

# On To The Top by DON JENSEN

Part Three: HOW CAN I HEAR THOSE RARE STATIONS REPORTED BY THE EXPERIENCED DXers IN THE CLUB?

As suggested last month, knowledge is the key to success. DXers should concentrate on learning all they can about the major DX bands below about 7 MHz, starting with the best of the batch, 60 meters. Concentrate on learning patterns of propagation; ideally the theoretical hows and whys, but, minimally, observe and learn by actual on-the-bands observation.

This leads to the next point of concentration.

Concentrate on certain stations. One reason experienced listeners manage to hear the really rare ones is because having logged so many stations, they can concentrate efforts on a relatively few wanted targets. The less experienced, needing more stations, often take a scattergum, hit-or-miss approach.

For example, when a good opening occurs for Indonesia reception, the less experienced DXer might spend his time taking a log on RRI.
Ambon, 4845 kHz. He "needs" it and is pleased to receive a new one. But the veteran, already having logged and verified Ambon, concentrates on trying for the rarer Indonesians, say the local government station, Radio Pemerintah Daerah Kabuptan Poso:

SURABAY Ambon may be a good catch, a new logging for you. But wouldn't you be happier receiving Poso? It takes self discipline to pass up a sure Ambon for a chancier Poso, but the odds are that you'll next hear Ambon--and get a reportable logging--far sooner than another crack at Poso'.

The choice -- and naturally you won't always opt for the chance of hearing the ultra rare one over the sure bet logging--is tough for the less experienced listener. It means gambling on the possibility of a rare one and, for that day at least, passing by a medium-hard station already at hand. The veteran DXer who has already QSLed the easier station doesn't have to think twice before chasing the really rare outfits when top notch openings occur.

A word of caution here! Don't let the higher stakes -- giving up temporarily a sure catch for a gamble--color your judgment. Apply the same identification standards you always do. The weak muddle down in the mud may be Poso....or it may not. Your gamble may not pay off. But

if it does.

The decision as to when to play it safe and take the needed logging at hand, and when to gamble on the possible really rare one, is easier if you have a "want" list.

Rare is the experienced DXer who doesn't have his own list of most wanted stations. Check on what others are hearing, particularly the DXers you regard as "pros". Draw up a list of about 10 such stations that you really want to log. In any situation where you're faced with the decision to play it safe or gamble on the rare catch, let your want list establish the priority. Concentrate on these stations when conditions to a certain area of the world are most favorable. If you have no luck, then go after the secondary targets. When you knock one off, replace it on the list with one you badly want to hear.

Compile a "book" on each station on your want list. Minimum information, of course, is frequency and the time when it is being received in your area. Comb the bulliten for more tips; schedule, language used, etc. Is there an especially favorable time "window"? Perhaps the normally strong utility on the frequency is off Sundays. Can it be heard only on occasions after a powerful nearby station signs off? What type of programming would you expect to find? Country and western music? Outdated U.S. pops? A French newscast?

In short, get all the background data you can. It'll help if and when you actually do hear the station.

Pinally, tune as often as possible for your most wanted stations. Trying for it seven times a week is better than six, six a week is better than four. Make the odds work in your favor'.

However, it's sports coverage that sets Emisoras Gran Colombia above it's competition. Their slogan, "La Voz Deportiva de la Capital" is no boast. Under the play-by-play announcing of Jacinto "Copa Mundo" Landazuri, a veteran of Ecuadorian broadcasting, the Station covers a wide variety of sporting events. In fact, Emisoras Gran Colombia sponsors it's own 22km marathon each year, attracting some of Latin America's most talented athletes.

# Radio Peking officials enjoy Colorado visit

A small version of the Great Wall of China in Colorado?

Well, not exactly. But the chief of Radio Peking's news branch was surprised to find something in Colorado that reminded him of the Great Wall: Skyline Drive in Canon City.

Liu Erhuang is one of three Radio Peking representatives in Colorado Springs this week as part of a seven-week tour of the United States.

The trip, sponsored by the U.S. Information Agency, is port of an exchange program between the Voice of America and Radio

The trie put Colorado Springs on their itinarary because of a correspondence and friendship that began in early 1988.

Paul writes, "We were invited because we are listeners of Radio Peking, which wanted American input about it's programming. Underneath it all was a strong undercurrent to establish a bridge of communication and an eagerness to cultivate friendship and understanding with Americans".

"In our travels we were escorted by a representative of Radio Peking and an interpreter. In addition, our group was met in each of eight cities by officials of their local radio station".

