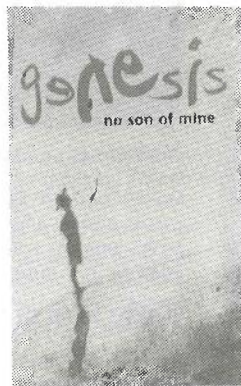

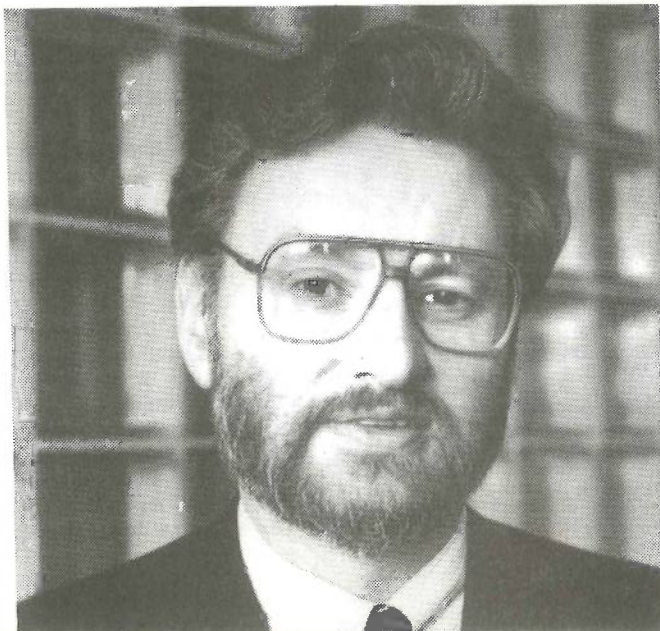

Thorney and Ehm pen Christmas fundraiser

The Einstein Brothers' label, known to be philanthropic in its outlook toward the less fortunate, is front-ending another holiday giving project. The vehicle for the funding of this year's soup kitchen and clothing giveaway is a song, Xmas Lives In Fairy Tales, written specially for the occasion of giving at Christmas time. The track was released on Sony compilation No. 38. Although radio play is expected to be fairly heavy, performance royalties won't be paid for some time, making it necessary to dip into their own coffers for this year's expenditure of the homeless project.

Einstein's Tim Thorney and Erica Ehm, had written the song for a movie, Christmas On Division Street. "It was a hot day in the middle of summer," Thorney recalls, "when Erica (Ehm) and I started to write the song. I said 'let's write this for the movie, but keep in mind that we could also use it to do some good around Christmas'."

As it turned out the movie people went with an instrumental, "so we thought, let's put this out for Christmas and maybe it can do some good. We're doing a little thing here for the homeless with the Einstein Brothers this year; a soup kitchen and other things . . . sort of remembering what Christmas is really all about."

The magic of the track is Thorney's distinct vocal performance. He is a songwriter first, which makes his delivery a bit out of the

Ska is not dead, mahn. Toronto's King Apparatus, recent winners of a CASBY award as the best ska band in Canada, are living testament that ska music can still pack a dance floor.

David Raider, Vice President Sales of The Record Peddler, reports that sales on the King Apparatus self-titled album "continue to increase," from coast to coast. The strongest region is Southern Ontario, but stores in Calgary and Edmonton have established "regular re-order patterns" since the release date.

Halifax is also kicking in with sales. Graeme Boyce, manager of the band, suggests that "perhaps it was our week-long stand at The Palace, or our week of Frosh Week gigs this past September, that created an interest."

Upcoming year to be a good one for Liona Boyd

One doesn't have to be a fortune teller to know Liona Boyd, Canada's first lady of the guitar, is in for a very good year in 1992.

On New Year's Eve, she'll be meeting the likes of Mikhail Gorbachev and Boris Yeltsin at a gala affair in Moscow, with plans to perform a small concert for Moscow's mayor, plus take in the Bolshoi Ballet and the Moscow Circus on a four day visit to the Soviet Union.

