

Jason Priestley named Juno host

It almost came down to the line, but the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS) has finally named the host of this year's Juno Awards. Vancouver's Jason Priestley, who is currently residing at Beverly Hills 90201, will come home to host the Canadian music industry's national treasure

Although Priestley was a vibrant member of Canada's commercial/jingle industry and had appeared in his first telefilm by the age of eight, it wasn't until after he left Canada when he was recognized for his acting and directing talent. He is a two-time Golden Globe nominee for his starring role (Brandon Walsh) in the Beverly Hills series where he also now enjoys the title of executive producer.

Priestley's music connection includes director credits for the Barenaked Ladies video of The Old Apartment, which gained him a best director nomination at MuchMusic's 1996 music video

Headlining the Juno Awards will be double Grammy winner Sarah McLachlan, reigning country

music queen Shania Twain; Jann Arden, fresh from her emcee chore at the first Canadian Radio Music Awards (Mar. 6); Leahy, Our Lady Peace and jazz

The Juno Awards goes to air March 27 live on CBC Television at 8 pm from Vancouver's GM Place. The Juno Awards are a co-production of CBC-TV and CARAS and is produced by John Brunton, Joan Tosoni, Martha Kehoe and Sue

Livent to liven up Toronto's downtown core

The plans have been in the making since 1989 when Livent's Garth Drabinsky, contacted world renowned architect Moishe Safdie, an Officer of the Order of Canada, to come up with a design that would create an entertainment complex in Toronto's downtown

Drabinsky had been promising for a number of years to build another theatre adjacent to the Pantages Theatre, which has entrances on both Yonge Street and Victoria Street. At a media reception in the Pantages Theatre, Drabinsky unveiled his plans, complete with a scale model of his new venture, which will not only include a 1400 seat theatre, expanded backstage area for the Pantages, a retail mall and a 41-storey tower.

The lower floors of the tower, which will be operated by Wyndham International, will be taken up with a 313 room luxury hotel, which will be topped by 192 condominium units.

A 300-space underground parking garage, the theatre and the retail mall, which faces Victoria Street, is now underway and when completed is expected to cost \$30 million.

The tower is being developed by Dundee Reality Corporation and is expected to come in around \$80 million.

The new entertainment complex which will encompass the existing Pantages Theatre, will be known as the AT&T Centre For The Performing Arts.

As Safdie pointed out, he presented a number of designs over the years, starting with two towers, then one tower and changes in the theatre and the hotel and condominium complex. Drabinsky took an active part in the planning of the complex, working closely with Safdie who had also designed Drabinsky's Ford Centre For The Performing Arts in Vancouver.

It's expected Drabinsky's entertainment complex will be completed early in 2000.

McLachlan and Morissette pick up Grammy honours

Although we lost more Grammy awards then we won, Canada's recording industry can be proud of torch bearers Vancouver's Sarah McLachlan and Ottawa's Alanis Morissette for keeping the Cancon torch burning. McLachlan won two awards, her first, for best female pop vocal performance and for Building A Mystery and for best pop instrumental for Last Dance, while Morissette won best long-form music video for Jagged Little Pill.

It was obvious from the audience reaction to McLachlan's win that her Lilith Fair was revered internationally. Interesting too was the wins by McLachlan's fellow Lilith Fair tour members Shawn Colvin, who won best record and song for Sunny Came Home, and Paula Cole got the nod for best new artist. She also performed her song Where Have All The Cowboys Gone?

It was disappointing that both Celine Dion and Bryan Adams lost in their categories of duets with Barbra Streisand. McLachlan also lost out to James Taylor in the best pop album category.

perennial winner, St. Catharines polka king Walter Ostanek, was dethroned by American Jimmy Sturr. Another Canadian, John Gora and his band Gorale, from Burlington, Ontario were also competing in that category.

Vancouver's Long John Baldry, nominated for The Original Story of Winnie The Pooh, lost out in the children's album category to the late Charles Kuralt's Winnie-the-Pooh.

Also from the west coast, jazz singer Diana Krall, lost out in the best jazz vocal performance category to Dear Ella by Dee Dee Bridgewater.

