



Saint-Tropez Fest announces long-form awards

New York: The organizers of the 1st International Music Video Festival of Saint-Tropez have announced a number of competitive categories and awards for long-form music videos. The festival will run from October 8th through the 11th.

"Ever since we first announced the Festival," explained North American representative John Nathan, "we have had tremendous interest from companies and individuals involved in the production, distribution, and programming of long-form music video."

Prizes will be awarded in the following categories: Best Concert Video, Best Adaptation from Another Medium, Best Video

to Enhance An Artist's Image, Best Clip Compilation, Best Special Music Event, Best Music Documentary, Best Portrait of An Artist, Best Classical Music Video, Best Direction, Best Story, Best Photography, Best Editing, Best Choreography, Best Sound, Best Special Effects, and Best Animation.

To ensure the importance of the festival as a place to sell music video programming, the organizers are inviting, all expenses paid, 50 international music programming executives involved in cable, broadcast TV, and satellite. Attendance is also expected from home video companies involved in the distribution of music video programs.

With music videos indicating a rapid growth pattern in Canada, particularly in the countdown-type television programs and with the advent of the CITY/CHUM pay TV channel, the Saint-Tropez Festival is expected to generate much interest.

New trivia game for music fans

Toronto: North American rock music fans will now be able to test their knowledge of rock trivia in a new game produced by Toronto-based Playtoy Industries. The game, IQ2000 'Rock Trivia', was launched in April, and contains more than 4,000 questions on groups, solo artists, and hits.

Playtoy Industries has previously experienced success with their IQ2000 trivia game, aimed at the children's market, and expects similar results with the new game.

Played on a simulated record album gameboard, Rock Trivia is divided into eight categories of questions, with five questions on each card. Players move around the gameboard by rolling a die and correctly answering a question from the category corresponding to the colour of the space the player's piece lands on.

Rock Trivia is available in all major department, catalogue, and book stores and carries an approximate retail value of \$20. The game is distributed in Canada by Playtoy, and in the U.S. by Pressman Toy Corporation.

VTR Productions celebrates 25 years

Toronto: Canada's first independent video studios, VTR are currently celebrating a quarter-century of operation. The company's firsts include creation of the world's first 3-camera mobile studio, installing Canada's first digital scanner for colour-enhanced film to tape transfers, and having the first Canadian ultimatte and squeezezoom installations.

Two sister companies, which operate symbiotically, are CTA Video Distributors and Toronto's Eastern Sound Studios. In the home videomarket, CTA is Canada's leading video cassette distributor to retailers; Eastern Sound has produced more Canadian gold and platinum records than any other studio in Canada.

In August, VTR will complete North America's most state of the art video editing and post production suite. Later in 1984, VTR's Duplication Centre will move to Don Mills, Ontario, where 1,500 video duplication machines will operate.

My City Toronto released as single

Toronto: A&M has released the Kosinec/Lenz penning of My City - Toronto in celebration of Toronto's Sesquicentennial. A variety of Toronto's musical family performed on the session, including members of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Moe Koffman, Guido Basso, and members of Anne Murray's backup group.

Tony Kosinec and Jack Lenz have written numerous jingles, theme songs, and film scores. Their major campaign jingles have included Bell Canada, Lifesavers and Coca-Cola.

Contributed to the City of Toronto by the Eaton Centre, My City - Toronto will be heard at all official Sesquicentennial events during 1984. The Kosinec/Lenz Music Corporation were commissioned to use their talents for this special composition by Saffer/Cravitt/Freedman, an ad agency for the Eaton Centre.

Virgin ships promo disc of Musical Phrases

Toronto: Virgin has released the first of a series of promotional discs flying the banner of Musical Phrases. The first issue, dated June 1984, contains 13 tracks from top priority albums, many of which are enjoying current action on the RPM 100. Included are Culture Club's It's A Miracle, which was taken from Colour By Numbers; Up On The Catwalk, taken from Simple Minds' Sparkle In The Rain; The Human League's The Lebanon, taken from Hysteria; UB40's Cherry Oh Baby from Labour Of Love and Locomotion from Orchestral Manoeuvres In The Dark's Junk Culture.

Also included are The Flying Pickets' (When You're) Young And In Love from their Lost Boys album, More Money from Combat Zone by Prince Charles And The City Beat Band; and The Rock Steady Crew's Hey You.

