bette Midler is a closet poetess, not that she's been hiding, but she emerges here displaying an exceptional talent of fusing rhyme with nonsense and registering a message, of sorts - naturally for the Midler cultists. One might detect the humour being a facade for someone who has a tremendous inferiority complex - like the fat lady who is always bubbly and good natured while all the time living a wretched existence as a good friend to everyone but a lover to no one. Perhaps one shouldn't attempt to read between the lines and rather take Midler's fable writing as the usual, off-the-cuff humour. She is a very funny lady with an exceptional gift. Through her word manipulating she tells of the birth of *Baby Devine* and the dream trip the strange, unwanted creature took to the outside world, meeting "Three Dizzy Dames - in a Boardinghouse close to the Track," and coming face to face with fear and laughter which brought her to view the Truth:

"It's the Point of Your View
that Decides What You See -
One Man's Flop is Another Man's Hit.
From Manners to Movies,
The Picture keeps Changing
Depending Upon Where You Sit."

The beautifully worked illustrations are by Todd Schorr, whose works have graced the covers of *Time*, *Esquire* and *National Lampoon*. Schorr has captured in swirling full-page colour believability, the anguish, fear, happiness and contentment of *Baby Devine* and her dream carousing with Lily and Tillie and Joyce and the return to her cradle where she beds down with her boa.

Of particular interest in this hard-backed book is the large and very legible type which was set on Mergenthaler 202 equipment in a face called *Cheltenham Bold*. This type was originally designed as a linotype face by Bertram Grosvenor Goodhue, an architect, in collaboration with Ingalls Kimball of the *Cheltenham Press* of New York.

Baby Devine is a classic from the *Divine Miss M*.

Superact CBS releases scheduled for October

Toronto: CBS is preparing the release of several key albums, many of which will be from their biggest-selling artists.

Scheduled for an early October release is Paul McCartney's new album. *Pipes Of Peace*. The first single from the album will be *Say, Say, Say*, a duet with another company superstar, Michael Jackson.

McCartney's last album. *Tug Of War*, was released well over a year ago. Both Jackson and McCartney previously teamed for the pop ballad *The Girl Is Mine*.

Slated for early November is a long-awaited release from Barbra Streisand, the movie soundtrack from *Yentl* to coincide

CHUM AM goes stereo a first for Toronto

Toronto: CHUM-AM, which on May 27, 1957, became the first station in Toronto and Canada to play rock 24 hours a day, has become Toronto's first AM station to go stereo. CHUM made its stereo debut on the evening of Sept. 15. The station selected the Kahn/Hazeltine Independent Sideband Stereo System for its performance in the areas of signal-to-noise ratio, frequency response and stereo signal stability, even under extreme conditions.

Said CHUM Chief Engineer Bruce Carnegie, "The Kahn System delivers a clean, high fidelity stereo signal that is absolutely essential against the competition of cassettes, compact discs, digital audio and of course, FM." CHUM believes that the growth and penetration of AM stereo will be much greater here than in the U.S., where FM radio is not subject to such restrictions. In Canada, government regulations do not permit FM stations to broadcast a Top 40 style of mainly hit music.

Ringo. Suddenly we had our own identities."

Another personal Starr recollection about Lennon: "In the old days it was really bad for your image if you got married because it hurt your popularity. Unbeknownst to me, when I joined the Beatles, John was already married to Cynthia and they were keeping it a surprise for me. So I was in the band for a couple of months before I found out that John was actually married."

A year in the making, the series was written by Canadian Doug Thompson and produced by Tom Rounds of Los Angeles and recorded in London, England in the 24-track studio in Starr's home (originally owned by John Lennon and where the *Imagine* album was also recorded). The series has been distributed by TBS Syndications and will be broadcast in over 85 markets in Canada as well as 350 markets in the U.S.

CKFM, in conjunction with the broadcast of the series, has arranged for the printing of a limited edition poster which will be made available for \$5.00. The posters are available exclusively at the station, Mr. Submarine, Mark's Work Warehouse and Fairweather. All of the proceeds will be donated to the CKFM Children's Fund for the Children's Hospital of Toronto.

with the release of the film, *Phil Ramone* produced.