In the best musical-show album category,

Chicago won over the Toronto cast recording of Ragtime.

In the non-musical performing category of best liner notes. Memorial University (St. John's) folklore professor Neil Rosenberg, won for his notes on a series of historic recordings issued by the US Smithsonian Institute.

The Canadian performing image was also squeaky clean with performances by Celine Dion, Sarah McLachlan, and Diana Krall. Dion was to have performed a duet with Barbra Streisand of their nominated song Tell Him, but Streisand had to pull out because of illness. Dion instead performed My Heart Will Go On, which is currently #1 on both the RPM Hit Tracks and A/C charts.

Newman names Cooke and Raaflaub in Warner shuffle

Back from Florida for a brief vacation in celebration of his appointment to senior VP and GM at Warner Music Canada, Gary Newman made two important announcements upon his return. Kim Cooke is now the senior VP and managing director of the company's US division while Doug Raaflaub takes the newly created position of director, national sales and marketing. Both appointments are effective immediately.

Cooke has over 22 years of industry experience under his belt, commencing with Sam The Record man, Muntz Canada and continuing with 20 years of committed work at Warner. Cooke will report directly to Newman. Raaflaub, who will report to both Cooke and Dave Tollington, has spent the past 16 years with the Warner family from the humble beginnings at the order desk. He will oversee the sales and marketing for both the domestic international and the US divisions.

"By promoting veterans, we'll be staying in the same direction that we've always headed on," commented Newman last week. He also took the opportunity to state that he foresees making no major changes to the company's policies or strategies in the upcoming year.

"We're a strong company as it is," he said, "so I don't see any need. From now until the end of the year I'm not going to do anything anyway, I'm just going to take it easy, watch everybody and see what happens."

Nevertheless, Newman predicted a banner year for Warner in 1998, primarily from major new releases from Eric Clapton, Madonna, Page & Plant and Van Halen. Their Spring and Summer release schedule will also include records from Seal,



Brandy, Jim Cuddy, The Killjoys, Barenaked Ladies and a European hip hop act called Cleopatra.

"It's going to be interesting," said Newman, who also told RPM that the company's past year "wasn't great, it was ok."

Asked whether he had any goals that he had put on himself for the 1998 year, he responded: "I want to make it through the year without my hair turning the same colour as Stan's."

A tribute to women!!! Each year, Variety pays tribute to three Canadian women, and this year the luncheon attracted a packed concert hall at the Royal York Hotel. Fashion Television's Jeanne Beker emceed the show which gave the nod to Dr. Anne Golden, Ann Rohmer and Leeanne Weld Kostopoulos. In his introductory remarks, veteran tunesmith Tony Hatch, you got his title from above, revealed that 20 per cent of Variety's UK membership is now female. 

ERIC CLAPTON Pilgrim Reprise 46577-P

Although we at the office allow ourselves a perverse sense of humour when it comes to Eric Clapton, we do so partly because he (of all people) can afford it. After all, the man has been critical to and all but become omnipresent in the history of modern music, Clapton in 1998 has pretty much progressed beyond a larger than life status; he keeps a pretty low profile and seems dedicated to his thing, but he's always there, as synonymous with western rock music as The Beatles. It's a little daunting -- in the shadow of that reality -- to review his material with any degree of objectivity. Harder still when we realize that Clapton's star has hardly faded; he currently enjoys the highest degree of wide popularity in some 40+ years of playing and creating music, this despite a nine year hiatus since a last full-length album. But we delay the inevitable; our appraisal of his newest release, titled Pilgrim, certainly one of Clapton's most cultivated, mellifluous bodies of work. To say he has developed his craft to almost parental affinities doesn't quite break the cliché, but you get the idea. Pilgrim, for all of it's soft adult contemporary savvy, has everything great music is about; passion, scope, talent and an astonishing wealth of remarkable songs. My Father's Eyes, which was championed by radio the second the single was serviced, is a very telling indicator for what we may expect in the coming year. Sure, critics will be critics and hey, the guys at the office will still crack a joke or two in his direction, but that won't change the fact that this man was born to make music, and make it well. -RG

