

Bostonbred they are naturally musical and have played and sung together since childhood. Dorthea has studied violin and Ethel the piano. The "Song Bird of the South"

Kate Smith the LaPalina singer, who is heard on CBS network every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at 8:30 P. M. (EST).

No one has ever looked upon her as anemic. Even at her birth in Washington, D. C., 22 years ago, Kate Smith was plump, and the ensuing years have brought further poundage. Furthermore, the young woman has no desire to diet. She is happiest, she says, when eating rich desserts, and she likes to be happy.

It was this desire for happiness that caused her to abandon Georgetown University, where at the behest of her family she was studying nursing, to begin the vocal training which eventually brought her to national attention.

Her professional career covers only six years, dating back to 1925 when she sang at a benefit in the B. F. Keith Theatre in Washington. Eddie Dowling was in the audience, heard her crooning, and engaged her immediately for his show, "Honeymoon Lane". One success led to another and when the show closed she was promptly signed for a part in the musical comedy, "Hit The Deck".

Careful investigation revealed the following facts anent the personal life of "Kate—the Radio Singer"; She's blonde, blue-eyed, wears no street make-up, and sings to her maid, Floyd, while putting on her stage make-up. Always wears solid colors—blue, white, black, but never red. Repertoire includes concert, operatic, Irish, "blues", and negro melodies. Her speaking voice is as hearty as anyone of her songs, with the possible exception of the moment following any defeat at backgammon. The theme song of her program, "When the Moon Comes Over the Mountain", is her most prized possession—she was co-lyricist with Howard Johnson.

World Radio History

"The March of Time" is probably the most ambitiously cast program on the air... The cast of actors on each program numbers from 25 to 30... And Howard Barlow's baton directs 18 musicians for the theme song and musical curtains.

Wee Willie Robyn, Columbia singer who has found it necessary to use a specially constructed microphone for his Venida programs, has carried the business of size a bit too far, if you ask musical director Emery Deutsch. The violinist doesn't mind the fact that Robyn buys his clothes in the boys' department of a store, nor even the fact that he signs his name with small letters. But when Wee Willie invited Emery for a ride in his new car, he gave up. You're right—it was an Austin, and there would have been room for Emery walked and the violin took the ride with Wee Willie.

In the doorway of the sporting goods store stands a dole figure. "Oi", he says, "I won't make a sale for fifteen minutes."

A mute show takes place in front of the music store while the real life drama comes from the loud speaker. Faces light up-or they frown.

Tosselli's Serenade again and the show is over with another object lesson driven home in simple terms. The crowd breaks away. Maxwell Street begins its bargaining again.

"Hey"! Want to buy a suede jacket. One buck!" (All regular members of the cast of "The Gold-

bergs" are Jewish).

"A Buck on Leave"

Mrs. Winchell's Bad Little Boy, Walter

World's Champion Collector of Gossip

Back before the war there was a stage-struck kid of 13 who earned his coffee and cakes as a singing usher in a movie house in Harlem. Eventually he graduated to vaudeville where he earned \$100.00 a week as a hoofer. But he quit the stage and went to work as a news writer for \$25.00, because he thought he'd like that better.

And, apparently he was right, for now he's turned the coffee and cake money into an income which would make many a millionaire water at the mouth, and he's known to hosts of people as Walter Winchell, the world's gossip collector.

The boy who sang in the Harlem movie is the man who now writes a column syndicated all over the country, and who talks over a National Broadcasting Company network three times a week. His voice is heard in Cuba, Hawaii, London, Paris and Montreal, as well as throughout America, as he calls orchestras to go on the air in various parts of the world.

It's quite a story, the story of his rise to fame:

Walter was born in New York in 1897. "No rag went into an extra edition over the event", he says. He went to the public schools until he was thirteen, when he started on his roundabout road to Broadway. He was in 6-B when he left school to join the "Imperial Trio"—three singin' ushers in a Harlem "moom pitcher" house.

That trio wasn't famous then, but look at the members of it now. Winchell isn't the only one who's famous on the NBC air waves. Another of the boys was Eddie Cantor—and you've heard of the third one too—Georgie Jessel. Those three used to keep the crowd out of the aisles, collect late tickets, and during intermission s:ng popular "chunes" to illustrated slides.

Cantor was the lead, Jessel sang bass, and Winchell was the tenor. Winchell was spelled with only one "l" then, but shortly afterward Gus Edwards put the trio into a revue and the printer spelled it in the present form on the program.

"What the "l", said Walter, and accepted the addition.

It was with this act that the trekking started. Walter played the boards in various acts from coast to coast until the war started

and he enlisted in the Navy. "And can you imagine?" he says, "They made me confidential secretary to two admirals. A juicy slice of irony. First confidential sec. to a battleship, and now the mogul scandalmonger."

