

(Saludos DXistas y radioventes: Welcome to another edition of Shortwave Center. Thanks for the nice comments on our first effort. Since we're limited to 11 pages this month (and have a good deal of excellent reterial on hand), we'll jump into it....

INTERVIEW

THE SHORTWAVE CENTER INTERVIEW: DAN FERGUSON

Dan Ferguson is no stranger to NASWA. Through the years, Dan has assumed a number of important editorial positions, often when NASWA's future looked bleak. We went to Dan to learn more about his approach to the hobby and his dedication to the quality and future of it....(JH)

<u>SWC:</u> You played a rather large role in NASWA's past, acting as publisher, editor, etc. How do you feel about the direction NASWA has taken?

 \underline{DP}_1 Obviously NASMA has experienced considerable growth since the days when I served in a "whatever needs to be done" capacity. There were problems attendant to that growth, perhaps enhanced by a sometimes tendency to glory in the numbers and to forget that NASMA became the elite of DX clubs because of the determination of thome in the club that what they would do they would do well. Generally I think a commitment to excellence exists, and that is gratifying. I would like to see more attention paid to the organization of FRENDX, with material appearing in sections designated for that particular type of material. It would make for easier reading of the builtetin, and certainly for easier future reference. That, together with a concentration on the stated areas of coverage of FRENDX --- shortwave broadcast stations --- would go far toward alleviating the recurring space allocation problems.

<u>SWC:</u> You've been credited with coining some of the popular catch-phrases in the hobby. The first is "List Logger". Do you feel the problem is still prevalent? Is there a solution?

<u>DF:</u> That's credit I don't deserve. The term has been around the hobby longer than I. I've harped on it on more than one occasion. All of us do what could be termed "list logging". Among the various lists I have floating around in my head, one includes the fact that BBC is heard on 6175 evenings to North America. Another includes a general knowledge of BBC programming. So, when I tune by 6175 and hear what I know to be standard BBC programming at 0200, I consult my "lists" and conclude that the station is BBC. If I want to listen to BBC I stay. Another example, it's easy enough to recognize certain HCJB announcers and "10" the station by reference to one's accumulated knowledge in the hobby. I don't believe I have ever said that one has to hear a station identify itself on the air in order to "10" the station. If I did say that, I was wrong. However, if I tune to 3330 kHz, hear something, consult WRTH, TBS, or one of the lists I publish myself, note a listing for R.Charcas in Bolivia and conclude I've heard that station, particularly since I've not heard it before, I've wasted my own time, and the time of anyone to whom I report the alleged logging. Actually, I don't know of instances quite so absurd. ... The problem lies not with the use of a list itself, but with the improper use of a list. Is it prevalent? I'd simply say the problem exists. I suspect the problem is linked to a phenomenon noted several years ago by one DXer -- we seem to occasionally get in our hobby people who expect to almost immediately be experts without ever taking the time and spending the time to develop the skills necessary to achieve such recognition. As the DXer observed, one does not purchase a camera for the first time and expect to be recognized as an expert photographer. One does not purchase a plano and expect

without years of practice to receive acclaim as a planist. Buying an automobile does not make one a skilled race driver and buying a receiver does not make him a top notch DXer. In part, the DXer must determine for himself that accuracy is something desirable and that he will strive to achieve it. In part, editors need to edit, rather than merely type. No one demands perfection, but those reading a DX bulletin expect generally to be able to place some reliance on the material therein. I don't know of a bulletin that has never in its history had any errors in it. The goal should be to keep errors out. But those that do get in should be corrected, gracefully, when discovered. For the new DXer and the old timer as well, I think Jun Jensen's "ON TO THE TOP" series is excellent reading.

<u>SWC:</u> The other phrase that comes to mind is "KPR" ("Kids Playing Radio"). Do you think that NASWA should take a blanket stand against publishing KPR/Pirate related material?

