# ZEP/YES ALBUM?

THE ZEPTYES combination line up, which has been the source of much speculation over recent weeks, should release an album by the late summer. Although there is still no official confirmation of who will be in the band it is go per cert certain that the line up will be Robert Plant, Chris Squire, Alan White and Jimmy Page. Together they've been rehearsing and recording at Page's studio in Berkshire.

The band have been there since shortly after Christmas and although Plant has been taking time out and playing 'secret gigs' with his band Honeydrippers, this is not a long term project.

It will be a single album with all members contributing songs and lyrics but a name for the new line up still hasn't been decided.

It's thought that a lour is also likely concentrating on America (Like Zep in their early days) with at least two nights at Madison Square Garden, it seems unlikely that the band will be playing any British concerts at any time this year.

# **BLONDIE "NO" TO** SPLIT SHOCK

BLONDIE ARE to stay together despite rumours of a split ... and that comes from Debbie Harry herself.

The new blonde sex symbol — who with the group has had hits with numbers like "Heart Of Glass" and "Rapture" — said in New York last week that although the group have been embarking on their own projects, there has been no split. "I can see why people have started to say Blondie are breaking up because it is not active at he moment," she said. "But we haven't broken up and we fully intend to make another album."

But she also warmed: "After that, who knows what will happen?"

The 35-year-old star, who has dyed her hair blue according to reports, has been working on a solo album with Chic mentors Nile Rogers and Bernard Edwards. This led to split rumours, especially with Nilod Harrison — the only English member of the group — befug back in this country.

She still lives with boyfriend and Blondie guitarist Chris Stein in New York — a strengthening factor for keeping the group together. And says she wants to keep leading a lite that is as normal as possible.

Lately, the group have been under some criticism for selling out by not sticking to their new wave origins. And she said that there were pressures that she did not expect.

"You find you're in a product business and you have to dos! with a whole lot of things you never expected. At times I've found it frightoning !!! start to think!" I'm locked into this one image or style.

"But I never thought of giving up music. It'll give me up first!"

# JUMPIN' JOE

JOE JACKSON is returning with a brand new band, following the split, some months ago of his old line-up... but this will be totally different.

It is called Jumpin' Jive, and the group will be playing old 1940s music and not his own material little "It's Different For Girts" which hit the charts last year, instead, the line-up will be taking a show onto the road playing traditional swing music.

"The reportoire consists of jump music, five music and swing, drawn almost entirely from the 1940s," says Jackson. "We will take songs from Cab Calloway, Louis Jordan and other hep cats."

His bass guitarist Graham Maby is on bass, while the rest of the group features two sax players, a trumpel player, drummer and pianist.

But the group is not a permanent proposition, and he will be back to writing his own music by the end of the year, Meanwhile a Jumpin' Jive tour is planned for July and an album and single are likely to be put out.

MONSTER HEAVY metal bands Black Sabbath and Motorhead head up an all-day HM festival this summer..., and it will be Motorhead's only live

MONSTER HEAVY metal bands Black Sabbath and Motorhead's only live performance for the rest of this year.

Also performing will be three other heavy groups with what promoter John Curd describes as two "very major acts", yet to be linalised.

The event is to be held at the Port Vale football ground as Stoke On Trent on August 1, It kicks off at 12 noon with the tirst act on at 1,30pm. And the whole show winds up at 10,30pm with Black Sabbath playing the final set.

Tickets are priced at £7,50 in advance and £8,50 on the day for the festival—which marks the opening of yet another new open air site for rock concerts.

And Motorhead are releasing a live album on June 5, including many of their major hits. Entitled "No Sleep "til Hammersmith" the LP includes live favourites such as "Motorhead", "Overkill" and "Acc OI Spades". It was recorded on their last tow at Leeds Queens Hall and Newcastle City Hall on March 28, 29 and 30.

A picture disc single in a limited edition is being released two weeks later on June 25. The title track is "Motorhead", taken from the live album and a live version of "Over The Top" on the B-side which does not appear on the LP.





Awesome, inspiring and eager to please -STEVIE WONDER opens his heart (and soul) to MIKE GARDNER

HEN STEVIE Wonder walks into a room you know it.
The cold whitewashed stone of Amsterdam's West Indisch Huis a basement club with spidery chairs and tables suddenly shrugs off its dingy mantle.

suddenly shrugs off its dingy mantle.

The journalists from the German and Dutch press are here to ask Stavie the usual questions on the opening of the European leg of his world tour. The slouching, the similers socialising, the small talk, the time kitting, all are forgotten as the whisper that he's arrived whips around the room. Frantic last checks are made on their tape recorders, notepads and cameras. Then all eyes are on the doowway as the Irall, shuffling figure of Slevie Wonder is led to the small table.

