An American Woman Flings a Challenge!

mentator Hedda Hopper.

She speaks her mind!

Hedda Hopper's recent stirring mandate delivered on her "Hedda Hopper's Hollywood" broadcast has brought such a nation-wide response that we reprint it here. -The Editors.

"EACH morning we've listened to the drive we're putting on to sell war bonds. Speakers have pointed

out the contrast between the Japs, standing for long hours in long queues, waiting their turn at the banks to put their money across the counter to win this war-and our own people, coaxed and cajoled with reserved seats at premieres, kissed by glamour girls, shaking hands with war heroes-given free rides in Army jeeps — anything — everything—if we'll only buy a bond. "Suppose we look

into the Jap's love for his country and emperor—a patriotism that's a national religion and a fierce pride—then look at the patriotism of our people that's been covered over during the fat years with a crust of selfishness. How can we break through that crust and get down to the real guts and fighting spirit? Well, this morning over the air I heard something that seemed like an answer to a prayer-a man's voice speaking of the Solomon Islands and the hope and determination of MacArthur to retake the Philippines. He asked us-while we watched the progress of the fight from our comfortable homes-to think

of the thousands of our men-the American prisoners on Bataan-who are sharing that hope.

"It's a fine thing to see our streets filled with boys in uniform—young, vigorous, swinging along with their heads held high-but how about those others who've gone before? Where are they now? Rotting Where

in concentration camps -doing forced labor — eating the bitter bread of defeat at the mercy of an enemy who knows no mercy. "THEY didn't stop

to haggle over wages or hours. THEY didn't have to be coaxed with kisses. They didn't ask anything of anybody but just the right to fight for the country they love and the things they believe in. There they sit--waiting, watching the skies for the planes that our

dollars and our factories can sendwith the scrap metal we can all turn in-telling themselves that they're not forgotten—that we won't fail them.

"I tell you that every hour—every MINUTE—in this fight counts. Every day of delay means the difference between hope and despair. If we fail them—if we betray them—we'll deserve everything we get-and don't think for one second we won't get it!

"THINK of them, then—think of them night and day--work for them--pray for them—give your money for them—and pray God that what we do won't be too little or too late!"

HOLLYWOOD CANTEEN

Bette Davis Inspired the Idea, but Studio Workers, Guild Members and Unions Were Responsible for Success of the Project

THREE thousand studio workers and stars enlisted to put Hollywood Canteen over the top. They've made it a real home away from home for men in the armed forces who are stationed in the vicinity of Movietown. To Bette Davis goes the credit for starting the project, which was inspired by her visit to the Stage Door Canteen in New York. A lease was taken until victory on the Old Barn, once a nightclub, and materials for repairs and decorations were promoted. Studio artists and cartoonists paneled the walls, and complete equipment for the kitchen was obtained. When the canteen opened, it represented a value of

\$15,000 with an outlay of only \$200, for everything from labor to equipment was given free of charge. In addition, an army of talent has been recruited from film-capital ranks. Every night two name bands will play for the floor-show staged, and will include in turn every star in Hollywood, and practically everyone in movie circles has enlisted to take turns doing the necessary chores around the place. Only four civilian guests will be allowed in each night and they will pay \$25 apiece for the privilege. Yep, Hollywood Canteen is a success. Servicemen applaud it, and those who made it possible are proud to SERVE THEM!

''S PORTS will continue during the war only in so far as they aid the war effort!"

That isn't the opinion of a sour old general or a crusader with an antiathletic bias. It is the forthright opinion of Bill Stern,

America's favorite sportscaster, a man who has won fame and fortune through his skill in dramatizing athletic events for the radio audience.

radio audience. I talked to Bill in his hotel room the day before he broadcast an important football game. This, my first meeting with the sportscaster, produced several surprises. The first was unimportant —the question of his appearance. Bill looks like his pictures —you would recognize his face across a hotel lobby. But those same pictures, stressing Bill's long face, had given me the impression that he was a very tall man. Actually he isn't above average

height, and he seems slightly built, almost frail.

frail. Much more important was the question of personality. Bill's radio reporting is packed with flashing enthusiasm, with a bubbling excitement. It made me expect to meet a man who still clung to the lightheartedness and cheeriness that we associate with campuses and "college spirit." (Continued on Page 36)

Tomorrow's Barometer: The National Election!

THE United States is fighting a war —the most horrible war in the history of the world. You can talk all you want to about why we are fighting the war. You can argue that it is for this reason, or for that reason. But when you get cold and factual, you know that we are fighting it to preserve self-government in America.

On November 3, we are having a national election. That election is going to tell us a lot of things. It will tell us who is going to hold office in the various states and communities. It will tell us the stature of the Congress we are going to have during these next two critical years in America's career as a nation. But most important of all, it will tell us just how determined we are, as citizens of the most powerful and influential democracy in the world, to continue to govern ourselves. It will tell us whether we still are willing to take the time and trouble to be interested in our government, and to make it represent a majority of the voters. How Determined Are We to Continue to Govern Ourselves? November 3 Will Tell, Warns Mutual's Washington Correspondent

I think that the American people ARE interested in their government. I know that they still are governing themselves, and that they have every intention of continuing to do so. So I am not concerned lest there be a dangerous lack of interest in the November election.