RUSTY -Alternative **Out Of Their Heads** Handsome Boy 0022-N

Full of surprises -- and then some. That's how we would describe Rusty's third release in one line. But we have a little more space than that, though (before we really get to it) we'd like to make an aside about how fucking great those bands are who keep us interested, dammit. It would have been the easiest thing for these



guys to put out another Sophomoric; after all, the album had some single power in its muffler and upped the ante on their rapidly-becominglegendary first release Fluke, Now, three albums deep, the boys decide to spin the chairs around, go liberal on the hallucinogenics and release an album that has equal parts rock, garage, pop, psychedelia and surf all distilled through a gloriously confused 60s/70s groove. Out Of Our Heads is a fun, extremely playable album that sucks you through a vacuum of carefree summery music right from the first track. We divvy up the selection in the following way: cool tunes (Rider, Get Outta My Way), way-out-but-still-in tunes (Feel The Vibe, Country Punk) and classic tunes (I'm Hungry, La Craqua), Hard Core Logo's Let's Break Robert Out Of Jail sqwaks in here as well as a cover of Kinks' Till The End Of The Day and Velvet Underground's Sunday Morning. Despite the general aura of light-headed lunacy that governs the sessions, the aptly titled Out Of Their Heads is fine testament that Rusty are one of the few really indie, really thinking, really interesting bands out there. Whatever we expected from them, one thing is for sure; we didn't expect this. And that ain't a complaint. -RG

MYSTERY MACHINE -Alternative Headfirst Into Everything Nettwerk 30122-F

We first heard Vancouver's Mystery Machine on the soundtrack for that Foxfire film that came out a while ago. The track (a convoluted mix of electronica and pop), isn't quite what



we have here on their first formal debut on Nettwerk Records. Headfirst Into Everything is really a standout album which is receiving strong reviews with media and for good reason. A track called YTV initiates the situation, and it's an intelligent, sensible bit o' rock pop with bite to its sound wrapped in a catchy riff. That is followed up by the winner combination of Gleam and Wake Up Pill, later on by a song called I'm Not Anything, all of which grasp originality and workability of successful songwriting in this format. There are a lot of ideas here, but somehow, the foursome of Mystery Machine make it all come together in a tight, fluid package. I'm Not Anything is vibrant and lasting, What I Want is perfectly rendered and Ditch is the last in a long line of radio centred progressive rock tracks. Not surprising that Nettwerk is touting the band as one of their big favourites for the year and have already gotten them an instore at HMV in February to prove the point (there are also plans to bring the band back into Toronto in March). There will be some opportunity to head out and give them a listen and we strongly urge you to make the best of it.

BIF -Alternative I Bificus

Aguarius 00584-F

Bif, or Bif Naked if you prefer, is first and foremost a personality. Make that a PERSONALITY. It's something that's not just evident from the title of her album alone, or in the lyrics that graffiti the jacket of the inner sleeve; Bif's larger than you personality is most palpably evidenced through her vocal delivery of these songs. They are not only sung but dominated by this tattooed demi-goddess, start to finish. Logically, I Bificus (the Vancouver artist's sophomore effort) is pretty much about the cult of Bif, rapidly growing on the Internet



and in concert halls across Canada. Her approach is simple; she talks about herself and tells it like it is, strong, butchy, sexy, funny, crazy darling of the camera eye she is. Musically, she teeters between accessible pop and progressive alternative, punk in attitude, but quite inoffensive in content once you get down to it. She's got, for example, the nicest broken heart gripe songs, be they devoted to boys (Chotee) or girls (Sophia). Bif will undoubtedly make her mark in the music biz in the upcoming year, primarily because she's receiving a promotional push the likes of which she hasn't benefitted from before. For an average band, that would mean more fans and greater sales; for Bif it means world domination. Or so she seems to say. You'll hear her on radio with Spaceman but we reckon the results will be coming in from video where the visuals will ram home her point. If you believe her and fall for her album, then Bif is already a star. -RG

