DX-300

USER REPORTS

The first reports from users of Radio Shack's digital shortwave receiver, the DX-300, have come in. Several people have reported problems with the MHz tuning as I reported in "This 'n That" page 9 of the March FRENDX.

REVIEW OF THE RADIO SHACK DX-300 COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVER by Rob Harrington, President of the Colorado Association of DXers. I purchased the Radio Shack DX-300 communications receiver from our local Radio Shack. After having the receiver for a few days, I found that there was some problem with my new receiver. So I sent in the new receiver for repairs My receiver needed a small alignment. But the main problem still remained, the main problem is in the MHz tuning. The MHz knob has to be constantly adjusted when tuning the receiver. It drove me up the wall, it is a very annoying problem. Example: If you want to listen to HCJB on 9745 kHz, you first set the kHz knob so the kHz display reads 745 kHz, then you tune the preselector band switch to 9 MHz and set the preselector between 9 and 10 on the preselector dial. Then you tune the MHz knob to 9 MHz. As you turn it you will hear many stations go by unless you know what HGJB sounds like you could tune in the wrong station and be off frequency. I feel that Radio Shack made a very bad mistake when they designed the receiver. To make the sensitivity better you have to readjust the MHz knob a lot, and will drive you up the wall. That plus not knowing if you are on frequency, unless you know of a station and where it is supposed to be. If you decide to change frequencies after peaking HCJB, you will soon note that you will have to go back and readjust and readjust again and again. You are going to be in for a lot of problems if you buy the DX-300. I just took my DX-300 back to Radio Shack for a refund. I made the mistake of paying by my own check, now I have to wait for 7 to 30 days for my refund to come from Fort Worth. If you decide to buy the DX-300, you may be better off charging it, and if you decide to return it you can get a charge credit in 5 minuites.

Denis E. Wilson, Gloversville, NY, wrote with a similar experience. "... I recently purchased a DX-300 and found it to be most unsatisfactory to operate and had to return it for a refund. The problem I experienced was that the MHz control knob was not precise, i.e. it required up to 1/5 of a turn to increase or decrease 1 MHz. I found that inbetween this span it was impossible to know where you were. No explanation from Radio Shack other than 'It just takes a lot of tuning'."

Larry Cunningham, Columbus, OH, wrote the following in a letter to Dave Walcutt. "I'm still having some problems with the DX-300; they may well be related to the Wadley-loop circuit difficulties discussed by Jerry Lineback in the March FRENDX. I'm continuing to work with the local Radio Shack service people and, indirectly, the big boys in Texas. I'm still hoping they can find some resolution to the difficulties. I would greatly appreciate hearing from any other NASWA members who share my experience, especially in regard to possible solutions. When the MHz tuning problems are not in evidence, I would venture to say that the DX-300 is a fairly serviceable receiver, certainly an improvement over my old DX-160. Sensitivity is good; selectivity is not up to professional standards, but probably equal to that on the unmodified FRG-7000 (consider the price differential). Frequency readout is a dream to behold, except, ofcourse, when the problem crops up!

That brings up an interesting question. The major tuning problem on my DX-300 occurs in the 4.7 to 4.9 MHz area, and in the entire 25 meter band area, whereas I have no problem at all nearly anywhere else. On the other hand, Jerry Lineback (and others) report that the sample he tested showed apparently the same problem in the 19 metre band. With the Wadley-loop design, does the antenna have any influence on this type of problem? . . . "

We have indirectly heard similar complaints from others. Again, we urge that persons interested in the DX-300 examine the receiver they intend to buy under operating conditions and carefully examine its MHz tuning.

LATE NOTE: On 20 March your editor received a phone call from Radio Shack in Fort Worth. They are aware of the problem with the MHz dial (an "oscillating IF") and they are sorry that it happened. Radio Shack is willing to trade a checked out and working receiver for any bad one. Make sure your receiver dial is accurate by tuning stations of known frequency (WNV, CHU, etc.) before you leave the store.

PROPAGATION

David Snyder , President of BDXC 1137 E. 12th St. Brooklyn, N.Y. 11230

First let me introduce myself: I am a computer science major at Brooklyn College and work as a programmer there. For the past two years I have been conducting research into Radio Wave Propagation Predictions. I have written an article entitled "Radio Wave Propagation Forecasting", which has appeared in NASWA, ASWLC, and BDXC bulletins. I currently do a Propagation Prediction program on Radio Canada Int. on the first Sunday of the month. I have also written a paper entitled "Prediction of the solar flux index" which has been submitted to the International Solar-Terrestrial Physics Proceedings and Workshop Program sponsored by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

Enough about me ; Now to some basic Propagation.

When a radio wave is transmitted, it travels upward from the antenna and out into the ionosphere. The Ionosphere consists of gases which when bombarded by solar radiation are ionized. Ionization is the process of the creation of charged electrons which constitute much of the ionosphere.

The density of the free electrons in each layer is influenced by the level of solar activity (as measured by the <u>solar flux index</u>), time of day, location of the transmitter and the receiver, as well as the frequency transmitted on.

The solar flux index is a measure of the overall level of solar activity. It is closely associated with the well known sunspot number and may soon be preferred to it as a measurement of solar activity.

