



WEA's phasing out of 7" singles Okay by radio

Stan Kulin. President of WEA Music Canada points out that contrary to what some, in the

industry, believe, WEA did not just arbitrarily come to the conclusion they were going to drop the mailing of the 7' vinyl single to radio. "We did a mailing to all the radio stations in Canada," says Kulin, "advising them οf OHE intention to service

them with CD only as of August 15th. We've been servicing vinyl with CD in tandem for several months . . . and we received only 12 negatives from the more than 600 radio stations we contacted."

Kulin points out however, that "The negatives weren't negatives toward the idea of phasing out the 7", rather that they thought our move was great but could we wait for another month or two until they got a CD player. So, what we've done is put them in contact with a couple of manufacturers of CD players, who, I believe are prepared to supply CD players to these radio stations on fairly good terms."

It's interesting to note that sales of the 7" vinyl configuration peaked in 1979 and have declined each year, with last year being one of the most disastrous. So now, ten years later, WEA, on August 15th will have phased out vinyl singles to radio completely.

There has been concern expressed by some in the industry with regard to a time delay in servicing CD compilations as opposed to the 7" singles. Says Kulin, "We find that we can normally get our CD compilation out on a more timely basis than we can on vinyl." He continues with, "If you read some of the comments, you would think that everytime we shipped a vinyl single, we were matching the U.S. release date, which really isn't true. The turnaround time we are finding on CDs, and I have to compliment Isadore (Philosophe) and Cinram on this, is as quick as it is on vinyl."

Insofar as a waiting period is concerned," Kulin retorts with, "We always had to wait. We do weekly mailings. We're

mailing the CD weekly . . . and we're mailing the vinyl weekly . . . and there were many instances in the past, and, remember, I've been with a number of record companies, where they often damaged a part on a particular vinyl single, so it didn't ship that week . . . it shipped a week after. So, nothing has really changed. In fact, as the demand for vinyl drops and as the factories pay less and less attention to vinyl, the turnaround time on the CD will be much quicker than on the vinyl."

Kulin also pointed up the fact "there's a cost saving factor insofar as the CD compilation is concerned. If there are seven or eight singles (tracks) on one CD, it stands to reason the overall cost to the record company would be cheaper as opposed to the seven or eight individual vinyl singles."

Kulin stresses, however, "We didn't do it for cost reasons . . . we did it for the improved sound and convenience, and looking ahead to a time when there won't be vinyl and I think that will be fairly soon. You're not going to keep a factory open just to satisfy the need to service radio stations with 7" vinyl singles."

It's expected that by the end of the year, most record companies, major and independent, will be on track with CD single compilations. Kulin doesn't see too much of a future in Canada for the CD single and as far as the cassette single is concerned. "We'll be into it . . . on our terms," he says, "and that is, if you're only going to be putting the hits out on cassette singles than you should be making money on them.

Multi-million \$ project set to roll for Supercorp

North America's jingle king, the colourful and often controversial Syd Kessler, was front and centre (July 25) at a ribbon-cutting ceremony for a multi-million dollar expansion to his entertainment complex. Kessler heads up the Powerful Supercorp Entertainment, a partnership deal with Labatt Breweries. Labatt's are also partners with another entertainment giant, Concert Productions International (CPI), which makes the Toronto-based brewery a powerhouse in the North American entertainment industry.

But this was Kessler's day as he, his longtime friend and Chief Operating Officer of Supercorp, Salim Sachedina, and Sid Oland, President of Labatt's, cut the ribbon on the site of the intended new \$22 million audio-video recording complex.