But speaking of the election itself, it probably is one of the most important elections we have seen for a long time, or are likely to see for a long time to come. It doesn't have any of the fancy trimmings and headlines that arouse interest in a presidential campaign. But on November 3, the entire House of Representatives and one-third of the Senate will be elected.

And that Congress that is going to be elected will have a lot to say about future American history. As a matter of fact, it will run the war. If you don't think Congress still is the boss of things in Washington, just remember that all the President's emergency powers were given to him by Congress, and that Congress can take them back any time it wants to. Ask Mr. Morgenthau who really writes the tax laws, or ask J. Edgar Hoover who tells him how many federal agents he can hire —ask anybody in the executive end of the government who tells them what they can do.

This new Congress not only will run the war but it might very well write the peace. It might shape up the postwar program which will decide whether we are going to be able to pick up the pieces and go on living the way we like to live. It might have the tremendous job of attempting to establish a lasting world peace, and if that job is fumbled, we could just settle down after this war is over and get ready to fight another one in twenty or thirty years.

But the job that the new Congress is going to have won't be the only unusual thing about this election. As a matter of fact, the election itself is going to be unusual. Keep that in mind (Continued on Next Page)

FOURTEEN years ago, Louise Massey was auditioning in the studios of KMBC, Kansas City. Scowling at the control-room critics, she muttered, "Boys, here's where we go back to the ranch. No one could please that bunch of bald-headed apes in the little room!"

But before Louise and the Westerners could leave, one of the "apes" rushed out to tell them that they had won two spon-

when you listen to the returns on November 3.

The war has done away with old campaign slogans and promises. Your candidate this year can't promise a new post office or park for your town; there are none to promise. There may be a few trick promises left, such as those involving new defense plants which would give everybody at home good jobs. But you don't have to worry about those, either, because you are pretty certain not to get them. Another unusual thing about this

election is that party politics probably are less important than they have been for a long time. This war isn't being fought by just Democrats or just Re-publicans. It is being fought by everybody. Neither party has a corner on brains, or ability, or patriotism. I have sat in the galleries of Congress and

seen both parties split almost beyond belief on war issues, in the days be-fore Pearl Harbor. I have seen easygoing, brilliant Representative Jim Wadsworth of New York, an unswerving Republican, develop into one of the Administration's mainstays in the House on foreign-policy matters. Senator Austin of Vermont, also a Republican, was another supporter of the Administration. There are many other cases like those, and just as many where

Democrats sided with the opposition. So, if you strip a candidate of his promises to give you something and then take away his political party, you have nothing left but the man. And it is the man in which you should be interested in this election. If you are going to judge the outcome of the election solely on the basis of whether more Republicans or more Democrats win, you are not going to have a very accurate estimate of the stature of the new Congress.

Now, as to the probable outcome of this election, we have the usual pre-dictions by the party leaders. The Republicans say they are going to pick up a lot of seats, and the Democrats say they are going to hang on to that nice comfortable majority they already have. We've heard all that before, and we know they can't both be right. But it is unusually hard this year to get any very accurate idea as to what the outcome is going to be. The campaign all over the country is quiet. No one is doing much talking, and when there isn't any talk, you can't tell what the voters are thinking. But rough, over-all estimates indicate that the Republicans may make some pretty substantial inroads into that Democratic majority in the House which now stands at about 100, and they probably will make a small gain in the Senate. Those are not predictions. They are just what look like the best guesses.

Now, when you listen to those returns on November 3, you should start out with some idea as to what you are going to listen for. If you try to absorb everything, you will get bogged down in a sea of precincts and votes, and then you probably will have

to ask somebody how the election came out.

To begin with, you can mark Maine and the entire South off your list. The election already has been held in Maine, and, for all practical purposes, it already has been held in the South. There just are not any Republicans in those states down there, and the real election issue is decided in the primaries, when the people nominate the Democratic candidates. The November election is just a formality, and not many people even bother to vote. When you mark Maine and the southern states off the list, you still

have quite a few left. But you can carry your elimination process still further. Those far Western states, like Utah, Nevada, Arizona, and Wyoming, are not very important from the standpoint of congressional elections. the The population in those states is small, and so is the number of representatives they send to Congress. Some of them have only one representative in the House.

Type of Picture: Wholly delightful comedy with a new twist and done to a turn.

This Is the Story: Ginger Rogers turns a dilemma into a rollicking adventure when she comes to New York to make good-and flops. With too little money in her purse to get back home, Ginger decides to go half-fare by impersonating a twelve-year-old she watches in the station. That lands her in a pretty kettle of fish, and when things get too hot, she scoots into a compartment occupied by Ray Milland (the major). He's completely taken in by her masquerade, and Ginger plays the part to the hilt, but finds it difficult when Major Ray gets affectionately sympathetic. Some of the situations are wholly unbelievable if you would rather analyze than laugh. Personally, we prefer to laugh —and did. Ginger, who loves to play kid parts, is great, and handsome Milland is a perfect foil.