The constant clatter of shutters and motor drives provides the soundtrack for the proceedings. But that minor firitation soon quees way to a feeling of tension between Wonder and the journalists. It a teeling of awe, a reversantal lear, an easily swallowed does of deference. The whole group seems struck with a communal attack of politeness and respect that approaches the compliance the British press adroids the Royals.

The tension, however, is a one-sided affair. Steve Wonder sits motionless, his nech craning lorward and upward, while his braids, resplendent yellow, hrown, red and gold Beads, cast de outo his blue jachet. He is a picture of vulnerability, secently and tranquility.

sachet, He is a picture of vulnerability, sesentity and tranquility. His presence sporks off ahernate surges of warmth, respect, awe and, most strongly, love within those who stand by. Despite the frail appearance there is an indefinable feeling of strength, a glow of positiveness that invites you to devout him.

But such openness and willingness to communicate but by presence alone is rewarded by an overwhelming leeding that you must not satrade. You not up the barbed wire hence and exceedile infested most around him for his own protection. You feel you are there just to skim off any utterances and treat them with the same respect that you would give to discovering the next Test Commandments. (Whet's this boy been taking — Ed')

He is flanked by his over-present essistant Keith Harma, an Englishman, and a Dutch representative of Motown who discets the event network while juugling the various mikes on the table according to which journalist last acked him for a closer position to the voice of Shevie Wooder.


After the obligatory "Welcome to Holland" and "Thank you for having me" speeches have run their course, Wooder, more than aware of his effect on people, displays the impuls homour that he has aired on his live appearances in this country by inviting



he press body to "look me straight in the the press body to "look me straight in the eyes, if you have anything to asy". The assembled throngs laugh networky grasping for any wisp of relief in the artificial atmosphere of the press consistence. The floor is open for the inquisition and everybody looks at everybody else. "Why has it taken you so long to do a world rour?", asks a Dutchman hesitantly as though he can't really believe that Wonder will really asswer him.

It echoes the feeling he expressed when he was involved in a near tragic car accident in Salisbury, Carolina in 1973 when look from a lorry came crashing through Stevie's side of the vehicle and left him in a come for over a week.

week
He said at the Ilma: "I wrote 'Higher Ground' before the accident, but something must have been lelling me that something was going to happen to make me aware of a lot of things and to

make me awase of a lot of things and to get mysell togeline. "This is like my second chance for life, to do something, or to do more, and to value the fact that I'm alive. And, if I left that not living would be better, to conclude it."
So how does he see his role of composer tying in with his powerful sense of optimism?
"I think that an actist is always an expression of the feelings of the times and likey must bring it to the people in a wey that will encourage and inspire them

Two inspirations in Wonder's life also share the same qualities, first there is the late Bob Markey who died on May 11 who inspired Wonder's Masterblaster (Immin)", and the jite and work of Dr. Martin Luther King Jint, the civil rights leader who was assessinated in 1968. Wonder holds him in such high regard that be nominated King's birthday on lanuary 15th to be a world holiday and was responsible for getting influential support lot the cell. The song 'Happy Birthday' on last year's 'Hotter Than July' set is a jubilant celebration for the event. The response to his plea has been instrumental in winning the support of the black caucus in America, various members of Congrets and more importantly the people, 150,000 of them, who braved the bitter American water to celebrate the day together in a huge gathering earlier this year. Wonder that this to say about King: "His life is something that should inspire us sil. We should look with great admiration at a man who did so much in a short space of time for the belief that all people should become one and should be treated equally."

Speaking about the holiday he explains: "When we recognise that day and celebrate we also recognise to contribution of all who have lived and died for the goal and desire of unity and peace of all people to be celebrated."

It is this strength of purpose that makes the words and music of Wonder so potent. His songs are always a celebration of being alive, an exhilarating burst of inspiration.

But inspiration takes the inevitable 99 per cent perspiration. After the conference descends anto a round of lirendly but uninformative banter I manage to get a few moments with Wonder to discuss the development of the world's most respected performer in that ray hap of styles we lizzity refer to a rock music.

that ray had the states we shall receive when the series whender was 31 on May 13th. getting very depressed and alcoholic and not knowing what to do. There was a time when Alan was wendering about London trying to get run over, he even wanted to feave our tapes in a restaurant, to Fatel rescued them and Alan said: "You don't think I'm it to run the label, do you? Wall if you want to buy the tapes that it be £25,000. Luckly, we managed to work something out." "We'd Known Josef K for a year or so. They were quite keen to do a single with us, then perhaps go for a major, but things have worked out well and they've stayed, 'Radio Drill Time' is Josef K's high saite on Gary Numan, unfortunately too many people took it seriousty. You like it? Welt, we wouldn't say you're wrong, but you may be very naive.."