Murray, Toronto's choice for Canada Day hoopla

Toronto: MCA recording artist Yvonne Murray has been picked as the "Official Murray" for 1984 Canada Day celebrations in Toronto. The young talent will perform at a number of events throughout July. Earlier this year she recorded Celebrate Our City, a tribute to Toronto's Sesquicentennial.

In 1983, Murray appeared at a special Canada Day celebration in Dublin, Ireland, as well as releasing her first solo album on the MCG label. One of the album's tracks, Don't Send Me Roses (Dear Abby), reached No. 12 on RPM's Adult Contemporary chart, and the second single, Let's Not Waste Another Heartbeat, is making solid gains through the RPM A/C Top 20.

Murray has made national TV appearances, performed in premier clubs, and was chosen to sing the theme song for Canada Cup '84, Catch The Spirit.

Tembo's Whittaker on a roll in U.S.

Toronto: Roger Whittaker's recent TV album package, All Time Heart Touching Favourites, is now over the 700,000 units sold mark in the U.S., and receives its first TV exposure in Canada in mid-June. The promotion for the package has been done by New York's Suffolk Marketing, who have also done similar work for Slim Whitman and Boxcar Willie.

The Whittaker album was produced by Chet Atkins, and features a collection of pop and country standards. Following the initial TV campaign in the U.S., MCA took over distribution of the record at the retail level, and it has consequently spent the last 21 weeks on the major trades.

Suffolk's Canadian orders are handled by Canadian Rockies Marketing in Brampton, Ontario.

U.S. album cover changes not expected for Canada

Toronto: Artwork on some U.S. album releases has prompted two labels to make album cover changes, described by one label spokesperson as "a precaution." The action is not expected to spill over into Canada.

Mercury released two different album covers of the Scorpions' *Love At First Sting*, rather than discontinuing the original jacket cover altogether.

Columbia in the U.S. is reportedly going through the process of changing the cover of Roger Waters' album, *The Pros And Cons Of Hitch Hiking*.

The original Scorpions album jacket features a black and white photo of a woman and man embracing. The man holds a tattoo marker. The alternate cover is also a black and white shot, but is one of the band, which was originally an inner sleeve of the first package. Both cover versions are still available to the public.

The Waters jacket displays colour artwork of a female hitch hiker, who is nude, with the exception of a backpack.

"We've had no feedback at all on the Scorpions album," said Ken Graydon, Director of Marketing and Sales for PolyGram Canada. "Everyone here thinks the album is in good taste and to my knowledge there's been no complaints."

The Scorpions album is quickly approaching the platinum mark in Canada, more recently fueled by their hit single, *Love You Like A Hurricane*. Meanwhile, their previous album, *Blackout*, has just passed the platinum mark.

The Waters album, despite some negative reviews, is off to a very strong start in

Videos have effect on radio's audience

Clara Carotenuto is Music Director at Vancouver's CFUN. She was asked to comment on programming today's music.

I find today's music well produced, vibrant and exciting. Music that makes listeners happy and music that is dance or R&B oriented is what I feel will be hot this spring and summer.

Videos have an effect on radio's audience, as far as strengthening a performer's image, but as far as I'm concerned, hit songs will always be heard more on radio, which means radio will continue to be the "juke box" of the masses. Videos do not affect my programming judgement.

I'm very fortunate to be able to say, that with the current influx of excellent music landing on my desk, I find music programming a very enjoyable task!

Canada. The album features the guitar work of Eric Clapton, making the LP in double demand for both Pink Floyd and Clapton fans. The album is quickly closing on gold.

"We've had no complaints here on the Waters cover," noted Don Oates, Vice President Marketing & Sales for CBS Canada. "We do have the artwork in case we do have to make a change. It just consists of a black bar to go across the cover."

Oates pointed out that with the amount of product already on the market, combined with the time the LP has already been out, that if there were any problems, the company would likely have heard them by now.

New Hall & Oates LP scheduled for Sept.

Toronto: The *Big Bam Boom* will be the title of the new Hall and Oates album, scheduled for a September release. The release will coincide with the duo's Canadian tour.