And upon her return, wedding bells will be peeling in Beverly Hills as Boyd will be tying the knot for the first time when she marries American businessman John B. Simon on February 2nd.

Ah, isn't love a many fine splendored thing?

"It really is and I am just thrilled to pieces," the guitarist told RPM recently over lunch, while giving off an almost giddy glow of happiness.

Will marriage curtail her rather extensive world tours?

"I don't think so. I've cut back to about 40 dates a year which is plenty. John travels a great deal with his business interests, so we

The band was the headline act at The Spectrum in Toronto on Dec. 6, as part of the Unsigned, Sealed & Delivered record release party. They have just completed a series of dates through Southern Ontario and, after the Spectrum date, play Toronto's Beaches (8), followed by Maryhill (14), Peterborough (19), Toledo (20), Windsor (21), St. Catharines (27) and the Annual Christmas party at Lee's Palace in Toronto (28).

While the band is committed to bringing ska music to the public en masse, they have a terrific sense of humour, as evident by many of the short songs and titles on their self-titled debut album. Their next video is for the song Buy Our Stuff (Make Us Rich). If ska finds the audience it deserves, the boys in the band won't have to worry about the latter.

try to coordinate our time away from home together."

Boyd said she has tentative plans to play Brazil in June and Barcelona around the time of next year's Olympics. She expressed satisfaction with her latest album release, Dancing On The Edge, but regretted the song that Rush's Alex Lifeson guested on didn't quite make her album.

"We gave him credit on the album cover, but it was one of those things where the song didn't quite fit with the others, so we took it off. I had the same thing happen to me on Julian Lennon's latest. I got credit on the album sleeve, but the song I played on didn't make it."

Such changes are a fact of life in the crazy record business, a fact that Boyd can attest to. "When I was doing my Persona album in London it was quite a thrill to get David Gilmour in the studio and he played wonderfully. We also got Eric Clapton to play but he was away on tour in America at the time, so we sent him the track and he did it in America, so I never got to meet him. But hopefully someday."

*Songwriters and publishers honoured at dinner***CMPA awards dinner another glittering affair**

This year's Canadian Music Publishers Association (CMPA) Songwriter of the Year Award Dinner, once again displayed the meticulous care and attention to every detail that organizers Fran Shaw and Norma Barnett have worked so diligently to present for the past five years. On entering the Casa Loma's main entrance, table assignation was made immediately.

After a bit of wine and networking, attendees were led into the main ballroom. The candlelit tables were highlighted by an appropriately-designed, music motif centrepiece. Place settings were cleverly-nameplated with a mirror identifying the place holder along with a die-cut mini-tuxedo folder displaying the menu and the program.

David Basskin, General Manager of the Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA) started the evening off with his usual light-hearted comments on his favourite topic, songwriting. "It all starts with a song. I've given a lot of speeches this year about impending changes in technology, and how they're going to re-shape the music business. But none of those developments will change the fact that people don't listen to CD's or cassettes or sound carriers . . . they listen to music and all music starts with the essential creative act: the writing of a song."

After offering a toast "in memory of a fine songwriter, dearly missed today . . . Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart," Basskin told his audience that between 1791 and 1991, "plenty has changed. But today music publishers and songwriters are still pursuing fair recognition and compensation for their talents, and this puts us from time to time against the users of music in our efforts. But we don't act in isolation. In the current economic climate, we all have to take a hard look at the role that music plays, not only in our own lives, but in the lives of our audiences."

Basskin also drew a parallel to the public's buying habits and that of the need to recognize the entertainment value of recorded music. "The next time you see a kid go by wearing a pair of Nike Air Jordans, think about what's on his or her feet, not a pair of shoes, but a dozen unpurchased CD's. A Nintendo Game Boy in someone's hands? That's eight or nine CD's that weren't bought. Each of us come up with more examples. While music is still the top priority in some people's lives, that number of people is shrinking. The fact is that no other form of entertainment except recorded music has the replayability factor. See a movie once for eight dollars. Buy a paperback for the same amount. Go to a restaurant or a theme park. They're all forms of entertainment and they're all one-time experiences. In a world of limited discretionary income, thanks to the GST, more limited than ever, everyone of these one-time entertainment purchases is money lost forever to the music business. Only recorded music offers you the opportunity to enjoy what you've purchased again and again. We need, as an industry, to bring the same smarts and effectiveness to the marketing

of all music that the athletic shoe industry has brought to its products. All of us, music publishers, songwriters, record companies and retailers alike can only benefit from more business, and we must work together to achieve it."

