

New Receivers

THOSE NEW PANASONIC RECEIVERS

Material supplied by David Duke and Regino Rincon

The Japanese firm of Matsushita, of which Panasonic is the U.S. sales company, plans to introduce two new portable radio receivers into the U.S. in 1978. Both feature LED digital frequency readout on shortwave bands. These receivers, the RF-2800 and the RJX-4800, join the popular RF-2200 on the American shortwave market.

We illustrate some advertising material from Panasonic here, but note that the U.S. import models may vary from the Japanese domestic versions or versions sold in other countries. In fact David Duke has had conversations and correspondence with Matsushita representatives about band coverage on the U.S. versions. It shows that Matsushita is mass market minded and has not previously considered what the needs of the serious SWL might be, or for that matter, that there are people who DX on long wave and medium wave bands also in the U.S.

The following was prepared by David Duke from conversations with Matsushita representatives. There are two distinct export models of the RF-2800 receiver, one intended for Europe and the other for North America and probably Australia/New Zealand. The domestic model has 3 SW bands covering 3.2 to 30.0 MHz, the MW broadcast band plus the Japanese 76-90 MHz FM band. The European model will have the same MW and SW coverage plus a LW band and the FM band will be 88-108 MHz. The North American model will not (apparently) have the LW band.


The digital readout on the domestic RF-2800 is capable of displaying MW frequencies also, but the MW IF of 455 kHz must be subtracted from the displayed frequency to get the correct MW frequency. On shortwave, the readout is exact (to the nearest kHz). However, the switch on the back of the receiver which allows the counter to work with the MW circuitry was deleted from the NA export model. Thus the counter is capable of working only on the SW bands. When the representative was asked why the switch was deleted, he replied that it was felt that this capability was not needed in the receivers intended for NA. Mr. Duke suggested that this might conceivably lessen the value of the receiver to the serious listener, especially for the MW listener who would certainly consider the feature to be of value when hunting for splits. He also pointed out to the Matsushita representative that there are two clubs in NA devoted exclusively to MW DXing

as well as others which cover both MW and SW. There is even a club devoted to LW listening. The Matsushita representative then indicated that they would like to hear about the needs of U.S. users of their products and suggested that Mr. Duke provide them with some input from listeners in the U.S. Mr. Duke has prepared a survey that he suggests NASWA members, interested in having products of the future more closely meet their needs, respond to. He will make the results available to Panasonic, Sony, Drake, and all other major manufacturers of shortwave equipment. Mr. Duke is not being paid by any of these companies to do this, so I have included Mr. Duke's survey in this month's SWC, after the material on the new receivers.






RF-4800

A 10-BAND COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVER BY PANASONIC

The RF-4800 is a communications receiver with complete coverage from 525 kHz to 31 MHz. The FM band is also provided. It is a double conversion synthesized receiver using the phase-lock loop system. It retails for about \$450 when available in 1978. The receiver is portable in that it can be powered by 8 "D" size batteries as well as AC mains power. The receiver also features LED digital frequency readout on shortwave to the nearest kHz.



The RF-4800 includes a ladder-type ceramic filter for added selectivity and stability. This is a 4-element type and is used in the "narrow" circuitry of the bandwidth selector. This is rated as \pm 1.7 kHz at -6 dB and \pm 6 kHz at 60 dB, better than some more expensive receivers.

To meet the competition, SONY will introduce the ICF-6900 communications receiver, possibly by June 1978. The receiver sells for about 80,000 Yen in Japan, considerably more than the FRG-7, which it resembles. The 6900 is a 32 band FM/AM/SW portable. On it is a dual conversion superheterodyne with crystal-controlled digital synthesizer tuning with FET RF amplifler. LED display is accurate to 1 kHz on SW. SSB reception, Battery or AC power, built in lamp. Size ? 1/8" H, 1? 3/8" W, 8 3/4" D. Weight is given as 11 pounds, but that seems a little light for its size. 6 "D" size batteries provide power, 8 ICs, 8 FETs, 53 transistors.

I for one am tired of hearing about "almost receivers that lack just one or two features, generally in selectivity and/or sensitivity. Any of us who shell out \$250 or more for a receiver intend to make serious use of it and would like to see appropriate selectivity and sensitivity built into the modern generation of receivers. After all, these requirements have been available on receivers for more than 30 years. The problem is getting present day manufacturers to put them on their mass produced receivers, and to convince them that they will have an increase in sales if they do.