The new album was produced by Hall & Oates, Bob Clearmountain and Arthur Baker. The latter, who heads up the Streetwise label, re-mixed Bruce Springsteen's current single *Dancing In The Dark* and also worked on the *Beat Street* Soundtrack.

Canadian tour dates, at press time, include Vancouver, Toronto, Montreal, Quebec City and Ottawa, with more expected for early '85.

Hall and Baker recently co-produced *Sweet Away*, a track that will be included on Diana Ross' new album, also released on the RCA label. The song was co-written by Hall and Sarah Allen and is a duet with Ross and Hall.

Hall is also heard on vocal assist on *The Only Flame In Town*, a track on the new Elvis Costello album, *Goodbye Cruel World*.

Oates has also been busy, guesting on other productions and can be heard giving a vocal assist on the current INXS single, *Original Sin*.

John Mills-Cockell set for Skylight

Toronto: Director Henry Tarvainen and composer John Mills-Cockell will join forces for Skylight Theatre's production of *Twelfth Night*. The production will be part of Skylight's fifth season. Tarvainen and Mills-Cockell have more than 25 such shows to their credit, spanning 14 years.

The *Twelfth Night* production features a cast of 16 players. Mills-Cockell's synthesized score will feature three a capella singers who perform on mandolin, accordian and mouth harp, using a contemporary jazz format.

The Skylight Theatre is located in Earl Bales Park, at Bathurst Street and Sheppard Ave in North York.

The *Twelfth Night* previews July 5 and 6 at 8:15 pm. Admission is free. Production is by Lewis Baumander and design by Martha Mann.

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Keith Elshaw: Channel 47's Flipside - videos with a personality

For Flipside's Keith Elshaw, video really took off with Duran Duran. "What Duran Duran have done with video gives us a rejuvenated market to deal with," he muses, "I wonder if the business of making records has just about spent itself."

The Channel 47 (Toronto) Flipside show is unique by virtue of having no host; at least not one that can be seen. Elshaw's voiceover on the program provides colour and insight into the clips shown, and allows as many as six videos to be screened. The program's mandate is simple: show new and unusual videos mixed in with old favourites.

"I was a station operator when I was only 13 at CFOR in Orillia," he recalls, "and from there I went to CHLO in St. Thomas where J. Robert Wood was the Program Director; he's currently General Manager of CHUM Radio."

After stints at CJCH in Halifax, a CHUM affiliate, and CKOM in Saskatoon, Elshaw landed in Toronto at CKFH (now CJCL), where he hosted the popular Open Lid program. In 1972 he was on board at Toronto's CFTR when the station switched from an MOR format to Top 40.

Before joining Toronto's Q 107 FM outlet in 1977, he freelanced, acted as a consultant, and ventured into the record production business, working with acts such as The Everglades, The Mods, and Martha and The Muffins.

From 1977 to 1984, Elshaw spun records for Q107, and Toronto new music station CFNY-FM. During his stint at 'NY, the Toronto Star rated him Best jock in FM radio.

Leaving Q107 in February of this year, Elshaw crossed paths with producer Vince

Homegrown album released by K 97

Edmonton: K97 has released their new Homegrown album, *Up From The Basement*, a compilation from entrants to the station's 1984 competition. The Homegrown Competition was open to all Alberta rock acts who did not have a recording contract.

K97 listeners picked the top three bands through a weekend phone-in vote. Calgary's Tickets finished first. Edmonton bands, Pete Mann & The Lonely, and Voice placed second and third respectively. The Unchain Me track by the Tickets, the first cut on the album, recently placed second in a national homegrown competition.

The remaining acts on the album: Free Zone, Shot In The Dark, Kids On Strike, British Rail, and Mark Korven were chosen by a panel of K97 personnel who were: PD Neil Edwards, Assistant PD Bruce Kenyon, and MD Ted Kennedy.

Alexander, already experiencing success with his Video Singles program at Channel 47. Alexander was looking for something just a bit different that would position Elshaw as more of a personality than a regular program host. The program's audience has obviously reacted well to the idea; Alexander fields letters from Bowmanville (just east of Toronto) right through to St. Catharines.

In addition to Flipside, Elshaw does many voiceovers for radio and television commercials. A natural development was the desire for him to have his own studio. As a result, Elshaw Audio, located on Toronto's Spadina Avenue, is now open for business. The facility does post-production for industrial films, videos, and television. "I really wanted to get my own studio underway," Elshaw confides, "after working with so many bands and seeing the need for such a facility. We're equipped with 8 or 16 tracks for audio time-code, synched to a 3/4" video."

