Opera Profile

JESS THOMAS

THE FIRST ACT OF Lohengrin was not too far advanced but already the audience had sensed an unusual performance in the making. The Herald called three times for the unknown champion to appear; downstage Leonie Rysanek, as Elsa, was in one of her famous hypnotic trances, casting her spell over Munich's Prinzregententheater. Gradually the solid wall of the chorus parted and exposed the swan boat, the silver Grail Knight standing, his sword glittering in his hands. He was tall, wellbuilt and, even through the stylized wig and make-up, obviously good looking.

DUT NO MATTER how a singer looks B he has got to be able to sing. So it was that when Jess Thomas stepped out of the swan boat and, to the accompaniment of the shimmering strings, turned his back to sing his farewell: "Nun sei bedankt, mein Lieber Schwann . . ." the audience took in its breath on a collected gasp and all but collapsed in its chairs. For from this big man (he stands over 6'2"), who for some reason we had expected to bellow like the usual slice of Wagnerian ham we had been fed all summer, floated beautiful, radiant, otherworldly tone.

Through the rest of that fantastic evening (called by English critic Michael Marcus: "one of the finest of my opera-going experiences") Thomas gave consistently the most compelling Wagnerian sining I have ever heard. Not only did his voice float radiantly, but in the crowd scenes he dominated the stage with bright, ringing sound. His musicianship was as astonishing (back to the conductor

is the rarest position in which anyone will ever see a tenor) as his presence was magnetic.

That performance, one in a series of steps through the major European houses (which began with a Bacchus in Munich in 1960 and now leaves only Covent Garden to be conquered), reminded us that after vocal training at Stanford University and appearances with local symphony orchestras, the Woodminster Light Opera, and as a soloist in various Bay Area churches. Thomas won the Merola auditions in 1957 and made his first appearance on a major operatic stage here in San Francisco. He sang Faninal's Major Domo in Rosenkavalier and followed that with the role of Malcolm in Macbeth. By coincidence, the Lady Macbeth that evening was Leonie Rysanek with whom Thomas was later to create roles in premieres of Adriadne auf Naxos at the Met and in Herbert von Karajan's swan song to Vienna, the magnificent new production of Frau ohne Schatten. Shortly after that San Francisco debut, Thomas left for Germany where he won a contract with the Baden State Opera at Karlsruhe.

This month he returns to the San Francisco Opera, scene of his modest debut, to sing the leading tenor roles in Ariadne, Tosca, Lohengrin and Meistersinger. In seven years, the young man from South Dakota, who almost became a high school counselor, has risen from the Major Domo to the major Wagnerian lyric tenor in the world. Although all Wagnerian tenors are usually incorrectly labelled Heldentenor (heroic tenor) neither of the two most famous Heldentenor roles, Tristan and Siegfried, is yet in Thomas' repertoire. In fact, though he has sung Siegmund "a few times" he is still holding off on taking the final plunge. "I love the part," he says, "but I don't wish to sing it just now with the 'very high' repertoire that I sing."

This unusually objective attitude has won Thomas the respect of critics as well as the adoration of Bayreuth, Munich and Vienna's opera fans. He works on a role from the "inside" and when he talks about opera you hear logical, no-nonsense descriptions of character and action. But though he has the reputation as an "intellectual" singer he by no means leaves the audience with nothing but bare bones of characterization. After the Lohengrin in Munich I began to wonder if Thomas could "act" in situations requiring more than projected strength of personality and voice . . . in other words could he be an Olivier of the operatic stage as well as a matinee idol? The Metropolitan's new production of Samson swept away any doubts. Musically the voice was in good condition, though Thomas' French is nowhere as idiomatic as his German, but it was his tough, realistic, beautifully controlled acting that kept Saint-Saëns' "opera" from sagging into the oratorio category in which it truly belongs.

Bayreuth fanatics are a bit disturbed by Thomas' youthful, lyric Parsifal (his debut role there) but no one who has heard him in the recording Philips made from a live performance in 1962 could possibly still adhere to the suffocatingly mature Parsifal image that has remained unchallenged for so many years. The trend among Thomas' contemporaries, singers like James King and Jon Vickers has been toward lightening the voice and doing away with the strangled vocal production that has made Wagnerian singing (and Wagnerian girth) the most ridiculed aspect of opera for the last hundred years. There is definitely importance in the fact that Thomas and King are Americans. Vickers a Canadian. The Germans themselves applaud the trend. "Send us your young singers," the director of a German provincial house tells America. "They are better looking, better trained and better disciplined than any singers in the world."

Thomas' recording activity has been mainly confined to Deutsche Grammophon's non-export label (including two gems, Forza highlights with Fischer-Dieskau and highlights from Ballo-both in German) and to some not very entrancing recitals on Eurodisc. His first complete opera for a major company was Angel's superb Lohengrin in which he was backed by a superior cast and brilliant conducting. Circumstances were not so happy for the live Meistersinger from the opening of the Munich Nationaltheater (now available on RCA) but Thomas' Walther is, if anything, better sung than his Lohengrin. No further plans have been announced for him but Angel could certainly use a new Ariadne (perhaps with Crespin?)

As for Tristan and Siegfried, it is difficult to wait, guessing as we can at what is in store for us, but we can find consolation in the fact that fully committing himself to those roles (and to Otello) will probably mean the loss of Thomas' Bacchus, Stolzing and Lohengrin. Watching this fine artist develop has become one of the genuine pleasures of today's musical scene.



PHOTOGRAPHY

THE PHOTOGRAPHER AND THE AMERICAN LANDSCAPE, SF Museum thru August 8th

This travelling show, which originated at the Museum of Modern Art in New York City, is a heartbreaking requiemto the immense and virginal American scenery. Photographers loved it, respected it, let themselves be swallowed up by it and recorded it with all the sincerity and awe which was its due.

This is a last farewell, a turning of the page. Now the skies are crisscrossed with the trails of jet planes, easy access and air conditioned campgrounds have taken the flower of its virginity. Now there are other things to see and to record: the change, the increasing control of man.

Today's landscape photographer has to be precious rather than grandiose, photograph dewdrops rather than panoramas—or have landscapes built to specification, like Ansel Adams. Scenery can still provide shapes which can be used as tools for self expression, but to photograph it for its own sake, for the wonder of it, is redundant and futile today.

As always through history a great challenge created its own masters and the Museum of Modern Art has recognized who they were and presented them to us in a magnificent panorama.

New Classical Recordings

TIPPETT, Piano Concerto/Piano Sonata No. 2, Ogdon, piano, Philharmonia Orchestra, Davis, cond. (Odeon ASD 621)

Michael Tippett is not as well known in America as his British contemporary Benjamin Britten. In England he is considered more difficult (which he is), more abstruse (which is an impolite way of saying deeper) and altogether a bit of a musical crank. To anyone who listens to this superb recording it should become plain that Tippett is a major musical personality, concerned not so much with what he is saying as with how he is saying it. Thus, somewhat like Prokofiev, he takes a theme and, rather than developing it in the standard Germanic way, he works with it unchanged, rescoring, altering the rhythm, playing with it until it assumes monumental proportions in the listener's ear.

Tippett's whole life of composing seems to have been directed at giving him the utmost control over every sound at his disposal, allowing him to state in the liner notes that the Concerto is "rich, linear and lyrical . . . the piano sings . . ." without being guilty of the least exaggeration or imprecision. An utterly beautiful piece of music that transcends all labels; romantic, modern, atonal etc. I have not seen a score but I have been told the piano part is fiendish. One would never guess from the ease with which John Ogdon performs. This recording belongs on the shelf of every person who thinks the piano concerto died with (or was killed by) Rachmaninoff.

HAYDN, The "Salomon" Symphonies, Royal Philharmonic, Beecham, cond. (Angel 36242-6)

I have momentary lapses when I think of Haydn as a sort of poor relation to Mozart but performances like those of the Amadeus Quartet at Stanford last month or these of the last 12 symphonies by the late Sir Thomas Beecham remind me that Haydn, more than any other composer, suffers from indifferent per-

formance. Haydn is civilized, full of little jokes but without the gratuitous vulgarity that occasionally mars Mozart's work. A bit eccentric perhaps, and at times seemingly unconcerned with anything more serious than having the symphony finish in time for fireworks in the garden at precisely nine o'clock (to crib from Hofmannsthal). It takes players or a conductor with precisely this attitude, civilized to what might be harshly called the point of extinction to do full justice to Haydn's work. Beecham was and Beecham does. Despite the larger orchestra than the purist would demand you will find nowhere a set of recordings (or even a single) that exhibits the civilized Haydn clearly and calmly showing you that his 12 London symphonies are the first and finest of our early symphonic literature.

SCHUMANN, Dichterliebe/Kerner Lieder/Liederkreis, Prey, baritone, Engel, piano (Vox SLDL 5562)

Vox has done an admirable service in bringing Hermann Prey's Electrola recordings to the U.S. and in giving them such splendid presentations. The notes, the albums, the translations are all first rate. Prey ought to be familiar now, he has the most beautiful German baritone in the world today and he generally uses it with discretion and taste as well as artistry. However, because of the involved history of these pressings it is difficult to tell at what stage of his career they caught him. Certainly his recordings for London records have exhibited more general awareness of text (occasionally betraying him into overemphasis). These songs are well sung and the two lesser known cycles are quite satisfactory. The Dichterliebe, though it sounds lovely, doesn't quite make it into the class with Fischer-Dieskau or Ernst Haefliger's versions. Haefliger, of course, has no voice at all, but he makes up for it by superbly intelligent singing. Prey is really coasting on that lovely sound which might be all right for opera but it simply won't work for Lieder.

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
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MASSANA, Canigo, Orchestra and soloists of Gran Teatro de Barcelona (Odeon G73)

This "modern" opera that had its premiere in 1953 is no more modern than Puccini or Cilea and, like them, is full of lush melodies and sweet sounds. Unlike Puccini, however, it isn't very dramatic-that is, the events are but the music isn't All the same, for those seeking obscure operas never to be performed here this is your meat. Find a friend, though, who speaks Spanish if you don't because the libretto is in Catalan and Spanish only. The performance is very idiomatic and the voices are quite good in a modest way . . . somewhat like better members of the Opéra-Com-

Lick your chops and shout hurray! From a live performance in the Library of Congress on April 13, 1940 comes a gem of a recording by two greats of the 20th century. Bartok, unlike most composers of this era, was also a brilliant concert performer. Beethoven's "Kreutzer" receives a charged reading full of strong contrasts though it is not quite as polished as the other performances. The playing of Bartok's Sonata No. 2 and Rhapsody No. 1 must be taken as definitive (and how lucky to have this live performance since Szigeti and Bartok never recorded the Sonata together). But the gem is Debussy's Sonata for Violin and Piano which is played much more straightforwardly than one is used to-no beaded curtains and velvet ties for Bartok and Szigeti. And oh, what a strong, healthy, well-constructed piece of music it becomes in their hands. The sound, of course, is not PHASE 4 but it is perfectly adequate.

