## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir,
I have been following with interest the points raised by G3IDG and KZ5TD on the question of QSL returns, may I add my comments regarding my own experiences. I was an SWL from 1954 till 1962 and was very keen on collecting QSL cards from amateur stations and as you may know, I was quite successful, having logged about 300 countries and of these about 275 were confirmed. Naturally, when I got my ticket I thought my QSL return would be of quite high percentage but I have found that this is not the case. I have now been licensed about $2 \frac{1}{2}$ years and have made just over 2,500 QSO's with 120 countries, out of this number qpproximately 2,200 QSL's have been sent out, my return has been a lowly 1,264 QSL's to date or about $58 \%$ which only goes to show that being a licensed amateur does not necessarily mean that a QSL sent out automatically means QSL back. I have not even had a QSL for my very first QSO yet. Generally I QSO every first contact and send out a duplicate QSL after about one year to 18 months if the other fellows card has not been received depending on what part of the world he is located or if the card is needed for some award. Regarding SWL reports I QSL $100 \%$ if the report tallies with the log.

1. The contest will be held in two parts, viz. CW only and AM only, and all members are eli.gible to compete in either or both section/s.
2. The CW only section starts at 1800 GIT on Saturday 2nd October 1965 and ends at 1800 CNT on Sunday 3rd October 1965. The AM only section starts at 1800 GNT on Saturday 6th November 1965 and ends at 1800 GMT on Sunday 7 th November 1965. The rules for both sections of the contegt qre the same and are set out below.
3. The following amateur bands may be used:- $3.5,7,14$ and $21 \mathrm{mc} / \mathrm{s}$. No set time is allocated for any particular band.
4. The object of the contest is to log as many countries as possible on each band. The winners will be the entrants from each continent who have the highest total scores in each section of the contest.
5. Separate scores should be kept for each band. Members may log up to five stations from each country on each band. Each station will score one point and four bonus points will be awarded for the first station heard from each country on each band. For instance, five G's heard on $7 \mathrm{mc} / \mathrm{s}$ will score $1+1+1+1+1+4$ bonus points $=9$ points total.
6. For the purposes of this contest the call areas of the U.E.A. and Canada and Australia each count as a separate country; i.e. W1, $2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9, \phi, \mathrm{VOl}$, $\mathrm{VO2}, \mathrm{VEI}, 2,3,4,5,6,7,8$, $\mathrm{VKI}, 2,3,4,5,6,7,8$, are all separate. (This relates to call areas and not prefixes; W2, K2, WA2 and WB2 are four prefixes but one call area only.) Otherwise countries will be determined according to the official I.S.W.L. list(obtainable from Mr. C.A. Tooke, 6 Chelmer Avenue, Rayles.gh, Essex, price $5 d$ or one IRC) together with any later additions or amendments published in Monitor.
7. No CQ, QRZ or similar call will be allowed to oount for points and the full call of the station being called or worked must be given. Maritime Mobile stations should not be logged.
8. A separate log should be submitted for each band. Band logs should contain the following details:- GirT, station heard, station being called or worked, RS( $T$ ) of station heard, points claimed, and a margin should be left for official use. Logs should be kept in chronological (not alphabetical) order. In addition the mriber's name, I.S.W.I. number, QTH (in full, please), and details of RX and antenna in use should be given. (Official I.S.W.I. logsheets may be obtained free of charge from the Contests Manager, whose OTH appears below; please enclose a lange 5d SAE or large envelope and IRC with your request). Comments about the contest will be weloomed.
9. Entries should be addressed to the I.S.W.L. Contests Manager, Mr Arthur Millor, 62 Warwards Lane, Selly Oak, Birminghan 29, England, to arrive not later than l2th November 1965 in the case of the CW only uvent and IOth December 1965 for the $A M$ only section.
10. Certificates of Morit will be awarded to the winners (see item 4).
11. The Contest Manager's decision is final and no correspondence can be entered into after the deadine date.
