Closed doors for MIDEM's Canadian Gala

According to Steve Thomson of Backstage Productions who was asked by the MIDEM representatives to organize a Canadian Gala: "Well, if there is a miracle it will happen but it won't."

For years the Canadian recording industry has complained about the lack of representation at these world-wide showcases. However, as Thomson states "To my knowledge, I am the only Canadian manager willing to pay for his artists representation."

There was certainly no lack of support from MIDEM, as Thomson suggests, "the gala was offered to us on a silver platter. They were coming on board with the money for publicity, technical support, location and hotel expenses. Typically, our government gave us lots of moral support but no money."

Thomson says he sympathizes with the artists who turned down his offer and asks "why should artists have to dig into their own pockets to promote the Canadian recording industry? But, I've learned a lot from all this. Now, I know what to do and what not to do for next year's gala."

Canadian gold and tour set for Whittaker's '86

Roger Whittaker began the new year in style with news from CBS Direct that his Songs Of The Heart LP went gold in December. The 2-record set was apparently a much in-demand item over the Christmas period. As well his Christmas LP, Tidings Of Comfort And Joy, proved to be one of the year's best selling Christmas albums. This Tembo LP also went gold in December. Tembo is distributed in Canada by RCA.

Whittaker is currently on release with a new single, Happy Everything, which was arranged and produced by Nick Munro. This single was taken from his Take A Little Time, Give A Little album.

WEA readies Frampton's new Premonition LP

WEA music has scheduled February as the month for their first album release from Peter Frampton. It's interesting to note that his A&M LP, Frampton Comes Alive, became one of the biggest-selling albums in the history of rock.

Frampton's new Atlantic LP is entitled Premonition, from which Lying has been taken as the first single. All tracks are Frampton originals.

Guesting on the session were keyboardist Richard Cottle, who worked with Alan Parsons; bassist Tony Levin, known for his work with Peter Gabriel; and drummers Steve Ferrone and Omar Hakim. Ferrone is from the Average White Band while Hakim has worked with Weather Report and Sting.

At least 4 independent recording artists will be represented at MIDEM by Ruth Hotchkiss PR Inc. This visit marks the company's first foray into the international market. Their acts seeking deals are: Ron Nigrini, Daisy Debolt, Crocini and Genes.

Also this year at MIDEM, prominent Toronto lawyer, Richard Hahn will participate in an international meeting addressing the topic: Merchandising And Sponsoring In The Music Industry and New Legislation And Recent Developments Concerning Royalties And Entertainment. Lawyers from the U.S., U.K., France, Germany and Belgium will also be represented.

A terrible blow to Canada!!!

The Canadian Gala at MIDEM '86 would have been quite a coup for Cancon, but it just wasn't meant to be - not this year anyway. Can you imagine Canadian acts sharing the billing with stars like Pete Townshend, Eric Clapton, Mr. Mister and others. The press of the world will be there. What an opportunity it would have been. Now, it's gone (EC: No use crying over spilled milk!!!)

Crying over milk crates . . . !!

The dairy industry wasn't too happy over the fact their milk crates were the exact size of LP jackets - so they changed over to metric - which is just a little too short for albums. Now, the industry people are afraid the record industry might make their album jackets - just a bit smaller - to fit into the milk crates. I have to admit that I use milk crates in my office to store albums. My crates however, are pure white - with no dairy company advertising. They were bought in a department store - and I wish I could get more at \$6.00 each. (EC: Have you ever been in the stock room a record company?)

Speaking of opportunities . . . !!

It never ceases to amaze me at the number of calls we get from radio stations, asking for assistance in almost every facet of broad-

cast/programming, which is very flattering to say the least. Many of the enquiries have to do with job offers, and if you take a look at page 15 you will see what I mean. There are job openings for news voices, morning, mid-day, and drive personalities, copywriters, and for bushy-tailed programmer hopefuls to become part of a programming team. There's even an opportunity to create in the land of the Midnight Sun. Now, if you happen to be interested in the record retail business - you might have the right qualifications to land a good job with an expanding music chain.