Faul adds that their personal activities were unrestricted and he mingled freely with the public. Many spoke English and, as he was told, they keep current by listening to The Voice of America and the BBC. Paul was impressed by their quick perception of the ideas he expressed in English.

# IT SOUNDS TO ME!

THE STATE OF THE ART by John Noritz Jr.

1983. A new year. Where does the hobby lie? While much has been done in the last couple of years to bring together the dxing and SWLing group, there still remains many differences between the two. These differences are usually the things that stand out front and that are continually talked about in hobby publications. But, much exists in common between the two groups. Our common bonds in the same hobby are rarely, if ever discussed. The dxer was, and still remains the original program listener. It remains the dxer who digs heavily into the music and culture of the station and country that he listens to. It goes without saying that the SWL is also program oriented, but basically toward a major international broadcaster. Still the similarity is there. But, he is also a dxer of sorts, finding new frequencies, new broadcasting times, new programs.

A simplistic view? Perhaps so, but it is still very much to the point. We all have much in common, and the idea of this column will be to bring the groups together in a way that will be enjoyed and contributed to by both. Hopefully, this will be for the benefit of our hobby and the stations we listen to.

But, what of the state of the art? From an equipment stand point we have entered the computer age. Radios and computers have and will continue to merge in even larger ways in coming years than in the last few. The next ten years in this hobby. Will see clubs owning computers, and indeed, will see computer log listings, and computerized bulletins. Rock has hit the major broadcaster. More than any other single force rock will be the medium of the new major commercial broadcaster. WRNO and KYOI are the forerumners of this trend. Political persuasion and national philosophy continue to dominate the established major broadcasters. Then, there are those who march to the beat of a different drum. The Clandestimes have also come of age.

What stake do we as hobbyists have in all of this? Of course, ours is only a hobby. But, more than any other, our hobby is truly immersed in the events and philosophies of the real world. The basic instincts remain the same. The guy who first heard KDKA on his radio many years ago, and the guy who logs Falklands today still get the same feeling of excitement and accomplishment. But, the hobbyist has become sophisticated. We now see dxers reporting complete ID texts for Latins and Indonesians. It is no longer "in" to just say you heard an ID, you should report that ID. Dxers have gotten into the music of Latin America and the historical perspective of those countries in such detail during the past five years or so. Dxers have become specialists. The SWL is also more aware of what he listens to, and writes to specialists. The SWL is also more aware of what he listens to, and writes to specialists bulletins about program content. He is rightfully critical of things he hears on the radio. Also, both groups are keenly aware of the fact that the bands are crowded, that power remains supreme, and that something should be done to bring some logical peace to the situation on the bands, especially above 6200 KHz.

What can we do together? Better, what should we do together? As hobbyists in the coming years we must reach together for the common ground that exists between us all and attempt to meld that into a force that has some say about what we listen to on the shortwave bands, be it DX or SM. We must strive together to clean the bands of power pollution and piggy-back broadcasting. We should and must be critical of trends that do not benefit us. The tropical bands must be protected, not so much for the darr as for the purity of those who seek to reach to the people in the heartlands. Confusion must no longer be the norm on the international bands. We should even delve into the force of religion on the radio and the force of politics on the radio. Third world broadcasting must be allowed to develop naturally and on its own, not with the influence and money of another country, or corporation behind it.

We should speak out for the right of broadcasters everwhere to speak the truth, not the philosophy of the ruling body. This applies not only to the meager miner's station in Bolivia, but also to the powerful Voice of America. But, we must also speak against our stations moralizing to us. We want to hear about America, the Soviet Union, Germany, Ingland, and other countries. What we don't need or want are the "facts" as seen by the various ruling political bodies of such countries. We don't need the neconservative morality of certain groups,or the trite comments about human rights broadcast over Radio Moscow. Radio is for the public consumption, and it should, to a large part, pay attention to that same public, not dictate to them. Culture, history, music and entertainment. Willis Conover, BEC Rock Specials, As it Happens, these are instances of radio's finest moments.

#### IT SOUNDS TO ME (comtod)

Yes, as different groups in the same hobby we do have much in common. Let us attempt to work together in these pages to not only better our hobby, but the world and the people we listen to as well. Of course there are different points of view, of course things are not as simple as I have presented them. But, the merging for the common good must start somewhere. Let that place be in the pages of "It Sounds To Me".

In coming months we shall delve into politics and religion on the radio. We shall look at rock on the radio. Is it good or is it bad? We shall look into philosophies of broadcasters, and we shall also examine ourselves. I look forward to hearing from many of you.