When the papers were signed which stopped the firing, Winchell returned to vaudeville, but soon decided to quit the stage. He wanted to be a newspaper man at any price, and while he was thinking about it he started "The Daily News Sense"—a couple of typewritten sheets which he used to tack up beside the mail box in every theater where he appeared.

Finally one theater owner showed it to Glenn Condon, editor of the New York Vaudeville News, who agreed to meet Walter's demand of \$25.00 a week for his reportorial services. Soon he was earning \$50.00, and after Condon agreed to allow him 20% on the advertising, he was making more than the editor.

Then a new "tab" was started in New York and Winchell was hired as dramatic critic, amusement editor and columnist at \$100.00. Four years later he was getting \$300.00, and a little later still the New York "mirrrr", as he calls it, hired him at \$25,000 a year for the column alone.

"Broadway is my world", he says. "I get up promptly at four every afternoon, make the office by five and prepare the column for the next yawning. Then comes the nightly round of theatres, sin-dens, ritzy parties, cognoscenti conclaves, drink a little giggle-water here and there and sniff out the news about the celebs. At about seven in the morning I go to bed".

Winchell says you "must pump people for news." You can always manage to find a leak in the person who promised not to tell, he finds. In addition he has regular news scources in Newport, Palm Beach and the other resorts, as well as in Europe.

"It's a dizzy business," he says, "a dizzy job, yet I'm happy where I am. All of broadway is my back yard."

Winchell married June Astor before he left the stage and they have two girls—Gloria and Walda. They're in Florida now and he gets lonesome sometimes, but he is too busy writing and broadcasting to be really unhappy about it.

Time? Yes--- No--- Oh!

This nightmare might happen to any announcer who has worked too hard through the day. It was the opening night of the largest commercial program to ever be presented over an NBC network. Everett Mitchell (dreaming he was Chicago NBC's ace mike-man) was to announce the program, at which the company's president, Morling H. Aylesworth, and a host of directors were present in honor of the occasion. Time came for the switch from the New York studios to those in Chicago. Everett looked at the clock which had never lost a split second of time, only to find that it was wrong. On legs that seemed to stick to the floor, he made his way to another studio to find that clock also wrong. Hurrying as fast as he could, he visited all of the remaining studios, and in each found the time different. Sick at heart Everett returned to the original studio to find that the program was already over.

Everett woke from the nightmare in a cold sweat! (Boy, we'll bet he's glad that was only a dream).

Russ Columbo Uses 5 Languages

Radio's "Voice from the Golden West" who in a few short months has sung his way to fame with a sensational vocal style, has signed an exclusive long term contract with NBC for nightly appearance over coast-to-coast networks.

Columbo's rise to radio's dizzy heights has been meteoric and romantic. No Alger hero ever rode to success more spectacularly. His full name—Ruggerio Rudolpho Eugenio Columbo—indicates his Italian parentage. He was born in San Francisco in 1907.

An idol of the air also can be an accomplished linguist. In fact, Russ Columbo, NBC Romeo of Song, has demonstrated such lingual proficiency that listeners often write him asking his nationality.

"The other evening I sang a Russian song", and a Russian-speaking listener got me on the telephone and began praising my proficiency in his language. I was delighted, but I am sorry to say that my knowledge of the Russian tongue is somewhat limited.

My Knowledge of Italian, Spanish and German, however, has helped me attain a passable pronunciation in several languages.

"French is quite difficult, but I have found Italian helpful in the pronunciation of that graceful tongue. I think French is one of the most musical of languages and one of the most effective when sung."

Columbo's native tongue is English. His parents were Italian-born, and he speaks the language of his father's sunny Naples like a true Neapolitan.

"I learned to respect German through my association with my first violin teacher," Columbo says.

"I picked up some Spanish on the Hollywood movie lots and also studied it in high school in Los Angeles. As I have grown older I have realized the value of Italian and I owe a great debt of gratitude to my parents for keeping the language alive in our home."

Three of a Kind

Arthur Tracy, "The Street Singer" came to radio after years of musical comedy, motion picture house and night club efforts. Starting on early afternoon periods he soon was drawing such a volume of fan mail that officials of Columbia moved him to the coveted 11 P. M. period where he is heard thrice weekly.

Now he wants to view the world from another angle and spends most of his spare time riding in planes. Charlie's love for the air dates back to his flight to Edmonton, Canada, where he was the only network announcer to greet Post and Gatty, the world flyers. Charles' favorite role in radio is giving "woofs" for control engineers. Dorothea James, whose beauty, dancing and singing has graced such productions as "Strike Up The Band", "Good News", and "Princess Charming", made her radio debut over the Columbia Network during the broadcast of "Radio Roundup."

