#### THE EDITORS' NOTE:

THE most flexible of entertainment mediums, radio already has passed through its peace-to-wartime transition. Without exception, every station in the United States is on a full-time war footing today. For the most part, it's "business as usual," although each station has received a set of secret instructions by which it will be governed in case of an actual and local

emergency.

The speed of radio's transition has been possible because of the nature of broadcasting. Radio programs al-ways have been changed, canceled, rewritten practically on a moment's notice. For that reason, changes in

horadcasting could be made swiftly.
Already, simply by our day-to-day
tuning-in, we know how the war is
going to affect radio and the entertainment it provides. But how about the movies?

No less important to the nation's entertainment, filming a motion pic-ture is vastly different from producing a radio program. Making a movie is a long, laborious process, usually requiring months of research and preparation in advance of the actual "shooting schedule," which may run five to eight weeks, even longer. For those reasons, and since many pictures were com-pleted and awaiting release when the war began, changes in motion-picture entertainment will be slower in coming. The war's influence will not be felt in the movies themselves for another two

or three or perhaps six months. What will happen then?

Changes in radio broadcasting have been few to date, with the exception of those areas which have had black-

outs. Changes in wartime movies will be few also, according to preliminary reports.

Lowell Mellett, director of the Office of Government Reports, has been appointed by President Roosevelt coordinator of films during the war emergency. In a letter recently made public, the President was quoted by newspapers as having written:

The American motion picture is one of our most effective media in informing and entertaining our citizens. The motion picture must remain free in so far as national security will permit. I want no censorship of the motion picture; I want no restrictions placed thereon which will impair the usefulness of the film other than those very necessary restrictions which the dic-


tates of safety make imperative."
All of which is very fair. No citizen, in the face of current conditions, would have things otherwise. The movies will not suffer, and together the two greatest mediums of American entertainment—radio and the motion picture—will march shoulder to shoulder doing their share to help win the war.







Type of Picture: An exceedingly well enacted screening of the bestselling novel "Kings Row."

This is the Story: In childhood, Bob Cummings loves Betty Field, and Ronald Reagan is loved by Nancy Coleman, whose doctor-father (Charles Coburn) thinks, as Ronald grows to adolescence, is too wild for his daughter. Bob, on the other hand, returns from prep school to read medicine with Betty's father (Dr. Alexander Tower, played by Claude Rains) and learns she has been confined to the doctor's home and grounds, allowed no society, for years. He still cares for Betty but cannot contact her. When he does, she tries to tell him what is wrong with her, that she really still loves him but that they can never marry. He thinks she is crazy. That night she kills her father and herself. Bob leaves to study medicine, specialize in psychiatry, abroad. Ronald stays on in town, begins to court "tough" little Ann Sheridan. Then he

loses his fortune and his fine friends, finds Ann and her family true blue. Her dad gets railroad work for him, and one night on the job he is injured. ## Axis Powers Blast Skies With Batch of Horror Yarns

AMES FERGUSON, Britain's leading propaganda analyst, in speaking over the London Short-Wave Station, states that since New Year's Eve the air has been full of appeals from German leaders seeking to bolster the flagging morale of the home people in Germany. Hitler, Goebbels, Rosenberg and Dr. Funk all sounded gloomy notes, notes of "alarm," in their January 1 broadcasts to Germany. "Fight to Save Yourselves"—or in other words, fight to save Hitlerism—was the keynote of these speeches. The only way-Hitler can make people fight for Hitler is to scare them by telling them what will happen if they don't. Daily trainloads of injured or dead soldiers pouring into Germany, great wagons stopping at every door to collect clothes for the freezing troops in Russia are not helping to lift German spirits.

Even Tokyo—victorious at the moment—warns its people by radio against overoptimism, saying the war may and probably will last for years.

Says Lindley Fraser of London in Speaking of the decay of morale in Italy: "In the stronghold of Fascism the situation is far advanced. Anyway you take it the Italians can't win—and now they face America's might also arrayed against them. Try as they may they can't work up much hatred for the United States. Instead, they begin to hate the Nazis and Mussolini, Hitler's tool. People in all of the occupied countries want Hitler beaten, but they fall in two distinct classes: The 'Out and Outers' and the 'Pin Stickers.' The 'Pin Stickers' are against Hitler but they don't think he can be beaten. The 'Out and Outers' believe Hitler can and will be beaten and will do anything or go to any lengths to bring this about. Our job. is not only to encourage the 'Out and Outers' but to bring the 'Pin Stickers' into their camp."