Using Propagation charts I have developed coupled with my own predictions of the solar flux index , I have listed below the Propagation Outlook for April 1979. The predictions are based on a monthly flux of 149.1.

DIVERSITY DX RECEPTION

Big time DX can frequently be detected with two receivers which would otherwise be inaudible or useless on a single more sophisticated receiver. At present, this writer is employing a diversity reception method using SX-190 and SP-600 receivers. The technique calls for listening to both receivers at one time through the use of split (stereo) headphones Each receiver, using its own antenna, is tuned to the same frequency. By channeling one receiver to the left ear and the other receiver to the right ear, a superior sensitivity and signal quality is realized surpassing that available from either receiver used alone.

The greatest advantage I have found for diversity reception, however, is the ability to locate new, or to confirm reported parallel broadcasts of different frequencies. Recently, I was thrilled with the affirmation of Jordan on the reported frequency of 11,810 kHz at 5 kW a parallel to its 7155 kHz outlet. The 11,810 kHz outlet was not audible on either of my receivers used separately, but, by tuning the SX-190 to 7155 kHz for the left ear, and tuning the SP-600 to 11,810 kHz for the right ear, I detected the tell-tale resonant echo on 11,810 kHz which can only occur if both ears are hearing the same thing.

To accomplish this easy method all one need to do is use two sets of headphones, one for each receiver, each ear listening to its own headphone. It may be a bit uncomfortable as well as appear ludicrous to wear two sets of phones, however, and to avoid this as well as to make it conveniently easy to switch from receiver to receiver, the writer devised a small black box for installation between receivers which will enable listening to a choise of:

(1) Signal A with both ears

(2) (3) Signal A into left ear and signal B into right ear

Signal B with both ears

The total cost of new parts at Radio Shack came to less than \$8.00, and that was enough to construct two units with parts left over. You can't buy just one of most items - they come in packages of two or three. Otherwise, all else that is needed is a cheap stereo headset. I dislike regular stereo phones though, since they reproduce frequency extremes. So, one can be constructed from two single earphones bought extra and spliced together properly in a stereo phone plug.



Supplemental instructions for making stereo headset from two single earphones:



One wire from each phone to the common terminal.

This gadget should enhance the season's DX for those having two receivers.

Delta Loop

THE DELTA LOOP ANTENNA

Over the past years, many articles have been written and much dialogue has taken place concerning one of the most important yet more easily varied components of the SWL's listening post, the reception antenna. I offer here a very easy to assemble and understand version of the widely used and highly acclaimed Full Wave Loop antenna used by Amatuers.

The Full Wave Loop antenna was invented and first put to use by MR. Charles Moore, W9LZX, one of the engineers of the then infant missionary SWBC station HCJB. The new antenna was comprised of a full wave length of wire formed into a rectangle and suspended in the air between towers. This new antenna came to be known as the Cubical Quad. The first Quads were used by HCJB in the summer of 1942 and proved so effective, that soon other stations in Latin America boasted the new antenna. This was to include a huge rotating giant for 49 meters at TGNA which is still in use today.

Through the amatuer activities of Charles Moore, other hams began to ask about the new antenna which was also used at W9LZX/HC near Quito. After the second world war, these new antennas were beginning to crop up spured on by their reputation of being able to transmit and receive signals as much as 30 minutes before more traditional antennas then in use. I might add that it is still true today; hence the saying, "Quads open and close the bands."

The antenna that this article will be dealing with is not the 4 sided Cubical Quad loop, but a simpler but related version called the Delta Loop (fig 1) which for our purposes, is much more. Electrically, it will work and be effective nearer to the ground and because of it's single point of suspension, this version of the Loop antenna is much easier to erect.




Fig 2 Inverted-V at 13

The Delta Loop antenna is a natural SWL an-It combines some of the virtues of the tenna. vertical antenna such as it's response to low angle incomming signals, (fig 2) where the Dipole falls

short as does the Inverted Vee. However, the
Dipole and the Inverted Vee not only do not require the huge radial systems



as does the Vertical, but they are not as receptive to man made QRN either. The Delta Loop also has some outstanding qualities of it's own to offer such as:

1. Wide Bandwidth (+- 200 kc at 4.8 mhz).

2. Ease of adjustment because of low "Q" factor.

3. Tremendous capture area owing to it's full 1 wave length

construction at the desired center frequency.

4. A full 1.4db of gain at it's resonant frequency when properly matched.

As shown in figure 1, the antenna is bi-directional, that is, it is receptive off of it's broad side with deep but wide nulls off the ends. This quality is somthing that the advanced DX'er might appreciate. Let me give an example of how it might work to an advantage if one were DXing with certain target areas in mind. North American listners could orient the Broad side of the antenna to face about 75. This would allow the antenna to to take in a good part of Africa off of the "front" and the "back" would cover nearly all of the Pacific Islands, Austrailia, and New Zealand. Interferance form South America which would be off of the end of the antenna would be attenuated between 5 and 30 db. The ammount of attenuation will dependent on the angle of the incomming signal, height of the antenna above ground, and if the antenna is being used within it's designed bandwidth. At this point I might add that the Delta Loop can be used with good results on frequencys higher than the ones it has been designed for but please take into account that the characteristics explained above will be altered for reasons that are beyond the realm and scope of this article.

