





Christmas selling period gets an "early" start

With the release of the Bruce Springsteen 5-lp package 4 weeks ago, various retailers are suggesting the Christmas selling period has started early. "It got us off to a great start," concurs Sound Insight's Director of Marketing Peter Parish, the distribution operation for the A&A's chain.

Parrish also believes the Springsteen release will have no negative repercussions at retail - with regard to other label's product or with respect to returns in the new year. "This is a once in a lifetime package, a permanent part of any collection that has nothing to do with one's immediate needs for new product

3rd quarter stats show increased sales

Although the Canadian Recording Industry Association's recently released statistics show that the net value of sales for compact discs have increased dramatically over the past year (187 percent), the combines sales of prerecorded tapes and records has increased only slightly.

Brian Robertson, CRIA president, believes the industry will finish the year with sales increasing between 5 and 6 percent over last year, which is where they stand to date

The statistics indicate "phonograph records", which now include CD's, have increased 5 percent, while actual production of 12" product has declined 10 percent and net shipments declined 15 percent since 1985. On the other hand, although 7" production has increased marginally (2 percent), net shipments have actually decreased 14 percent.

CD sales have nearly tripled since last year and, including the month of October, their net value is over \$35 million. Net shipments have subsequently increased from 912 thousand units, to nearly 2.5 million representing an increase of 169 percent.

In 1986, the manufacture of cassettes increased by 9 percent, while net shipments are up only 3 percent. However, again the net value of sales has increased, by 7 percent.

Therefore, although total sales have jumped from \$197 million to \$209 million; production of units has only moved from 66 million to 67 million and yet actual shipments have declined from 55 million to 54 million.

that. "If anything," he quips, "it'll probably take away from purchases in other industries. Perhaps, we've stolen a nice dinner in a restaurant." Parrish also points up his stores are seeing sell-through on all product and is actually expecting low returns in January.

John McBride of Roblan's, Sam's distribution arm, agrees, though noting "the actual" Christmas selling period has yet to arrive. Since the Springsteen release he says retail "hasn't really slowed down but it hasn't hit the usual peak either."

He is looking for a major upswing in Ontario soon, where retailers are opening on Sunday for the first time. 50 of their 80 stores are located in Ontario and McBride feels the move will "change normal buying patterns and get people out earlier," which will have a marked affect on the overall turnover this year.

Lesley Soldat, Director of National Promotion for MCA, adds even without the assistance of the U.S. parent the label has broken "a great number" of new acts. Among these are Fine Young Cannibals, Charlie Sexton, Doctor & The Medics and

Mulligan key player for MuchMusic's December

Terry David Mulligan moves into the MuchMusic spotlight as he finally kicks off his MuchMusic West, at 12 Noon (EST) Tuesday Dec. 12. This is Mulligan's first 4-hour shift on MuchMusic and will continue each Tuesday from Vancouver.

In association with Shane Lunny Productions, MuchMusic will open their Vancouver office (Dec. 12), and the opening celebrations will be shown on Mulligan's Dec. 16th show.

Mulligan will make a 2-day shift from Tuesday (Dec. 23) to Thursday (25), when he will host his Christmas Special - all day long.

Big Ticket dates for December include Robert Charlebois and Jean-Jacques Goldman (Dec. 6), and Belinda Carlisle in concert (20). The latter was taped during her summer '86 tour with Robert Palmer.

The CHUM/CITY crews have been busy shooting concerts around the country, which included Tom Cochrane and Red Rider in Calgary, The Fixx live in concert in Kitchener, and Honeymoon Suite's most recent concert.

A couple of welcome additions to MuchMusic's programming which brings the European music market closer to Canada are the Coca-Cola Eurochart (Fridays at 3 pm EST), and U.K. Despatch (Sundays at 5 pm EST). ingsteen set is being bought as "one record, not as 5," that is leading to an increase "in dollars but not in people." Midge Ure, all of which "did nothing" stateside.

With respect to this success, both at radio and retail, Soldat offers: "Radio in Canada is more apt to listen to a record, where as in the U.S. there are consultants and groups that make it more difficult to create a national impact."