The keynote speaker for the evening was "Shingoose" Jonnie, whose articulate and very humorous musings about aboriginal rights struck a comedic, but nonetheless serious chord with his audience. "Imagine what our history books would say if our people would have had a say in writing them. If it wasn't for the active intervention of the Iroquois and Algonquin people on behalf of the English in the 17 and 1800's, we'd all be speaking French now, and English would be our second language. We might even be called Americans if it wasn't for Joseph Brant siding with the Loyalists. My point is, whether you realize it or not, people of North American First Nations identity have in the past, and will continue in the past, and will continue in the future, to enrich the lives of all music lovers no matter what their ethnic origin. The only thing that limits creative musical expression ironically is the music industry itself. Music merchants are more preoccupied with catering to current trends, rather than setting new ones. But that's the bottom line and I understand that. What I don't understand is why there can't be a compromise. Why can't the music industry designate a small portion of their resources and prime time to promoting indigenous creative works? Through this type of creative development, who knows, some great songs may emerge that will strengthen our collective identity."

In closing, Shingoose let a little more native humour hang loose. "Before I go, I would like to offer a few words of encouragement to all you budding writers . . . get a real job! To all you happening songwriters . . . could you spare a couple of points on your next hit . . . better yet . . . need a co-writer?. To all you music publishers . . . if you think we could do business, I'll get my Indian agent to call your Jewish agent . . . and we'll do lunch. To all the people who helped make this evening possible . . . see, I told you . . . you'd do anything to have a party in a castle." Needless to say Shingoose received a standing ovation.

All The Lovers In The World, performed by Gowan, took the top prize in the Rock category. The song was written by Gowan and Eddie Schwartz. Bryan Potvin's penning of She Ain't Pretty, performed by Northern Pikes, won the first runner up prize and Whatcha Do To My Body, performed by Lee Aaron and written by Aaron and John Albani was the second runner up.

Let Your Backbone Slide, performed by Maestro Fresh Wes won top honours in the Alternative category, and his Drop The Needle took the prize as second runner up. Both songs were written by Wes Williams and Anthony and Peter Davis. She's So Young, performed by Pursuit of Happiness and written by Moe Berg won the second runner up prize.

Attic's President Al Mair is "wildly nationalistic"

Al Mair, President of Attic Records, the largest independent record label in Canada, is being only slightly facetious when asked what advice he'd give if someone wanted to start a record company today.

"In a word, DON'T!", Mair says with a chuckle. "No, seriously, when we started we had like \$300,000 in the bank from our backers. Today, you'd need \$3 million, what with the cost of studio time, promotion and video production, it's an unbelievable expense today to launch an artist."

Mair has always been in love with the record business, ever since his teenage years working in a record store. As a University of Toronto accounting student, he began working for Capitol Records in their accounting department.

Mair moved to London Records to take over in publicity when Walt Grealis left to start a record trade industry publication called RPM.

Mair was working for MCA Canada in the late 60's when he discovered a then relatively unknown guitarist/songwriter by the name of Gordon Lightfoot playing in a Yonge St. pub. Knocked out by his abundant talent, Mair became Lightfoot's manager, a partnership which lasted until '76.

"I learned a lot from Gord, the most important thing was, he was the first major artist that proved you don't have to leave Canada to be major league successful."

It was Lightfoot's success that provided the inspiration for Mair and his partner, Tom Williams, to start Attic Records in '74.

"Tom and I felt there was enough talented Canadians out there who just weren't getting signed to the major labels and we wanted to fill that void."