That's one for which I'd certainly like to be able to take credit. But, alas, DFI credit belongs to an FT participant who first used it. I believe, sometime last year. I've used it some in FT since then, and I suppose that's how I came to be credited with coining the phrase. Although some might argue, unsuccessfully, that the 'Kids Playing Radio" have some basis for existence in some countries where the "programming" they broadcast is unavailable from licensed broadcasters, certainly any attempt to apply such an argument to the North American situation, where the only thing often lacking is good music programming, is ludicrous. ... No, I don't think all "KPR" related material should be omitted from FRENDX. I think FRENDX should occasionally carry comments from the FCC concerning the very limited conditions under which unlicensed broadcasting is proper and the penalties attendant to conviction of unlicensed broadcasting outside these limitations. That would be on a subject that I don't think falls within the purview of NASHA's avoued limits of coverage, since I don't think one can successfully argue that the broadcasts are really intended for reception by the general public. Nevertheless, as a courtesy to those who might be tempted, publication of the FCC's views on the subject would not be inappropriate. More than that merely lends encourageent to a blight on broadcasting.

Another courtesy NAGMA should extend, in this instance to licensed broadcasters, is a harmonic radiation alert to MM stations whose harmonics are heard, so that they can determine and correct transmitter faults as quickly as possible. It would be a real service to the broadcasters and to the listening hobby.

SWC: A few years ago, Mass. DXer Jerry Berg wrote an article entitled, "In Defense of DXing". At the time, a lot of folks felt that it was a signal that serious DXing was dead. Do you think events have passed by the serious DXer by?

 \underline{DP}_{1} That depends on the DXer. I don't think serious DXers are any more prome to have events pass them by than those who have interests in other areas which are the subject of human curiousity. They may be a lot less prome thereto than those engaged in some areas of activity which might come to mind. I know "serious DXers" whose DXing activites have resulted in a far higher level of knowledge about the "third world" than would otherwise have been the case. And "serious DXing" can hardly be said to be dead when DX groups have to be careful not to get too large to function. No, you'll find serious DXers in every walk of life, frequently the elite of their profession, some actively involved in DX groups, some not.

. SWC: You publish a worksheet for serious DXers called "Pine Tuning". Now did you start FT and why? What would you say to those who feel that an "invitation only" type of publication restricts the free flow of DX information?

 $\underline{DP_1}$ I simply mailed issue M0 to a number of active DXers and invited them to participate in the exchange of DX information on a rather frequent basis. It's dome on a "time available" basis, so it gets delayed during those periods of time when work builds up and I have to work 60-70 or more hours a week. My goal is to get Fine Tuning in the mail weekly. So far that hasn't occurred, but I've averaged about 40 issues a year. ... I started it because I felt that there was a need for better coverage of the hobby (or sub-hobby, if you wish) than was being provided by other sources at the time: that serious SMBC DXers would be interested in participating in a group with the subject matter restricted to SMBC DXIng, where a concern for accuracy was expected; that a more frequent publication schedule than that of the larger clubs was necessary; that it could be of value to editors of loggings sections in other bulletins. Having published FRENDX I well knew the amount of time that would be required to publish a bulletin for a large group. I simply did not have THAT much time available. In order to assure that as many active serious DXers as possible

would have an opportunity to participate, it was obvious that participation had to be by invitation. I was not interested in serving those who like merely to collect bulletins. I think the claim that "invitation only" publications restrict the flow of DX information is usually repeated without sufficient knowledge on which to base any judgment. Many of the active reporters to the NASHA Log Report sections are participants in smaller, more frequent publications. Editors of columns in various monthly bulletins are participants in smaller, more frequent publications. Fine Tuning participants who are editors of columns in other publications are generally free to use material from Fine Tuning in their columns. Participation by editors in frequently published serious DX bulletins, rather than restricting the flow of information, actually enhances it, not only to the direct participants, but also through the larger bulletins to the entire DX hobby. The small, limited circulation bulletinstare merely an efficientamethod of correspondence among those participating. To assert that every such builtetin should be as widely circulated as FRENDX is as absurd as to assert that if you plan a weekend of DXing with a couple of DX friends you should invite 2000 people over for the weekend. One official of a group of clubs actually had the gall to propose something equivalent to that about 10 years ago, asserting that any gathering of DXers should be widely announced so that all who wished to do so could attend. It was never clear whether he expected the host to feed all who appeared. I once participated in a "round robin" of tape recorded "letters" among several DXers. Would those who criticize the existence of FT and similar builetins argue that the tape group should have expanded to accommodate all comers?

