OUR COVER STORY - THE WELSH CONNECTION

This month's FRENDX cover photo is of Alan and Audrey Thompson of Neath, West Glamorga Wales. Alan has served as NASWA's United Kingdom Representative for several years. Your Shortwave Center editor had the great pleasure of spending a weekend with Alan and Audrey during my recent visit to Britain.

Alan and I talked about DXing in Britain and spent some time in the local evening working his Racal receiver for some typical UK 60 metre band DX. The Thompsons were also very kind in taking me to various senic spots in the mountains of south Wales. I also taped a couple of programs for Alan's DX program on the English service of Deutschlandfunk (not on SW unfortunately).

The Thompsons live in Neath, a plesant small city located near Swansea in south Wales. It is on the poast and like many British cities and towns, it has its complement of Roman and more recent ruins. Alan is a grandfather and works for the Inland Revenue (the Britis version of the IRS). They live at 16 Ena Avenue in Neath with a grown daughter and two very large and very friendly black dogs.

Alan's Racal is tucked away in an attic room, but he has a quite nice arrangement. Because of the necessity of using a short antenna, he uses several forms of preamplificati and preselection before inputting a signal to the Racal. The Racal is a great receiver that uses the original Wadley Loop. It is a tube type military style receiver. The main difference between the Racal and other receivers that I have used are the extremely sharp skirts on the filtering system. It provided really sharp cutoff of interference outside of the bandwidth setting. This alows the receiver to provide a good gain of audio output above noise. The receiver is sensitive, but no better than my Barlow Wadley that was sitting on the desk next to the Racal. Every station heard on the Racal was also heard on the BW, the latter using only the whip antenna. However, the big advantage in the Racal was in the much greater intelligibility of the Racal audio output. I did note that the Racal dial needed to be calibrated every 100 kHz by the crystal calibrator in order to produce frequency readings more accurate than the nearest kilohertz.

I noticed many interesting differences in 60 metre band DXing from the UK. Early evening receptions come from several USSR Home Service stations and even from China. Africans seem also to be prominant in the early evening. Latin stations, of course, would not appear until the middle of the night.

I would like to publicly thank the Thompsons for their hospitality and a most interesting visit.

As you probably have read in Report from Headquarters, I have been elected to fill one of the newly formed positions on the NASWA Council. I want to thank all those who voted for me. I will do my best to see that NASWA and FRENDX continue to provide the best servi possible to the hobby. Please feel free to write to me with your suggestions for improvem of NASWA and FRENDX. I am receptive to all viewpoints and believe that we can serve every from beginner to master DXer.

Everyone should remember, however, that 95 percent of the material in each issue of FRENDX comes from you, not the editors or the NASWA Council. If you want interesting and informative material in FRENDX, you will have to prepare and submit it to the appropriate editor. NASWA is really your club and FRENDX is your bulletin.

THE DRAKE R-4 SERIES AND THE WADLEY TRIPLE-MIX LOOP REVEALED! Fart II of "Basic Concepts of Superheterodyne Receivers by James B. Wilson, Jr., 836 West Rose, Lincoln, Nebraska 68522

"In the October Shortwave Center we talked about the basic theory of both single and double conversion receivers. Right now we'll talk about the actual circuit operation of two receivers - the Drake SW-4A, similar to the R-4 series, and the Wadley Triple-mix Loop as used in the XCR-30, SSR-1, and FRG-7.

If you'll turn your attention to figure 1, you will see the basic block diagram of the SW-4A receiver. This one is very similar to the R-4 series with the exception of adjustable selectivity (changing crystal filters) and single sideband reception capabilities. It is actually very similar to our double conversion example in the last article. It is double conversion with the first IF being 5645 kHz, and the second IF of 455 kHz. The first IF gives us good image rejection and, in the case of this receiver, our desired selectivity. All the first IF stage is a crystal filter with a bandwidth of 6 kHz and a center frequency of 5645 kHz. No amplification goes on in the first IF at all. This means that the majority of receiver gain takes place in the second IF of 455 kHz.

The RF amplifier and VFO are both adjustable but not physically linked together. The RF amplifier tuning is brought out to the front panel as a separate control and labeled preselector. The VFO control is the main tuning control. This eliminates any tracking errors between the RF amplifier and VFO.

The VFO used in this receiver is a permeability tuned oscillator that? tunes linearly so that the dial calibration can be linear. In the case of the SW-4A, the output of the linear VFO is mixed with the output of a crystal oscillator in the premixer. The output of the premixer is then used as the local oscillator signal. This means that the frequency range (and calibration) of the linear VFO remains the same all the time and we change bands by changing crystals in the crystal oscillator.