Guairá, 5975v, has been off the air for several months, probably because price of electricity was doubled about the time it disappeared. LV de Amambay, 5995; and Em. Paraguay, 6015 are on reduced skeds, former f/in 0850, and transmitting during local daylight; and the latter ending around 2400 or 0100. R Guaraní, 15210, still off the air. Non-Governmental stns now prohibited by law from operating above 6200. 15210 (and 11915) have been allocated to R. Nacional for future use, when their new xmtrs arrive. However, tests were carried out by R. Guaraní on 15210 during 1977, and their SW equipment has been completely overhauled. He adds that RVA receives an average of 8000 letters a month from listeners in 16 Asian countries (RVA "Wavelength" via Joseph Vargo, MI) Tnx for the sked, Joseph, but is out of date by publication of this FRENDX issue (gh) AFRTS Poro relay was discontinued 6/11 at 0000, apparently a late decision, as was listed in the D77 VOA sked. No longer required, as original purpose was to serve US forces in SEAs. The xmtr used, Poro-2, 35 kW has joined Poro-1 (35 kW) and Poro-4 (15) on the USIA RTTY "Wireless File" at 2330 Mon-Fri, on 14526 to Indo & Au, 11490 and 9870. REUNION In response to my letter, M. L. Larrieu, R & TV Technical Manager at St. Denis says 'First, we stopped our SW xmsns because, from the middle of the Indian Ocean with only 4 kW, we reached a small amount of people. Secondly, the SW xmtrs were installed in the base of the R & TV production center and brought a lot of RF troubles in the wirings and especially in the low level circuits." Asked it there were any protests from DXers, M. Larrieu said that "After we decided to turn off our SW xmsns, nobody but only 3 or 4 persons wrote and asked us about the SW. This fact confirmed ourselves in our position about this decision." Finally, in response to my query as to phony or bogus reports, he replied that "The small power of our xmtrs explain the poor reports we ever receive from anywhere around the world but it was not very important because our program had no international design." Now operates only on 665 & 602 kHz, 0200-1900 (John Moritz, OH)

TURKEY Türkiye Polis Radyosu, 6340 at *0558 bells like IS, rousing choral anthem, man in Turkish with short talk, into straight cuts of Turkish mx past 0632 (Pitt McNeil, DC, 6/2) (UNITED NATIONS) (Cf Feb LN-10/11) UN Radio's anti-apartheid BCs to South Africa will be carried by the VOA from Liberia and on MW from Botswana on 971 kHz, and from Mozambique either on 917 or on the National "A" programme. Other African stations to relay the broadcast include Zambia, Tanzania, Uganda, Ghana and Nigeria. Also expected to help relay the programs are the European ISWBC stations previously mentioned, with the exception of the BBC, which has declined (Richard Ginbey, RSA, SCDX 31/1)

USA Looks like WYFR Scituate site survived recent storm, as heard with ID at 2200 11/2 on 6055. Scituate beach area, where xmtr is located, was extremely hard hit in storm--houses washed away, lives lost, etc. (Jerry Berg, Lexington MA)

 $\underline{\text{U}}$ S R Most ES freqs are listed in the IFRB sked as 240 kW, some with 100 kW. Most internal svc freqs are listed as 100 kW, some 240 kW. 7195 & 7205, two of the strongest signals on the R. Moscow NAm svc, are listed in the IFRB sked as 100 kW. The comparative strength with other frequencies indicates actual powers of at least 240 kW, and probably 500 kW, since strength is the same as the 500 kW Plovdiv relay on 7115. The R. Tashkent SAs svc is listed as 50 kW on 6025/9600/15115 and 100 kW on 9540/11730/11925. Signal strength in NAm at 1200 GMT indicates power of 240 kW (Roger Legge, Jan UHN) Sverdlovskoye Radio now using 4860 for regional svc, sometimes audible around 1300, when local pgms are BC in RS weekdays to 1400; otherwise relay M1EU (Moscow Pgm I for Euro USSR, Ural, Caucasus and Turkmenia). Heard at the end of Dec 1977 (Takahiro Saito, FEDXR)

