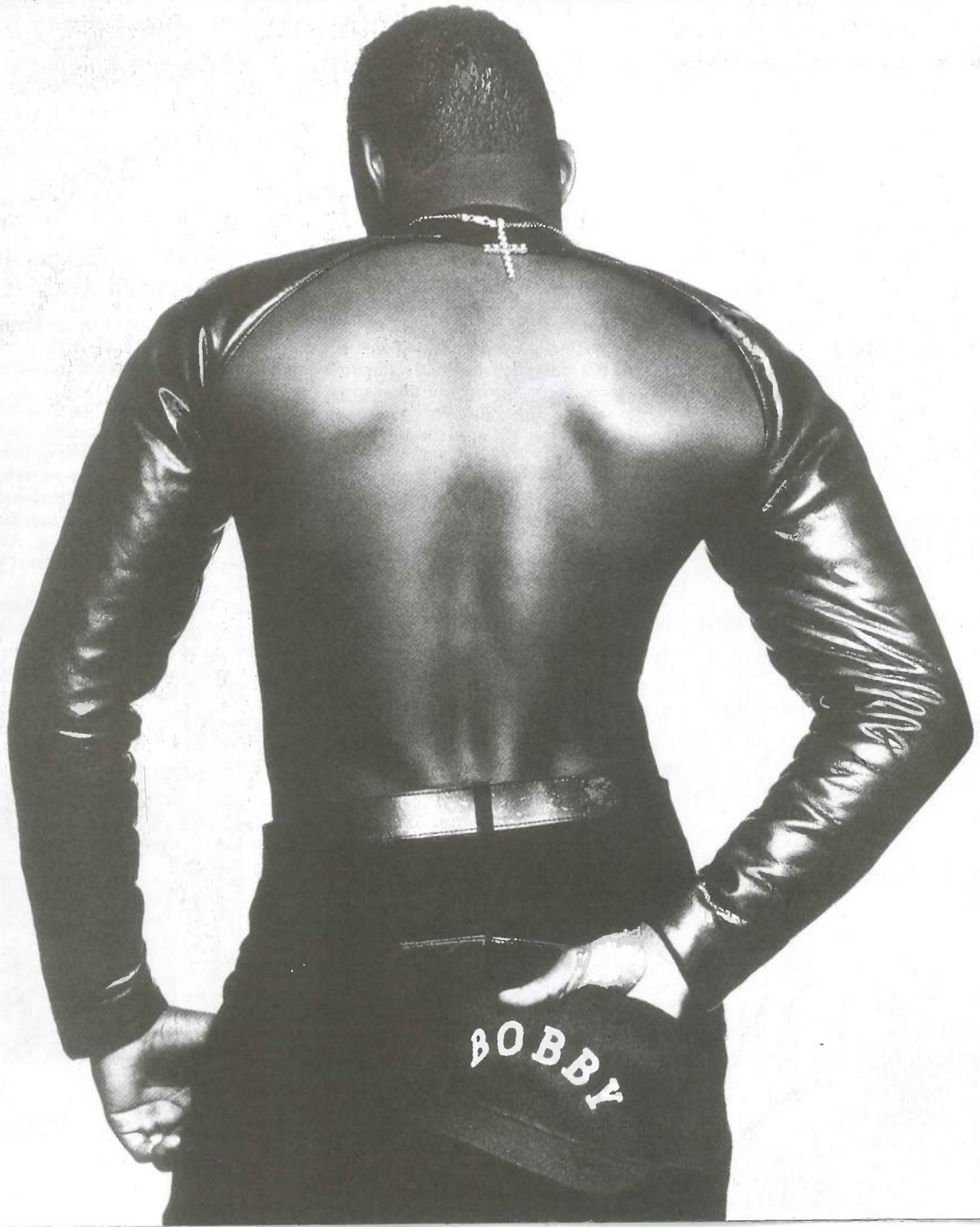

## O Fortuna pulled for copyright infringement

A dance compilation called Too Technocal is being pulled off shelves because one of the songs on the album, O Fortuna by Apotheosis, infringes the copyright of the well-known classical work, Carmina Burana, written by the late German composer, Carl Orff.

The Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA) is the Canadian licensing agent for the owner of the copyright and is behind the action. CMMRA contacted SPG Music Productions, the Etobicoke, Ont. company which released the album, and told its representatives that litigation could follow if the album was not withdrawn from stores. SPG has agreed to comply with the request and will hand over returned copies to CMRRA.

