

we have been relating the views In this series of three articles, of nine outstanding collectors of 33Ls--on why they seek verifications and how they handle then. In this concluding article we finish the rund own :

MARLIN 1. FISLD: "I ion't know how many QSLs I have. I count by station. I have QSLs from 353 stations in 212 countries. I have a number of QSLs also from the same station; for example, I try to get each one issued by HCJB.

also, I really have two collections -- (1) QSLs from all countries, and (2) GLs from religious broadcasters which are duplicated in No. 1 for the most part.

My specialties: (1) Pennants--from 231 stations in 25 countries.

(5) Latin America, and (C) Religious broadcasters.
 What part do GLs play in my DX life? I have them organized in such a start it's easy to find what i'm looking for. They're in 21 looseleaf

notebooks by continent. If I want to see an African 33L, I look in my black notebook (sorry, South Africa) where countries are arranged albhabetically. I refer to the 33Ls occasionally as well as show them to others once in awhile. Undoubtedly, I'll be showing some of them to our new minister as he spent a summer with HCJ3 and is interested in radio as a missionary outreach.

Unfortunately, I don't have all my verifications in books yet. In the

books I also have postal cards, photos and stamps I have received from station personnel. The pennants are in separate books. If we were to leave Hillsdale, there's no question but what I'd take my SLE along. The 54119 Graham Center at Wheaton College. Illinois, has expressed interest in my religious collection; therefore, when I no longer

have a need for it, it will go there. Jenter personnel even suggested that I might donate it before death so that I might see how it was used there. I've made no arrangement for my general collection. There's more work that needs to be ione on both. I ion't know whether I'll get it ione before I retire or not-as I don't know when I'll retire.

I also have QSLs from 925 1M stations in 29 countries."

COMM MORITZ: "As far as QSLs 50, they remain dear to my heart at all times. The challenge and excitement of finally mailing down a long sought-after Peruvian does not imminish after outting it in your book. Indeed, it only serves as encouragement to get the next one. Of course, this abolies in varying degrees to the individual involved. It goes without saying that Perry Dexter is the foremost at the motivation/ QSL game. He continually hanners away on a regular basis. For me, it is not that degree of intensity, but still I have my method to keep plugging away.

My QSLs are organized in notebooks, but into clear pages to allow wiewing of both sides. I have a book for each continent and then separate books for each Latin country, as that remains my main area of concentration. I look at my QSLs periodically throughout a year. They bring back fond memories of how and when I finally heard that station. More than any periodical back and a station.

particular, they remind <u>me</u> of when I heard a station. I sometimes look at them when I need a bick-me-up in a lown period of the hobby. Sometimes I look at them to get me started on follow-ups once again. But they still remain a friendly reminder of my involvement in different stages of this hobby. It is interesting to look at my SLs and think of the early lays when I scratched out some details in English to a station, and then, after so many years, think of the many reports and things I sent out to a Latin, only to finally receive a verification letter after

two or three more years. I suppose the main point here is that QSLs, perhaps more than anything else in this hobby, are and remain a personal achievement. A personal reminder. An incentive to do more. Flus, a QSL collection serves as an enticement to continue during periods of inactivity in the hobby. A number of people have seen my collection, but I do not make it a point to bring it to conventions or ovenly talk about it. Again, it remains

personal to me.

What would I do with it? Well, I hope that my son gets involved in DXing someday and I might be able to pass it along to him as a reminder of earlier stations and times, a kind of historical perspective of the radio scene.

But more than anything, I'm glad that I have it to look back upon.

It serves as a record of my DX involvement. Logs and tabed IDs are nice, but nothing takes the blace of that card, or letter and hand bainted pennant from Radio Andina. 25Ls are the icing on the cake, and they taste very, very sweet to this DXer.

JOHN CAMPBELL: "Yes, QSLs come out for recollection or discussion, usually with friends interseted in DX or aspects of radio and communications. This doesn't happen very often at present (due to my workload), but maybe things will be more relaxed in another 20 years or so.

