NEW DEREK ROY RADIO SERIES

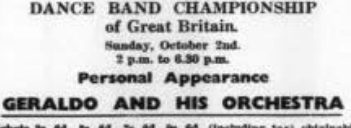

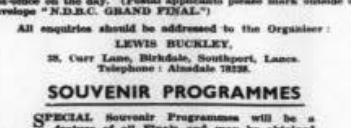

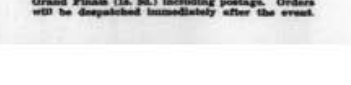
