The address will be simulcast and also recorded for broadcast.

Catherine McLeod stars in the title role, supported by Lorna Lynn, Cliff Hall and Gene Peterson. A pilot will be available in three weeks. Charles Irving will produce and direct the series, with Charles Gussman writing the episodes.....Norman Blackburn has been named executive director for Screen Gems, Inc., in Hollywood, to act as liaison between Screen Gems' production dept and agencies, networks and clients.....Guild Films will distribute Signet Circle Playhouse, 26 half-hour film dramas produced by Andre Luotto Productions from stories by famous European authors.

NEWS AND COMMENT: NBC signed comedienne-singer Kaye Ballard to a long-term contract. She'll be featured in the first of the new Colgate Summer Comedy Hour series and appear in other shows.....William S. Paley, chairman of the Board, Columbia Broadcasting System, Inc., in an address before the convention of the National Assn of Radio and Television Broadcasters in Chicago on May 25, discussing responsibility in broadcasting in the field of news and public affairs, said in part: "The broadcaster has the same right to editorialize and the same right to independent as the free press....In this connection, I would like to say that it is not the act of editorialization which puts the bite and backbone into a news and public affairs operation. It is rather the fact of having a rounded and vital schedule which does the trick...a schedule of unbiased news which covers all categories...a fair and objective analysis of that portion of the news which calls for background and interpretation...a schedule of controversy in which the issues of concern to the listeners will get full and responsible airing...public feature programs and documentaries which put the spotlight on conditions worthy of the listener's attention.".....Paul Raibourn, v.p. of Paramount Pictures Corp, told the Television Council of Chicago at a luncheon May 21 of 12 proposals that would help solve the UHF economic problem, among them: subscription television, moving all VHF stations to UHF channels, granting additional UHF channels to networks, required UHF tuners for color sets sold in interstate commerce and elimination of intermixture of VHF and UHF stations in the same community. Paramount Pictures has network, local and subscription television interests.