SHOSTAKOVICH, Symphony No. 7, "Leningrad", New York Philharmonic, Bernstein, cond. (Columbia M2S 722)

I am too young to have heard this symphony during the war with the emotion that most people seemed to have attached to it. Consequently I find now that I have no violent "reaction" to it's so-called programmatic errors. It strikes me as typical Shostakovich. It is too long for what he has to say, but what he has to say is too important for us to do away with it all together. So like some of Mahler one simply has to slog through the

middle movements in order to reap the rewards of the ones on either end. Bernstein conducts magnificently and the New York Philharmonic give their all. Fine sound.

NOTES ABOVE THE STAVE -

London's new Goetterdaemmerung (OSA 1604) is not perfect (nor will any be until a real Heldentenor breaks through the Magic Fire—Windgassen is essentially giving it a brave but lyrical try) but it is as close as anyone is liable to get on records, to say nothing of the opera house. Solti's superdramatic concept of the score, complete with brilliant brass and percussion playing from the Vienna Philharmonic and stunning aural effects from John Culshaw's team, perfectly suits the rest of his protagonist's abilities.

Angel sends two big delights in small packages, highlights from Martha (Angel 36236) on which Fritz Wunderlich gives another of his magical vocal expositions (known to lesser mortals as "singing"). But why, oh why not a complete version? Also comes a recording of chamber pieces by Poulenc including the Sextour also released by Westminster a few months ago. I prefer Angel's version by Fevrier and the Paris Wind Quintet (Angel 36261). Also included are a jolly Trio for piano, oboe and bassoon and the sweetly melodious Flute Sonata.

Pathé sends a Landowska recording marked IV. I don't know what the others contain but IV devotes one side to Rameau's Suite en Mi. No wonder Landowska was at such pains to rescue Rameau from his undeserved oblivion (COLH 302). More ancient music appears from Eurodisc in an album devoted to Claudio Monteverdi (Euro. 70 900). A complete Combattimento di Tancredi e Clorinda (lightly and pleasingly performed) is coupled with several scenes and arias. The singing is respectable if not the last word in proper ornamentation and the Chamber Society of Lugano is excel-

And for dessert Columbia finally puts the complete Violin and Piano Sonatas of Beethoven as interpreted by Francescatti and Casadesus in one box (Col. D4S 724). The playing needs no endorsement from me, it is as fine as can be heard anywhere and the sound is superlative. One can only humbly thank recording companies for projects like this (before greedily begging for more!)

JAZZ Perspectives

HERB WONG

The Eighth Annual Monterey Jazz Festival will be dominating the Northern California jazz scene during its three day affair September 17-19. "The Tribute to the Trumpet" theme wherein the history of the jazz trumpet will be highlighted brings Dizzy Gillespie into a fitting role as m.c., raconteur and any unexpected zany proffers. Diz is an excellent choice what with his own vital position in the history of the trumpet, his virile, magnetic personality and his familiarity with the festival program operation.

Diz will be featured in the world premier performance of "On the Road to Monterey" written by Walter Gil Fuller who is serving as Festival musical coordinator and who contributed many arrangements to Dizzy's big bebop band of the forties. Another featured jazzwork commissioned for presentation is Fuller's "The Angel City Suite," a four-part suite dedicated to L.A. (Angel City East, Angel City Blues, Sunset Strip and Freeways). One other is pianist Mary Lou Williams' West Coast premiere of St. Martin de Porres-jazz in a liturgical setting. According to Festival manager Jimmy Lyons, Miss Williams will perform this and other works with the MJF Orchestra and a choral group.

Glancing at the Festival program will suffice in getting an impression of the stylistic scope. The Saturday afternoon "Rebel Voices" should be fascinating for those attuned to the more daring approaches in jazz featuring Mingus, Zeitlin and Handy's respective groups. If you dig horns, this is the year to get your jazzears filled.

An award of \$10,000 was made to the Monterey Peninsula College Music Department from the 1964 receipts; a grant of \$5000 toward a musical education of a young jazz artist will be announced. With the unprecedented advance sales of tickets this year, it seems logical to expect the figures will be funneling into the largest gross in MJF's history.





DUKE ELLINGTON
Will Big Bands Come Back?, Reprise 6168

Will they come back? This great band and a few others have never departed although dozens have faded away. Countless albums have been produced to re-create big band epics but Duke only uses the resources of yesteryear as lab material for experimentation and re-interpretation. And how magnificently they are Ellingtonized. Most of the familiar charts such as Kenton's "Artistry in Rhythm," Brown's "Sentimental Journey" and Erskine Hawkins' "Tuxedo Junction" become almost brand new tunes. Attractive cameos out of the genius of Ellington make this, for me, the most appealing Lp released on this label. Dig the high trumpet work on "Woodchopper's Ball"!

Johnny Hodges, Cootie Williams, Cat Anderson, Paul Gonsalves and Lawrence Brown are the chief soloists altho the liner notes completely ignores the specific acknowledgement of solos. Back to the album title query-"Will Big Bands Come Back?"; well, not if a band like this or like Basie's or Herman's is out of the scene. Only such bands with tensile strength, flexible repertoires, exciting soloists, magnetic leadership and very sound business practices can survive the constant perils bucking the longevity of bands. And only such high musicianship, creativity and admirable models can motivate the propagation of other big bands aspiring to be a major member.

BUNKY GREEN
Testifyin' Time, Argo 753

Altoist Green should have most of his dues paid with this release. Like some other jazz talents scuffling on the scene, Bunky continues to fortify his musical profile with maturity by serious matriculation (supported by scholarships), and playing professional gigs of a mixed format, but above it all trying to permeate the veil leading from relative anonymity to solid peer acceptance and finally to general recognition. The album is well planned with refreshing changes of pace. From lovely ballad interpretations as "My

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
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Ship" and pianist William Wallace's "Tamara" through medium groovers like "When the Sun Comes Out" and "On Green Dolphin Street" which is a gas of a version, by the way, on to churchy selections as the title tune, you will discern Bunky's diversity and adaptability of musical thoughts. Better move over a little and make space for Bunky Green who promises to be right "where it's at."

JON HENDRICKS Recorded in Person at the Trident, Smash 67069

Happily I was present at this stimulating recording date in Sausalito's Trident and have eagerly anticipated its release. Consistent with my expectations, the album is a panorama of Hendrick's broad span of musical tastes, approaches and emotions. Jon sings with such a genuine and abundant love of it all; this trait seems to penetrate readily on tunes like "Old Folks" and "One Rose," on jazz standards and fun tunes. The accompaniment is by Noel Jewkes, the fine tenor player, pianist Flip Nunez who has been touring with Jon these six months, bassist Fred Marshall and drummer Jerry Granelli, the musician with the multiple gigs. The spirit of spontaneity of a live session is preserved well and promises many hours of joyous listening. Jon and the Jazz Ensemble will be re-appearing at the Trident beginning September 21. In the meantime get clued in and dig this!

WOODY HERMAN My Kind of Broadway, Columbia 9157

Yeah, here we go again with the most electrifying band in the land. Woody's return to the Columbia stables after close to 20 years absence is ushered here with a wonderfully communicative Lp of show tunes played with such gusto that there is much to rejoice. The band's crisp section work and solos generate immediate, open enthusiasm and animated response. The variety of arrangements, mostly written by the ranks of the band itself including Rader, Govkovich, Romero, Chase and Pierce make up the bulk of the zestful collection punctuated by three charts from the fabulous Bill Holman.

Producer Teo Macero of Columbia did a superb job and I also appreciate the complete compilation of pertinent data—names of arrangers, soloists in correct sequence, and the recording dates. Here's hoping this system of proper crediting will be sustained on future productions. The album displays just one dimension of the Herman band's fantastic stack of charts. And the next Lp featuring this groovy herd will bounce you out of your nut! Watch for it later this year.

EARL HINES

Grand Reunion, Limelight 82020

What with Hines' recent works documented on Columbia, Contact, Focus and Victor in the last three months, the Limelight Lp solidifies the Hines phenomenon and the basis for the showering compliments accorded him in the recent Down Beat Hall of Fame poll expressed by jazz critics. This collection is to me the most attractive from a standpoint of varied settings in particular providing comparatively more chances to hear Hines



in different roles. His orchestral resourcefulness is attractively displayed on a medley of Broadway tunes and on a contrasting set of portraits of Fats Waller on the one hand. On the other, he joins in on "C Jam Blues" with Roy Eldridge and Coleman Hawkins, veteran trumpet and tenor sax stars. Earl and his bassist Ben Tucker and drummer Oliver Jackson give "Little Jazz" Eldridge a helluva medium for his fine hornwork on "Sunday" and Hawkins' intriguing improvisations on "Rosetta." Listen to the album and you may agree that Mr. Hines' multiple talents come off more effusively in this issue than most of the others issued thus far. Nevertheless, very few artists have had five major Lp's in a few short months and showing such an elevated plane of blooming value and significance.

MEL TORME That's All, Columbia 9118

Mel's long-awaited Columbia debut is warmly rewarding. Perhaps this major label and its merchandisnig savior faire will effectively aid in advancing the marvelous music Mel has to offer. Being a devout admirer of Mel for almost 20 years, I can't be less than enthusiastic about any Torme Lp. His background as a jazz-oriented musician adds that X factor many vocalists strive to attain without success; this somewhat elusive entity shows up in a singer such as Mel who wields his vocal instrument in telling a story with credible sincerity and understanding. His uncanny sense of time and innate good taste is enhanced by his distinctively rich smooth textures. The title tune and "The Nearness of You" are strong favorites of mine; the set of tunes includes contemporary material such as "The Second Time Around" and the Brazilianbased "Ho-Ba-La-La."

