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

Neill Dixon, Executive Director of Canadian Music Week (CMW) has revealed that Lisa Zbitnew, President of BMG Music Canada, has accepted an invitation to act as the honourary chair of Canadian Music Week International's executive industry conference.

Zbitnew will officially open the conference, expected to draw in excess of 1500 delegates. She will also introduce many of the main speakers throughout the four-day event which will be held at Toronto's Westin Harbour Castle Hotel (March





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

Bocelli's Romanza sets Canadian classical sales record

The Universal Music Group reports a "historic first" for Andrea Bocelli in Canada. The Italian tenor made history (Dec. 21/98), when his Romanza album became the first CD by a classical artist to sell more than one million units in Canada.

Covenant House and The Salvation Army are sharing the evening's proceeds with \$1894.00 presented to each organization.

"This really is a unique event," said UMG's Vice President of Classics & Jazz Liam Toner. "But then Andrea is a unique talent. His voice has an unforgettable haunting quality... a sound that has the power to move people to tears when they hear it. It's that rare emotive characteristic that continues to attract a broad based audience that crosses all age groups and musical tastes. Sales figures like these are unprecedented for a classical artist in Canada and, it is a remarkable achievement for our marketing and sales people throughout the country.

"Their profound understanding of this genre's special needs, tireless enthusiasm and unwavering belief in the artist made it all happen. No other team in the world could have achieved this.

"The support from our retail and radio partners

also played a vital role in this success story. They got behind everything we wanted to do and really went the extra mile to push this artist into the phenomenal category." Toner concludes with "Romanza's success is a milestone of the exciting growth happening in Classics today, and is a perfect example of the heights this industry can reach when everyone pulls together."

With Aria, Bocelli's album of popular operatic melodies gaining platinum status in Canada at the same time as Romanza, Canada has now become his biggest market per capita. It was at his sold-out Molson Amphitheatre concert in Toronto last summer when he paid a special tribute to his Canadian fans, acknowledging that it was Canada that provided his first success outside of Europe.

Bocelli is working on a new album which is targeted for a Spring '99 release.

FACTOR Board cancels radio syndication program

In view of what is described as "a consistently low demand" for financial support for the production of music-driven syndicated radio program, FACTOR has pulled the plug on this program.

It was further pointed out that of the 10 applications submitted for funding for the fiscal year ending March 31/98, only four projects were eligible for support.

Big Sugar firmed for Stone's Canadian dates

Universal Music Group recording band Big Sugar have been firmed as the opener for the sole Canadian date of the Rolling Stones' No Security Tour. The show is scheduled for the Air Canada Centre in Toronto on Feb. 25.

The Canadian band has been on the road, playing sold-out dates across the country in support of Heated, their fifth album, Heated, released in September of last year. The album has now surpassed gold in Canada. A U.S. release on the Capricorn label is scheduled for April 4.

Elana Rabinovitch of the Universal Music Group, reveals that Big Sugar is the first Canadian band to deliver a single and video (The Scene/C'est Moi Qui Regne) in both English and French simultaneously, which enjoyed heavy rotation on MuchMusic and MusiquePlus. The band's current single, Better Get Used To It, is now bulleting up the RPM 100 Hit Tracks chart (#XX).

Ostertag reveals that the FACTOR Board was aware of the ever-changing environment for producers of syndicated radio programs, and that these facts, combined with the high administrative cost of maintaining a program for a few applications per year "left the board with no option" but to cancel the program.

Ostertag goes on to point out that the Board was very committed to making this program work but the demand wasn't there. This was also a problem experienced by Maclean Hunter Broadcasting with their CAPS Program (Canadian Artists and Programs on Satellite). "If a program with a sufficient demand were to become apparent I would welcome discussion with the industry. I know the Board of Directors commitment to supporting the development of Canadian talent remains unchanged."

Linden will perform several songs from his new album, Raised By Wolves, and field questions about his songwriting talent.