Flipside however, is Elshaw's current priority. "Video is really great," he enthuses, "Kids take the videos over to a friend's house, and watch them together; it's just like the early days of radio."

How can a video program succeed? Elshaw's answer, "Find out what's hot, support it, and the fans will support you." -KCW

Iglesias & Coca Cola pact promo deal

New York: Internationally popular recording star Julio Iglesias will promote Coca Cola and diet Coke around the world, via print, radio and television, as a result of a deal pactured with the soft drink bottler early last month.

As part of the arrangement with Coca Cola, Iglesias will film six commercials each year, in English, Spanish, and other languages. The clips may include some of his best-known songs.

The announcement was made to the largest conference audience in history - a live television broadcast from the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City and transmitted to nearly 90 countries worldwide by satellite, covering nearly 80% of the world's population.

Iglesias, who releases on CBS, is estimated to have sold in excess of 100 million records worldwide, a feat for which he was the recipient of the first and only Diamond album by the Guinness Book of Records.

Iglesias and Willie Nelson, topped the RPM 50 Singles chart (May 19) with their Columbia duet of *To All The Girls I've Loved Before*, a single that also previously topped RPM's Country 50 and Adult Contemporary charts.

Canadian dates have been firmed for this tour which also includes Germany, Holland, South Africa, Australia, Hong Kong, Taipei, Bangkok, Singapore, Japan and Hawaii. The Canadian dates are Montreal's Forum (Aug 16), The CNE in Toronto (17), and the Ottawa Ex (18).

Ontario Premier launches Cancer Society single

Toronto: With a gold single as the target, Ontario Premier William Davis personally unveiled a "gold facsimile" of *Someone To Hold*, a single recorded by Dena Golden. The single is the brainchild of Steven Shapiro, a local Toronto musician, and is released on his own Contribution label distributed by CBS. The revenue generated from the sale of the single plus revenues from publishing and performance royalties are to be donated to the Canadian

Cancer Society. The plug side of the single was written by Rachel Oldfield, a Toronto nurse and part-time songwriter.

The project has already gained the support of the Premiers of seven provinces, the mayors of Toronto and North York, plus the Chairman of Metro Toronto.

The release is being supported by public service commercials, a video, and 150,000 Cancer Society volunteers across Canada who are encouraging radio play as well as retail sales.

"I got involved in starting the project because illness had touched my own family," noted Shapiro, "But what started as an individual effort was almost immediately shared by dozens of other people. Now that the Canadian Cancer Society is involved on a national scale, hundreds of thousands of Canadians from one side of the country to the other will take part in spreading a single song, and making a contribution that's vitally important."

Breakin' Soundtrack breaks gold in Canada

Montreal: *Breakin'*, expected to be one of the top soundtracks of the year, has now gone gold in Canada, shipping 6,000 last week (June 16). PolyGram moved 250,000 copies in the U.S. in the same period, bringing their total to 900,000.

The album has made excellent jumps up the British and U.S. charts with the first single taken, Ollie & Jerry debuting on the Music Week chart (U.K.) at No. 35 and continues with impressive numbers on both the U.S. trade charts.

Toronto: The last week in June has been targeted by CBS for the release of a special 12" single from the Toronto-based Platinum Blonde trio. The disc will contain a special mix of Take It From Me, which is also included on their debut album, Standing In The Dark. The latter is now nudging the platinum mark in Canada.

The flip of the 12" will contain a live version of the title track, recorded at their recent record-breaking Toronto City Hall concert.

A date at the Kingswood Music Theatre (Toronto) has been firmed for Aug. 11.

Other tour dates for Platinum Blonde include Fort Francis (June 27), Thunderbay (30), Regina (31), and Yorkton July 4).

The band's debut album is expected to be released in England in July.

The band signed with WEA Canada in late 1983, and returned to the studio to record the album with Treumuth.

Who does the writing in the band? "Derry's pretty well doing most of the writing right now," explains Dee. "He writes well with the Portasound (portable recording unit the band won in another contest) and I'm starting to write more as a result. I always wrote with a band, so this is something different for me."

