"Fogie" rock takes a second run via BMG

It's hard to think of a new release schedule bearing the names of Styx, Lynyrd Skynyrd and ELO in this day and age but there it is. And scoff though you might, this could very well be the summer the old fogies bite back, if all goes according to plan for BMG after their acquisition of the CMC International label out of the US. Initially a small management company, CMC shifted gears to an independent label focusing on hard rock acts and gradually developed the concept of signing bands that were "historic" in nature, re-developing established artists as a viable alternative to establishing new ones from scratch.

"We've found there to be a gap in the market, a niche that the majors weren't really paying attention to," says Tom Lipsky, CMC's president. "We decided that was a good market for us to attack because we just felt that there was a lot of consumer interest with certain types of bands and certain schools of music that maybe aren't the trendiest things in the world. Most labels jump on and off trends and sort of ignore things that stay in the middle of the market. We decided to devote ourselves to that."

The decision became a trend in itself, once word of mouth brought many such acts to the label. When substantial, sometimes hefty revenue began

oriented rock bands are definitely more in vogue than they were before," says Lipsky.

Though the long-standing status of many of these bands has been the concert venue, the astonishing thing is that they are not merely rebanding for a last go on the road, but are releasing brand new material. On CMC alone, Pat Benatar, Lynyrd Skynyrd, Bruce Dickinson, Dokken, Slaughter, Warrant, Deep Purple, LA Guns, Yes and Justyn Hayward (from the Moodies) are putting out new material. Ironically, Lipsky says that the label's biggest battle is getting the older consumer to think of classic bands as also being contemporary.

"The trick is how to interest them in the next chapter of the band's history, not just the last chapter," he says. "What we've found in the past year is that radio is helping us with that up till this year CMC has been a very non-radio, non-video alternative marketing type of company that looks for ways to promote directly to the fans without having the more traditional vehicles the label has but all of a sudden even that's changed."

With mainstream rock radio becoming more significant in the US, Lynyrd Skynyrd's first single, Travelling Man, went top 10 and Top 20 on virtually every rock chart across the country. In Canada, both

Lynyrd Skynyrd and Styx have enjoyed a significantly weaker run of their first singles, though Travelling Man broke the top 75.

"I think that interesting people in the next chapter of the band is going to be a lot easier when they get exposed through traditional channels like radio and video," says Lipsky.

Sales for Lynyrd Skynyrd's Twenty continue with a top 200 debut in the US on the

first week out and holding now for seven consecutive weeks. Styx's Return To Paradise is off to a good start with a little over 100,000 units (US) sold in one month. The label is currently putting the emphasis on Pat Benatar (see feature page 7) with 140,000 units of her new album Innamorata which has only been

out two weeks. CMC has bandied Benatar together with Styx for a cross country and international tour.

"Obviously one thing that convinces us that the band still has the public's interest is the fact that they go out and tour successfully and sell merchandise successfully," says Lipsky. "That tells us that their core fanbase is still there and very much interested in the band. Our challenge after that is to convince people to buy new product, not just relive the experience in a concert or buy an old catalogue piece. It's no different than convincing people who have never heard of a band that a new band is worth paying attention to. With us we're already there it's just a matter of getting people to open their mind to new things not just enjoy what they've already done."

It's official, Michael Enright gets CBC Radio plum

CBC Radio's vice-president Harold Redekopp has finally made it official, As It Happens host Michael Enright will anchor a yet-to-be-named morning show to replace Morningside. He will also host Sunday Morning.

Enright, a popular choice, has become a mainstay of CBC evening radio where he has hosted As It Happens since September 1987. Prior to that he was managing editor of CBC Radio News and honed his reporting knowledge and curiosity of world happenings in editorial positions with various newspapers and magazines, including the Globe and Mail, Toronto Star and Quest, Macleans and Time magazines. He goes to air in his new weekday time slot at 9:05 am (9:35 am NT) beginning Labour Day. A search is now on for a female co-host to join Enright.

Redekopp also announced that Mary Lou Finlay will succeed Enright as host of As It Happens with returning Barbara Budd. Over Finlay's 27-year career with CBC, she has co-hosted CBC-TV's The Journal with Barbara Frum and hosted her own Finlay and Company on radio. She joined Sunday Morning as host in 1988, moving to Now The Details in 1994.