Just a little late . . . !!

We hear stories about 2 RPM's arriving in the mail at the same time - when we certify that we mail RPM every Friday afternoon. On Monday (Jan. 13) a close associate of mine received his copy of an entertainment weekly trade paper, dated Nov. 27. It took six and a half weeks to travel from NYC to TO.

Canadian studios doing fine . . . ??

From all outward appearances, Canadian recording studios must be doing very nicely. There was a time, not too long ago, when studio management was continually knocking at the doors of foreign record companies and management, in hopes of having recording acts take advantage of their "state-of-the-art" facilities. It quite often worked, but the only studio that seems to have maintained that foreign connection is Andre Perry's Le Studio in Quebec. Now, with the Canadian dollar in a depressed state, one might think the time opportune to grab as much of this foreign action as possible. They're doing it in Paris . . . and I'm going over to personally check out the studios. Some of the stuff I've heard certainly doesn't sound as if their studios are as state-of-the-art as those in Canada. One small ad, placed in

RPM recently, by a recording studio, attracted enquiries from the U.S. and the U.K. - and even from Saskatchewan - so I know there is an interest in Canada's recording studios.

The rewards are there . . . !!

Getting a foot in the door of the broadcast industry is one thing. Doing your first on-air shift is another - but being recognized for your talent is the icing on the cake. How's this as an accomplishment: Jim Ferguson, former mid-morning personality and Music Director at CKWS 96 in Kingston, has been promoted to the position of Vice President of Programming for the station. Jim has only been with CKWS for 5 years. Here's another: Terry Williams, who has been with the CHUM Group since 1974, gets a chance at the big time. He takes over as Program Director of CHUM 1050 in Toronto, effective in March. Terry gained a lot of programming experience as PD of CJCH Halifax and CFRW Winnipeg. There's also a new face and voice at CKEY in Toronto - Marty Kingston moves from CHNS/CHFX-FM Halifax where he was Sports Director - to handle afternoon sports reporting for the Toronto station. Congratulations.

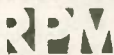
Just a reminder . . . !!

CKGM switches to 'Lite Rock...Less Talk'

The 'Lite Rock...Less Talk' format, first researched and introduced by Vancouver's CFUN early last year, has been launched by fellow CHUM Group station CKGM in Montreal.

After conducting considerable research, CKGM's new sound was developed "to meet the demands of the changing Montreal market." Lite (or Soft) Rock formats are already established in Halifax and Toronto. - as well as Vancouver - and, according to the recently published BBM surveys are evidently what the listening public is after.

In Vancouver, measuring the 25-49 demographic, CFUN Radio moved from 553,000 tuned hours in the fall of 1984 to 1,409,000 hours one year later. The 'Lite Rock...Less Talk' format has also moved CFUN to the number one station in the 18-49 group, with 1,748,000 hours tuned.

The radical change from Top 40, clearly positions differently the station from the talk and sports oriented CFCF, the talk/information/personality dominated CJAD and the all news CKO.

'Lite Rock...Less Talk' has been applied for, as a registered trade-mark, by the CHUM Group for exclusive use in its markets across Canada.

TV's Greatest Hits - "a pipeline to the soul"

Television's Greatest Hits runs the gamut, covering 65 themes spanning an era from the late '40s to the present. Over \$250,000 (U.S.) was spent by Gottlieb producing the package, "cleaning up old tracks" as well as "re-creating those which were unusable."

Replying to the question of whether the set is considered a novelty item or a historical documentation of the times, Gottlieb says, "Looking at the trivia products that are out there on the market - those are done on the fly, they get out there with lots of PR. I wouldn't have undertaken to distribute, where the whole goal is a 'flash in the pan.'"

"The reason I invested that kind of money was because I knew if I had a high quality product and put together the definitive statement of an era, of that genre of music, that whether or not it was a hit immediately or 20 years from now - it is the kind album you were going to keep."