CHICAGO By BILL ANDREWS

When Eddy Duchin took a Navy commission, we expected him to come to Great Lakes as soon as his training was completed. The spot of conductor of the Navy's rhythm orchestra which plays on "Meet Your Navy" seemed made to Eddy's order. But Eddy didn't show up, and we've been working to run him down. Here's the story:

The orchestra job may have been in Eddy's mind when he put on his uniform. But his training as a naval officer stirred up different ideas. Eddy became sold on Navy work, on the importance of the grim job our seamen face. The result: Eddy applied for active sea duty and got it. Somewhere at sea, or waiting orders to sea duty, Eddy's doing a job and asking no billing on a glittering sign, no credit on a radio program. He's swallowed up in the namelessness of our fighting men that's broken only by honors lists and casualty lists . . .

Poets who sing the praises of the dawn must, I suspect, lie late abed of a morning. Dawn in real life is grim and often bitter. A big town at 4:30 a.m. is full of tortured folk, bleary, sleepy, haggard. The people on an elevated train look like a draft of lost souls bound for Hades. Last night is all mixed up with tomorrow—last

"Alaskan butterflies," countered Charlie. "It's so cold up there they're stunted." Edgar Bergen, Mortimer back Charlie up night dragged out to its stale and sodden ending; tomorrow half-waked, grumbling, cold. And I remember many country dawns too, dark and chill and wet, when we sloshed across the soggy barnyard by lantern-light and fought to tone up sleep-drugged muscles for heavy chores.

All this is by way of a tribute to a group of radio folk in Chicago who crack the dreariness of the dawn to bring flashes of cheer to those up and about before the sun. It's the WLS gang who put on the "Smile a While" program six days a week, beginning at 5 a.m.

The show's light and breezy, gay and tuneful, definitely on the "corn" side, but the same type of high-grade corn that's made the "National Barn Dance" a favorite of millions. It's put on by rotating shifts of "NBD" talent.

The morning I visited the "Smile a While" show the gang included Red Foley, Joy and Jean, the Prairie Ramblers and the blind singers of sentimental ballads, Mac and Bob, all well known to "NBD" visitors. Howard Black, producer-emcee, is the only steady Smile-a-Whiler, for even the engineers work the dawn shift in turn.

It's a sleepy crew that clusters around the mike for the 5 a.m. signon. The sand's still in their eyes, and the shoulders sag when the first cheery chorus of the show's theme song rolls onto the airways to the accompaniment of some off-mike joshing and chatter. But the waker-uppers sell themselves their own brand of light-heartedness, and they soon are kidding and laughing among themselves without smothering their yawns.

The show runs on a strictly informal system. People stroll in late to work to the accompaniment of genial razzing. The script gets left behind as individual instrumentalists decide to try their hand at gagging. People stroll in and out of the studio, and nobody worries if the door squeaks. Along about 5:30 a.m. a pot of coffee is brought in from the back-alley lunchcounter and the gals play hostesses to the performers and the control-room crew. All this, I might add, would shatter the morale of a network producer, to whom the split-second timing is the rule.

This "Smile a While" program is a phenomenon. Every other station I've seen starts its morning off with a tired announcer and phonograph records. To see a crowded studio and a live-talent variety show before sun-up is a real novelty.

Most revealing single incident in the whole morning's proceedings, it seemed to me, was Jean's catnap. The gal was nursing a bad cold, was sleepy and weary. So, between her numbers, she found a blanket, brought it into the studio, wrapped herself up in it and slept peacefully on the floor not five feet from the microphone.

GERSHWIN, GOULD WORKS TO BE PERFORMED **ON TOSCANINI CONCERT SUNDAY**

Goldmark, Brahms Compositions Scheduled for Philharmonic Concert Sun.; Ganz Presents United Nations Program for Children Sat., CBS

F SHOSTAKOVICH isn't careful, he'll become the foremost Amer-ican composer." Morton Gould speaking. Mr. Gould, young, successful and witty, likes to make musicalso epigrams. He does well at both. As a musician he is admired by musicians, which is tantamount to saying

that he is a musician's musician. As an epigrammatist he is admired by many. Young Mr. Gould, as you must have learned by now, is the composer-conductor-pianist who has been holding forth so valiantly for so long for the Mutual Broadcasting System. He recently took up another duty, that of being himself, musically speaking, for Schenley's Cresta Blanca Wine, which sponsors a program featuring Jack Pearl on WOR-MBS.

Morton Gould sometimes finds it necessary to temper his epigrams with explanations. So he develops the Shostakovich with, "Seriously, though, I mean that he is the most positive of our contemporary writers. He pos-sesses a tremendous emotional expressiveness. He is clarity itself. He is simple and not self-conscious. In other words, he isn't afraid to use one-syllable words, because he isn't afraid to be considered uneducated.

"I'll tell you something else," he confided to the writer. "I don't care for Shostakovich's humor. It's rather common."