Flood was the first group signed to Attic, followed by Shirley Eikhard and Ken Tobias.

FACTOR grants based on "professionalism" - Sym

FACTOR's Executive Director, Heather Sym, says an artist has the best chance of getting a grant or loan from FACTOR by putting together the most professional demo and publicity package possible.

"An artist's strongest selling point is a professionally done demo. It's best to keep the music in one style so the listening panel can get a clear focus on the band. Also include any press clippings, a bio and picture of the group. Plus, an outline of expected studio, video and tour costs. And what, if any, plans of national distribution."

Not exactly the carefree, crazy world that one normally associates with rock n' roll, but Sym makes no apologies for FACTOR's demands for professionalism. "Hey, this a business just like anything else and it's not cheap to make a record these days. So you better believe, we're only committed to helping artists who are seriously committed themselves."

Sym got her start in the music industry when she happily quit her insurance business

But it was Hagood Hardy's Homecoming album that went double platinum that firmly established Attic Records, two years after its inception.

Triumph's multi-platinum, worldwide success made Attic Records a major presence, which it has continued with the success of artists like Lee Aaron. But Attic isn't just concerned with Canadian acts, as it has distributed records in Canada by such international stars as George Thorogood, Judas Priest, Katrina & The Waves and Motorhead.

"You can't stick your head in the sand and pretend the world doesn't exist outside of Canada, which is why we distribute other acts."

But promoting Canadian acts remains Mair's number one priority as he proudly says, "I'm a wildly nationalistic promoter of Canadian talent."

"Of course, I'm a bit biased, but I firmly believe that a Canadian artist is better served if he or she signs with a Canadian label. You often only get one shot with a US label and if it goes nowhere, you're history. And if that happens, then it's real hard to get a Canadian label interested in you again. It took Lee Aaron several albums before she really developed into a good songwriter and started having big sales. But we were committed and stuck with her, whereas a lot of US labels wouldn't have."

Mair practices what he preaches, as he is also the President of the Canadian Independent Record Producers Association (CIRPA).

"Next week I'm meeting with Michael Wilson and then the Prime Minister. The record business generates something like \$250 million a year in revenue in Canada alone. Anne Murray just grossed over \$400,000 in concert revenues from her O'Keefe Centre shows in Toronto, that's a lot of revenue and

job to become a receptionist for the Canadian Talent Library. When the Library merged with FACTOR in '85, Sym came too and rose through the ranks to become the organization's Executive Director.

"I love the music industry. I used to be really painfully shy but this is such a people oriented business that I've had to come out of my shell and deal with people and I'm really grateful for that."

Sym says that another gratifying aspect of her job is when an artist makes it big with the help of a FACTOR loan or grant. But if she had one wish it would be that more artists acknowledge the FACTOR contribution upon their success.

"Alannah Myles was terrific. When she did interviews she told people about how the FACTOR loan got her recording career started and I got calls from Los Angeles inquiring about our organization. That's what we need more of, because the more people that know about us, then the more contributions we'll get and the more artists we can help out."

a lot of tax dollars. Artists like her, Rush and Jeff Healey are international stars who generate millions of dollars that come back to Canada and I think it's time the government recognized this fact and started paying more attention and giving more help to this industry."

Gold to Jesus Jones for Capitol's Doubt album

Jesus Jones have struck gold in Canada. The band members received their awards for Doubt, their second release on Capitol, after a sold-out performance (one of two) at Toronto's Concert Hall last month.

As well, the band played dates in Edmonton, Calgary, Saskatoon and Winnipeg. "Considering this was the very first time they've ever played in these cities," says Mariann Girard, Media Relations for Capitol, "the turn-out and audience reaction was phenomenal. Every date was incredibly successful."

While in Winnipeg, the band held an autograph session at St. Vital's HMV Store which attracted a crowd estimated at close to one thousand. Doubt has been nominated for a CASBY this year in the International Album of the Year category.