Construction is really very simple. First, the total length of wire needed must be found. The most agreed on formula for the Delta Loop is:


L= 1000 once the total length (L) is found, the length of each side is needed. This can be found simply by dividing

"L" by 3.
Below is an example of a Delta Loop for the 60 meter band whose center fraquency will be 4.850 khz.

These are the measurements for a 60 meter Delta Loop. However, we are not quite ready to put our Delta Loop up yet. The impedance of this antenna is around 120 ohms. This would represent a 2/1 mismatch to the 50 ohm inputs in most of todays receivers. There fore, a simple impedance transformer is needed. A length of RG-59 or still better RG-11 cut according to the following formula and placed between the antenna and the 50 ohm feed line (RG-58 or RG-8) will do quite nicely. The splice can be accomplished with a standard PL-259 connector attached to one end of the 50 ohm feed line and another PL-259 connector attached to one end of the RG-11 or 59 with a standard double female connector in between. Please refer to fig 3. Here is the formula for cutting the the transformer or length of RG-11 or 59.

$$T1 = \frac{162.4}{\text{Freq in mhz}}$$

Below is a completed Delta Loop for the 60 meter band.



When erecting the antenna, care must be exercised to define and mark off each of the 3 corners of the antenna. Insulated wire should be used and the insulators should be installed so that they do not slip up and down the wire when stress is put on them. One method is shown in figure 4 below. You might want to try other methods also.


When hanging the antenna, the bottom wire should be paralell to the ground and about 8 or 10 feet above it. The feed line will be in one of the bottom corners and note that THE CENTER OF THE COAX FORMING THE TRANSFORMER MUST BE ATTACHED TO THE ASCENDING PORTION OF THE WIRE THE BRAID OF THE COAX IS ATTACHED TO THE WIRE THAT IS PARALELL TO THE GROUND (fig 3).

For SWL's, this antenna is both useful and versitile. It does not require large ammounts of land to string wire enough to obtain useful gain as do antennas of other design. The antennas only liability is it's size when cut to cover the lower bands. For th 60 meter antenna, a tall support such as a large tree is needed to hang the antenna so that it's bottom wire is the required 8-10 feet from the ground.

When you operate the Delta Loop, you will note that QRN is down 5 to 10 db from most all antennas. Stations in the target areas sought will be considerably stronger and will be detected sooner as compared to most horizontal antennas. At this QTH, the Delta Loop is consistantly 5 to 7 db better than the Inverted Vee and 3 db better than my best vertical which is an amatuer tower, 50' tall and gamma matched with a center frequency of 4.800 mhz.

For the purposes of this article, the 60 meter band was chosen to use for an example. The antenna is considerably smaller on the higher frequencys. To cut the antenna to another band, simply substitute the frequencys in mhz in the formulas for a band of your choosing.

ANOTHER FILTER MODIFICATION FOR THE FRG-7000


February's SWC had an article by Robert Rankin showing how to wire in a separate switch permitting use of the FRG-7000's 3 kHz filter in the AM mode. Jerry Lineback's review article in the March SWC dramatically shows why such a modification is needed. While I wanted to have the 3 kHz filter available in the AM mode, I did not want to wire in a separate switch as Robert's article described. A look at the 7000's schematic indicated a simple modification involving only a short jumper wire would accomplish my objective. The result makes the 3 kHz filter in the AM-ANL position of the mode switch and leaves the function of the other three positions of this switch unchanged. The ANL, although not very effective, remains functional in the AM-ANL position.

To make this modification, remove the cabinet, set the 7000's chassis on one side, and locate the mode switch on the underside of the chassis. This switch has 5 sections or wafers; the last wafer (nearest the rear of the chassis) controls the selectivity. The white wire with a blue stripe, controls the 6 kHz filter and enters lug 2 and continues to lug 1. Cut the interconnection between lugs 1 and 2. Using a low wattage

soldering pencil and solder wick, remove the solder and remaining wire from lug l. Leave the connection of the white-blue wire to lug 2 unaltered. Be sure there is no connection between lugs l and 2 remaining and be careful not to melt insulation from other nearby wires as you use the soldering pencil. Prepare a 1 1/2-inch insulated #22 jumper wire by stripping 1/4-inch of insulation off each end. Connect one end to lug l and the other

to the interconnection between lugs 3 and 4, (see figure) and solder the two connections carefully. The work is done. The 3 kHz filter is now available in the AM-ANL position of the mode switch and all the advantages described in Jerry's review article are available.

While this change to the FRG-7000 is simple, some skill in using a soldering iron and working with schematics and circuitry is needed to properly complete it. You may wish to have your dealer do it for you. ALWAYS UNPLUG


AN INEXPENSIVE FRG-7000 AUDIO MODIFICATION

I have found the FRG-7000 to be an impressive communications receiver that reflects the latest developments in digital technology, coupled with an advanced Wadley-loop circuit design.

Despite this, I was disappointed by a low level audio hum present at the speaker while listening at minimum volume settings. Since most of my listening takes place at these low levels of Audio output, and since there was no defect in the circuitry, I felt compelled to correct this irritable problem.