CLANDESTINE CRANNY R. Rebelde is a very interesting Claims to be operating from a hidden place in Cuba. $\underline{\text{R. Rebelde}}$ is a very interesting clandestine which Of course, R. Rebelde was the name used by Castro during his guerrilla days, and is still the name of one of the national nets in Cuba, but this is different. I heard it once around Thanksgiving, then not again until Dec. 25 & 26, on about 7000 to 7025 kHz between 2000 and 2200. It began with several short anmts that it would soon read a Christmas message written by a Cuban mother. The transmitter would go off the air for 5 to 10 minutes. Then the message condemned Castro, especially his sending Cuban soliders to Angola. Also used the slogan "La voz que no tiene mordaza" = The voice without a gag. Reception was on a par with ham stations from Cuba on 40m. I do not think it was operating from here in Miami, because there was fading (Timothy Hendel) Tim sent me a tape of this, excerpts of which have been included on my March 10 (+11 CMT) report on R. Nederland's Espacio DX-ista, from which I also gleaned: At one point it called another station "Segundo Frente Patriótico Militar Único Móvil en la provincia---". Also called "CQ 40, from CO8RR, in Santiago de Cuba". On AM; "R. Rebelde, unida a R. Libertad Cubana". Intermittent QRM from a station playing music, which this stn also heard and blamed on the Cuban government. At conclusion, speaker IDed self as "El Comandante Abito(?)" (gh) Also check 3850 (D. Crawford) R. Sandino (cf Feb LN-9) has not been confirmed by monitoring observations (BBCMS 26/1)

New York pirate(s) (Cf Feb LN-9; LR-A) WPAT, WPOP, WPOT, WPLC were among the IDs used by a pirate hrd 21/1 at 2315-2400*, announced freq 1625 kHz; phone-in talk show, some rock mx. Gave number (212) 830-9900. Anno'd QTH as Manhattan, tho most callers were from Brooklyn. DJ "Jack" or "Vito" anno'd it as a pirate station and "illegal radio stn". Final ID was WPLT, with the sounds of muffled shouts and pounding on a door. Signal at my QTH, 100 km from NYC, was fair, severe fade; signal lacked directionality. I was surprised at the number of people calling in. The day was perfect to run a pirate. It was a weekend, the day after a snowstorm. A lot of people were indoors; potentially big audience. Plus impossible traveling conditions would hinder direction finding and any possible FCC action. And around 1630 kHz 7/2 from 0400, another phone-in stn with some cursing, during the big snowstorm; no ID hrd. 8/2 on 1630 0130-0200, DJ claimed he was only on during snowstorms. Anno/d QTH as NYC. Phone (212) 391-9979; said another pirate would be on at 10 p.m. EST, but I did not hear this. Yet another one on 3886 kHz 6/2, 0135-0143*, *0147-0200* playing mellow pop music; strong carrier, weak audio, no talk, heavy QRM, no ID, off suddenly (Steven Kontos, Centereach NY)

WFSR, "Free Speech Radio" hrd 7/2 from 0820 to 0900 on about 1626 kHz, weak sig, "a radio stn run by people with little money and simple equipment". Used regular call-in format, number 830-9900. Phone was answered without ringing. Ancr said he was in Brooklyn, using store-bought ham equipment, horizontal long wire antenna, radiating approx 20-40 w. Admitted that WFSR was formerly WICE; I read FRENDX Feb LR to him, and he said the calls were paid for, not underhanded. Said he was with WCPR in 1976, the only time he was busted. Why he does it? He believes in the principle of free speech radio and it is an interesting challenge for him (Michael J. Youndt, Denver PA)

WGOR, Brooklyn, hrd on 1630v, this past Sat & Sun nites local dates around 0400-0445+ GMT. Mostly call-in, various numbers, all with 9900+ last four digits like WCPR used. Also hrd last Fri at 0500 IDing as WICE, parody of wx situation then. Also hrd then but not subsequently on second harmonic 3260.6 (Pitt McNeil, DC, 23/1) more....