New Girl Now has been taken as the first single from the album. Dee comments: "Derry had written the song for his own vocal. I thought that I could do it justice, so we demoed it with my vocal. You're right, it does sort of have a '60s 'pop' feel to it."

Dee only took to singing seriously two years ago. "I played guitar with Lennox," he recalls, "but really, down deep, I wanted to sing; dancing around up front appealed to me."

The numerous influences represented in the band haven't been overtly manifested in the band's music, to listen to Dee. "I guess there are influences at work," he speculates, "but it isn't a conscious thing; we're trying for something new, something of our own." Dee is equally explicit in the band's bio: "I don't know what a day off is, I'm so used to playing all the time. If we're not performing, we're rehearsing. If we're not rehearsing, then we're writing. I have to play!"

Frankie Goes Hollywood set for Two Tribes release

Toronto: Fueled by strong British response, Island Canada has rush-released the controversial, Two Tribes by Frankie Goes To Hollywood. The single is the follow-up to Relax, which became a Top 10 item in Toronto but bombed in the U.S.

The new single apparently entered the British charts at No. 1 with advance orders for 750,000 singles. "This has only been equalled once," said Island's Lee Silversides, "and that was by The Beatles with Can't Buy Me Love, in 1964. It's also the first time since the Beatles that a band has had two singles in the Top 5 - Two Tribes at No. 1 and Relax at No. 5."

Silversides also revealed that the video for Two Tribes has already been banned in Britain. The video pictures U.S. President Reagan and Soviet Chairman Chernenko slugging it out in a boxing ring.

The Two Tribes single will ship July 5th in Canada with the album set for a fall release.

"I don't think there's anything that can be compared to Two Tribes," said Silversides. "It's a very powerful record."

Although Relax was banned by one radio station in Calgary after listeners complained of lyrical content, Silversides doesn't anticipate any problems with the new single. "We don't expect this one to be banned," he explains, "because the lyrics deal more with reality. Relax was a regional break-out and is only recently building in the West."

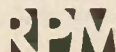

Lenny Zakatek: A Project voice goes solo

One of the voices of the internationally successful recording act The Alan Parsons Project will soon be heard on a project of his own - an album to consist primarily of tunes penned by Canadian writers.

Lenny Zakatek, featured on such Project tunes as Games People Play and I Wouldn't Want To Be Like You, has spent the last year preparing demos in London (England) and Toronto for a solo outing.

RPM spoke with Zakatek recently during a break in his Toronto sessions; the interview took place at the Toronto offices of ATV, the music publishing firm headed by Frank Davies, responsible for bringing Zakatek from England.

Why Canada for the sessions? "ATV had some songs they needed a writer for," explained Zakatek, "and after three months of recording in London, the decision was made to bring me over and do some work with David Tyson. He and I have been doing the arrangements together, and all of us have been working for a year to find songs which indicate that there is life after the Project."

Zakatek is certainly no stranger to the music business, singing professionally at age 13, and spending his teens playing guitar in European gigs behind R&B legends such as The Drifters, and Inez and Charley Foxx. The strong R&B influence has stayed with him.

"I still love Motown," he confesses, "It was terrific in the old days; the drums were nailed to the floor, and they just walked in and played it live with the sidemen performing for different artists." As a singer, Zakatek is excited about the challenge of performing live. Prior to teaming with Alan Parsons and Project partner Eric Woolfson, Zakatek fronted the British band Gonzalez. The latter had a sizeable international hit

with I Haven't Stopped Dancing Yet. Some members of the band went on to play with acts like The Rolling Stones and The Average White Band. Gonzalez performed throughout the U.K. and Europe, including support slots for acts such as Bob Marley and The Wailers.

"The Project has never gone 'live at all'," Zakatek relates. "I thrive on performance. Up until about five years ago in England, you couldn't get signed unless you were a writing band. The bad thing is that you ended up with bands who could write but couldn't cut it live. Then again, you've got great live acts like Paul Young and Dire Straits, who are strong writers as well."

While doing production work at EMI in London in 1978, Zakatek received a call from Project writer/vocalist Eric Woolfson with a proposition. The result was Zakatek singing on I Wouldn't Want To Be Like You.