After explaining the problem to a friend, he suggested that I try inserting a "pad" between the audio output and the speaker, as illustrated below:



R1 = 4 ohms rated at 5 W R2 = 40 ohms rated at 5 W (Ohmite Wire-wound)

The 'pad' shown above consists of two resistors coupled to the output of the receiver. R1 is connected in parallel with the audio output of the receiver, while R2 is connected in series with one side of R1 and one leg of the speaker. This small circuit creates an audio output that is split between a shunt resistor (R1) and a load resistor (R2), which is capable of 'padding' the annoying audio hum I encountered, and thereby reducing it to an inaudible level.

Hookup is quite simple. First remove the cabinet of the FRG-7000, and be sure to keep those small cabinet screws in a safe place, as they are easily lost! Next, tilt the receiver chassis upright, keeping the speaker nearest the table, with the bottom side of the chassis facing you. Now there is access to the speaker and audio output cable. This cable is a two-wire brown cord, terminating in a white and black lead soldered to the speaker. Desolder both these wires from the speaker lugs, and insert the two resistors as shown above. Two important tips are suggested here: (1) be sure the receiver is unplugged and (2) connect all wires and resistors before soldering. This allows you to position leads and parts as desired, away from other components. Make sure they do not come in contact with other leads or ground against the chassis or outer case. Sufficient room is provided to neatly insert these two resistors. I suggest you use the cylindrical type Oh mite wire wound resistors rated at 5 watts. These resistors fit inside nicely.

After all connections are made and carefully soldered with a 25 watt pencil-type soldering iron, you may test the receiver before inserting it back into the outer case. Be careful of what you touch, since many hot leads are exposed! You are merely spottesting your modifications at this point. If all is well, encase the chassis and replace the case screws carefully. Now hook up your antenna and observe the results. You should be very pleased at its performance and the small cost that went into making it that way!

THE FRG-7000 -- USER COMMENTS

Harry L. Hartsell, Lompoc, CA.-- "I read with interest the FRG-7000 user review and suggested modifications by Robert Rankin in the Feb. 79 FRENDX. I have just received a new FRG-7000, modified by Gilfer Associates. Total cost, including shipping, was \$641.44.

Gilfer modified it by adding a 4 kHz filter. They also redid the mode switch section of the front panel. The LSB-CW and USB positions are the same as before. The original AM now reads AM-wide. A new AM-narrow position is where the AM-ANL used to be. The ANL has been retained and is operated by a switch on the back.

If you are listening to music and switch from AM-wide to AM-narrow, it still sounds good--about like you had turned the tone control down to its lowest position--and adjacent channel interference is pretty well cut down. If you are listening to SSB, you can easily "fine tune" the last kHz with the main tuning knob, so that you don't often need to use the regular fine tuning knob.

Mr. Rankin said it right when he said this receiver was a "dream" to operate. And the digital readout seems to give me a finer touch than I could attain with my old (unmodified) FRG-7.

Ed Insinger, who wrote the earlier article on modifying the FRG-7000 audio, mentions that he compared his Gilfer modified 7000 against a Collins 2.9 kHz mechanical filter (presumably in a FRG-7) and decided that he was "inclined strongly to favor the ceramic over the mechanical. Why? First and foremost, audio intelligibility is far superior on the ceramic, second, the mechanical is too expensive. Just not worth it to me when the ceramic will perform that well, and it does."

Ed also uses a 3 wire line cord with bypass capacitors and resistors across both hot legs to reduce line QRN. He mentions that he too did not like having a clock that could not be turned off and often pulls the plug.

Editors Note: When I compared the 2.9 kHz mechanical added to a FRG-7000 against the 2.4 stock ceramic used in the AM mode, I found a slight audio advantage to the mechanical because of its wider nose, but no real difference in selectivity.

Don Dickey, Minneapolis MN, also wrote about his new Gilfer modified FRG-7000. He thinks it is as good as the other receivers he has (RF-4800, Collins 5102, Drake SPR-4, SW4A, SX-100). He also appreciates the good service given by Gilfer Associates. Leibschen thinks it is great too.

Solar Eclipse

DXING DURING THE SOLAR ECLIPSE by Robert Fraser, P. O. Box 501 Cohasset, MA 02025

Keeping in mind Glen Hauser's mention of possible night-time DX reception during the solar eclipse of 26 February 1979 that he made in this Listeners Notebook section of the February FRENDX, I fired up my Barlow Wadley XCR-30 during my lunch time. All I have for an antenna is its 1 metre vertical whip. I had only the period of 1715-1749 GMT to really listen which was the last half of the eclipse. But I did manage to catch some quick time periods one and two hours later to compare signals.

Primarily, I listened to the two WWV frequencies of 5 MHz and 20 MHz. I never got any reception of the 5 MHz transmission, but there was an excellent signal on 20 MHz. The only change I noticed was a sudden drop from excellent to fair on 20 MHz around 1717 GMT which I presume was due to the eclipse. By 1720 GMT, the signal was back up to its former strength.

The other two WWV frequencies received were 15 MHz with a fair signal and 10 MHz with a poor signal. Both remained unchanged. Moving to 49 metres: reception of CFCX on 6005 kHz was good at 1740 and was at the same level at 1840 and 2030 GMT checks. CFRX on 6070 kHz was poor at 1740 GMT, gone by 1840, but back and very poor by 2030. CHNX on 6130 kHz was very good at 1740, almost gone at 1840, and with a fair signal by 2030 GMT. By this time, 2030 GMT, a number of European transmissions were beginning to be picked up.