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

Group T consists mainly of pupils and teachers of the photography department of San Francisco State. The only execption being Phil Palmer who teaches at University of California Extension. Its maximum leader is Jack Welpott whose claim to fame is a luminous anl eloquent picture of two ladies on a porch called: Twins, Stinsville, Indiana. It is not exhibited.

Instead he is represented by a single picture, beautifully printed, of a Chinese gentleman. Apart from a remarkably silky beard there is little else to recommend the photograph.

As a group, T has little to offer the world. It appears to be mostly a mutual admiration society, the members intent on showing the beauty of their souls via clever montages, flat allegories and sexy symbols.


Some members of T deserve special mention. Gil Toibin, a teacher, for his clear and poetic pictures, simple subjects well composed, the message being: here are some things I like, I hope you do, too.

Linda Boyd, whose show was reviewed here last month and who disappointed me by selecting for Group T only her shallowest pictures. A doll, for instance, stabbed with needles, doubleprinted over a spiderweb.

Judy Dater has some shots of a couple making love. The ruthless handling of the situation made me wonder a) what they saw in each other, b) what Miss Dater saw in them, apart from an occasion for being daring. In spite of this, one of the pictures has a haunting tenderness which would

have made it outstanding. But in the midst of similar shots it merely looks like a lucky accident.

Kumilo Matsunami has a strong personality, a fine feeling for form and a crisp printing technique. She is the only photographer in Group T concerned with humanity.




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Watching a Shakespeare Festival is entirely different from being in one, we discovered this year. Marin Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet and As You Like It we never saw, except from backstage. And Henry IV, after playing in its opening performances, was too familiar to appreciate as a spectator.

But the Oregon Shakespeare Festival at Ashland was a horse of a different—did the Bard originate that one?

Here we spent our days lazing in lovely Lithia Park, talking to actors and directors as they passed by—our nights watching the dancers on the green before showtime, and then sitting—without intermission—through the shows. This is the way they should be seen.

Seeing the plays thus is a way to almost, but never quite, reach a surfeit. It is like eating a perfectly served, leisurely banquet, which never reaches the finality of a dessert course.

Things that remain in the memory: the consistently fine acting of Zoe Kamitses (Lady Macbeth, Beatrice, Paulina), Ray Keith Pond (4 plays, 4 leads), Baker Salsbury (busy in all four, and particularly good as Leonato in *Much Ado*), Jim Baker, Peter Froehlich, Pat Patton, William Shepard (a wild Verges), and William Roberts, whose Polixenes was particularly outstanding.

Disappointments in the acting company: Nagle Jackson, whose great potential we first saw in 1959 in Ashland. His Benedick and Autolycus were mannered, identical, over loud characters. His biog claims 1000 performances with the Julius Monk satirical revue. Perhaps this is an indictment of long runs. Kirk Mee, after three good years, bats .500 in this one. His Jack Cade in Henry VI, part 2 is good; his clown in Winter's Tale excellent; his Borachio in Much Ado thought out to the point of extinction; and his Porter in Macbeth, a sweating, puking, most unfunny caricature of a caricature. Susan Hooper, whose audition had impressed us at San Jose State. jumped about in her two lead roles like the little red hen. Only in the scene when as Hero, she appeals to her father in defense of her virginity did she strike the sparks of which she is canable.

Otherwise—a good season, which closes Sept. 11. Volpone, directed by Mr. Jackson, is added to the rep, and plays Sept. 5 and 10.

The biggest development at Ashland, however, is the announcement that plans are going ahead for construction of an indoor theatre, which will allow longer seasons, irregardless of weather—and matinees. We'll have more about this later in the year.

With the ending of the summer festivals, Shakespeare will not leave the Bay Area, for producer Peter Kump of Comedia Repertory Theatre in Palo Alto is presenting Othello, directed by Dean Goodman and starring Brock Peters as the Moor. It opens Sept. 14.

FILMS - MILTON

THE COLLECTOR
William Wyler
Columbia 120 minutes

Since the ascendance of the auteur theory a new game has come into vogue. I call it "Who's Who In The Genre." For instance Minnelli is considered the master of musicals, Ford the last word in western, Cukor is the king of sophisticated comedy, and of course, Hitchcock is the high-priest of mystery. This is all very well, but I think a useful genre has been overlooked. This is the *Prestige Film* genre, and it includes those venerable and honored films which do not quite fit

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in any other genre or go beyond the scope of their original genre by making statements of great significance. For instance George Steven's Shane with its mythopoeic motifs could never be considered a mere western. In the Prestige Film genre William Wyler is second only to Stanley Kramer. Wyler, while the master of no particular genre, has been significant in all of them from the western (The Big Country) to light, romantic comedy (Roman Holiday) to the taboo subject genre (The Children's Hour). Take Ben Hur, winner of thirteen Academy Awards. It could never be considered a mere epic or biblical drama with its leper motif to provide it with additional social significance. In any genre it's a bloody bore. Wyler is a Prestige director. His collection of Academy Awards undoubtedly ranks second only to Walt Disney. After years of being a Prestige director and making Prestige films, Wyler has finally made a good one. Every Wyler film has revealed adeptness in various aspects but all have suffered from Wyler's apparent attitude that audiences may be spoon-fed art after being bludgeoned with significance.

The Collector is good because Wyler, the craftsman, is in full charge. He allows his material to work itself

out while Wyler, the virtuoso, remains quietly, unobtrusively in the background. The Collector is a shocking film, not because it deals with a type of sexual perversion, but because it permits the recognition of the collector in each of us. A superbly played melodrama on the surface, it reveals through details in the work itself and interplay of thematic levels the existence of psychological prisons in which we are all to some degree confined. They key scene, the discussion of The Catcher in the Rye, demonstrates the frustration of the girl in trying to reach someone pathologically cut-off while revealing the inadequacy of communication in general. The use of such an extreme situation intensifies the presence of the problem, and the scene is handled with subtle force and believability. Terrence Stamp's muted, low-key performance blends beautifully with the dampness of the dungeon walls and renders the isolation of Sammantha Eggar complete. Her hysteria echoes from Stamp as well as from every inanimate object in her surroundings. Wyler's deployment of tensions is adroit, and his employment of Maurice Jarre's vibrant music permits the mood of the film to penetrate without distracting. The photography of Robert Surtees and Robert Krasker

is flawless, and attention to detail in all departments is without exception faultless. Although *The Collector* is beautifully made in every respect, its primary impact comes not from what Wyler has done but from what he didn't do. For the first time he completely avoids making a statement. Instead he allows recognition to do the job.

THE SANDPIPER

Vincente Minnelli Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer 100 minutes

Originally I intended to point out that Burton-Taylor films should not be dismissed simply because their (Burton and Taylor) publicity makes them appear so ridiculous. After all their publicity is not their relationship and even it it were this should not affect their value as cinematic properties. After seeing The Sandpiper I would alter this statement in only one respect. Their value as cinematic properties is effected. It is enhanced. Their love scenes take on an added dimension of reality which no two "normal actors could possibly achieve. In fact why punish an actor and actress, forcing them into all sorts of physical contortions and facial hyperbole, to accomplish what Burton and Taylor accomplish by simply be-

ing themselves. Whether the camera actually captures the attraction between them or the attraction is merely an illusion induced by the publicity is not easy to determine. Only the next generation can really let us know. Never mind. They are pleasant enough to watch. The problem is that in so effectively rendering themselves they rather negate the possibility of producing believable characters for a fictional story. This is not terribly important in The Sandpiper, since the story is complete trash. I shall dispose of the plot in a few hot words, so that we may get on to more rewarding aspects of the film. A liberal minister falls in love with a charming if angry young beatnik among the scenic splendors of Big Sur. After sleeping with said beatnik he has a few moral afterthoughts, defrocks himself, leaves his shocked wife (played with frightening frigidity by Eva Marie Saint) and his passionate paramour to drive alone into the sunset where we presume he will "find himself." This would be no more objectionable than any other Hollywood story if Dalton Trumbo hadn't planted so many messages of defiance in the dialogue. The pretense to hoest and frankness is only a front. Audiences are treated to the titillating spectable of a naughty preach while comforted by neo-victorian assurances that no moral man could be happy after doing what he did. Now I say no heterosexual man in his right mind after being booted out of bed by his wife is going to drive alone to Ensenada, Mexico if Elizabeth Taylor is waiting for him. Come on, Ransohoff, we're not chil-

Minnelli's direction continues to be assured, stimulating and eloquent. The Sandpiper is his most lyrical statement (and I don't mean those opening shots of the boy chasing the deer through the wood). Milton Krasner's camera alternates between sweeping gull-like over sun-drenched sand and serene water and hovering very close to Taylor. Not since Garbo has a woman's beauty been used so effectively to evoke the poetry of the film. The camera seems almost to caress, and there are several long moments during which the camera sensitively records the radiance of this glorious woman in repose. Johnny Mandell's score, rich with jazz flutes, provides an almost shearing-like background of wistful but warm sensuality. Altogether the film is a bomb, but there are at least forty minutes of footage which makes worthwhile wading through another sixty of platitudes.



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SOUND ADVICE

Some answers on stereo. "Can I place my stereo speakers one on each side of the room?" Have you ever been to a dance where half of the orchestra was on the stage and the other half at the back of the ballroom, or at a concert where half of the orchestra was on the stage and the other half in the balcony? Separating your speakers to each side of the room or on opposite walls rips your program material apart, and it cannot be natural sound. Ideally for most rooms, the speakers should be on the same side of the room along the same wall and from 6 to 10 feet apart depending on whether the room is a small one or a large one.

"Because it is a stereo system is it a better sounding system than the conventional monaural system that we call Hi-Fi?" Certainly not. An inexpensive portable stereo phonograph with tiny speakers in the lid will still have a very limited sound range not much better than pocket transistor sets. Stereo merely gives an illusion of dimension. The quality and range of the sound is dependent entirely on the components and speaker systems that make up the unit. A full range high quality monaural system will sound infinitely better than an inexpensive stereo system.

A quality stereo system is made up of two quality full range monaural systems, usually combined with one set of controls. It has to be a good monaural system before it can be a good stereo system.

"Stereo is false, I like my monaural Hi-Fi system better." Many people make the above statement. Usually, they make this statement because they have never been exposed to a properly placed good stereo unit. In a monaural system, even those with the greatest full range fidelity, the sound of an entire 60 piece symphony orchestra comes from one spot generally 12 to 15 inches in diameter. The entire orchestra is a pin-point of sound instead of being spread across an entire stage; so even though the sound may be superb, it still lacks the naturalness of being spread out. A quality stereo system can have the same full range sound of the above monaural system; however, the sound will seem to be spread across a larger wall area. This then is the real difference between stereo and monaural. It is not the quality of the sound, but the dimensional effect added to the sound that makes stereo more realistic.

