

## John Hammond created change in record industry

John Hammond, who became a legend in American musical history, died of natural causes in his Manhattan apartment July 10. He was in his 76th year.

Mr. Hammond was a Vanderbilt, although he refused to follow the family's lifestyle and ideals. His early years were spent as a radio personality and a music critic in New York, branching into the recording industry where he devoted himself to fighting discrimination against the blacks, on records and in clubs.

His career spanned almost 50 years in the recording/entertainment business. During

that time he discovered many of the jazz greats including Billie Holiday, Bessie Smith Lionel Hampton, George Benson and Count Basie to name a few. He also discovered Bob Dylan, Aretha Franklin, Benny Goodman and a host of others including Bruce Springs-

## Cancon CD series released by Capitol

Capitol Records-EMI Canada has launched the Over 60 Minutes With . . . Compact Disc Cancon series. Each of the individual titles will feature over one hour of music from prominent Canadian artists. Those featured include Red Rider, Strange Advance, David Wilcox and Frank Mills.

It was pointed out that the series was designed to give the CD consumer "more musical value for their valued musical dollar."

As it currently stands, none of the tracks included on this series are available on any other compact disc from Capitol-EMI. The specialized CD series makes use of catalogue product only, allowing the compact disc buyers, "the opportunity to enjoy their favourite songs by their favourite artists, finally on CD."

Each compilation compact disc is packaged individually with its own 3 panel/6 page booklet and bottom inlay card. The cover and bottom inlay card of each individual CD will be featured prominently on the specially designed "generic" longbox. It was pointed out that "a 'generic' type of longbox has been created for this series to allow the consumer to immediately identify this product." teen. Mr. Hammond was 60 years old when he discovered and offered Springsteen his first recording contract. Three years later he officially retired from CBS. However, he kept active with his own production company, and still handled the occasional production for CBS.

Mr. Hammond keynoted RPM's Three Days In March (March 27, 1978), and drew one of the largest audiences of the Three Days In March series. This was the first time Canadian audiences had the opportunity to

Both Aldrich and Bone will report jointly to Wright and Doug D'Arcy, President of Chrysalis Records International, who heads a newly created board of the international record company. Aldrich and Bone will both be members of the board of Chrysalis Records International, alongside Roy Eldriged, Managing Director of Chrysalis Records UK; Mike Allen, International Director of Chrysalis Records Inc; and Nigel Butterfield, Financial Director of Chrysalis Group PLC. the overall Chrysalis parent company.

## Whittaker hit packages for both sides of pond

At the conclusion of his successful tour of the U.K. in June, Roger Whittaker's new album, His Finest Collection, made steady gains up the British album charts (No. 15 and No. 8 on the CD charts - week of July 11). In Canada and the U.S. his new album, Best Loved Ballads (via TV by Heartland Music) is now nearing the quarter-million units sold mark.

Whittaker is also hot when it comes to TV. He has a new series of 6 TV specials under the banner of Sing Out, which made its debut in the U.K. July 19. The shows were produced for Ulster Television by John Anderson and features such guests as Carroll Baker, Gloria Gaynor, The New Seekers, George Hamilton IV, Donna, and the African Children's Choir.

Whittaker's new Canadian release, features One Broadway Classic, and One Country Classic from the Best Loved Ballads album - Memory (from Cats), and Make The World Go Away. Release date was set for July 17.

Whittaker's first CD release in Canada, Roger Whittaker - Greatest Hits, will be available this August. meet, listen to and question an industry patriarch of this magnitude. ## Berlin brings back the big band sounds

Berlin, a new uptown Toronto dinner dance club, has introduced what they're billing as "Romantic dining and dancing to the big band sounds of Guido Basso and his orchestra." The launch for this "welcomed" event was Sunday July 12, and it's expected to continue each Sunday.

Although the first-nighters were on the thin side, the enthusiasm was obvious. The age group ranged from the early twenties to the mid-sixties, and Basso and his 12-piece orchestra had something for everyone for the three sets as he delved back into the era of the big bands, heavy on Glenn Miller, and all the way up to Whitney Houston material. Vocals were performed by Rosemary Lynn, who displayed a powerful delivery, despite her small size. Even Basso pleased the audience with his rendition of Spanish Eyes.