Reception of New York VOLMET Aeradio on 3001 kHz was poor at 1745 GMT, was improved at 1840, but had gone back to poor by 2030 GMT. The other frequencies: 5652 kHz had a fair signal at 8868 kHz had a good signal - both remained unchanged.

I even tried the mediumwave and some of the powerful distant AM stations, especially WQXR, New York on 1560 kHz. Lately, it has been received hereabouts with a good signal to 10:30 and 11:00 am EST, but I had no luck.

In the other direction, France was loud on 21705 kHz at 1830, but the BBC on 21710 had already signed off. Some Soviet stations between 12.0 and 12.1 MHz could be received with fair to good signals, but nothing I would call spectacular. I never got any overseas stations below 31 metres and these 9 MHz band transmissions were as good as the day before.

I noted the hams tried the lower frequencies. 40 metres was very busy in the 1815–1845 GMT time period, but 80 metres was quiet until about 1840 when a couple locals came on. They made contact with other stations but I didn't remain with them. While I didn't try the higher frequencies until 1945 GMT, I found both 10 and 15 metres busy at that time. I didn't bother with the CB band as this is always busy regardless.

The WWV propagation broadcast at 1818 GMT gave the solar flux at 169, the K-index as 4, and the geomagnetic field as moderately active. At this same time, New England was experiencing a snow/sleet/rain storm from a northeast gale dying somewheres east of Philadelphia. I have never determined whether a weather front does affect radio propagation.

All in all, and with the exception of the short drop in signal strength of WWV on 20 MHz, I felt the eclipse was a disappointment, propagationally speaking.

BRASIL

RADIO CLUBE DE PERNAMBUCO AND RADIO JORNAL DO COMERCIO

Since 1971, when I had the thrill of hearing and QSLing my first Brasilian station, I have been on the look out for other Brasilians, both to log and QSL. There must be other members who share this interest in Brasil, but I wonder if we all appreciate the history and technical complexities that comprise some of these stations? Take for example Radio Clube de Pernambuco and Radio Jornal do Comercio, two stations located in Recife, a city on the northeast coast of Brasil.

When you tune in Radio Clube de Pernambuco, do you realize you are hearing a bit of Brasilian history? For it was on 17 October 1923 that this station went on the air, the first one in Brasil. Today it operates on mediumwave (720 kHz) with a PEB made transmitter via a omnidirectional antenna, with a standby one kW PEB transmitter. In the 49 metre band (6015 kHz) the station uses a CACIQUE Transmitter that is 40 years old and still going strong. In the 25 metre band (11865 kHz) there is a one kW transmitter that was made by the technical staff at the station sometime around 1949. Both these shortwave frequencies use a DELTA half-wave dipole antenna.

Radio Jornal do Comercio is a more complex station, with a total of eight MARCONI transmitters. Mediumwave (780 kHz) is presently on the air 24 hours a day and has a 5 kW back-up transmitter. The shortwave frequencies are in the 19 metre band (15145 kHz) and 49 metre band (6085 kHz). The station's program format consists of music, news, and major sports events within Brasil (usually futebol).

Radio Jornal do Comercio has two FM transmitters that establish a communications link between the studio building and the "Palace of Radio" where the transmitters are located. The station also has two mobile FM transmitters which are capable of sending a signal back to the studio. Because of this versatile system the station can transmit three different programs over three different frequencies at the same time. Added to this equipment is a unique feature, reportedly the only one in South America. The eight transmitting towers are all illuminated automatically by a system of photoelectric cells.

It is my hope that this article has aroused your interest and will motivate you to It is my nope that this article has aroused your interest and will motivate you to try tuning in to these stations. If so, please check the recent log report sections to find out when is the best time for reception in your area. If you should hear these stations and wish a confirmation (QSL), let me offer a few suggestions based upon personal experience. I have found I have more success if I send my reception report directly to an individual at the station. That is one reason why Sam Barto's "QSL Report" is so outstanding. It shows who the verification signer is. With this in mind, you might try a reception report for Radio Clube de Pernambuco, in English, directly to: Edson Montenegro, Cruz Cabugă 394, Recife, PE, CEP50.000, BRASIL. Senhor Montenegro was kind enough to send me a full data letter and has a good command of English. Another engineer at the station is Alberto Moreira, who is a radio amateur (PY 7 DN). I do not know Senhor Moreira's ability with English, so it would be best to write him in Portuguese.

For Radio Jornal do Comercio, send your reception report in English directly to: Arthur S. Miranda, Caixa Postal 1332, Recife, PE., CEP-50.000, BRASIL. I have found Senhor Miranda to be an excellent verifier. He is the chief engineer for the station's transmitters and is also a radio amateur (PY 7 DT). Arthur's wife is a collector of post cards and I am sure they would both be most appreciative of any local post cards received along with your report.