O Fortuna has already been the subject of litigation in Holland, where a court ordered the recording removed from the market and

banned further public performance. The copyright owner successfully argued that the dance recording was an unacceptable mutilation of Orff's composition, and as such was a violation of the moral rights in the work.

SPG had sub-licensed the master rights from Radikal Records in the United States and the company was under the mistaken impression that it would not have to apply for licensing in Canada. Jeff Sprigg of SPG says 6,500 copies of the album have been pressed and he believes that about 90 per cent have either been sold or given away in promotions. SPG will have to pay CMRRA royalties based on the number of copies sold.

Sprigg says O Fortuna was the focus track of Too Technocal and it wouldn't be worth the trouble to re-release the album without it. A sequel album titled Too

Technocal: The Second Rave is scheduled for a September release.

Sprigg says the company will be more diligent from now on and will ensure that all licensing agreements are in place on future releases. "It's a lesson," he says, "With techno music there's so much sampling done that you have to be very careful."

David Basskin, president of CMRRA, says he feels sorry for SPG but insists that he had no choice but to take action because of the instructions given to him by the music's publisher. "My motivation is not to keep people from selling records. I make money when people sell records, not when they don't sell records.

"If we'd received an application prior to SPG's release of this CD, we could have told them that the publisher refused to license the work and it would not have been necessary to pull the product from the market. The cut simply could have been left off the CD."

Import copies of a CD single containing four different mixes of O Fortuna, which is manufactured in the U.S. by Radikal Records, has also been available in some Canadian stores. Retailers who continue to sell either the CD single or Too Technocal may be subject to legal action. CMMRA has released notices informing retailers of the situation.

## Molson Park sells out again for MCA Concerts

The Waking Up The Nation Open Air Festival at Molson Park in Barrie, Ont. on Saturday sold-out before the day of the show.

This makes Waking Up The Nation the third sold-out concert promoted by MCA Concerts Canada at Molson Park this summer, the other two being The Great Canadian Party on July 1, and Lollapalooza '92 on Aug. 5. Both shows also sold-out the 30,000 capacity site prior to the concert date.

The band opened for Toronto's Lowest Of The Low. Just prior to the Ultrasound show, Rhatigan and her band performed at a BMG industry showcase.

Rhatigan has been on the road performing showcases across the U.S. and after her Toronto date, she headed for London, England. She will also showcase in Australia in October to coincide with the release there of her self-titled Imago album. She then returns to Europe for a five week tour.

## Guns concert rescheduled for Sept. 13 in Toronto

The Faith No More, Metallica, Guns N' Roses concert in Toronto originally slated for Aug. 9 has been rescheduled to Sept. 13 at Exhibition Stadium.

The concert, which begins at 4:30 p.m., is one of the shows that had to be rescheduled after Metallica's James Hetfield suffered second and third degree burns to his forearm at an Aug. 8 concert at Montreal's Olympic Stadium.

The same Montreal show provoked a riot which caused an estimated half-a-million dollars damage after Guns N' Roses lead singer Axl Rose stormed off the stage after performing for just 55 minutes. A woman who attended the concert, and who wishes to represent the 53,000 unhappy fans, is seeking permission to file a class-action suit against promoter Donald K. Donald Productions and Olympic Stadium officials for breach of contract. She is seeking reimbursement of two-thirds of the cost of the \$35 tickets. Quebec Superior Court will decide in a few weeks whether to let the case proceed.

Guns N' Roses has been banned from playing Olympic Stadium again and the cancelled Aug. 17 Vancouver date for the three bands won't be rescheduled because there are no available dates at B.C. Place.

## Canada's 125th birthday celebrated at the CNE

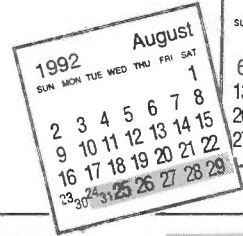
The Canadian National Exhibition will be celebrating Canada's 125th birthday with a presentation of talent from across the country on Aug. 25.

Montreal's Sass Jordan will belt out songs from her current Racine album at 7:20 p.m. And April Wine, currently based in Montreal but with roots embedded in Winnipeg, will continue their comeback with a set at 8:45 p.m. A fireworks display will begin as April Wine ends their set at 10:15 p.m.

Admission to the CNE is just \$1.25 for this special day. The concert is presented by Labatt Blue, Concert Productions International and the CNE Association.