Let's follow a signal through the receiver to get a better understanding of it's operation. Let's say we want to receive BEC-Ascension on 17.84 MHz. We will first change the band switch to 17.5 - this will change the tuned circuits in the RF amplifier, premixer, and the crystal in the crystal oscillator. The crystal oscillator will be at 28.59 MHz. The 28.59 MHz will be mixed with the linear VFO in the premixer and we should be receiving signals in the 17.5-18.0 MHz band. To dial in BEC-Ascension on 17.84 MHz, the VFO will be dialed to the correct front panel reading, when it will be putting out a frequency of 5.105 MHz. When the 5.105 MHz of the VFO, and the 28.59 MHz from the crystal oscillator are mixed in the premixer, both sum and difference signals will be produced. The difference signal will be 23.845 MHz (28.59 - 5.105 = 23.485). This signal will be coupled to the first mixer as the local oscillator signal. The VFO gives us our linear tuning while the crystal oscillator gets us to the right frequency band. When the local oscillator signal is mixed with the RF signal frequency of 17.84 MHz the difference will be 5.645 MHz (23.485 - 17.84 = 5.645), which is our first IF.

In the first IF the signal will be filtered down to a 6 kHz bandwidth by the crystal filter. So the first IF takes care of the selectivity and by virtue of its high frequency gives us good image rejection. The signal is then coupled to the second mixer where it is mixed with a frequency of 5190 kHz. The difference of these two signals will be 455 kHz (5645 - 5190 = 455), our second IF. It is in the second IF stages where most of the receiver gain is, so the second IF determines the sensitivity - along with the RF amplifier. The signal will then be detected and amplified by the audio stages.

The major advantages of this type of receiver are good image rejection (due to the high first IF), good selectivity (due to the crystal filter), good sensitivity, and linear frequency readout due to the use of the linear VFO and premixing scheme. The disadvantages are that the frequency coverage is limited to your selection of crystals. The new frequency synthesizer offers hope here for the R-4 receivers, but it does seem rather expensive.

<u>Wadley Triple-Mix Loop</u>. The Wadley Triple-mix Loop was originally developed and used in Racal receivers, found its way to South Africa where it is used in the Barlow-Wadley XCR-30.

and more recently it has appeared in the Drake SSR-1 and Yaesu FRG-7.

The basic block diagram is shown in figure 2. This is the block diagram for the SSR-1, the FRG-7 is very similar, but with a first IF of 54.5-55.5 MHz. The SSR-1 is basically a triple conversion receiver with a first IF of 44.5-45.5 MHz, second IF of 2-3 MHz, and third IF of 455 HHz. As you can imagine the first IF of 44.5-45.5 MHz gives us excellent image rejection.

With this type of receiver we use two VFOs. One is a high frequency oscillator, 45.5-75.5 MHz, and the other is a low frequency oscillator, 2.455-3.455 MHz. The high frequency oscillator is used to select the megahertz range of the incoming signal and the low frequency oscillator selects the kilohertz of the incoming signal.

Let's follow a signal through this very interesting receiver. First we will pick out a received signal of 1.5 MHz as our example. The megahertz dial would be turned to the 1 MHz band, and the MHz oscillator would be putting out a frequency of 46.5 MHz. This signal is applied to the first mixer and mixed with the incoming 1.5 MHz RF signal, the difference frequency will be 45 MHz. This will fall in the middle of the passband of the first IF bandpass amplifier. This amplifier will pass all signals within its 1 MHz bandwidth from 44.5 to 45.5 MHz. This means that so far in the receiver we have only selected the megahertz range.

Let's back track a little bit. The 46.5 MHz output from the MHz oscillator also goes to the mixer shown below the oscillator. Here it will be mixed with the output of an Harmonic Generator. The Harmonic Generator is no different from any crystal calibrator. This one puts out a spectrum of signals at 1 MHz intervals up to 33 MHz. The output of the MHz oscillator will mix with these producing a whole bunch of frequencies. One of these frequencies will be 42.5 MHz. In this case the 42.5 MHz will result from the MHz oscillator's 46.5 MHz signal mixing with the 4 MHz harmonic, the difference signal being 42.5 MHz. The 42.5 MHz signal and only that signal will pass through the bandpass filter on the mixer output. this signal will then be used as the local oscillator for the second mixer.

In the second mixer the signals applied will be the 45 MHz first IF signal (actually all signals in the 44.5 to 45.5 MHz bandwidth), and the 42.5 MHz signal from the bandpass amplifier. The difference of these two signals will be 2.5 MHz, the middle of the second IF of 2-3 MHz.


The second IF amplifier is a variable frequency amplifier over the range of 2-3 MHz. It is mechanically coupled to the VFO and will assist in selecting the correct signal from the 1 MHz spread of signals available. The signal from the second IF is coupled to the third mixer where it is heterodyned down to 455 kHz, the third IF. This is the point where we select the actual signal to be received. The third IF has the majority of gain in the receiver, and through the use of a ceramic filter gives us the desired selectivity.

The SSR-1 uses a switchable AM detector or product detector for single sideband or CW. The BFO is used in the reception of SSE and CW. When receiving SSE the BFO actually replaces the carrier which was suppressed during transmission. After the detectors we have the usual audio amplifiers.