Our only criteria is that you do not attack personally a fellow hobbyist. His ideas are open to attack, but not him personally. That is it. Say what you might, in a logical and intelligent fashion. Finally, it should also always be noted that the opinions that will be presented in "It Sounds to Me" are those of the individual expressing them, and not necessarily the policy of NASWA and its governing body as a hobby publication.

I want to publicly thank my good friend John for assuming the rather tough task of editing "It Sounds To Me". Not many can do it. In fact, I thought of shelving the column for awhile, at least until I could find the right person to handle it...one with a strong hobby background, especially in NASWA, and who is articulate. John qualifies on all counts. Those who are fortunate enough to know him can attest to the fact that he has some very compelling views on our hobby, as you'll surely discover in the coming months. In light of the above comments, I would like to weave a yarn concerning my entry into collection and restoration; and, ultimately, my request to certain persons to allow me a bit of space to share these avocations with you. Perhaps this may strike a responsive chord. I hope so.

It should be no secret that I have an affection for history. of us who deal in the physical sciences would be lost if every generation had to rediscover fire and the wheel. Metaphysicists among us find great solsce and direction from the musings of those long departed. And, of course, our hobby is sufficiently oriented to the physical sciences and humanities

to benefit from similar perspectives.

My own story might well be entitled from "Sears to Silver-Marshall". Having need of a radio for the for-site, I went to the local Sears store. The run-of-the-mill AM-FM that I was searching for turned out to be a multi-band portable that was then on closeout sale. The discovery of (God forbid) Moscow and the BBC impressed me. The vast amount of fare engrossed me. somewhere along the line, I was bitten (rather a bit harshly) by the DX bug. QSL cards began to turn up in my mail with interesting pamphlets and outright propagands. (I majored in poli-sci.) Onfortunately, my portable had a few shortcomings. Sensitivity and selectivity were rather high on this list.

The deluge of equipment pamphlets and spec sheets began to outstrip the number of QSLs taking residence in my daily mail drop. The sight of this dezzling receiver, and that immensely professional looking one, was only equal-

ed by the heavyweight price tags attached to them.

It was at this point that I began to discover the intrinsic worth of some of the old workhorses. Jim Freds Antique Radio Corner column in the (now deceased) "Elementary Electronics" magazine was a great help in entering the hobby of old radio. Organizations such as the Antique Wireless Association and the Antique Radio Club of America foster a fraterity of both collectors and restorers. These people are an extremely valuable group of man and women who are presently in the process of preserving and passing-on a heritage of early technology. They are sincere; and, generally, they are very friendly. Jim Fred is but one of them.

The next step in my new hobby was the acquisition of vintage gear. The older receivers are electronically similar to modern gear in a circuit-for-circuit comparison. They merely seigh about five times more. Boat anchors! But, some of those bost suchors are comparable only to modern sets costing (quite literally) thousands of dollars. The object is to learn the particulars of certain sets, and then to take oneself to task in their location and acquisition. Once again, the club contacts are very important.

My search led ma through the flee markets and garage sales; it

took me through suctions; and, it made me carefully examine the went ade and trading newspapers. Ever so slowly, I began to acquire both communications gear and some of the most beautiful home furnishings ever produced. These investments (for that is what they really are) are primarily historical and sesthatic. You see, when I began to collect the military hardware for DKing, I fell in love with the old walnut wonders.

Some of us have a need to work with our hands. The next logical step is the study of electronics and the electronic restoration of these old friends. I am firmly of the belief that education must be based an a progression from simple principles to succeedingly more complex units. I began at the crystal set and wave traps. Tuned radio frequency receivers came next. Then I moved on to the "gennies" and "hets". I learned of the developments in vacuum tubes. And then they rediscovered the wheel that I was referring to earlier. We want back to the little crystal. Only this time it was silicon, and not galens.
While gaining this knowledge, I became enthralled with the fact

that the circuits are essentially identical whether they are composed of the old "walves", or of modern semiconductors. The thrill of taking an orphan radio like my Atwater Kent Model 35 and fixing the years of disrepair, then mulling in stations from all over the mid-west, was extremely satisfying. A clean-out here and an RF alignment there, and pretty soon I had a stable of

successes.

Somewhere along the line, I felt that something was missing in FRENDE. I wanted to see radio history in it. I felt that this was a part of our heritage every bit as important as Efrem Maxim was to our cousins in the ham bands. The concept seemed to work well with SWC. Hence, I worked up my courage as a nowice SWL/DEEr and volunteered to Edil Oliver.

up my courage as a nowice SML/DKer and volunteered to Bill Oliver.

Somewhat to my surprise, the answer was posted that inseed this
was a workable idea. I was handed over to john-john, and the rest is in the
library on the shelf of your shack. The ammipotent editor and publisher
turned out to be really great guys. We, and you; us; we make a team.