SWC: What do you think of current trends in the hobby?

<u>DPi</u> I believe I see a tendency for editors in all the major clubs to stay away from the "who am I to say he couldn't hear Reunion on 2446 at high noon in the midwestern US" attitude. That can only be good for credibility and for the encouragement of the development of necessary DXing skills in those new to to hobby. John Monitz noted in the February FRENDX that the hobblest has become more sophisticated, reporting full text IDs for many of the rarer stations. In recent years we have seen, among some, specialization in certain areas of DXing. All this has, I believe, contributed to the body of knowledge useful to the DXer, and to the health of serious DXing. It results from an approach that says, about any area of endeavor, "If I'm going to do this I'm going to give it the time and effort to do it correctly." Serious DXing, far from being dead, is growing.

I'm glad you didn't ask what I think of current trends in SV broadcasting, because I'd have to say that too many stations are broadcasting rock and I'd rather hear music. Wonder how that sounds to John-John?

<u>SWC:</u> Thank you, Dan, for what has to be one of SWC's best interviews ever. Your comments are truly "food for thought". Also, thanks to Stu Klein for his help and encouragement with this exclusive interview.

On To The Top by DON JENSEN

Part Four: HOW CAN I IDENTIFY THE RARE DX STATIONS?

OK, you've followed the various tips suggested earlier in this series. You've tuned a signal that may--or may not--be a real DX station. Now you've got to identify it.

This is where the going really gets tough. It's the test that separates the men from the boys, the place where DKing experience really counts.

The first case to consider, strange as it may seem, is just what constitutes an identification?

constitutes an identification? Identifying a station should be an easy thing, theoretically. Either yes or no. go or no-go? Fractically, though, station identification comes in varying degrees of certainty. Although this certainty spectrum is a continuum from total certainty about a station's identity to complete uncertainty, let's divide it into four bread brackets. <u>POSITIVE IDENTIFICATION</u>: You're 100 per cent sure of the station's identity because you heard the ID announced. There are other ways to positively identify a station, of course. For instance, if you hear "Moscow Mailbag" you don't need an ID to know you're tuned to Radio Moscow. Now all this is a station you're deallow with strong signal stationes

Now all this is a snap when you're dealing with strong signal stations broadcasting in English. But our topic is rare DX and identification of these outlets is harder because they're usually weaker, plagued with QRM and broadcast in languages other than English.

<u>TENTATIVE (or Probable) IDENTIFICATION</u>: No definite ID is heard, or if heard, not fully understood. But various clues in the programming, etc. lead you to believe strongly that you are hearing Station "X".

etc. lead you to believe strongly that you are hearing Station "X". <u>POSSIBLE IDENTIFICATION</u>, Again, no station identification heard, but some factors lead you to suspect you've logged Station "X". However, those factors might also apply to other stations. In short, your degree of certainty as to identity is rather low.

<u>UNIDENTIFIED</u>; Here you either have no idea, from announcements or program details, as to the identity, or you have a very low degree of certainty as to which of several--or many--possible stations you may be hearing.

Broadly speaking, a reception report is always justified when a station is positively ID'ed. A report is never justified with an unidentified station. In the mid-ranges of ID certainty, even experienced DXers differ as to when a reception report should be sent to a station. The following represents the author's viewpoint.

If you strongly believe, based on a number of factors I'll discuss in a later article, that you've heard a certain station, coupled with some pretty convincing program details, a report may be sent to the station on the strength of tentative identification. But that report should spell out that you didn't positively ID it. It should mention the reasons why you believe it to have been the station reported. And you should ask that it be verified only if the station authority is convinced it is correct.

Rarely should you report a station on the strength of a possible identification. A report seeking a verification is justified only when you've noted some especially unique factor that could apply only to the station in question. Example: You think your station possibly could be Station "X" and during the course of your logging, a transmitter problem knocks the station off the air at 1413 GMT. It is very likely that the station could determine the accuracy of your report on the strength of this detail.

The sensible rule of thumb to follow in most cases is report those stations which you know or strongly believe you logged. The burden should be on you, the DX'er. When in doubt, don't rely on the station's QSL to resolve those doubts.