J-PAUL Self-titled JP-98001 - New Pop

Toronto-based band, that shouldn't be overlooked, present what they call "new pop, and the flavouring is perfect for the pop trade, with enough of a ballady rock edge to create a niche for them in that market as well. The material is all original stuff, written by Jay Turvey and Paul Sportelli. That's Turvey registering the achingly beautiful lead vocals with both Turvey and Sportelli supplying most of the background vocals. It's that musical theatre background by Turvey that gives most tracks that warm feeling. And here's a nice twist, speaking of musical theatre. That's Tyley Ross on background vocals on World Was Then, a key track. Also key is Go Luciano with Sharron Matthews and Kyree Vibrant doing the backup thing. A very impressive production by David Gray, particularly with the soothing strings (cello and violin), and David Marsh's impeccable violectra and violin inserts. Sportelli does the very creative keyboard work on the session. Nice trumpet and flugelhorn work by Sarah McElcheran, which makes for a very lush session. Also key are Black and Blue, Chicken-A-Go-Go and June, July, August. Should make an impact with A/C programmers. Contact Joanne Smale Productions 416-922-4459. -WG

MIGUEL DE LA BASTIDE - Flemenco El Cambio (The Change) La Bastide-0001

There's no question, Miguel de la Bastide has his fingers on the pulse of flamenco. Having shared CD compilations with Paco de Lucia, Al de Meola, Tornatito and Rafael Riqueni, this flamenco guitarist extraordinaire steps into the spotlight with his solo album. There's more to flamenco music then what we get from the



overrated purveyors of this exciting music genre, and here Bastide passionately gives us a true sampling with what is described as "masterful blends" of Afro-Latin, Middle Eastern and Arabic elements. Interesting too is that Bastide is a native of San Fernando, Trinidad and one might pick up a subtle island influence. All published tracks are instrumental, but Bastide has cleverly added a hidden track titled Solèares, also a Bastide original, featuring exceptional improv vocalising by Alfonso Mogaburo Cid. The title track will be released as a video with imagery supplied by

Carmen Romero, whose movements are being touted as being as exciting as Bastide's guitar work. Anyone of these tracks could serve as a wake-up call to early morning radio listeners. Certainly, in-store play will create a buzz through the store. Produced by Bastide at his own recording studio in Toronto. Take your pick, there isn't a weak track among the 13. All tracks are full MAPL. -WG

MIDORI - Classical Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra Claudio Abbado conducting Violin Concerto in D Major (Tchaikowsky) in D Minor (Shostakovich) Sony Classical-68338-H

The title is almost as long as an allowable review but that's alright since there's little more than need be said of this superb live recording. Miss Midori is the mistress of her instrument, playing with an emotional range of almost palpable angst to ineffable sweetness. Maestro



Abbado leads his splendid orchestra in majestic manner and stately tempi. Still, it must be stated again that Shostakovich was never the equal of Tchaikovsky and it seems almost unfair to have major works by them on the same album. Comparisons are inevitable but entirely unsuitable.

VARIOUS ARTISTS -Sacred The Ave Maria Album RCA Victor Red Seal-09026-63260-N


A thing of beauty is a joy forever. As proof, we offer the Ave Marie, one of the world's loveliest prayers and the loveliest to have been set to music. We're unaware how many composers have done so but five are presented here by eleven singers; five sopranos, five tenors and one contraito. The composers are Schubert, Gounod after Bach, Verdi, Mascagni and Kahn.



The sopranos are Leontyne Price, Carol Veness, Rosa Ponselle, Jeanette MacDonald and Katia Ricciarelli. The tenors are Domingo, Lanza, McCormack, Caruso and Hedley. The contralto is, of course, the divine Marian Anderson. Imagine hearing the Ave Maria sung sixteen times and not once less than enthralling. There can be no best rendition, only personal favourites. For us, it's Marian Anderson singing the Schubert version and Jeanette MacDonald singing the Gounod. Oh, and we must make mention of an unnamed young Vienna Choir boy singing with Placido Domingo on the Schubert Ave Maria in manner quite angelic.