The theme was In The Mood, a theme that Basso is quite familiar with. It was in the early '70s when the CBC produced a big band series called In The Mood, and Basso was the Music Director and trumpet soloist. The

show guested some of the greats from the big band era including Tex Beneke, Les Brown, Woody Herman, Duke Ellington, Count Basie, and more.

David Miranda, one of the owners of Berlin, a pop-oriented club through the week is convinced that his Sunday evening big band showcase will be as successful as the club's pop nights, which run Monday through Saturday. "There's a need for this type of dining and dancing in Toronto," said Miranda. "The area is perfectly situated to attract people from downtown, the suburbs and out of town. The food is great, the setting is soft, and where can you get this type of entertainment?"

He was obviously excited by the dance floor that was filling up with dancers, and the requests that were being given to Basso.

## Yorkville takes trip back with Spirit Of The '60s

While Toronto cooked under record high temperatures during its latest heat wave, the action was hottest on the city's historic Yorkville Avenue (July 12) for a special fund raising event for the Variety Club. Flying the banner Spirit Of The '60s - A Yorkville Celebration, the event was held by the Bloor-Yorkville Business Improvement Area in association with CKEY and Labatt's, and highlighted a return to the street's roots during the latter '60s. As early as 1965 the street became a gathering place for folk, blues, country and rock musicians, as well as hippies.

The day's events were kicked off by CKEY on-air personality John Rode and Toronto Mayor Art Eggleton. Performing acts included Brent Titcomb, Vicki Taylor, Passing Fancy, Cathy Young, Keith McKie (of Kensington Market), The Ugly Ducklings, Dede Higgins, The Stitch In Tyme, The Last Words, plus Robbie Lane & The Disciples to name a few.

Lane also hosted the event along with Don Francks and Don Cullen. Between shows there were auctions, of articles donated by the local businesses, with sales going to the Variety Club.

Michelle Triebsch of Michelle's Hair Design, is credited with having come up with the idea. She came to Canada from Italy in 1968 and set up her business in the area.

"I made a lot of friends at that time and that's very important when you're in a new country," she said. "I'm still friends with a lot of those people today."

She explained that the Bloor-Yorkville Business Improvement Area was formed in 1984, and one of their mandates was to beautify and promote the area. "We were having a meeting about what we could do for Yorkville," she told RPM. "I thought about Yorkville in the '60s and how people still talk about it today. It was known for its music and poetry, and it was during this meeting when I came up with the idea."

A committee was formed, and Triebsch, who was a member, revealed the project was four to five months in the making and that all those involved contributed their services voluntarily. "We felt it would be a good idea to do something for the Variety Club," she said, "The event was a total success. There were a lot of people who hadn't seen one another for several years. There were even people dancing in the street. We hope to do this again next year."

The stage itself, donated by Labatt's, was set up on a parking lot, which was jammed for the performing acts. Between shows, many people walked the avenue to see how it has changed since the '60s.

During the early evening, the parking lot became so filled that, at times, the overflow went onto the street where many were already sitting on the sidewalks, as it was during Yorkville's heyday.

It was revealed at press time almost \$20,000 was raised for the Variety Club.

## Broken English single released by Capitol-EMI

Capitol Records-EMI of Canada has released the 7" and 12" single of Comin' On Strong by Broken English, a popular U.K. trio.

The band, comprising Steve Elson (lead vocals and guitar) and Jamie Moses and Alan Coates, both of whom play lead guitar, were signed to the EMI U.K. label early in 1987.

Interestingly, the band signed a "singles only" deal with EMI, on the strength of playing three live sessions for Radio 1 in the U.K. However, now that the single has broken into the Top 20 in the U.K. the band are now in the studio recording a full album for the label.

U.K. critics were quick to pick up on the "this sounds like . . ." vocals guessing game, resulting in a teaser with a no-name label and with the added instructions that "This record is to be scrapped." The single was shipped in a plain sleeve to the media and sales accounts, obviously creating interest in the band, which was followed up (July 13) with the commercommercial single formats.

## Florio and Martin join Falcon Productions

Jim Martin who, for several years, was road manager for The Guess Who and Burton Cummings, has teamed with the Torontobased Falcon Productions to manage Tembo recording artist Louisa Florio. Martin's career most recently, includes the putting together of the career of Capitol's Partland Brothers, currently climbing the charts in Canada and the U.S.

