Lily Pons To Be **Guest Soloist On Kostelanetz Show**

Lily Pons, coloratura soprano of the Metropolitan Opera, will be the the Philharmonic-Symphony Society guest soloist with Andre Kostelanetz and his orchestra and chorus over CBS, including WKRC, WHAS and WHIO, Wednesday, December 22, from 9:00 to 9:30 p. m. (E.S.T.). The occasion is to be a gala one, featuring many of Miss Pons' favorite compositions.

Miss Pons will offer two operatic arias and two French Christmas carols of the 18th century. Her first selection is to be Ambroise Thomas' "Je Suis Titania" from "Mignon." The carols will include "Dureau la Duree" and "Tous les Bourgeois de Chartres." In conclusion Miss Pons is to sing the Bell Song from "Lakme."

Kostelanetz will direct the orchestra in the Farandole from Bizet's "L'Arlesienne Suite" and Maurice Ravel's "Daphnis and Chloe." There also is to be a special arrangement of the old Christmas song "It Came Upon a Midnight Clear." Deems Taylor, as usual, will give the commentaries on the program.

Young People's **Concerts To Begin** 8th Season On CBS

The Young People's Concerts of

of New York, will enter their eighth season of broadcasting when John Barbirolli directs the opening Saturday program from Carnegie Hall, over CBS, including WKRC, WHAS and WHIO, December 18, from 11:00 a. m. to 12:15 p. m. (E.S.T.). The soloists are to be Mishel Piastro and Ioseph Schuster, first violinist and first 'cellist of the orchestra, and Anselme Fortier, leader of the double bass section.

The program consists of the "Jubilee" Overture of Chadwick; the Air from Bach's Suite in D; a Minuet by Boccherini; the Handel-Halvorsen Passacaglia for Violin and 'Cello, featuring Piastro and Schuster; "Deep Forest," by Daniels; the first movement from Koussevitsky's Concerto for Doubles Bass, with Fortier as soloist; "Molly on the Shore," by Grainger; the Praetorius "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming," which the audience will be asked to sing, and the Fantasia on Old Scottish Melodies transcribed of a missing suitcase filled with a by Alfonso Gibilaro.

"Twelve Crowded Months" Offered **On Christmas Eve**

The twelve stories that rode highest and longest on the nation's headlines during 1937, as selected by a poll of the country's city rooms, will be dramatized when the Columbia Broadcasting System, including WKRC, WHAS and WHIO presents its third annual "Twelve Crowded Months," Friday, December 24, from 9:00 to 10:00 p.m. (E.S.T.).

Every day a stream of nominations for the twelve biggest stories of the year is received in the CBS Department of Public Affairs, which is polling the editors and arranging the broadcast. Even now it is obvious that certain news events will be selected, of course, but the rather amazing total of sixty different stories have gained votes from newsmen all over the United States.

William Robson, director of the program, is now whipping into shape such items as the Chinese-Japanese War, the Texas school explosion, the Coronation, the Spanish War, and the Hindenburg disaster. The script will not be completed however until the day of the broadcast, allowing time for a complete vote and insertion of any important last minute events.

The previous "Twelve Crowded Months" broadcasts called for the services of some of the biggest casts in the history of radio and Robson expects that this year's program will continue the tradition. Thirty actors will be used in addition to a squad of five research men who are assisting Robson on the script.

John Barrymore and his wife, Elaine Barrie, will make their "Holly-wood Hotel" debut when they present several scenes from Barrymore's latest screen vehicle, "Bulldog Drummond's Revenge," during the Friday, December 17, program over CBS, including WKRC, WHAS and WHIO, from 9:00 to 10:00 p. m. (E.S.T.)

The story from which the preview scenes have been selected concerns Capt. Hugh ("Bulldog") Drummond's experiences with Scotland Yard detectives in the particular case newly discovered explosive.

Rodzinski has programmed three masterworks by Haydn, Brahms and Richard Strauss for the sixth regularly scheduled concert by the newest of major symphony orchestras.

