The rise of Montreal's Bran Van 3000

Of the few acts that cleaned up at MuchMusic's annual Video Awards Show, Bran Van 3000 ought to receive the heartiest congratulations. The nine member collective rose from complete obscurity in some three months to claim two awards, Best Dance Video and the VideoFACT Award, both for their hugely successful Drinking In L.A. video. This after the band's album, titled Glee, veritably flew off the shelves to make a short but not unnoticed run on the national album chart.

"I'm still surprised," exclaims Jaimie Di Salvio, the Bran Van collective's self-titled Bran Man. "It's a very indie sounding record but there's a commercial side of it that is strange and welcome."

Strange, yes. Bran Van 3000 is, in Di Salvio's own words, a chaotic musical monster whose genesis occurred over one long jam session in his Montreal living room. Employing a virtually unheard of "open door policy," Bran Man and fellow brainiac E.P. (Electronic Pierre) recorded and mixed over forty hours worth of music from some 26 musicians over the period of a year and a half. The bulk of material collected, the duo then set about to edit and pare down, loop and refine, armed with the fine art of gadgetry manipulation and determined to give life to a harmonious yet oddly surreal weavework of musical forms, formats and instrumental voices. "Progressive throwback is a good way of describing it," offers Di Salvio. "I like electronic music and I also like old country music; I like punk, I like it all. I think the idea was to play with contrast, like in film-making it's fun to have contrasts. Whether it's intensity or drama, instead of doing it at night, shoot it during the day time, you know. So if it's a drum & bass riff, why not put in a country music song over it or put on an eighties riff over a

hip hop or electronic jam? There's no formula really, there is no plan."

While Glee ambles out into the open armed world, a bidding war begins in the US which has understandably caught the attention of the band. Which seems even stranger than ever, taking into account what BV3 has shaped for its future: according to Di Salvio it includes songs that are twenty five minutes in length and as format-stable as a mad scientist. One can't argue with success however, and the public is responding.

"It's really amazing to see a mix of kids and scenesters and some people in their thirties who haven't moshed for a long time get down and dirty on the mosh floor," notes Di Salvio. "You wouldn't tell on the record," he confides, "but live it's a lot more gritty or rough; the record's the record and live is another thing."

Bran Van 3000 continue to tour through Canada into the new year as Glee gets ready to hit the international marketplace. Look for follow up singles and a return to MuchMusic, where video makes a welcome platform for Bran Van 3000's complex artistic -- and cinematic -- vision.

Making a mountain out of a Sour Landslide

Pretty much everything that ever came out of highschool can be relegated into two categories: those things which were among the most memorable moments of our lives, and those things which we would like to forget -- forever. But seldom does something other than memories come out of that period, certainly not something with any serious clout to it, like a good, strong, rock and roll for instance. And yet, this is exactly where Toronto's Sour Landslide fashioned their musical training wheels, learned how to ride and then set off on a musical trek that has recently claimed some approval with a first album, appropriately titled They Promised Us Jobs.

The album was pounced on this June by Shake The Record Label, barely two months after the band began shopping it around. The quick response was due to a positively poppy, subversively punky selection of tunes brought to junky finesse by a stripped down setup of a bass, guitar and drums. But for all of its boyhood charm and three chord naivete, Sour Landslide adds a wallop to its pop punches that makes every one of these tunes as memorable as all of those good highschool memories. Drummer Dee Horvath explains it this way:

"A lot of the music was pretty much weeded out before we got to the album stage," she says. "It wasn't like we had twenty songs and had to go, which ones do we pick?, you know. We had already put together a group of songs where the ones we weren't as thrilled about had been thought about long before. With this band, if we don't like it, it goes and that's because sometimes something about it just isn't right. You're going to be playing these songs all the time and you want to be pretty much as proud as you can of them and if that's not happening right off the bat then sometimes it's not going to happen."

Horvath met and started "hacking around" with guitarist Vince Nicholson in highschool (*where else does anyone hack around?-Ed.*). The two were joined by Vince's cousin for a brief period of "really bad shows" before recruiting Vince's brother Vern for bass duties. They decided, shortly thereafter, to give a serious attempt to producing a full-length record and to shop it, though the realities of a posthighschool existence made for some trying times.