The seven-story complex will encompass the present location, without disturbing its operation, and will be called the Supercorp Arts & Entertainment Centre, and should be completed within eighteen months. "This centre will be the biggest of its kind in North America," boasts Kessler, "a giant step for Canadian talent." The centre, which will also house Partners Film Co., in which Supercorp holds a 50 percent interest, will service the music, film, TV and advertising industries. Included will be five new state-ofthe-art post-audio and music recording studios

Guilbert and Wells named in A&M moves

Joe Summers, Senior Vice President and General Manager of A&M Records Canada, has announced the appointments of J.P. Guilbert and Randy Wells to the positions of Vice Presidents of Artist Development and Promotion respectively.

Wells, who will primarily be responsible for more directly leading the A&M promotion team at radio, has been with the company for 15 years, serving in Winnipeg, Calgary and Toronto. Prior to this new appointment, Wells was National Promotion Manager, a position he has held for the past five years.

Guilbert, who has been with A&M for more than 15 years, will, in his new capacity, direct the company's A&M promotional efforts in music videos, dance and country, along with alternative and special projects.

In making the above announcements Summers said the "well-deserved promotions were a part of A&M's redefinition of position and responsibilities in the evolving marketplace."

Stones return to Toronto for Skydome Dec. 3 show

Joe Owens of Concert Productions International, has announced (July 26) that due to the "continued demand" for tickets, The Rolling Stones will return to Toronto with their Steel Wheels Tour for a Skydome date, Dec. 3. Tickets, priced at \$32.50 will be limited to six per purchase.

In an unusual move, Skydome will open 16 ticket windows for first day cash sales only (July 29). Labatt's Blue is presenting the Canadian portion of the Steel Wheels tour. and, as Jay Whiteside, Director of National Promotions for Labatt Breweries of Canada. explains, "The additional tour date at Skydome will give Labatt's a further opportunity to extend our consumer promotions and activities."

The Stones', two Toronto dates, Sept. 3 and 4, at Exhibition Stadium, were sold out shortly after tickets went on sale. They are touring in support of their upcoming Columbia album, Steel Wheels. It's expected the band will play to nearly three million fans on this Canada/U.S. tour.

A Japanese firm has reportedly bought a 40 percent share of a major independent . . . and there are also rumours that another major independent may soon be taken over "by a Goofy!" whatever that means . . . and yet more news of another major independent being baited. Stay tuned! (EC: Is this the year of the knives . . . or hatchets!)

Take DAT and Dat and Dat! Digital Audio Tape (DAT), the sleeping giant, is showing signs of getting ready to bash the compact disc market. That's all the consumers need, more confusion as to what hardware to buy. But the DAT people have apparently seen the light and are ready now to play ball with the recording industry. To add even more confusion as to what direction to go as far as hardware is concerned, the owner of a couple of Vancouver-area radio stations told me he has equipped his stations with the latest in DAT equipment . . . and he swears by the sound, which he says is an improvement over CDs . . . and so the battle grows interesting!

Talk about musical chairs . . . there hasn't been this much excitement in Toronto radio since the granting of a Sunrise to Sunset licence to CHUM AM, back when Stan Klees began his "talk, talk talk" career with the medicine man, known to some as "The Rock". The new PD at Q107 is Gary Aube, who comes from 54 Rock in Ottawa. His new morning personality, Brother Jake, has just arrived from 97-KISS Winnipeg, and he brought along his morning operator, Jeff Allan. That's not all . . . there are two new on-air personalities at Q107: John Bird, formerly of Q107, but who arrives back in Toronto from 97-KISS in Winnipeg, and Eric "Too Tall' Westin, who did the afternoon drive at The FOX in Vancouver, and who has also been on the air at K-97 Edmonton and O-94 in Winnipeg. The problem is . . . someone, or two or three, has to go, so the new ones can be squeezed in . . . and what happened to Marty Forbes, who left CHUM AM a couple of weeks ago . . . you might be asking? I know of one Toronto daily snoop, who picks up a lot of information from this column. He's been seen dashing into Sam's one week and A&A the next week to get his copy! 



but this time at the SkyDome . . . but no question period, but I knew Joe's answer to any questions, had they been allowed, would 'no comment' anyway. It took me thirty minutes to drive to the SkyDome, fifteen minutes to park . . . a further thirtyfive minutes to wait for the announcement, but the sandwiches and the beer were excellent, another twenty minutes of socializing with people I had socialized with at a press conference the previous day, and another fifteen minutes to drive back to the office. I was in a hurry, obviously, to see if CPI had FAXed me a press release on the announcement, which they usually do. (EC: But think of the social aspect, mixing with your peers, plus the free beer!)