# Bewitched and beguiled

TOYAH: 'ANTHEM' (Safari VOOR 1) By Mick Mercer

W ITH HEA fourth album in well under three years, one might have expected a resting on the proverbial surels or just a straightforward decline in quality, but 'Anthem' quickly establishes Toyah as growing ever nearer her best work and unfikely to disappear from sight for a long long time inot until she actually wants to I suspect). It may not be everyone's cup of tea, but there are several different styles contained within the album; yet all variations on the Toyah theme. As a marketing move it's highly successful. On a musical level very hard to ignore.

With any recognisable sound first impressions are one of mixed beguitement. Certain things remain one of mixed begullement. Certain things remain primarily the same, and give convenient points of observation. The voice still remains the most potent lorce. revealing her wide range of abilities, often alternating between hard and soft in the course of one verse, but on this abbum there seems to be more though in the actual presentation. Instead of going overboard as on some of 'Blue Meaning' Toyah herself remains quite restrained, alnging more for effect than pure show.

pure show.

The music has both improved and changed in parts, for which the band must be humbly applauded, Joel Bogen takes a back seat role and on some tunes appears to be completely absent, as the songs shift towards a topically tribal bent, with keyboards and drums the main instruments. More often than not the songs appear almost subdued in nature, occasional bursts of life, intruding on the sublime and dreamy arrangements that show the mature side of Miss Willcox's imagination. Nigel Glockler's drumming and Adrian Lees keyboards really do steal the show, but Phil Spaulding on bass plays perfectly, adding impetus when required, but mainly turking in the background oozing supremely.

Joel Bogen who co-wrote half of the songs plays consistently well when he does appear, generally on the more streightforward songs. Very much a band affort.

Toyah herself refuses to keep to one vocal style and it can plainly be seen that her work is improving. No needless bellowing, no overdramatic whispering. On this album she realises the perfect role.

All this pressed ones. The ceasarily mean that every song is a bona fide classic; far from it. As a collection of songs it is genuinely impressive, but no songs stand as instantly memorable, and a couple appear well dodgy. "I want To Bs Free" the current single is her most crass commercial tune to date, and although lenjoy it I wouldn't say it was a particularly wondrous item. Likewise "Elocution Lesson" doesn't appear to work at all, with it's messy stop/start arrangment.

The main highlights within this 11-track offering include the slowly building 'Pop Star' with the alternating vocals (one minute sharp and deviant, the next soaring ambivalence), the doomy bass-ridden 'I Am', 'Markonette' with its aparse opening, and thumping ending, and the bustling bracing 'We Are' which features the band at its flowing best, similar in many ways to 'It's A Mystery', which is also included hore. Any of these tracks are as good, if not better than their previous work.

where the difference really shows is in the likes of 'Masai Boy' and 'Jungles Of Jupiter'. The former has the sparsest arrangement of all, with tribal drum intro, keyboard, intrusions and strangely rising vocals. The latter gives Joel Bogen a chance to fling out a memorable guitar motif whilst all around the band build slowly upon the quiet start, to roar along and then forsake the expected explosive linale in tayour of a cunningly designed climax. Both songs are simply stunning.

stunning.
Daspite the one or two unworthy items, the album strikes me as an overtily musical work, much needed these days as a refreshing afternative, well deserving of your attention. Toyah's certainly got a brain up there, and her ideas are now meeting accord with the band. A shame the cover designer wasn't similarly equipped, having some up with a poor man's Roger Dean style paining. Who cares anyway? The music is 90 per cent faultiess and the wait for the next album should be well worth it, because she's not even at her peak yet + + + + 4/5

Called KNIGMTRIDERS, it lifts the concept of chivalry and trial by combat from the Dark Ages and plonks it right down in the present. Armoured Hell's Angels do baltie with sword and lance from the backs of mechanical steeds - stripped down, dressed-up Harleys and the like - while theirs lair dameste awaif the victors in the bridgi bower dressed in leather and chains. Romero has already proven himself an influential and powerful director with NIGMT OF THE LIVING DEAD. THE CRAZIES, MARTIN and ZOMBIES, and ... KNIGMTRIDERS looks like becoming another cutt classic which future directors will doubtless be plundering for years to come.