Let's get back to our Triple-Mix Loop. The loop acutally consists of the first and second mixers and the mixer below the MHz oscillator. The rest of the receiver is in essence a 2-3 MHz single conversion receiver. To examine the loop more closely, let's go back to our example - a 1.5 MHz received signal and the MHz oscillator putting out 46.5 MHz. This resulted in a first IF signal of 45 MHz (46.5 - 1.5 = 45), and, through the use of our mixing scheme local oscillator signal of 42.5 MHz, a second IF signal of 2.5 MHz (45 - 42.5 = 2.5). Let's say the MHz oscillator drifts to 46.6 MHz, a large drift I'll admit but remember this is only for illustration purposes. That means that the incoming signal of 1.5 MHz will mix with the MHz oscillator signal in the first mixer and the difference signal will now be 45.1 MHz (46.6 - 1.5 = 45.1), still within our first IF passband. The MHz oscillator will also mix with the harmonic generator output. As before the closest signal to 42.5 MHz will be coupled to the second mixer. In this case 46.6 MHz will mix with the 4 MHz harmonic with a difference frequency of 42.6 MHz, the closest signal to 42.5 MHz that is being generated. This 42.6 MHz signal will then be coupled to the second mixer where it will mix with the 45.1 MHz first IF signal. The difference will be 2.5 MHz (45.1 - 42.6 = 2.5). The 2.5 MHz signal is the same one we got at this point before the oscillator drifted off frequency! This is the magic of the Wadley Triple-Mix Loop - drift cancellation! Even though the MHz oscillator drifted off frequency, the kHz dial will not have to be readjusted, the drift will have been cancelled in the loop.

Some of the advantages of this type of receiver are drift cancellation (of course), excellent image rejection, and direct frequency readout.

Well, now you've seen the basic workings of the Wadley Triple-Mix Loop. As most of you already know it makes a very good general coverage communications receiver, and the price is

reasonable. The difference between the SSR-1 and FRG-7 are primarily in specific circuit details. The SSR-1 uses transistor amplifiers and diode mixers exclusively, whereas the FRG-7 uses a lot of FETs as mixers and amplifiers. The advantages of this are unknown as the receiver specifications are basically the same. One advantage the FRC-7 has is better packaging and extra details for operator convenience. Either one is an excellent receiver and a good value for the money.

RADIO WAVE PROPAGATION FORECASTING

When forecasting radio wave propagation one must concentrate his attention on the sun, since it influences all radio waves. A spectrum of radiation is emitted by the sun including ultra-violet and infra-red. The ultra-violet radiation increases the amount of free electrons in the ionosphere, a process called ionization. The infra-red radiation heats the ionosphere and causes it to expand, which reduces the density of the free electrons.

When a radio wave travels into one of the ionospheric layers (fig. 1) the direction of the wave changes. The extent of this change is proportional to the density of the free electrons in the layer. When the layer has enough of an electron density, the wave bends and eventually reverts back to the ground. If the electron density of the layer is not great enough, the radio wave will either be absorbed or travel out into space.¹

The density of the free electrons in each layer is influenced by the level of solar activity (as measured by the <u>solar flux index</u>), and the time of day. Whether or not a radio wave is bent back to earth will also depend on the location of the transmitter and the receiver, as well as the frequency transmitted on.

The <u>solar flux index</u> is a measure of the overall level of solar activity. It is closely associated with the well known daily sunspot number and may soon be preferred to

the sunspot number as a measure of solar activity. While following the ll year average cycle of solar activity, flux values also vary from one day to the next in association with the activity of the sun. This activity influences the density of the ionosphere which in turn influences the range of frequencies which will support ionospheric radio communications on specific circuits.


The solar flux index has been correlated with the temperature of the ionosphere in many studies. Some of these studies show that the temperature of the isothermal region above the thermopause and the exospheric temerature show a variation associated with changes in the density of the ionosphere and in the solar flux index. These variations are over long periods of time as well as from one day to the next.


The dependence of the variations of temerature on the intensity of solar ultraviolet radiation (as characterized by the solar flux index) apparently becomes more pronounced with increasing height (up to 300 km, which is the ionosphere).

The <u>solar flux index</u> measurements are gathered at the Alogonquin Radio Observatory (ARO) of the National Research Council of Canada with a reflector of 1.8 metres diameter, using 2800 MHz. These radio emissions which originate from the solar disk and from any active regions are a continuation of observations which commenced in Ottawa in 1947. Historically the measurement taken at local noon (1700 universal time) has been considered the "official" value for the day. The solar flux index is measured in units of 10^{-22} watts per square metre per cycle per second, (10^{-22} Wm⁻Hz⁻¹) and in general has a range from about 60 to 400 units (fig. 2).

J. Virginia Lincoln, Director of the World Data Center A for Solar-Terrestrial Physics stated in a letter that "Solar flux indicies correlate highly with sunspot number observations, which as you know, have an approximately 11 year cycle. Both of these indicies can be used in HF (High Frequency) radio propagation_predictions, but they are more reliably used for monthly median frequency predictions."⁵

I have correlated the various solar flux indexes with the frequency, time in CMT, and the location of the transmitter and receiver, to predict high frequency propagation. These charts (example see fig. 3) are the result of a year of collecting and compiling the data available to me. I used the stations heard by DXers from North America for the data. With adequate data this could be accomplished for any area of the world.