The first was their claim that one hundred Japanese nationals were seized from the Malay-city of Ipoh by the British before its capture by the Niponese troops, taken to the city of Kuala Lumpur and shoved (by the British) into burning oil tanks under bombardment by Japanese bombers. Radio Tokyo went on to report that during the evacuation of Penang by the British, Chinese coolies who were attempting to board the evacuation boats were shot and killed by the British to make more room for white passengers. Only the fiendishly sadistic mind of a Japanese Oriental could conceive such yarns.

Jane Anderson, prize fanatic of Berlin's commentators, put on a great show the other night. During her program period she interviewed two citizens from Latvia who ostensibly had come all the way from this northern country to tell the world about the frightful reign of Communism during the time that their country was held by the Bolsheviks. Too bad they couldn't speak English and that Jane Anderson had to elaborate upon their stories in her bloody, picturesque style. Screaming in her inimitable voice, she told how the leaders of Latvia were forced to do menial labor; men, women and children sent to prison and torture; property confiscated. The money paid them for their labor in factories was not enough to buy bread. They died by the thousands. Stalin had determined upon the systematic destruction of Latvia. On June 13 and 14 the dreaded OGPU dragged women, and girls from their homes in Latvia, thrust them into crowded stock cars and took them to

and hunger. Those who arrived were doomed to die under the knout. The Communists, she said, shot down thousands of men, women and children like dogs. Eyes were gouged out, legs chopped off, stakes driven through the eye sockets. Is it any wonder that the Latvian people were delirious with joy when the German troops moved into their country to give them their freedom? The plea ended with "Heil Latvia, Heil Hitler." She puts on a great show, this Jane Anderson. If Your Host Raymond ever lost his job on our radio show "Inner Sanctum," Jane Anderson would be a likely successor. I still prefer the horror hokum dished out by our American radio stations. The foreign tales are so crude and unbelievable, and besides they have neglected the creaking door and the rattling-chain sound-effects. Don't be taken in by these fantastic terror tales that are originated for one purpose only—to confuse us and make us distrust our allies; to frighten listeners and lower morale in general.

As a special war precaution, radio stations in some cities are periodically silenced. At such times you will find it possible to tune in high-powered stations in other parts of the country that you ordinarily could not get. These stations will bring you newscasts and special announce-ments as well as many of the network broad-casts normally carried by stations in your own vicinity. Therefore, when the stations you usu-ally listen to are off the air, try tuning to the nearest 50,000-watt station outside of the precaution zone. 

#### Government Sues Nets

CHICAGO.—RCA, NBC and CBS have been made the defendants in a suit brought by the Federal Antitrust Division. The Government charges that the broadcasting chains are monopolizing radio broadcasting. Specifically, the complaint seeks to restrain the chains from entering into an exclusive contract with any radio station for more than two years, and barring electrical manufacturers from "reasonable access" to their studios for transmission of recordings. The complaint also seeks to require NBC to sell either its Red or Blue network, and for CBS to sell its stock in stations in towns having not more than four stations. The latter action, it is understood, would have the same effect in towns having four or less stations as would be the abandonment by NBC of one of its networks. There are 105 towns having four or less stations.

#### Radio Censor

WASHINGTON.—Byron Price, director of censorship, has named J. Harold Ryan, vice-president and general manager of a corporation controlling a number of radio stations, to serve under him as assistant, to deal principally with radio. In announcing the appointment, Price said that Ryan was coming to Washington at a great personal sacrifice.

#### Radio Aims for 1942

New York .- As a new year started, officials of the three major nation-wide radio networks, in statements made separately, stressed the objec-tives of radio in 1942. Said Alfred J. McCosker, chairman of the board of the Mutual Broadcasting System: "Our resources will be made available . . . to designated governmental agencies that may require them . . . our second obligation lies in presenting . . . complete coverage of news . . . we will . . . give special thought to

#### Tip-Off on Big News

NEW YORK .- Alert listeners to CBS programs can detect the broadcasting system's code to warn technicians at every station on the network of special news announcements if they remember the following: Five minutes before a regularly scheduled broadcast goes off the air an unobtrusive tone signal is added to the sounds of the program, just a little below the

level of the program. Three short dashes indicate that special bulletins will follow the end of the broadcast. Five short dashes mean the news will be unusually important. One long tone means that an urgent announcement will be made in ten seconds-that the program will be interrupted.

#### Singer's Brother Killed

Hollywood.-Mary Lou Cook, femquartet, has been notified that her brother, Corp. Harold Cook, was killed in action while helping defend Wake Island in the little band of Marines who so gallantly and spectacularly stood off the Japanese attacks until superior force overwhelmed them.