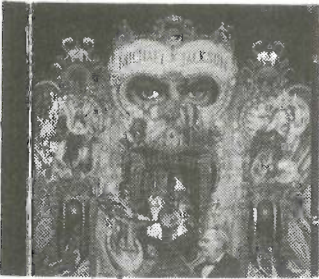

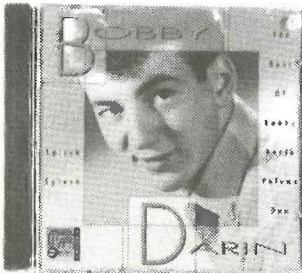

It's been four years since the one glove man has released an album and it's obvious that the singer has been listening to the radio during that time by the evidence of *Dangerous*. Jackson tries to cover all the bases by including rap, dance, soul, infectious grooves and hard rock riffs all into one smoothly streamlined package designed to sell eight zillion copies. And for the most part he succeeds. The debut single *Black Or White* hits a groove, with Guns N' Roses guitarist Slash hammering out a good, chunky hard riff throughout the song. *Jam, Why You Wanna Trip On Me* and *She Drives Me Wild* all carry the signature Jackson dancing grooves. The one truly dreadful song on the album is *Heal The World*, a saccharine-sweet ballad with Hallmark card lyrics about saving the world. (CD reviewed) - DP

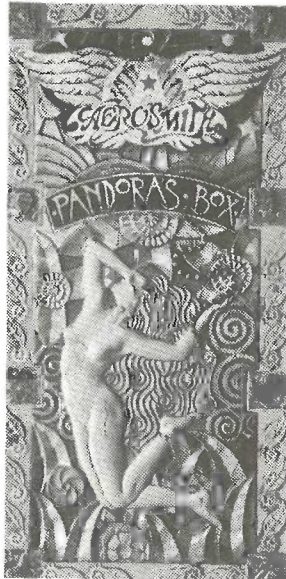

Darin also pays homage to Ray Charles by doing an exact copy of *What'd I Say*. *Mighty Man* and *Early In The Morning* prove that Darin was of the first rock n' rollers. Also key are *Let Me Tell You*, written by Gino Salvador and Rick Wilkins, and *I Love You Cherle*, written by the team of Salvador and Lanz. Don't overlook *A Wonderful Lifetime*, a beautifully arranged duet with Manuela Silvani. There are 21 tracks here, all delivered with a vocal warmth and compassion rarely heard today by an artist of this calibre. 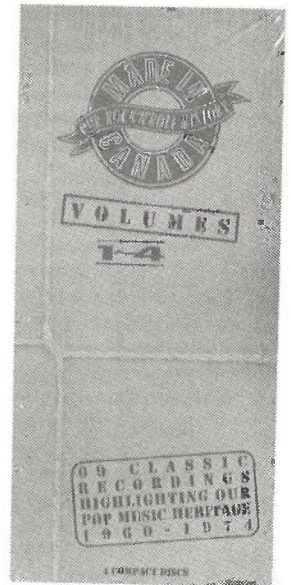

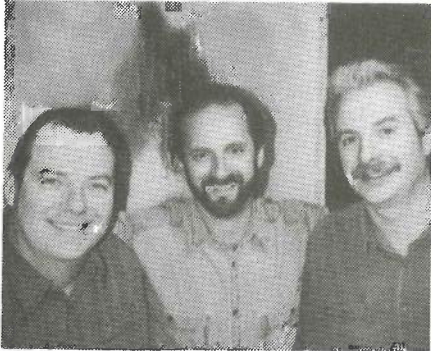

Ross Carlin's dream of a revitalized national anthem comes true

Professional treatment for Canada's national anthem

During the Persian Gulf war, Ross Carlin, former on-air personality at DC103.5 Orangeville, Ontario, set himself a goal to put in motion a plan to revitalize Canada's national anthem (RPM - Feb 2/91 and Oct. 26/91). It was his hope to harness the support of Canada's

recording artists to add that ingredient of nationalistic excitement to a recording of O Canada.

The Gulf war was over, but back home there was a different kind of war being waged, Quebec and the rest of Canada were at odds with each other.