The NYC pirates were putting on a real circus in mid-Jan. WICE "Free Speech Radio" noted on 1626 from 0200 21/1 taking phone calls at 212-399-9977. Noted same date at SWNS HQ with fair signals from 0320 tunein. By then, SWNS Correspondent Robert L. Foxworth, Long Island, reports they were up around 1630 tho announcing 1625 kHz. About half the callers wanted to, quite literally, just make noise on the air--much to the station's disgust. Subsequently switched phone numbers to 830-9900, another 'loop' number normally used for internal phone company operations only. Still going at 0740. What Foxworth believes to be the same stn, but called WPOT, was noted on LI and at SWNS HQ same date 2300- on 1626.3, drifting down to 1625.9 by 2350. During this period, SWNS HQ noted a second NYC phone-in pirate, announcing as 1620, not audible, but hrd poorly on about 3240, not //WPOT. Foxworth caught WPOT abruptly signing off at 2358 which sounded as if they were being busted-the announcer certainly seemed anxious to get off the air. At 0130 WGOR definitely audible on about 1630, and on 5/2 at 0330. WGOR previously logged 0405 16/1 with porno phone call. Shortly before 0500 someone called claiming to represent WCPR (the original phone-in pirate) and complaining that WGOR had taken over WCPR's freq. Despite this, we believe all these stns are connected: they are all able to tamper with the phone system (Feb SWNS)

WGOR hrd 22/1 0545-0630, fair-to-good, 399-9979; DJ said GOR stands for "Get-Off Radio ...no, I mean Get On Radio" (John Czarnowski, Staten Island NY, IRCA DX Monitor) On 1620. WFAT, NY, 1630, hrd 1/1 0535-0623 tuneout, weak, lots of fading, talk show, 212-830-9906 and lots of calls were from DXers, including me (David Nelson, Chapel Hill NC, IRCA DXM)

KUGR. I operate pirate stn "Cougar", "King Underground Radio". This station is highly clandestine -- so much so that I will not reveal its frequency. It is on MW, however, with 100 milliwatts power, and a 10 foot antenna, as permitted by the FCC's Part 15. KUGR operates whenever I damn well please. Program policy is to rebroadcast noisy SW stns for the enjoyment and edification of the general public. Any DXer hearing KUGR should write and I will make up some sort of QSL. Personal visits and phone calls are highly discouraged and will not be QSLed (Shaler Hanisch, 940 Hillcrest Pl., Pasadena, CA 91106)

Voice of Namibia via Tanzania 15435 1830-1900 EG, not as per BBCMS sked (Pitt McNeil, 3/2) <u>Voice of Zimbabwe</u> via Maputo, Mozambique, noted with EG political nx at 1715 on 9570; is presented by ZANU (Ron Knight, Papua New Guinea, via R. Australia Japanese DX 15/1) Wil the 'settlement' in Rhodesia have put an end to these particular cland programs? (gh) Zimbabwe People's Revolutionary Voice in EG & verns, 1700-1745 via R. Zambia 9580/7235/ 6165/6060 (BBCMS 2/2)

Voice of the Free Canary Islands, via Algiers had not been heard the past few days, R. Exterior de España reported 27/1, maybe due to approaches made to Algeria by the Spanish govt. Monitoring obs confirm the pgm is no longer BC on 7060 at previously sked time of 2100-2200, which now carry R. Algiers DS in FR; but still carries ES in EG & SP at 1900-2100 as before (BBCMS 2/2)

Voice of Arab Syria & Voice of One Lebanon. "VOAS" not hrd since yearend, presumed discontinued; but VOOL continues on its same freqs, 9510/6060 at 1030-1130 & 2030-2130. Now evident this from Iraq, since on 9510/6060 at 1030 10/1 were relaying R. Baghdad's Turkmen svc instead of VOOL. By 1040, both freqs had switched to the correct pgm (BECMS 19/1)

Voice of Palestine is the name of a feature carried on R Baghdad's ES in EG to Eu on 9745, Thu (26/1) at 2150, announced as being presented by RB itself--a 4-min talk ridiculing the Zionist's view of Israel as a 'Jewish home land'; assumed repeated Fri 0350 to NAm (BBCMS) Voice of the Oman Revolution During Aden Radio's VOOR pgm 12/1, it was stated that the pgm presented by the PFLO has been BC at 2030 from Libya since 8/1. Obs 16 & 17/1 on 9650 revealed it during Libya's external svc "Voice of the Arab Homeland" at 2000-2015 (BBCMS 19/1) Ditto, and also on 9500, 6100 (BBCMS 26/1)

Voice of the Communist Party of Turkey and'd that from 1/2 it would increase output to: 0400-0430, 0810-0840, 1640-1715, 1815-1900, 2030-2100, 2200-2245; and'd W/Ls 31.5 and 48.5 metres. Those daily; said would also continue Tue & Thu 2015-2045 on 908 kHz (BBCMS 2/2)