Here are some explanations of the charts themselves and how to use them. Yesterday's solar flux index may be found by listening to radio station WWV, which is on 2.5, 5, 10 and 15 MHz at 18 minuites past the hour. After listening for a few days you will usually notice a trend in the flux. Then taking the flux number as given you should listen to the frequencies at the times given under the appropriate flux number shown on the charts. If a trend is apparent, then use the flux numbers above or below yesterday's flux as

After using the chart for a while you might realize that there is another method in which it can be used very effectively. Taking a certain solar flux index number, write down its portion of the chart in time order on a piece of paper. You can then take schedules of specific stations which should be audible according to the chart and write them next to the area, time, and frequency. This will enable you to search through an entire band which might be open and also search for specific countries you might which to hear.

Here are a few examples of stations one can hear by following the chart:

 The following stations were heard on 7/6/76; the solar flux index being 67; Guyana-GBS- 0635-0720 GMT on 3290 kHz; Liberia -ELMA- 0635-0711 on 4770; Papua/NG-NBC- 0705-0720 on 4890; Australia-ABC-Brisbane at 0700 on 4920; and Chana-GBC-

0602-0700 on 4980 and 4915. All this in a matter of minuites and all in English.

2) On 8/22/76 the solar flux was 71 and the following stations were heard; Tahiti at 0300 GMT on 15170 and 11825 kHz in French; New Zealand-RNZ- 15130 at 0240 in English; Ethiopia-ETLF-4905 at 0300-0325 in Amharic; Mozambique-R. Beira-at 0430-0509 on 4896 in Arabic and French, and Zaire-R Lubumbashi-at 0510-0514 on 4750 in French.

Other rare countries heard by myself include Libya, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Taiwan, Andorra, Kuwait, Yemen, Grenada, Affars & Issas, Guinea Bisseau, and many others. I thank BDXC members Terrance Billan, Adam Gaffin, Neil Schulman, and Leon Tannenwald for their help in the loggings for the charts and the spark for my ideas.



The formal BC sked will begin 22/10, and dedication by Dr. Paul Freed will be in late 1977 or early 1978 (TWR NJ release via KAIM via Walcutt) Began on new 15115 on 30/9. Eve pgms on 11705 and 9670 are clashing badly with co-channel R. Australia. RA have sent several urgent Telexes to KTWR attempting to sort out the mess. RA freqs had been registered many months ago; they don't know why the sudden moves to their established channels by Guam (Bob Padula, Victoria; direct)

HUNCARY R. Budapest IS heard on 23820 at 1259 8/10, day of excellent T-A propagation. Believe this is first Hungarian harmonic for me, 2 x 11910 (gh)

INDONESIA A South Central Timor District Official stated in a newspaper interview that the regional 600-watt xmtr on 2580, 2336 kHz had been BCing on trial since 29/7 and could be heard clearly even in Kupang, North Central Timor (BECMS 13/10) RRI Jayapura now on 15300, *2230, into local Indo nx; generally continues past 0300, as on 2/10 (Padula, Victoria) Per QSL from RRI Tanjung Pinang, Sumatera, they have 10 kW on 3225; also 1 kW on 4980, and 300 watts on 2360. Per QSL from RRI Ternate, Maluku, they have 10 kW, not 1 kW as in TBS-5, on 3345. RRI Sorong, Irian Jaya now relays Jayapura nx 1230; local nx 1100 (Satoshi Wakisaka, Japan, 2/10) The RRI Gorontalo 10 kW xmtr is USA-made by Harris, on since 10/76.

INTERNATIONAL WATERS Voice of Peace is now on SW too, 6242 kHz, 10 kW (Offer Barth, IBA DX 25/9)

IRAQ R. Baghdad, new 11723, 1050 AR, het to Delhi 1100* 11725 (Padula & Hanner, RA DX 25/9) ISRAEL Finally heard only active lim stn, IBA-25605, Yiddish at 1400 8/10. Was running OC as early as 1315, and that was jammed, but no jam audible by 1400. IBA was slightly SSB. Ironically, 25605 does not appear in the IBA S77 sked; 10m hamband not open (gh)

JAMAICA The govt has signed an agreement 3/9 to take over the British-operated-for-27-years R. Jamaica, 30 days after the signing, an MF station (BBCMS 8/9) JAPAN LN-12

KOREA SOUTH This summer something called the Korean SWL Association, obviously an arm of the S. Korean govt, began publicizing itself in DX circles, and we queried them as to whether R. Korea does in fact still carry R. Free Russia, as suggested in the 1977 WRTH. We have now received a package of material but none answers the question. There is a freq sked listing Russian at 0900-0930, 2100-2130 on 11860/9720/9665/9640/9525--but do they actually use all those? Also a picture of the Russian lang staff, all of whom are Koreans. The peckage contains a fully filled-in and endorsed membership. Most remarkable in light of the fact we did not send them a reception report, is a QSL card: signed, with 9640 and 11860 filled in, but no date and time. Finally, the package contains a quantity of report forms with this note: "CAUTION Would you please introduce to me your friend or SWL (BCL). If impossible, you must send me this report paper, at least two times for every month". (C.M. Stanbury II, SWNS Oct.)