Gottlieb elaborates, suggesting that in the U.S. the album is selling primarily "by word of mouth because it's good music." Continuing, he admits that "the genre (of music) may have its limits but it is so effective at creating a mood and stirring one's emotions."

It's frightening to think that these are pieces of music that can stick in peoples minds for so long when they've only heard it once or twice. It has a tremendous amount of staying power."

What actually influenced Gottlieb to produce the Greatest Hits package? "This is the music that has been kept alive by people

Australian-based Barnes is new WEA signing

Jimmy Barnes, a British-born, Australian-based vocalist is the latest signing to the Geffen label. WEA have tagged Barnes as "one of the new names to watch in '86".

WEA is currently readying a national push to support the debut, self-titled LP from Barnes.

Barnes is managed by the Vancouver duo of Bruce Allen and Lou Blair. The singer is currently putting together a touring band which is expected to include some members of Bryan Adams' group.

"This is the season for a lot of debut albums," said Bill Johnston, Warner Bros and Geffen Product Manager. "Out of all these, Jimmy Barnes is one of the most promising. Keep your eye on that name." Johnston describes Barnes' material as "mainstream rock".

Barnes, the former lead singer of Cold Chisel, an Australian band, is expecting to tour this spring.

No single has been picked at press time, but WEA is issuing a special AOR 12" spotlighting No Second Prize, the opening track on the album,

who couldn't get it for years and years, it's better known than any single artist from Elvis to Bruce Springsteen - it's so engrained in our culture." He cites Sting's movie *Bring On The Night*: "the high point of the movie is where they do the Flintstone theme."

Gottlieb is quick to draw the line with present TV themes doing so well at retail and says that although the older themes are milestones, "they were, in their day, experimental."

Gottlieb explains "The difference between past and present TV themes is that this is a genre unto itself and in the past when they did TV themes, the attitude was not 'What's hot in pop music? Let's do something like that.' It was were doing a TV show - this is the sphere of it - let's come up with a signature piece."

"So, when they did the themes to Green Acres or The Beverly Hillbillies - country and western music - well, it wasn't even called that, it was bluegrass that was listened to by a small band of hics. It didn't have a national audience, not to mention a global audience. A lot of other themes existed in the self-contained and somewhat insulated medium of television - where as they're much more

Happy New Year to everyone...from WEA

Christmas and New Years are behind us for another year and everyone, everywhere has racked their brains for Top 10 lists in music, film and on most ever imaginable topic. But it's time now to put '85 behind us and check out some of WEA's new and upcoming records we hope to see on next year's lists. Following are a few that are sure to attract attention as the months go by.

Lloyd Cole and The Commotions debuted last year with *Rattlesnakes*, a complete masterpiece by many people's standards. In fact, this record made NME's Top 100 list of all time with some pretty heavy company. *Easy Pieces* is this year's Cole, with *Lost Weekend* as the key cut and video. If there was ever any doubt as to whether the Commotions could follow such an auspicious debut, there won't be after a few listens to this new platter.

Anyone familiar with Aussie music lore will immediately recognize the name Cold Chisel as one of the most popular and enduring of that continent's rock 'n' roll offerings. The force behind this band was a singer/songwriter from Glasgow named Jimmy Barnes. Now, after 15 years on top down

like pop music. The goal is not to do a signature piece for the show but rather come up with a hit theme."

At least half of the tracks are not original, they are studio-recorded covers and as Gottlieb says "we ended up paying a fortune to do the re-creations" but cautions "it wasn't a question of an imitator ripping off the original performer because in all cases it was cheaper to use the license."

Many of the original recordings were either lost or destroyed; hence "unsuitable for the record." A lot of them were too short, such as *Leave It To Beaver* which only lasted 35 to 40 seconds "and I would rather invest nowever many thousands it cost to re-create *Leave It To Beaver* and then have a track that's 60-90 seconds long - so the record doesn't feel like it's skipping, like it doesn't sound like a bunch of commercial jingles."