LECTRONIC LESSONS: The Variable Capacitor

What does it do? What is meant by 365mmF when referring to variable capacitors? Tinkering hobbyists ask these same questions often enough to merit a general lesson to readers.

The variable capacitor takes several shapes, but it essentially is a stack of metal plates on a common rod which rotates and meshes with the plates of a fixed sort, all mounted within a metal frame. The movable plates are called the ROTOR, and fixed plates are called the STATOR. Each has a terminal for affixing a wire to it.

Variable capacitors come in all values and from micro-sizes like peas which are tuned with small screwdrivers...to large air-spaced monsters for use in tuning high voltage transmitters. Somewhere in between is the common table radio standard variable capacitor with two sets of plates within it. One set may be the common value of 365 mmF and the other set 140 mmF. Why there are two sets of these particular values have to do with the technical reasons why heterodyne receivers works, and that isn't necessary right here to explain it.

The story behind the use of 365 mmF as a standard is somewhat interesting. however. I don't know which came first, the capacitor value or frequency assignment, but it so happens that 365 mmF used with any inductor coil, or choke, will provide a 3:1 frequency response. That is..if your inductor response is 15 MHz, then the 365 mmF capacitor will permit that inductor to be tuned down to as low as 5 MHz. If the top end should be 1605 KHz, then the lower end will be 535 KHz. Recognize that spread? Of course, it is the



MW broadcast band. Some persons might remark that the frequency assignment actually is only 540 to 1600 KHz, which is true...if you do not consider the sideband spread...which is about 5 KHz each side of the carrier frequency. Why do you think stations are supposed to be 10 KHz apart in the U.S.? Well, so much for the capacitor story. Not many persons know about it.

'LECTRONIC LESSON" The Inductor Coil


Inductor coils, or chokes, are an equally important part of many hobby projects along with the vari-cap, since it must be used with a vari-cap to give correct frequency response. Keeping in mind the 3:1 ratio story, I am providing here a list of choke values and the frequency ranges they will provide.

Exact values are not necessary. Anything z can be used as long as the 3:1 spectrum allows your desired frequency to be covered.

The examples shown allows four (4) chokes to cover all of the hobby spectrum from Medium Wave up through 30 MHz.

CAPSULE COMMENTARY: Why A Radio Works Essentially, the inductive-capacitive resonance relationship is the basis for all shortwave receiver RF "front end" workings. The tuned frequency is fed through an amplifier stage, mixed with another frequency generated by the receiver circuit called the Local Oscillator or Variable Frequency Oscillator. While the operator tunes the RF up-frequency, the oscillator does likewise internally. As a result, the difference in separation is maintained something like 455 KHz at all times. It is this 455 KHz, or intermediate frequency (I.F.) that you read so much about. There are so many things we can do to the I.F. to make signals more readable. But, how can we hear 455 KHz with our ears, you ask? Well, another oscillator in the receiver generates a 455 KHz signal of its own. When this signal is superimposed on top of the I.F. signal from the mixer, the "455 KHz" part disappears, and we are left only with what we call the modulated audio output...the ordinary tones of voice and music we CAN hear. If this sound like an overly-simplified explanation of your radio, it ls...and, I apologize. But, you'd be surprised at how many persons now have a understanding (albeit basic) of how their radio works.

MEASURING AC CURRENT WITH AN AC VOLT-OHM-METER: is no big trick, but there is a simple way to accomplish it with the aid only of one resistor. Obtain a 1 Ohm resistor of heavy wattage capacity, the more precision the better. Insert the 1 Ohm resistor in series with one lead of the AC power line. Using your VOM, measure the voltage across the resistor, and then use Ohm's law to figure the current flow. <u>CAUTION</u>, use at least a 10 watt size resistor and never attempt to read current of equipment drawing more than about 3 amps.



As an example: To measure current being used by a common L20 watt light bulb. Insert the resistor and measure voltage across it. It should read something close to 1 volt. Ohm's Law states 1 Volt divided by 1 Ohm equals 1 Ampere. In this case also, 1 Voit multiplied by 1 Amp equals 1 Watt, so heat generated is well within the ability of the resistor to handle it. REMEMBER: Don't allow the wattage heat to exceed the capability of the resistor. In regard to the Feb. article about rediffusion of radio signals via portable radio for around-the-house use, Gary Pearce of Royal Oak, Michigan suggests that Radio Shacks \$7.95 wireless broadcaster kit can be substituted. Merely remove the microphone on the kit and feed your shortwave speaker leads (at lowered volume) into the broadcaster. The 10 foot antenna of the broadcaster will give adequate in-house use. Gary affixed additional line switch and 9V battery eliminator wall transformer. This may be the best after all.