Much of their success is attribute to quickly capitalizing in regional breakouts. For example, Soldat mentions the new Belinda Carlisle single, I Feel Magic, is now starting to convert to chart in many major markets after peaking already in Peterborough and London.

"We reached our quota at the end of November," states Soldat. "Now we're into the biggest selling period and it's all gravy."

Powder Blues Band wins a Handy Award

Vancouver's Powder Blues Band, who won a Best New Group Juno in 1980, have won a Handy for Foreign Blues Band of The Year. The award, named after W.C. Handy, known as "The Father of The Blues" was presented to the band's manager Ron Zeelens, during the Blues Foundation's 7th Annual National Blues Awards Show, held in Memphis (Nov. 16).

The award is presented annually through the Foundation's international balloting system in 21 categories - and is the only national forum honoring musicians/performers in what is described as "a unique musical art form."

The band's most recent album, Red Hot/True Blue, is available in the U.S. on the Flying Fish label, and in Australia/New Zealand on PolyGram. Also available is a conceptual video of I'm On The Road Again along with a full-length concert video of Live At Montreux for home video (excluding Australasia) and broadcast television (excluding Canada).

Zeelens is associated with Raz Management of New York City.

Manhattan to grow with Glass Tiger & Partlands

Bruce Lundvall, the president of New Yorkbased Manhattan Records, started the label less than 2 years ago with neither an artist signed nor an employee hired. Although Steve Van Zandt's Sun City project put Manhattan "on the map"; it was, in fact, Glass Tiger "who helped us turn the corner," he states.

Adding, for the label, "Glass Tiger has been our biggest success story so far.

"I think they'll be one of the biggest artists in the current contemporary music scene," he continues . "They've got it in every sense: in terms of their songs, their live appearance, their totally distinctive identifiable sound and absolutely excellent management."

Manhattan have also signed to their roster Glass Tiger labelmates The Partland Brothers, currently on release with their debut Electric Honey, "and we intend to do the same with them," comments Lundvall.

Currently, Glass Tiger's debut, The Thin Red Line, sits at 500,000 units and reaching platinum is not unrealistic, says Lundvall, "after all, we're only half-way through the second single (Someday)."

Although initially, the strategy was to break Glass Tiger at (U.S.) AOR stations, Lundvall found while The Thin Red Line was gaining a foothold Don't Forget Me was becoming "a huge hit in Canada." Manhattan then rush-released Don't Forget Me stateside. "It was being forced out of the album here . . . and AOR stations also wanted to play - and many of them were!"

However, "We were a little concerned about the video," he recalls. "In fact, very concerned because we felt it depicted the band as being very teen oriented and so we

Atlantic set to release 2 new box sets

In the new year, Atlantic Records intends to release 2 more box sets following an intensive year of catalogue reapraisal. Simply titled Atlantic Blues and Atlantic Jazz, the records can either be purchased individually or in box sets.

The 8-disc Blues set "documents Atlantic's involvement in blues recording, and its credits reads like a veritable Who's Who's of the blues." The compilation will cover three decades and several generations of blues men and women, from the early pioneeers to the "modern legends," such as: Muddy Waters, John Lee Hooker and Howlin' Wolf.

The jazz package represents the first attempt to "anthologize its great wealth of material" in this field and covers tracks recorded since Atlantic's inception in 1947.

The set contains 141 cuts arranged "according to style" in 12 volumes, comprising 3 double and 9 single albums; which collectively are available as a 15-disc box set. Digital re-mastering was employed to guarantee the best sound quality for these re-issues. Extensive liner notes and track by track credits have also been made available.

Ahmet Ertegun takes Executive Producer credits, while John Snyder (jazz) and Bob Porter (blues) produced. were very insistant that we do a new video."

In May, with Glass Tiger then climbing charts on both sides of the border, Manhattan brought many of their employees and associates up to Toronto to see the band's performance at Ontario Place. "We brought up our field district managers, a lot of the promotion people and some key customers.