IMPROVE YOUR DX TAPES WITH A QF-1, by Syd Osterman, Toronto, Ont. I use a number of addon gadgets in my DXing, including a QF-1 Audio Filter. However, I think that my method of on gaugets in my baing, including a gr-1 audio filter. However, I think that my method of using this marginally effective piece of gear differs somewhat from that normally mentioned. My QF-1 is used to remove hets, reduce static, or peak a signal that I have <u>already taped</u> and cannot read to my satisfaction. In other words, the output of my tape recorder (cassette) is fed through the QF-1 and, while listening on phones or speaker, I can, at my leasure, attempt to improve DX signals taped at other less convenient times. In this way I eliminate the possibility of chopping out a vital ID or other relevant speech while fiddling and fumbling with the Filter on a live transmission. Also, I can replay the tape as often as required to obtain the best result. If your receiver is tuned to make the most of a poor signal prior to taping, the use of an Audio Filter after the tape is made will often help to interpret those few vital words needed for an ID.

RETURN OF BRAZIL from Brett Saylor, Altoona, PA. Radio Nacional of Brasilia, Brazil is back with its international service in English. They are now conducting a 90-day experimental broadcast on 15280 kHz from 0200-0255 GMT, playing Portuguese and Brazilian music and with 3 to 4 minuite spots on different aspects of Brazil such as the weather, economics, farming, and so on. The announcer, John Morris, talked about the international services two year absence from the air, though they didn't say why they had been gone or why they were now back. But he did encourage listeners to write giving the address: Radio Bras (network name) c/o International Correspondence Service, Post Office Box 040340, Ed. Venancio 2000, 1st Floor, Postal Code 70323, Brasilia, Federal District, Brazil. Write and support their return!

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC Some news obtained during a week's visit the third week of March--(see also FUTURE PLANS)--La Voz del Paragrayo has been off the air several years, because it was re fused permission to operate on MM, and couldn't make it on SW only. It operated out of a Puerto Rican club. I was told the name came from a freighter ship, tho the dictionary says the name means either a parrot, or a red fish full of venomous prickles. La Romana's other SW stn is also off the air because it's doing OK on MW and the SW was an unnecessary expense. In Puerto Plata, La Voz de la Libertad MW is off freq to about 1244, and produced strong harmonics (locally) on 4976 and 6219, so the latter when occasionally heard, is certainly a 5th harmonic rather than a variant of 6190, which is off the air. In Santiago, R. Exitos has colorful new AM & FM studios and the manager isn't interested in bothering with SW anymore. R. Norte there appears to be active on SW only certain hours--nighttime. In Santo Domingo, In Voz de las Fuerras Armadas is temporarily off SW because tubes had to be borrowed for a new AM station elsewhere in the country. Due to frequent power failures during a drought causing hydroelectric shortage (a blackout occurred during my visit), stn is looking into installing its own generator within the military compound it inhabits. I was told that as a military activity it can obtain equipment more easily than government or commercial stations. LVFA seems to be enthusiastic about reception reports, and prefers taped reports. R. Comercial's 800-watt SW xmtr gave out, but a new 5 kW unit is on order and should be on in April. RTYD's 5967 and 9505 xmtrs are at different sites, one reason, perhaps, why they are not always on the air at the same time. R. Mil receives lots of reception reports, mostly in English, so they've had to get someone who speaks English to answer them. The only D.R. station I saw with a real newsroom and people working in it. Thx to Teo Veras for transport!

I also had the great pleasure of meeting Rudy Espinal just before his departure for a new 2-year-contract advertising job in Caracas. He was quite pleased and proud to have been invited to the 1979 ANARC Convention and is looking forward to attending. This received quite a bit of coverage in the local press, and really lifted Rudy's spirits after several difficult months following the Clarin cutback. But he's been busy in an advertising business, and as MC of Dominican culture shows at a resort hotel, and carries a pocket pager. One of his regrets is that following numerous delays in getting QSL cards designed and printed, it was not possible to answer all the thousands of reception reports before Clarin's international service came to an end. He really got a charge out of "This is Santo Domingo" and hopes to resume it one day on some station, even if it has to be called "This is Caracas". Rudy is also the president of the Circulo de Locutores Dominicanos: it strives to upgrade the quality of radio announcing in the country, and ... receives public attention on April 18, "Dia de Locutores" More about this in the April REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING (gh)

GRENADA 21/3 at 0100 on 15105 I...tuned in the voice of Herbert W. Armstrong. I thought at first WINB had changed from 15145. But the sermon abruptly ended and I heard "This is Radio Free Grenada -- The Voice of Revolution" followed by speeches from people of the new government -- lasted well past 0300 (Arthur S. Getzel, NY) RFG heard 14/3 with cricket commentary, interrupted by RFG ID at 2045 (Syd Osterman, Toronto, Ont.) In New York, ex-Prime Minister Sir Eric Gairy told AP 13/3 that he had not been overthrown and the uprising was limited to the takeover of the radio station by 'a small group of communists'. Mozambique ch & from Maputo now on 6005 ex-6115 (Richard Ginbey, RSA, SCDX 20/2) "A" uses 6000 ex-6115, and 4855 occasionally, but always 4855 for Voice of Zimbabwe. Most RM freqs still drifting all over the dial (DSWCI Mar SW News)