#### Officer Winchell Reports

NEW YORK.—Walter Winchell, a lieutenant commander in the Naval Reserve, has been called to active duty by the Navy Department. Lieu-tenant Commander Winchell has been assigned to the Public Relations Office. He will assist in the promotion of affairs for the Naval Relief Society. It is not believed that Winchell's assignment to active duty in the Navy will affect his radio or newspaper work.

Bonds in "Big Town"

HOLLYWOOD.—What the people of
the United States are getting for the
money they invest in defense bonds
was powerfully dramatized in the
"Big Town" show of January 7. In the story, editor Steve Wilson (Edward G. Robinson), answering questions posed by a small manufacturer who was worried about his business outlook, described the great personal sacrifices made in behalf of our nation by men virtually forgotten by history. The script was written by Crane Wilbur, the producer of the show, and Paul Franklin.

#### He Got to Sing

NEW YORK.—A young baritone's request for an earlier appearance than previously scheduled was granted recently by maestro Wilfred Pelletier of cently by maestro Wilfred Pelietier of the "Metropolitan Opera Auditions of the Air" program. The request was made by Leland Goodell of Caldwell, Idaho, when he learned that his draft number would come up sometime in January. Wishing to realize his ambi-tion to sing on the "Met Auditions" program, Goodell wrote Pelletier, explained his reason for asking to appear ahead of time, and was notified that the program's schedule had been rearranged so that he could appear on the January 4 broadcast.

#### In the Tea Leaves



### FEMININE FORUM

### Handful of Beauty

OAN FONTAINE, lovely RKO actress, has a garden which she takes care of all by herself; Joan Crawford washes her own dogs; Ginny Simms mixes the dough for her favorite breads; Irene Dunne is a hard-hitting golfer; and so on. Movie stars don't sit around on a cushion all day with cream-lined mittens on their hands, and yet, to look at their lily-like hands on the screen, you might think so.

Their secret, which is no secret at all, lies in proper care. A hand is more than something useful that's tacked on to one for cooking, sewing, or to wash babies with. The modern woman knows that hands are just as important an item of feminine appeal as any other part of her. She knows that songwriters and poets who sing about the beauty and romance of a woman's hands have something there, and she gives her own hands special attention.

It's important to have a good lotion handy to apply before, as well as after, some hand-roughening task, like dishwashing or digging in the garden. Because hands are exposed and used so much, the natural oils secreted by the skin are dried up; it's your job to replace it frequently with a lotion like the new Toushay, which gives exposed parts a protective finish. Remember an ounce of prevention is still worth a pound of cure.

Although Joan Fontaine occasionally gets herself a professional manicure, more often she takes care of her hands at home. "Every day I go over my nails, whether I have worked in the garden or not," Joan says, "filing any split or roughness to avoid a broken nail, replacing polish the minute it cracks. I push back the cuticle each time I wash my hands, apply a light cream after each washing whenever possible. At night I use a heavier cream."

Every day. That's important. In these busy times, the shortest cut to beauty is making a routine out of it, and daily hand-checking becomes as automatic and essential a part of grooming as regular tooth-brushing. If you have a Dura-Gloss set equipped with the necessary items, this little beauty habit is an easy one to develop.

The professional manicurist has developed a routine which the home amateur can follow. Washing your fingers in warmish water with a mild soap like Palmolive is the first step. Next comes shaping, which some wo-men do with the coarser side of the emery-board instead of the file, smoothing down with the finer side. And the long fingernail is out. Hands that are busy with war-time activities must be practical as well as beautiful, and nails should not be worn longer than an eighth to a quarter of an inch beyond the tip of the finger.

After shaping, dip the flat, cottonwrapped end of your orange-wood stick in oily cuticle-remover and push back the cuticle from the base and edges of the nail. After dipping your fingers in clear water, and drying them, remove the old polish with the new cream-remover, Mov, or, if you're still using liquid polish, soak it on a cotton pad. Be sure that you hold your polish brush against the side of the bottle before you apply it from the base to the tip in two or three strokes, so that it will spread evenly. After it's quite dry, apply nail white and, lastly, cuticle oil around the edges of your cuticle.

OMEN occupied with defense duties will be particularly grateful for the transparent finish that Cutex has produced to be applied over your polish like an overcoat, which makes the polish last about twice as long.

Florence Pearsall, a model whose lovely hands are seen in many magazine advertisements, offers this tip for supple, graceful hands: Hand exercises such as opening and closing your fists twenty-five times, bending and unbending each finger and then rotating

each finger a dozen times.

If you do these things, maybe no one will ever write a song about your hands, but at least they'll be appealing to a lot of people that count in your scheme of things, and what is more, give you that satisfied feeling which comes when you know you're well groomed down to your fingertips.