Bill Richardson, a Vancouver-based broadcaster and humorist, who has become popular on both CBC Radio and CBC Stereo will now host his own Richardson's Roundup, which airs weekdays at 2:05 pm (2:35 pm NT). The show which will be made up of repeat programming from other CBC Radio and Stereo programs will be spiced up with regularly scheduled items. To be produced in Vancouver by Ted Elvidge of Double Exposure, the show replaces Gabereau.

Canadian astronaut takes Quartetto Gelato into space

Dr. Robert Thirsk, Canada's fifth astronaut, made sure that among the items he took on board the space shuttle Columbia during mission STS-78, were two Ouartetto Gelato CDs.

During his 17-days on the Life and Microgravity Spacelab mission (the longest 'mission in the history of NASA's shuttle flights), Dr. Thirsk spent his relaxing hours listening to the quartet's self-titled debut and the follow-up release Rustic Chivalry. Dr. Thirsk can be credited with taking the music of the popular quartet around the world, in fact 271 times around the world, more than 11 million kilometers.

In a letter to the quartet he made mention of listening to the CDs "when I went to bed at night hanging in my sleeping bag from the ceiling." He first met the quartet during their visit to Houston, last year.

Say what you will about Jon Bon Jovi, this man has carved out a career for himself that few artists have (musicians out of the '80s especially), Mr. Bon Jovi, you will remember, survived the death of glam rock without really changing his shtick all that much, even if the critics were not all pleased that he did. Rather than go the route of some confused minstrel lost in the progressive chords of grunge and industrial rock, Bon Jovi turned his attention to making good pop rock songs, a labour at which he has become extraordinarily adept. Two albums deep into his solo career, he seems not to have skipped a beat and makes his point on three tracks alone; Queen Of New Orleans, Jamie Don't Take Your Love To Town and Midnight In Chelsea. Already the album is falling prey to some ambiguous media responses but here at RPM we just keep listening to those three tracks and seeing a long line of girls in the first row... screaming. Jon Bon Jovi's Destination Anywhere isn't going to change the face of rock and roll and might be guilty of a few lackadaisical moments that could have been saved by a contributing band, but this album is still dependable. We think it will do quite well as Bon Jovi continues to procure the full support of his committed fanbase on the power of consistency and a name well preserved over the years.




JAMES BONAMY Roots And Wings Epic-67878-H

One of the new breed of country youngsters, Bonamy caught fire in the US with his first album, What I Live To Do, and became a media sweetheart. He did fairly well with two of his releases, and has cultured an excellent fan base. Fueled by the success of his current single, The Swing (RPM #29), Bonamy should kick in at retail with this release, produced by Doug Johnson. There's a comfortable feel with Bonamy's vocals and he sometimes stretches beyond his depth, which makes for even keener ear pleasing. He also displays that comfort zone on his lyric interpretation, fitting the character to a storybook tee, in particular with the title track, Some Things I Know and Naked To The Pain. But don't overlook When God Dreams, and Little Blue Dot, which could be a left-fielder. Nice image, and the graphics catch it all. -WG

JIMMY WITHERSPOON With The Junior Mance Trio Stony Plain-1231-P

To listen to "Spoon" is to enjoy a distinct entity. His voice hasn't the robust quality of Jimmy Rushing and his phrasing lacks the silky kinetic of Joe Williams but the sum of his delivery more than equals the totality of the two with whom he's often compared. He's in fine form here in this previously unreleased live performance from France in 1969. Not surprisingly, the ten selection programme is made up of his most popular numbers. You know the ones we mean -- Lowdown Dirty Shame, Kansas City, Ain't Nobody's Business, No Rollin' Blues and the rest. He's given fine support by Junior Mance on piano, Jimmy Woods on bass and Kenny Clarke on drums. Each one of them is known for the restrained accompaniment they lend to performers in support, but they could swing on their own and with a vengeance. Spoon recognized that by giving them virtual free rein on Roll 'Em Pete, a showpiece of swing blues. Good, good