LIBERIA VOA heard at 1630 2/10 on 15470 00B, Swahili (David Crawford, FL) Not in sked (gh)

LIBYA Arabic lesson: Jumhur = crowd; plural: Jamahir. Jumhuriya = Republic. Baghdad R. has a pgm called "Sawt el-Jamahir" (Voice of the Masses). Jamahiriya would be an adjective coined from the plural form. Now back to Libya's name. Jamahiriya appears not only in the EG name, but also in the FR one (as in FR-lang newspapers here). In fact, the Libyan radio does not even name the country: they only call it "the Jamahiriya" (Victor C. Jaar, PQ)

MALAYSIA 15295 noted with HS relay in Malay, local daytime, 0250-0300+ as on 2/10; apparently for overseas audiences. Still no acknowledgement from stn on use of VOM freqs for these unsked xmsns! (Bob Padula, Victoria; direct) MALDIVES IN-11

<u>PERU</u> Ondas del Huallaga on new 3300 ex-3330 (Jan Tuner, R. Nederland DX Juke Box 13/10) <u>SOMALIA</u> (?) 16/10 at 2045-2059* I received an unID on 6185; music distinctively Somali to 2049 news, often mentioning Somalia; am <u>almost</u> certain was //9585. If so, must be a move from 6095, and maybe on when Ethiopia off? Needs checking; I wonder if anyone else had this (Terry L. Krueger, FL)

SOUTH AFRICA R. RSA heard testing on 7270, 0145-0215 30/9, with SABC All Night Service // 3980; 0207-0212 a test tone. SINPO 53543; testing new 500 kW xmtr already? R. RSA sked xmsn heard on 7270 after 0252, slightly lower signal level (Richard N. Allen, OK) <u>SRI</u> LN-12

<u>USA</u> <u>MARCONI 75th ANNIVERSARY SPECIAL EVENT STATION</u> -- ARRL says during <u>14-22</u> Jan <u>1978</u>, the first two-way contact between US and Europe by Marconi in 1903 will be celebrated by the operation of <u>KMICC</u>, from the original Marconi stn location in South Wellfleet MA. The Town of Barnstable Radio Club of Cape Cod is the sponsor; will be operating on 160 thru 10m ham bands, CW, SSB, RTTY, slow scan TV. Also planned, 2m FM, 6m SSB. FCC approved A2 on all . bands, so the famous sound of the 240 Hz rotary spark gap Marconi stn will be reproduced for CW QSOs. British hams will be at Polchu, England operating another special station at their Marconi site. A message from Pres. Carter will be passed from KMICC to England during this period. QSI Manager is Duncan Creamer, WIGAY, Main St., Vineyard Haven MA 02568. Special Marconi Anniversary envelopes are 10 for \$1,50 ppd. from R. J. Doherty, KIVV, RFD 1, 14 Pine St., Sandwich MA 02563 (Oct SPEEDX Utility Report)

The first xmtr is installed and is now being tested. Four antennas have been installed as of this writing. Lord willing, WYFR will begin its first phase of broadcasting at Okeechobee by the first week of November. (Family Radio News, via Dean Fick, OH)

(Cf Apr LN-7, Jun LN-6) Almost all 2 MHz marine traffic with US coast stns uses SSB with 16db carrier suppression. However, many wx BCs employ only 6 db, easily readable in the standard AM mode. This explains Jacksonville-2566 relaying XEJN (SWNS)

Mostly 2nd, maybe some 4th harmonics (gh)

VENEZUELA YVRL R. Litoral, 1130 has a SW freq now, 6060, and a new name: R. Ideal. YVI R. Sucesos' 9700 outlet is inactive (Frank Lucena, Venezuela, PLAY-DX 1/10)

VIETNAM "Tay Nguyen" (which is not a place name, but means Western Highland) until 2 years ago had pgms for South Vietnam in some mountain langs, including Rhade, at 1100-1400, on 4860/7512/9840, and other Central Highland langs like the unID on 4772. Today these channels used exclusively for FS to neighbouring countries. Neither then nor now is the exact location of the station mentioned. VOV 1st pgm 3998 and 7374 both inaudible recently. (Isao Ugusa, FEDXR 27/9) unID on 4798 at*1200-1300* with local mx, light vocals, in Viet (Akabayashi, Tsukamoto, Ugusa, FEDXR) New station, Radio Son La on 4803, then moved to 4816, *1130-1400*: 1130 Meo, 1200 Viet, 1230 minority lang, 1300-1400 Viet (Tsukamoto & Ugusa, FEDXR 27/9)

ZAIRE New stn at Bunia, one of the new regional stations destinated for Upper Zaire, is on 3390 and 5050 (Peter Laschan from Mondombe via Boende, Zaire, SCDX 4/10) VOZ-15350 putting out strong spurs at ± 450v kHz: 14900, 15800, best around 2200. If an IF is involved, it is at their end, not mine (gh)

FUTURE PLANS ARGENTINA RAE will soon have 4 x 250 kW xmtrs (Néstor ---, MAR-PLA DX Club, via R. Nederland Espacio DX-ista, 7/10)

<u>BRAZIL</u> Five more high power xmtrs are under construxion, and as soon as they are ready, the International Service will resume broadcasting (WRTVH Newsletter, 8/77 via Snyder) RNB has announced cancellation of a contract with Brown Boveri for the installation of 7 more 250 kW HF xmtrs. Reason given was the escalating cost and a shift in official policy (Jim Whitehead, SPEEDX 10/77)