FUTURE PLANS ARGENTINA (Cf Jan LN-11) The Dir. of the govt's General BCing Directorate stated 23/1, per Arg. news agency Telam, that the BC law permits the return of commercial stns to private firms. Present plans include the releasing of 53 such radio stns to commercial enterprises (BBCMS 2/2)

AUSTRALIA The two 100 kW Harris Gates xmtrs are now being installed at Shepparton, and when these are ready, two of the older 100 kW units will be temporarily withdrawn from service, whilst building alterations are carried out around them. It is planned that a revised sked will commence in Nov, using all six 100 kW units. The new units will require only a 5 min break between xmsns rather than 30 mins; also; no tone tests (R. Jones, ADXN)

(Cf Jan LN-11) The report is not entirely correct. An engineer with DENTEL was in Asunción a few months back, and said they intend to transfer all non-govt stns from the HF bands and re-allocate them freqs in the Tropical and MW bands. At least some, if not all of the vacated HF channels will then be used for Govt stns. The engr did not specify if the 49mb was to be included among the HF bands, but this seems unlikely. (Tony Jones, Pgy) COSTA RICA Watch for possible curtailment of Radio Cadena Nacional ops in wake of the 5/2 elexion defeat of the ruling National Liberation Party's presidential candidate by Rodrigo Carazo of the Unity Coalition. RCN was put together in the early 1970s during the second term of NLP's José "Pepe" Figueres. Carazo has also promised to expel fugitive US financier Rovert Vesco who is known to have invested in various Figueres business interests and was described in the 30/7/75 Variety as having 'various communications interests' in CR (SWNS)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC On R. Clarín, Rudy Espinal mentioned 8/2 that they would soon add a broadcast in EG at 0030, "news for you, Glenn Hauser" (Ed Ricchezza, PA) It was not certain at that point, but it would be done by a new ancr, Erminio Alberti, who might also substitute for Rudy while he spends 53 days in the US attending various broadcasting seminars, in Washington DC, Las Vegas, San Francisco, and during most of March at Syracuse Univ in New York. On 9/2 I interviewed Rudy by phone on the air. He said they were going to convert the 60m xmtr on 4850 to a MW repeater, where it would do more good. The management has not yet bought the idea of getting a directional antenna for 25m. They are also thinking of repeating the 2130 broadcast at 0230 when reception is best in Australia and NZ. And, Rudy has offered the GMT Sun 0000-0030 block for the use of DX clubs. I expect that a monthly "Review of International Broadcasting Of the Air" will be among the features, if Rudy's absence does not hinder (gh)

HAMMARLUND's remaining assets have been purchased by Pax Manufacturing Corp, 100 East Montauk Hwy, Lindenhurst NY 11757. In a letter to WTFDA ANARC Rep Morrie Goldman, Robert Kjeldsen says "We will manufacture all of the HQ 180, SP 600 and R 390 series. We will also supply spares for all of the former equipment." (Jan ANARC Newsletter)

HONDURAS La Voz de Honduras announced 26/1 that a formal request had been made to R. Neder-land for assistance, to give 'a special dynamism to R. Honduras from both the technical and programming standpoints in order to best publicize activities in culture, education, science and art". The country's official stn would cease to be a bad copy of R. Havana, Cuba. It would no longer indulge in demagogy and diatribe against national banking, commerce and industry, and attacks on the military regimes of other CAm countries. It rates RN as 'perhaps the most professional stn in the world, on a par with the BBC" (BBCMS 2/2) This may relate to a visit recently made by an RN training team to R. Clarin as well, regarding the establishment of a training centre on Bonaire (gh)

IVORY COAST Following a visit of the French President, France-Inter reported 15/1 that the I.C. radio and TV net is to be modernized and extended at a cost of one billion francs (BBCMS 19/1)

MASIRAH BBC's 1412 kHz relay, put out of action by cyclone 13/6/77, is back on the air. Four 100 kW SW xmtrs are being installed and should be in use by mid-year (Arthur Cushen)

SHORTWAVE RADAR Jan Wireless World reports as follows on the US SW radar facility currently being developed by GE and E-Systems for operation in Maine: 'Work involves tests in a nominal freq range between 6 and 30 MHz using a pulse compression waveform having a typical repetition frequency of 40 pulses per second. Mr. W. Fenster of GE was asked jokingly by a radar symposium delegate, 'What are we going to do about those damned communications in the HF bands?" His equally jocular reply was "Oh, we'll just switch on." However, he did explain that altho efforts are made to ensure xmsn freqs are chosen to coincide with clear channels, stns operating in the target area or elsewhere are not necessarily hrd at the xmtr site due to the nature of ionospheric propagation." (SWNS)