The solo demos for ATV will include material penned by ATV artist/writer Eddie Schwartz, who has written for many major recording acts, most notably Pat Benatar, and the recent release of Honey-moon Suite.

Zakatek is happy to be working in this country. "Using Canada as a base is good," he says, "I have family here, and I know we can reach the North American market in a big way; I'll continue to work with Eric and Alan, something that I'm proud of, but I'd like to put some energy into this thing as well." (Sessions for the new Project LP were scheduled to get underway in London the day prior to RPM's interview - making this the first occasion when Zakatek will miss initial production on a Project record.)

"I'd like to see both my work with Alan and this solo stuff continue," ponders the articulate singer, "I've been very fortunate in the choices I've been able to make; I'd like to think that this is only the beginning."

A new Vanilla Fudge after wait of 14 years

Toronto: WEA Music Canada has shipped the first reunion album from the '60s progressive rock quartet, Vanilla Fudge, titled *Mystery*.

The Fudge, best known for their covers with distinctively Fudge arrangements, broke up after releasing their last album in 1970. Their biggest hit was a cover of the Supremes hit, You Keep Me Hanging On, written by Holland/Dozier/Holland.

The new album contains another cover written by the trio, My World Is Empty, which was also recorded by the Supremes. The album, produced by Spencer Proffer, also includes a Fudge version of the Burt Bacharach/Hal David classic, Walk On By, a hit by Dionne Warwick and a Canadian hit for Bobby Kris on the Columbia label in 1965.

The Fudge comprises Mark Stein (vocals/keyboards), Carmine Appice (drummer), Tim Bogert (bassist), Vinny Martell (rhythm guitar). Both Appice and Bogert have recorded and toured with Jeff Beck as Beck, Bogert & Appice.

Doug & Slugs tour to support new LP

Vancouver: Doug And The Slugs, who recently released a greatest hits album on the RCA label, have launched a major tour of Canada. The album, 10 Big Ones, also includes two new tracks, an It's Alright Medley, to be released as the first single, and Get Up And Go.

The 10 Big Ones Canadian tour kicked off in Ottawa (June 15, 16), followed by St. John (18, 19), Yarmouth (20), Halifax (21-23), Sydney (25), New Glasgow (26), P.E.I. (27), Halifax 28-30), Cobourg (July 2), London (4), Toronto (5), Calgary (12-14), Fort McMurray (16, 17), and Edmonton (19-21).

Kalil & Nesrallah become Dreamer

Ottawa: David Kalil and Stephan Nesrallah have announced a name change to Dreamer. The band's current release is self-titled, on the Focus label.

According to Kalil, radio programmers were not even listening to the record because of the difficulty in pronouncing the names. He hopes that a change of name will alleviate this situation, as well as more accurately reflect the band's attitude and musical style.

Eclipse, the first single from the album, has indicated a positive programmer pattern of acceptance on a national scale.

A second single, Never Say Goodbye (Tribute To Harry Chapin), is currently being remixed, and should see release some time in mid-July.

Alert label continues with busy schedule

Toronto: Alert, the label founded by Tom Berry and Marc Durand, will see a busy summer season with continued chart response to the debut self-titled release from The Box, as well as a forthcoming release from veteran singer/songwriter/guitarist Kim Mitchell.

The Box recently completed a mini-tour as support for England's Marillion, and their debut single, Walk Away, is receiving heavy exposure at over 70 stations nationally. The Box will conclude June with a special Canada Day performance at Park Cartier in Ottawa.

Kim Mitchell will be on release (June 28) with his long-awaited debut solo release, *akimbo alogo*. The Album Network music trade has predicted that the Go For Soda track, the first single, will be one of the top 5 American AOR tracks this summer. In mid-July, the Kim Mitchell band will commence a showcase tour throughout Western Canada. Through August, tour dates will continue in Ontario, Quebec, and the Maritimes. Mitchell's band will consist of Kim Mitchell/Peter Fredette, rhythm guitar, keyboards, vocals; Robert Sinclair Wilson, bass, keyboards, vocals; Paul Delong, drums; and Todd Booth, keyboards.

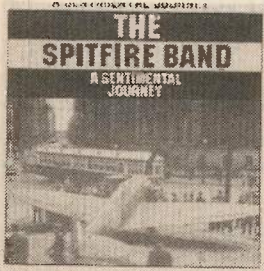