TOMMY BANKS AT THE MONTREUX FESTIVAL Royalty-9752

Edmonton-based, Juno Award winner Tommy Banks has long been a respected pianist, arranger and conductor. In 1978 he put this band together and took it to Montreux where these live recordings were made. Judging by the response of the audience, it was a successful experience albeit in a retro sense. If one doesn't read the liner notes one could think it's the early Kenton band playing. We're talkin' real early; like the forties when it took over from Skinnay Ennis on the Bob Hope radio show. It's more than just a tad pretentious, but that's alright, as in AAAL RIGHT, because it's vital and alive. Banks lets the musicians soar with intense riff lines almost stratospheric. The 13 tracks on two discs (80 minutes in total) are a mixed bag of originals and standards with arrangements mostly by the band personnel. Especially interesting is Cactus. Clever use of high reeds in minor key turns Cactus into a boppy Sweet Georgia Brown. There are a couple of powerful vocals by Clarence "Big" Miller, a former member of Jay McShann's big band who moved to Edmonton in 1970 where he inspired Canadian musicians until his death in 1992. No doubt he was an inspiration in these sessions, but the overall accolade of success belongs to Tommy Banks. -BW



VARIOUS ARTISTS - Soundtrack Everyone Says I Love You RCA Victor-68756-N

Movie soundtracks are frequently less than satisfying because they're scene driven and meaningless away from the theatre. An enjoyable exception is Woody Allen's Everyone Says I Love You. Though not too many people are aware of the fact, Allen is an expert musician who recognizes the fine compositional values of songs written for the movie musicals of the '30s and '40s. A baker's dozen or so of them were used by him in Everyone Says. and they're included here under the direction of Dick Hyman who also arranged them. His arrangements could make anyone sound at least pleasant: assisted by the Helen Miles Singers they can make them sound good. And, so they do here. Among the other vocalists are Ed Norton, Natasha Lyonne, Woody Allen (a light but true voice), Julia Roberts, Goldie Hawn and Alan Alda. The last name is the best. Hearing him sing Cole Porter's little known Looking At You, one can almost imagine it's his father, the late Robert Alda who created the role of Sky Masters in Guys And Dolls. Some of the songs are Just You, Just Me, My Baby Just Cares For Me, I'm A Dreamer, All My Life, Enjoy Yourself, and even the Marx Brothers' Hooray For Captain Spaulding. Anyone can enjoy the album, but fans of old movies will quite fall in love with it. We did. -BW

There is life after All You Can Eat, after all. A quick check of the titles, and you might think k.d. is having us on; Don't Smoke In Bed, Smoke Rings, The Air That I Breathe, Smoke Dreams, My Last Cigarette, Your Smoke Screen, and Love Is Like A Cigarette. Spoof, or not, k.d. still has the magic to turn a listener on. But there's a comfy vocal

niche here, à la Kurt Weil, the master of cabaret. Interesting too, is that a couple of tracks are Cancon. This being an American release, they obviously don't know what a MAPL logo is, but Jane Siberry's Hain't It Funny, a very key track, and David Wilcox's My Old Addiction, which was originally titled Chet Baker's Unsung Swang Song, would both be three-parts Cancon (MAL), not that k.d. needs the Cancon crutch, not yet, anyway. Her cover of Steve Miller's The Joker has been taken as the first single, a track that will impact



immediately. There's obviously some very clever creative behind the smoke, and the lush orchestration, strings, celli and harp are further examples of the genius of k.d. By the way, she adds her production expertise to that of Craig Street and the meeting of minds, and/or chemistry, worked.

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

MOTLEY CRUE Generation Swine

Welcome back to Vince Neil from a defunct career in pornography to reunite the mighty Motley Crue. As pure slime, the Crue have done an admirable job over the years, getting the most out of the snot-nosed boyish insolence to keep a good three generations of high-school kids out of line. And because Generation Swine is a comeback of sorts, you can bet the outhouse that the boys have gone out of their way extra specially to hammer home the fact that they're as maladjusted as ever. But even if Nikki Sixx and co. have spent the past five years smoking in the boy's room, it sounds like they've been listening to a lot more than their old records from the eighties. The NIN and Manson sound that is all the rage among the returning WASPS and repeating Bowies gets its fair shake here but, to the Crue's credit, it comes out sounding pretty darn impressive. The contemporary twist will make sure there are parts of Generation Swine (the first single notwithstanding) that will keep detractors second guessing and fans taking another look, maybe even a long second look. But there is still enough of the old Crue here also, including the sappiest, cheesiest ode a metal head could ever hope to make (Brandon dedicated to Tommy Lee's son) and some echoes from the past. When the band cover Shout At The Devil for the new year it's pretty much game over for the converted and even some of the young rabble rousers out in metal land, all of whom will churn out to any participating stadium to check this band out. Do we really need to tell you how many people lined up last week for the Crue's instore at HMV on Yonge?