DENMARK The Danish Council decreed in 1969 that all broadcasts from R. Denmark should be in Danish and all efforts to get this decision altered have been unsuccessful. Nevertheless, RD is hopeful that it will be able to transmit at least one programme in EG in the near future as "it feels that such a programme would place us on an equal footing with other nations in search of international understanding." (BBCMS 25/8)

<u>DUBAI</u> Marconi Comms Systems has signed a series of contracts worth \$9.6 million to supply radio & TV stns to the Dubai Radio & TV Service: three Marconi 300 kW HF xmtrs, two quadrant antennas, 15 wideslew curtain arrays, and a range of ancillaries. The first equipment is sked to be operational within 14 months and the entire project in 21 months. Marconi will provide installation, training and commissioning services (Electronics News, 17/9 via SWNS; and via David Mackes, MD)

FALKLAND ISLANDS These islands and the 1900 people living on them should be handed over to Argentina around the end of this century. Whitehall is actively considering this as a solution to a long-standing dispute. The Falklanders are receiving an inordinate amount of help from the Overseas Development Ministry; the existence of the colony hampers British trade with Argentina, and the territory is indefensible. The delay until the year 2000 would allow older Falklanders to live out their working lives under the British flag, while younger islanders would have time to decide whether to emigrate (Hugh O'Shaughnessy, The Observer, 25/9, via Richard E. Wood) Better hurry up and QSL FIBS!! (gh)

HAITI 4VRD R. Nationale, Port-au-Prince has already started on 1080 kHz and 102 MHz. Plans call for SW on 5975 and 9545. This is obviously former R. Commerce, later renamed Voix de la Revolution duvaliériste, which was silent for a long while, even on 1080. Power described as 10 kH, dropping to 8 kW (P-a-P relatives of, via Victor Jaar, PQ) I noticed that 4VEH no longer uses 3345 or 6120. I wonder if this is where R. Nationale is getting their transmitters from? (David Crawford, FL)

HAWAII Apparently, per KAIM (870) G.M. Cliff R. Scott, they have received approval for 100 kW SW xmtr on Maui, but want more so are applying for 1000 kW. Target area ambiguous. Meanwhile, they have applied for MW power increase from 5 to 50 kW, and a new site on Molokai, and a directional antenna 'protecting' WWL, which would actually beam KAIM into the South Pacific islands (David Walcutt, HI)

ICELAND Rikisutvarpid has no plans to expand its SW service from the present daily 1200-1300 pgm for fishermen on 12175, except for extended sked around Christmas, and for July 78 elections (Finn Krone, Denmark, WRTVH Newsletter, via David Snyder, BDXC)

JAPAN FEN constructs new 72.5 m high serial at Asaka US base, acc. to a press report. Now, US Forces plans the synthesis of the bases to Yokota base from Kanto area's. Accompany with this plan, FEN is also moves to Yokota from present Asaka. But serial will remain at Asaka. SW outage in May seems to have a some relations with this (Y. Hayashi, FEDXR 27/9)

LIBERIA LBC has ordered 2 million pounds' worth of radio & TV equipment with Pye TVT, to be installed in a new BC centre. Included are four new production studios and a 50 kW HF xmtr. (Electronics Weekly, 21/9, via BBCMS) Isaac P. Davis of ELWA says it's now difficult to hear ELBC once one leaves Monrovia. The improvements should make it audible elsewhere (Crawford)

NETHERIANDS Visiting RN, I learned that the new 500 kW xmtrs are not anticipated to be in action for 6 years. There is also some controversy over the site to be used (Ravenhorst, MN) NICERIA VON says that in the Third National Development Plan (1975-1980), over 54 million hairs is provided for the Radio Development Protect. Plans are undersuch and for

hairs is provided for the Radio Development Project. Plans are underway to make room for more studios and equipment, and for installation of four additional 500 kW xmtrs (BBCMS 22/9 which adds: 3 of the projected 7 500 kW xmtrs should have been commissioned by end of 1976)

PAKISTAN The Govt. has directed R. Pak to exercise complete freedom of expression and act as an independent medium of public info and entertainment. The organization has been asked to re-establish its neutrality and credibility, which had eroded over the years due to Govt interference and control. R. Pak will now be reporting and presenting pgms on everything of public interest within the framework of Islamic ideology, national integrity and cultural values. The general programme will be reshaped to suit the requirements of independent and unfettered organizations. (R. Pakistan news 19/8 via BBCMS)

PERU R. del Pacífico announced that R. Nacional, the official state radio stn, created exclusively for educational, cultural and news purposes, was now planning to carry commercial programmes (BBCMS 22/9) <u>SPAIN; SURINAM</u> LN-12