To help recollections of reception etc. and the particular pleasure they give, I store QSLs in albums sold in Europe to hold first-day covers . in frequency order; it helds me remember the sources of 32% which have made the DX receptions difficult.

For disposal of Gals via a will, I'll try to find a good museum with so far are in New Lealand, but that's rather far away at present. Total number of QiIs must be about 1600, about 70% shortwave and the rest mostly medium wave. I don't try to specialize but I seem to have quite

a few 23Ls from European 3W pirates. Other areas where the collection is well developed are Indonesia and political clandestines. Sore point: I've reported 6 3.3. pirates from outside North America but only three have replied. Corresponding rate for European 'unofficial' stations is at least 95%.

SILL MARTHEIS: "The QSL collection well, there is absolutely nothing like adding a card or letter from a new country to it. Regrettably, such additions are few and very far apart. In the interim periods, I try to add to the collection by submitting reports to stations offering multiple designs for reporters (a la HCJ3, Radio Berlin International, Radio Cairo, etc. While this is not a good substitute for a new country, it helps me to sustain my interest in DXing.

QSLs to me are not 'unwest, unhonored and unsung'--they, to me, are important reminders of stations heard in the sast--of the 2 AM 'rise and shine', of the 3:30 AM fall aslees time by the receiver! I can remember studying in mid-winter (while in high school and college) to the Brazilians, of the high heat of a Pennsylvania summer while listening to Radio Iran, or in early evening to an interference-free Voice of Turkey.

I carefully preserve at least one QSL per country, sometimes more depending on the rarity. Others are maintained to look at for the various depending on the marity. As for showing to others, that's an exception mather than the rule, for I think it is only too true that the confirmations mean more to you than to others (especially non-DXers!). If I had to nove, they would certainly accompany me. As far as throwing out, they would be among the last things to go. Death? Well, that's another matter. I've always wondered why the stamp collectors have been able to band the stamp action more than to be the stamp collectors have been able to band

When one cannot hear a new country, how loes one get any kind of thrill? Well, try new stations--Latin incrica is filled with them. If or as many domestic stations as you can hear--the Chinese and Australian regionals. Try to earn as many different QSL designs as stations offer (make sure the station wants reports.). Adventist World Radic offers a special certificate for SLing the various sites and frequencies they utilize. It's 24 spaces total and it took about 24 years to complete, so it's not as easy as it might seem. The challenge af propagation on that are is almost uncelievable.

" Inckily, you may report to all stations in Inclish. Swee those countries which ion't broadcast in English (e.g. the two Yemens) understand it and accept reports in it. In fact, English is widely known in both Yemens: the P.D.R.Y. is a former British is visition, while my North Yemeni students here in Alba are among the best speakers of English. Stations in Algeria, Morocco, Finisia and Lebanon may also be reported in French, but this does not seem to be necessary to obtain a 151. Do not refer to it as chanting and, of course, avoid negative terms like wailing. As someone who loves all types of music, I have found my favorite station to be Swaziland Commerc'al Radio (3.J.R.), with its nice selections of Portuguese ballads, Hindustani type music and, of course, popular songe in English. From within the small African Kingdom of Swaziland comes a big signal directed to its listeners in South Africa but which can often om enjoyed by us here in the States. The station has had a turbulent history since it first went on the sir from Sandlane, in Swaziland, back in the early part of 1972.