"I'm told that you do not get static on FM, but I get static." "Although there isn't supposed to be static on FM, I can here ignition noise when cars go by." "If FM is noise free, why do I get background hiss and noise in the background of the program material?" "FM is a full range method of broadcasting, yet the stations on my set sound distorted and fuzzy, why?"

These and many other statements and questions can be answered by an understanding of FM reception. Many people spend a considerable amount of money for an FM music system, but neglect to spend money for a good FM antenna system. No matter how expensive or how good an FM tuner or receiver is, it cannot and I repeat cannot perform adequately unless it has a sufficient amount of signal, and a pure signal. To have an FM system without an antenna is like having a swimming pool without piping to supply the pool with water. The pool is of no value without water, just as an FM unit is of no value without signal.

It is true, that the FM method of broadcasting rejects static type noise and interference; however, this rejection will occur only if the FM tuner receives a sufficient amount of signal. What is a sufficient amount of signal?

This condition is specified as useable sensitivity, and if IHFM (Insti-



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tute of High Fidelity Manufacturers) standards are used, the specification will give the amount of signal in millionths of a volt that is required by the FM tuner to reject the total noise and distortion to a level 30db lower than the program material. A level 30db lower means a noise level having a voltage about 32 times lower than the voltage of the program material. This amount of quieting is deemed sufficient for good listening. For an inexpensive FM unit the specifications for useable sensitivity may be 10 microvolts for 30db of quieting; whereas for quality FM tuners or receivers the sensitivity may be from 1.8 microvolts for 30db of quieting up to 2.5 microvolts for 30db of quieting. In other words, if your set requires 5 microvolts for full quieting (30db) and the set is only receiving 3 microvolts, your set will have background noise and hiss, and it may also have severe distortion. Connecting a good FM antenna to the set will increase the signal and clear up the distortion and noise caused by lack of signal.

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A SELFISH VIEWPOINT - By Norman Sturgis

San Francisco Area people, as a generality, are the nicest people in America—a view shared by thousands who visit here. The cosmopolitan milieu blends with and is enhanced by the city's physical beauty, and all around the world people told us how they loved San Francisco better than any other city in the United States. In my twenty-four years in theatre I feel I've learned something about the kind of people who go to the theatre, and I am convinced that San Franciscans would flock to the theatre. IF GOOD THEATRE WERE AVAILABLE TO THEM REGULARLY, CONVENIENTLY AND ECONOMICALLY.

In Europe good theatre is available consistently and at nominal prices. West Germany, for example, with a population of 53,000,000, has 121 full time theatres, employing a great many actors, writers, directors, scenic artists, technicians, etc. (Curtains, K. Tynan). The United States, with about 195 million people, has fewer than 50 professional theatres, only a few of which are full time and which employ very few people. (The Performing Arts, McGraw-Hill, 1965, Rockefeller report). East Germany has twice as many theatres for its population as does West Germany. and neither in East Germany nor in Russia are the majority of the plays done for propaganda purposes. Except in America, theatre is recognized as a vital need of society, and theatres are subsidized until they can become selfsustaining, as they almost always do. It would be beyond the comprehension of most theatre people in Europe that any theatre with a subsidy could operate for thirteen years and fail to build a large audience, as in the case of the Actor's Workshop.

Ionesco says in his Notes and Counter Notes (Grove Press, 1964) that avant-garde plays should have theatres seating no more than "fifty to a hundred" specialists. As one of the leading avant-garde writers, he is fully aware that the public is not expected to fill large theatres to see his

experiments, and yet this is what the Actor's Workshop asked of the public in many instances. Writers and theatre people in general have a stake in such experiments—and sometimes the avant-garde does establish a beachhead that is a true forerunner of a new form of drama, but these experiments are not the final forms themselves. The avant-garde, the "vanguard," as M. Ionesco discovered in his Larousse dictionary, "are the troops which precede an armed land, sea or air force and prepare the way for its entry into action." The avant-garde writers simply are not meant to capture the public.

It is ludicrous to expect people to go to a theatre if they don't have experiences there which please them in some way. As the Rockefeller report points out, theatre, to succeed, must be "relevant," i.e., meaningful to people of average intelligence, not just to pedants and specialists. To the great artists of theatre, past and present, this was and is an obvious truth, but today there are a great many theatre people—particularly in our universities and in amateur theatres-who seem to regard theatre as an art that can somehow exist in a vacuum. I have heard a collegetrained little-theatre director say, after an audience failed to respond to his production of an esoteric play, "Well, to hell with them. We did a good job." They DID NOT do a "good job." The audience was perfectly willing to be pleased, the actors were all wrapped up in themselves—the play was not comprehensible even to the director. The public who paid admission was as surely cheated as they'd have been had they paid for a juicy steak and been served fried bees.

Theatre, to deserve a regular and large audience, can serve up exciting and meaningful works of theatrical art, but it cannot expect to exist by ignoring the audience—by pleasing itself only. The art of theatre is a dynamic art that has absolutely no static existence. The art "takes place," it doesn't hang on a gallery wall. It exists only dur-

I have been working professionally in theatre for 24 years as a director, actor and writer. My wife, Laura James. has been an actress and singer for 14 years. We have appeared in, or I have directed, over two hundred and ten major stage, film and television productions, primarily in

New York City and Hollywood, but also in London, Rome, Nairobi, Manila and Hong Kong. Each of us is a member of Actor's Equity Association, Screen Actor's Guild and the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists.

We left New York City, where there was little work, in 1955, for Hollywood, where it seemed there was a trend toward live television production and more stage productions. There was, for awhile, and we did quite well financially, but, as in New York, the only work that paid was almost wholly uncreative. We began a workshop wherein

people in the "industry" could come and work creatively, and we put on a few productions. It had many good members. Jack Albertson, recently here in SUBJECT WAS ROSES, and winner of the "Tony" award, was a member—but even the creative outlet of the workshop wasn't enough

to counteract the automating monstrosity that is Hollywood.

In 1960 we packed and left the United States in search
of a right to work creatively in our art. Except for labor
nermit problems and language difficulties we would doubt

permit problems and language difficulties we would doubtless have stayed overseas, probably in London, where we

appeared for two and a half months at Peter Cook's THE ESTABLISHMENT, did a request performance for Princess Margaret at the Savoy, a special BBC-TV show, etc., but the need to obtain special permits for each job made it impractical to live there or elsewhere, so, in 1964 we decided we must return to the United States.

After long consideration, we realized that neither Hollywood nor New York City would be bearable, and so decided upon San Francisco, my favorite city in the U.S.. through I had only been here for a run of Odets' THE COUNTRY GIRL.

So in mid-1964 we arrived in this city, full of hope that we would be able to work creatively in our art. theatre, and also be able to eat. We contacted virtually all the theatre companies in the area—and we found we were thirsty people in a desert. We still are.




ing the actual moments of performance, with the audience and the actors interacting. The audience is an absolutely essential *part* of theatre art. And the public is not pedantic. not scholarly, not specialized.

Irrelevant theatre, esoteric theatre, is a private art, not for the public—who cannot be a part of it, nor have they any reason to be. From the beginning of theatre until today, theatre at its best—the theatre that has been considered great—has communicated strongly to the public-as-a-whole, and that public has never been required to take a course in theatre in order to be able to enjoy it. That kind of theatre—well-done and "relevant" theatre—is almost non-existent in San Francisco. It's no wonder there's only a small theatre-going audience!

Artists have always "starved in garrets" rather than work in conventional jobs. In U.S.A.-a go-go, there aren't any more garrets. Artists are forced to work in conventional jobs or be arrested as vagrants, or steal, or compromise their art to the commercial world and become a Norman Rockwell or a Kirk Douglas, both of who might have become fine artists had they not been forced or lured into the pandering milieu of the commercial "art" field in order to live. Possibly never before in history has a true artist had a more difficult existence than in the United States today.

This conclusion of the Rockefeller panel's exhaustive study of theatre artists, is true: "The miserable income of

the majority reflects both a shortage of jobs and the brief duration of employment that is available. . . . Of the actors who do find jobs, well over half are employed for only ten weeks—less than one-fifth of the year. Far too many artists must still rely for the major portion of their income on employment not connected with the arts. Quality of performance is inevitably subjected to severe strains as a result of this vicious circle of inadequate pay and limited opportunity." (P. 17).

It is simply impossible for an actor to do his best work if he has to be an IBM machine or a dishwasher all day and Hamlet at 8:30 p.m. And if the actors in a play aren't excellent, the audience is not going to be very entertained or enlightened, no matter how "relevant" the play. If we are to have theatre in the United States that will increase the number of theatre-goers, the actors, et al, must be freed from the need to work at other jobs. America is almost alone among modern nations in not realizing this and acting upon it. The recently approved National Foundation of the Arts and Humanities bill is a step in the right direction, but will provide existence for only a tiny number of the theatre artists of America, who have

struggled for many years with almost no hope whatsoever of a decent income, much less "security."

San Francisco can obtain the dedicated services of some of this country's finest actors for about \$3000 a year each. Anyone who might think this isn't true simply doesn't know the state of theatre in this country. I wrote an article for Theatre Arts magazine while my wife and I were in Hong Kong, and the article stated that we hoped to start a theatre company there, paying minimum salary. Within two months we received over 200 applications from good actors all over the United States. Such a published statement re San Francisco would elicit at least twice that response. Broadway is very sick—and has been for years. Hollywood is intolerable. San Francisco is unborn theatrically, except for the Actor's Workshop's specialized approach to theatre. If this city wants a fine company of actors, writers, director, et al, it can get them at a very reasonable cost. The building in which they perform isn't of much importance, despite the loud protestations to the contrary. A warm barn will do.

"Snobbery" is rampant in San Francisco-not among the people in general, but in certain segments of the population, namely certain of the "social elite" and quite a number of university-trained theatre people who have little or no actual experience in theatre. Generalizing, these people tend to regard anything with popular appeal as "below them," as non-art. Only the "in" playwrights, actors, novelists, etc., can possibly be worth their attention. They have a perfect right to these views ,but unfortunately they often are able to impose their narrow views upon the public-because many of them have a great deal of money or other forms of power which can influence the art diet of the city. Their spokesmen in the tragically little "press" we have laud the esoteric and curse or ignore the "relevant." Their spokesmen in politics propose grandiose schemes for magnificent buildings to house their favorite art formsinstead of planning means of making all forms of art available conveniently and economically to the public.