USA The Carter admn wants to reorganize the USIA and give VOA listeners a clear distinxion between policy statements and news. VOA would be telling listeners, in effect, "the preceding announcement was brought to you by the State Department." The Dept. would have to request broadcast time, said Peter Szanton, of the OMB (Columbus Dispatch, 10/10 via Bill Matthews, OH) Pres. Carter has proposed a new Agency for International Communication, to take over USIA's international communications sergices, such as the VOA. "Under this Administration, VOA will be solely responsible for the content of news broadcasts-for there is no more valued coin than candor in the international marketplace of ideas," Carter said. (Reuters, via the Star-Ledger, 12/10 via Edward J. Insinger, NJ) More on IN-12

CLANDESTINE CRANNY and 15185 resp., mutrs believed in Sofia, Bulgaria; main broadcasts from xmtrs believed in Bucharest, Romania, ceased 14/7 (BBCMS 22/9) REI was last IDed during its 1235-1250 xmsn on 5/10 at 15365 kHz. The 2005-2025 xmsn on 15185 was last heard 28/9. These xmsns are now thought to have been discontinued (BBCMS 13/10) REI heard 3/10 on 15365v, 1237-1255*, toned-down pro-communist talks, Kabul het messy (Pitt McNeil, DX, TDXN) SPAIN, LN-12

<u>Voice of Arab Syria</u>, not heard since 0400 xmsn 27/9, while 0700 xmsn last heard 21/9. Xmsns from this 9510/6170 kHz station, material critical of the present Syrian regime, are believed to have been discontinued (BBCMS 13/10)

Voice of Lebanon, of Leb. Phalangist Party, is still active; ID in AR: "Huna Sawt Lebnan, Sawt al-Hurriyah wa al-Karamah"; EG: "This is the Voice of Lebanon, the Voice of Freedom and Dignity". On 6500 kHz at 0455-0930, 1100-2105. AR 0455-0930, 1100-1300, 1430-1745, 1900-2105. Western pgm, mostly music, 1300-1430; 1745-1830 includes EG nx 1745-1755, FR nx 1800-1810. Armenian 1830-1900 (BBCMS 15/9)

Turkish pirates A (locally) famous pirate, Azminin Radyosu was recently closed down--that is Azmi's Radio (Azmi was the name of the operator). It was in Kuzan-Adan and broadcast only music. According to Turkish law, even the better-known low-powered SW stations such as Ankara Polis and Meteorolojinin Sesi are illegal. So they may well have to close down in the near future. Hurry up and grab their QSLs. (Haluk Mesci, Istanbul, SCDX 27/9) Certain stations are transmitting in contravention of the law under which only the Turkish Radio & TV Organization, TRT, is authorized. The first of these, Ankara Police Radio, was established in 1954 to improve relations between police and public. Since then it has added xmtrs, some on VHF. At present it is on the air with music and features 10½ hours per day. Other stations are Mamak Radio in Ankara, Istanbul Police Radio, Voice of Meteorology in Ankara, Izmir Police Radio, Voice of the Airmen in Ahlatlibel in Ankara, Eregli Coal Works Radio in Zonhułdak, and Azmi's Radio in Kozan, Adana (Istanbul "Hurriyet" newspaper 29/8

Voice of Nigeria obs 10/9 0600-0610 with "Freedom Our Goal", a "10-min exhortation pgm for freedom fighters in southern Africa"; also announced a further edition 1645 11/9, but not confirmed due to poor reception (BBCMS 15/9)

<u>R. Freedom</u>, of the ANC heard ending 1653 6/10, sked given as Mon-Sat 1610-1650, Sun 1700-1800; and at 1715, lion roar, "<u>Zimbabwe Peoples Revolutionary Voice</u>", and at 1730 into tribal lang. Said was on 31 & 49 m Mon-Sat; and Sun on 49m only; all heard via R. Zambia on 9580 (David Walcutt, HI)

Voice of the People of Malaya, "Suara Rakyat Malaya", pro-Peking, anti-Malaysian govt clan-destine, sked on variable 7020 kHz: 2130-2200 Cantonese, 2230-2315 Malay, 2315-2415 Std. Ch. 1130-1200 Cant, 1200-1230 Std Ch, 1230-1315 Malay, 1430-1500 Cant, 1500-1530 Std. Ch.; was first hrd on 4/5/76 (BBCMS 8/77) This stn is operated by MCP(ML) -- Malayan Communist Party--Marxist-Leninist Faction, not pro-Peking. Operational area of MCP(ML) is, per FE Economic Review, west of the Sungei Patani (= river), in southern Thailand near the Malay-sian border, and that is where the VOPM xmtr is considered to be. The 2/9 FE Economic Review explains the difference in ideology between MCP(ML) and the MCP proper. MCP proper, the original faction is still led, as always, by the world's most indefatigable guerilla, Chin Peng. His R. Suara Revolusi Malaya, in Mandarin, is in southern China at Hengyang, 200 mi S of Changsha and 1180 mi N of Kuala Lumpur. MCP(ML) split with MCP(P) in 1970, led by Chiu Jen, but this did not become known until 1974. The armed units are trying to push their influence further west towards the coast by claiming to be the most revolutionary and most communist of all factions. It is continually attacked by Chin Peng's radio (Ugusa, FE)