SWITZERLAND (Cf Feb LN-11) The SSB tests are definitely on starting in May for a year to NAm (Swiss SW Merry Go Round 28/1 via Pete Grenier, CA)

TURKEY VOT info state there will be further changes in the ES when two new xmtrs commence operation in late spring or early summer (BBCMS 26/1)

YUGOSLAVIA Tho R. Yugoslavia begins as nothing but a new name for R. Belgrade, big things are in store, the no spectacular differences should be expected straight away. The Dir. of RY said new equipment will be purchased to increase the stn's audibility to 10, 15 or 20 times the present level. It was hoped to improve audibility of xmsns beamed to the Arab World, Asia, IAm, Af and also Eu (BBCMS 2/2)

UNIDENTIFIED 2340 (Cf Jan LN-10) I think it's R. Nueva Esparta, 0359*, on the beautiful island of Margarita, which is what Mr. Perdue may have heard instead of "Bogotá" (Jack Limann, Caracas, 18/1)

4719 Stn hrd almost daily from fade in 2130, 2200 peak, gone by 2230. Seems Asian, and on good day might have hrd RRI ID at 2200, but no IS. Could be Ujung Pandang but seems whacky. Pretty sure it's not Pakistan, as they were on 4718 11/2 while mystery was very weak on 4719 (Jerry Berg, MA) Karachi 4735 has drifted to 4718, at 0045-1810, 1915-2145, latter time feeding WS to Islamabad (BBC WRC 15/2) Tashkent on new 4718 *1714 in Arabic (Satoshi Wakisaka, JADX, via ADXN)

4740 15/2 0507-0521* no Aida, but taps + bugle improvisation (Sandy Blaize, LA)

Although I am the new Technical Editor of SPEEDX, I intend to still try and support FRENDX as well with logging, suggestions, etc. No use to bicker over which one is the 'best'. I can't get by with just one! SPEEDX best for looking up a station by area, FRENDX best if you have a frequency you are trying to ID.

Syd Osterman, Ont .: I have been reading various letters and articles for and against the poor SWL. Mainly against, I think, and mostly by the so-called DX fraternity. Obviously, we all have to start somewhere! Many cannot afford more than a 'cheap little portable'. Personally, I started during WWII in London, England, using 1-tubes, home built from junk, with a bed-spring antenna. I will never forget the thrill of hearing the US, Canada and many others on those simple receivers. They also provided a stepping-stone to an eventual

career in the electronics industry. Of course, there were NO QSLs then either!

The point is that there is, or can be much more to the hobby than 200 VIC in the shortest possible time. Firstly, some knowledge of the theory of operation of the cheap, or expensive toys that one uses to listen with--oh, sorry, DX with! --cannot help but make you more proficient at knob twiddling. Secondly, one does not have to stay at the SWL level or become a dyed-in-the-wool DXer-QSL chaser. Surely, a third category, which may be called DX Listener would provide the optimum in both enjoyment and education. The idea is to acquire the ability to hear so-called DX stations and then endeavour to listen to them in depth, rather than just enough for a QSL. Local news bulletins in English are probably the most interesting and informative. Tapes can often be made from the likes of local PNGs and Solomons, etc. Without owning expensive DX receivers. Linguistic ability will, of course, increase greatly the number of DX stations "Listened" to.

I think that people in the hobby today are most fortunate to have clubs such as NASWA

and bulletins like FRENDX. Getting the most out of the hobby is up to you!

But SPEEDX's log arrangement makes it invaluable for 'target shooting' -- trying for a particular station or country--but it could use more of the crucial detail included so that one can be sure of what one hears. Each major DX club has its own feature that makes it invaluable to its members, like ASWLC's "Time Index" which lets you get an idea of what you can hear at a particular time; so all I can say is God forbid that all clubs started looking alike!!

Louis Goldstein touched on another sore spot concerning me & NASWA. The membership directory not making print for this year was not the last straw for me. The last straw was that I wasn't listed as a NASWA member last time, and now the chance to correct that sit-

uation has been removed!