The university-graduate theatre-snobs take their toll of the public by running little theatres when they get off work-and doing the kind of theatre their teachers told them was "good theatre," and doing it badly, thus discouraging future audiences, who tend to confuse the media with the inferiority of the production. These people, being almost wholly inexperienced, know practically nothing about how to create exciting productions, and their choice of plays is pre-determined. To both groups of "snobs," there is a world of difference between the "commercial" theatre and "artistic" theatre, and other forms of art, and the difference is determined by one basic question: "How hard is it to understand?" If it's almost totally incomprehensible, it must be excellent, so they do it. They worship the word—not the art. They worship the reputation—not the art. Ubiquitously, the snobs are anti-public, anti-art, pro-selfrighteousness, pro-selfish-art. Bless them. Let them enjoy themselves—at their own expense, not the public's.

I won't be so presumptuous as to attempt a definition of art, but I will try to point out the difference between commercial "art" and non-commercial art. A writer in Hollywood has one basic job—to assemble formulae into scripts. Through the years, producers have learned how to pander to the lowest common denominators of humanity—the emotions of sex, violence, etc.—and a Hollywood movie or television show is nothing on earth but an employment of these pre-conceived panderings—these formula situations, movements, etc.—in slightly varying disguises known as New Films or New TV Series. ART

Crafts and manual skills were featured in a number of winter shows in the Bay Area. The most impressive was the exhibition of Contemporary French Tapestries at the California Palace of the Legion of Honor, and probably the one leaving the deepest imprint on local artists was the 23rd National Ceramic Exhibition at the San Francisco Museum of Art, an annual survey made by the Syracuse Museum in New York on current trends in American ceramic arts which is the largest and most important national exhibition of its kind.


Since the Syracuse project tends to set the pace for the nation's ceramists, we may be in for a spell of pre-archaic pottery, rude in shape, grandiose in scale and very sober in color. Pottery, as an art form, seems to have come full circle. From Paleolithic to paleolithic.

The earthy brown and gray tones that have long dominated in the field of pottery (since the influence of Japanese folk pottery after World War II) and which are to some extent essential to expression in clay, were the only colors to be found in this show with the exception of two pieces-Nicholas Vergette's sculpture resembling a tower of pot slices and segments, glazed with melon-yellows and orange, Franz Wildenhain's polychromed hand-built stoneware sculpture titled "Tropical Growth" in which the rubbery volumes of fruits and stems were emphasized with muted purple and green. One suddenly longed for a "big red" to break the monotony.

There was reference to Pop Art in Janet Braley's big wall slab, striped with black and white slip and interrupted by a field of natural brown in burlap texture, which strongly suggested a flag. And a whimsical touch was provided by Kenneth Dierk's relief sculpture, "Innocent City", which presented the facade of a story-book city complete with peopled balconies, window-sill still life, gables pigeons, even an eccentric bachelor with a pet lion. Dierk is from El Cerrito.

Concepts and themes, materials and techniques, functions whether social or aesthetic, have all broken away from the traditions of the past, according to Mildred Constantine, associate curator, Department of Architecture and Design, Museum of Modern Art, New York. The colorful and exciting exhibition of Contemporary French Tapestries substantiates her thesis.

"Even the lines distinguishing the fine and the applied arts have become uncertain, and in fact seem to be fast disappearing," she points out in the introduction to the catalogue which accompanies the show.

A circumstance of which the average gallery goer is wholly aware. But the Legion show seemed to bring the point into sharp focus, even more than did the Syracuse annual, although that exhibition made it abundantly clear that pottery is no longer limited to the making of vessels and vases, nor is sculpture confined to working in stone, wood or bronze.

In the applied arts it is among the textile arts where new character and new spirit have emerged most strikingly. Technological ingenuity, experimentation with and manipulation of new materials have stimulated innovations in design, and these have caused us to revise our concepts of these crafts and have created a new kind of enthusiasm in the designer and the public alike.

Yet the art of tapestry, tenaciously withstanding 20th century innovations, has held firm to its traditions and character. The dominant feature of tapestries throughout the past centuries, and including the 20th century, is its reliance on essentially one material—wool (sometimes combined with silk)—with its richness of dimension produced by the closeness of the weave, the depth of pile, the texture of the weave itself.

First designed to break the drafts created by cold stone walls in the Middle Ages, later to decorate the churches and illustrate the Mass, and to divide great baronial halls into suites for important guests as well as elaborate the social position and extol the historical importance of the hosts, tapestry evolved from a utilitarian function into an aesthetic one often far removed from its original purpose.

The use of tapestries had declined by the end of the 18th century and it remained for the 20th century artist, with his continuing search for new forms from old, to return to the ancient art form and revitalize it with the poetry of his own time.

New Classical Recordings STEPHANIE VON BUCHAU

BACH, Brandenburg Concerti/Orchestral Suites 2 & 3, Berlin Philharmonic, Karajan, cond. DGG 138 976/8

I approach new recordings by Herbert von Karajan with trepidation because, although I admire his talent, I am put off by his unpredictability. I would have enjoyed waiting for this current offering much more if I had remembered two things: 1) that in his early days as a conductor Karajan used to lead Baroque music from his seat at the second harpsichord-an indulgence no longer possible for a busy, international General musikdirektor, and 2) that whatever his peculjarities of interpretation, Karajan has always been master of the musical "line"—the basis of counterpoint of which Bach is the greatest exponent.

Thus we have what to my ear is the finest set of *Brandenburgs* on record—a set, furthermore, that will outlive the ridiculous implications of the wording on the spine of the box:
J. S. BACH—HERBERT VON KARAJAN. That's a composition I never

knew that Bach had written; and if DGG thinks that is doing a service to their start conductor they are crazy... for it is precisely the fact that he does not "star" that makes this set cherishable.

In the first place the orchestra members play so well that after two minutes you forget they are there at all and are able to give full concentration to the music. In the second, DGG has provided a warm, spacious acoustic with none of that dry, cramped, "look at us, we're intimate!" feeling that makes me wish I were a sportswriter.

And in the third place the conductor is evident only in so far as his dynamic rhythmic presence can be felt at the start of each concerto. Once everyone is going, he fades out and the dialogue commences. That between flute, violin and Edith Picht-Axenfeld's harpsichord in No. 5 is the most ravishing musical sound I've heard in years.

In the Suites the boss is definitely back making high-powered noises, fine in their way but not magical. Why only two Suites are included is a mystery in any case since they are contained on one record. DGG might either have added the other two to make a complete set, or better (since it only raises the price of the Branden-burgs), have left them out altogether.

TCHAIKOVSKY, Symphonies No. 1 & 2, Vienna Phil./Maazel, London CS 6426 and CS 6427 Piano Concerti No. 2 & 3, Graffman/Ormandy, Columbia MS 6755

Here is a triple issue of rare Tchai-kovsky for which I wish I could work up enthusiasm. Graffman prefers these two concerti to the overworked No. 1, but I find it hard to agree. They are exceedingly bombastic, with violent fortissimi, crashing double octaves for the piano and little of the singing melody that distinguishes the tired No. 1. Graffman and Ormandy squeeze every bit of surface bravura out of them both.

The Symphony No. 1, "Winter Reveries," is one of my underground favorites, but I defy anyone to find much revery in Maazel's straightforward presentation. If this work had the barnacles that the last three have accumulated such a clean-cut, precise approach might be valuable, but if you want to hear this (and the sparsely developed No. 2) played with the poetic, romantic touch they require try Dorati's new versions on Epic.

FALLA, La Vida Breve, de los Angeles, Barcelona Opera, Odeon LALP 142 ROSSINI, Le Comte Ory, Glyndebourne/Gui, cond. Odeon QALP 10200/1

Re-issue of famous recordings now out of print in America is always a cause for celebration. Here are two causes imported from Europe by Odeon. The young de los Angeles is splendid in this only recording of

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
Falla's opera. The fourth side contains a recital of Spanish songs in which the soprano, accompanied by Gerald Moore, is in spectacular voice.

Comte Ory, in the Glyndebourne production starring Juan Oncina and Monica Sinclair, is my favorite Rossini opera. It contains beautiful music, lots of fun (if you aren't squeamish about kidding religious institutions) and an ensemble (in Act II) that is as great as anything Rossini ever wrote. Again, it is the only performance available and it is super.

BEETHOVEN, "Rasumovsky" & "Harp" Quartets, Juilliard String Quartet, Epic BSC 152 BRAHMS, Quartets (complete) & SCHUMANN, Quintet in E-flat, Budapest/Serkin, Columbia M2S 734

The Julliard String Quartet give a demonic interpretation of the "Rasumovsky" quartets, fine in its way but difficult to swallow at one sitting. They play like fiends and Beethoven, after all, can take it, but I really don't see why he should have to. If you like the Middle Quartets coming at you like the White Plains Express you'll like this set. If you prefer them a bit more gemuetlich, try the Fine Arts.

No such reservations for the Buda-



pest's re-recording of the complete Brahms set in stereo. It's echt and ultimate. Serkin joins them for the Schumann Piano Quintet with results only slightly less inspiring than their version of the Brahms Quintet in F issued last year.

DONIZETTI, Don Pasquale, Maggio Musicale/ Gracis, DGG 138 971/2

Here is a rare bird: a recording of a complete opera by a major company in which not one singer is an international star that simply, by virtue of excellent ensemble, clean singing and brilliant conducting, wipes up the opposition. Ettore Gracis is the hero, conducting with brisk fervor, pointing the recitative and making the Maggio Musicale sound like a first class band.

Anna Maccianti, with the sharp,

bitter quality of an Italian soprano's very forward production, sings clean coloratura and gives her shrewish characterization lots of bite. Alfredo Mariotti is almost too elegant and stylish as Don Pasquale; one wonders why he is still on the marriage mart. Ugo Benelli is not in as good voice as on London's Cenerentola but he is still that rarity among Italians: a tenore digrazia who sounds like a man. DGG's clean surfaces and lack of gimmicky effects contribute to a snappy performance that gives only pleasure.