"I think that created quite an impression and that probably was a key thing for us to have done early on. It made quite a statement as to our commitment to the group as well.

"It's really been a totally cooperative venture," he asserts. "Between our Canadian company, the band, the manager and ourselves. It's been one of those experiences that you dream of - where everything goes right."

Lundvall relates following the Toronto shows, Glass Tiger were flown to New York to acquaint themselves with Manhattan Records and for pre-press interviews during which time the opening tour slot with Journey was announced. "Then we hired an outside publicist for the tour . . . we made sure that we got all of our customers and radio people out to see them."

He also suggests the label is having quite a year breaking new acts, despite tightening radio playlists; as well as Glass Tiger they are enjoying considerable success with Robbie Nevil and his self-titled debut release.

"Any record company is really based on very strong A&R. You can have the best marketing in the world but if you don't have the right records you aren't going to go anywhere," he concludes. "It always has to start with great songs and obviously a great artist. Then the marketing follows."

Currently in Canada, You're What I Look For (the latest single), together with the U.S. action has renewed sales and prompted The Thin Red Line to begin a climb back up the album chart, where it has already enjoyed 42 weeks.





New Cockburn songbook parallels first recordings

Bruce Cockburn's songs and instrumental pieces recorded between his formative years 1969 - 1979 have now been collated in a new songbook titled All The Diamonds, published by OFC Publications - a division of the Ottawa Folklore Centre.

Bernie Finkelstein, Cockburn's manager, says "the music transcriptions were all authorized by Bruce and in fact parallel the work as Bruce first recorded it.

"As a consequence," he continues, "for those people who wish to know tunings and fingerings etc. as Bruce played them, this book is a must." Altogether 29 songs were transcipted by Paul Bourdeau, who explains Cockburn's 'fifth finger' technique in the book.

"Happily," he adds, "the hand remains quicker than the ear, and like any bit of magic, Bruce's music can be mastered -although not without difficulty. Practice will help in pulling Bruce off the written page, and repeated listenings will assist you with the spirit of his work, which cannot be transferred to paper."

Now, that's going too far!!





Er, g'day. Michael J. Crocodile Dundee's the name. I'm just in town for a coupla days filmin' some new commercials for this Aussie brew that tastes like "an angel cryin' on yer tongue." And I suppose all you fun lovin' Canucks have seen me hit movie too. Bonza show . . . eh?

While I was in town I ran into me old mate from downunder, Pete 'The Wombat' Vitols. We call him The Wombat because he eats, roots and leaves (think about that one then). The last time I saw the ol' bastard was back in Oz, when he was hangin' around with this big bald guy who sings in some big Oz rock band. Anyhow now I find him hangin' around this Canadian record company called Juke Street Records or as you bloody beavers would pronounce it . . . Doooke Street Records. So, I go to see 'im to tell 'im about me movie and he couldn't care less. All he wants to do is to tell me how hip his record company is and what a great year they've had and how good all of his bands are. What a wanker!

So, I ask 'im to tell me who all these great bands are and what they've done this year. He starts tellin' me about this bunch of young kids called Chork or Chark Circle, who had a top 20 hit in Canada with this song called April Fool. Duran Duran - changing for the better?

Among's rock's most notable trios, The Police and Genesis stand out as the most commercially successful. However, one started out as a trio and one evolved into a trio. Now, following a series of lineup deletions, Duran Duran are also a trio - and their aspirations, or delusions, of grandeur - remain uppermost.

Duran Duran were at the pinnacle of the new British invasion, following their previous album releases - then seemingly, at the height of this success, the band split up, forming splinter projects, Power Station and Arcadia, both accruing sales in access of platinum.

However, when the call was put out to begin work on a new Duran Duran album this past summer, "Three showed up and two didn't," explains John Taylor, who recorded the Power Station with Andy Taylor, Tony Thompson and Robert Palmer. Andy Taylor has subsequently released his solo effort on Atlantic and former Duran drummer, Roger Taylor is "doing his own thing."