"I first approached the Juno people, back in March. My idea originally, was to have them sing it as a finale for the show. But Lynne Harvey (CBC-TV producer) said 'no way,' there wasn't enough lead-in time."

Toronto's Mix 99.9 offers prizes for holiday sobriety

Carlin had picked up some press however, and Jane Rowan of Toronto's McLear Place called him and said she had read about his project in RPM and that McLear would like to donate studio time. She also told him that Hayward Parrott, one of Canada's top producers, and one who was familiar with these types of projects, was interested in talking to him about producing the session. After a short meeting, Carlin and Parrott became a team and Brian Lyon, former Promotions Director of CFNY FM Toronto was contacted and a troika formed.

Carlin admits there was lots of enthusiasm for the project wherever they went, "but we

needed money, and that's when the going got tough. Just on a whim I contacted my local member of parliament, Garth Turner, who was also the Business Editor of the Toronto Sun. I told him it was tough to get funding for the project and the idea lived or died with him. I asked for his help as a business consultant, but I made it clear up front that we didn't want any government interference . . . I don't want the government to run this or use it in any way as a vehicle to get re-elected or anything political at all. He agreed and, not in his capacity as an MP, but as a man with a lot of contacts in the business world, he was the guy who went out and raised \$400,000."

The money was raised through seven sponsors: Canadian Airlines, Canadian National, Canada Post, Coca-Cola Canada, Ford Motor Company, McLean-Hunter Ltd. and Prudential Insurance.

After laying out pre-production plans, arranger Eric Robertson was contacted. He was asked if he could come up with two totally different versions of the anthem, symphonic and contemporary. He readily agreed to become a part of the project and the team was complete. Shortly thereafter, Carlin and his cohorts founded the O Canada Foundation.

"Our plan was to sincerely and honestly invite every single artist and musician we could to take part. This was to be a gift to Canada from the music industry."

Lou Ann Wheaton joined the group as Talent Coordinator. Her mandate was to literally phone every artist and musician available in Canada and invite them to take part. Parrott chose the lead singers, based on their popularity and who he believed deserved to sing the lead lines.

The first three people to sign up were Maureen Forester, Tommy Hunter and Geddy Lee (who had to drop out because of a European tour). "Then we knew the project would be taken seriously by others," and it was. Quickly following were Rita MacNeil, Michelle Wright, Paul Janz, Maestro Fresh Wes, Alannah Myles, Murray McLachlan, Patsy Gallant, Luba, Salome Bey, Suzanne Stevens,

Robert Pilon, Claude Naubert, Liz Tansey, Natalie Choquette, Gino Vannelli and Randy Bachman for a guitar solo. The numbers then began to grow like topsy until there was a full complement of 244 singers and musicians.

Carlin points out that although there were obvious people missing, "it was just a scheduling problem."

Now, the real hard work began. Flying in people from different parts of Canada, scheduling and rescheduling itineraries. "One day we had ten people in the studio, the next day 35 and one day there were 65 people in the studio." Besides McLear Place, Toronto's MantaSound was used for the large symphonic session, Tom Lavin's Blue Wave Studios in Vancouver for the western people and Montreal's Studio Tempo for the Quebec artists.

One of the most interesting and humorous happenings during the sessions was with Maestro Fresh Wes. The first chorus of the anthem is carved in stone, "that can't be touched, but the second chorus is the one

where we took a few liberties. We originally had Maestro Fresh Wes down to do the line 'from east to western sea.' He looked at us and said, 'you know, I don't sing, and this line doesn't rap. He scratched it out and in ten seconds rewrote the line. We wondered how this would sit with the historians, but as it turned out the rap line is what everyone seems to key into. When Maureen Forester heard it, she rolled her eyes and said 'Oh my, will we have something to talk about at the bridge club now.' We have the world's first anthem with a rap line in it . . . and it was written in ten seconds and six takes later, history was made."