BERLIOZ, Requiem, Temple University Choirs, Volletti, Ormandy, Columbia M25 730

I want to like this performance because there isn't a really satisfactory interpretation on records and certainly no sonically acceptable one. Columbia has done everything to make it a success but I begin to suspect it is an impossible task. The brass bands don't stand out, the shimmer of the cymbals behind the tenor's Sanctus is inaudible, all of Berlioz's felicitous, impossible touches are missing. In addition my review copy had a high degree of surface noise.

Ormandy does surprisingly, even heroically, well with what he has but the Philadelphia Orchestra naturally has no French brass (with small bore) and the Temple University Choirs are amateur at best. I made the mistake of auditioning this set after listening to the Singverein on Karajan's new Brahms Requiem. There is a great chorus. Temple is only adequate, it doesn't have the quick response or sheer weight of adulthood to make it great. And Valletti is under par in his solo. It is fiendishly difficult, I know, but difficult things must not sound so or they become unbearable.

If you are looking for sonics, this comes as close as anything is like to. As for performance you can toss a coin between Ormandy, Munch on Victor (also the wrong brass sound and middling sonics) and Scherchen on Westminister—the right sound but the wrong style. Poor Berlioz.





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Jazz Perspectives

As per cyclical pattern of jazz activity of the past several years, February is the year's harbinger of Bay Area jazz. BSW will be the hub of big band jazz starting February 2 with Woody Herman and then Count Basie zooms in on the 7th. Incidentally, trumpeter Marvin Stamm and tenor man Bob Pearson from Detroit have been sparking the wailing Herman Herd as recent new members. Check out the new Lp "Woody's Winners"it'll singe you. I'll be airing it on my KJAZ Sunday and Monday night broadcasts if you want to cop a preview.

The month will also see the Stanford jazz program streaming with its gallery of jazz features, the release of many new jazz records on the scene, and the likes of Monk, Hank Crawford and Jimmy Smith swinging on North Beach. Denny Zeitlin's trio appearing every Monday at Sausalito's Trident will have its exciting new Columbia disc issued; it was recorded live at the Trident and is titled "Shining Hour."

JOHN COLTRANE

The Last Trane, Prestige 7378

Representing the remnants of Coltrane's pre-60's performances on this label, the four essays from two different sessions provide some very satisfying and rich Coltrane vocabulary. Trumpeter Donald Byrd plays on the quintet date—Lover and Come Rain or . . . More rewarding are the pair of Coltrane blues—Slowtrain and By the Numbers, the latter containing some wonderful Red Garland piano. This Lp is essential to Coltrane devotees. John Coltrane was recently named Downbeat Magazine's "Jazzman of the Year."

ERIC DOLPHY

In Eurape, Valume 3, Prestige 7366

This set of extended recordings offers further documentation of the late Dolphy's development which was cessated with his death in 1964. Ably backed by a fine Danish r.s., Dolphy's alto work on Gillespie's bebop tune Woody'n You with fresh construction lends deeper insight to the power Eric possessed. Switching to bass clarinet on When Lights Are Low Eric

exploits the instrument unhesitatingly with imagination. Finally, the three takes of *In the Blues* are a beautiful study of jazz improvisational development.

EDDIE HARRIS

The in Sound, Atlantic 1448

Tenor saxist Harris plays in a diversity of persuasions in his debut Atlantic Lp; it is his most interesting Lp to date. His previous efforts on VeeJay and Columbia leaned toward a more stereotypical format and didn't really provide for outlets that this Lp represents. From the Love Theme of The Sandpiper to the avant gardish Freedom Jazz Dance, Harris' variety of references and inspirations shows an "open mind" and a style which may yet be amalgamated into a "Harris Sound".

GERRY MULLIGAN

Feelin' Good, Limelight LS-86030


Baritonist Mulligan's new album is beautiful. After his last Lp when he served up a platter of top pop, folk and rock tunes, this nice collection of Julian Lee arrangements is filled with warm sincerity and delicate taste. Opening with The Lonely Night which is really Gerry's own Night Lights first recorded on a Philips Lp. it sets the tone for the entire set. I'll Walk Alone has been a favorite tune of mine for many years and it hasn't been recorded any more than three or four times since it was an old "hit parade" tune of the 40's and Martha Tilton had a nice Capitol 78 disc and Ella on Decca. Gerry's thorough ease in swinging is a joy to listen to. He plays both baritone sax and clarinet here. The title "Feelin' Good" is apropos because Mulligan plays that way and you'll be feelin' good too when you acquire the recording.

OSCAR PETERSON

With Respect to Nat, Limelight LS-86029

Oscar whose vocal interpretations are very close to the late Nat Cole's style and timbre makes this a haunting

set of tunes from Nat's repertory. Recorded in Hollywood, the charts featuring the trio of O.P., Ray Brown and former member of the trioguitarist Herb Ellis, include favorites such as It's Only A Paper Moon, Sweet Lorraine, Gee Baby Ain't 1 Good To You (an excellent track!) and the big hit Straighten Up and Fly Right from the Cole trio of over 20 years past. The big band charts were recorded with NYC studio musicians and present clean performances. Oscar sings admirably well and the Lp should get plenty of air play and evoke much nostalgia.



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

Most music that we hear on the radio originates from phonograph records. One of the very important links in the conveyance of sound to our ears is the pickup cartridge that rides the grooves of the records and converts the wiggles of the stylus to electrical energy. What types of cartridges are there? What are the differences?

The most common cartridges found in the inexpensive phono systems and radio consoles are the CRYSTAL and the CERAMIC types. The crystal pickup is made up of a small bit of crystaline material (as mined from the earth) that has a mechanical attachment from the crystal to the stylus. When the stylus wiggles in the grooves, it stresses the crystal bending it back and forth. The crystals used for pickup cartridges have the ability to create electricity when stressed. Thus from the stylus through the crystal, electrical impulses are produced that can be amplified for audible sound. The voltage produced by crystal cartridges varies from about 1/2 to 1 volt which is a considerably high voltage output for a cartridge. The ceramic cartridge is much the same as the crystal type except that the element is a man made ceramic element instead of a crystal.

The advantages of a crystal or ceramic cartridge are its high voltage output, and the fact that its electrical output comes out with even intensity throughout the audible spectrum without having to tailor (equalize) the response of the amplifier. Set manufacturers can use less amplifier tubes in the design. The disadvantages are the limited frequency response, the heavy tracking force (weight on the record groove) required, and the stiffness of the needle assembly. The crystal unit can be damaged by heat or moisture, whereas the ceramic is not affected. In general, the crystal and ceramic cartridges have poor sound quality and are hard on record grooves.

The most popular cartridge used in quality phono and music systems is the MAGNETIC type. There are many versions of the magnetic type. The most common type is the design that has a coil or coils of wire instead of the crystal element, and a small

magnet is mechanically connected to the stylus. Since the stylus does not have to stress a substance, but just has to wiggle, it can be made with less stiffness (compliance). The coils have metal cores called pole pieces. When the magnet is wiggled across the pole pieces a minute voltage is produced. This voltage is on the order of 2 millivolts to 10 millivolts.

The magnetic type has many advantages over the crystal or ceramic type. It requires very little tracking force. It has a very wide range frequency response. With equalization of the amplifier response, the audio output is very linear. The distortion produced is very low. The disadvantages are its low output which requires extra preamplifier tubes in the electronics; its susceptibility to hum pickup from surrounding circuits; and because of its low output voltage, it requires quality preamplifier circuitry and components to raise the output voltage of the cartridge without adding hum.



Magnetic cartridges are made with several stylus assemblies. The commonly used stylus is a conical shaped point with a 0.7 mil radius for stereo records, 1 mil radius for monaural records, and 3 mil radius for 78 records. The mechanical stylus mounting assembly for stereo cartridges comes in several compliances (stiffnesses). The less compliant (stiffer) cartridges are made for average record changers and should be tracked with a weight of 4 to 7 grams. The medium compliant cartridges are made for quality changers and should be tracked from 3 to 4 grams. The highest compliant

On Stage

KARL BARRON

With Moliere's *Don Juan*, the Actor's Workshop really fell into stride for its 1965-66 season, giving an exciting, even, well-acted. well-directed production.

Using a translation by Robert Goldsby (presently at U of C) Tom Gruenewald managed to keep his actors moving at a fast pace despite the inevitable long speeches of Moliere's period. Mr. Gruenewald, on loan from White Oaks Theatre, Carmel Valley, deserves all kinds of commendation for his direction, as does Joan Larkey for her ingenious settings, hauled up on a large ring with a minimum of stage hand intrusion.

Anyone who thinks Moliere is dated should prepare to listen carefully to his lines, as he takes off on everything from tobacco to the church. There is little in this play which cannot be tied into present day civilization. (Even the suspension of hostilities for reasons of "honor.")

Topping the uniformly good cast are Anthony Smith as Don Juan and Barton Heyman as his servant, Sganarelle. Heyman, whose Edward 11 gave the flavor of a mannered actor, comes forth as an earthy scoundrel as real as your garbage man.

Smith, whom we liked as the Devil in last summer's Music at the Vine-yards production of L'Histoire du Soldat, comes into a completely rounded role here which allows him full scope for a fine talent.

Don Juan points himself up as a character we should dislike. Unscupulous in his dealings with women, he is also responsible for the death (perhaps murder) of The Commander, played with magnificent stone-facedness by Robert Benson.

Yet despite his villainies, despite the rejection of his father, and ultimate cheating "conversion" to religion, never once are we out of sympathy with Smith's Juan. He handles bits of low comedy as expertly as he does his usual suavity, and for our money should be marked as the Workshop's most promising actor of the year.

Alfred Leberfeld as the aging, foppish and terribly respectable father, makes the most of his role, while C. David Colson contributes a polished performance as the brother of one of Juan's various wives.

Dona Elvire, the wife, is played by Rhoda Gemignani, who once again proves that here is an actress who was trapped in small parts during the Workshop's previous regime, and who, when given the opportunity, can bring emotion, pathos. and full depth to a character.

Goldsby has translated (or Gruene-wald invented—we don't know which) a hill-billy quality into the scene between Pierrot and Charlotte, two simple fisher-folk. As bounced through by Tom Tarpey and Nancy Bond, it is hysterical. Miss Bond, who displayed almost her all in *The Last Analysis*, here is dressed, (though threatening not to be) but displays a delightful talent for dead-pan comedy.

The part of Dimanche, the tradesman, although small, becomes a well-rounded character in the hands of David O. Stiers.

If it's still playing when you read this, try to catch the show. It's an evening well-spent.