early part of 1972. In the early years it was hard going for an independent station, but then Mr. Isele Kirsh became managing director and Kireh Industries became nvolved, things looked brighter. New studies and offices were set in in tkinson House, on Bloff Street in Johannesburg, South Africa. Unfortunately, the station still has problems acquiring advertisers and of establishing a blearly defined listening public. It was not until 1976 that both of these problems began to be solved. For that was the year that saw the start of both the Indian and Portuguese Services. There was a real need for pro-gramming to these groups in South Africa and the businese community saw the vision of using SCR to reach these people with ads for their products. The Portuguese Service is Radio Parallel. There are many eriles from Angola and Mozabique who have become regular listemers to this service since it started operation on April 3, 1975. Foday the format is still **REMO** South announcere as Eugenia Maria and Sampaio e Silva, both formerly

by such announcers as Eugenia Maria and Sampaio e Silva, both formerly with Radio Clube of Mozambique. This service was first noted by me in August, 1982, on 6155 kHz., beginning their program at 3500 JMT, with beautiful Portuguese ballads and several IDs for "Radio Paralelo Winteesets":

The Indian Service is Radio Truro, named after the S.S. Truro, which in November 1860 transported the first indentured Indian workers which in November 1860 transported the first indentured Indian workers to Natal (South Africa) from India. In late March of 1976 test transmissions were made and Radio Turns started regular programming on May 9, 1976. REVOLUCIÓN O MUERTE, VENCEREMOS! by Steve Reinstein

"Revolution or death, we will conquer" are words that should not be taken in a glib manner. These defiant words have probably been uttered by many revolutionaries throughout history. Yet, never have they stood so boldly true as they do today, in El Salvador. El Salvador, a densely populated nation of 4.8 million, has staggered through four trying years of violence, terror, & murder! The bloody civil war has claimed upwards of 30,000 lives and, as yet, there is no end in sight. As happens in this day and age, guerrilla revolution and counterrevolution is invariably accompanied by a staunch platform of political rhetoric via clandestine radio broadcasting. It is in this light that we take a closer look at developments in the El Salvador underground.

Since the revolution in El Salvador began in the late 1970s, there have been several rebel shortwave radio stations on the air. These include: Radio Liberación. Radio Venceremos, Radio Farabundo Martí, Radio Unidad, and Radio Guazapa. All of these stations have 'flown' generally under the banner of the PMLN - frente <u>Parabundo Martí</u> para <u>Liberación Nacional</u> (Parabundo Martí front for National Liberation).

The FMLN is a large unbrella organization that encompasses combatants from the five major Marxist groups in El Salvador. Their name is derived from the martyred communist leader, Farabundo Martí, who led a short-lived peasant uprising in January 1932. Martí was captured by govt. forces and shot by a firing squad. The rebellion was crushed and thousands were massacred. Little did he dream that half a century later his country would be literally torn apart by a revolution in his memory! While the FMLN is essentially a military guerrilla organization, the other half of the Salvadoran Left is represented by the FDR - <u>Frente Democrático Revolucionario</u> (Democratic Revolutionary Pront). The FDR is a political ally of the FMLN and serves as the political arm of 14 leftist parties and groups. Leading the FDR is a former Social Democrat, Guillermo Manuel Ungo. Ironically, Ungo ran as the vice-presidential running mate of José Mapoleon Duarte in 1972. Duarte won the election but the military falsified the voter tabulations to keep him from taking office. In 1979 Ungo served on the ruling civilian-military junta but resigned in 1980 to work with the FDR. (The original FDR leader was Enrique Alvaréz Cordova, assasinated in December 1980). Duarte later became President of the ruling junta, while Ungo went into exile in Panamá to oppose Duarte's regime. The current (interim) President of El Salvador is Alvaro Magaña.