Another memorable happening for the recording was Paul Janz, the only lead to do his entire line in one take. He drove for an hour and a half from Mission, B.C. to the Blue Wave studio, sang the line and left. Carlin and his crew had booked an hour and a half of studio time for the session.

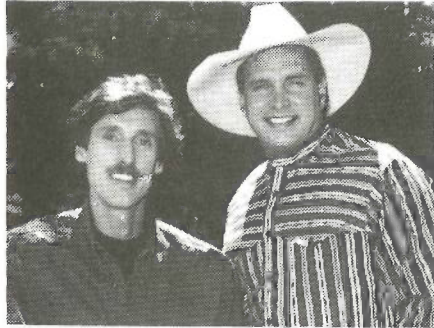
A cassette of both the symphonic and contemporary versions of O Canada are being shipped across Canada to every school, library and Legion, courtesy of Cinram. CDs and cassettes will be available through direct marketing. They are packaged in an attractive box, which also contains a 24-page full colour booklet.

Radio stations are being supplied with a CD of both versions, and Carlin and his crew hope to influence them to air one of the versions on January 1st at noon, central time. Warren Cosford, General Manager of London's BX-93 is soliciting his 65-station O Canada network and the Canadian Association of Broadcasters (CAB) are also lending their support for this noon playing of Canada's revitalized anthem. As well, Standard and BN's satellite networks have been utilized to send the song out in advance to all their stations. But Carlin assures, all the stations will have the CDs by January 1st.

With country music shaping up to be today's mass-appeal format, the Dec. 27 airing of George Fox: Country On Campus by CBC-TV is timely. The one-hour special was taped at the University of Guelph, Ontario and at the University of Calgary.

Guesting on the special are Patricia Conroy, Kashtin, the Skydiggers, Trisha Yearwood and Capitol superstar Garth Brooks.

The special allows Fox to flex his contemporary image muscle. There is a definite swing toward the younger country record buyer and viewer, and Fox's success with his previous TV specials would indicate that he is

one of the more popular of Canadian country artists.

Fox suggests that "whether it's because of family values or the environment issues we country artists have written and sung about for years, city folk are being drawn to country music in numbers that are astonishing. It's a phenomenon that I wanted to address."

The campus has long been a barometer of

what's new in trends, and taking a highly-charged and packed-full-of entertainment special to the university level created a level of excitement and acceptance rarely seen on a country cum pop variety show. "I also wanted to show how much a part of our Canadian culture country music is. And our audience, about one thousand university students, responded as enthusiastically as I could ever have hoped."

Canada's leading variety producer in the television field, Sandra Faire, who has successfully guided similar specials for Fox, Anne Murray, Bryan Adams, k.d. lang and Corey Hart, will once again be in charge of the production crew. Fox's last special, George

Fox's New Country, aired last year, drew a surprise rating of close to one million viewers, surprising, in view of the fact that this was Fox's first special.

Faire points out that both she and Fox wanted to show "how much broader country music is today than it was, say, ten years ago. Look at the range of our guests and their music. Kashtin are singing in their native Montagnais, instead of English, yet the meaning about their people comes through loud and clear. If the '90s is the decade for country music, and I believe it is, it's also the time for native Canadians. And country music is broad enough today to embrace that diversity. Having said that, it's always fun working with George and, as in the last special, it shows on the screen."

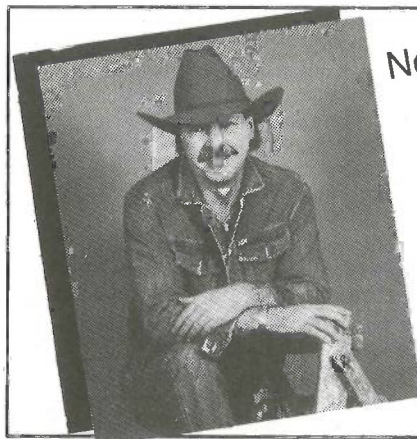
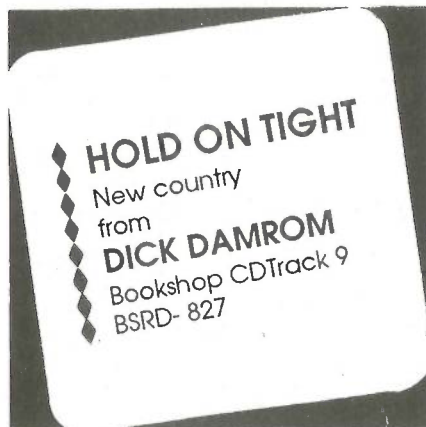