In addition to her stage experience, she has appeared in motion-pictures since childhood, her first important role occurring in "school days" opposite Wesley Barry. For several years the versatile young lady performed as a protegee of Gus Edwards. Miss James has posed for a number of important paintings and sculptures, particularly the Roosevelt Memorial Statue at Oyster Bay, Long Island.

Studio Notes

NBC has three completely equipped studios from which no programs are ever broadcast over the air. They are studios X, Y and Z, used only for auditions and rehearsals.

"Take up some other station".—Coriolanus.











Mr. & Mrs. E. Ormandy



Bill is fond of the Lincoln Park zoo, and when he heard that a new consignment of monkeys was being delivered, he immediately dashed down

there. "Say", he addressed a slightly intoxicated in-dividual, "did you see a truck-load of monkeys pass by here?" "Wha'sa' matter?" asked the gentleman, "Did ya fall off?"

Members of the Morgan Trio, NBC instrumental group who have just returned from an European trip, say London and Paris radio stations are not particular about the time allowed to artists. Broadcasters do not have to cut off their programs if they are a few minutes too long, as they do here.

What sounds like a horse galloping down a dusty road? The production men at the NBC studios in Chicago. after experimenting around for a while, found that drumming on a derby hat with muffled xylophone hammers gives the de-

sired effect.

A long-suffering production man, who for years has heeded the New York fire department admonition against smoking in the studios, won his revenge when the fire department's glee club broadcast over an NBC network. As the vocalists concluded their rehearsal, several reached into deep firemen's pockets, drew forth cigarettes and prepared to light up.

"I am sorry boys, no smoking in the studios", warned the production man, as he pointed to the bright red fire sign with a note of glee in his voice, and then stepped quietly into an adjacent corridor and calmly enjoyed a refreshing smoke.

Roles

John Holbrook.

Won Honors in 1931

John Wesley Holbrook, voted the best voice on the air in 1931, is the most surprised young man in America. He started out to gain fame as a ski-jumper. Instead, he bounced through banking and business, slid across the stage, and skidded into radio by a ruse.

He was awarded the gold medal for good diction on the radio by the American Academy of Arts and Letters on November 12, 1931.

John, a blue-eyed brunette, is a lithe six-footer who unbounds quickly in manner and speech. He revealed that he never studied elocution in his life. Without previous experience, he once filled thirty-two weeks in stock for an actor who walked off the job. His speech is that of a cosmopolite.

Holbrook was born at Crow Point, suburb of Boston, on August 14, 1906. His father was a southerner and his mother a Yankee. They took him, when one year old, to Mexico. They returned to the states and settled at Sherbrooke, At Lennoxville, near there, Holbrook grew up in the Etonian atmos-Quebec. phere of Bishop's College School. He left college in 1926.

"My father, a corporation lawyer, wanted me to become an attorney. In-stead, I seriously intended to become a professional ski-jumper", Holbrook recalled. Ultimately, he dabbled in the Boston wool business, tried banking, sold oil burners and peddled automobiles.

"Money went through my hands so fast that I didn't seem able to stop any of it", Holbrook said, "So I 'scrammed' out of business.

While walking down the street in Boston, Holbrook noticed the name plate of station WNAC. Out of curiosity, he entered and wheeled his way into the studios. He was surprised to find a friend working there. The acquaintance suggested he get into the business.

Holbrook obtained a list of Boston advertising agencies and tramped the streets for a job. He wandered into a firm on Water Street and announced he was fresh from radio. The advertising production man introduced him as "A big radio man from Canada."

"I had never seen a microphone in my life", Holbrook said. "The big redheaded Irishman who was boss discovered it and threatened to put me out on the street. Finally he said, 'If you had gall enough to walk in, you certainly ought to handle a bunch of musicians.'" So Holbrook got into radio. He announced, produced and wrote scripts for the firm.

Sign Language of the Studio

Visitors to the CBS studios in New York City oftenexpresscuriosity concerning the signlanguage employed by announcers and production men. A system of signals, employing the use of arms and hands, has been devised for convenience, speed and accuracy.

These signals usually are made through the double-plate observation window of the control room which adjoins each studio to the men in the broadcasting room itself. At times, however, the procedure is reversed.

Should the visitor see a production man drawing his pointed finger across his throat—a gesture seeming to signify an open razor and a desire to end it all—he should know that it is to inform the entertainers in the studio that the current which actuates the microphone has been "cut". When the production man holds his index finger against his nose, there really is nothing wrong with his olfactory organ. It is only to indicate that the broadcast is being terminated "on the nose", or, to the layman precisely on time.

As the microphone is about to "take the air", the production official stands with one arm raised overhead. In his other hand is the indispensable stop-watch, and, as the second hand of the watch hits the minute, down comes the arm, and they're off—in other words, the program is on the air.