NANCY WHITE - Comedy/Pop Gaelic Envy and other torch songs Borealis-109

Tailored to the funnybone of White fans and guaranteed to add to that legion. White can now carry the "incomparable" tag with impunity, unless that east coast Gaelic crowd can find something to complain about. White spoofs life, her life, most of which took place in the Atlantic Provinces, so consequently, she's spoofing that region. And she lays it all out in precise candor in revealing liner notes. Like Moose On The Highway, which she wrote with producer Bob Johnston. And then there's the title track, and of course, Pierced Matron (see cover). She might be stretching it a bit, but that downhome humour is what makes White so entertaining. Is it possible to mix "Gaelic envy"



ROBBIE ROBERTSON Contact From The Underworld of Red Boy Capitol 54243-F

It's no secret that Robbie Robertson has gradually been gravitating closer and closer to home -- home, in his case, is the native American community of his heritage. And as the title of the album intimates, Robertson has finally come home, producing an album from the heart of a land touched by ancient voices and contemporary tribal chants. The resulting mix is not quite a native American record, though it is a courageous attempt at coming as close to it as possible while still maintaining a clear head above the water. Robertson describes it this way: "It isn't much different than the beginning of rock'n'roll, when this music came down from the mountains and this other music came up from the Delta and when they met in the middle it made for something exciting and refreshing, new and old at the same time, moving ahead and yet paying respect to the original roots music of North America." Robertson's keen aesthetic ear is what maintains the balance on this

record and allows for music that is true to its vision yet mindful about Robertson's musical career What could have been an exercise in self-indulgence and crass pontification emerges as a courageous vision clothed in the moving narratives of a culture still vibrantly musical and vibrantly alive. Unbound has been chosen as the first offering and will undoubtedly become a cause celebre among programmers but the album really ought to be heard in its entirety. Appearances here from Leonard Peltier, Priscilla Coolidge, Laura Satterfield, Bonnie Jo Hunt and Joanne Shenandoah, to name a few, and production by Howie B






CARLOS BARBOSA O Botto

HARRY CHAPIN - Classic Pop The Bottom Line Encore Collection Bottom Line/Page-34404-74012

The name Harry Chapin is magic to those folkies from the coffee house days of the '70s. He also enjoyed a brief period of success in the early '80s. This is Chapin's performance at New York's Bottom Line, a two CD set, which was recorded live in 1981, six months prior to his death. The Bottom Line date was actually his 2000th concert performance. The tracks are most memorable, including Taxi, his first RPM 100 single, which went to #5 on May 27/ 72; W*O*L*D, which was also a charted item; and Cats In The Cradle, perhaps his most venerable outing, which peaked at #3 (Jan. 11/



73). Also includes I Wanna Learn A Love Song. and Sequel, which were also charted. Sequel had never been previously available on a live recording. These are all Chapin's signature songs, and besides those mentioned are treasures and include Mismatch, Old Folkie, Remember When The Music, Mr. Tanner, and A Better Place. It should also be noted that Chapin was one of the first recording acts to target and support hunger causes, which led to Feed Our Children. Oak Leaf-2109 For their tenth album, classical Celtists Barnes and Hampton have tried a new twist. In addition to their more or less usual and impeccably performed Celtic favourites they have included what are probably best described as American



popular standards. Among them are Jelly Roll Morton's Buddy Bolden's Blues, Django Reinhardt's Tears, Joplin's Sunflower Slow Drag and Fats Waller's Ain't Misbehavin'. One applauds the apparent good intention of broadening their listener base but the suspicion here is that they might have alienated regular fame and offended possible new ones. You see, while the skill of the artists is beyond dispute, it remains that American jazz simply doesn't lend itself to expression by medieval instruments. Truth to tell, the attempt is almost laughable. The best tracks here are those featuring this talented duo doing what they do best. The Western Wind and Thomas Moore's Oft In The Stilly Night, as cases in point, are goosebumpingly chilling. As for the rest? Well, thanks for the college try, but no thanks.