In December 1980 the first PMLN station appeared on shortwave. The shortlived Radio Liberación broadcast on 8243 kHz and claimed to be located near battlefronts in El Salvador. Popular opinion, at the time, suspected Radio Liberación to actually be located in Chinandega Province, Nicaragua. In Feb. 1981, R. Liberación ceased broadcasting but was quickly replaced by a new FMLN station, Radio Venceremos. Radio Venceremos "the official voice of the FMLN" is generally assumed to sometimes be actually broadcasting from the Morazán Department of El Salvador. It is suspected that at least one transmitter is located at a large FMLN complex, south of Managua, while repeaters are used in the field. The easily heard Radio Venceremos often changes frequencies and schedule, to avoid jamming and direction finding techniques, so be sure to check other sections of FRENDX for more current information. Radio Venceremos claims to have begun operation on medium wave an 1/22/80 under the name Radio Revolucionaria del Pueblo. Since March 1982 their transmissions on shortwave have been severely interfered with. They claim that U.S. vessels patrolling the Gulf of Fonseca have persisted in a plan to disrupt the FMLN broadcasts (see the cover of the April 1983 RIB, #75 for the latest). Despite the jamming harassment. Radio Venceremos is well heard around the world. They can be reached at: Apartado Postal 7-907. Mexico Distrito Federal. Although the FMLN oversees the activities of the rebel groups and attempts to keep them unified, these groups have diverse political ambitions and often run into conflict with one another.

The largest and most radical of the guerrilla groups comprising the FMLN is the FPL - Fuerras Populares de Liberación (Popular Liberation Forces). The PPL was founded in 1969 by Salvador Cayetano Carpio after he split with the Salvadoran Communist Party over ideological differences. The 63 year old Cayetano, usually known by his nom-de-guerre 'Marcial', has often been referred to as the "grand old man" of the revolution. Throughout the civil war the FPL has been very active battling govt. troops in Chalatenango Department and other areas. In January 1982 the FPL introduced their own clandestine radio station in the form of Radio Parabundo Martí. They carefully timed their broadcasts to follow the sign-off of Radio Venceremos, so as not to appear as competition. The sporadic R. Farabundo Martí has been jammed mercilessly by the "music" jammer, probably because their Marxist doctrine is far more radical than even the FMLNI In April 1983 the FPL was dealt a severe and damaging setback when their second-in-command Melida Anaya Montez, usually known on-the-air by her pseudonym 'Comandante Ana María', was assassinated by fellow FPL members. Shortly thereafter FPL leader Cayetano, despondent over the death of Ana María, reportedly committed suicide. The FPL is now headed by 'Salvador Guerra' (an obvious pseudonym).

The second largest guerrilla force in the PMLN is the ERP - <u>Ejército</u> <u>Revolu-</u> <u>cionario</u> <u>del Pueblo</u> (Revolutionary Army of the People). The ERP, formed after a dispute within Cayetano's FPL, is commanded by 31 year old Joaquín Villalobos. The ERP is said to operate mainly in Morazán since the outbreak of the civil war.

The third largest guerrilla force in the PMLN is the PARN - <u>Puerzas Armadas</u> <u>de Resistencia Nacional</u> (Armed Porces of National Resistance). The PARN, formed in 1975 after a dispute within the ERP, is commanded by the Costa Rica born Eduardo Sancho Castañeda, known better by his nom-de-guerre Fermán Cienfuegos. The PARN is said to operate widely in Cuscatlán Department, especially around the Guazapa volcano. This leads to speculation that the PARN is behind the latest anti-junta radio station to hit the airwaves. Radio Guazapa "La Voz de Cuscatlán" appeared in March 1983 varying between 9820-9850 kHz at *0130, and also announcing a *1830 broadcast.

The fourth guerFilla group in the FMLN is the Salvadoran Communist Party itself. A relative newcomer to the fighting, the Party finally joined in the fray in 1979 with a small group of guerFillas known as the FAL - <u>Puerzas</u> <u>Armadas de Liberación</u> (Armed Forces of Liberation). The Salvadoran Communist Party is led by secretary general (since 1972) Shafick Jorge Handal, son of Palestinian immigrants. Handal is said to have ties to Palestine Liberation Organization terrorist Yasser Arafat, and is active in the purchase of arms for the FMLN.