Electronics Overseas Corp. Inc, 170 Cedar Avenue, Hawthorne, N.J. 07506 offers a portable active antenna for use indoors or outdoors in 3 models. Use indoors is governed by how much your room is shielded by metal frames of the building. Outdoor use is limited to length of unit from the receiver and condition of weather. Model 001 is AC powered (\$24), model 002 uses a wall transformer and has two output impedences (\$35), and model (03 (\$26) is like 001, but runs on 9V battery only for field use. INTERFERENCE FROM TV RECEIVERS (TVI)

All of us have experienced this distinct interference, some perhaps without recognizing it for what it was. The TV picture is swept horizontally by the electron beam 15,750 times per second, using a wave shape that is rich in harmonics...even as high as 30 MHz. If the TV set's horizontal oscillator radiates due to poor shielding or other reason, considerable interference to reception on shortwaves can be a headache for DXers. Current FCC rules require manufacturers to suppress this kind of radiation, but older sets may have had no such consideration. DXers find this interference as a loud buzz...buzz...buzz across their shortwave bands every 15.75 KHz.

Such radiation usually occurs in one of three ways: through the AC powerline, from the antenna system, or directly radiated from the picture tube area.

Interference from the AC power cord can often be reduced or eliminated by use of bypass capacitors or other filters at the point where the AC cord is affixed to the set. (See illustrations below)

Radiation from the antenna is usually suppressed by installing a "high-pass" filter on the receiver (your TV receiver) (See illustration below)

Radiation from the picture tube itself may require that the inside of the TV set be shield insulated in some safe manner. Some have had good luck by using aluminum foil affixed with "pliobond" type rubber cement. This is more than just common rubber cement. It is a very positive adhering substance that smells badly and holds hard.

Another radiation problem which might cause problems is the color subcarrier of 3.58 MHz, also rich in harmonics at the way up to 30 MHz. Fortunately, only the 41 meter band and the upper limit of the 16 meter band might be affected.

UNDERSTANDING POWER SUPPLIES

As you wander through your neighborhood auction or ham fest, you may come face-to-face with a piece of vintage gear that so totally distracts you hat it must be taken home. The following article is intended to assist you in understanding the power pack. These supplies are indispensable to convenient operation of your set. However, they are also the primary source of breakdowns and problems. Some of these problems can be so severe as to destroy other components and entire stages. A simple inspection using only a multimeter components to be your bet insurance. Cluminati, the second problem a multimeter can prove to be your best insurance. CAUTION: the common voltages and currents found in these receiver supplies can severely shock you! Nork inside the chassis with one hand only. If you have an isolation trans-former, use it to deny AC powerline shocks through ground.

POWER SUPPLY STACES The block diagram in Fig. #1 shows the primary components of a power supply. The transformer is used to convert the AC line voltage to any of several AC secondary voltages used for filaments and the hi,jn voltage "3" sup-ply. The "5" voltage supply is then fed to the rectifier for conversion to heavily rippled DC voltage. After having been rectified, the "3" supply must be filtered to remove the ripple pulses. This filter may be either capacitive or inductive in nature according to the first component to be mecontared upon leaving the rectifier stage. The final encountered upon leaving the rectifier stage. The final stage of the power supply is the voltage divider. These power resistors provide for a poorly regulated (relatively) source of different high voltages for use in the set.