The Big Valley was surprised? What a performance that must have been by George Fox at the Big Valley Jamboree last week. Patrick Davitt, who writes for the Regina Leader-Post, and who had never seen George before (it was George's first time in Saskatchewan), wrote that his performance "should go down as the pleasant surprise of the Big Valley Jamboree." That's not all, Davitt and the 15,000 or so country fans sat through an hour-long, 15 song set the scribe described as "a masterpiece of planning, pacing and performance." And there's more . . . Davitt capped his review with "One look at the prolonged standing ovation (amazing in that withering heat) should have been enough to convince any doubters that Fox had touched all those fortunate or wise enough to have been on hand." How's that from a prairie reviewer? (EC: Now, if we only had music critics like that in Vancouver and Toronto!)

Wake up and smell the roses? Remember, back, a few years, when rock 'n' roll was . . . ROCK 'N' ROLL? There were no brewery or soft drink sponsors. Ad agencies were scared to death to suggest anything that would offend the "establishment", and that's what rock 'n' roll was built on, a rebellous spirit . . . to hell with the establishment! My . . . how times have changed. There's actually very little left to rock 'n' roll. It has become so homogenized and subsidized, it doesn't mean that much anymore, and radio reflects the dismal replacement to what used to be exciting music. Perhaps we've grown so fat and complacent, that's all we can do . . . is smell the roses! (EC: That's if someone provides them . . . !)



Hinojosa shines as true symbol of Americana

Definitely no rookie by industry standards, beginning her recording career fifteen odd years ago, Tish Hinojosa (pronounced Ee-no-hoe-sah) has finally seen the release of her first full-length album. Proud of both her Mexican and American roots, a fall tour, tentatively slated for September, will afford her the opportunity to deliver her message of bi-culturalism in person.

"It was a lucky thing . . . and a timing thing," says Hinojosa of the circumstances leading to her deal with A&M. "At that time I was really believing that it was going to be straight country music that was going to be my shot, even though I was really getting frustrated by the Nashville country music scene

"I was starting to write things that were hitting closer to home for me culturally

speaking and I was writing more Spanish," she relates. "It was a lucky thing that I chose to do a set of my own material," she says of the night A&M's Patrick Clifford heard her at a Nashville showcase. "That was the kind of Americana that they were talking about, so, therefore, it was a good idea for both of us."

The Americana to which Hinojosa refers is A&M's new series for which Homeland, her release, is the debut. "I think the idea is trying to keep America from being so homogenized," she explains. "Generally, everybody wants to be just plain old homogenized American, no matter what your background was, and the Americana series is artists that hold us to our roots a little bit.

"I felt like I was out of place so many times because I did stick to my culture," she relates. "I've always felt there was a place for this, even though Nashville didn't understand it. I knew there was a place and I really didn't want to sell out to Nashville."

For Hinojosa, bi-culturalism is a fine line to be tread with respect for both sides. The daughter of illegal Mexican immigrants who became American citizens, Hinojosa was raised to view her Mexican roots and her American cultural surroundings as distinct entities to be cherised and preserved, compatible yet individual.

"Down in south Texas or in the southwestern states they have what they call Chicano music or Tex-Mex. They call that blend of the cultures and I don't see that as o." To Hinojosa, the images of Tex-Mex demand that one's Mexican heritage be seen in caricature as a novelty, rather than with the dignity it deserves. "That's fine if somebody's got that in their blood and wants to do that," she qualifies, "but I don't think that not doing that makes me more of a brown on the outside, white on the inside kind of person. I write and sing in respect to both cultures."