As I said at the outset, I requested your leave to envoke your support... your teamsork. Some of us are date banks and others are story tellers. Many of us are so busy that we can hardly get to the set anymore. A
good many of us virtually live on the bands. I, personally, am a busy, story.

teller. But together, we melt together to form a pretty well ciled machine.

This years has just about run out. But, I'd like to click the
needles one last time. Comsider yourself. Examine your interests and your
strengths. Then, write to somebody.



WHEN IT RAINS, IT POURS!! Introducing from Kenwood. the new R-2000. This entry is no doubt entered to be in competition with the new ICOM R-70 also just ap-The features are similar and I will elaborate on them.



The R-2000 is an all-mode SSB, CW, AM, and FM receiver that covers 150 KHz to 30 MHz in thirty bands. Like the ICOM, microprocessor controlled operating features provide some advantages only available on much more expensive sets.

Key features digital VFO's and ten memories (compared to only two for the ICOM), and a scanning ability both for memories or between two frequencies.. just like a CB or police scanner. At right are some of the more important specifications, and comments that this writer feels are important to observe.

More specific information on the R-2000 is available from authorized dealers. You might also want to write Trio-Kenwood 1111 West Walnut Street, Compton, Ca., 90220.

Like the ICOM R-70, optional accessories are necessary for making the receiver operable on DC source, but a competent technician can accomplish this as well.

One of the ICOM features NOT found in the R-2000 is a true passband twining, or a notch filter. Perhaps users will feel the advantage of ten memories and more RF attenuation control of the R-2000 are a comparable trade-off.

What's more, the ICOM selectivity of 6 KHz RF Attenuation: In several 10 dB is attrocious, and only marginally acceptable when judicious use with the passband includes an antenna fuse in case tuning it offers is employed, giving 3 KHz. of large incoming current.

Selectivity: 6 KHz wide or 2.7 KHz narrow. This is better than the R-70 offers. What's more, even the 2.7 figure can be improved with use of standard filters available. Not so the ICOM.

Ten Memories: Each one of these can hold a catch by mere push of a AND, they each can be buttom. tuned just like a separate radio... a fine advantage over the ICOM.

Lithium Cell Back-up: Your memory stays alive even when you turn off the power. Uses little power, will last 4-5 years. Replaceable easy.



Squelch Circuit: Like the ICOM. stays quiet until a station is on the air. Useful for keeping a low noise background.

#### REBROADCASTING PROJECT FOR REMOTE LISTENING ON A PORTABLE RADIO

Sometimes, hobbyists might like to listen to their favorite shortwave program or even a cassette tape while puttering around the house, but cannot very well take a cumbersome shortwave receiver or large cassette player around wherever they go. Even TV audio can be tuned remotely, by using your small portable radio. The project which follows requires a minimum of parts, but you might have to shop around or purchase special the crystal needed for the job. To use this gadget, merely plug your TV, Cassette, or receiver audio into the 8Z input, and then tune your portable radio to above 1600 KHz fee around-the-house wireless reception.



Careful examination of the schematic and the board layout will indicate where the various components are mounted. Resistors and Capacitors are indicated between which two holes they should be mounted in.


Parts Needed: 1 - 1610 KHz crystal (or any freq. above 1600 KHz that can still be tuned on your portable) Such crystals might be found in surplus houses, or Jan Crystals, for instance.

2N2222 NPN transistors - common as daylight
- 2KOhm to 8 Ohm audio(miniature) transformer.

1 - 1 milliHenry choke (L1)

1 - Cermet-type trimmer capacitor having 25pF range (10pf)
1 - 160 microHenry choke (or close)(Li)
And, other i watt resistors, 12volt capacitors as indicated





Construction Notes: All parts are located in their own spot on the board. Only one extra piece of wire is needed to jump from Point A to Point B. The Antenna output may be either a 3 or 4 foot piece of wire, or for best results (AND USE SAFETY AND CAUTION HERE, DON'T GET SHOCKED!!) install a much longer wire around the perimeter of your house, or in the attic. Other equipments found on the commercial market can inject such signals inte your house wiring for down-the-street ranges, but such application is both dangerous, and illegal, and I strictly caution against doing this.

One last note on use of chokes, etc. The final choke and its capacitor are matched to the crystal used. A 50 microHenry choke and a 300 pF capacitor would also give similar results. There are other combinations, too. If a higher freq. crystal were chosen, the combination would have to match it.

Essentially, all we are doing here is making a 1600 KHz oscillator, and modulating it with ordinary audio sounds thru the transformer. Can you think of other uses and variations for this gizmo?