Middleton, Ivan Stover and Russ Hall. Also featured are Deborah Lauren, Ian Eaton and Heidi Munro from Saskatchewan, and Steve Bell and Rocky McLeod from Manitoba. Nashville producer Brad Hartman was in charge of the board and Glen D. Hardin, also of Nashville, did the arrangements.

Michael Peters has been picking up good playlist adds on his release of the title track of his new CD, released on the WEA label. produced by Randall Cousins and Bob Doidge. Some of Canada's top country artists took the time to record the song. All royalties are to go to the Wesley Urban Ministries Food Bank. Several major and secondary stations have already added the track.

Christmas In The Valley Vol. 6 continues the annual holiday tradition of Ottawa's Country 105 CKBY. This is the sixth year for the recording and the eighth year as a radio series. More than \$290,000 has been raised through this project for the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario and the Royal Ottawa Health Care Foundation. The top artist . . . With the song of the year, the No. 3 song, the top AC song and the No. 15 album, Bryan Adams gets the nod as the number one artist of 1991. Runner-up probably goes to Garth Brooks. He had the No. 2 and No. 4 country songs and a total of five songs in the Top 40. In addition, Brooks was the only country artist to have an album in the Top 100 of the year.

RADIO

The K-97 Bungy Jump has been cancelled. The Dec. 4th jump-off, originally scheduled to take place from a catwalk in the rafters of the World Waterpark at West Edmonton Mall, was cancelled because of the stress it may have caused the structure. A platform is now being erected that will allow K-97's midday personality Terry Evans to attempt his indoor Bungy Jump, now scheduled for Jan 1st.

It's the opposite of last year when the top album was way ahead of all the others and the battle for song-of-the-year was very close. What was the top album and song from last year?

The top crossover artist. There is only one artist whose name appears at least twice on each of the year end Dance, AC, Hit Tracks, and Albums charts. Mariah Carey had three songs in the Top 100, three in the AC Top 100, two in the Dance Top 50, and two of the years top albums.

Out with the old . . . This year was quite a bit different than last. In 1990, there were three artists who had an album in the Top 10 which was also a Top 10 album the year before! This year, no one accomplished that feat. The closest was Mariah Carey's self-titled album. It ended up as the No. 4 album this year, after being the No. 13 album last year. As a comparison, there were only three albums in the TOP 40 this year that were even in the Top 40 last year!

An A&M sweep! A&M takes the Gold, Silver and Bronze on the Hit Tracks chart. Bryan Adams has the No. 1 & 3 songs, while Extreme's More Than Words comes in at No. 2. Warner Music ends up ahead at the top of the Albums chart though, with five of the Top 10 albums.

The top dance act. It wasn't even close! C + C Music Factory is the only act that had three songs in the Top 50! Not to mention the fact those three songs came in at Nos. 1, 2, and 5!

Canadians fared well . . . Of the Top 20 albums, four of them are from Canadian artists. Compare that to last year, when only one Canuck cracked the Top 20. As well, there are four Cancon albums in the Top 20, but not the same ones. Confused? Well, Rod Stewart's Vagabond Heart contains Cancon material so it counts, but Bryan Adams' Waking Up The Neighbours doesn't have any Cancon material, so it doesn't count.

Last year's best! Did you remember a year ago? The top album of 1990 was Sinead O'Connor's I Do Not Want What I Haven't Got. It was on top for 15 straight weeks, and was well ahead of . . . But Seriously by Phil Collins. The No. 1 song last year was Phil Collins' I Wish It Would Rain Down.