Hinojosa regretfully confesses that Latin culture stereotypes have proven self-perpetuating, a situation she aims to improve. "It seems that in the Latin world people still buy albums if they see the low-cleavaged sexy girl on the front cover and I want to show them that it doesn't have to be that way. I think their hearts go deeper," she declares. I hope, she states, that "they see in here, 'We can just be as we are and be accepted.""

From the standpoint of music as an educator, Hinojosa thus hopes to educate not only white America to the concerns of brown America, but also to show those who share her ancestry how they may be submerging their true entities. Furthermore, she stresses, "my whole approach is subtle . . . I don't ever see a reason to have to be preachy about things, but a lot of things need to be said." For this reason, her lyrics take an observational, not directional, stance, an approach she believes will make her message an easier pill to swallow.

Hinojosa believes her music will be able to reach both cultures effectively and is thrilled by the marketing approach A&M has taken internationally. In Norway, Love Is On Our Side has been taken as the single, while A&M Canada, she perceives, sees her more as a country artist. "In America," she comments, "That could bind me a little bit because of what country music is there still, but here it's a whole different thing . . in Nashville, if my background was going to play any part at all it would definitely play the part of the colourful caricature.

"In the U.S.A., it's been a song called Let Me Remember," which Hinojosa describes as more pop-oriented. She does not see it as a cultural compromise "if I've got to lean a little bit over and make myself more white to draw in a white Anglo-American audience, because once they get in, I'm showing them the true heart of the thing," as she sees the album, not any particular song, as the real focus of consumer interest.

Hinojosa doesn't think that being white on vinyl will alienate Latin audiences. As she sees it, although "they want to see that their interest is there, they definitely want the music to sound American."

A&M could not have found a better project to initiate its new series. An intelligent, thoughtful songwriter with a captivating voice, in the American melting pot, it will be difficult to find another artist so proud of her roots and so completely a symbol of Americana.

Sales of vinyl declining since 1981 - Robertson

The vinyl controversy continues to rage with some journalists suggesting that the recording industry is mounting a campaign to get rid of vinyl. Brian Robertson, President of the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) has taken a few of these writers to task, in particular Gerald Levitch who was quite critical of record companies in his July 1989 article in Video Magazine, which he titled, The Death Of Vinyl'', sub-headed, "Record companies want to make us CD converts by phasing out good old LPs."

"What's happening," says Robertson, referring to the state of vinyl in Canada, "is that we basically have an outdated formula which has reached the end of the line . . . and that's the bottom line."

Robertson goes on to point out, "When you compare the technology of vinyl, which is pretty primitive, to a laser beam reading a digital signal, which is what CDs are, there has been a massive leap in technology. Vinyl has been wonderful for the industry, but it's reached the end of the road."

He stresses that "Record companies aren't killing vinyl, they are responding to customer demands," and refers back to industry statistics to punch home his point. "Vinyl album sales peaked in 1981," he reveals, "That year there were 54.4 million units sold. By 1985 . . . and remember CDs hadn't arrived yet and weren't a factor, vinyl album sales were down to 25.5 million units sold, that's more than a 60 percent drop. On the other hand, there were 14.8 million cassette units sold in 1981 and in 1985 that figure jumped to 41 million . . . which shows customer preference and you can't blame compact discs for that. The record buyer is making the choice on format. That whole cassette increase was obviously fueled by the

Walkman technology."

However, as Levitch points out in his article, "The issue is choice, which the average Canadian record buyer is rapidly losing." He goes on to suggest that "The record industry would rather sell you a tape or a high-profit-margin CD (the manufacturing cost of a domestically produced CD is about \$1; the typical price is nearly \$20)," continuing with, "The profits on CDs are so high that the record industry would rather lose vinyl sales by strangling the supply, than risk the continuing survival of a cheap, low-profit, competing medium."