So much for the Gould slant on the Leningrad fire-warden, who, accord-ing to some accounts regarding his Seventh Symphony, answered a false alarm. Let's take up Gould the composer, the very fortunate composer who will have a work performed by Arturo Toscanini and the NBC Sym-

phony Orchestra. The work is "Lincoln Legend," a musical depiction of the spirit of Lincoln, "not in the literary sense, but symbolically." Mr. Gould has subtitled his composition "An American Idol." The symphonic piece is in one movement.

Asked whether the movement answers to sonata form, Mr. Gould re-plied, "The form is curvature of the spine." But, of course, he was being for the nonce Gould the epigrammat-ist, or wit, if you prefer. Not that Mr. Gould wouldn't be the one to describe musically a spinal tidal wave. He is that clever.

Naturally, the composer has utilized some folk material. In the "Lincoln Legend," a work that would certainly call for the use of such basic stuff, he has incorporated "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" and "Old Abe Lincoln Came Out of the Wilderness."

"I believe that 'The Battle Hymn of A Rarely Heard Concerto the Republic' is one of the most powerfully lyrical and expressive of march tunes," he said. "It gives the composer a good deal to work with. The other piece, 'Old Abe Lincoln Came Out of the Wilderness,' was one of the Great Emancipator's campaign songs. You can see how well that fits the idea of a 'Lincoln Legend.' "

Thus far Mr. Gould has devoted most of his time to radio. He has had to make his own arrangements for radio programs, a matter that takes up much of one's time. But he has also written original works. Somehow when the urge is there, he says, the time can be found. Already several of the country's major symphony orchestras have performed Morton Gould compositions, notably his two "American Sympho-nettes" and the "Foster Gallery," a suite based on Stephen Foster melodies.

Mr. Gould's ambition, it is easy to understand, is to write. Some day he will be occupied solely with that. He won't write operas for a while, be-cause he doesn't feel too drawn to that form of musical art. He admits, however, that his ideas may change.

The young musician is particularly pleased by the fact that his "Lincoln Legend" will be programmed by the NBC Symphony (November 1) to-gether with George Gershwin's "Rhap-sody in Blue." The program, actually, is one by American composers, the other two being Charles Martin Loeffler and Paul Creston. But the most important thing, though, is that Arturo Toscanini will conduct. And Mr. Gould can't be criticized for his esctasy.

Carl Goldmark, Hungarian born, lived so much of his musical life in Vienna that he is regarded today almost as a Viennese composer. In that respect he is something like Joachim, famous violinist, another Hunthe garian, who had a street named after him in Berlin. All this, of course, preanschluss.

He wrote a good deal of music that is played today, particularly his First Symphony and several overtures, in-cluding the "Sakuntala." But Goldmark also wrote a Violin Concerto in A Minor. This is not the daily bread of all violinists, but it has had its moments. Both this work and the Fourth Symphony of Brahms are programmed the November 1 concert of the Philharmonic-Symphony over CBS, Bruno Walter conducting.

Probably the most curious thing about the first performance of Brahms' Fourth Symphony was the reaction of the public at the idea of a symphony in the key of E minor. Such a dis--as Hugo Wolf couldn't digest the thought of a symphony in E minor. But, as always happens, Brahms' closest adherents found much to be happy about in the choice of key. Perhaps, they wanted to conceal their disappointment in the music itself. It wasn't too well thought of then.

The symphony didn't bounce soon into general favor. It had a long, up-hill road to travel. As a matter of fact, Brahms had played the work, on the piano, for several friends of his previous to the orchestral premiere. Their reception of the music was practically nil. Today it is regarded in certain eminent circles as Brahms' greatest symphonic work.

has been called a "character" symphony. The composer has with-drawn into himself; that is, he has become meditative, subjective. And for a particular piece of analysis one is referred to a statement of Brahms' biographer, Niemann, who finds this symphony an expression of Brahms' "own tragic recognition . . . that, as a tragic composer, his place is not at the side of Beethoven." Could be. (Philharmonic-Symphony broadcast on CBS on November 1 at 3 p.m. EWT.)

Josephine Houston: Beauty plus brains and voice

BEAUTY and brains don't often go together. Beauty and brains and a lovely voice fraternize less frequently. Beauty and brains and a lovely voice and creative ability still less so. But the last grouping occasionally comes about. It can be found amply rep-

resented in all of its parts in the person of Josephine Houston, young soprano from Nebraska.

Miss Houston is young, as we've pointed out, but she has had a career; in fact, several of them already. She has appeared on Broadway in some of those spectacular extravaganzas that opulence-loving producers like to turn out. She has been a prima donna in many successful operettas here and abroad. She has even done dramatic parts. All of this with considerable success.

Now she is hard at work on the radio. You'll find her on the Blue Network Sunday nights between 7 and 7:30 p.m. EWT. There she sings her own arrangements of the better popular songs in the program, "Stars from the Blue."

The word arrangements is used advisedly, for Miss Houston often rewrites a song and makes out of it a stunning dramatic presentation. She pens new lyrics, new music for it, in short, she stages it, endeavoring always to develop the song's idea to its fullest possible scope.