"It's tough to play music and do all the regular things you're supposed to," notes Horvath, "try to make money and actually do well. It's a big struggle and this CD is about our struggle and the struggle of all the people that we know, students, engineers working at K-Mart, whatever."

Talking 'bout their generation? Absolutely. "I hope it does well," says Horvath, "with people buying the album and with the shows; we

hope the fans develop." They might not have promised them jobs, but Sour Landslide won't be standing in line anytime soon. In fact, the word out is that they'll be making them.



Urban music gets venue in Ottawa

Now that urban music has broken in a serious way into retail charts, Canadian club owners are responding accordingly. The country is slowly coming around, most recently in Ottawa where EDAC Entertainment teamed up with The Coconut Groove Restaurant/Dance bar for the city's first live music venue strictly dedicated to promoting urban music. According to a press release issued last week, the club will be booking acts that cover the spectrum of the genre including reggae, soul, R&B, soca, hip hop, African, Caribbean, jazz and worldbeat acts and appearances from local DJs.

"In the past, the biggest obstacle for local performers and promoters was finding a venue that was receptive to urban music," commented EDAC Entertainment spokesperson Stephane Lecuyer, "this will no longer be a problem with the Coconut Groove."

The newly renovated club which is entering its third year of existence, decided on the format change to coincide with a change of address (it is currently located at 1724 Bank Street). Owners expect the club will make a stir that is comparable to the Bamboo Club in Toronto, after which it has been fashioned.

"The most frustrating thing for us was not having a venue to develop smaller Canadian urban acts," said Lecuyer. "Most R&B and hip hop acts do not play with live musicians, they perform live to track, which is not acceptable in most live rock venues. This will not be a factor for the Coconut Groove; the club will adjust to the urban culture, not the other way around."



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THE ROLLING STONES -Rock Bridges To Babylon Virgin 44712-F

Some guy recently dropped by the office and mentioned how he had a soft spot for the Stones and how could he not like the first single? Well, it appears that a hell of a lot of people have a soft spot for the Stones; after a miraculous 30 years, this band simply refuses to become history. As you should have already noticed, the single in question -- the first from their new album -- made a record-breaking debut on BDS charts and cleaned up on RPM's Alternative 30 (#1 debut) as well as on Hits 100 (#20 -- highest debut for the week). Not surprisingly, Anybody Seen My Baby? is headed for the top of the charts this week and no telling how long it will remain perched there, vet another testimony to the lasting power of this band. As with every album the Stones have released in the past twenty years, Bridges To Babylon is the focus of overwhelming media and consumer interest which will guarantee an explosive retail for the first several weeks. What will contribute to longevity in sales, however, is the music itself; stirring junk chunky rock'n'roll tracks like Flip'n'Switch and Already Over Me and derivatives like You Don't Have To Mean It and Out Of Control. Richards, who has miraculously survived as the group's central creative energy, contributes some colour on You Don't Have To Mean It and the album's soft shoe closer called How Can I Stop. Easily the Stones' most well rounded release in a while and their best bet, this side of 1990, at another Tattoo You. Produced by Don Was and The Glimmer Twins. -RG

WE WILL FALL: -Alternative THE IGGY POP TRIBUTE Various Artists - Attic 1492-J

A tribute to Iggy Pop is probably the most inevitable undertaking that modern rock could possibly assign for itself. Iggy Pop was, after all, one of the chief preservatives of bad boy antics to a musical form that lapsed into pseudo academia in the '70s and synthetic counterfeit in the '80s. Throughout it, Iggy Pop



