Thompson packages roster for MIDEM trip

Steve Thomson, President of the Toronto-based Backstage Productions celebrates his tenth year at MIDEM with one of the largest and most complete packages of productions in the history of Trilogy Records, the company's label division.

Besides his catalogue, Thomson will be shopping three new offerings: a new Jannetta album titled Mark On My Heart, Cop To Con, an album by Swedish rockers Bai Bang, and what Thomson describes as "a very special recording" by Kimberley Richards titled Something Special.

The Jannetta album, which is tagged a "pop/dance" release, was produced by Ross Munro and Todd Booth with the added talent of Peter Mann of Nylons' fame. "This is by far a major step for Jannetta" says Thomson. Initial reaction from international distributors has been encouraging. The album will be released in Canada in February to be supported by a nationwide tour. A March 21st release date has been set for Japan on the Teichiku label with subsequent releases in Scandinavia, France and Korea.

Thomson has already softened up

Frost exits Toronto's Q107 for Intreprid position

Andy Frost, who left his position as Program Director of Toronto's Q107 in September of last year, has joined Intreprid Records, a Toronto independent label. Frost's duties will be that of radio consultant and promotions expert. His first project will be with The Bookroom. Tears In The River, to be released Jan. 18, is the first single taken from their album Fame And Fortune.

Frost, a native of Winnipeg, gained a foot-hold in the broadcast industry early in his life and was in on the beginning of CITI-FM where he held the position of Music Director. He moved to Toronto where he became associated with Q107 and took on the duties of Program Director. Frost has a wide and varied knowledge of both the record and broadcast industries.

The Intreprid label is distributed in Canada by Capitol Records.

MIDEM delegates with advance product by Bai Bang. He expects to announce a worldwide release after final meetings at MIDEM. Thomson describes the Swedish band's music as having a "hard edge and incredibly catchy." The album was released in Canada earlier this month.

Thomson brings Trilogy's brand of country to MIDEM this year with the Kimberley Richards album, which was produced by well-known country writer/producer J.K. Gulley. Guesting on the album are John Allen Cameron, Kelita and Liona Boyd. As well, Boyd wrote two songs for the album and provides accompaniment for Richards' vocal styling. Included on the album is the Richards/Gulley duet, We Can Dream, which garnered much chart action in Canada last year.

Kollar resigns top post at BMG Music Canada

A press release dated January 11, 1991 from BMG Music Canada's press/publicity department, advised that BMG International President and CEO Rudi Gassner had announced "the resignation of Mr. Donald Kollar, President and General Manager, BMG Music Canada, Inc., effective immediately."

Although there has been nothing officially reported, Mr. Kollar's replacement, Bob Jamieson, is apparently already in place. An official announcement is expected shortly.

Mr. Kollar was widely respected in the industry. He joined BMG in 1979 after a distinguished career with WEA Music Canada. He made many changes as head of BMG's Canadian operation, overseeing the difficult move of head offices from Markham, Ontario into the core of Toronto.

It is the general belief in industry circles that in view of Mr. Kollar's expertise in finance, since taking over the helm of BMG Music Canada, he contributed enormously to putting the company on a stable and financially-sound footing.

Mr. Kollar will be working with his replacement over the next few weeks on a consultative basis.

PolyGram releases Medley debut in other territories

Sue Medley's self-titled debut album has received much praise since its release in May, 1990, including Best Debut Recording and Female Vocalist Of The Year at Canada's West Coast Music Awards, and gained her the opportunity to open for Bob Dylan on the Canadian leg of his international tour. Now PolyGram is hoping that the enthusiasm will run over into three new territories, the U.S., U.K. and Germany.

The interest that she has generated has left Medley breathless and very busy: "I was excited by the whole thing when the album was released," she says. "But I didn't think that people would respond to us as strongly as they have." And of her tour with Dylan she states that the experience was the "highlight of the year."

The first single has already been released in the U.S., U.K. and Germany.

BMG Music Canada sets Cancon as priority

With only a couple of weeks into the new year, BMG Music Canada has announced an aggressive campaign for the coming year with regard to its domestic artist roster.

David Bendeth, Vice President of A&R, has been working for several months on the roster, which he believes is ready for an assault on international markets. "Although we are still a young company and our acts are young," says Bendeth, "I feel very lucky to be working with such a talented roster of artists and songwriters. The feeling at BMG is that these artists will play a very big part in the overall representation of international artists in Canada."