CMW stages second coming of St. John's rock quartet

Dead Reckoning make instinct second nature

Dead Reckoning: navigational term; finding your way from A to B without the aid of standard navigational tools; ie. by instinct.

If ever a band was more appropriately named, this St. John's Newfoundland rock and roll quartet would be it. Their namesake isn't just a cool handle to ink posters by and name websites after, it's a way of life the band have opted to hold very dear to their hearts. And their hearts isn't to be found in their mouths.



Dead Reckoning, you'll remember, enjoyed a warm reception last year at the heels of their third independently released album titled Time's Time. A single came out of that album, called Don't Waste A Day, and it worked a mean magic on radio, where

it also initiated band appearances on Dinni Petty, Midday and MuchMusic, who had put the video into regular rotation. In the wake of that response, it was only logical for label moguls to begin courting sessions (undoubtedly laced with sweet promises) in the hopes of scooping the band up. But Dead Reckoning checked its internal compass, saw the time wasn't yet nigh for that sort of thing and, in the words of bassist/singer Tim Norman, "went on our independent thing and sold as many records as we could."

Crazy, maybe, but that's just the way they saw it and that's what they did.

"At the time we made Time's Time, we put all our resources into the album, everything that we had," explains Norman, "so we wanted to do it ourselves. That was the way we had planned it from the beginning; it was our marketing/music strategy at the time you know, and it turned out to be quite a learning experience and very interesting."

But as any regular, label-less gigging act in the country knows, the vocabulary of the road is survival, specifically the economic sort. And yet, Norman insists the ride hasn't been that hard, a telling indicator the Dead Reckoning's significant fan draw in this country.

"It's a mystery to me also," he says, "it's just that we make and we sell and we go out and we play as much as we can and we keep our resources down to a minimum to what we can and cannot do."

The band have proved that they can certainly do it themselves, with three videos to their credit, and appearances last week on CFMT, Global and

MuchMusic. And they feel they are now ready to pay closer attention to what the labels have to say. Of course, they plan to stir the pot at CMW with a showcase of new songs on Friday at the Reverb (at lam)

No kids to the industry, Dead Reckoning (besides Norman, the band includes guitarists Mike Kelly and Mark Norman and drummer Perry Murphy) have been in the business for some seven years now. In that time, they've released a total of three albums and have, through that output, singled themselves out as a rock and roll outfit with a trustworthy musical dynamic and a knack for generating penetrating songs. Their self-titled debut received a lot of college airplay, interest from CBC and even got oversees on the BBC. Hollow Reason followed up to another bout of critical acclaim and prepped the way for Time's Time. Now, the boys are preparing a highly anticipated fourth release, which they expect will up the ante on their success thus far.

Still, Norman is remarkably calm for someone who is heading into what will undoubtedly be pressured territory.

"Everyday is pressure so it's just part of the game we play and part of the industry that we're in I guess," he says matter-of-factly. "I just basically see that we have a great solicitation of the new stuff, we have a reputable amount of interest from different publishing companies and record people who know us already because as you know, a lot of people have to get to know you, they want to see what you're all about. But right about now the band is at its strongest it's ever been, musically and fundamentally on stage. It will be a great live show, real kick ass," he promises.

Our advice? Adjust thine internal compass and get thee out to see the show.

Fifteen years for Toronto's CMW

Now in its fifteenth consecutive year, Canadian Music Week makes its appearance in Toronto for yet another season and president Neill Dixon is saying it's the best yet.

"It's shaping up great and it's actually ahead of last year," he commented last week as final preparations for the event were being put into place. "I don't think the fact that the Junos left town hurt us," he added. "I think we're going to be just fine."

Dixon estimates the event will draw some 1,500 delegates this year, as many as 20% of them from abroad, coming in to town to check out talent, network their services and come away with some valuable knowledge they can apply to their jobs. The CMW exhibition, which is being

Mason.

"The public component is really the artistic side of it," said Dixon, "it's to help the bands gain a larger notoriety and also for the public to experience and enjoy Canadian music. And also, our international guests are coming in to see talent, they might as well see it in a packed club with local fans, so they can get the true ambience and feel of what they're checking out as opposed to a sterile showcase in a hotel."