continually hammered home a pospel of defiance and sophisticated raunch that evolved him into a confusing pop icon; as much an art vogue creation fit enough to hang with Warhol and Bowie and pure punk trash with affinities to G.G. Allen. And with the '90s return to those sensibilities. Pop easily inherited the world as a grandfather of rock'n'roll and legend in his own time. Which brings us to this release, and strange way these participating bands fit into the mould of an Iggy or a Stooges tune; check out Joey Ramone regress a good twenty years when he does 1969, same thing for Red Hot Chili Peppers on Search And Destroy, Joan Jett & The Blackhearts on Real Wild Child and Superdrag on 1970. The punk sector makes its appearance through Misfits (I Got A Right), Lunachicks (The Passenger) and 7 Year Bitch (Shake Appeal) and appearances from Adolph's Dog (Ordinary Bummer), Jayne County (Down On The Street/Little Doll), Sugar Ray (Cold Metal) and Nada Surf (I'm Sick Of You) cover some of Pop's far flung influences. Lots of good stuff here that will mean some celebrating for Pop's insatiable audience and -RG some education for the young 'uns.

COMPADRES

Compadres Jericho Beach 9701-Festival

Whatever you do, do not underestimate this duo of complementary guitarists made up of James Keelaghan and Oscar Lopez. The two Compadres are taking a stab at a guitarcentred Celtic and Latino hybrid they refer affectionately to as "Celtino." The results are startlingly fluid and rely a great deal for effect on the acoustic flair of the two musicians and on the strength of their vocals. Keelaghan and Lopez are hardly strangers to the biz, having individually received Juno nominations (Lopez) and awards (Keelaghan) for solo work in the past. Their coming together for this project is occasion for the possibility of music that is a stranger to either of the circles of folk. Celtic or Latino music. Even so, the two manage to make their sound a welcome one to those formats, and lovers of acoustic guitar music will find a lot of points of familiarity with the music on this disc. Sales of the album have



mirrored that easy infectiousness and have opened our eyes to future releases from Jericho Beach Music, Canada's new world music label. Compadres continue to cris-cross the country with club and festival dates; do yourself a huge favour and lend your eyes and ears to this fascinating and unique musical gem. -RG

LOCAL HEROES -Pop/Country A Different Light Lookout 00197

This humble piece of mainstream rock comes to us from the independent sea to ode us with an album's worth of soundly rendered pop songs. Not even a year on the Toronto scene, the quintet of musicians has already made an impression with the industry, garnering a first place award from the Mix 99.9's 8th annual songwriting competition and FACTOR's New Talent Demo Award (with which the band recorded this debut album). They achieved those noteworthy honours with a warm pop song called I Believe and a natch for streamlining a lot of natural rhythm into 11 original compositions. The title track offers a warm rock track with heat from keyboards. passionate vocals and heartfelt lyrics and The



Answer gives a rocky answer to an age old question, while Don't Have The Time, Tired Soul and Horrible Day throw a country guitar into the mix. The group's strengths remain in pop that has ancestry in country music, but Local Heroes' treatment of the form keeps them in a relatively label free zone of independence. This is possibly the greatest accolade we can bestow on this band; that somehow they are giving a subtly original voice to a format which is shot through with commercial familiarity. 

Former country radio programmer Bill McNeil took the youngster under his wing and produced this album which was recorded at In Session Recording in Truro, Nova Scotia. JANN ARDEN

Happy? A&M 31454 0789-Q

One of the big reasons this once-busker from Calgary enjoyed such a meteoric rise to the top is because, throughout her arduous history, Jann Arden retained a tight grip on the art of writing *songs*. Now, one million albums later, she has flourished into a

consummate songwriter, having cultivated some sort of Gnostic access to the touchstone of universal emotions while nevertheless remaining within the humble confines of acoustically designed pop. Of course, with producer Ed Cherney behind the console and a band that boasts names like Jim Keltner and Kenny Aronoff, Arden's acoustic ditties get to blossom into the full bloom of crossover pop. Happy? showcases a spectrum of musical expression in the first four tracks alone, most substantially with The Sound Of which, not surprisingly, has benefitted from a huge surge of radio interest across the country. The song, like much of the material on this album, will easily do its bit in that arena, though it seems a shame to simply