TRANSFORMERS The transformer stage may be found in any of several configurations. The basic configuration consists of a 110 VAC primary coupled to several sec-andary windings for filamonts and high voltage. There are several variations which may be encountered within this general configuration. The schematic shown in Fig. # 2 shows a late twenties AC prototype that uses a ballast tube

to regulate the transformer stage. The ballast tube (inset) is composed of a standard tube base to which is mounted a thick mica sandwich that is used for nounting resistance wire coils (iron The ballast for a primary will drop the voltage across the primary alloy). to approximately 75 or 80 VAC.


to approximately 75 or 50 %AC. The primary may be fused. If it is, the correct rating for the fuse may be based upon a draw of the supply. Most of these early sets drew between 80 watts (0.66 Å) and 150 watts. The 500mma setting of your multimeter may be used to calculate the current of the high voltage secondary when it is insert-ed in series anywhere along the 3+ line. There are certain inductive losses in a transformer which require that the primary power consumption is greater

Hence, the fusing may be found from the following equation: $\underline{L} = W \sec x \ L_2 \le /120 \ VRC$; where I is the total primary current in amperes, Wsec is the power consumption of the secondary windings in watts multiplied by the inverse of the transformer efficiency (here 80%).

It is important to note that the total wattage of the secondaries requires calculating the number of tubes operated from each filement circuit multiplied by their filement current. Hence, according to Fig. # 2, if the "Rectifier" winding operates one type 30 at 5 volts/2 amps, the circuit uses 10 watts. The Hivolt winding supplies 550 volts at/.115 amps for a total of 61.25 watts. (Note; a tube manual is necessary to calculate the amount of current drawn by each and all of the tube plates and screen grids). The first filement winding operates (for instance) five type 27 amplifiers that each require a filement supply of 2.5 volts at 1.75 amps. The winding must then produce 2.5 volts at 5.75 amps for a total of 21.9 watts. Finally, the power amplifiers are operated from the second filement winding. If these are two type 15 tubes that require 2.5 volts at 1.5 amps, the power drawn is 7.5 watts. The sum of these power requirements is the total secondary power under load ... 102.65 watts. Note above that a contart to the trade of the secondary power It is important to note that the total wattage of the secondaries 7.5 watts. The sum of these power requirements is the total secondary power under load ... 102.65 watts. Note above that a center-tapped winding is under load ... 102.05 watts. Note above that a center-tapped winding is actually drawing twice the supply voltage through the winding. It taps half of this voltage on each half cycle. The primary current of the transformer in question would then equate to the following ... 103w (1.25)/120VAC = 1.07 amps. In this instance, a 14 amp fuse should be used. Now that we have a value of primary current, we may then go on to figure the resistance of the ballast tube as well as its wattage. Ballasts can generally be relied upon to create a great deal of headenes. A true ballast is so engineered as to increase its resistance as excessive current is drawn through it. Some manufacturers used resistor tubes not having this

ballast is so angineered as to increase its resistance as excessive current is drawn through it. Some manufacturers used resistor tubes not having this regulatory function. Both of these components were assentially the same: high wattage power resistors. They are difficult to locate now. The follow-ing equation will serve to make their replacement easier. A z Ed/I, where $z_{\rm d}$ is the required voltage drop (usually 40 volts - 120 less 50 volts for the transformer primary), I is the primary current ($z_{\rm eW/E}$), and Ω (omega) is the resistance in shms. The power rating, W, of the ballast is simply the current times the voltage drop across the ballast resistor, $z_{\rm d} x$ I. As per our example, the ballast should be approximately 30 mms and not less than 50 watts. An adjustable power resistor may be used to bridge the socket 50 watts. An adjustable power resistor may be used to tridge the socket under the chassis, or it may be potted in an appropriate tube base shell. If the latter option is used, a piece of ABS pipe should be comented to the base to enclose the entire height of the resistor as a safety measure. Another feature to be found on many early transformers is the center-tapped filament windings. Fig. # 3 shows the simple configuration for two tapping options. In # 3s the winding is directly tapped, while a potentiometer is used in # 3b to find the electrical center between the two helves of the filament circuit. These taps are

halves of the filament circuit. These taps are used for two reasons: first, as a circuit to return the plate signal back to the heaters or filaments, and secondly, to reduce any latent AC hum in the AC filaments. If a resistor has been used in your set, it will probably be found that it is a screwdriver trimmer type of a value approximately 1/10th of the current (10 amps/1A) In either option small bypass capacitors are recommended to help reduce the hum (.01 or less 3 600 v).