PRIDE -Dance/Pop Various Artists Polydor 314 553 743-Q

There is still something nostalgically surreal about songs like Bronski Beat's Smalltown Boy and Soft Cell's Tainted Love. Ten+ years after the fact, it's as if these songs have always quietly throbbed somewhere in the back of the subconscious. In lieu of this, it also seems somewhat besides the point that both songs have become anthems for the gay community at home and around the world -- a fact that has pretty much been irrelevant to their long standing success. But for the gay community, coming out is still a major issue and any artist that has taken it upon him or herself to do so in digital will not soon be forgotten, especially when the music has struck a chord with the populace at large. With Gay Pride day half a week away, a compilation of artists who have done

so is pretty much unavoidable though this Mercury package broadens the scope in selecting their hits. Sure, the staples from Bronski Beat and Soft Cell are here as well as Diana Ross' I'm Coming Out, Gaynor's I Will Survive, Connie Francis' Where The Boys Are and Communards' Never Can Say Goodbye, even if Queer Nation already owns these songs two times over. Which is why Polydor has opted to also include the lesser known second half of Tainted Love (Where Did Our Love Go) a barely recognisable remix of Elton John's Made In England, Salt'N'Pepa's Let's Talk About Sex, Melissa Etheridge's Keep It Precious, Ashley MacIsaac's Brenda Stubbert and songs from Billy Bragg, New Order and Dusty Springfield. The hits date back to the fifties but the spirit of the songs never falters for a second, just one reason why a little retail push could make Pride -- like Pride Day itself a huge summer event.



HOLLY McNARLAND Stuff

You've heard a lot of stuff about Holly McNarland in the recent past but the bottom line on this gal is that she is a freak with an incredible voice. These two points will help clarify the remarkable collection of tracks that comprise her debut album on Universal and the insistence on subversion that plays like a leitmotif all over it. A Vancouver BC discovery, McNarland eked her way into the scene with a six song EP titled Sour Pie that benefited from cyanide laced pop songs and a voice like Sarah McLachlan. Even so, her full length LP argues quite convincingly that McNarland has developed significantly since that time, writing new songs that are commercially more probable and better aligned with the subversive universe of her lyrics. On Water McNarland fantasises of death by drowning; Numb is revealed to be her emotional shell of choice and Elmo gives us nuggets like: 'Didn't have the time of day/ But I fucked him anyway.' All the while the music moves from the hard alternative (Twisty Mirror), dark and stirring (Water), rock pop (Coward) and just plain freaky (Mystery Song). Universal isn't holding back on their find and are servicing the lead-off track (Numb) as the first single, a punchy opener that captures the full story in three minutes. On Stuff, McNarland shows herself to be a contemporary commercial commodity with huge cross-over possibilities, despite her penchant to give the attending world a hearty middle finger. It's a major achievement all things considered that we simply can't overstate enough. Here's another one for Universal's domestic A&R department, who have scored a big three for the summer along with Headstones and The Hip.

The single, released on Hanna's own Psychabilly label, was recorded at Toronto's Metalworks and Studio 1 at London's Fanshawe College. Bill Geffras, who manages a number of country acts, including the Desert Dolphins and Rebecca Timmins, is giving Hanna a hand in building his profile.

Billy Ray Cyrus has a new single and a Best Of CD titled Cover To Cover. It's All The Same To Me, written by the team of Phillips and Laseter, is the focus single and enters the chart at #94. CISS-FM firms names for 5th annual New Country Fest

Some of the big names in Canadian country music will be performing on Canada Day at CISS-FM's 5th annual "free" New Country Music Festival.

Lianne Tapuska of CISS-FM's Promotions lays claim to this year being "the biggest ever. Never before have six acts performed in one afternoon.'

Included in the lineup are Jason McCoy, Joan Kennedy, Julian Austin, Thomas Wade and Wayward, The Mahones and Farmer's Daughter.

Toronto's Kew Gardens is the setting for the festival which begins at noon and runs through to 6 pm. There is also an arts and crafts area, a children's festival complete with magicians, face painters and clowns and lots of food.

