WHEN THE JAM first crashed the scone four albums ago in a blaze of Union Jacks and Carnaby Street naute coutre. It was inconcetvable that they wou
become our most peculiarly Gritish of Dands. Like Ray Davies of The Rinks, Paul Weller is obsessed with England, is traditions and the way of obsessed with lingland, past this has caused nim to write specifically about London ('In The City'. The result is a set of funes of emotional depth and maturty In fact, it would be easy to lall into the Irap of thinking in terms of this being a Weller solo album, if the powerlul playing on each of the 10 songs weren't a reminder of the crucial importance
of The Jam's thythm section.
Bruce Foxton also co-wrote 'Smithers - Jones", a song about one of soclety's classic victims, A pin

7 must admit. I do get rather frustrated at times like when there is something you want to do yourself but can' $\%$. Bul Freddie is the

There are times that I would like to be on my own - making all the decisions All the band probably think that.
Does that mean the lour often bicker, or even throw the occasional left hook? "Oh, sure, we argue a lot but it's always resolved in the end
Is there anyone who is particularly prone to intransigence?

Brian can be very hard to budge at times - but we usually gang up on him and stick it out to the bitter end Then we all go home.
Ah, home swieel home or in Roger's case, home swee homes. Three to be precise. Number one is set in 20 acres and lies in state naturally, a few miles outside London. Then there's the town house in-Barnes and the latest purchase -ist' another town house in
Chelsea.

"We've been approached to do so many movies ourselves - but li's lust so much trouble. But there should be a documentary about Queen coming up on TV in the not too distant future. We would never actually act in a film. Rock stars are very ollen hopetess when it-comes to acting.