Another transformer filter which, if not pre-existing on your set, should help reduce hum in the output, is to bridge the primary with small value caps (.001 to .01 3 400 v). The cir-cuit in Fig. #4 represents this very affective filter. Finally, the last common transformer circuit is also il-

lustrated in the drawing in Fig. # L. Many early AC models had variable primary taps for use in different parts of the country. These taps covered 100-110 and 110-120. Some makers produced

transformers with primary taps covering 90 to 140 volts plus several 200 volt windings.

Next month we'll continue with the rectifiers and start on the difforent filter circuits. In May, we'll finish the filters and start on the lif-tage dividers. When the series is through, you should be able to examine, analyze, troubleshoot and improve the power supply in that old wainut and ma-hogany cream-purf in your sttic.

<u>NEW ZEALAND</u> Against a background of increasing activity in the Pacific radio world, there is continuing uncertainty about the future of the R New Zealand SW svc. This is currently continuing as a relay of the domestic natl pgm with no spl pgms, and is being funded entirely by RMZ. The it is believed that the stn will remain on air until 31/3/83, recent developments in Wellington give serious rise for concern that the plug might be pulled soon after. It is understood that the External Services Division is no longer staffed, and now exists only on paper. If you have not yet verified the stn, I suggest you send your reports in before 31/3, even the we doubt whether there is anyone there to confirm them for you.

At the time of the threatened closedown in 1982, RNZ was persuaded to continue the svc at its own cost. That decision was made in the face of political antipathy by the Govt and was courageous. This is for your unID section. Maybe an illegal signal, or maybe some licensed commercial opn. Mystery signal on 1622 kHz, + 100 Hz or so at times, driving me crazy. I can't figure out just what it is! First logged 2200 29/1, lasted ail thru that nite past 0720 on 30/1. Back again next nite too. Stn features some fading, usually 1-3 S-units above the noise, and has very weak AM. Sig seems to be rebroadcast of Satallite News Network, complete with one-minute programless gaps on the carrier every 5 or 6 mins for ads. This sig is a good S-9 in Delaware, but weak here. Once in a while, a male voice comes on (at a stronger modulation level) during commercial breaks, and says things like "hang on, Steve " or "back in 5 minutes -- OK?" Now this fq region has been allocated for years for remote broadcasts for AM/FM stns, but with the advent of reliable UHF FM transceivers, this band is almost never used for that purpose. In any case, rebroadcasting SNN seems hardly to fail within scope of remote bc. A further puzzle is its periodic nature. Sig not present at 0400 29/1 or 1/2. A second possibility is that a hobbyist w/access to SNM is re-being it for his own purposes--either to a specific target, or as a "lazy man's programming" for a pirate stn. In any case, I have hrd no IDs. And why the very weak modulation? I almost thot I had NBFM at first! Any help appreciated --- Also, this stn is vy hard to tune in my area due to a strong ute on 1622.6 or so. I get no peak or mull with the loop on this mystery signal (Vincent J Pinto, Suffern NY, 2/2)

/Two weeks later:/ Other observers and I have been hearing a weird new signal on 1622.0 kHz since late Jan. Not on continuously, rather only on some eves, and hours are irregular. Noted to be weakly AM modulated w/audio portion of Group W's Satellite News Channel. There are frequent 1-minute gaps, and less frequent four and five min gaps, presumably for ads. Occasionally some voiceover has been noted. Sig strength here is usually only 6-10 db above the noise most evenings. There have been occasional peaks of up to 26 db above the external noise. To make matters worse, it is partially occluded in here by a much stronger utility carrier less than 700 Hz above it. However with careful tuning of the R-7A, I am able to isolate the signal and copy some audio most nights. As far as direxionality, I get only a very weak mull toward the south, due to lots of skywave. The signal is hrd in Delaware at quite strong levels, and in Washington DC at very strong levels. Whatever its source, I knew the signal must have a pretty good ERP since it has been logged in Connecticut (weakly), and weakly in Canada and in Michigan. Listeners in the coastal southern states reported that the signal again drops off in strength compared to Delaware & DC signal

There were several questions regarding the mystery signal. What was its source, and was it a legitimate rebroadcast, or some kind of hobby broadcast, perhaps a "poor man's program ming" for a pirate. It has been known that for some time one of the allocated uses of this slice above the AM band is for remote broadcasts by AM stns. Yet this bc didn't seem to fall within the strict definition of "AM remote broadcast".