The association with A&M came about "because" says Gottlieb "we were anxious to find a record company that would be able to move quickly. We turned down the majors because we weren't convinced they could act fast enough. At A&M, they seemed excited about the project, they were willing to turn on a dime and get it out. They moved faster than all the other territories."

Gottlieb concludes: "The reason this record is such a trip is precisely because it is music....it's a pipeline to the soul."

under, Jimmy Barnes' self-titled North American debut will be available Jan. 30th on the Geffen label and you will be hearing a lot more from this lad. Jimmy Barnes features 11 tracks including his Australian smash *No Second Prize*. Canada has become a second home for Barnes. He's temporarily settled in Vancouver where managers Bruce Allen and Lou Blair have him rehearsing to take his act on the road.

HoneyMoon Suite are set to follow-up their double platinum debut Feb. 4th with the release of *The Big Prize* and first single *Feel It Again*. 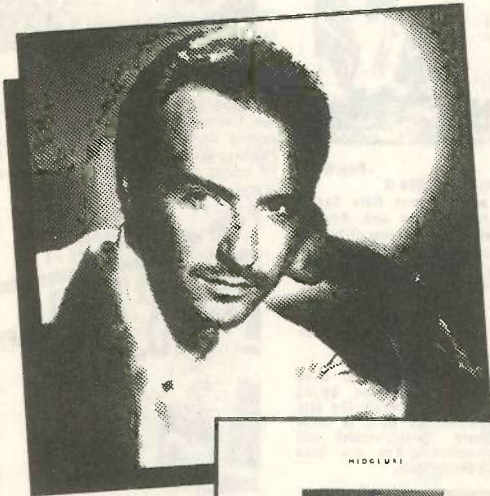



BRUCE COCKBURN - Pop
 World of Wonders
 True North - TN4-66-H
 Produced by John Goldsmith and Kerry Crawford, Bruce Cockburn's message-type recordings would appear to have finally broken the barrier. Initial single, *People See Through You*, was an immediate add with most of the major CHR and AOR stations, a few of whom were usually late when it came to recognizing Cockburn's "mean method" of communicating. There's a lot of things new here besides the album: Michael Allan White is the new horn player; and Michael Sloski is the new drummer. They join the Marsh brothers, Fergus on stick, and Hugh on violin, Chi Sharpe is on percussion and Judy Cade does background vocals. Also new is the sound of the Charango, an instrument native to the Andes which Bruce has become quite proficient with. Key are the title track and *Santiago Dawn*.



ANNE MURRAY - Pop
 Something To Talk About
 Capitol - SJ-12466-F
 To use Capitol's own promo talk, this album "is the most artistically challenging album Anne Murray has ever recorded," which pretty well sums up what this 15-yr veteran has in the grooves. Evidence of what might be "a significant year in her life," is the enthusiasm with which radio programmers, particularly those with rock formats, took to Murray's

first single, *Now And Forever (You And Me)* which literally bounded up the RPM 100 singles chart. A big plus for the LP, of course, is the production of this single by David Foster. Also producing tracks were Jack White and Keith Diamond, with *Who's Leaving You and You Never Know* as key tracks respectively.



FINE YOUNG CANNIBALS - Pop
 Fine Young Cannibals - IRS - IRS-5683-J
 Bevy of producers including Mike Pela, Bob Sargeant (who produced previous Beat LP's), Robin Miller (Sade) as well as bandmembers Cox, Gift and Steele. Contains their European hit, *Johnny Come Home* and an innovative interpretation of the Elvis classic *Suspicious Minds*. Features the fine use of trumpet, complimenting the bass of Steele and the searing vocals of Gift. The reggae-influenced band recorded this session at the Power Plant.

VIRGIN STEELE - HM/Pop
 Noble Savage - A&M - CL-1005-W
 This pseudo-HM recording unit, released on the Cobra label, offers such memorable melodies as *We Rule The Night*, *Fight Tooth And Nail* as well as the title track - which is key. Lead singer/producer David Defries penned the majority of the material. Canadians Hugh Syme and Dimo Safari lend art direction and photography talents respectively.