The Canadian operation has been closely watched by Heinz Henn, Senior Vice President of International A&R/Marketing, who points out that "Within less than three years, BMG Canada has developed from being a company mainly focused on selling repertoire for themselves... but also exports their artists around the world very successfully." He concludes with, "Today, Canadian product represents a major force in BMG's Worldwide artist roster."

Two acts in particular, Sheree and Big House, have been released on the RCA label in the U.S., prompting RCA President Joe Galante to comment, "Both of these acts represent a very fresh attitude, musically and lyrically. Sheree's lyrics and Big House's sound are like no other acts out there right now. We look forward to a bright future for these acts at RCA U.S. in 1991.

Besides Sheree and Big House, BMG Music Canada's roster comprises Crash Test Dummies; Prairie Oyster, the first Canadian country act released by RCA Nashville in more than twenty-five years; Cowboy Junkies, already a recognized act in the U.S.; The Jeff Healey Band, an established Arista act worldwide; and the latest signing Oui, 3, a female dance group out of Toronto.

Artists band together in bid for peace in the Gulf

Artists in the music industry have decided to band together to do a remake of John Lennon's "Give Peace A Chance" which will be broadcast to Canadian radio stations by Seltech Broadcasting Systems. A video has also been made to accompany the song.


Satellite delivery of the song began January 15, the date of the UN deadline for Iraq to pull out of Kuwait, and continued through to the

Star's Voisine gets quick start with English debut

Roch Voisine, the New Brunswicker who became a sensation throughout Canada and Europe, has recently released his self-titled English debut in Canada and internationally on Quebec label, Star Records.

The album features the hit Helene, which was a smash in Canada and in Europe, selling over two million copies worldwide.

Voisine got his start in 1989 when he first hit the Canadian music scene with an English version of Helene. One year later it was number one in France, a position he retained for 50 weeks. Further success was seen with tracks Pourtant and Avant De Partir. He followed up his chart success with a tour of France, never playing to crowds of less than 5,000.

Voisine's talent has often been recognized; In 1990 he won three honours at Quebec's version of the Grammy's, the ADISQ awards, was presented Felix statues for Top LP Sales in Quebec, Best Representing Quebec Internationally and the Diamond Disc, an award jointly sponsored by ADISQ and the French SPPF. In previous years Voisine also took home the Felix for Best Pop-Rock Album Of The Year, Best Newcomer and Best Song.

The current single from the album, A Fishing Day, seems to be following in the same successful footseps as Helene. It's has established itself as a powerful crossover track and is currently maintaining positions on three of RPM's charts; A/C, Hits Tracks and Country Tracks.





Latent releases Bottomley solo debut with Library

Since the age of fifteen, John Bottomley has been heavily involved in the music scene. For nine years starting in 1981, he and brother Chris formed Tulpa, and now Bottomley is pursuing a solo career. In September Bottomley released his debut, Library Of The Sun, on BMG distributed Latent Records.

Born in Toronto, Bottomley spent his childhood years at different points across the globe. With his father being "navy brass" he and his family were always on the move, settling every three years in such places as Germany, England and various spots in their native Canada.

"It was a great way to grow up, " says Bottomley, who remarks that it was always hard leaving countless friends behind. "You never like doing that, but you get used to it."

Bottomley credits his nomadic upbringing with his need to always be on the move, if only in his day-to-day activities, his songwriting and desire to meet new people. These are qualities which have kept his interest and ambition levels high.

Ten years ago, Bottomley returned to Toronto because "It's a great place to be as a musician, and as a Canadian musician the only place to be."

Tulpa's nine year lifespan saw some solid recognition in Canada and in Europe, and sales from each of the two albums put out by the band exceeded two thousand. Eventually the member's individual musical goals started differing, so Tulpa split and Bottomley began concentrat-

"More concentration on adult market" - Cameron

Although the youth market still commands the sales picture of the overall recording industry, there is an obvious move being made by both the manufacturers and retailers to bring the adult market more into focus. There has been, and obviously will continue to be, a strong sales base for the youth market, but that "untapped" adult market will be a priority.

Deane Cameron, President of Capitol Records-EMI Canada, reveals that "One of the ironies of the nineties is that our fortunes came basically in the form of rap artists... music that perhaps a few years ago in this country might have been considered having nothing more than a 'niche' market. By Christmas we had sold well over a million units of M.C. Hammer and Vanilla Ice. That certainly shows the teen and the youth markets are prepared to buy when they hear something that turns them around."