That, of course, requires imagina-tion and taste and a remarkable musical ability. "Popular songs," she said, "are the basis of excellent dramatic material. They need to be amplified, edited. They need what the simple, fragmentary themes of the great symphonies need—expansion and con-struction into more expressive terms."

Miss Houston has the opera-bug. She will sing in opera one day. She knows it. She feels that she has the voice, the personality, the understanding of the spinto roles. She knows several of them now, the heroine in "Madama Butterfly," for instance, Nedda in "Pagliacci," the female leads in "Thais," "Turandot," to mention a few.

Miss Houston believes that a truly American music for voice is in process of development. She envisions works of great beauty based on the Ameri-can idioms, the popular idioms. We wouldn't be surprised if the lady's prophecies should come about, par-ticularly since we feel the same way about it.

WOMEN FILLING TECHNICAL JOBS AT FM STATIONS . . . MORE NEW OUTLETS

W57PH Begins Operation in Philadelphia; Stations Present Special Programs for War Workers; FM's First Religious Station Plans Debut

The Total Grows

THE debut of still another FM station was marked in October by the following telegram, dispatched to interested parties by Leslie Joy, manager of KYW in Philadelphia: "The birth of an FM station in the

"The birth of an FM station in the City of Brotherly Love on Monday, October 5, at 3 p.m., is hereby announced by Westinghouse station KYW. The child was immediately christened W57PH by the Federal Communications Commission, and its first howl was heard to the horizon by enthusiastic neighbors. Both mother and child are doing extremely well."

This makes five FM transmitters regularly serving frequency-modulation listeners in the Philadelphia area —more than the number in any other city except New York. Contrary to what was stated on this page last month, W73PH (operated by WPEN) has been on the air since last June and is currently heard from 1 to 4 and 6 to 9 p.m. daily. The entire installation of FM transmitter and antenna required only eight days, and represents about the quickest time in which any FM station has ever been constructed.


This brings to forty-three the number of FM outlets now on the air throughout the country. One year ago there were only seventeen. Despite the advent of war, FM has still moved ahead steadily and today is thoroughly enough entrenched to expect that it will hold its own until the return of peace.

It's a Woman's World

It's reached a point where nothing is sacred any more. Even the traditionally masculine vocation of radio sound-effects man has fallen by the wayside. Today we have sound-effects women. It all started at W85A, the General Electric FM station at Schenectady, N. Y., which recently lost its maker of artificial noises to the draft.

In his place appeared a demure young lady named Beth Muir—blonde, if you'd like to know—who is now responsible for the pistol-shots, trainwhistles, airplane motors and sundry other sounds that mean so much in radio dramatizations. One of Miss Muir's knottier problems deals with doors. In the first place, she has a tendency to get her fingers caught in them. (The sound-effects people, in case you don't know. use a sawed-off door in a real door-frame that opens and closes, even if it doesn't happen to lead anywhere.)

"I could use lots more hands and feet," declares Miss Muir, when outlining her main dilemma. "The hands are necessary because I have to work turntables for three different record-

ings of sound-effects—all playing simultaneously. The feet give the sound of tramping, only two feet don't sound much like an army. "My biggest worry, though, is that

"My biggest worry, though, is that door. Almost every script calls for the sound of a door closing—maybe several times during the broadcast. The question is to get the door open so I can close it again. There I am with a closed door on my hands and no cue to open it before I'm supposed to shut it again."

Miss Muir's problem grows particularly acute when you consider that FM microphones are quite sensitive and able to hear the faintest noise in the studio.

Women technicians and announcers are becoming increasingly common in the frequency-modulation field, due to the shortage of men—especially engineers—who have entered the armed services. There are many excellent opportunities these days, incidentally, for women in all branches of the broadcasting industry. The necessary training to serve as studio technicians does not take long to acquire, and women have already proved their ability at such specialized jobs (particularly on telephone switchboards).

Broadcasting is classed as one of the essential services necessary for the maintenance of public morale and the dissemination of war information. Women who fill the place of men in radio stations not only receive good wages but are performing a vital task in the over-all pattern of an America at war.

Another in Chicago

The first non-commercial and religious FM station in the country—W75C at Chicago—is expected on the air with regular programs in the very near future, according to an announcement by Henry C. Crowell, director of the Moody Bible Institute.

For several weeks FM engineers have been conducting tests with a new antenna, installed atop the 490-foot transmitting-tower of W75C's sister station, WMBI.

Although W75C has official permission to install a 50.000-watt transmitter, operation for the duration will probably continue at 1,000 watts because of priorities and the scarcity of needed materials. Mail received following preliminary tests indicates that listeners up to forty miles south of Chicago have been hearing W75C with a satisfactory signal.

W75C is the first station in the Chicago area to employ a studio-to-transmitter FM link which relays programs over a narrow radio beam from its studios in Chicago to the transmitter location at Addison, Ill., nineteen miles to the west. This obviates the need for telephone wires, normally used for such purposes.