HOWARD LOPEZ - Relaxation Under The Piano Soundscape-9801

Title notwithstanding, this isn't bar room ragtime. It's what yours truly calls Gift Shoppe music -- the kind heard in gift shops -- usually redolent with the scent of bayberry candles. Pianist/keyboardist Howard Lopez, who might well be Toronto's Peter Duchin, plays his own compositions with nicely understated accompaniment by Michael Stuart (soprano saxophone and flute) and Kevin Briggs



(guitars). They're relaxing but not soporific; evocative (notably Sangria Sunset) and thoroughly enjoyable, especially without the bayberry candles. 100% MAPL. -BW

CINCINNATI POPS ORCHESTRA - Popular with Erich Kunzel conducting From The Heart

Telarc-80510

Sixteen current pop favourites and standards such as My Heart Will Go On and Melaguena receive symphonic covers. The Cincinnati



Pops isn't the Boston Pops nor does it try to be, but Mr. Kunzel, in his workmanlike manner, extracts a rich if not lush sound from it and succeeds in producing a good if not memorable album. We couldn't find in the line notes who wrote the arrangements which is a pity.

MICHAEL KAESHAMMER - Jazz Tell You How I Feel Alma-1004 Pacific Music

One supposes there might be a better boogie woogie pianist then Michael Kaeshammer, but this auditor doesn't think so. The young man-he's only in his early twenties -- plays it not only with requisite technical skill, but also with an evident feeling of zest. His artistry in other piano styles is apparent here but it's the boogie woogie that joyously carries the day. Selections include Sweet Georgia Brown, Sunny Side of

the Street, Caravan, Basin Street Blues (fine vocal by Carol Weisman) and even Hank Williams' Move It On Over. The real treat, for



us however, is listening to him work with Joe Sealey and Doug Riley on Same Old House; three keyboard masters doing their excellent stuff and as always doing it well. -BW



VARIOUS ARTISTS - World Music Rhythm & Smoke Global Disc-9542 Intersound

The popular music of Cuba isn't simply Latin American or even specifically Afro-Cuban. It embraces a number of forms and styles including Charanga, Son, Timba, Nueva Trova, Rumba and Nueva Salsa Cubana. All of them and more are offered here by Cuban musicians in a zesty programme that leaves one exhilarated. The beat is intoxicating and the orchestrations, exciting. Definitely up front music that demands attention.

KONSTANTINE - World Music Across The Aegean

First Generation-6869 Trend

This is a must for all who have an unrealized or pleasant memory of the Greek Islands. A new world born musician often retains genetic remembrance of his or her ancestors' homeland. Konstantine's eight compositions offered here are testament to that. They're exotically familiar both in form and presentation.




DAVID CROSBY is back

He's been called rock's favorite threat to society, David Crosby, fabled pop music veteran and voice of the Woodstock generation, has been confirmed for a "celebrity interview" at CMW on Sunday March 7th 1999. As a man inducted into the Rock N Roll Hall of Fame on two separate occasions, David Crosby's contribution to rock n roll is not in dispute. It was his seminal work with the Byrds, and later, Crosby Stills and Nash, that got him into the Hall, but Crosby's career and life has had as many lows as it has highs. In the mideighties, following a drug-related arrest on weapons charges, Crosby became a ward of the Texas Penal System, emerging from that ordeal wholly sober and drug-free for the first time in his adult life. A decade later, with his liver failing, David Crosby survived a successful liver transplant. It was during that recuperation that Crosby was contacted by James Raymond, the product of a brief relationship in the sixties, who was put up for adoption at the time, and having been given his father's identity, had searched Crosby out. Now, three years later Crosby, Raymond and Jeff Pevar have formed CPR, releasing their debut album in 1998. Along with his celebrity interview on the 7th, Crosby will perform as part of SOCAN's In Session on Saturday March 6. Robert F. X. Sillerman to Keynote at OAB/BES Luncheon

His empire greatly expanded in 1992 with the creation of SFX Broadcasting, which built a nationwide network of radio stations at a time when no one was buying stations. Modabo signs U.S. deal with Sidestreet Distributing

Modabo, a New brunswick trio, has signed a distribution deal with Sidestreet Distribution of Lansing, Michigan. Sidestreet specializes in the distribution of world beat and folk titles and carries other Canadian acts, including James Keelaghan, Stan Rogers and Figgy Duff.

The deal calls for the marketing of both of Modabo's two albums, to available through Sidestreet's mail order catalogue, web-site and sub-distributors, which includes Canadian River Music out of Amarillo, Texas.