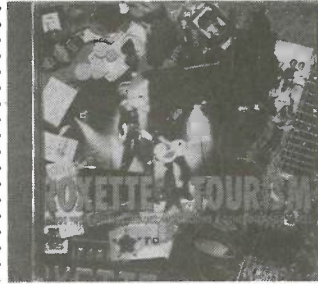

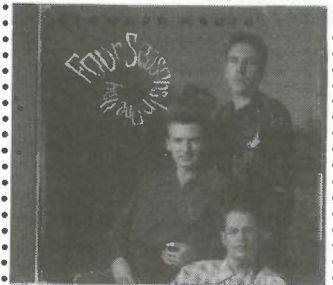

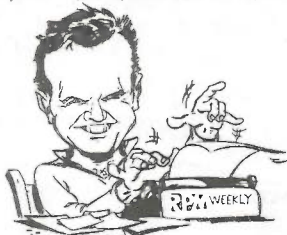

## A partnership that's paying off in spades

*Ten years of contributing to Canada's star system . . .*

When FACTOR was born in 1982 with a budget of only \$200,000 supplied primarily by CHUM Ltd., Moffat Communications, and Rogers Broadcasting Ltd., and other industry factions, the future looked chancy at best. However, in celebrating 10 years of growth (RPM - Aug. 22/92), the aggressive young organization now boasts 10 more sponsoring broadcasters with an annual budget of \$4 million, of which \$2.2 million comes from the Department of Communications (DOC), \$1.1 million from broadcasters, and the balance from loan repayments and interest.

FACTOR's 11-member board, headed up by Jason Sniderman as president, is responsible for administering funding to the

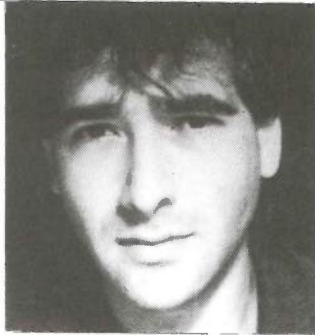
10 programs which covers everything from loans for recording sessions, video shoots, tour assistance, international showcases, demo sessions, and even assistance for radio syndication.

Sniderman's full time job is vice-president of Roblan Distributors. Roy Hennessey as vice-president of FACTOR, is also vice-president and general manager of Toronto's CFRB. Treasurer Doug Ackhurst is group vice-president of Telemedia. FACTOR secretary Larry Wanagas heads up the Vancouver-based Bumstead Productions. The other directors have equally time consuming positions: Duff Roman is vice-president of industry affairs for CHUM Limited; Brian

Chater is executive director of CIRPA; Terry Flood, heads up Terry Flood Management; Wayne Patton is head of Patton Pending Music; Tom Berry is president of Alert Records and Management; Sandy Sanderson is executive vice-president, eastern division of Rogers Broadcasting Ltd.; and Vincent DiMaggio is vice-president and general manager of CFNY Radio.

Being a FACTOR board member isn't an easy task. There are many variables that have to be taken into consideration and often confrontations that would frustrate even the most hard-nosed. Besides their regular jobs, some running huge organizations, they devote much time and effort ensuring that the needs of fund-seekers from every nook and cranny of Canada are looked after. Some aren't, for obvious reasons. Is it a thankless task? From an industry that's not too quick with the platitudes, one might think so.

## Rik Emmett's Ipso Facto was a long-term project

After finishing his new album, Ipso Facto, Rik Emmett should have treated himself to a new hat rack.

He certainly undertook enough tasks on the album; he wrote it, produced and arranged it, sang all lead and some background vocals, played all guitar parts, and programmed some percussion.

"It's very tiring and it's very wearing after a while," Emmett says of the experience. "Every single step is very intensive."

And time consuming, he might have added. From start to finish, it took Emmett almost two years to release Ipso Facto.

"I wish I could speed the process up. I wish I could get records to market quicker and have it so I still felt fresh about some stuff when the public was first getting it and feeling fresh about it."

But the 38-year-old former member of Triumph is satisfied that all his labour has resulted in a worthwhile album. Emmett says he felt more confident and relaxed making Ipso Facto than he did on his first solo album, Absolutely. He also simplified the arrangements this time out.

"It makes it more accessible. It makes it easier for people's ears to get inside the record

and get all the way through it to the other side of it."

Though initial reactions to the album have been generally positive, Emmett doesn't hold lofty commercial expectations. The industry veteran knows a number of factors have to come together to make a song or an album a hit.

"You just have to hope for the best and hope you can get lucky with timing. You just hope that whatever the vibe is that gets created for you will be a positive one."