When the performer wanders a bit too far from the microphone, the alert production head attempts to remedy the situation by holding one hand stationary and drawing the other slowly towards it. If the artist fails to notice the signal, there is always someone on tap to tap the faraway-one on the shoulder and direct him to the proper position. The drawing away of one hand from the other, is used in case the performer is too close to the "mike".

As the alloted time of a broadcast dwindles to

but 30 seconds, the production man holds one hand with two fingers at right angles to indicate the remaining time. This signal enables the artists or orchestra, as the case may be, either to lengthen or rush their parts so the broadcast may finish "on the nose".

Describing swift circles with the hand denotes the necessity of accelerating the orchestra's tempo. The holding of both hands flat and moving them to and fro slowly is the signal for the orchestra to fade out gradually, either for a station break or announcement. Forming an X with the arms and swerving the hands rapidly back and forth is the high-sign for a swift fadeout.

Before a new production man at the CBS studios is assigned to his first program, he must undergo thorough training in the sign language of the studios for one error in a signal might prove disastrous to a carefully-prepared and costly program.

6,500,000 Pupils Hear Damrosch Music Hour

Walter Damrosch instructs the largest music class in the world, with more than 6,500,000 pupils listening every Friday to his Music Appreciation Hour over combined coast-to-coast National Broadcasting Company networks.

The class, whose pupils occupy school rooms scattered through all the forty-eight states, has increased in attendance by 2,000,000 during the past year.

Investigation in sixty-eight cities over the country showed that for each Instructor's Manual requested of the NBC by teachers, superintendents and supervisors, there were more than a hundred pupils taking the radio course. On the basis of this listener-manual ratio of 100 to 1, there is indicated a school audience of 6,500,000, inasmuch as 65,000 manuals were requested during the first half of the 1931-32 course.

This figure does not take into account, of course, the large number of adults who hear these broadcasts in their homes, nor the numerous music clubs, women's clubs, and similar organizations which meet regularly to listen to the program.

In addition to the instructor's Manual, many principals and music supervisors have ordered the Student Notebooks for the use of their pupils. During the fall and early winter course 137,000 of these were requested and sent out by the NBC, an increase of 90 percent over the same period of the previous year. The increase in Instructor's Manuals was 75 percent.

The Music Appreciation Hour is now broadcast through seventy-one stations from coast-tocoast, and Dr. Damrosch believes that the tremendous interest evinced by children in the programs is a very definite refutation of spasmodic charges that appreciation of good music is on the wane. Further refutation is seen in the immediate nationwide popularity of the regular NBC Saturday broadcasts of the Metropolitan Opera, and of the NBC Symphonic Hour, which Damrosch conducts each Sunday. Until recently the Pacific Coast stations of the

Until recently the Pacific Coast stations of the NBC were not included in the Music Appreciation Hour network, as it was felt that broadcast of such a program would not find an audience in in the far west at 8:00 a.m.

It was learned, however, that many teachers were convening their classes an hour early every Friday so that they might tune in the Damrosch program from more easterly stations, and it was therefore decided to add the coast stations.

therefore decided to add the coast stations. The broadcast is now heard on the Pacific Coast through KGO, San Francisco; KFSD, San Diego; KOMO, Seattle; KHQ, Spokane; KGW, Portland; KFI, Los Angeles, and also through two new Montana NBC associates, KGHL, Billings, and KGIR, Butte.

Sylvia Froos, "little princess of song," will broadcast regularly twice weekly over an NBC-WJZ network starting Sunday, January 24. Sunday nights she will broadcast at 11:15 p. m., E. S. T., and Saturday nights at 6:45 p. m., E. S. T. The programs will consist of a wide variety of songs, including sentimental numbers. Miss Froos made her debut recently over an NBC network. She is only seventeen.



The radio listeners of the land make their presents known—any popular announcer or entertainer on the CBS network can testify to that.

Gifts from the "great unseen audience" range from bananas to money, from monkeys to elephants, although it must be explained that the latter are only miniatures carved from ivory.

Nor are the gifts always expressions of appreciation. There was one speaker, for instance, whose trembling voice indicated an acute case of nicrophobia. In a subsequent mail he received a pair of plush slippers with the advice that he wear them "to keep your feet warm the next time you broadcast".



Robert Simmons

Robert Simmons, singing the songs of today in a simple, direct manner, has found a ready audience on National Broadcasting Company networks. He is now heard five times a week with Howard Lanin's Campbell Orchestra.

Simmons is a concert and opera tenor who has had a thorough training in music. He was born in the Ozark Mountains and at the age of eighteen became a member of the St. Louis Civic Opera Company. While still a youth he was graduated from Boston University and the New England Conservatory of Music. He was on the faculty of both institutions.

Following a concert tour in Europe he entered radio as a leading singer in the NBC National Light and Grand Opera series. He sang opera and concert selections at all radio appearances until friends persuaded him that many people would appreciate popular songs.