Cameron is hopeful that this kind of buying habit will continue in 1991, and again contribute to a financially successful year. The calendar year of 1990 (Capitol's financial year ends March 31st), chalked up "the highest sales we've ever seen," says Cameron which follows the record year of 1989, "giving us two banner years in a row."

As far as 1991 is concerned, "We're going to be cautious, just like everyone else," says Cameron, continuing with, "I think it's going to be the year of the clever marketing company. We're going to have to give value for money to the public. We are not recession proof. We are going to have to look into our catalogues . . . exploit our greatest hits packages . . . the richness of our catalogue. We are going to have to do pre-packs and help the retailers give value for money to the public. That doesn't mean giving it all away cheaply. We are going to have to look into our budget and mid-price catalogues and come up with themes and really be clever marketers."

Cameron is critical of the methodolgy used in the past where the reliance was "getting a record on the radio and cranking up the profile as high as possible hoping it will result in an awareness which will lead to a spill-out of product. Well," says Cameron, "I think now we are going

to have to be out there and dig and work with the retailer."

It's obvious labels are going to be more discreet about new signings this year. As Cameron points out, "Even in America... the old theory of a label putting up 15 or 20 new acts in a year and putting half a million dollars into each of them and another half a million dollars into marketing... I don't think that kind of gamble is going to be there next year." However, as he points out, "On the one hand, this kind of approach might have some benefits... for us to be more focussed. Sometimes, whether we want to admit it or not, we are a business that too often puts out product and just hopes for the best to happen. I think we're going to have to see a little more focus."

Cameron is also concerned that the record industry in North America doesn't "market to the adult audience . . . right from retail to the manufacturer's guilt of not signing enough adult artists," and of not promoting enough adult artists. Cameron suggests that if the industry continues to rely soley on the youth market, "we could be in trouble," suggesting that "if we are going to work with the retailers to try and get the adult market, we're going to have to be clever and we are really going to have to work with our catalogue."

Summing up the past year, Cameron is proud of the changes the company went through, particularly with regard to the black market. "We made a commitment to black music, both domestically and internationally. We led the industry there by putting Ron Robles in full time to look after that market. We saw an expansion in our American black music sales (MC Hammer's album, Please Hammer Don't Hurt 'Em, topped the RPM 100 on Aug. 18/90, a position he held for three weeks), as well as with MCJ and Cool G and Simply Majestic here."

Capitol also concentrated on its country roster, which Cameron says "We are really going to watch closely this year. He concludes with "We are trying to split out our marketing and spread ourselves into different markets... but watch what we do with catalogue and greatest hits packages."

ing on his solo material.

He was keen to pursue a more streamlined form of music, primarily acoustic with minimum embellishments, and that is what he produced with Library Of The Sun. "Tulpa was a very 'parts' oriented. You couldn't play any of the tunes alone, and that's what I like to do, to sit down play a song and dress it up accordingly."

Originally released independently in February of 1990 on Bottomley's own Crane Bag Records, the bulk of Library Of The Sun was recorded at Grant Avenue Studios in Hamilton. Bottomley enlisted the help of Crash Vegas bassist Jocelyne Lanois and violinist Hugh Marsh as well as the staple Bottomley band consisting of guitarist George Guerra, drummer Mike Severin and bassist Corinne Culbertson.

An arduous undertaking at the best of times, the independent route left Bottomley discouraged with the task of distributing his album. "I was sending copies to people, and either they weren't getting there or else I never got the money for them. I knew that I had to get major distribution, or I'd had it!"

During the first couple of months, he tried to make the best of the situation but always had an eye out for a deal with a label. He sent a tape to Michael Timmins, owner of Latent Records, created for his band The Cowboy Junkies.

"Michael told me that She Lay Down (the first single from the album) jumped out of the speakers at him, and he wanted to hear more," remembers Bottomley. Soon afterwards, Timmins dropped by one of his gigs at a local Toronto venue, and the two decided to join forces, an association he is very comfortable with.

"Michael knows my history, he followed Tulpa, and he lets me do whatever I want."

With Latent signed to BMG for distribution, Bottomley's burden has been substantially lifted. "Things are a lot easier now with BMG out there for me," he says, and he seems keen to let someone else take over the task of pitching his music to the industry.

Although he is 30, Bottomley has a brooding, childlike quality to him. His knowledge of the industry and it's demands on him is complete, but he seems unconcerned with the commercial aspects and is eager to retain his musical integrity.

Prior to the release of Library, Bottomley went on a search for his musical roots. "I read a lot of stuff on blues and country music." He says. "I wanted to get a foundation, to find out why they do the things they do, to find out where it came from. It was a tradition thing."