NETHERLANDS ANTILLES Ever wonder how RN-Bonaire gets such good quality out of a submarine cable feed from Hilversum (which is in regular use rather than satellite) compared to BBC's crummy audio cable fed out of Sackville? At this stage RDP does not have the resources to pay Feb staff salaries. RDP has a staff of about 2,500, of whom 53 are on short-term contracts. The org. employs three orchestras and is the majority shareholder in a recording company. RDP also runs a farm on land occupied by the Porto Alto xmtr and a fishing company in the Algarve. All are loss-making concerns. Its only sources of revenue are ads and license fees, which are a veritable drop in the ocean. Ad rates are out of date, having been fixed in 1976 but licence fees are greater problem since they are collected by Portugal's 212 regional electric companies, great majority of which do not collect the fees and some even refuse to do so. Restruxuring of RDP, currently underway, is bound to show an excess of personnel, and it is planned to dispose of all RDP concerns not directly related to BC. The Committee intends to ask the Secretariat of State for Culture for help in running its three orchestras and to approach the Ministry of Foreign Affairs with a view to securing financial help for its international SW pgms (BBC MS 22/2) Council of Ministers approved a resolution declaring RDP in a "difficult economic situation" with all the legal consequences that implies (BBC MS 8/3) RDP hrd on 23800 31/3 at 1625, fado; not on fund. 11800 (gh, Dom. Last time it was no problem to find out stations' powers, but now they seem to be 'state secrets', and each station believes it is actually operating on its exact assigned frequency. Kulmis, Voice of the Front for the Redemption of Somalia, via V. of Revolutionary Ethiopia xmtrs, first noted 8/2 on 9590 1900-2000 with inaugural broadcast, claimed to be mobile; called for holy war against regime of the "anti-Islam gangsters" of Siyad Barreh (BBC MS 15/2) As of 21/2 retimed to 1800-1900 and said was also on 4lm (BBC MS 22/2) 9595 and 7235 (BBCMS 1/3) 14/3 claimed it was being jammed by Somali govt and said would vary plus/minus 5 kHz (BBC MS 22/3) Operated by the Front de Salut Somalien; announcer is Mustafa Haaji Nuur, former R. Mogadishu announcer (Le Monde, via Bernard Chenal, France, SCDX 6/3)

Revolutionary Voice of Zimbabwe was anno'd by VORE to be retimed as of 21/2 to 1900 instead of 1800, on 9615 (BBC MS 22/2) Coinciding with retiming of R. Kulmis, above (gh)

A Voz de Africa Livre via Rhodesia 1020 kHz 1630-1730 is now claimed by "Resistência Nacional Moçambicana". Its nominal hero is the assassinated first president of FRELIMO, Eduardo Mondlane, whose social aims it accuses the govt of having discarded (John Campbell, DSWCI SWN)

United Nations Anti-Apartheid Program On 10/2 FRCN Nigeria tests on 15120 included "UN Radio from Lagos" 0840-0855 in EG, 0855-0906 in Afrikaans. In a Cairo meeting 5/2 African liberation movement heads called for more broadcasts to SAf, and from closer sites. Possibilities of cooperation between UN and Egypt were also discussed (BBC MS 15/2)

Voice of the Malayan Revolution per anmt from 1/3 the 2200-2245 in Malay will switch from 31 to 19m. That is from 9620 to 15790. This probably applies to other xmsns too (BBC MS 1/3)

Voice of Democratic Kampuchea via R. Peking facilities, has some peculiarities in formati opening always accompanied by theme mx w/ID & sked anmt in the 2300, 0400, 1500 xmsns, but without ID or sked anmt in the 1200. The 0400 & 1200 close w/out any mx: 1500 closes with an instrumental version of National Anthem; 2300 choral NA. In the 1200 xmsn IDs are given in the course of the pgm (Isao Ugusa, NFEDXR 2/3)

Eight-One (std. Chinese: Ba Yi) On 10/3 V. of Vietnam DS claimed it had monitored a stn in China of this name at 1300 the day before in the 19m band. In this nxcast and in EG to SEAs, VOV stated that the stn operated by the Chinese PLA was broadcasting material opposed to China's actions regarding Vietnam. Despite a thorough search, the existence of Radio "8-1"—which means 1 August, the symbol of the PLA—has not been confirmed (BEC MS 15/3)

R. Voice of the Revolutionary Party for Reunification was hrd 15/2 on 4109 kHz at 1404 in EG twice concluding ID with location as "Seoul, South Korea". The first reference, to my knowledge, of its QTH as Seoul. Were we wrong in assuming it was in N. Korea? (George J. Poppin, San Francisco CA) Not necessarily: (gh)

<u>Congo-Brazzayille</u> and <u>Zambia</u> broadcasts of various liberation programmes for southern Africa now seem to have stopped (Vaclav Kořinek, RSA, Mar DSWCI SW News)

Liberation, 7425, appears to be somewhere in the SE USA in contrast to the Minnesota hotbed. "Guy Wire" indicates they may try some broadcasts to Line, latest 'sked' seems to be GMT Sun only from 0200 opening with variable speed music box "Oh, What a Beautiful Morning". Offering pennants first for a financial contribution; then for those sending in a taped reception report via S. David Klein, 1225 S.W. 1 Ave , Apt. 401, Gainesville FL 32601 (gh)

Voice of the Voyageur is apparently off for good, since the FCC is now taking actions to revoke Mike Martin's General Ham and Radiotelephone operator's licenses (Steven Shaffer, IN, 18 /3) Martin is also allegedly under prosecution for 'blue-boxing' the phone co (CMS Telegram)