According to (John) Taylor, the band's bassist, the changes are not just physical. As well as allowing for the making of a quicker decision, the change has also helped the band realize a greater degree of flexibility, musically. For instance, their new album, Notorious, contains brass and the guitar work of Nile Rogers. But more importantly Taylor points out, the band has simplified their sound and recorded a "very organic" album - something they hadn't been able to do in the past.

How that fact will translate into commercial sucess, Taylor is unsure. Actually, company should be called Duck Street Records). I look a little closer and I think I've seen this sheila before. Gawd Blimey! When I was in New York makin' me film I remember seein' 'er photo in all these papers, like The New York Times and magazines like Rolling Stone, Spin and People (I read a lot ya know). There were almost as many stories about her as there were about me. They all said that this Jane Slippery (or whatever her name is) was the best thing to come out of Canada since the hockey puck (is that another animal?).

I guess she'll have a bonza new album out in the autumn of '87. Also, we might even see that record released in the land of Oz. Then she can go downunder and do a video with a kangaroo or maybe a koala bear.

I looked out the window, and up at the sun, and realized it was 4:20 (that's how we tell the time out in the bush) and I knew I had to go. The T.V. crews were waitin' for me, but Vitols, The Wombat, wouldn't let me go until he told me about a few of the new acts that Dork Street Records will be puttin' out next year. I can't remember any of the names that he told me, so I guess you folks will have to wait until next year to be surprised.

Anyway, me limo arrived so I said "Ooroo" to me mate and left him standin" there polishin' these 3 gold records on his wall. Industry awards or something like that.

By the way, just kiddin' about the 20 grand mates!

while recording, considering their fans, was apparently of relative unimportance. "It's a very selfish record," says Taylor. "you've got to make music for yourself... or you're not going to be happy."

Perhaps this is what led to their split. Taylor elaborates, "I think Seven And The Ragged Tiger was put together for the 'Duranies'. That's what it was ... an album for the 'Duranies'. I mean ... the album cover looks like a boardgame."

Therefore, a hint of seriousness and sophistication is suggested. Taylor believes the "new" Duran Duran sound will not upset their fans who, after all, sent their previous releases skyrocketing up the charts, worldwide. He believes Duran Duran fans will welcome the change.

"I remember when Bowie recorded Young Americans," he recalls, "and it freaked me out. I couldn't deal with it at all. Now I look back and see what a good move it was - a sophisticated move."

Fervently denying any hint of contriving this "new" sound Taylor, does admit that what was "contrived" is what the fan (or critic) will see and not hear. The packaging of the album stands in stark contrast to other releases. The artwork is colourless and there are no lyrics printed on the liner. "People will now have to listen to the album," he emphasizes.

Taylor maintains that as the band grows older, so do their fans - and that Notorious then is their most important release to date. 8 - RPM - December 13, 1986

The show was carried live across Canada on CBC radio, and co-hosted by the Royal Canadian Air Farce's Roger Abbott and Don Ferguson.


Private radio did compete in several categories, but the only winner was CKO's Peter Varley who won in the category of Best Phone-In Broadcaster.





Police kudos for Norma Gale



"I mean ... they're all important, but this is the one where we either stand or fall." Not that the failure of one album concerns Taylor, who boasts, "We're as successful as any of the groups I ever idolized.

"We've out-sold David Bowie . . . and I'm on the same label . . . so I know," he adds. "And we've actually played to more people than Roxy Music," which is how Taylor judges Duran Duran's success.

"Now, on one hand," he continues, "I'd love to be as successful as Bruce Springsteen, but it's just not going to happen like that. I mean . . . that level of success takes 15 years. I'm at the age now that Bruce was when he released the first song on his new live album (Thunder Road), yet I've been releasing platinum albums for the past 6 years.

"We're looking really good . . . if we stick together. We're in a strange situation right now . . . and it's quite unique for us. We're a trio, but we're not a self-sufficient trio. I'm into collaborations, and now we're flexible enough to add a new drummer or a horn section. Actually," he concludes, "We have the same flexibility as David Bowie."