The hour and one-half concert from Studio 8H in NBC's Radio City headquarters will open with Josef Haydn's "Military" Symphony in G Major, the last symphony written by Haydn for his London patron, Salomon.

Following the Haydn work, which is written in four movements, Rodzinski will conduct Johannes Brahms' Fourth Symphony in E Minor. The third and concluding number will be "Salome's Dance," from Richard Strauss' biblical opera, "Salome."

Broadcast To Be Aired Over CBS, NBC Nets **Christmas Eve**

President and Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt will send their Christmas greetings to the nation, Friday, December 24, at 5:00 p. m. (E.S.T.), over the combined CBS and NBC networks, including WKRC, WLW, WHAS, WHIO and WLS.

The broadcast is part of the program connected with the fifteenth annual lighting of the National Community Christmas Tree in Lafayette Park, Washington, D. C. The President will press a button during the broadcast to light the tree, and many communities throughout the country will begin their observance of the holiday season at the same moment.

President Roosevelt will make his speech after he throws the switch. Music by the Marine Band, greetings by Boy and Girl Scouts, carols by the Schola Cantorum and a solo by Henry Nestor also will be heard during the broadcast.

and surveys, the broadcasters have marshalled a wealth of information about "the typical listener," from what tunes he prefers, to what he likes for breakfast.

But whether all these answers mean anything is something else again.

According to the broadcasters there are between 85,000,000 and 100,-000,000 listeners in the United States. To assume that any one person can represent such a heterogeneous multitude is manifestly absurd. There are too many differences in background, occupation, racial stock, viewpoint, and emotional attitude, not to mention culture. Even in such a well-defined group as lovers of fine music it is impossible to single out a "typical listener."

The same is true of statistics gleaned from polls and surveys. There is a cynical saying that figures can be used to prove anything. Radio is an outstanding illustration of that. Far from shedding any clear light on what "the typical listener" likes or dislikes, the endless polls and surveys merely confuse matters.

The fact is that "the typical listener" simply doesn't exist, any more than "the typical movie-goer" or "the typical motorist." And even if he did exist, tailoring all programs to please him would be as silly as making all clothes to fit a "perfect 36." For the only thing known definitely about the radio audience is that any program will please some people and that no program will please everybody.

It's rather strange that all this didn't occur to the educators. Or is it?

Yehudi Menuhin, youthful wizard of the violin, and his pianist sister Hephzibah, will make one of their rare joint appearances on radio as guests on the Ford, Sunday Evening Hour, December 19, over CBS, including WKRC, WHAS and WHIO. This joint concert in Detroit's Ma-

sonic Auditorium will be one of the six to be given by the talented brother and sister this season. Other joint recitals in the country- will be limited to the Metropolitan Opera House in New York and an appearance in Boston. Radio audiences heard them together for the first time last season on the Ford hour.

Rosenthal is at present celebrating his 64th consecutive year before the public. He has made many tours of the United States, vying in popularity with Paderewski, Josef Hofmann, and piano classics.

John McCormick **Philharmonic To Feature Music Of Beethoven**, Sibelius

A program of masterworks by Beethoven and Sibelius will be performed by the Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra directed by John in Carnegie Hall, New York, is broadcast over CBS including WKRC-WHAS and WHIO, December 19, from 3.00 to 5:00 p.m. (E.S.T.).

Beethoven is to be represented in the first half of the program by his 'Coriolanus" Overture and Sixth, or "Pastoral," Symphony, the composer's only symphony with a pro-gram, or scenario. The "Coriolanus" Overture was not written to the Shakespeare tragedy but to a drama by Heinrich Joseph von Collin in 1807. Beethoven himself conducted the first performance from manuscript in March of that year.

He wrote his "Pastoral" symphony in the summer of the next vear in the wooded environs of Vienna. The program is indicated by the sub-titles of the five movements: "Cheerful impressions awakened by arrival in the country," "Scenes by the Brook," "Merry "Merry Gathering of Country Folk," "Thunderstorm, Tempest," and "Shepherds' Song."