<u>Voice of Yenus</u> Scott called me 2/3 and tried a test on 6990, not audible. Pls call again (Dave Twiggs, Bristol CT)Sun 4/3 on 21510 USB 2125-2147*1 wants to use 21 MHz more often Pls call again (Gerry Bishop, PA) a.k.a. "Voice of the Northern Prairie", hrd 15/2 0230 on 7465 USB, 19/2 with tape of Hindenburg disaster, very good on 7460 USB, 25/2 0245 on 21510 SSB to west coast w/S2 but readable signal. "Fred Charles" of the FCC called in early March, waking me up at midnight. Said they had just caught YOV and wanted to know what I had to do with them. It seems my name was in their log book. In an ominous voice he added "They'll never broadcast again." (Fred Schumacher, Kindred ND) That sounds like a phoney call, not from the FCC; and I've had a report that YOV was heard again on 21/3. An address is via Darren Leno, 309 Valley Ave., Morehead MN 56560 (gh)

"KDHF" or its phonetic equivalent finally an ID caught from the pirate on 6420a, 8/3 0702* after a long string of various types of mx. He has been heard sporadically here with good signals. So. Cal. DXers seem to think he is there judging from strength (Bill Harms, UT) "KVHF" hrd on 6420 GMT Sat 17/3 0410 "From coast to coast this is KVHF" and "When the hits come out in the evening, this is KVHF". Hrd twice before with no ID, both times on a weekend --and at 0541* no anat (Rick Novak, Walnut Creek CA) See also MEXICO, LN-8 April

"KDOR" 830, Los Angeles. I've had an unconfirmed report that this has been busted -- and that it was a pirate like all the rest, despite claims of legitimacy (gh)

"WJAM" hrd on apx 28120 in ham band, pop mx, hard rock. Many anmts, power as 100 mw but sounded like much more; several Sats around 2300-0100; possibly in northern CT (D. Twiggs, CT)

"WEKG" (of Mar LN-10) is in Rockaway, Queens, near JFK airport, 40 W, operated by a husband and wife team, Chris Christy and Kevin Scott (Harry Helms, Dallas TX)

"WNCL" (of Mar LN-10) is not active; only operated briefly for tests; but there is a pirate active on Staten Island, WISI on 108.5 FM (Harry Helms, Dallas TX)

"MUFO" Rumors are rampant that a new pirate is planned for 9485 kHz (Harry Helms, Dallas TX)

NYC pirates were off the air in early March due to a NY Times article saying authorities were patrolling the city on weekends with DF gear in an attempt to locate unlicensed broadcasters. Sources within the NYC pirate scene promise the various stations will return as soon as the heat dies down a bit (Harry Helms, Dallas TX)

"WBLO" on 18/2 at 0945 on about 1640 kHz, heard this, weak but readable. Fellow was English, played space mx, talked about ham radio, but every other word he was saying was "---" (Don Coco, Rochester NH) The word is the call letters, backward, of a former projected Kansas City UHF TV station which Ed Shaw would take great exception to printing despite his naviness (gh)

"WCEN", manned by Colonia High School graduates in their mid-20s, in Woodbridge NJ, has gone off the air after nine years of operation. The FCC never busted them, but the 1000-watt hand built transmitter has been sold and is en route to licensed use in Haiti. There goes the 'evidence'. The station's enthusiastic audience will be missing "Wolfman Bruce", Rick (the mastermind), Lou and Bobby (from a much longer article in the Woodbridge News-Tribune, 6/12/ 78, via Allen L. Nissen, NRC DX News)

3850-3900 kHs activity has been increasing -- about 5 pirates heard in the last month. Most recently, rock mx around 0030 on 3865 GMT 19/2; no announcer hrd; sounded like coming from someplace in the Midwest (Roy Peterkofsky, Rockville MD)

R. Free Ontario Canada has never had many pirates despite the fact that the local authorities don't worry too much when one appears. "It cost us too much to run them in", per one official. Now, Tim Smith in Toronto has been hearing RFO on several fqs between 23290 and 23590, 5 watts, probably a modified CB rig, irregularly 2300-2345. Mostly mx with few anmts; they also give out a loop phone number (CMS Telegram 19/3)

Mi Amigo (Cf Mar LN-9) did not sink. After it was abandoned, crew returned the next day, got the pumps working again and got most of the water out; it had been up to the turntables in the studio, but not in the xmtr room. So they hope to get back on the air (DSWCI, RVDXW)

R. Condor International (cf Mar LN-9) testing to ENAm on 11463 4/2, 11/2, 18/2, seems every Sunday 1430-1700. QRA is 53, Charleston Rd, Dublin 6. 80 watts; IDs as "Irish Broadcasting Corporation" (Mike Barraclough, England, WDXC Mid-Monther) Also Sundays at 1000-1400 on 11463, and hrd around 2000 on 6240 (Michael Burden, RVDXW; Paul Karagianis, SCDX 6/3)

R. Enoch, The Voice of the People Against Marxism, attacks the British Labor Party and trade unions, hrd 11/2 around 1100 in <u>SSB</u> on 6246. Probably will be on one Sun morn monthly. It takes pains to point out that it opposes the extremist National Front (John Campbell, DSWCI)