Florio, who has been nominated in the category of Rising Star Female Artist in the Toronto Music Awards, will be releasing her

The album was produced by Harry Hinde, and qualifies as 4-parts Cancon. Florio is just coming down the charts with The Boy I'm Going To Marry, which had much success.

Almost all the winners at this year's CASBY awards ceremonies were members of CAPAC – but that's to be expected, since nearly all the nominees were CAPAC members as well!



## The Long Riders know it's going to be tough

They've been around for quite a long time, but it was only after their debut release, The State Of Our Union when The Long Riders began to achieve the recognition due them for their efforts and perseverence. They were placed into the roots rock movement, along with Los Lobos, Rank & File, Lone Justice and The Del Fuegos; now that movement has been declared "dead", The Long Riders can only stand on their own musical merit.

Guitarist and frontman for the band, Sid Griffin, explains that history has proven movements which have merely served as a springboard for great commercial success: out of the "Mersey Beat" came the Beatles,



from "Mod" came the Who, from "Punk" came the Clash (or the Sex Pistols), and more recently, out of the "New Wave" movement came the Police.

Griffin hopes that by writing quality material, often compared to the likes of Bob Dylan and Tom Petty, by not having "a silly haircut" or making "a dumb statement" on television, his band will emerge out of the ashes of the "roots rock" era of music and into the commercial mainstream. "Without having to 'sell out'," he says. "Whatever that is."

He adds, "I never considered us standard bearers of the roots rock movement any more than I consider us supporters of Oliver North or Robert MacFarlane. So," he continues, "I don't really know or care that much about the roots rock movement. I mean ... do I like what's called 'roots rock' music? Sure . . . but I hardly feel that I'm the caretaker, or that the band is the caretaker of that sound.

"We're not here to flog a dead horse. It's enough of a chore to try and get people to buy our records, much less worry about them buying everybody else's. I love Doc Watson and Hank Williams, but I can't tell everybody to listen to them just because I do."

The band, currently touring in support of their new album, Two Fisted Tales, are one of the relatively few U.S. acts with a strong political stance, which is downplayed with a fervour by Griffin.

"I don't think we're a political band any more than we're a 'roots rock' band," he states. "Also, I would say that a lot of people don't understand what the hell I'm singing

It's going to be a long hard summer, at least in the hard rock department of WEA. With new releases by



Paul Simon's concerts were an unqualified success, with Paul pausing long enough to pick up a world-first 5 times Platinum award from WEA Canada. CBS Canada moved 120 of their marketing, sales, promotion and finance staff by rail and air from across Canada, and had taken over the complete location for a four-day CBS "energizer course".

Once again, this year, Bill Bannon was responsible for all the physical logistics: getting the site, and making sure that rooms were available for breakout meetings, meals and sleep, although the latter appeared to be secondary. He was also responsible for transportation.


## Savannah signs deal with Benelux - RCA/Ariola

about anyway . . . and that's fine. We like to set up the lyrics so that a young person, or for that matter an old person, can imitate James Brown or Mick Jagger and dance around the room and play air guitar to our records.

"If they want to go a little deeper and see if there's anything else there, they can do so. But I don't want to make it a history lesson or a sociology lesson forced down their throats every time they play a Long Riders record. Our songs are a bit of a Trojan Horse: they're just wonderful songs and if someone wants to get a little glimpse of my world view, they can dig deeper into the lyrics. But that's not something that necessarily has to be done."

Critics have consistantly pointed to such tracks as Gunslinger Man and Harriet Tubman as outstanding, for their lyrical content, since the album has been released. Although very grateful, Griffin admits reviews won't sell the band's album, and views them as "a foot in the door" to the music industry.

"I'm not knocking it," he stresses, "because we've had some great reviews in the past. But I want people to remember gearing your music at the critics is equally as ridiculous as gearing it because you think it's going to sell.

"I think the real artists in this world do their music or their sculpturing or their painting the way they want it to be and just hope and pray that someone will see some of their spirit, some of their soul, in their art and enjoy it for that, as opposed to trying to please everybody. You have to please yourself," Griffin concludes. "Just do what you want to do and what feels right and true in your heart, and hope that you find a marketplace."

The Long Riders' only Canadian appearance is in Toronto where they'll open for Billy Bragg, on July 30 at The Concert Hall. The remaining members of the quartet are Gred Sowders (drums), Stephen McCarthy (guitars), and Tom Stevens (bass), the latter pair also handle vocal assignments.
