Ed is the founder and president of Agri Communicators, inc. formed in 1972, of which the Agri Broadcasting Network (ABN) is a division. He broadcasts six days a week from the studio at the family farm and the ABN studios in

Columbus. Market reports are aired on 64 radio stations throughout Ohio and West Virginia and 3 television stations. ABN-TV, Inc., formed in 1981, produces "Agri Country" with Ed Johnson a 30 minute farm television program which is seen on 8 television stations in Ohio and Indiana.

The Falrfleld County native was raised on a 380 acre general livestock farm. He was active in FFA and is a former State FFA officer. Ed is a graduate of The Ohio State University with a B.S. in Agricultural Economics and Agricultural Education.

Ed is an active member of the National Association of Farm Broadcasters, the Ohio Agricultural Council, the 4-H Foundation Board, and chairman of the Ohio FFA Foundation. He has been recognized on the local, state and national levels of numerous organizations for his "dedication to promoting agriculture."

ABN PROGRAMMING

ABN's FARM BLOCK programming is a combination of top agricultural news and events, grain and livestock reports and the agricultural weather advisory. Farm Block can be heard throughout the day on most ABN stations.

The morning LIVESTOCK REPORT includes a summary of the interior Ohio hog, sheep and cattle markets from the Producers Livestock Association in Columbus. Also included are the Omaha cattle prices, Midwest lamb prices and the Chicago Mercantile Exchange quotes of cattle, hog and feeder cattle futures.

ABN's morning **GRAIN REPORT** keeps you informed of upto-the-minute quotes and analysis on the Chicago Board of Trade and the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. The report includes the settlement quotes on the Chicago Board and The Andersons' producer cash grain bids from Maumee, Ohio

The LIVESTOCK AND GRAIN Market Reports are also broadcast by three television stations in Ohio.

WBNS-TV, Columbus, CH. 10 airs the program within the Noon News at 12:20 p.m. daily; WTOL-TV, Toledo, CH. 11 airs programming within the Noon News at 12:20 daily; and WLIO-TV, Lima, CH. 35 airs the programs at 6 p.m., 11 p.m. and during the "Good Morning America" program at 7:45 a.m. daily.

AGRI WEATHER is an agricultural weather advisory heard exculsively on ABN. The feature is provided by the National Agricultural Weather Service of Purdue University and is tailored to the farmers and gardeners of Ohio.

MARKETING STRATEGY is an interview feature that zeroes in on marketing, farm management, economics, price trends and editorials.

AGRI NEWS is an interview feature covering farming, agribusiness, editorials and key agricultural events.



Once a month the ABN airs the **OPEN MIKE** program, a show where key agricultural resource people discuss current issues and topics affecting agriculture.

SPEAKING OUT FOR AGRICULTURE, sponsored by PAG Seeds, is a minute and a half commentary by Ed about his feelings and insights into agriculture.

ABN FEATURE PROGRAMMING is in addition to our regular daily farm programming produced for farmers of Ohio. On-location broadcasts such as: field days, open houses, conventions etc., are keeping the ABN van on the road more than 90 days each year all over Ohio.