During part of the broadcast day, WMBI and W75C will air the same programs. At other times, FM listeners will hear programs designed exclusively for them. W75C is the fourth station on the air in Chicago, following the Chicago *Tribune's* W59C, Zenith Radio's W51C, and the CBS FM outlet, W67C.

FM Singing Hostess

W1XTG, one of the country's pioneer FM stations, at Worcester, Mass., is now bringing frequency-modulation enthusiasts of mid-New England a fifteen-minute program twice weekly, featuring the voice of Ann D'Elia, singing receptionist of W1XTG and WTAG, who is introduced as "The Singing Hostess of Frequency Modulation." The program is heard each Monday and Wednesday at 4:15 p.m. EWT, presenting light concert favorites. Miss D'Elia is a member of the Worcester Light Opera Association and well known in central New England for her radio broadcasts and appearances at war bond rallies.

In the War Factories

FM is making a sizable number of contributions to the war effort these days not only in actual combat equipment and policing systems at war plants but also in the maintenance of morale among workers in war factories.

The fact that most FM stations broadcast long daily periods of classical and semi-classical music has led employers to install FM receivers in workrooms where their employes may hear the FM programs at certain intervals during the day. It has been found that the change wrought by occasional periods of music results in higher efficiency, less worker-fatigue. Recently, at the suggestion of W45V,

Recently, at the suggestion of W45V, several war plants in the vicinity of Evansville, Ind., have installed the necessary equipment to receive noonday and evening programs from W45V. These are presented over the publicaddress systems of the factories. Programs during these two periods are specially planned for the purpose with patriotic music, newscasts, safety slogans, and similar material.

The arrangement makes many new friends for FM among the workers and, when the postwar era arrives, they will probably be quick to purchase FM sets because of the familiarity they are gaining now with its greater tonal range and clarity.

W8XAD, the experimental FM station of WHEC in Rochester, N. Y., also airs special programs intended for the ears of war workers.

Nazi Propaganda Now on the Defensive; Marines in Solomons Hear U. S. Programs; American Prisoners Report Over Tokyo Stations

Europe a Fortress, Say Nazis

A. SINCLAIR, British propaganda analyst, explained the causes underlying the recent change in Nazi propaganda the other night over the London shortwave station.

The Nazi propaganda trend is now consistently on the defensive. Both occupied Europe and Germany itself are seething with unrest. The new idea is to instill in the minds of these peoples that "the worst is now over, that they can now begin to settle down inside fortified Europe and enjoy the fruits of their conquest, that a ring of steel will be built around the whole continent." The new theme proposes that a new epoch has begun, that things are actually going to improve from now on. This propaganda will undoubtedly be used as a main theme until there is a radical change one way or the other in the military situation. It is ingenious in that it can be played up big in both home and overseas broadcasts. It is good for encouraging the home front and meanwhile allowing a quiet reorganization of Nazi plans to be effected. It is meant to prove to Nazis that their position on the continent is impregnable, that they cannot be dislodged from Europe. It is supposed to prove to those in the occupied countries that uprisings and organized resistance is useless, that an invasion is an impossibility. It is supposed to prove to those Americans simple-minded enough to believe it that an invasion of the Continent is unnecessary, that Germany's new order is now established, that she will not move out of her walls and has no intention of further offensive actions outside of those already under way. In other words, the "fortified Europe" propaganda is a dragon with three heads. One to cheer Germans, one to frighten those in occupied countries, the other to instill a false sense of security in the peoples of the United States and Britain.

Yanks in Solomons Hear U. S.

Marines battling the Japs in the Solomon Isles are receiving their daily news and entertainment from KGEI, San Francisco, according to a letter from a colonel in the Marine Corps at Guadalcanal, received recently at that station.

Here is the letter:

"Just a brief note from a fightingfront to say that we enjoy and look forward to your daily news broadcast. Your 1:00 a.m. PWT (7:00 p.m. here) program comes in fine. I always have large crowd present around my Zenith portable and, in addition, we have our field telephone rigged into a hook-up so that many others on the front lines receive the news also. On one occasion during an enemy air raid,

I carried the set into my foxhole and listened during the bombardment. I might add that eleven of the twentysix enemy bombers failed to return that evening. Please remember that my name is not to be used if reference is made to this letter. The Marines have the situation well in hand and we will continue to give the little yellow devils hell."

U. S. May Operate Short Wave

If Congressional approval is forthcoming (and it probably will be), a plan for Government ownership and control of all United States short-wave broadcast stations, already ap-proved in principle by the War Communications Board, will be put speedily into effect.

The plan includes outright purchase and subsequent twenty-four-hour daily operation of U. S. international stations, which are now owned by various large corporations or net-works. The Office of War Information and Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs will actually direct activities of the stations, including the planning of all programs. Headquarters will probably be in the General Motors Building in New York. The plan contem-plates the use of thirty-six short-wave transmitters in all, of which

fourteen now are in operation. Some \$7,068,000 has been requested by the OWI for construction of the new stations and improvements on the now existing transmitters. Our propaganda battery has lagged sadly behind Goebbels' artillery, which includes some sixty-eight transmitters. The new move will enable us to spread goodwill more effectively; to counteract enemy propaganda more successfully.