Says Robertson, "His (Levitch) estimate of the manufacturing cost of a domestically-produced CD is wildly inaccurate and his assertion that the industry is trading high profits on CDs for low margin vinyl recordings would be laughable if it were not so sadly misconceived. The reality is that trade margins on cassettes are higher than compact discs."

Although the growth of CD software is apparent, not so with the hardware, which only enjoys about 10 percent penetration in Canada and only 18 percent in the U.S. As Robertson suggests, "There's a little confusion among consumers as to the type of hardware they should buy . . . they've heard about the Digital Audio Tape (DAT) and CDV, but with the lower prices for CD players, I believe, that in a year, there will really be a big difference in the penetration factor . . . CD's are here to stay for a very long time."

In conclusion, and in further answer to Levitch's article, Robertson suggests, "It is a transition period for our industry . . . but it is

one that is driven by the record buyer...not as Mr. Levitch asserts, the record companies."

Seals And Crofts set for The Peace Concert Tour

Seals and Crofts, the popular seventies duo, have come out of retirement to "promote the issues and ideals of peace," through The Peace Concert Tour, which will play Toronto's Roy Thomson Hall Aug. 17. Doug Cameron, known for his critically acclaimed Mona And The Children single and video, will tour as special guest. It was Seals and Crofts who helped Cameron and producer Jack Lenz record the Mona single.

Both members of the Baha'i faith, Seals and Crofts retired in 1979 after much success on the charts, particularly with Diamond Girl, which enjoyed a long run on the RPM 100. Their reasons for retiring were twofold, one was to spend more time with their families and the second, because music took what they describe as "a turn for the heavier dance style," they believed their "intricate melodies, thoughtful lyrics and weaving harmonies got lost in the clatter."

Seals moved to Costa Rica where he has a coffee farm, and Crofts, who lived for some time in Mexico and Australia, now lives in Nashville. They were invited to return to Canada by Water Music, a new record label. They are promoting The Promise Of World Peace, a statement on peace, that has been sent to all world leaders.

Jamaica setting for first Radio Sunsplash

Lee Marshall, evening on-air personality at Toronto's CKFM and Robert Payne, former longtime CKEY morning news personality and current Toronto Sun columnist, are currently organizing Radio Sunsplash, the first holiday/conference for Canadian broadcasters ever held abroad. The setting will be a luxury villa near Montego Bay in Jamaica from November 4 through 11.

"The idea is for on-air folk and friends to be pampered at a luxury villa for a week, and, at the same time, rub shoulders with some top people in the field," Marshall explains, "and better still, it's tax deductible."

A number of top-calibre broadcast veterans are already committed, including John Stall, CFRB's ACTRA winner as Best Interviewer On Private Radio; Erin Davis, CHFI morning co-host and news veteran; and Bob Bowland, owner/manager of CKLP Parry Sound.

Marshall and Payne are negotiating with other industry notables with "a view to rounding out this impressive list of resource people," says Payne.

Workshops will focus on issues regarded crucial in commercial radio now and for the '90s: the ingredients of a successful morning show; the role of news and opinion in today's market; cracking the commercial voice-over market; the expanding role of women in what has been largely a male-dominated industry; getting the most from an interview subject;

and carving a comfortable niche in smaller markets.

"We're combining the need for improved communication within the radio industry with Canadians' natural desire to go south when the wind blows cold," offers Payne, who is well-versed on Jamaican villa holidays. "A lot of our business will be done around the pool . . . very informally, and likely with a glass of rum punch within reach."

Attendance will be limited to about fifty delegates, but as Marshall explains, "Spouses and friends are welcome . . . and the week will allow plenty of free time for participants to do as they please." Plans also call for a visit to JBC, Jamaica's national broadcasting system.



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

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
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
