

QUESTIONS FROM READERS: Question - Some of us "old timers" are having a hard time reading the small print, what can be done? Answer - I have just purchased a \$400 modem which will enable me to transmit my text from my computer to my printer for typesetting. Portions of this issue, including this page, has been typeset. Your comments on type size and readability will be appreciated. Continuation of typesetting in future issues will depend upon cost. This is just another added cost in doing this publication that has to be covered by subscriptions. Question - Why don't you mail A.R.C. in a protective envelope? Answer - Very simple, the costs are too great. At present A.R.C. weighs 0.9 ounces, an envelope would push the weight past 1 ounce and necessitate a 37 cent first class stamp. That alone, plus the cost of envelopes, makes this a several thousand dollars increase in mailing cost over one year! To add to this problem, postal rates are going up in 1985. Perhaps we may have to go 2nd class mailings. Any suggestions?

The 'Collectors Corner' will appear as a regular feature of Antique Radio Classified. Many small firms did some rather innovative work in the early years of radio. Not always did the innovations catch on, making most of these sets very rare now. One of these sets is featured this month. This set predated the universal AC-DC sets by a couple of years.

The Nathanial Baldwin model 40 'Universal Portable' was introduced in the June 1930 Radio Retailing Magazine, a product of Nathanial Baldwin, 1601 South Michigan Ave., Chicago, Illinois.

Better known for their speakers and headphones, the model 40 was one of the most outstanding items of the sensational Nathanial Baldwin line. The other items were the model 70, 7 tube 'Consolette' at \$129.50; the model 50, 5 tube 'Baldwinette' midget set at \$99.50; and the unusual model 75 'Hydaway', a 7 tube set in a plain wooden box "made to be hidden away in a bookcase, under a davenport, or in some other out of the way place". Its \$119.50 price included the \$35 Nathanial Baldwin remote control kit but no speaker. The model 26 dynamic speaker was available for another \$35. The remote control was optional on the Baldwinette and Consolette for \$30.

The 8 tube "Universal Portable" retailed at \$79.50. It could be plugged into any 110 volt line, irrespective of type of current or cycle pulsations, without any changes. When used in conjunction with a Nathanial Baldwin step up converter, it could be operated in automobiles directly from the 6 volt battery.

Type 24 tubes are used in the 2 RF stages; one tuned, one untuned, and volume is controlled by varying the screen grid voltage of the RF tubes. The remaining six tubes are all type 27's. One is used in the detector stage, transformer coupled to the first audio stage, which is transformer coupled to a push-pull audio stage driving a specially designed magnetic speaker. The two remaining 27's are paralleled as a ½ wave rectifier. The filaments are all connected in series with the line voltage being dropped by a 58 ohm resistor with a tap at a 1/2 ohm for a dial light.



NATHANIAL BALDWIN MODEL 40

The cabinet is leatherette covered plywood and is 18-1/2" long, 11" high, and 10" deep. The set weighs 19 pounds.

Surprisingly, the Baldwin model 40 is a pretty good working set although reproduction is not the greatest of quality due to it's magnetic speaker. With it's 15" long line dropping resistor, the set draws over 200 watts and the heat given off by the resistor is enough to warm a small room, making the set a nice radio/heater combination which was probably an industry first.

Next month will feature the 1930 Pilot MIDGET, the first factory assembled Pilot radio.
















COLLECTORS VALUE GUIDE

THE CROSLEY MODEL IV (FOUR) WAS A 2-STAGE AMPLIFIER THAT SOLD FOR \$20 IN LATE 1923. IT WAS DESIGNED TO PAIR UP WITH CROSLEY'S MODEL V (AND LATER MODEL 51) AND SHARED THE SAME CABINETS... AND WAS IDENTICAL TO ITS COUSIN, THE ACE 2-B.



CROSLEY'S EARLY VERSION MODEL VI (SIX) WAS A 2-TUBE TRF RECEIVER USING TWO WOODEN "BOOK" CONDENSERS. IN REALITY, IT IS THE RETA AND HARKO SR. COMBINATION IN ONE CABINET. IT SOLD FOR \$28 WITHOUT TUBES, BATTERIES OR PHONES IN LATE 1922. THIS PARTICULAR MODEL VI IS IN THE "SPECIAL" CABINET WITH ROOM FOR DRY CELL BATTERIES.



WHEN CROSLEY REDESIGNED HIS TAPPED DRUM COIL WITH THE SMALLER, FLATTER SPIDERWEB TYPE, IT ALLOWED CONSTRUCTION OF HIS SMALLEST CRYSTAL RECEIVER, THE 1923/24 "CROSLEY JUNIOR". WITH ULTRA-SIMPLE CONSTRUCTION AND A CHANCE TO USE UP SURPLUS PARTS, WAS TOO GOOD FOR POWELL CROSLEY TO PASS UP. PRICE IS UNKNOWN, AS IT WAS ADVERTISED LITTLE, IF AT ALL AND REMAINS A MISTERY.



IN LATE 1923 THE MODEL VI WAS SOLD IN THE MORE COMMON CABINET WITH THE FAMILAR TUNING DIALS. INSIDE THE TRF CIRCUIT WAS UPDATED WITH THE SPIDERWEB-TYPE COILS INSTEAD OF THE DRUM TYPE. MOLDED RUBBER SOCKETS REPLACED PORCELAIN ONES, AND THERE WERE TWO LESS TAP SWITCH STOPS, ALL FOR \$30.




Philco Model 70

HILCO'S model 70 superheterodyne when recently measured in our laboratory gave the overall performance curves printed on this page.

For receiver input, the signal generator was coupled to the antenna by the manufacturer with the receiver as standard cquipment were used, the volume control was adjusted for maximum receiver sensitivity. and no changes were made in the factory alignment of tuned circuits. An average sensitivity of 10.8 microvolts column 3 are the band widths measured from them, given in tabular form