Voice of the People of Thailand (Cf Sept LN-6), re its location in the Sipsong Panna, "land of the 12000 rice-fields" is on the upper Mekong in Yunnan, China. Panna is a unit of measurement for ricefields, but it is generally interpreted as <u>cantons</u>. Today the area is in-habited, among others, by the <u>I'ai Lu</u>, residents of China who share some heritage and com-mon linguistic origins with the Lao and Siamese (Henry L. DuRant, MD ex-Thailand)

FROGRAMS AUSTRALIA "DXers Calling", which had not missed a week since it DX began in 1946, was to come to an end after the program of 29-30 October 1977. R. Australia gave these reasons: financial constraints; RA's desire not to have a programme for a specialised audience. Letters of protest may be successful in gain-ing a return of the programme. Send them to: The Assistant Director of English Programmes, R. Australia, Box 428 G, GPO Melbourne 3001, Australia (Peter Bunn, ARDXC, 13/10) They have agreed to continue the Japanese version as before, and offer to allocate 4 minutes of the Sat "Club Forum" pgm to DX tips, plus two other 2-minute segments at unspecified times during the week. This seems to be final; however, the full 10-minute pgm is to continue on the domestic service only, Sat at 2200 on VLR/VLH (Rob Williams, phone call from Sydney, 20/10) The 2200 broadcast is on 11880/6150, and is at 2100 Nov-Feb due to DST (Padula) Let's insist they put "DXers Calling" back together again, and on R. Australia! (gh)

AUSTRIA ORF heard on 6015 at 0453-0458 with "Shortwave Panorama"; heavy QRM (Steven Dubin, NJ, MNRC Oct.) NNRC editor Bennett actively discourages reporters from giving days of week or dates, since he edits them out. Can it be that ORF has started carrying this pgm when NAm listeners can hear it--without telling us by putting it in the pgm sked? Or did Steven merely hear a plug for the pgm at its usual inaudible times, as I have heard them do (gh)

EGYPT R. Cairo heard with EG DX show "Cairo Calling", at 0205 10/8 on 9475 (Thomas Brennan, NJ, SPEEDX) Unless it's really changed, I'd question calling it a DX show. 10/8 was Wed(gh)

GERMANY WEST The DX pgm "Unser Kurzwellenbummel" will be heard 3 Dec. 1545-1600 over SDR-1 on 6030; and 4 Dec. at 0645-0700 on SFB 6190, plus more times on AM & FM (SCDX 4/10)

MEXICO R. México has "Hola DX-ista" in SP on Mon at 1410 on 5895/9705/15320 (Javier Castro, Can-Cun, Quintana Roo, SCDX 4/10) Two out of three is bad==5985/15385 (gh) Because of my class schedule, my pgm will soon change to Mon 0200 and Tue 1400 (Panamanian Ramón Barragán, producer, on RN Espacio DX-ista 15/10) I think he means GMT Tue 0200 and 1400. However, I listened on a Tue at 0200-0230 and didn't hear it (gh)

SWAZILAND TWR is considering dumping the "DX Special" due to lack of input and interest amongst Southern African listeners. Gerry Wood suggests you write to TWR Swaziland, Manzini, if this has a bearing on you (R. RSA DX Corner 1/10 via Richard Stoller, NY)

SWEDEN More WOOD to the DX-World! The name WOOD is well-known to DXers. Dr. Richard WOOD is an estimated language-expert and appreciated contributor to SCDX. The DX-Editor of R. RSA is Gerry WOOD. Several years ago Robin WOOD was director of R. Australia. Also, the name Skoog means WOOD in English. During my semi-retirement another WOOD will edit SCDX. His name is George WOOD, an American journalist and DXer, who has been a freelancer with R. Sweden since 1975. - I hope you will support him as well as you have supported me. MANY THANKS. So local time is now GMT + 4h (BBCMS) Apparently in this way Iran abandons $\frac{1}{2}$ -hour off-time; originally GMT + $3\frac{1}{2}$, up to GMT + $4\frac{1}{2}$ for summer (gh)

<u>POLAND</u> Warsaw radio reported a reversion to GMT + 1 as of 25/9 (BBGMS) More, LN-12 <u>SPAIN</u> Madrid radio announced that summer time would end on 24/9; back to GMT + 1 (BBCMS) <u>TURKEY</u> Per Ankara radio, winter time begins 16/10, i.e. GMT + 2 (BBCMS)

The signals are not particularly strong at Rochester NY, but this might be because Bob LaRose's listening post is within the 'dead spot' before first skip zone. Per the 17 Feb. ELECTRON-ICS, tests from Maine were not supposed to begin until fall 1978, however that could refer to xmsns from the 6 million watt xmtr presently under construction by Continental Electronics. The signals now being heard could be from an interim experimental unit (SWNS Oct.)

WATCH OUT. One of this country's newest early-warning systems is a six-story giant radar structure on the Aleutian island of Shemya. It has 15,000 electronic eyes that can detect and track a grapefruit-sized object from a distance of 2000 miles. The radar system is designed to keep an eye on Soviet missile tests, warn of surprise missile attacks, and track the growing number of satellites. (Parade, 16/10) Sounds like SW pulser to me (gh)

MAIL EMBARGO Overseas Surface Mail Embargoed, Postal Service Blames Dock Strike. 