Ipso Facto is released in Canada by Duke Street Records, a fairly small independent label. Because of the inherent limitations of working with a minor label, Emmett realizes he has a restricted budget for publicity. And since he's not the kind of artist who attracts media attention through stirring up controversy, he hopes positive word of mouth will raise the album's profile. So far, Ipso Facto has sold around 20,000 copies in Canada.

The first cut on the 14-song album, the hard rocking Straight Up, was released as the first focus track in order to re-establish Emmett at AOR radio. The follow-up, Bang On, is aimed more toward CHR as well as AOR formats. The song also has a video.

But Emmett believes that if he's going to achieve much commercial success, it will come through the subsequent single releases of some of the ballads on the album. Let Love Conquer All, Heaven In Your Heart, and Dig A Little Deeper all have potential.

## Acid Test and Hhead at Toronto's Phoenix

Acid Test and Hhead, two Toronto bands that have been attracting major label attention, will show their appreciation to local fans by playing a free show at the Phoenix on Sept. 3.

Acid Test is also one of four Canadian bands invited to perform at the 'In The City' Festival in Manchester, England in September.

## Siberry to return to U.K. after completing album

Warner Music Canada recording artist Jane Siberry is completing her sixth album.

Siberry produced most of the songs on her own in Vancouver and Toronto while three tracks were produced by Brian Eno during Siberry's three-month residency in London, England this past spring. The album is tentatively scheduled to be released in January.

Peter Gabriel recently invited Siberry to participate in Real World/WOMAD recording week -- an annual event in which Gabriel invites artists from around the world to his studio in Bath, England to explore new musical ideas.

Siberry will play a week of U.K. dates with Bob Wiseman in early September and will also appear at Edinburgh Castle on Sept. 4 opening for Mike Oldfield's live world premiere performance of Tubular Bells II.

Ipso Facto has also been released in Japan, where Emmett was surprised to find that a 5½-minute blues/jazz tune called Out Of The Blue was tabbed as the first single. As a result, he's going to make a video for that song, too.

The album is also being distributed in some European countries and Emmett did a promotional tour over there in July. He's still shopping for an American deal, but he's confident something will come along because of his firm fan base south of the border.

Emmett has been playing selected Canadian dates since July and is playing shows in Ontario and New York through August and September before performing in San Francisco on Sept. 19. If things go well with Ipso Facto overseas, he would like to extend his live playing to take in Europe and Japan as well. He's once again been bitten by the bug which drives performers to strut their stuff in front of a live audience.

"I'll probably be touring for a good four-to-six months, even if the record is only moderately successful," he says.

## Stampeders are on the career comeback trail

The original three Stampeders have reunited after 16 years for two concerts at Lulu's in Kitchener, Ont. on Sept. 25 and 26.

Rich Dodson, Kim Berly and Ronnie King already staged successful concerts at the Calgary Stampede in early July. And due to the demand created by the emergence of classic rock radio, the band is also planning a Canada-wide tour next spring to coincide with the release of a new album.

According to promoter Donald K. Donald, the Stampeders were the top Canadian concert draw from 1971 to '74, and were the first Canadian band to tour from one end of the country to the other. In addition to their double-platinum single, Sweet City Woman, the band also had hits with such songs as Oh My Lady, Then Came The White Man, Playing In The Band, Hit The Road Jack, and New Orleans.

The Stampeders also made some of the first rock videos by a Canadian act. Five of those are included in a one-hour video entitled Canada's Rock Legends - The Stampeders, which is available on Quality Special Products and will soon be aired on MuchMusic.

## New IMAX/OMNIMAX film takes a look at music

A new IMAX/OMNIMAX film titled Why is Music Music? is tentatively scheduled for a 1995 release.

In the film, viewers will be able to interact with the subject as they simultaneously hear and see vibrating giant screen images of sound waves and patterns, travel through musical instruments, listen to the visual deconstruction of musical components, and experience the language and science of music from around the world.

Chicago's Museum of Science and Industry will serve as executive producer and worldwide distributor of the film, which is funded through a \$175,000 grant from the National Association of Music Merchants. The film is being directed by Academy Award winner, Ben Shedd.

## Richie signs worldwide with PolyGram's Mercury

Lionel Richie has signed a long-term, multi-album, worldwide recording contract with PolyGram's Mercury Records following the expiration of his agreement with Motown.

Under the new contract, PolyGram will release Richie's repertoire on its Mercury label in North America and on its Polydor label in the rest of the world. The contract begins with Richie's next recording, which he is expected to start work on soon.