Once he did get his musical bearings, he maintains that the information served only to provide a grounding to his music. His songs are unsystematic and far removed from traditional formulas, a crutch that he shirks.

"I find it really upsetting when I listen to the radio and I hear a song, then a commercial, then another song, and I can barely differentiate between the three." This grassroots attitude is not unlike the Junkies' when they first arrived on the scene.

Entertainment is key in attracting cruise passengers

Cruising the world's oceans is becoming the fastest growing vacation phenomenon in history. As each day passes, the new cruise ships being built are adding hundreds of cabins which have to be filled by passengers looking not only for a relaxing way to travel, but exciting on board entertainment. There are huge ships sailing the Caribbean and Mediterranean today that are capable of carrying upwards of 2,000 passengers.

Supplying entertainment for cruise lines therefore has become an important function for booking agents. Gary Geni, who heads up Musicianship Entertainment, based in Chicago, has a fair chunk of this business. He

acquired the cruise bug as a drummer in 1976 and became a bandleader a few years later. Most of the ships he booked on accommodated upwards of 1,800 passengers, sailing the Caribbean and around South America.

After six years of cruising, Geni decided to parlay his knowledge of cruise entertainment into his own business. He based himself in his hometown of Chicago and worked with associates around North America building a solid reputation of supplying "the best" in cruise entertainment to major lines. He has placed entertainment on 31 cruise ships, an impressive figure.

If it's entertainment, Geni's Musicianship Entertainment has it, or can find it. He books showbands, musicians, variety acts and headliners, the complete gamut of floating entertainment in general.

Interestingly enough, although a major supplier of American talent, Geni has cultured a very close business relationship with Regent Holidays, a Canadian giant in both the cruise and land travel industry. His association with Regent came about through his knowledge of Canadian talent and what was available. Canadian talent accounts for about 50 percent of his bookings. "I like working with Regent," says Geni, "because they have the most consistent feeling of a family aboard a ship." He continues with, "Regent also maintains a very impressive lineup of headliners which makes their entertainment program second to none."

Geni credits much of the success of Regent's entertainment program to Ron Victors,

Entertainment Coordinator for Regent Holidays. "Ron puts together an excellent roster of top Canadian headliners which adds much to the overall entertainment program."

Regent leases the mts Pegasus, the flagship of Epirotiki, a Greek cruise line. The 750 passenger ship which cruises the Caribbean is usually filled to capacity with Canadians. Regent's entertainment policy focusses around headliners who are Canadian: Carroll Baker, Ronnie Hawkins, The Family Brown, Michelle Wright, Liona Boyd, J.K. Gulley, and Jannetta, to name just a few.

It is Geni's job to make sure the showband supplies proper instrumental backing for these acts. Some come aboard with their key musicians to supplement the ship's band. When signing on musicians, Geni stresses that they must "be good readers with knowledge of jazz standards . . . and the lounge bands are a crossover between danceable standards, country and pop. He scouts bars all across the U.S. and Canada in search for the "right" musicians with the "right attitude" says Geni. "I also get my leads from resumes and tapes and references . . . which often leads to some very fresh and exciting talent." He goes on to explain, "I look very intently into the character of the musician, because of the kind of industry the travel business is. I look for people who can get along easily . . . remember they have to be together for three or four months. Working as a musician or an entertainer on board a ship is just that . . . it's a work situation.'

Geni's record of supplying stable entertainers is impressive. Most of the musicians he initially signs, continue to come back season after season. A young Canadian keyboardist, Mike Barber, from Bomanville, Ontario, won a Performance At Sea Scholarship, which Regent sponsors with Ontario's Sheridan and Humber Colleges. "He worked with the band," explains Geni "and really enjoyed himself. A couple of days after returning home, he contacted me and asked if he could sign on for this current season."

Besides Barber, the Pegasus showband comprises Kerry Mero, a Canadian on lead guitar, who is also the bandleader; Jason Lougue, a Canadian on trumpet; Les Holmquist, an American on sax; drummer Steve Pitkin, a Canadian; and bassist Steve Mauve, an American. Performing with the showband are vocalist Joan Ballantyne and well-known vocalist/tap dancer Joey Hollingsworth. The show is rounded out by Rummy Bishop, one of the top comedians in the business. Entertainment for the lounge is supplied by husband and wife team, Gwen and Al Leger, a Maritimes couple. There is also a piano bar with Ted Connors at the keyboards, one of the most popular entertainers on the Caribbean

Geni keeps a close check on the musicians he books for cruises, quite often meeting up with the ships in San Juan or The Bahamas, where he spends a couple of days aboard. The purpose of his trip is twofold. Besides keeping his musicians up to date on musical trends, supplying them with new charts and making

sure his people are happy, he wants to make sure the cruise staff are satisfied with the entertainment he supplies.