Over the years of hosting the festival, CISS-FM has showcased the creme de la creme of Canada's country star system, including Charlie Major, Prairie Oyster, Susan Aglukark, Michelle Wright, the Barra MacNeils and Patricia Conroy.

Tapuska goes on to boast that the concert "is the largest one-day country music festival in the world," last year attracting an audience of more than 100,000. She closes with "CISS-FM is now the most listened to country radio station in the world."

Canada's Ducks surface on European chart

The Mummble Ducks, a roots-based Newmarket, Ontario band, has gained a #20 listing on the European Country Music Association's Top 50 Radio Chart (week ending June 22). The band's single, Harness The Wind, has enjoyed nine weeks of steady gains on the chart which is compiled strictly on airplay reporting by member stations with European coverage.

The ECMA's Independent Chart gives Harness The Wind a #3 slot, behind Don Emerson's Rocky Start at #1, and Prairie Oyster's One Way Track at #2.

The Ducks' previous single, North Channel Blues, sits at #23 on the same chart, and in Italy, The Ducks are #2, just behind Little Texas.

Harness The Wind is the lead track on The Ducks' new Rodeo album, North of the Ridges, which is targeted for a July 1 release in Canada. The album was mixed by Terry Brown. A new single and video is expected at the end of July with live dates planned to support the release.

Stampeders head west for extensive tour dates

Country/rock trio, The Stampeders, launched their Sure Beats Working Tour of western Canada in Lethbridge on June 28. The tour is in support of their first CD release on the Marigold label, distributed by Koch International.

Titled Sure Beats Working, the release marks the 5th anniversary of their reunion concert at the Calgary Stampede in 1992.

The newly-recorded tracks were produced by Rich Dodson at his own Marigold Studios in Toronto. All the material was written by band members, Dodson, Kim Berly and Ronnie King with the exception of several co-writes with Monkey House front man Don Breithaupt and a cover of the Rolling Stones' hit It's All Over Now. Two singles have already been released from the CD, Oh Belinda b/w Carry Me and Hometown Boy, currently charting at #70 on the RPM Country 100.

It's All Over Now, the follow-up to Hometown Boy, was serviced to radio June 10.

The Stampeders, originally from Calgary, gained international fame in 1971 with their mega-hit Sweet City Woman. They went on to release a number of other singles and nine albums until their breakup in 1976. Their other hits included Carry Me, Devil You, Wild Eyes, Oh My Lady, Then Came The White Man, Minstrel Gypsy, Playing In The Band, Hit The Road Jack, New Orleans, Monday Morning Choo Choo, and Keep Me Running Wild. The trio made their first industry appearance in some time at the Big Country Awards (June 1) where Dodson presented the Video of the Year Award, which was won by Paul Brandt for My Heart Has A History.



Hogan, who makes his home in Saanich, BC, has already been firmed to showcase during this year's Canadian Country Music Week in Hamilton which will be followed up by club and concert dates throughout southern Ontario.

Craven A Today's Country continues its Summer Series and on the July 6 edition will air Mila Mason performing several songs from her Atlantic album That's Enough Of That. Mason made her first impact on the industry with her very first single, the title track of her album. The follow-up was her country cover of Amanda Marshall's pop hit, Dark Horse. George Fox also drops by to sing his most recent charted single, I Give You My Word, taken from his Greatest Hits album. The July 13 edition will air Ty Herndon's exclusive performance of a number of his hits

Jason McCoy contiues to make good gains up the chart with Born Again In Dixieland, last week's most added single (#74), which bullets up to #66 this week. His new album, Playin' For Keeps, his second release for Universal, will be in stores on July 8. McCoy, who has been living, writing and performing in Nashville for the past year, co-wrote 11 of the 12 songs on the album, which includes a "countrified-rock" version of Powder Blues' classic, Doin' It Right, which features Delbert McClinton on mouth harp. 

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Pat Benatar still has her best shot

Odd to think that nineteen years ago this brunette with the pouty lips made her first big hit with Heartbreaker, a tune that stormed its way into rock radio on a no nonsense riff and lots of attitude. But nineteen years it has been, six since Pat Benatar's last release culminating a period of long musical transition for the singer. Now a priority for BMG's CMC label, Benatar doesn't quite make the grade as a geezer rock act, but nineteen years is still just one shy of twenty.