The last of the major Marxist groups comprising the FMLN is also the most furtive and least known organization. The PRTC - <u>Partido Revolucionario de</u> <u>los Trabajadores Centroamericanos</u> (Central American Workers' Revolucionary Party) was formed in 1975 by the secretive Roberto Roca. It is speculated that Roca's PRTC is responsible for guerrilla activity in the swampy southeastern Usulután Department. Roca is believed to side with Guillermo Ungo of the FDR in believing that a negociated settlement for peace in El Saivador is a necessity in order to avoid massive intervention by U.S. military forces.

The last of the FMLN clandestine radio stations is/was Radio Unidad, a station that very little is known about. To my knowledge Radio Unidad has never been positively reported by North American DKers. The BEC Monitoring Service came out with several reports that Radio Unidad was heard in January 1982 on 7000 kHz, claiming to be broadcasting from Usulután. It was never ascertained as to whether R. Unidad was a legitimate FMLN station, or perhaps a disinformationtransmission from an anti-FMLN source. In 1982 there were some interesting reports of a station called R. Orientación or Reorientación, which surfaced briefly to confuse listeners of R. Venceremos!...And there you have it, the current clandestine scene in El Salvador. I've thrown all these names at you, the readers, not to confuse you but to hopefully help you in listening to the amazing world of clandestine radio. So, as they say on R. Venceremos. "...hasta la victoria final, revolución o muerte, venceremos"! 73 de Steve

PART II - The Active Loop Antenna.


Last month we constructed the loop itself, BUT, as some of you have noted, I did not mention how the variable capacitor is affixed. Hahl This has to do with continuing construction on the amplifier, which we will discuss here.


The FET amplifier used here is a push-pull design allowing for ample increase in gain and quiet response. All the small parts are readily available, and actual construction should be easy for the modest hobbyist.

Construction layout on a small piece of perforated board may follow exactly the schematic diagram provided here. Wires may cross over each other, provided they are insulated and not actually touching. Note that there are two points for entry of the signal from the antenna loop, and two points for hooking to your receiver antenna/ground terminals. There are also two points for powering the unit, which we will take up next month.

- Parts List: 2- FET 2N3819 (or similar) 1- 2n2222 transistor
 - 2- 4.7K resistors
 - 1- 1K resistor
 - 1- 2.2% resistor
 - 1- 100uF/25V electrolytic capacitor
 - 1- .01 uF ceramic capacitor
 - 1- .UI UF Ceramic capacit

Here is where the variable capacitor is hooked-up to the loop itself.....





The amp draws 13.5 mA with a 12V power supply using .162 watts. It will work fine with a common

9V battery, too.

Don't let any screws touch * the wires of the loop! *

Next month we will complete the unit by constructing a power supply for it. In the meanwhile, you can use a 9V battery, or a wall transformer for 12V.

WANTED: Programs in basic, particularly for the VIC-20 computer, that are useful in pursuits of short wave listening and DXing. Perhaps some member has constructed a loggings program they would be willing to share.

CAR HEADLIGHT REMINDER: While this has no relationship to shortwave, it is useful for the tinkering hobbylst. The time and slight expense wasted on a drained car battery could be better devoted to DXing...justification. You need merely a small 12V buzzer. Wire it in to your headlight switch, one lead to low-beam wire, the other lead to the oil pressure switch on the engine block. When the car is running, headlights ON, the pressure switch is open..no buzz. Turn off the engine, no pressure, switch closes, buzzer sounds reminding you the headlights are being powered. Turn off lights also cuts power to buzzer. Voila. And GM wants\$27.00 for such a gadget installed.

LETTERS FROM READERS This is not likely to be a continuing feature, but the subject matter is interesting enough that many may have the same problems and can benefit from the suggestions I give, if any.

New York: " I own a DX-302, and use a longwire antenna. Within two miles are 10 50KW AM, and 20 100KW FM stations. I have images all over the entire spectrum. What can I do? " Good grief! Let's assume that all the stations have met their FCC obligations to suppress images. The remaining problem MUST lie within the less-than-desirable circuitry of the DX-302. Reduce the length of your antenna dramatically...only a few feet, say 10. Then construct a series-type antenna tuner. This will resonate your short antenna sharply, only for the band of frequencies you listen to on short wave. Alas, if the problem IS at the transmitter, it could be that the signels come in on such unsuspect things as your power line.