Modabo's management company is also negotiating with a U.S. booking agent. The band's first album, which is self-titled, will be released to U.S. radio this spring, while the second album, The Many and The One, will be released to U.S. radio later in the year.

Modabo chalked up a busy 1998 with

performances at nine folk festivals across Canada as well as tours of the Maritimes and Ontario. A highlight of the fall tour was a performance for an estimated 10,000 music fans on Parliament Hill in Ottawa, which was broadcast nationwide. The trio also took part in a television special titled Where The River Meets The Sea, which was shot at Saint John's Imperial Theatre. The special will be aired on CBC-TV in March. Audio from the special will be aired on Atlantic Airwaves.

A tour of Alberta and B.C. is being pencilled in for February and March, with dates in Edmonton, Calgary, Vancouver and other western centres to be firmed shortly. The month of April will take the band on tour of Ontario, Manitoba and the Northwest Territories.

The band is currently working on their third album being targeted for a spring release.

Bill Geffros has taken over guiding the careers of Jennifer Johnson and Reese Klaiber. Ottawa Valley's Johnson hits hard with an impressive boxed package containing her new self-titled CD and a video of 800 Reasons, the single Geffros is now working at radio. Johnston first gained recognition as the 1992 winner of CJOH/CTV's talent search program, Homegrown Cafe. It was a good start for her. That same year she was crowned Miss Renfrew during the annual Lumber Baron Festival and performed on the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario telethon. After a 1993 performance at the Classic Country Music Reunion in Lindsay, Ontario, she returned the following year and won the CCMR's first annual singing competition. Johnston was ready for the charts in 1995, making a good impression with her first single I Never Thought I Could Love This Much which was followed by Only A Dreamer, with the video gaining rotation on CMT. Johnston's album, which was produced by Randall Prescott and Dan Paul Rogers is released on the Wolfe Lake Music label. Klaiber has just returned from Nashville where he gained much attention with his showcases and networking with songwriters and record people. He recorded his new

album, Where I Came From in Nashville with

producer Dave Pomeroy at the board. Klaiber has already made a niche for himself with country programmers with his first release, Cowboy Up. Geffros is currently working the follow-up single, She's Sittin' Pretty, which is now at radio. This album is also available on the Wolfe Lake Music label. Watch for album reviews next week. Linda Davis, no stranger to the charts, has another winner with I'm Yours, the title track of her Dreamworks album. The single is the most added this week entering the chart at #68. The single was written by Phillip Coleman and Carolyn Dawn Johnson. The album was produced by James Stroud and Julian King. Dreamworks is distributed by Universal Music Group (UMG).

The Rankins have made an excellent start for the new year, unfortunately without Raylene, who has left the band to raise her new family. The band's new single, a very countrified Let It Go written by Jimmy enters the RPM Country 100 at #86 and is also bulleting up the A/C chart (#42) after two weeks of charting. The track was taken from their

Uprooted album which was produced by George Massenburg. The album was recorded in Nashville. The single qualifies as three-parts Cancon MAL. Interesting too is that Cape Breton's favourite family has returned to its popularity down home, leading this year's nominees in seven categories (see separate story). Album sales for the band are now close to two million copies in Canada.

Kevin Waara has a chart single with Texas Two Step making its debut at #89. Written by Waara, Glenn Niemi and Ken Moore, the album was produced by Moore and recorded at Thunder Bay, Ontario's Barn Studios. Interest has grown in the U.S. as well, particularly in Texas where the two step is still one of the most popular dances.