WHAT'S **COOKING!**

By GEORGIA SCOTT Stretch Your Food Dollar!

HEN your pocketbook becomes a slave to the food budget, go in for a bit of adjusting! In these times, it is our patriotic duty to save pennies to make dollars to buy war bonds. You can shop wisely and economically and still not cut down on nutritious foods. For if there was ever a time when your family needed healthful and appetizing food, it is right now! So keep them in pep, and your budget in step with the nation's demands.

Preparing low-cost meals to stretch the food dollar is not impossible. However, it does require careful planning, thrifty shopping, and a dash of imag-ination. The thrifty housewife does her shopping in person, and frequently adjusts her menu to fit the specialties of the day. She buys only fruits and vegetables that are in season. She checks her shopping habits for tricks of the trade.

Far too many women, particularly those in the metropolitan areas, always buy white eggs and pay premium prices. This is really not necessary, for you can get the same food value in brown eggs at a considerably lower price. You must make sure, however. that the eggs are always fresh and meet the standards of their grade. Then, too, money can be saved on butter. The economical woman buys tubbutter to use on the table as well as in cooking, and thereby saves the price of packaging. She simply slices the butter into cubes and wraps in oiled paper. This prevents the various re-frigerator odors from impairing the flavor and it always looks appetizing when served.

But you still must contend with your most expensive item-meat. The time may come when we will be rationed on this natural source of B vitamins, but we will never go without such valuable food. There may be an under-

supply of this or that cut, but we will always have meat. And there is no time like the immediate moment to collect ways of dramatizing cheaper meats and at the same time help our budget. Here's something worth trying.

Pork Sausage Scrapple

- 1 cup cornmeal
- 4 cups water
- 1½ teaspoons salt
- 1 pound pure pork sausage

Add cornmeal slowly to the rapidly boiling salt water and cook for about fifteen minutes until the mush is thick. Lightly brown sausage, crumbling it with a fork. Add pork sausage to mush mix thoroughly. Pack into a and bread-loaf pan. Cover with waxed paper. Chill. Slice one-fourth inch thick, pan fry until lightly brown. Serves six.

Buying foods in large quantities is another thrifty habit to acquire. It can be a challenge to your imagination! So let each item play a number of roles. Take, for instance, corned-beef brisket. Split-pea soup, made from the water of the cooked corned beef, can be served one night for dinner. It will have a tangy flavor and will definitely taste good. The following evening serve the hot corned beef, which has been cooked with potatoes and carrots, and the remaining meat can be stored away in the refrigerator. Then several days later produce it in the form of sliced corned beef with hot potato salad. Try these ideas on your family.

Corned Beef Brisket 5 pounds corned beef Water

Cover corned beef with water. Bring to a boil. Simmer about three

> and one-half hours or until tender. Pared potatoes and carrots are cooked with the corned beef for the last twenty or thirty minutes. The vegetables may be cooked with the beef when it is being reheated in hot water.

> > Split Pea Soup

- 2 quarts corned-beef broth 1/2 cup split peas (soaked overnight)
- 1 medium onion

Add split peas to boiling broth. Add the diced onion and cook until peas are tender. Press through sieve and bring to a boil. Blend one tablespoon flour with two tablespoons melted butter and add to soup; stir until well mixed. Add a few pieces of corned beef. Serves six to eight.

Hot Potato Salad

- 1/2 pound bacon, diced potatoes, cooked in jackets (3½ cups cubed)
- onion, chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- teaspoon pepper
- teaspoon sugar
- 1/2 cup vinegar
- 1 beaten egg

Fry bacon. Combine potatoes, bacon and onion. Add remaining ingredients to bacon drippings; heat thoroughly. Pour over potato mixture and mix well. Serves six.





But Bill isn't frothy. On the contrary, he seems earnest, almost painfully so. His mind runs to serious things, and it was of serious business that we talked.

I had one question to ask Bill: "What will the war mean to sports?" Bill answered it with straight-from-

the-shoulder comments, crisp, incisive, thoroughly realistic. He pulled no punches. Moreover, his answer was obviously the product of long and serious thought. He needed no prodding nor leading questions. Here is the essence of what he told me:

"This is an all-out war, and sports, like everything else, must do their share or close up shop. Where sports can serve the war effort, they will be continued. Where they do not help, they will be stopped.

"Take football, for example. The war is already making its pinch felt in the curtailment of special trains, the rubber shortage and gas-rationing. However, I do not expect the present football season to be affected greatly. When we launch great offensive movements, and our casualty lists mount high, people are going to begin to resent the husky young fellows on the football teams. I don't think there is much feeling against their being in school as yet.

"There will probably be very little big-time football next season. The young men will be gone and the transportation problem will be more serious. Transportation is really the key to the question of sports in the sense of mass spectacles. The Government simply won't be able to afford the waste of transportation involved in any game that attracts great crowds. "However, there will be plenty of

football played. I think you will see a great shift from intercollegiate to intramural football. The game is a great conditioner and toughener, perhaps the closest thing to actual combat you'll find in the sports world. There will also be more games between schools that are very near to each other.