New York: "My R-70 is everything I ever wanted. However, I note that the digital display 'pops' unexplainably and it doesn't seem to have anything to do with band changes er-the-digital steps up or dowr in frequency. Do I have a defective receiver?" Not likely. The 'pops' you noted probably are due to the switching, inherent in the gas-discharge segments of the readout. Notice that, for instance that the digit 1 is comprised of two lighted segments. If you tune down, the next digit to light would be zero, comprised of six lighted segments...that is, a sudden increase of four more. If you went from zero to 1 again, the additional four segments would just as suddenly extinguish. Such switching does cause pops. Better buffering would alleviate or eliminate this minor nuisance, but it doesn't create any problems. I noticed it too, but it doesn't bother me.


WANTED: Reader experiences on how to modify different receivers to employexisting SSB filters to narrow the AM passband. Information on the new rash of Kenwood, Icom, Panasonic, Sony receivers particularly desired.

WHICH WAY TO PUT THE BATTERIES IN? . Sooner or later we all do it; insert the batteries incorrectly. It usually means soon dead batteries, corroded terminals, and maybe damaged circuits.

By inserting the 4-diode gadget shown here, it will make no difference which way you insert the batteries...polarity will come out correctly for use by your instrument. The four diodes should cost about \$1.00 for 10 at Radio Shack. Note the band around one end of a diode indicates the positive (+) end. You probably can also buy a ready-made bridge for about \$1, and it's small enough to tuck away in some inner recess where it can't be seen.



First stage of general works completed Nov 81 w/repair of submarine power cables across Darwin Harbour, and reestablishment of power supply. By June 1982, bldgs restored w/addl cyclone protexion and harbour jetty rebuilt. Final stage, costing \$3.8 million, involves erexion of seven TCI-611 curtain antennas. Work already started on foundations, and 8 masts should be in place before July. Ants will then be hung progressively during remainder of dry season. After test ing, stn should be ready for use in late 1983 or early 84 w/original three 1969 Collins 250 kW xmtrs, and possibly one addl unit, TBA later.

<u>Shepparton</u>. In 1982/83 budget, \$1.1 million was provided for purchase of four 100 kW xmtrs. Two are currently being installed and tested, while others due later this year. Four of them were USB: 6900, 6220, 5200, 5770; two DSB: 7000 & 5565. All 4 xmtrs of R 15 de Sept are probably in Honduras, also used by R Miskus & possibly LV de La Libertad (Ernie Behr, 13/5)

Dios, patria y libertad. Les habló Juan Carlos." John also hrd ments ef Commandante Juan Carlos. It seems that J.C. is actually the nom-de-guerre of Pedro Ortega, a wealthy Nic businessman who prospered during Somoza years. He now commands anti-Sand exile group Ejército Nacional de Liberación. ENL is made up of Somocistas in Honduras. Early 198 2 it was thot there might be merger of ENL with Unión Democrática Nicaragüense, headed by the Chamorro bros. (both former Sandinista commanders). Proposed merger seemed to fall thru because UDN leadership still felt too much animosity to ENL Somocistas. UDN later merged w/ 15 de Septiembre group to form Fuerza Democrática Nicaragüense coalition. Not known yet whether LV de La Lib has own xmtr or shares time w/RIS. Recent Miami Herald articles hint at possible wide-based anti-Sand coalition, combining Hond groups w/ARDE/FRS/MDN people in CR: (Steve Reinstein, DXSF 18/5) LV de La Libertad noted on 7000 25/4 w/prayer and 0355*, 1/5 to 0342*, but at 0330 2/5, R 15 de Septiembre was on this same fq; more recently the fq has been heavily jammed (SWNS) Also see previous page