I had a little free time recently, and decided to track this signal down. Station is legitimete, and indeed in Washington DC area. It's a new type of service allocation for the band 1605-1650 kHz. This service is called Broadcast Auxiliary. Apparently this new allocation arises from the recent ITU accords, and allocates this slice on a secondary basis for remote links from cable studios to remote crews. Secondary basis means that the cable operators use this band with the understanding that they must not cause significant interference to other primary services in the band and must tolerate interference received. The particular signal we were hearing was a link between the SNC home control board in Stam ford CT and field news crews in Washington DC. SNC calls it their "P.L. line" and essentially, a phone line carries their control or P.L. line from Stamford to Washington, where under local control, the signal is broadcast on 1622 kHz.to their field vans. The intended coverage range is only the immediate DC area. The voiceovers we were hearing were instructions to remote crews.

This new service is not to be confused with the older allocation for remote AM broadcasts, although the services are similar. The signal is basically on the air only when remote vans are out in the field. The FCC monitoring office believes there are six such services in operation on this band thruout the country at this point. Freqs are 1606, 1622 and 1646 kHz. The watr runs less than 100 watts RF out to a 5 foot tall vertical antenna on the roof of an 8-story bldg, east coast [?]. When I called Group W's 18th St site for more data, the engineer kept interrupting me to ask incredulously to please repeat where I was calling from. It turns out that the weak modulation I was hearing was due to xmtr problems. Station license is "WJZ-PB"; address correspondence to Engineer in Charge, Remote Field News Broadcasts; Group W Satellite News Channel; 1111 18th St NW, Washington, DC 200-08. Phone is (202) 872-1700.

I also spent time recently interviewing the FCC Monitoring HQ in DC. Since they are not really a monitoring stn themselves, and are more of a central network control, he [sic] used his computer terminal to relay many of my "real time" questions to various of their stns. I asked primarily about the CW mystery beacons between 1600 and 1750, and also the funny carriers you hear at night between 1613 and 1650 kHz. These carriers seem to have a bit of FM on them, and often have clicks or chirps like a cricket. First off, they've newer spent much time on the GW beacons, assume they are radio markers for fishing buoy nets. All have bearings off Florida coast and down toward the islands. At this point we started DKing together - I would find weird signals in the 1600-1650 band and call out freqs, and he would query several of his stns on that signal. They classify my clickers or chirpers or FM swisher carriers as all radionav signals. They call them crickets internally, and assume they are LORAN "A" type signals. Admit they have never gotten into checking much on them. They think they're mostly from outside the country. Well, I enjoyed DKing for a half hour with the FCC." (Vincent J Pinto, Suffern NY, 16/2)

DXing the USSR Just received my copy of this cassette tape produced by Rudy Van Dallen and ancd over Brussels' DX pgm, and on Media Network. A brief review: The recording starts w/ a good quality studio recording of the Soviet national anthem, in itself a nice piece of mx to have. There follow, as advertised, many recordings of Soviet interval signals, either studio quality or good off-air quality. Most of these IS are exotica which we will never hear here, and as such are good listening. Now comes what I regard as a serious weakness of this tape. In most cases, only about two or three seconds of spoken ID are included, sometimes no ID. In a few cases a longer ID is presented. I, for one, would have welcomed the chance to hear these stns announce in their rare Asian langs, as well as Russian. I guess anyone interested in these IDs could learn enough Russian to understand the IDs. I would have liked 15 or 20 seconds of talking on each cut. There is a 5-minute parody of R Moscow at the end, which they could have done without, as well as some blank tape. They could also have eliminated the ID of the Moscow SW svc, and with all this perhaps have had enough room for the spoken ID, and if they had had to use two tapes, so what? It would have been worth it. So, if you order this tape, this is what you will, and won't get. Take your choice!

DXers who want help in IDing stns should place more emphasis on recording the spoken ID and pgm intro as well as the IS. I participated in an informal session at ANARC Thunder Bay, where someone had brought a tape of unID stns. In most cases they had only recorded the IS. A person like myself, who is interested in langs, and there are many SWLs who have this interest, could have been much more helpful if we could have heard more talking (Tim Hendel, Miami FL)