Richie's latest album, the retrospective *Back to Front*, has sold nearly three million units worldwide and has reached number one on the album charts in Australia, Ireland, Holland, Hong Kong, New Zealand and the United Kingdom. PolyGram is responsible for the marketing and distribution of the album.

## Bob Wiseman keeps going, and going . . . and going

The hectic activity never seems to end for Bob Wiseman.

He recently finished a tour of southern Ontario with Jane Siberry. He then went to New York to guest on the upcoming John & Mary (ex-10,000 Maniacs) album. After that he went to Vancouver for a week to co-write a few songs for Eugene Ripper's new recording.

From Vancouver Wiseman will fly to New York City to perform at an industry showcase at CBGB's on Aug. 29. The next day he'll hop on another plane to join up with Siberry in the United Kingdom. The pair will be splitting a bill for a week of shows in Scotland, Ireland and England.

Immediately upon Wiseman's return to Canada, he will enter CBC's studios to compose the score for each episode of the television show, *Material World*. The weekly program also features *Separated* -- a cut from Wiseman's latest Warner release, *Presented By Lake Michigan Soda* -- as its new theme song. During the weekends of this period, Wiseman will be in various local recording studios working on his next solo project.

Wiseman also provided the mood music for European dance diva Laura Taller's film and dance extravaganza.

The following groups will be opening on the tour's next stops: Furnace Face in Ottawa on Aug. 26; Deadbeat Honeymooners in Winnipeg on Aug. 29; The Kevin Barrett Quartet in Craven, Sask. on Aug. 30; The Grift in Big Valley, Alta. on Sept. 5; and The Grapes Of Wrath in Osoyoos, B.C. on Sept. 6.

The tour opened of Aug. 14 at Quidi Vidi Park in St. John's and drew a record crowd of 33,700. Steve Miller, Extreme and Sass Jordan are also on the bill.

## Debbie Johnson's career makes her dance with joy

Debbie Johnson's day job is history and she's trying to make it history.

The former child performer gained a lot of exposure in the pop/adult market in the mid-1980s, but when it came to the beginning of a new decade, Johnson started fresh too. In the fall of 1990, Johnson decided to take a new, more aggressive direction by giving her material a more dance-oriented edge.

With the help of a team that included former Stampeder and current producer Rich Dodson, composer/arranger Don Breithaupt, and writers Derrick Brin and Brooks Hale, Johnson secured a licensing deal with Keith Brown and Aquarius Records that gave her the support of a committed label with major (Capitol) distribution.

The album that resulted from this group of collaborators, *So Excited*, revealed new dimensions to Johnson's music. The first single, *I'll Respect You*, was a top dance hit and also gave Johnson her first national CHR chart action. *Power To The People*, *Everlasting Love*, and the newest single, *So Excited*, have followed the same course.

Johnson hasn't left her AC past behind her, however. Those stations have been playing *Everlasting Love*, *I Know You Very Well*, *Behind Closed Doors* and *Let Me Go* from the album.

Aquarius has also just released a specially priced compact disc called *The Dance Mix*, which features two new and different versions of each of Johnson's four dance hits.

Johnson's performing schedule has also been busy this summer.

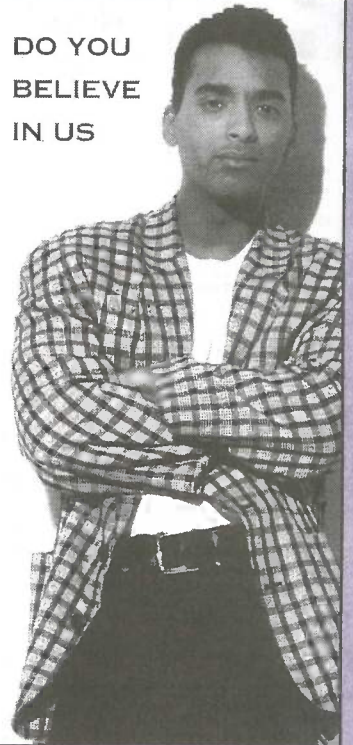

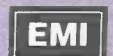

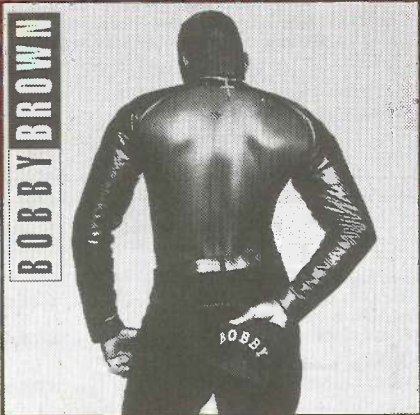