"One of two things may happen to horse-racing. Either the Government will take all the profits—not just the five percent "breakage" it now gets or racing will be stopped. We don't need horse-racing to improve the breed. The waste of transportation in getting crowds to and from the tracks isn't justified unless the Government gets a great deal of revenue from the sport. If the Government takes over, purses will probably be greatly re-duced, except for a few traditional stakes like the Kentucky Derby. Even the Derby will have to draw its crowd from the people in the vicinity of Louisville.

"The war will mean the end of bush-league ball for the duration. The smaller leagues won't be able to get transportation, even if they can find players next summer. I think it is possible that even the majors may be suspended, but it is more likely that they will be allowed to continue with a shortened season. Probably not more than six leagues will be playing ball next summer, and these will be the most important ones. Here again, transportation is the key to the problem.

"I think we've seen the last prizefight of major importance till after the war. The armed services are clamping down on the fighters in uniform, and I think they'll continue to do so. The (Continued on Next Page)

fighters left next year will be the oldtimers who have slipped and the green youngsters who haven't reached their peak. The only sort of fight I can imagine being produced in the months to come that would pack Madison Square Garden would be a bout between, say, the champion of Fort Dix and the champion of Great Lakes Naval Training Station.

"Tennis and golf may continue with little interruption, for they don't put any great strain on the transportation system. They offer healthful exercise, and that will be encouraged.

"We can sum all this up by saying that when a sport seriously interferes with the war effort, it will be stopped or curtailed. And the worst problems arise in connection with the sports in which a small group of players attract great crowds, thereby wasting rubber and gasoline.

"War is having another and very different effect on sports. Our armed forces are training the champions of tomorrow—and what champions they will be! The last war produced men like Gene Tunney, and the present Army conditioning program is a tremendous improvement over the World War I set-up.

"In the preflight schools, the Army camps, the Naval stations and the other military centers, young men by the millions are undergoing a physical development course that is making them hardy and rugged. Our boys are learning to take it—and to dish it out. "I ran into Tommy Harmon down in Texas recently. I've never seen Tommy so sure of himself—not even when he was an all-American football player. He is cocky about his ability to handle his fists, though he was never a fighter in his school years. "After this war is over, I look for a great revival in sports. Every war seems to produce a sort of athletic golden age. I believe that the golden age to follow this war will be even greater than that of the twenties

greater than that of the twenties. "Yes, the mass spectator sports will suffer during the war. But in their place will come far greater participation in rough-and-tumble athletics by our young fellows. Until these fellows come back, it is the job of sports to serve the war effort. When the money they raise, the good health they produce, and the boost they give morale are great enough to justify the time, effort, materials and money expended on them, we'll keep them. Those that can't show a favorable balance in these respects are through—washed up for the duration."

That's Bill Stern's story of sports in war-time. It isn't a cheerful story for the fan—or for the professional sportscaster. But Bill wasn't complaining. He was simply calling our war plays the way he saw them, as honestly and accurately as he calls the plays of a big game

big game. What's more, I got the very strong impression that Bill Stern was man enough and patriot enough not to do any crabbing, no matter what plays coach Uncle Sam decides to use in the Big Game.

The real decision comes in your big states and the middle-size ones. New York, California and Illinois, for example, send a total of 92 representatives to the House. Any appreciable shift in those states will make a big difference in the political complexion of Congress.

In addition to those big states, there are the trouble-spot states—states where the voters may reverse themselves and oust many of the incumbents. Connecticut is one example of that. It has only five members in the House, and four of them now are Democrats. But there are cross currents in some of the pre-election winds which indicate that the entire Connecticut delegation may be Republican next year.


New York is another very important indicator this year. The election campaign there is highlighted by that touch-and-go gubernatorial race between Thomas Dewey, the Republican candidate, and James Bennett, the Democratic nominee. A shift of votes in Dewey's favor might upset the balance in some of the other races in the state


Candidates reporting back from California are nervous about the situation out there. There are no clear indications that any major upsets are in the wind, but changes wouldn't be surprising. The campaign in Illinois has been so quiet that even the candidates don't have any very good idea of the situation. The same is true in Indiana, with the exception that a few of the veteran Democratic congressmen from that state appear to be dangerously close to defeat.

The recent reapportionment of Congress, which took congressional seats away from some states and gave them to others, is going to make some minor changes in Congress, and it looks like it will result in some gains for the Republicans.

I have been following politics for about twenty years, and I have never found any magic key for predicting election results. But the way everything looks now, the Republicans will make some gains. If the Democrats should maintain their present majority in Congress, that will be somewhat of an upset against the Republicans. If the Republicans were to cut the Democratic majority in the house down sixty or seventy from the present one hundred majority, that would be an upset against the Democrats. But Republicans or Democrats, on the shoulders of those congressmen elected must fall the task of guiding this nation through ever-pyramiding crises ahead!