Currently, I Can't Stand It is at number seven on RPM's Dance chart.

CBC Stereo celebrates Mozart's 235th birthday

CBC producers Steve Wadhams, Karin Wells and Keith Horner have put together a three-hour documentary celebrating the 235th birth-day of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. The program, to air on CBC Stereo on Jan 27 from noon to 3 pm, is part of a nine-hour celebration of Mozart.

The documentary portrait, Mozart; The Man, The Music, The Mystery, is drawn from 40 hours of raw material which was recorded in 69 locations. Using the latest in digital audio technology, Wells, Wadhams and Horner with technician Dave Field spoke with leading Mozart scholars, performers and others who keep the memory of Mozart alive. "Everyone has his or her own Mozart," exclaim the three producers. "The man remains as provocative two centuries after his death as he was during his lifetime."

The CBC also had the opportunity to tape the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra and Sir Georg Solti making a new recording of The Magic Flute.

Another interesting feature of the Mozart day will be a live performance from Toronto's Roy Thomson Hall with soprano Emma Kirkby who joins Tafelmusik who perform Mozart works on original instruments.


Now in the pre-production stage is Hawkins next studio album, to be released simultaneously in Canada and Europe in the fall.

BOP (harvey) - Reggae/Ska Bread & Circuses Relativity ZK 90856

Bop (harvey) is an eclectic reggae/ska act that has bounded out of the U.S. with a very simple and likeable "garage band" sound. The music is erratic, almost a revamping of the reggae genre a la North American. It has a cool tone, and although the music is not all that imaginative, it has an endearing quality to it which makes the album quite appealing. The title track is slightly glib and spunky, featuring the staccato saxophone work which is present throughout the album. 
AKIKOYANO - Pop Akikoyano Elektra 79205-2-P







Now that's stamina! Elton John hits No. 1 with You Gotta Love Someone. It marks the 22nd straight year John has had at least one song in the Top 40. No one else even comes close to matching that feat. It also marks his 13th No. 1 hit (including his duet with Kiki Dee). The Beatles, with 18, is the only act to have more No. 1's. Madonna appears ready to add to her chart topping totals as Justify My Love is at No. 2. She has had 11 No. 1's in her career.

What's in a title? George Michael's Freedom drops to No. 4, after one week at the top. No artist has hit the top with two different songs with the same title, although Michael came close. As a member of WHAM!, Freedom hit No. 10. How many different songs with the same title can you name that have hit No. 1? There are five in total, including one title three artists have taken to the top.

It's close . . . Madonna's The Immaculate Collection holds on to the top spot on the Albums chart, but just barely. Look for Vanilla Ice's To The Extreme to recapture the top position next week.

Gamble pays off. The dice have certainly been kind to Blue Rodeo. Casino climbs to lucky seven, while the first track off the album, Til I Am Myself Again, climbs to No. 5. It is still rising and could become the band's first No. 1 hit soon.

Still going strong! MC Hammer's Please Hammer Don't Hurt 'Em remains near the top of the Albums chart as it approaches one year since it first entered. In its 44th week, it is still in the Top five. Even the Top two albums last year were out of the Top 20 long before the 44th week. The last album to be in the Top five after a longer stretch was Alannah Myles' self-titled debut. In its 59th week, it was No. 4.

No Blues here . . . They may be battling the Cosby's on television, but in music they're battling Phil Collins, Paul Simon, and Madonna. The Simpsons' Sing The Blues climbs into the Top ten on the Albums chart and Do The Bartman is approaching the Top 20 on the Hit Tracks chart.

The top movers ... The Outfield's Diamond Days has this week's biggest jump on the Albums chart, as it climbs 18 spots to No. 36. Sting has the hottest song on the Hit Tracks

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chart. All This Time vaults to No. 23. Rik Emmett has the top add this week as Saved By Love enters at No. 62.

Double talk. The five songs to have hit No. 1 with the same title but different songs are: Woman (Peter & Gordon/John Lennon), Magic (Pilot/Olivia Newton-John), Touch Me (Doors/ Samantha Fox), The Power Of Love (Huev Lewis & The News/Jennifer Rush), and Cherish (Association/Kool & The Gang/Madonna).

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
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