BANGLES - Pop
 Different Light - CBS - FC-40039-H
 Produced by David Kahne, this Los Angeles-based, all-female band combines the talents of

Vicki Peterson, Michael Steele, Debbi Peterson and Susanna Hoffs. The first single, *Manic Monday*, is a key track. Also notable are *Walk Like An Egyptian*, penned by Liam Sternberg, and *Alex Chilton's September Girls*.



FACE TO FACE - Pop/Rock
 Confrontation - Epic - FE-39999-H
 Band comprises Laurie Sargent, Billy Beard, Stuart Kimball, John Ryder and Angelo. Majority of material penned by team of Angelo and Sargent, including first single, *Tell Me Why*. Produced by Arthur Baker and Ed Stasium, John Cafferty guests on *Shake The World* - a key track.

ZARBO - Rock
 A-Z Collection
 Canadian Custom Records - CCR-9051
 Produced by Alexander Zarbo and Mike Alyanak at Toronto's Kensington Sound Besides Zarbo on bass and vocals (he also wrote all the material) the band is made up of Derek Sharp (guitars/vocals) and Greg Anzelc (drums/vocals). Key are *Save Your Money* and *Oh Momentum*.



PAUL HARDCASTLE - R&B/Pop
 Paul Hardcastle - Chrysalis - CHS-41517-J
 A self-production, Hardcastle includes his controversial 19, which scored hit status in Canada, peaking at No. 2 on the RPM 100 singles chart (Aug. 10/85). This set however, will require a lot of work to gain programmer popularity. He could do it with *Just For Money* which features the voices of Laurence Olivier, Bob Hoskins, Ed O'Ross and Alan Talbot - from a variety standpoint only.



JAMES YOUNG - Rock
 City Slicker - Passport - PB-6051-W
 Produced by Young and noted keyboardist Jan Hammer, who also lends a hand at co-writing *Waiting*, *Still Feel Your Love*, *No Mistake*, and *Prisoner Of War* - all key tracks. Of course, he is also heard on keyboards and drums.



MARTI JONES - Pop
 Unsophisticated Time - A&M - SP-5086-W
 Debut solo album for guitarist Jones with a little help from Mitch Easter and Don Dixon. These two are known for their exceptional work with R.E.M.'s latest effort, *Fables Of The Reconstruction*. Dixon, who not only produced this set, also plays "everything else" on the session. Key are Jones' own penning of *The Rhythm Of Shallow Breathing* and *Elvis Costello's The Element Within Her*.

HANK SMITH & WILO ROSE - Country
 Country International - Quality SV-2139-M
 One of the veterans in the Canadian country music, Hank Smith and his Country Rose band put together a live set from Australia. Smith is probably one of the most travelled of any country recording act in Canada, having played dates in New Zealand, Australia, Hong Kong, Singapore, London, Nigeria, Zambia, and they were the first Canadian country band to tour East Germany. Vocal solos from Deanna Waters, Paul Bartha and Ray Dussome as well as Smith. Fiddle work by Graham Townshend. Key are *Dick Damron's Countryried* and *Rose Of San Antone*, written by Bob Wills.

D&L celebrates 25 years

Don Grashey and his Thunder Bay, Ont.-based D&L Music will celebrate their 25th anniversary on Feb. 24th, 1986. The publishing firm has chalked up a pretty impressive record, including 8 P.R.O. C-KAN sets finals for Talent Search

Newmarket, Ont. country station, C-KAN has narrowed their Talent Search to 12 finalists who will compete for the big prize (Jan 30) at the Canadiana Roller Rink in Aurora. The lead up to the Talent Search began in May and was held in clubs throughout York Region and Scarborough each week up to the middle of December.

The grand prize, a \$5,000 recording session, produced by last year's Big Country Award winner Mike Pepe Francis, will be given to the winner of the finals.

C-KAN's Al Kingdon, the spark behind the Talent Search and who will emcee the finals, stresses that the competition "isn't an amateur show". The only stipulation however, was that the artist or group was not under contract to a label at the time they entered the contest.