reduce this album to its retail value. Happy? is a delicately designed, thoughtful record, easily Arden's most forward looking effort and a strong commercial contender that nevertheless resists sounding like it's trying to be. Arden herself has said that she is repeatedly overwhelmed by the amount of faith her record company places in her creative powers (ie. the label reputedly does not preview her demos). Happy? is probably the single most facile argument as to why that is the case. With an artist like Jann Arden -who has and will continue to reap huge international successes -- that's saying a hell of a lot. -RG just one example, the familiar I Loves You Porgy might well be a piece of exotica by Martin Denny. It's eminently and enjoyably listenable, but where is Gershwin? And, where for that matter, is full measure of Miss Lerner? The album shouldn't be judged good field, no hit, but we look forward to Miss Lerner's next in expectation and hope that there will be more of her on it. Produced by Larry Cramer. EVGENY KISSIN - Classical Beethoven Piano Concertos 285 James Levine Conducting Sony Classical-62926-H

Beethoven is best remembered and revered by many for his mighty symphonies. It's regrettable because his five known concert's are worthy of at least equal appreciaton. The first and last of them (see the splendid liner



notes for explanation of a seeming discrepancy of chronology) are superbly presented here by the young Russian piano ace with the Philharmonia Orchestra conducted by James Levine. There's really little for us to write. The music stands by itself and is performed immacuately by the orchestra and soloist. We must object however to the statement of a commentator on Canada's tax supported radio network. He opined that Mr. Kissin lacks emotional exuberance in the rondo/allegro movements. Nonsense! He, the so-called critic, would seem to have been so entranced by the pianist's unchallengeable technical dexterity that he couldn't recognize the joy in execution. Violinist Jascha Heifetz used to be an occasional recipient of the same bad rap. To be fair, the commentator was voicing only his opinion, but it distresses one to have opinion implied as fact over a medium for which we're paying with tax dollars. Sorry for the editorializing. Just enjoy the album, especially the exuberance in the rondo/allegro movements. And, remember that our opinion -BW hasn't cost you in tax dollars.

CATHERINE ROBBIN & PAUL NICHOLSON Passion And Piety Marguis Classics-193-F

The title and cover art could be remindful of a bodice ripper novel by Barbara Cartland. Recordings are like books however and shouldn't be judged by covers. What one enjoys on this album are not naughty or hypocritical airs. They are religious or concertsongs written by Haydn, C.P.E.Bach, Beethoven and Schubert sung impeccably by mezzo-soprano Catherine Robbin accompanied with equal impeccability by Paul Nicholson. If we've perhaps over used references to that quality of presentation, it's because we'are so much taken with the artistry displayed by both. The



works are difficult to perform; so much so that they often become like mere disciplinary exercises for artists and listeners both. Here however, the passion and the piety are actually and wonderfully conveyed. In truth, to say anything else would be to gild the lilly, which is unnecessary. What's necessary is that lovers of music that is intellectual but frissoned with high emotion should enjoy this excellent production. Permit us to add to the above which was intended as the full review. We were listening again to Uber die Finsternis and Die Gütes Gottes just after the funeral of Lady Diana. MONTY ALEXANDER - Cocktail Jazz Echoes Of Jilly's Concord Jazz/St,Clair Ent-4769

Cocktail jazz is played in smart clubs by quartets or trios featuring piano as lead, usually on standards. More like swing actually. In the fifties, the best spot of all to hear it was Toronto's Club One Two by José Mélis, Bill Butler and others. In the sixties the scene changed to Jilly's in NYC. It was favoured by Frank Sinatra who especially enjoyed the piano stylings of Monty Alexander when he, Sinatra, was in a good mood (we could be wrong, but think it was Jilly's where Don Rickles said to him, "Make yourself at home Frank. Slug somebody.") On the album under consideration that same Monty Alexander ably assisted by John Patitucci on acoustic bass and Troy Davis on drums, plays covers of standards



associated with Francis A. Included among the 13 tracks are The Summer Wind, All The Way, Come Fly With Me, and In The Wee Small Hours Of The Morning. That random sampling will let you know that the album is u pbeat for the most part. Monty A. is in notably full flight with Just One Of Those Things. This reviewer isn't going to comment on what makes each of the tracks seem special. There isn't enough space and anyway, the liner notes of Will Friedwald are well nigh definitive. So too are the interpretations of Monty Alexander. Good, good album. -BW