Benatar's Innamorata, in stores last week, is the singer's first full-length album of original material in the past five years after departure from Chrysalis label left her with a tour in her hands despite no album. Once the divorce papers with

Chrysalis were finalised, Benatar resisted looking for another label prior to heading into the studio. Along with guitarist/husband and cosongwriter Neil Giraldo, she went on instead to write and record the twelve songs for Innamorata, her first independent release in nineteen years.

"It really was more about making a record without having the label people standing over me," she says in the midst of a cross-country tour with Styx. "We financed Innamorata ourselves and pretty much did everything that we wanted to do for the first time in years."

Once the album was done and bidding season began, Benatar turned to CMC International, who won her over primarily on the enthusiasm they had for her new material. It wasn't necessarily a matter of going with the label because of their experience in working with established artists.

"We respect their position with staying with the older acts that had," says the singer, "they feel that the older acts are still viable and that's great. But they liked the album alot and they were beside themselves. You can't buy that kind of enthusiasm."

The enthusiasm came out of Innamorata's startingly fresh acoustic centred sound which CMC president Tom Lipsky believed would seduce the target demographic -- mainly comprised of Benatar's early fans -- into supporting a new stage in the artist's career. The rockier Strawberry Wine, which is being used to introduce the album to radio, represents Benatar as a more sophisticated musician albeit still vigorous with electric guitar and unflinching vocals. At 43 years of age, she says mellowing was just not part of the plan.

"That's not what this is about you know," says Benatar, "I didn't want this to be an unplugged thing and neither did Neil, we still wanted to move the air. Really that's what we still love to do,

it's just that you want to augment it and expand on it so it wasn't so narrow in its base. So that's pretty much what

we wanted to do; try to get a little more scope out of it but still be able to move air."

While the summer concert run with Styx continues, Benatar is playing directly to those fans that made her into a superstar of a decade past. Accordingly, she has divided her set neatly in half, with fifty percent of the material culled directly from the earlier albums like Crimes Of Passion, Promises In The Dark and Anxiety. All of a sudden, at the mere mention, the nineteen years of performing begin to show.

"I'm probably going to dump Hit Me With Your Best Shot," she states. "We usually do it and have the audience come up

and sing it because I hate singing it. I feel that the response to the new songs is better anyway and twenty years is enough don't you think?. I sometimes do Heartbreaker because it's real fun but it's a little hard to sing 'you're a real tough cookie' at my age."

Large turnout expected for Midem Latin America

With two months to go, the Reed Midem Organization, has high expectations of a very heavy turnout for its first Midem Latin America & Caribbean Music Market. The conference, to take place in Miami Beach, Florida, will run from Sept. 7 through 11.

At press time, 128 companies from 23 countries have already registered. A total of 3,000 industry professionals are expected.

Scheduled are eight conferences which will focus on major trends and recent developments in the music market of the Latin American and Caribbean regions. The keynote address will be delivered by Manoio Diaz, of PolyGram USA.

Panels will include a special on Brazil; copyright and publishing; the current situation of collecting societies and authors' rights; a debate on A&R, marketing strategies and promotional activities; and on how Latin music seduces Europe.

Besides Diaz, other high-profile industry personalities firmed to take part are Gabriel Abaroa, President, Flexo (USA), Eduardo Bautista, President del Consejo de Dirección, SGAE (Spain); Edmundo Monroy Ortiz, Gerent General, EDIMUSA (Mexico); and Dario Rodriguez Miglio, Director of Foreign Affairs, SADAIC (Argentina).

The Canadian Independent Recording Producers Association (CIRPA) will also be hosting what's expected to be a large Canadian contingent at its Canada Stand, which will be manned by CIRPA President Brian Chater and stand coordinator Mary Vrantsidis. A separate report on Canada's participation will follow over the next few weeks.

A Song for Canada ready for Canada Day

Fergus, Ontario songwriter Paul Hock has written A Song For Canada, described as "a compelling message to all the adults of this country." The CD single was shipped to more than 300 radio stations across Canada two weeks prior to Canada Day (July 1).

Hock's vocals are complemented by a children's choir. The single was taken from Hock's upcoming CD and tape release entitled So Many Songs. The album was produced by Domenic DiGravio and recorded at L.A. Sound in Guelph.