Notes: Joe DePauw, with whom we worked at Contemporary Theatre last year, is taking over production at the International Repertory Theatre. As this is written, we're waiting for his announcement for a six play season,

FILMS - MILTON MIRON

1965 - THE YEAR OF THE BEATLE

Although their popularity probably peaked in 1964, the Beatles were most imitated in 1965. In this era of cheap adulation it is not enough to trigger waves of teen-age hysteria, one must aso inspire hordes of adolescent imitators. The Beatles in their race toward immortality have left in the track a hobbling field of hirsute singing groups and have now joined the Elysian company of Frank Sinatra and Elvis Presley, the only post-war pacesetters. Like popular idols before them the Beatles are in danger of imitating themselves (the temptation to cash in on their own fad is very large), but they have one thing working for them which the sincerity of Sinatra and the sensuality of Presley precluded: irreverence. If the Beatles continue to take only their work, not themselves, seriously, they could delight audiences for years. In any case they are certain to be around until the current thirst for irreverence is slaked.

Irreverence characterizes the core of feeling from which some of the most successful films of the past year sprang. Irreverence toward everything including irreverence appears to be password now in high producing circles, and all films must be decorated with it like department store windows displaying the latest fashionable colors. All fads have their phonys, and in this case the most blatant examples expose themselves by lampooning targets which no one holds in reverence. Excess irreverence may have been fathered by over-formula, but it can only leave in its wake audience exhaustion for frivolity which in small doses is the leaven of life.

The irreverent films of 1965 can be lumped into three general categories: (1) irreverance toward social conventions and institutions, best illustrated by the films of Richard Lester (2) irreverance toward cinema conventions and techniques of which only Godard is capable of constant coups (3) irreverance toward reality as typified by the Bond films. Only What's New Pussycat? completely defied classification, cutting a broad swath across all categories.

At any given period a nation's artistic vitality can be measured by the quantity of artists producing quality work. This is particularly true of the cinema where a director's work must reflect his awareness of the work be-

ing done around him. Each film should not only stand alone as an entity but should also form part of the dialogue of the film community. Nowhere in the world is the situation healthier than in England where so many capable young directors are working in a dynamic producing climate with such a large pool of available acting and technical talent. This year my list of best films include six British films and one quasi-British film made in England in English by a Polish director. A remarkable record for a country that only ten years ago could offer no one better than Anthony Asquith.

France is in a decline. Production has fallen off considerably, and a large segment of what remains is devoted to cute little capers with Belmondo. Godard continues to grind out three a year, but one director doesn't make a cinema as evidenced by those lonely giants of Denmark, Sweden and Spain. Where is the new talent? In fact where is the old talent: Truffaut, Chabrol, Malle, Renoir, de Broca, Resnais? If any of these people produce, 1966 cannot help but be a better year than 1965.

Italy produced the most disappointments in 1965. Tremendous talent is being vitiated on superfluous superproductions with international casts in stories so silly even Hollywood at its worst would wince. Speaking of Hollywood at its worst. 1965 was the all time low ebb in American film production, John Ford's flawed but eloquent Cheyenne Autumn being the high water mark. The break-up of the studio system did not bring about the long awaited increase in independent productions, only a steady exodus to Europe. The flourishing Underground Cinema as it is now called by everyone remains a faint hope, but lacking technical polish (a thing more appreciated in its absence) their chief asset is lack of the restraint customarily imposed on commercial productions. Unfortunately most of these films are naive in content, amateurish in organization and hackneyed in style.

Japan, of course, is still a first rate cinema power as films this year from Teshigahara and Ichikawa prove. Several other countries seem on the verge of moving into the front rank. Poland is perhaps the most conspicuous with its excellent film school and its density of directionial talent, but the Dutch, the Czechs and the Greeks are making significant contributions. Of those two countries with such a tremendous prewar achievement little can be said.

Broadway works in the same way, albeit a little less thoroughly. In short, commercial "art" is not creative—not something born for the first time, but rather a re-hash of proven means of titillating the emotions of as many human beings as possible. It is commercially motivated—to sell soap, magazines, tickets, etc. Non-commercial art springs from a desire of the artist to express himself, with no commercial motivation, except perhaps a hope.

But, and here's where the confusion enters, it is *not* true that artists of theatre do not want to communicate to the public-as-a-whole. The greatest have—from Shakespeare to Miller. (And so have most poets, too, for that matter.)

It is possible to build theatre audiences by doing plays which can be understood by the public-in-general, which provide a rewarding experience for them and will make them return for a second and third production, etc. It is possible to do this without once doing a "commercial" play—but it is not possible to do it if the producer is unaware

that theatre is a public, not a private, art. The director who delves into the obscure works of some well-known classic playwright and comes up with some play that the playwright himself probably regarded as worthless, has no right to expect the public to like his production.

A knowledgeable producer will choose a play, old or new, that he feels is broadly communicative as well as creatively written. This knowledge can come only from experience with audiences, and this is why the Rockefeller panel concludes that "it is on the professionals that we must primarily depend for the development and maintenance of high standards of artistic performance, which is of paramount concern."

"Relevant" plays, full time theatre artists, a warm barn, add up to a theatre which will comparatively soon become self-sustaining, while providing the public of San Francisco all the stimulating rewards of theatre now being denied them. And, too, it would provide jobs for a couple of theatre people I can think of.

The tapestry of today is still confined to the wall; it is still dependent upon scale, pattern and color relationships to make its effect. It uses relatively few colors, and is still limited to dimension provided only by thickness and depth of weave, all other being illusionary.

The works exhibited at the Legion were designed but not woven by noted contemporary artists (most were woven in India). They were not reproductions of paintings, although many of them would seem so since the idiom of the artists was clearly apparent. No catalogue was needed to tell a Picasso design from a Leger or an Ernst. Probably the most striking characteristic noted was the interchangeable function, from tapestry to rug. Yet Oriental history provides ample evidence of the versatility of rugs as drapes, wall decorations or as wearing apparel, as well as being decorative floor coverings. So perhaps a deep piled, colorful tapestry which could also serve as a rug should not seem so avant-garde after all.

ILLUSION FOR SALE, a photographic essay

The subject is the neon-lit shopper's attempt to extend her personality and/or reduce her age through garments. jewelry and, mostly, hats.

About three photographs would have told the story, all the rest are fillers, repeating the theme in similar moods and compositions; the value of a hard core of good pictures is diluted to the point of disappearance.

The pictures are records without interpretation. All shots are middle distance. The viewer remains outside looking in at a scene with which he is familiar without gaining deeper understanding.

The show seems to have been a "quicky," shot and assembled at the drop of an empty museum wall.

ALAMOS By Richard Elkus DeYoung Museum

Mr. Elkus has lived in Alamos. Mexico, for fifteen years. His tribute to that town is a collection of photographs published in book form by Grabhorn Press (\$75.). The show at the De Young Museum consists of excerpts from the book.

Alamos is full of predictable Mexicana. Tattered shoeshine boys sit in front of tattered movie advertisements. Old doors, old people and old adobe are weatherbeaten. A merciless sun drums down on remnants of fine colonial architecture.

All of that is easily visible in Mr. Elkus' huge, strident prints. The depth which they lack is thoughtfully supplied by captions written by the photographer in that Sandburg-Bible style which seems to be taking over where sepia toning left off.

The camera work is careless and the prints are too contrasty and unwieldly but the framing is exquisite. Lovingly, the shots are set off from their mats, creating their own shadows. The gigantic structure is surrounded by a slender, gray frame which stands slightly higher than the photographs. The effect is truly worthy of an Ansel Adams.

Unfortunately lost, though, is a small Mexican Town, sacrificed to a super ego which in fifteen years has not found the time for involvement with its people and their environment or with the tools used to record it.

ERIC WEBER City Lights Bookshop


Weber's photographs are of the San Francisco Mime Troupe. This inspired group of hams is successfully engaged in taking theatrical entertainment out from behind the glass wall of TV and the money wall of showbiz. They bring it to the people in the people's parks. They are part of life, throwing their support to today's causes: student rebellions, Viet Nam marches.

This phenomenon is grist for the mills of photo-journalism. It provides for pictures of ebullience and thoughtfulness, of children's laughter and of intervention by the law.

Weber responds to this stimulus with crisp, clean pictures. His prints are full of light and simply composed, a perfect record, done by a fine technician.

Though Weber's pictures do justice to the vitality of the Mime Troupe, I would have liked to see a few tries at interpretation. The only attempt at extending reality is a shot of the back of a monstrously attired actor (tress?) overlook gray space of sky and water.

As the Mime Troupe's magic is born out of the immediate dialogue with its audience, magic, rather than neat journalism could have resulted with a more creative photographer.



DYLAN

by Sidney Michaels SF City Theatre, 465 Post St.

Although it is episodic, and suffers from this slightly, Sidney Michaels' dramatization of the last days of Dylan Thomas is crammed with drama, and one leaves the City Theatre with the sense of having seen a real slice of the great poet's life.

Basing his play on John Malcolm Brinnin's Dylan Thomas In America and Caitlin Thomas's Leftover Life To Kill, Michaels manages to include enough, but not too many quotes of Dylan's poetry. He has distilled the essential earthiness of Thomas (and Caitlin), the burning genius of the poet, and the pursuing devils which drive him to his death, into a poignant reality.

The passionate love between the two and its gradual erosion also is delineated clearly as Michaels' drama unfolds.

As Dylan, Jack Aranson gives us the finest acting job we have ever seen him do. The part was created on Broadway by Alec Guiness, but we fail to see how he could have surpassed the truth of character that Aranson brings to the part. (The Chronicle's Paine Knickerbocker, who apparently saw Guiness, feels that Aranson is superior.)

Whether reading the Welsh poet's actual words, (in which Aranson sounds like him, but does not slavishly imitate him) ranting at Caitlin, pinching a pretty girl's bosoms, or quietly telling Brinnin his own interpretation of Baa Baa, Black Sheep, Aranson portrays a lust for life (and muted disrespect for death) that is magnificently effective.

And above all, the actor brings to the character a spirit of humility which despite his flamboyance, Thomas obviously had. As when he says with complete conviction "I've sung a few songs in thirty-nine years just for the pleasure of singing, but now I think I have come to a point in my life when I think I have something to say."