While A&R representatives and journalists will undoubtedly be more interested in the unsigned acts at the festival, Dixon says international delegates and local fans would rather see higher profile recording artists. The festival has therefore cut back the number of performing live acts down

targeted to fans, is estimated to draw a head count of about 10,000 Toronto locals

While the role of CMW in the past has oscillated between an industry-only and an industry-first event, it seems that this year the public emphasis has reached an equilibrium. Ironically, the change in emphasis was suggested by representatives from the major labels, who wanted more support for their artists and an encouragement for their fans to come into close contact with them.

"One of their main recommendations was that they wanted to see the exhibition have a little bit more fan appeal, sort of like a little fanfest," says Dixon.

Representatives from the majors also suggested an all day music marathon which would feature up and coming recording acts sponsored by radio stations on four stages (12 noon till 7 pm on Friday and Saturday). Besides radio, performances will be broadcast online on Virtually Canadian and Groove Society, part of CMW's emphasis on the Internet and its applicability to the industry. CMW's own website at www.cmw.net has been expanded to include exhaustive information about the event, festival schedule and ticket sales. An autograph session with partial proceeds to the Music Therapy trust Fund will also encourage artist/fan contact with a participating line-up which will include (but will not be limited to) Roger Hodgson, Rik Emmet, Barstool prophets, The Age Of Electric, KC & JoJo, Paul Gross, Holy McNarland and Wide Mouth

to 300 from last year's 350.

"We're trying to emphasize quality over quantity," says Dixon.

Obviously the industry component remains crucial to the existence of CMW; the industry component is featuring panels and seminars covering the areas of live performances; legal issues; records; the Internet; retail, professional development; broadcast; international and musicians. Keynote addresses from Danny Goldberg, Sir George Martin, Moby and Chuck D, along with the annual Music Industry Awards and the first Canadian Radio Music Awards will round out the offerings, though Dixon says that the practical possibilities for delegates are

"It's still well supported and we've managed to keep the calibre high; I've been to every conference in the world now so I know, ours is probably the best there is in terms of calibre. So I know what we're offering the business people in terms of professional development and for exchange of ideas and networking opportunities, it's pretty solid as far as that goes."

Also this year; a spotlight on Latin America will have several representatives from the South coming up for business. Dixon says the market's rapid growth has occasioned a surge of interest worldwide which he believes will be valuable to the Canadian market.

"It has been growing and it's gratifying to see it grow," he says; "we try to make sure every year that we add new things and try new things."



Through upcoming Epic, Monument and Columbia releases, Sony is showing definite indications of making a strong bid to return to the Canadian country fold. Sony's Director of National Promotion Vel Omazig and marketing representative Steve Coady, has been making the rounds giving importance to the new Cancon releases.

Priority concentration is being placed on Famous First Words, the first single by Sudbury, Ontario native Gill Grant. The single is the title track of his debut album, which will be released on the Monument/Epic label. Although the song was written by Nashville writers Byron Hill and J.B.Rudd and recorded in Nashville with Hill taking producer credits the track will be re-recorded in Canada the end of March so as to give the single two-parts Cancon (AP). Grant, who was signed to Epic Nashville, is also scheduled for a March 29 date on Craven A's Today Country.

Lisa Brokop, who was signed to Columbia earlier this year, will don her new label with the release of How Do I Let Go. Brokop, a native of Vancouver, was a consistent chart happener a few years ago and with this change in labels is expected to resume her prominence in mainstream country.

Another Sony Nashville signing is Tara Lyn Hart from Brandon, Manitoba. Her first single, What He Used To Do, was written by David Quillico (Sony Canada Publishing and A&R guy) and Hal Draper.



Awards Show '98 and Country Music Week '98 showcases can now take on a much higher profile. Negotiations are already underway with national record company reps, management professionals and others to make showcases and seminars more attractive than ever. In general the membership is very happy with the media recognition given the Nova Scotia Country Music Association (NSCMA) since its launch three years ago.