Bob Dylan will have an October release for his *Infield* album, produced by Mark Knopfler. Recorded at New York's Station session musicians included Sly Dunbar, Robbie Shakespeare, Allen Clark, Knopfler and Mick Taylor, formerly of the Rolling Stones. With eight new songs, tracks will include *Joker*, *Man*, *Union Sundown*, *Don't Fall Apart On Me*, and *Man Of Peace*.

A major project just released from the company is the second album from Canadian guitarist Aldo Nova, a concept LP titled *Subject*. A video of *Monkey On Your Back* has been released as well.

Curtola set for return with DePitt production

Toronto: Bobby Curtola, the "bobby-sox" idol of the '50s, is preparing for his return to the business with an album produced by Dave Van DePitt at Detroit's Soundfleet studios. DePitt is known for his production work with Ginette Reno.

Curtola has been away from the business for several years, residing in Edmonton where he became involved in a successful venture in the oil business. He began his return to the music business a few months ago, scheduling several dates in clubs across Canada, one of the most successful being at Moncton's *Urban Corral*.

Curtola collaborated with the drummer of his four-piece group, Mick Mikilock, Paul Napora, a writer of prose from Edmonton and his mother, in writing material for his new album. A particularly touching song is the one he co-wrote with his mother, *Lord Hear My Prayer*, which reveals a very personal anxiety. She is losing her sight through diabetes.

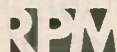

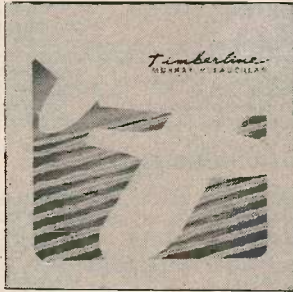

A major Canadian record company has signed a Canadian reggae band, a rare happening being that reggae is thought to be the sole or "soul" music of Jamaica. WEA Music of Canada didn't need much coaxing to move quickly in the signing of

Messenjah have been tagged "Canada's premiere reggae group" and this year won a Black Music Award as Top Reggae Group and a U-Know as Most Promising Independent Act. The heavy writers in the group are Harvey and Blackwood.

New to the Portrait label (a U.S. signing) is the Winnipeg-based Orphan, a four-piece rock band comprising Chris Burke-Gaffney (lead vocals), Brent Diamond (keyboards, vocals), both formerly of The Pumps, Steve McGovern (guitars, vocals) and Ron Boisvenue (drums, percussion and vocals). Together only fifteen months the group has honed their talents into a very tight circle of rock sound that obviously impressed the Portrait people.



Messenjah, a group of transplanted Jamaicans, led by Errol Blackwood (bass guitar, lead vocals). The rest of the group comprises producer Rupert "Ojiji" Harvey (lead guitar, lead vocals), Eric Walsh (rhythm guitar, background vocals), Hal Duggan (keyboards, background vocals, bass), and Tony King (percussion). The birth of this group took place in Kitchener, Ontario, home of Octoberfest, and somewhat removed from the music of the Islands. Producer Harvey has had much experience in the business, much of it learned from his early association with Crack Of Dawn and then going on to put together Inner Flame, one of Toronto's first R&B/reggae club acts. Harvey produced Messenjah's initial album release titled Rock You High, at San Diego's Circle Sound, where he had previously produced Shagnatty, a white reggae band from Arizona.



Initial album session was co-produced by Lance Quinn and Tony Bongiovi, the latter also produced Aldo Nova's successful debut. The taping took place at New York's Power Station. Much of the material was co-written by the group, although Burke-Gaffney would appear to be the heavy in this field, writing three of the nine cuts.

First single taken is the title track, also released as a 12" radio only single. A video of this single was filmed by Stereovision with Paul Vanderlinden as Director of Photography. He enjoyed a similar credit for the Quest Of Fire film. Orphan's video used 16mm film rather than video tape.

Orphan is "prairie rock" - very independent and tough.