The University of California, having resolved the major problems that last year unexpectedly clouded the future of its proposed University Arts Center on the Berkeley campus, opened the New Year at the University Art Gallery with an exhibition of drawings, photographs and models by the six design teams who were finalists in a nationwide competition to select an architect for the center (1965). Featured is the prize winning design by the San Francisco team of Mario J. Campi, Paul W. Reiter, Richard L. Jorasch and Ronald E. Wagner. Included are some 50 of the preliminary drawings of the 359 other competitors. There can be little question of the superiority of the Campi design, or of the qualities that gained recognition for the other finalists, but among the "other 50" are some designs notable for an appalling lack of imagination. Through Feb. 16.

Louis E. Nadalini paints, or rather constructs, a special form of Op art which he calls Myopic Art, and is exhibiting it at the Arleigh Gallery, San Francisco, through Feb. 6. Working with a wood construction comprised of slats of wood painted with acrylic paint and applied to wood panels, he plays on the eye's ability to hold an after image while yet accepting a new one. Although most of them are somewhat conservative and staid in their choice of artists, community concert associations more often than not veto jazz events, jazz being a "dirty," classic being a "clean."

Not so with the Contra Costa Concert Guild in Pittsburg, whose healthy attitude is "something for everybody." In the last three seasons the guild has presented, with unusual success, two programs devoted to jazz.

It's not surprising the concert offered by Vince Guaraldi's trio and Brazilian guitarist Bola Sete in January sold a record number of tickets.

Although Guaraldi is nothing short of great on the LP, his live performances generate an especially moving quality. And were Guaraldi to change his idiom from that of jazz to the long-hair field, his success would be just as strong. His musicianship is impressive, expressive and possessed of a rare individuality that at once establishes communication with his audience.

The trio's playing is clean and polished, lively and poignant in a manner that is never cold but consistently warm. And although jazz is spontaneous and "instant creativity," as Ralph Gleason pointed out in a somewhat lengthy commentary preceding the program, Guaraldi's group also plays with sophistication.

The program included such tunes as Vince's hit Cast Your Fate to the Wind, Linus and Lucy and a portion of his Musical Setting of the Eucharist; Yesterdays and New Waltz. Even though Guaraldi is the star of his show, Paul Distel on drums and Puz Fith on bass are equally adept and qualified musicians.

Bola Sete's participation in the concert commanded the strongest applause of the evening. It was to be expected, for here is an artist who is equally at home with composers such as Albeniz and Bach as well as jazz. The texture of Bola Sete's playing is velvety and rich in ardor and color. His excellent interpretation certainly must come from an inner warmth and passion for his instrument and its music.

THE SPY WHO CAME IN FROM THE COLD Martin Ritt Paramount 120 Minutes

The Spy Who Came In From The Cold is currently taking shelter at the recently and richly re-embellished Cinema 21, where we hope for those of you have not yet partaken of its particularly labyrinthine pleasures it may stay securely lodged. I have long maintained that Richard Burton is the best actor working in films in the face of well-supported charges that he is capable of only one portrayal. Versatility is not necessarily a virtue.

Burton's work is all of a piece, transcending mere roles. From Osborne to le Carré he has worked steadily and deliberately to reveal various aspects of one character, to discover the core of that character and to embody that character in film terms as a statement of the human condition. That character—modern man as the tragic victim of complex and convoluted social forces—was apparent even in such retrograde efforts as The Sandpiper.

Often he has dangerously worked against his material, particularly in Becket where the conflict loses all meaning when stripped of its historical framework. Burton compensated for that error by carrying the film with quiet conviction, and his ability to make us believe Becket's suffering salvaged something from the shambles of Glenville's inept direction and O'Toole over-praised and over-blown performance. Quiet power and subtlety have always been Burton's trademarks, but these qualities have been largely wasted in a series of films which were at best tolerant of his purpose which like the Wandering Jew moves from place to place, finding sometimes friendship, even rapport, but never home.

In The Spy Who Came In From The Cold Burton is at last home. Alec Leamas is the perfect victim, the espionage agent, not committed philosophically but nevertheless hopelessly enmeshed, manipuated by unseen figures which use him, change him and finally destroy him. Leamas' education in political realities is a costly one, not because the irreconcilable evil is so horrible, but because his own contribution was so great. When society becomes so complex that its manifestations are beyond the pale of understanding, we abnegate our right to judge and our right to know to a group or organization and replace reason with faith. We content ourselves with stupidity, passivity and blind acceptance, and evil flowers in our darkness.

The inscrutable facade of the film conceals this idea, but the twisting alleys of its plot inevitably take us there. Underneath those layers of complexity is the simple message film so adored by Americans, and, if on the one hand Ritt's direction occasionally lapses into self-conscious spasms of style, on the other we can be very grateful Stanley Kramer didn't get there first.

In the hands of a lesser performer, Caitlin might become an unlikeable shrew, but Miss McMaster gives us a warmth and sympathy that makes Caitlin's suffering and striking back against it completely understandable. Even in the final scene when she smashes her fist against the coffin in grief-torn

rage, we are with her. For Miss McMaster, this is also a top in her

The rest of the cast is excellent, through somewhat overshadowed by the stars. Angela Casey's Meg stands out, as does Cyril Clayton's Angus Marius. John Speers does a fine double as Mattock and Antone, while Maggie Murphy Rubinstein's bumps and grinds as Thelma Wonderland are indeed a wonder.

We felt that London Green's Brinnin is a bit ponderous, but it certainly doesn't detract from the show's general excellence. Robert Callaghan has staged it with good pace, and settings by Kenneth Price and Mike Tuggle make ingenious use of simplicity. Despite the many charges, the waits are seldom annoying, aided by James Mc-Millan's lighting.

Elsewhere in this issue you'll find a plea for good theatre in San Francisco. I think author Norman Sturgis will agree with us that Dylan is a step in the right direction. For although Michaels has written a play aimed at commercial success, he undoubtedly was aiming even more highly at an artistic success.

MARCEL, OR THE UNSEEN DRAMATIZED

Marcel Marceau celebrated his 10th anniversary of playing in San Francisco during his most recent engagement at the Geary Theater. In a series of sketches beginning with The Kite and ending with Bip as a Soldier Marcel eloquently depict's man's struggles with unseen forces in a variety of styles ranging from humorous (as in The Circus Performer) through tragic (The Cage), including those hoary misdeeds, The Seven Deadly Sins, and a multi-faceted tour de force entitled The Mask Maker.

It is this last sketch which I felt was the best and so I shall attempt to describe it. Briefly, the plot is that Marcel, as the mask maker, is trying on some of his creations-each of which depicts an emotion. He finally settles on the classic masks of Tragedy and Comedy, those dual realities which exist simultaneously. But unable to decide on one he puts them on and off with a fantastic rapidity which

amazes everyone. Eventually the comic mask refuses to come off. As Marcel's chalked countenance is itself the mask, he must assume the openmouthed grinning face of the mask while attempting to remove it.

To exhibit frustration, which rises to anger and finally boils into fullrage—all the while maintaining the slack-awed fool's face—is clear evidence of his fine talent. The mask never does come off and as the lights dim, we see Marcel sitting dejectedly in utter weariness, his arms wagging like a run down Jack-in-the-box-ultimately acquiesing to that fate into which he has been forced. The levels of interpretation are, of course, many. However one chooses to view this sketch-from the child's enjoyment of a clown's antics to the more subtle philosophical revelations of man's condition engendered by Marcel's miming —this is entertainment at its best.

More an amateur than a professional musical aggregation when conductor Gerhard Samuel came to the East Bay to take over its leadership several years ago, the Oakland Symphony Orchestra is, today, one of the area's important—and distinct—cultural organizations.

December's concert, played twice for sold-out houses in Oakland and in Pittsburg for the Contra Costa Concert Guild, proved once more that Samuel is the undisputed master of his orchestra; and his musicians respond readily to his hardiest demands.

The highlight of the December concerts was Igor Oistrakh in an extremely moving and exciting performance of the Bartok concerto for violin and orchestra (1946).

Oistrakh is a seasoned performer whose technical ability is amazingly brilliant and his accuracy astounding. That he could perform the solo role in the Bartok concerto (which is an extremely difficult work) with restraint, is not unusual. Oistakh plays everything with emotional reservations, free from sentimental deliberations. Nevertheless, his Bartok was haltingly beautiful.

Samuel and his orchestra provided an accompaniment that reflected the spirit in which Oistrakh played: sympathetic and tonally impressive.

Widely known for his expertise when it comes to conducting for the ballet, Samuel's reading of the score for Tschaikowsky's Symphony No. 4 in F Minor could have been a tour de force for a corps de ballet and solo dancers. It was a performance that stressed the ballet aspects of the music (and there are many in the fourth symphony) and was quite unorthodox in that Samuel's dynamics and sharp colorations of the score emerged with a pointed and welcome freshness, rather than the sluggish morosity with which most conductors interpret this work.

Also included on the program was a vivid performance of Schoenberg's Music for a Film Scene (1930) that should be heard in live concerts more often and an unimpressive reading of the overture to Weber's Euryanthe.

Russian films are getting better, but Germany continues to make the worst films in the world.

To my list of best films I have little to add. Most of the films were covered in this column. I have considered all films opening in San Francisco for the first time, regardless of the year in which they were produced, but I have excluded all films opening after the middle of December and all films shown exclusively at the Film Festival. This leaves us with a list that looks more like 64 than 65 and includes several throw backs to the early 60's such as Vivre Sa Vie and Chance Meeting which to my knowledge had never been screened in San Francisco until it slipped in last summer for two days at the Powell. and most expensive cartridges are made for manual turntables with precision tone arms and for the professional quality changers. These cartridges should be adjusted to a tracking force of from ½ to 1½ grams.

The newest stylus is one that has a bi-radial, sometimes called an eliptical point. The point is actually egg-shaped; that is, it is very thin in the direction parallel with the record groove, and fairly wide in the direction across the groove. These cartridge stylus combinations have a very high compliance and can be used only on the finest changers and manual players because they must not be tracked at more than 1½ grams.

How does all of this affect you, the user. It means that if you purchase a new cartridge, it has to be the right type. You cannot use a crystal for a magnetic or vice versa. You can use crystals and ceramics interchangeably. If you change your magnetic cartridge, it has to have a stylus with the correct compliance to track in your system. If you track an expensive elliptical cartridge at 3 to 4 grams to make your changer trip, the needle assembly will be bottomed (pushed back so it can't wiggle) and you will have high distortion. Whenever a cartridge is changed, the balance and weight adjustments have to be changed on your equipment.