The Porch Boys continue to promote their new single, 16 Minutes of Fame, that got caught up in the Christmas rush. These Regina guys have a lot of talent and like they say, they're "looking for more than 15 minutes of fame." The track was taken from their Brain Dead Crazy album which was produced by Bart McKay. The album was recorded at Sound Edge Productions and mixed and mastered at Crosstown Studios by Al Rodger. The band comprises Larry Lowe (lead vocals, acoustic guitar), Scott Valley (vocals, lead guitar, keyboards), Ward Peters (vocals, lead and acoustic guitars, mandolin, harmonica), Jared Bildfel (vocals, bass guitar) and Jason (Jukebox) Junk (drums, percussion). Great harmonies and impressive message material with Valley writing nine of the 10 songs and Lowe doing the writing for Your Love. All tracks are 100% Cancon. Gratton has gained the respect of Ontario's country community through working with the Good Brothers, supplying backup vocals on their album Delivering The Goods, as well as touring with John Allan Cameron and entertaining Canadian troops overseas. Jennifer Gibson, that "rare gem" from Edmonton, is back after a five year hiatus, with a new album titled Be The Woman. The album, which was produced by Gibson and Jamie Kidd, is available on Gibson's own label, Girly Girl Records. The album was recorded at Edmonton's Beta Sound Recorders with mastering at Toronto's Metalworks. Gibson, who plays guitar on the session, has some pretty good pickers giving her hand. Kidd does all the keyboard work on the Hammond organ and accordion; Steve Pineo supplies electric and acoustic guitar, plus mandolin and banjo, and even vocals; Matthew Atkins on drums; and John C. Towill on fretless bass and five-string red bass. Drummer Greg Petty and guitarist Greg Sures are heard on two tracks, Every So Often and I Want To Be Alone. 
Tales. The album was recorded in Edmonton in May of 1997 and February of 1998 by Raj Ramtej. Pruden wrote all the material for the album and together with Beley, produced the album. Lots of good roots stuff here with strong country and folk

Tony Moreau steps up to the plate with his debut album titled Boulevard of Broken Dreams, a title that sets the theme for the whole album. Nine out of the ten tracks were written by Moreau who explains that the album "is a compilation of songs about people and events that have brought both great joy and sorrow to myself and those close to me." Paul Bottineau wrote one of the songs, Take Me Along. There's no information as to who played what on the session, but their names are Jamie Williams, Bill Chambers. Tom Stephens, Oliver "Ollie" Strong, Lorne Pinkney, Ron Edwards, John Marrocco, Cindy Thompson and Moreau's son Joshua and one track, Daddy's Little Man, is obviously dedicated to the young Moreau. The album was produced by Jamie Wilson and recorded, mixed and mastered at Maple Leaf Sound. By the way, Moreau is based in Perkinsfield, Ontario and can be reached at 705-549-4005. What'll I Do, has been taken as the first single. Anya Wilson & Associates is tracking the single.

Steel Horse, a four-piece band from Surrey, B.C., lucked in, winning the opportunity of performing three of their songs in the movie, Floating Away, which starred Paul Hogan. The three songs, Dancing On Holy Ground, Tall Dark & Country and Keeper of My Heart, were included on the movie soundtrack. The album was recorded and mastered at MR&D in Burnaby and produced by Tom McKillip. All the material was written by the bandmembers: Greg Hannas (keyboards, vocals), Brian Zalo (guitar vocals), Alex Franson (drums, vocals) and Mark White (bass, vocals). An interesting sidenote is that Harpo Wells, who taught Hogan how to manipulate the mouth harp, does the harmonica solo on Dancing On Holy Ground. Producer McKillip is also heard on the session, supplying acoustic guitar licks and vocals. Nice fiddle work by Cory Churko on I Can't Sleep At Night and Memory On My Mind. The band is currently working Real Love, the second single taken from the album.

Steve Fox, born in Vancouver and now living in Toronto with lots of side trips to Nashville, has two singles at radio, a countrified Daddy Won't Sell The Farm and Why. The latter is pop-oriented, a song that was a winner in Toronto's MIX 99.9 songwriting contest. Fox began the new year with a number of "warm-up" dates in the Toronto area with his own band. He has already played Burlington's Hanging Tree and is scheduled for a couple of Toronto dates; a solo gig at Graffiti's (Jan. 12) and with his band at Cactus Pete's (14); a solo appearance at Chapters in Brampton (15); back to Toronto for a date with the Tin Eddies at the Black Swan (16); and then west to Regina with the Poverty Plainsmen at The Pump Country Roadhouse (20-23). He has a number of solo dates scheduled for February in Tennessee, Texas and New Mexico. A Nashville deal is pending for his album.

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




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
