## Johnny Nash

SHARPLY-DRESSED, young, clean-cut and with brandy glass cupped in his hand as he sits in the genteel elegance of a hotel in the heart of Mayfair, Johnny Nash is no ordinary sinfer travelling from town to fown, country to country in the search for fame and fortune. He makes rare public appearances. Recording is his way of life when he isn't recording himself, he's recording somebody else.
